▶ The No. 25 Auburn men's cross country team will travel to Falcon Heights, Minn., to run at the 23rd annual Roy Griak Invitational Saturday.

► The women's team will be inactive this weekend, but return to action Oct. 4 at the Tiger Invitational.

► Saturday's race will be an 8K over the rolling hills and grassy terrain of the University of Minnesota Les Bolstad Golf Course.

► The Tigers' lone NCAA qualifier from 2007, Felix Kiboiywo is slated to run at the Roy Griak Invite Saturday. Kiboiywo was withheld from racing at the season opening Powerade Invitational on Sept. 5.

► Auburn's men's team cracked into the U.S. Track & Field/Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) national rankings, debuting the 2008 season at No. 25.

► The Tigers have been tabbed second in the men's NCAA South Region poll and the women are ranked eighth.

▶ Upon the release of the SEC's coaches poll on Sept. 12, the Tiger men were picked to finish third in the conference and the women were picked sixth.

► A pair of Tigers, Elkanah Kibet and Girma Mecheso, received the initial conference awards for the 2008 season. Kibet was named Male Athlete of the Week and Mecheso was awarded Freshman of the Week honors on Sept. 9.

► Four of Auburn's men's runners, Kibet, Mecheso, Scott Novack and Julian Matthews, hold the top-four 5K times in the SEC.

▶ The Tigers packed a punch at the Powerade Invitational in Chattanooga, Tenn. The men captured first through fourth place individually and brought home the team title. Three women finished among the top 10 and placed second as a team.

Auburn Men Win Team Title; Women Runner-Up

▶ The Auburn men's cross country team finished in first place and the women tied for second and both teams had the individual champion as the Tigers opened their 2008 seasons at the Powerade Invitational hosted by the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga.

► The men's team scored 18 points to finish 48 points ahead of instate and conference rival Alabama, while Kennesaw State (91) and UT-Chattanooga (104) finished third and fourth, respectively.

► The women finished second with 38 points, just four points back from champion UT-Chattanooga.

▶ In the men's 5K race, Auburn captured first through fourth place with junior college transfer Elkanah Kibet and true freshman Girma Mecheso packing the blazing one-two punch in 14:49 and 14:54, respectively. Junior Scott Novack (15:22) and true freshman Julian Matthews (15:31) followed for third and fourth.

▶ On the women's side, the Tigers had three top-10 finishers with sophomore Holly Knight and junior Laurel Pritchard placing first and third, respectively. Knight, who was the top finisher at the same event a year ago, cruised to her second title by completing the two-mile course in 10:56 and finished 26 seconds ahead of runner-up Tara Gietema of UT-Chattanooga. Pritchard crossed the line in 11:22 and sophomore Amber Riley placed sixth for the Tigers.

Pair of Auburn Runners Earn SEC Honors

• Auburn newcomers Elkanah Kibet and Girma Mecheso were named SEC Male Athlete and Freshman of the Week, respectively, following their performances Sept. 5 at the Powerade Invitational, the league office announced Sept. 8

Auburn Men Picked Third, Women Sixth in SEC

► Auburn's men's and women's cross country teams were picked to finish third and sixth, respectively, in the announcement of the 2008 SEC Cross Country Coaches Poll by the league office on Sept. 12.

▶ In a vote by the league head coaches, the Auburn men received one first-place vote and had 31 points. Alabama captured seven first-place votes for a total of 14 points and Arkansas tallied two first-place votes for 19 points. Florida and Tennessee round out the top five on the men's side with 37 and 46 points, respectively.

► Auburn's women are predicted to finish sixth and had 68 points in the voting. Arkansas received nine first-place votes and tallied 13 total points for the top spot. Florida received two first-place votes and posted 25 points for second-place. Tennessee also earned a first-place vote and recorded 31 points for a third-place finish. Georgia placed fourth with 39 points and Kentucky placed fifth with 61 points.
