2005 HEADLINES

- ▶ Auburn finished the season 9-3 overall and 7-1 in the Southeastern Conference, earning its fifth outright or shared SEC Western Division title in the last six seasons.
- ▶ Auburn has posted a record of 22-3 over the past two seasons, which is the third best record in NCAA Division I-A during that span.
- ▶ Auburn's 22 wins over the past two seasons established a new school record for victories in a two-year period (previous record: 20).
- ▶ Auburn's senior class finished with 39 victories over the past four seasons, equaling the best four-year victory total in school history (1986-89).
- ▶ Auburn has won 16 of its last 17 SEC games and 17 of its last 18 games against SEC opponents. The Tigers have won nine straight home games against SEC foes and are 8-1 in their last nine road games.
- ▶ Auburn has posted a 15-1 SEC record over the past two seasons, becoming just the fourth team since divisional play began in 1992 to win at least 15 SEC games in a two-year period.
- ▶ Auburn has the best SEC record in the last six years with a mark of 36-12 (.750) in conference games since 2000.
- ▶ Auburn had victories against two teams ranked in the top ten, defeating then-No. 8 Alabama (28-18) and then-No. 9 Georgia (31-30). The Tigers have now won six of their last seven games against teams ranked in the top ten.
- ▶ Despite losing its entire starting backfield from 2004 to the NFL, Auburn averaged more points (32.2), rushing yards (194.1) and first downs (21.4) and had a better third-down percentage (.462) this season than in 2004.
- ▶ Auburn led the SEC this season in scoring offense (32.2), total offense (409.8), third down conversions (.462) and sacks (39).
- ▶ In conference games, Auburn averaged a league-best 32.8 points per game and also led the league in total offense (413.6), rushing yards (197.6), passing efficiency (140.7) and third down conversions (.474).
- ▶ Auburn excelled in the red zone this season, scoring on 44 of 51 chances (86.3 percent), including 34 touchdowns. Auburn's defense allowed opponents to score just 24 times in 34 chances (70.6 percent).
- ▶ Auburn outscored its opponents in the first half this season 210-84, including a whopping 127-37 edge in the second quarter.
- ▶ Auburn tied for second nationally allowing just eight touchdown passes all season. The Tigers ranked sixth nationally in scoring defense allowing 15.5 points per game.
- ▶ Kenny Irons led the SEC in rushing (107.8) this season despite averaging just 10.8 carries per game during Auburn's first five games.
- ▶ Irons averaged 125.9 yards rushing over the last 10 games of the season with 13 touchdowns, and was a workhorse particularly during the last seven games, averaging 139.1 yards per game on 28.9 carries per game.
- ▶ Irons became just the fourth back in Auburn history to total 400 yards rushing in back-to-back games and the first to do it in two road games when he ran for 182 yards at Arkansas and 218 yards at LSU.
- ▶ Sophomore Brandon Cox threw for at least 200 yards in eight of his 11 games played, including six straight, posting the third-most 200-yard passing games in a single season in Auburn history.
- ▶ Marcus McNeill earned consensus All-American honors at offensive tackle and was a finalist for the Outland Award. The Tigers have now had six All-Americans in the past three seasons.
- ▶ Auburn became the first known team in SEC history to have four career 1,000-yard receivers on its team at one time. Courtney Taylor (1,394 yards), Devin Aromashodu (1,333), Ben Obomanu (1,313) and Anthony Mix (1,010) had all surpassed the 1,000-yard mark by the end of the season.

THE WRAPUP

Auburn finished the season with a 9-3 record, including a 7-1 mark in the Southeastern Conference. The Tigers finished tied for first in the SEC Western Division and were selected to play in the 2006 Capital One Bowl.

WESTERN DIVISION CO-CHAMPS

With a 7-1 record in the SEC West, Auburn won its fifth outright or shared SEC Western Division title in the last six seasons, and its sixth since the SEC split into two divisions in 1992. Auburn won the West outright in 2000 and 2004 and shared the division title in 1997, 2001, 2002 and 2005.

TWO-YEAR DOMINATION

Auburn posted a record of 22-3 (.880) over the past two seasons, giving the Tigers the third-best record in the NCAA since the start of the 2004 season. Only USC (25-1, .962) and Texas (24-1, .960) have better winning percentages than Auburn over the past two seasons.

DOUBLE DIP

With 22 victories over the past two seasons, Auburn has established a new school record for victories in a two-year period. The Tigers previously had four occurrences of 20 wins over a two-year span (1982-83; 1983-84; 1988-89; 1993-94).

TIGER SENIORS MATCH FOUR-YEAR RECORD

Auburn's senior class finished with a four-year record of 39-12, including three SEC Western Division championships, while tying the Auburn record for most victories during a four-year period (39 - 1986-89).

WINNING IN THE SEC

Auburn has won 16 of its last 17 SEC games and 17 of 18 against SEC opponents. The Tigers have won nine straight home games against SEC opponents and are 8-1 in their last eight SEC road games with the only loss coming in overtime at No. 7 LSU (20-17) on Oct. 22, 2005.

With a 7-1 conference record, Auburn finished with another winning record in the SEC. This marked the sixth consecutive season that Auburn finished with an SEC record of no worse than 5-3. The last time Auburn had six straight winning conference records came from 1955-60. The Tigers had streaks of five straight winning SEC seasons from 1968-72 and 1986-90.

WINNING IN THE SEC, PART II

Auburn's 15-1 mark in the conference from 2004-05 marks the fourth time in SEC history (since divisional play began in 1992) that a team has won 15 or more conference games in back-to-back seasons.

NOT SKIPPING A BEAT

There were many who assumed that after Auburn lost its 2004 starting backfield of Jason Campbell, Ronnie Brown and Carnell Williams, who were all first-round NFL draft picks, that the Tigers would struggle offensively in 2005. Instead, the Tigers' offensive numbers this season were nearly identical to last season.

Last year, Auburn averaged 32.1 points and 420.7 yards per game. This season, the Tigers averaged 32.2 points and 409.8 yards per game. Auburn also improved from last season in first downs (21.4 - 20.8), rushing yardage (194.1 - 183.3) and third-down conversions (.462 - .459).

The biggest difference from last year has come defensively, where the Tigers, although very solid this year, were tops in the nation in 2004. Last year's team gave up just 11.3 points per game, compared to 15.5 this season, and allowed only 277.6 yards per game as opposed to this season's 315.2. Still the 15.5 points allowed this year is second best at Auburn during the Tommy Tuberville era.

BORGES BALL

In the four seasons prior to Al Borges' arrival as Auburn's offensive coordinator before the 2004 season, (2000-03), the Tigers scored 30 or more points in 22 of 62 (35.5 percent) games. Since Borges has taken the reigns of Auburn's offense, the Tigers have scored 30 or more points in 17 of 25 (68.0 percent) games.

STRIKE WHILE IRONS IS HOT

Junior running back Kenny Irons led the SEC and ranked 21st nationally averaging 107.8 yards rushing per game in 2005. More impressively, Irons posted those numbers despite averaging just 10.8 carries during Auburn's first five games, including only one rush in the season opener vs. Georgia Tech.

After gaining 34 yards in the first two games of the season, Irons rushed for more than 100 yards in eight of the last 10 contests, averaging 125.9 yards per game with

13 touchdowns during that stretch while averaging 5.2 yards per carry. Irons was a workhorse the last seven games in particular, totaling 974 yards on 202 rushes (139.1 ypg; 28.9 carries per game).

On Oct. 15 at Arkansas, Irons ran for a then-career best 182 yards on 33 carries to earn SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors. On Oct. 22 at LSU, Irons posted the 14th-best single-game rushing total in Auburn history, gaining 218 yards on 27 carries, including a 74-yard scoring run in the third quarter. It was the most yards by an Auburn back since Rudi Johnson ran for 249 yards vs. Louisiana Tech Oct. 21, 2000.

Irons had 101 yards and a score Oct. 29 vs. Ole Miss and followed that with 103 and three TDs in one half vs. Kentucky. Nov. 12 at Georgia, Irons ran 37 times for 179 yards and two scores, earning SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors while tying for the fifth most rushes in a game in school history. He finished the regular season with 103 yards and a score on 28 carries vs. Alabama, becoming the second back in Auburn history to have six or more consecutive 100-yard rushing games.

Irons finished the season ranked sixth in Auburn history for a single season with 1,293 yards rushing. By surpassing the 1,000-yard rushing mark, it marks the first time that Auburn has had a 1,000-yard rusher in four consecutive seasons.

IRONS SHINES VS. TOP DEFENSES

Auburn played two teams this season that ranked in the nation's top 10 in rushing defense, and Kenny Irons surpassed the century mark against both teams. Irons posted a career-best 218 yards on the ground Oct. 22 at LSU, which finished with the nation's No. 6-ranked rushing defense, allowing just 91.5 yards per game. Irons ran for 103 yards Nov. 19 vs. Alabama, which ranked No. 9 nationally giving up 94.3 yards per contest.

COX SHOWS STEADY PLAY

In his first year as a starter at quarterback, sophomore Brandon Cox had a stellar season. Cox threw for more than 200 yards in eight of his 11 games, and ranked fifth in the SEC averaging 218.7 yards passing per game. Cox's total of 342 yards passing in the season opener vs. Georgia Tech was the third-highest total in the SEC this season.

Cox placed third in the Auburn single-season record book for most games throwing for 200 or more yards with eight, and he had six straight 200-yard passing games this season, which is tied for the second-best mark in Auburn history.

MAKING SEC HISTORY

Auburn became the first known team in SEC history to have four career 1,000-yard receivers on its team at one time this season. Prior to this season, the Tigers had never had three 1,000-yard receivers at once.

Junior Courtney Taylor finished the season ranked 10th in Auburn history with 1,394 yards receiving, senior Devin Aromashodu is 11th with 1,333 yards, senior Ben Obomanu is 13th with 1,313 yards and senior Anthony Mix is 21st with 1,010.

SEC LEADERS

Auburn emerged as the league leader in four statistical categories this season: scoring offense (32.2), total offense (409.8), third down conversions (46.2 percent) and sacks (39). The Tigers ranked second in rushing offense (194.1), kickoff returns (27.4) and red zone defense (70.6 percent). If scoring margin were calculated in the SEC stats, the Tigers, at +16.7, would have led that category as well.

TIGER O TOUGH ON SEC FOES

Auburn's offense was tough for SEC defenses to stop, as the Tigers averaged a league-best 32.8 points in conference games, and scored 39 more points than the second-ranked team (Vanderbilt - 27.9). Auburn ranked first in total offense, averaging 413.6 yards per SEC game, which was 30 yards per game better than the second-ranked team (Vanderbilt, 383.8). The Tigers' balanced attack ranked first in rushing offense (197.6) and passing efficiency (140.7), and Auburn led the league with a 47.4 conversion rate on third downs in league games.

OTHER SEC SUPERLATIVES

In conference games, it's not just the Auburn offense that excelled, as the Tiger defense ranked third in the league in scoring (15.2) and rushing defense (95.1) and tied for fourth in total defense (295.0), while the special teams ranked second in kickoff returns (22.6).

Individually, Kenny Irons ranked first in SEC games in rushing (117.6), third in scoring (7.5) and fourth in all-purpose yards (134.2), Brandon Cox led the SEC in passing efficiency (140.4) and ranked third in passing average (209.2) and Kody Bliss averaged a league-best 45.8 yards per punt in league games.

SEC Success

Auburn has won 16 of its last 17 Southeastern Conference games and 17 of its last 18 games against SEC schools, including the 2004 SEC Championship game victory over Tennessee. Auburn's success against conference schools dates back to more than last year's championship run, as over the past six seasons, the Tigers have the best SEC record among the 12 league schools. The following are the combined conference records of the 12 SEC schools from 2000-05.

Tigers Terrific Since 2000

Since the start of the 2000 season, Auburn has one of the best records in all of Division I-A football. The Tigers record of 55-21 (.724) ranks 14th among all 117 programs. The list of the top 20 programs since 2000 in terms of winning percentage follows:

THIRD TIME S A CHARM

Auburn had tremendous success on third downs, leading the SEC and ranking 14th nationally by converting 46.2 percent (73-of-158) of its third downs. When the Tigers had 10 yards or less to reach a first down, that percentage climbed to 53.2 percent (66-of-124).

Meanwhile, Auburn's defense allowed opponents to convert third-down chances just 32.5 percent of the time (55-of-169). Auburn makes its third-down superiority known right off the bat, as the Tigers are 23-of-41 (56.1 percent) on third downs in the first quarter, while opponents are just 6-of-34 (17.6 percent).

THE LONG AND SHORT OF IT

Auburn's offense showed that it has both quick-strike capability and the ability to put together long, sustained drives. In fact, the Tigers led the SEC in scoring drives of more than five minutes (14) and ranked second in scoring drives of less than two minutes (23). Georgia (23), which played one extra game, was the only other SEC team with more than 15 scoring drives of less than two minutes, and no other squad posted more than 10 scoring drives of over five minutes.

DRIVE TIME

Auburn had more offensive success per drive than any other team in the SEC this season. The Tigers led all SEC teams in yards per drive (35.13), points per drive (2.61), scoring efficiency (42.1 percent) and touchdown efficiency (33.6 percent). Auburn had big leads in points per drive and touchdown efficiency, as second-place Georgia trailed by more than a quarter of a point in points per drive at 2.34, while the Tigers' touchdown efficiency was a full seven percent higher than the second-place Bulldogs (26.6).

AUBURN IN THE RANKS

After falling out of the national rankings following a season-opening loss to Georgia Tech, Auburn climbed all the way to No. 7 in the final regular season Associated Press Top 25 poll before finishing at No. 14. Auburn did not break back into the AP poll after the Georgia Tech loss until an Oct. 1 victory over South Carolina improved the Tigers to 4-1 and pushed Auburn to No. 22 in the poll.

QUICK STARTS

Auburn has been a notoriously quick starter the past two seasons. The Tigers have outscored their opponents 403-120 in

the first half over the past two years, including a 210-84 tally this season. Auburn has led by 10 or more points at the half in 11 of its 16 SEC games over the past two seasons. Auburn has made those early leads stand up, as the Tigers are 18-0 over the past two seasons when leading at the half.

The second quarter was particularly kind to Auburn this year, as the Tigers held a commanding 127-37 edge in points scored during that period.

TIGERS TOUGH ON TOP TEN

Auburn's 28-18 victory against then-No. 8 Alabama was its second of the season against a top 10 team. Auburn has won six of its last seven games against teams ranked in the Associated Press top 10, including a 31-30 victory at No. 9 Georgia Nov. 12. Dating back to the 2002 season, Auburn has played 16 games against top 10 teams in its last 43 games (37.2 percent).

During the Tommy Tuberville era, Auburn is 12-10 in games played against top 10 teams, and has won 12 of its last 17 games dating back to a 23-20 upset of No. 1-ranked Florida Oct. 13, 2001.

DEFENSIVE DISPLAY

The Auburn defense has been stingy when it comes to allowing points in recent seasons. In fact, in the past 44 games, the Tigers have allowed an opponent to score 30 points or more just twice (31 by LSU Oct. 25, 2003 in Baton Rouge; 30 by Georgia Nov. 12, 2005). During that same span, 29 opponents failed to score 20 points, and 16 were held to single digits.

PRIME PROTECTOR

Offensive tackle Marcus McNeill earned consensus All-American honors, giving Auburn six All-Americans in the past three seasons.

McNeill played 42 consecutive games, including 39 starts, without allowing a sack. He was the recipient of the Jacobs Trophy as the SEC's top blocker and was one of three finalists for the Outland Trophy.

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES

Auburn has had a knack for winning close ball games since Tommy Tuberville arrived as the Tigers' head coach. In his seven seasons at the helm, Auburn is 19-10 in games decided by seven points or less and has won seven of its last nine. Counting his four seasons at Ole Miss, Tuberville has a 19-15 record as a head coach in games decided by seven points or less.

NO PASSING ZONE

Auburn played its first eight games without allowing an opponent to throw for 200 yards in a game before surrendering more than 300 in two straight contests. Still, Auburn ranked 32nd nationally in pass defense, allowing 199.0 yards per game, but more impressively, the Tigers tied for second nationally in fewest touchdown passes allowed, surrendering just eight passing scores all season. Only Maryland (4) allowed fewer touchdown passes than Auburn.

JORDAN-HARE STADIUM

In its 66th year as home to the Auburn football team, Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's eighth-largest on-campus stadium, with a capacity of 87,451 fans. The Tigers are 249-60-7 (.799) at Jordan-Hare Stadium, including a 35-6 (.853) mark in the last six seasons. Auburn went 7-0 at home in 2004, marking the second perfect home season in the last five years (7-0 in 2000).

Auburn had an eight-game home winning streak prior to a season-opening loss to Georgia Tech Sept. 3, but won its last six home games and has now won 18 of its last 20 games at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

JORDAN-HARE TOUGH ON SEC

Jordan-Hare Stadium has proven to be a difficult place for opposing SEC teams to play. Auburn currently owns a nine-game winning streak in home games vs. conference opponents, not losing a home game to an SEC team since a 24-20 loss to Ole Miss in 2003.

MANY HAPPY RETURNS

Auburn ranked second in the nation, averaging 27.4 yards per kickoff return. Devin Aromashodu averaged 24.2 yards on 20 returns, ranking third in the SEC and 36th nationally, while Brad Lester aver-

aged 49.0 yards on just four returns, including a 93-yard return for a score vs. Ball State Sept. 17.

GETTING TO BE A HABIT

Auburn leads all Southeastern Conference schools with five 1,000 yard rushers in the last six seasons (since 2000). Tennessee is second with four, followed by Alabama, Arkansas and Mississippi State with three. Florida and Kentucky each have two, while Georgia, LSU and South Carolina have one. Ole Miss and Vanderbilt have failed to have a 1,000 yard rusher since 2000.

Nationally, the Tigers are tied for fourth-most since 2000. They trail only Minnesota (9), Texas (7) and Northern Illinois (6).

Auburn's 1,000-yard rushers include: Rudi Johnson in 2000 (1,567), Ronnie Brown in 2002 (1,008), Carnell Williams in 2003 (1,307) and 2004 (1,165) and Kenny Irons in 2005 (1,293).

RUNNING LONG DISTANCE

For the first time in school history, Auburn had three different backs break a run of at least 70 yards in one season. Brad Lester was the first to accomplish the feat with a 70-yard dash vs. Ball State, Kenny Irons went 74 yards for a score at LSU, and Tristan Davis joined the group Nov. 5 at Kentucky with a 75-yard gallop for a touchdown. There had been two prior occurrences of Auburn having two different players with a 70-yard run in one season (Bo Jackson and Brent Fullwood, 1985; Ralph O'Gwynne and Jimmy Fenton, 1936).

In addition, Auburn had four runs this season of at least 60 yards, marking the first time that the Tigers have had four 60-yard runs in one season since the 1985 team had five, and just the fifth time overall (1978, 1979, 1983, 1985).

Single-Season Record Climbers

With eight 100-yard rushing games, Kenny Irons tied for second with Bo Jackson's Heisman Trophy-winning 1985 season for most 100-yard rushing games in a single season in Auburn history, and his six straight 100-yard games ranks second.

Meanwhile, Brandon Cox threw for at least 200 yards in eight of his 11 games played, including six in a row. Cox ranks third in Auburn history for the most 200-yard passing games in a single season, and his streak of six straight is tied for second.

TURNOVER TURNAROUND

In a season-opening loss to Georgia Tech, Auburn committed five turnovers while forcing just one. After that game, the Tigers turned the ball over just 13 times in the last 11 games. After suffering four interceptions in the season opener, the Tigers threw just four interceptions in the last 11 games combined.

GOOD WILL HERRING

Junior Will Herring continued to excel in his third season as Auburn's starting free safety. Herring, who has started 36 consecutive games dating back to the third game of his freshman season, led Auburn with 69 tackles, pushing his career total to 178. Herring had a career-high 13 tackles in the season opener vs. Georgia Tech, recovered a fumble for a touchdown Sept. 10 against Mississippi State and blocked a field goal attempt Oct. 15 at Arkansas.

WILLIAMS SQUARED

Auburn's defense was anchored by senior linebackers Travis Williams and Antarrrious Williams. Travis Williams, a preseason All-SEC selection, finished second on the squad with 68 tackles in 11 games, and has added 5.5 tackles for loss including 2.5 sacks, two forced fumbles and an interception. Antarrrious Williams, a second-team preseason All-SEC pick, was third on the squad with 51 tackles. The Williams combined to play in 93 games including 58 starts (Travis - 49/36; Antarrrious - 44/22).

IRON MEN

Of Auburn's 15 seniors, 12 saw time in at least 40 games during their careers. Devin Aromashodu, Wayne Dickens, Ben Obomanu and Cooper Wallace led the list,

playing in all 51 of Auburn's games during the last four seasons. They were followed by T.J. Jackson (50), Travis Williams (49), Anthony Mix (49), Jake Slaughter (46), Marcus McNeill (45), Troy Reddick (45), Antarrrious Williams (44) and Steven Ross (42).

STARTS STREAKS

Four Tigers finished the season with starting streaks of at least 25 games. Leading the way were FS Will Herring (36) and TE Cooper Wallace (31), while NG T.J. Jackson and OG Ben Grubbs were next with 25 consecutive starts each.

FOUR HUNDRED IN TWO GAMES

Kenny Irons achieved a rare feat by rushing for 400 yards during Auburn's games at Arkansas and LSU. Irons is just the fourth back in Auburn history to rush for 400 combined yards in back-to-back games, joining Joe Cribbs, James Brooks and Bo Jackson. Irons is the first to accomplish the feat during two road games.

Cribbs (1978) and Brooks (1980) each accomplished the feat once, while Jackson hit the milestone four times during his Heisman Trophy season in 1985.

Irons' 400 yards is the seventh-best two-game total in school history.

TUBERVILLE'S SEVENTH SEASON

Tommy Tuberville completed his seventh season at Auburn in 2005 and his 11th as a head coach in the SEC. Tuberville has the third-longest tenure in the SEC (second-longest active streak) behind Phillip Fulmer of Tennessee and Steve Spurrier of South Carolina, who were each in their 13th season in the league this year.

Tuberville has amassed a record of 60-27 in his seven seasons at Auburn and has

an overall mark of 85-47. He has led the Tigers to six straight bowl appearances and three bowl victories: over Virginia Tech in the 2005 NOKIA Sugar Bowl, Wisconsin in the 2003 Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl presented by Bridgestone and Penn State in the 2003 Capital One Bowl.

Tuberville is fourth all-time at Auburn in wins, and is the fifth-longest tenured coach in school history.

11 AND COUNTING

In his 11th year as a head coach, Tommy Tuberville has five assistant coaches who have been with him all 11 years. That group includes: defensive tackles/noseguard coach Don Dunn, running backs/special teams coach Eddie Gran, wide receivers coach Greg Knox, offensive line coach Hugh Nall and defensive ends coach Terry Price.

25 SEASONS ON THE PLAINS

The 2006 Capital One Bowl was line-backer coach Joe Whitt's 299th as an Auburn football coach, which is more than any head or assistant coach in Auburn history. Legendary Tigers' head coach Shug Jordan coached in 265 games at Auburn. It was Whitt's 18th bowl game, by far the most for any coach in Auburn history. In 2006, Whitt will become the first person to coach in 26 consecutive Auburn seasons.

WHEN SCORING 20+ POINTS

Under Tommy Tuberville, Auburn is 53-4 when scoring 20 or more points, including a 51-3 mark in the regular season. Dating back to 1995, Auburn is 74-11 when scoring 20 or more points in a game.

30+ POINTS EQUALS VICTORY

Under Tommy Tuberville, Auburn is 37-0 when scoring 30 or more points in a game. Auburn has won 42 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points.

The last time the Tigers lost when registering at least 30 points was a 56-49, four overtime loss to Georgia in 1996.

In the last 22 years, Auburn is 111-2 when scoring 30 points.

THREE AND OUT

Three Auburn football players achieved a rare academic feat, graduating from college in only three years. WR Ben Obomanu (Finance) received his diploma in May, 2005, while WR Lee Guess (Business Marketing) and NG T.J. Jackson (Public Business Administration) both graduated from Auburn in August, 2005, after just three years on campus.

TIGER GRADS

Auburn began the season with nine graduates on the roster, which was tied for second most among all Division 1-A football teams and was tops among SEC schools.

In addition to Guess, Jackson and Obomanu, the Tiger graduates include: DS Chas Crofoot (Entrepreneurial Family Business), C Steven Ross (Marketing), FB Jake Slaughter (Communications), TE Cooper Wallace (Business Administration), LB Antarrrious Williams (Criminology) and LB Travis Williams (Criminology).

In December, Wayne Dickens, Kevin Hobbs and Troy Reddick all earned degrees, giving Auburn 12 graduates that were on the team at the Capital One Bowl.

The 2005 senior class at Auburn posted a 39-12 record over the past four seasons, tying the school record for most victories during a four-year period, while also winning one outright SEC Championship, sharing two SEC Western Division titles and playing in four bowl games (2003 Capital One, 2003 Music City, 2005 Sugar, 2006 Capital One).

Of the 15 Auburn seniors, one earned All-American honors, six were named to an All-SEC team and nine had graduated prior to playing their final game at the 2006 Capital One Bowl.

Georgia Tech forced five second-half turnovers and withstood Brandon Cox's 342 yards passing as the Yellow Jackets ended Auburn's 15-game win streak with a 23-14 victory in the season opener at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Cox's 342 yards on the night were the most passing yards for an Auburn quarterback in his first career start. Cox finished the night 22-of-44 with two touchdowns and four interceptions. The four interceptions led to six Georgia Tech points on two field goals and helped offset Auburn's 392-313 edge in total yards.

Auburn was held to just 50 yards on 23 carries on the ground, while the Tech offense ran for 139 yards on 39 rushes.

Georgia Tech running back P.J. Daniels led the team with 23 rushes for a game-best 111 yards with one touchdown. Jackets quarterback Reggie Ball completed 17-of-36 passes for 174 yards including a 35-yard touchdown pass to Calvin Johnson in the first quarter.

After the Ball to Johnson touchdown, Georgia Tech followed up with a 32-yard Travis Bell field goal with 5:29 remaining in the first quarter, giving the Yellow Jackets a 10-0 advantage.

Auburn first scored on a 39-yard Cox pass to Devin Aromashodu 43 seconds into the second quarter. A John Vaughn extra point put the Tigers within three, 10-7.

Georgia Tech answered back late in the half on a Daniels two-yard touchdown run, culminating from a 77-yard drive with 1:48 left in the second. The Bell extra point again gave the Yellow Jackets a 10-point cushion over the Tigers, 17-7.

Just 1:07 later, Auburn attempted to break up the Tech momentum with a score of its own. Cox connected with AU wide receiver Ben Obomanu for a 15-yard touchdown, capping off a six-play, 61-yard drive. After another

Vaughn extra point, Auburn headed into the lockerroom down 17-14.

Auburn rebounded from a season-opening loss to shut out Mississippi State 28-0 in the teams Southeastern Conference opener as the Tigers scored a touchdown in each of the four quarters of play.

Auburn's win over Mississippi State gave the Tigers a 10-game win streak in SEC conference games and an 11-game streak over SEC member teams.

Auburn quarterback Brandon Cox threw to nine different receivers for a 12-of-18 effort for 202 yards passing. Auburn tight ends appeared to be the targets of choice as Cooper Wallace had a team-high three receptions for 21 yards and Cole Bennett grabbed two passes for 45 yards and a touchdown.

Carl Stewart rushed for 44 yards on nine carries on the day and was followed by Brad Lester with 39 yards on six carries. Kenny Irons added 35 yards on 13 carries.

Auburn got on the board on its second drive with a 33-yard pass to Bennett from Cox at the 6:56 mark in the first quarter.

On the Tigers' ensuing possession, Cox found Devin Aromashodu from 5-yards out, giving Auburn a 14-0 lead with 13:04 remaining in the second quarter.

The Auburn defense remained strong, giving Auburn an opportunity for a shutout. The Tigers added to their lead as safety Will Herring rounded up a Mississippi State fumble in the end zone, giving Auburn a 21-0 advantage.

Auburn had a few firsts down the stretch including the Tigers' final score of the day, a 6-yard touchdown rush by Brad Lester, the first of his career. In just three plays and 30 yards, Auburn captured its 28-0 shutout of the Bulldogs.

With 202 yards passing on the day, Cox became the first Auburn quarterback since Dameyune Craig in 1997 to throw for more than 200 yards in the first two games of the season.

Mississippi State quarterback Omarr Conner completed 10 passes for 116 yards and one interception and was sacked five times by the Auburn defense. Tee Milons led the team with four receptions for 54 yards and Derek Ambrose collected 42 yards on six carries.

Mississippi State troubles continued with the loss to Auburn as the game marked the 13th consecutive road loss and the 18th straight SEC road loss for the Bulldogs.

The Auburn offense was running on all cylinders against Ball State as the Tigers scored on all nine possessions in a 63-3 victory over the Cardinals.

Senior Ben Obomanu and freshman Prechae Rodriguez each caught

passes for 39 yards on the day and Obomanu added a 3-yard touchdown reception from quarterback Brandon Cox with just :30 remaining in the first half of play.

Cox completed 16-of-19 passes for 171 yards and one touchdown.

For the first time in the 2005 season, Auburn found itself on the road and passed the test behind a 182-yard rushing performance by Kenny Irons as the Tigers defeated Arkansas 34-17 at Reynolds Razorback Stadium.

The victory improved Auburn's consecutive win streak over SEC teams to 13 and its SEC road win streak to five games.

Irons' career-high 182 yards on 33 carries gave him the top single-game performance in the Southeastern Conference to date in 2005.

Auburn continued its domination in the red zone as it scored on all six chances.

For the first time since the season-opener against Georgia Tech, the Tigers found themselves down as Arkansas jumped out to a 10-6 lead in the first half.

Auburn and quarterback Brandon Cox, responded with three second half touchdowns in the air and a rushing TD from Tre Smith. Cox ended the game completing 17-of-26 for 203 yards and three touchdowns.

Kenny Irons catapulted himself into the Auburn record books with a 218-yard rushing performance at No. 7 LSU, but it was not enough, as LSU defeated Auburn 20-17 in overtime at Tiger Stadium.

The loss halted Auburn's 13-game win streak over SEC teams and continued the trend of home team victories in the series, extending it to six games.

Irons' 218 yards made him just the 14th player in Auburn history to rush for over 200 yards and the first since Carnell Williams ran for 204 against Alabama on Nov. 22, 2003.

The Auburn defense held LSU to 4-of-15 on third down conversions and allowed just one offensive touchdown on the night.

Brandon Cox finished the night completing 16-of-40 passes for 221 yards and a touchdown to Anthony Mix.

Auburn capped off its scoring with a 13-play, 87-yard drive, which ended with a fourth down 5-yard touchdown pass from Cox to Mix with 4:52 remaining.

LSU answered Auburn's score with an eight-play, 48-yard drive which set up a Chris Jackson 44-yard field goal with 1:40 remaining in regulation to tie the game, 17-17.

In overtime, Jackson struck again with a 30-yarder to give LSU the 20-17 advantage.

Vaughn came in for Auburn to attempt a 39-yard field goal to send the game into double overtime, but the kick hit the left upright, giving LSU the win.

Led by Irons' 218 yards, Auburn rushed for 230 yards against the SEC's top run defense.

The Auburn defense held Ole Miss to just 23 yards rushing on 27 attempts and running back Kenny Irons notched his third consecutive 100-yard rushing game as the Tigers defeated the Rebels 27-3 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

For the fourth time in the 2005 season, Auburn held its opponent to a single-digit score with UM's Matt Hinkle connecting on a 43-yard field goal in the second quarter for Ole Miss' lone score of the game.

Irons finished with 101 yards and one touchdown on 32 attempts. Irons' 101 yards versus Ole Miss made him the first player since Carnell Williams in 2003 to rush for three consecutive 100-yard games.

Wide receiver Courtney Taylor took on a different role for Auburn's first score of the game. Taylor connected on a 28-yard pass to Devin Aromashodu in the end zone early in the second quarter.

Kicker John Vaughn had a solid day connecting on 35 and 39-yard field goals in the second quarter.

In the third quarter, Auburn added to its point total on a 1-yard Brandon Cox pass to Ben Obomanu for a touchdown. Obomanu finished the game with 43 yards rushing and 8 yards receiving.

Irons' rushing TD from 4 yards out in the fourth quarter capped the scoring for the Tigers.

While Irons led the ground game, sophomore wideout Prechae Rodriguez tied a career best three catches for 55 yards.

Cox finished the game completing 17-of-27 for 205 yards and a touchdown.

On the other side of the ball, defensive end Marquies Gunn finished the day with a career-high three tackles for loss, including a quarterback sack.

Steve Gandy, earning his first career start, intercepted a pass in the second quarter and ran it back 29 yards, the longest interception return for the Tigers this season.

Auburn (7-2, 5-1 SEC) relied on its ground game, rushing for 388 yards and six touchdowns, as the 17th-ranked Tigers defeated Kentucky (2-6, 1-4 SEC), 49-27, in their first game in the Blue Grass State since 1995. It was Auburn's 15th consecutive win over the Wildcats dating back to 1966.

Running back Kenny Irons posted his fourth consecutive 100-yard rushing game, as the junior ran for 103 yards on 23 attempts with three touchdowns--all in the first half.

Defensive back turned running back Tristan Davis gained a team-high 162 yards on just eight carries, for an average of 20.5 yards per carry, including a 75-yard TD run on his first touch of the game. Tre Smith added 99 yards on 13 attempts, including a 46-yard TD run.

After the Tigers fell behind 7-0 early in the first quarter, Irons scored from 9-yards out midway through the first to tie the game then gave Auburn the lead for good early in the second quarter with a 1-yard touchdown run.

Quarterback Brandon Cox, who finished the day 13-of-21 for 201 yards, connected with Prechae Rodriguez for a 41-yard TD in the second quarter and Irons scored from the 2-yard line with less than a minute left in the half, giving AU a 28-10 lead.

Auburn used a steady diet of running plays in the second half, gaining 255 yards on 24 carries, including Davis' 75-yard score on its second possession of the half and a 46-yard TD run by Smith on its final possession of the game.

The Tigers finished with 589 yards of total offense, the third most in the Tommy Tuberville Era, and had five touchdown drives of 75 yards or more.

Defensively, junior Stanley McClover had seven stops including four for loss and two sacks. Quentin Groves added three TFLs and two sacks while cornerback Jonathan Wilhite had seven tackles and his first career interception.

UK running back Rafael Little had 124 yards rushing and 122 yard receiving, while wide out Keenan Burton had 100 yards receiving.

The Deep South's oldest rivalry also proved to be the most exciting as Auburn defeated No. 9 Georgia 31-30 in Athens in a game that had nine lead changes, including four in the final quarter.

Junior placekicker John Vaughn's 20-yard field goal with :06 remaining was the game winner, giving the Tigers their 10th win in the last 12 tries in Athens.

The field goal was set up four plays earlier by a 62-yard reception from quarterback Brandon Cox to Devin Aromashodu on a 4th-and-10 from the Auburn 35-yard line. Auburn's game-winning drive which started with 3:25 remaining in the game, took up 77 yards in 10 plays over 3:19.

Auburn led 21-20 entering the fourth quarter and the two teams traded touchdowns, including linebacker Karibi Dede's 15-yard fumble return giving the Tigers a 28-27 advantage.

The lead was short lived as Georgia took a 30-28 lead 2:20 later on a 41-yard field goal by Brandon Coutu.

AU running back Kenny Irons extended his streak of 100-yard rushing games to five consecutive with a 179-yard, two-touchdown performance on 37 carries. Irons led the Tigers' offensive attack in the first half, rushing for 125 yards and two touchdowns on 19 carries.

The Tigers totalled 506 yards of total offense, while the Bulldogs countered with 446 yards of their own. Cox completed 16-of-28 for 279 yards on the evening while Georgia signal caller D.J. Shockley was 20-of-36 with 306 yards and two TDs.

Aromashodu led Auburn's receivers with four receptions for a career-high 135 yards including catches of 62 and 53 yards.

Dede, who recovered two fumbles, snatched one on special teams setting up a 30-yard touchdown on an end around by Ben Obomanu midway through the third quarter.

DB David Irons and LB Antarrrious Williams led the Tigers defensively with six tackles each.

Auburn won its fourth straight game over Alabama in convincing fashion, scoring three first-quarter touchdowns against the nation's top scoring defense en route to a 28-18 victory over the No. 8 Crimson Tide at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The victory gave the Tigers a share of the SEC Western Division crown. It is the Tigers' fifth SEC West title in Tommy Tuberville's seven-year tenure as head coach.

The win put No. 11 Auburn (9-2 overall, 7-1 Southeastern Conference) on a four-game winning streak against the Crimson Tide for the first time since 1986-89. It also marked Auburn's sixth win in its last seven games against top 10 teams.

The Tiger offense was led by running back Kenny Irons, who finished with 103 yards rushing -- his sixth straight game over the century mark -- and wide receiver Ben Obomanu, who had both a receiving and rushing touchdown. Quarterback Brandon Cox, meanwhile, finished 14-of-21 for 118 yards and two touchdowns.

The Auburn defense picked up where the team's offense left off, holding the Crimson Tide (9-2, 6-2) to 188 total yards of offense while posting a season-high 11 sacks. Stanley McClover led the team with 3.5 sacks and four tackles for losses. He was followed closely by T.J. Jackson and Antarrrious Williams, who both had 1.5 sacks in their final game at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Obomanu opened the game's scoring with a 7-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter. It was the 18th of his career, moving him into sole possession of second place in AU history.

Three minutes later, the Tigers saw Irons cross the plane on an 8-yard run to make it 14-0.

Obomanu made it a comfortable 21-0 lead at the 4:01 mark of the first quarter when he scored on a 45-yard reverse.

The Crimson Tide scored its first points of the game early in the second quarter on a Tim Castille 1-yard touchdown run.

Cole Bennett finished Auburn's scoring with a 5-yard touchdown reception at the 2:07 mark of the second quarter.

Alabama added a field goal in the third quarter and a 1-yard touchdown run by backup quarterback John Parker Wilson with 23 seconds left in the fourth, but it was not enough to overcome Auburn's fast start.

Brian Calhoun rushed for 213 yards and one touchdown and John Stocco passed for 301 yards and two scores as Wisconsin defeated Auburn, 24-10, in the 2006 Capital One Bowl.

The loss snapped Auburn's three game bowl winning streak, and left the Tigers 9-3 on the season.

Wisconsin took a 17-0 lead into halftime, and saw the Tigers mount a 10 point comeback early in the fourth quarter. Brandon Cox found Courtney Taylor for a 9 yard score at the 14:49 mark of the fourth to pull Auburn within seven.

However, Calhoun rushed for a 33 yard touchdown less than two minutes later, giving the Badgers the final 24-10 outcome.

Cox finished 15 of 33 for 137 yards and one touchdown in the final game of his sophomore season. Kenny Irons rushed for 88 yards giving him 1,293 on the season -- the sixth best single season mark in Auburn history.

Ben Obomanu ended his Auburn career with five receptions for 62 yards. His senior counterpart, Anthony Mix, caught 2 passes for 11 yards, giving him 1,010 yards in his career.

Wisconsin opened the game's scoring when Stocco found Brandon Williams on a 30 yard reception at the 7:55 mark of the first quarter.

Taylor Mehlhaff connected on his only field goal of the day, a 19 yarder, at the end of the first quarter, then watched as Stocco find Owen Daniels for a 13 yard touchdown pass in the second quarter.

John Vaughn connected on a 19 yard field goal, his 12th of the season, in the third quarter to put Auburn on the board.

Defensively, David Irons led the Tigers with 11 tackles.

Davis played both running back and safety for the Tigers, scoring a touchdown and then recording a tackle on the next Ball State possession.

Western Kentucky

Auburn improved to 69 8 5 all time on Homecoming, and won its 13th straight homecoming game ... Auburn was forced to punt on its third possession, snapping a string of 10 consecutive drives (plus one kickoff return for a touchdown) by Auburn that resulted in scores, with nine touchdowns and one field goal ... Auburn held Western Kentucky scoreless in the first half, holding a 24 0 lead at the break. It marked the third straight game that Auburn had not allowed a first half point ... Auburn allowed its first touchdown since the second quarter of the season opener against Georgia Tech with 11:54 left in the fourth quarter. It snapped a string of 13 straight quarters in which Auburn had not allowed a touchdown, and it was the first touchdown in 199:34 against the Tigers ... Blake Field made his first collegiate start in place of Brandon Cox, and completed 13 of 21 passes for 200 yards and three touchdowns. It was the first time an Auburn quarterback threw three TD passes in a game since Jason Campbell last season vs. Tennessee ... Fields' first nine completions went to nine different receivers, and he finished the game completing passes to 10 different players ... Field's 38 yard screen pass for a touchdown to Brad Lester was the first touchdown pass of the quarterback's career ... Lester's touchdown reception was his first career scoring catch, and it was his fourth touchdown in the last two weeks ... Kenny Irons bettered the 100 yard mark in rushing before halftime for the second straight game. Irons had 16 carries for 108 yards in the first half, and ended the game with 111 yards on 18 carries ... John Vaughn tied his career high with three field goals (28, 20, 32). He previously kicked three field goals in the 2005 NOKIA Sugar Bowl (23, 19, 24) ... Lee Guess, who missed the first three games due to injury, caught his first pass of the season in the fourth quarter, covering 24 yards. He caught his second pass two plays later, a 13 yard touchdown strike from Field ... Zach Gilbert's fourth quarter interception was the first of his career, returning the interception for 26 yards.

South Carolina

Auburn's 41 point margin of victory was South Carolina head coach Steve Spurrier's second worst loss as a head coach at any level. Spurrier's worst loss was a 45 3 defeat at the hands of Tennessee in 1990 ... Auburn did not allow a point in the first half for the fourth straight game and outscored its opponents 104 0 in the first half during those games ... Auburn scored on its opening drive for the third straight week ... Auburn's 31 0 halftime lead was its largest halftime lead against a conference opponent since Oct. 18, 2003, when the Tigers led Mississippi State 38 7 at the break ... Auburn allowed a second quarter sack, which was the first sack surrendered by the Tigers since allowing one in the third quarter vs. Mississippi State Sept. 10 ... Kenny Irons rushed for two touchdowns in the first half, scoring on a 1 yard run in the first quarter and a two yard plunge in the second period. It gave Irons five rushing touchdowns in the last three weeks ... Wayne Dickens had his first career fumble recovery in the first quarter ... Brad Lester had his fourth and fifth rushing touchdowns of the season ... Ben Obomanu caught his 16th career touchdown pass in the second quarter, a 15 yarder from Brandon Cox. The touchdown moved Obomanu into sole possession of third place on Auburn's career touchdown receptions list ... Brandon Cox completed passes to 10 different receivers, and connected on 19 of 29 passes for 245 yards one touchdown and no interceptions. Cox had not been picked off since the season opener against Georgia Tech ... Carl Stewart's 1 yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter was his second of the season and the fourth of his career.

Arkansas

Auburn won its third straight game vs. Arkansas, marking the first three game winning streak for either team in the 15 game series ... Auburn won its 12th consecutive SEC game and 13th straight game against SEC opponent ... Auburn's 13 consecutive wins against SEC opponents was one shy of the school record set in 1993-94 ... Auburn extended its SEC road winning streak to five games ... Auburn improved to 3-0 in the SEC for the fifth time in the last six seasons ... Auburn was playing its first road game of the season. Auburn and Nebraska, which also played its first road game Oct. 15, were the last two Division I A teams to play a road game this season ... Arkansas' first quarter field goal marked the first points allowed by Auburn in the first half this season since the season opener vs. Georgia Tech. The Tigers had shut out their last four opponents during the first half ... Will Herring's blocked field goal in the second quarter was the second blocked field goal by the Tigers this year ... Arkansas' 10 first half points all came after Auburn turnovers. Prior to the game, the Tigers had allowed just six points off turnovers all season ... Auburn outscored Arkansas 14-0 in the third quarter, moving its scoring advantage to 51-3 in the third quarter this season ... Auburn was six of six on scoring opportunities in the red zone (four touchdowns, two field goals), improving to an SEC best 28 of 30 in the red zone this season ... Brad Lester made his first career start at tailback for Auburn ... Kenny Irons finished with a career high 182 yards rushing on 33 carries. It marked his third 100 yard rushing game of the season and third in the last four contests ... Brandon Cox completed 17 of 26 passes for 203 yards and three touchdowns ... Devin Aromashodu's 98 yards receiving pushed his career total to 1,068. He became the 20th Auburn player to surpass 1,000 yards receiving and joined Courtney Taylor and Ben Obomanu to mark the first time in Auburn history that the Tigers have had three players with 1,000 career receiving yards on their team at one time ... Brandon Cox's interception on the opening drive was his first interception thrown, and the first thrown by any Tiger, since the season opener vs. Georgia Tech. Cox had thrown 69 straight passes without an interception ... Karibi Dede had his first career interception in the fourth quarter on a pass that was deflected by Montavis Pitts ... Tre Smith's 5 yard touchdown reception in the third quarter was his second career receiving touchdown, and first since a 5 yard TD grab his freshman season against Louisiana Monroe ... Smith's 7 yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter is his second of the season ... Cooper Wallace's 9 yard touchdown catch in the fourth quarter was his first touchdown reception of the season and the fourth of his career.

LSU

Auburn's streak of 12 consecutive SEC victories came to a close with the 20-17 overtime loss at LSU ... Auburn fell to 3-4 in overtime games. The Tigers' last overtime game was a 30-23 loss at Florida on Oct. 19, 2002 ... Skyler Green's 66 yard punt return for a touchdown was the first punt returned for a touchdown vs. Auburn since James Riddle of Syracuse went 85 yards in 2002 ... Auburn trailed at the half, 7-3. It marked just the third time this season that Auburn has trailed at the half (Georgia Tech, Arkansas) ... The Auburn defense held LSU to 111 total yards and no offensive touchdowns in the first half. LSU entered the game averaging 386.4 yards and 30.8 points per game ... LSU's third quarter touchdown was the first touchdown allowed by Auburn in the third quarter this season. Auburn entered the game with a 51-3 advantage in points scored during the third quarter ... Auburn trailed 14-10 entering the fourth quarter. It was just the second time this season that Auburn trailed after three quarters (Georgia Tech) ... Kenny Irons' 218 yards rushing vs. LSU ranks 14th in Auburn's single game rushing list. Irons is just the 14th player in school history to rush for over 200 yards in a single game. The last Tiger to rush for 200+ yards in a game was Carnell Williams with 204 vs. Alabama on Nov. 22, 2003 ... Irons' 74 yard touchdown run in the third quarter was a career long rush for Irons and the longest play from scrimmage for Auburn this season. The previous long was a 70 yard run by Brad Lester vs. Ball State ... Irons' 74 yard burst is tied for the 24th longest rush in Auburn history and the longest since Carnell Williams went 80 yards on the first play of the 2003 game vs. Alabama ... Kody Bliss had a 63 yard punt late in the second quarter that went out of bounds at the LSU 4 yardline. It was a season and career long punt for Bliss, whose previous career long was a 62 yard boot in 2003 vs. Louisiana

Monroe ... Jake Slaughter's 19 yard reception in the third quarter was his first reception since 2003 and the fourth of his career ... Anthony Mix's 5 yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter was his second of the season and the seventh of his career.

Ole Miss

Auburn became bowl eligible for the sixth consecutive season. Auburn had not been to at least six straight bowls since going to nine straight from 1982-90 ... Auburn won its eighth consecutive SEC home game and 10th of its last 11 ... Ole Miss finished with just 23 yards rushing. It marked the seventh time in the last nine meetings that Auburn has held Ole Miss to fewer than 100 yards rushing ... Ole Miss passed for 186 yards. The Auburn defense had not allowed an opponent to throw for 200 yards in a game this season ... Auburn scored first on a 28 yard pass from Courtney Taylor to Devin Aromashodu in the second quarter. It was the fifth time this season that the Tigers have scored first ... The Auburn defense held Ole Miss to just three points, marking the fourth game this season the Tigers have held opponents to single digits ... In SEC play this season, the Auburn defense allowed its first five opponents just 47 total points, an average of 9.4 per game ... Kenny Irons ran for 101 yards on 32 carries, giving him over 100 yards rushing for a third consecutive game ... Ben Obomanu caught his 17th career touchdown pass in the third quarter, tying him for second in Auburn history with Karsten Bailey (1995-98) ... Courtney Taylor's 28 yard touchdown pass to WR Devin Aromashodu in the second quarter was his first pass thrown during his collegiate career, and the first by any Auburn wideout since Tim Carter completed a 39 yard pass to Marcel Willis in 2000 at Florida. It was the first touchdown pass thrown by an Auburn non-quarterback since Carnell Williams hit Anthony Mix for a 29 yard score vs. Georgia in 2004 ... Brandon Cox finished with 205 yards passing. It was the sixth time in seven games that Cox threw for at least 200 yards ... Marquies Gunn finished with three tackles for losses, which was a new career high, including a quarterback sack ... Carl Stewart's 25 yard pass reception in the first quarter was the longest reception of his career ... Devin Aromashodu's touchdown catch was his fourth of the season and the ninth of his career ... Steve Gandy, making his first career start, had his first career interception in the second period, returning it 29 yards.

Kentucky

Auburn won its 15th straight game against Kentucky since the Wildcats last victory in 1966 ... Auburn's 80 yard touchdown drive on the opening possession was the Tigers' eighth scoring drive of 80 or more yards this season ... Auburn led 28-10 at the half. The Tigers improved to 6-0 when leading at the half this season ... Auburn outscored Kentucky 21-3 in the second quarter, improving their scoring margin to 113-20 in the second quarter this season ... In Auburn's last seven games against Kentucky, the Tigers have had 27 rushing touchdowns and six passing touchdowns ... One more rushing yard for Tre Smith (99 yards) would have resulted in Auburn having three Tigers rush for 100 or more yards in a single game for the first time since 1983 when Tommie Agee (219), Lionel James (115) and Bo Jackson (105) accomplished the feat. Tristan Davis rushed for 162 yards and Kenny Irons 103 vs. Kentucky ... Irons had his fourth straight 100 yard rushing game and his sixth of the season. It was the third time this season he had over 100 yards rushing in the first half ... Irons had three rushing touchdowns in the first half, giving him 10 rushing touchdowns this season. Carnell Williams was the last Auburn back to have three or more rushing touchdowns in a game, scoring six times on the ground vs. Mississippi State in 2003 ... Irons became the 19th player in school history to rush for 10 or more rushing touchdowns in a single season ... Irons carried the ball 23 times, all in the first half, giving him 115 rushing attempts in his last four games ... Tristan Davis also surpassed 100 yards rushing, finishing with 162, marking the first time Auburn has had two backs rush for more than 100 yards since Ronnie Brown (147) and Carnell Williams (122) both went over the century mark in 2004 at Mississippi State ... Brandon Cox finished with 201 yards passing, giving him seven games with 200 or more passing yards this season ... With two catches for 28 yards, Anthony Mix moved into Auburn's top 20 for career pass receptions ... Prechae Rodriguez caught a 41 yard touchdown pass from Brandon Cox in the second quarter.

It was the first touchdown catch of Rodriguez's career ... Tristan Davis' 75 yard touchdown run in the third quarter was his second rushing touchdown of the season on just his third attempt. He had a 52 yard touchdown run earlier this season vs. Ball State, giving him 124 yards rushing on his first three career attempts ... Davis' 75 yard run was the longest play from scrimmage for Auburn this season, surpassing Kenny Irons' 74 yard touchdown run at LSU. It was tied for the 23rd longest run in Auburn history ... Kody Bliss had punts of 59 and 57 yards ... Jonathan Willhite had his first career interception in the third quarter. Willhite became the eighth different Tiger to intercept a pass this season ... Tre Smith's 46 yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter marked his third rushing TD this season and the 12th rushing TD of his career ... Tristan Davis just missed setting the Auburn record for single game highest yards per rush average (20.25, eight carries for 162 yards). Brent Fullwood averaged 20.7 yards per rush vs. Vanderbilt in 1986 with 145 yards on seven carries.

Georgia

Auburn won for the 10th time in its last 12 games in Athens ... Auburn moved one game ahead of Georgia for the best record in the SEC since 2000 with a record of 35 12 during that span ... The 31 points scored by Auburn were the most allowed by Georgia this season and the most since 2003 ... Auburn's 92 yard touchdown drive on the opening possession was its longest of the season in terms of yards ... Georgia entered the game allowing an average of 13.8 points and 288.9 yards per game. Auburn scored 14 points and had 274 yards in the first half alone ... Auburn won its 11th game in its last 16 tries vs. teams ranked in the top 10 ... John Vaughn's 20 yard field goal late in the fourth quarter gave the Tigers their first fourth quarter comeback since a 10 9 victory over LSU in 2004. Vaughn also kicked the extra point to give Auburn the win in that game ... There were nine lead changes in the game, including four in the fourth quarter ... Kenny Irons surpassed the 1,000 yard rushing mark for the season, marking the 17th 1,000 yard season in Auburn history ... Irons went over the 100 yard rushing mark on his 14th carry in the second quarter. It was the fourth time this season he surpassed 100 yards rushing in the first half ... Irons had his seventh 100 yard rushing game of the season, tying for third most in a single season in Auburn history ... Irons had his fifth consecutive 100 yard rushing game, tying for the second best streak in Auburn history and the longest since Rudi Johnson in 2000 ... Irons' two touchdown runs in the first half (30 and 6 yards) gave him 12 for the season, moving him into a tie for ninth on Auburn's single season rushing touchdowns list ... Devin Aromashodu had 135 receiving yards, which is a season best for Auburn and the most since a 150 yard receiving performance from Ben Obomanu vs. Ole Miss in 2003 ... Brandon Cox threw for 279 yards for his eighth 200 yard passing game of the season, moving him into sole possession of third place in Auburn's single season history ... Cox threw for more than 200 yards for the sixth straight game, moving him into a tie for second in Auburn history for consecutive 200 yard passing games. Pat Sullivan holds the record with seven in 1970 ... Cox was intercepted on Auburn's second drive, snapping a string of 110 consecutive passes thrown without an interception. Cox had not been picked off since the first half of an Oct. 15 game at Arkansas ... Brad Lester had a 30 yard run on his first carry since Oct. 15 at Arkansas. It was his fourth run of at least 20 yards this season ... Ben Obomanu's 30 yard touchdown run in the third quarter was his first career rushing touchdown ... Brandon Cox's 53 yard pass to Devin Aromashodu in the fourth quarter was Auburn's longest pass play of the season. The previous long was a 41 yard touchdown strike to Prechae Rodriguez at Kentucky ... Karibi Dede recovered two fumbles, returning one 15 yards for a touchdown ... Dede's fumble recovery was the second defensive score of the season for Auburn.

Alabama

Auburn won its fourth straight game over Alabama for the first time since 1986 89 ... The last time Auburn beat an Alabama team ranked eighth or higher was in 1989 (No. 2 Alabama) ... Auburn improved to 12 5 in its last 17 games against teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 10, winning five of its last six ... Auburn clinched a share of the SEC Western Division title, and has now won or shared six of the last seven SEC Western Division titles ... Auburn's 15 seniors played their final game in Jordan Hare Stadium.

Auburn improved to 39 11 over the past four seasons, tying for the most wins during a four year span in Auburn history ... Auburn has won 22 games over the past two seasons, which is the most over a two year span in school history ... The Tigers improved to 7 0 this season when scoring first ... Auburn led 21 0 at the end of the first quarter. The 21 points scored by Auburn in the opening period were the most scored by Auburn against Alabama in any quarter since the Tigers scored 21 points during the fourth quarter of a 49 26 Auburn victory in 1969 ... The Auburn defense held Alabama to minus 17 yards of offense in the first quarter, including minus 35 yards during Alabama's first four drives ... The Auburn defense recorded a school record 11 sacks, including five in the first quarter alone ... Auburn scored more points in the first half (28) than Alabama had allowed in any game this season ... The 28 first half points scored by Auburn were the most by the Tigers against Alabama in any half since Auburn scored 35 second half points vs. the Tide in 1969 ... Ben Obomanu's seven yard touchdown reception was the 18th touchdown catch of his career, moving him into sole possession of second on Auburn's career touchdown receptions list ... Obomanu's 45 yard touchdown run marked his second consecutive game with a touchdown run ... With two touchdown passes, Brandon Cox moved into a tie for eighth on Auburn's single season touchdown passes list with 14 ... Kenny Irons finished with 103 yards rushing, marking his eighth 100 yard rushing game of the season and sixth in a row. His eight 100 yard games is tied for second most in a season in Auburn history with Bo Jackson in 1985, and his six straight 100 yard games is the second best streak in school history, one behind Joe Cribbs' record of seven set in 1978 ... Irons' eight yard touchdown run in the first quarter was the 13th of the season, moving him into a tie for sixth on the school's single season rushing touchdowns chart. It was his fifth consecutive game with a rushing touchdown ... With an 18 yard reception in the second quarter, Anthony Mix became the fourth current Auburn player to surpass 1,000 career receiving yards. It is the first known occurrence in SEC history of one team having four career 1,000 yard receivers on its squad at the same time. However, Mix later lost two yards on his next catch, pushing his career total back to 999 ... Cole Bennett had his second touchdown catch of the season and first since the Mississippi State game in the second quarter. It was his third receiving touchdown of his career and fourth overall ... John Vaughn made four extra points, and in the process, became Auburn's all time leader in extra points made and attempted, passing Damon Duvall (1999 2002) in both categories. Vaughn improved to 127 of 128 for his career in extra points.

Wisconsin

Wisconsin broke Auburn's three game win streak in bowl games ... Auburn is 17 13 2 in bowl games and 12 6 1 in its last 19 ... The 24 10 loss to Wisconsin was the Tigers' first bowl loss since the 2001 Peach Bowl in a 16 10 loss on Dec. 31 ... Tommy Tuberville is now 3 3 as Auburn's head coach in bowl games, and 4 3 overall in bowl games ... Auburn's 17 0 deficit in the second quarter was its largest since 2003 when the Tigers trailed Georgia 26 0. The most points Auburn had trailed by this season had been a 10 0 deficit against Georgia Tech in the season opener ... Auburn was shut out during the opening half for the first time since trailing 6 0 at halftime against Alabama in 2004 ... Brian Calhoun's 213 yards rushing is the sixth most yards given up by Auburn in school history ... Kenny Irons finished with 88 yards rushing on the day and moved into sixth place on Auburn's single season rushing list with 1,293 yards ... Ben Obomanu had five receptions on the day, pushing his career total to 97, which ranks eighth in school history behind Courtney Taylor, who is in a tie for sixth with 99 (Freddy Weygand) ... Devin Aromashodu finished with 16 yards receiving moving up one spot to 11th in school history with 1333 career yards ... With a 10 yard reception in the first quarter, Anthony Mix became the fourth current Auburn player to surpass 1,000 career receiving yards. It is the first known occurrence in SEC history of one team having four career 1,000 yard receivers on its squad at the same time ... Kody Bliss' 58 yard punt in the second quarter was his 11th punt of at least 50 yards this season ... Stanley McClover's sack in the third quarter was his eighth of the season. McClover had 7.5 sacks in his last four games ... Courtney Taylor's 9 yard touchdown catch in the fourth quarter was his first touchdown reception of the season and the seventh of his career.
