The Game ... Auburn hosts Houston in a non-conference tilt Thursday at Jane B. Moore Field. The game is the first meeting between the clubs.

Doubleheader Loss To Georgia ... Holly Currie went 3 for 3 with a double and a home run but the Tigers could not rally, losing to No. 19 Georgia, 5-2, in the second game of a doubleheader Wednesday at Jane B. Moore Field. Earlier, the Tigers lost to the Bulldogs, 4-0, in the first game.

Currie homered in the seventh after singling in the first and doubling in the fifth. She also walked in the third. Currie's homer scored Ashley Arcuri, whose double started the inning and gave her one in five of her last seven games.

Anna Thompson no-hit Georgia through five innings in game one, but the Bulldogs took advantage of three Tiger errors in the sixth to score six runs. That's all the Bulldogs needed in the win.

Coming Up ... Auburn stays at home and hosts Ole Miss in a three-game series that begins Saturday and closes Sunday. The Tigers and Rebels will square off Saturday in a doubleheader that begins at 4 p.m. CT. Sunday's game is at 1 p.m.

After Ole Miss, the Tigers will take a week off before playing at Mississippi State March 24-25 in a three-game series.

A Look At Houston ... The Cougars, preseason selections to win Conference USA, are coming off a 2-1 loss at Georgia Tech Wednesday night. Houston is a pitching dominated team, evidenced by a 1.28 ERA and 219 strikeouts in 202 innings.

Angel Shamblin sports a 1.10 ERA in 115 innings. She is 12-5 with 146 strikeouts while walking just 25. Barbie Love is close behind Shamblin with a 3-2 record and 1.05 ERA in 33 innings.

Offensively, Houston is batting .242 this season with 17 home runs and 71 RBI. Jessica Valis leads the club with a .343 batting average and four triples. Laura Durham paces the team with four home runs while Elaina Nordstrom leads the Cougars with 14 home runs.

The First Meeting ... Auburn and Houston will meet for the first time in each team's histories tonight. Auburn is 2-1 against teams it has faced for the first time this season. Included is a win over North Carolina and losses to Maryland and Virginia Tech.

Tiger Seniors ... Auburn's seniors have been the most accomplished group in team history, winning 141 games overall and 57 in SEC play since 2004.

The seniors have won nine games in 10 attempts against Kentucky.

Deese In 11th Season ... Auburn head coach Tina Deese is in her 11th season at the helm of the Auburn softball program and 19th overall. The former Huntingdon College head coach is 347-299-1 in 11 seasons with the Tigers and has taken Auburn to three straight NCAA postseason berths.

Deese is the only SEC head coach to remain with her club since its inception. She has the second-most tenure of any SEC coach, trailing South Carolina's Joyce Compton, who is in her 21st year with the Gamecocks.

Deese won her 600th career game in Auburn's 1-0 victory March 8 of the 2006 season. That came just a month after she won her 300th game at Auburn in 15-1 defeat of Miami (Ohio) in the second game of the season on Feb. 10.

727 And Counting ... Holly Currie's 727 career strikeouts ties her for the most in an Auburn career with Kristen Keyes, who pitched for the Tigers from 2002-04.

Duh, Duh, Double ... Sophomore Ashley Arcuri must be seeing double lately. She hit one in the second game against Georgia Wednesday night and now has a double in five of her last seven games. Arcuri has raised her average from .191 to .250 during that stretch.

Hold 'Em ... Anna Thompson has inherited 15 runners this season and allowed only two to score. That amounts to an 88.2 percent success rate.

Road Trip ... Auburn just wrapped up a 14-game road trip, finishing with an 8-6 record. The road trip marked the second-longest stretch away from home in team history, trailing only the 1997 club which spent 16 straight games away from home.

Then They Come Home ... When Auburn got back home March 14, it began a six-game homestand, first against Georgia. Houston (March 15) and Ole Miss will follow (March 17-18). That will mark the team's longest homestand of the season.

Jane B. Moore Field ... Auburn will call Jane B. Moore Field home for the 10th straight season. The venerable facility hosted its first game in 1998 and was officially dedicated in Dr. Moore's name in 2003. The facility, which hosted a 2005 NCAA Regional, seats 1,500 and will be the site of the 2007 SEC Tournament.

The Tigers are **134-84 (.615)** at Jane B. Moore Field since 1998 and are **68-22 (.755)** the past three seasons.

Last season, the Tigers rode a 19-win season at home as the team saw an average of 439 fans at Jane B. Moore Field, easily a record.

Extra Time ... Auburn has already played in five extra inning affairs this season in just 26 games. That already surpasses last season's total in which the Tigers went 2-3. This season's record? Try 2-4.

Auburn Players vs. Houston

Auburn and Houston will meet for the first time.

Thompson Hits 100 ... On the opposite end of the spectrum, freshman Anna Thompson has already reached 160 strikeouts this season, which sets an AU single-season freshman record. Thompson's 160 strikeouts is already the seventh-best single-season total among all pitchers. She is also sixth in career strikeouts.

Thompson has thrown 95 innings this season, averaging 1.69 strikeouts per inning. She's also just walked 30 batters this season. Her strikeouts to walk ratio is 5.3:1.

Ouch ... Myesha Finney has been getting on base this season, but it's costing her some bumps and bruises.

After getting hit once in the three-game series against the Wildcats, Finney has now been plunked 11 times this season, which is the second-most in a single-season. She has 20 for her career, which is third-most.

Raising Some Points ... Senior Sara Ghezzi has been on a hot streak of late, posting at least one hit in 14 of her last 18 games. Included in that was a nine-game hit streak from Feb. 17 to March 2. The streak was one off tying Ghezzi's career-best of 10 games set in 2005.

Ghezzi has raised her average from .172 to .284 since Feb. 17, which is a rise of 112 points.

Ranking Watch ... Ten teams ranked in the top 25 of the ESPN.com/USA Softball Top 25 are Auburn opponents this season. Meanwhile, 10 from the USA Today/NFCA Top 25 poll will face off against the Tigers this season.

Against The Ranks ... Auburn is 0-5 against teams ranked in the top 25 this season, but has allowed just 16 runs in those five games.

The Tigers are scheduled to play two games through the rest of March against teams in the top 25. LSU, which is 12th in the USA Softball Top 25, travels to Jane B. Moore Field for a three-game series March 31-April 1.

Change In The SEC Schedule ... The Southeastern Conference reduced its schedule by two games for the 2007 season, giving each team 28 conference games instead of the 30 that had been the norm since the SEC's inception in 1997.

First Meeting

Auburn and Houston will meet for the first time.

Beginning this year, teams will play 14 games on the road and at home. Each team will still play two midweek series -- one away and one at home -- although those will now be two games instead of three. Those games will be played as a doubleheader.

Pitch Count ... Anna Thompson has already thrown more than 100 pitches in a game seven times this season, including a season-high 139 pitches against both Hofstra and Nebraska. Holly Currie, meanwhile, has reached the century mark five times, topping out at 128 against Kentucky.

Auburn is 5-8 this season when a Tiger starter throws more than 100 pitches in a game.

One Assist, Two Assist, Three Assist, Four ... Well, make that five. Brittany Day finished with five assists in Auburn's loss to Southern Illinois in Columbus, Ga. That total marks a season high for any Tiger. Day, in fact, was starting just her second game of the season and went six innings, limiting the Salukis to just three hits and two runs.

Wyatt Makes A Big First Impression ... In just the fourth official at bat of her collegiate career, Whitney Wyatt made a big impression on the Tiger coaching staff.

Wyatt pinch hit for Lindsey Harrelson in the sixth inning against Hofstra Feb. 24. With two runners on and Auburn down, 2-1, Wyatt drove a pitch the other way and over the right field fence for a three-run shot. The home run proved to be the game winner as the Tigers held on for the 4-2 victory over the Pride.

Freshman SEC Of The Week ... Anna Thompson earned Auburn's first SEC weekly honor, taking the Freshman of the Week award Feb. 19. She earned the honor on the strength of a 2-0 record at the Tiger Invitational, where she posted a 1.52 ERA and 27 strikeouts in 18 1/3 innings.

Thompson is just the second Tiger to earn SEC Freshman honors after the conference instituted it last season. Tatiana Fernandez was the first.

Just Learn To Say 'No' ... Holly Currie's no-hitter against Georgia State Feb. 14 marked the seventh of her career. The senior holds the AU career record

for no-no's. She also holds the single-season record with five last season. She is the only Tiger with a perfect game, achieved February 11, 2005 against the College of Charleston.

TV Time ... Currently, the Tigers are scheduled to air on television once in the third game a three-game series at Tennessee. The game will be April 22 at 1 p.m. CT. and will air on Fox Sports.

Should the Tigers advance to the SEC Tournament Championship Game, they will be on Fox Sports at 12 p.m. CT.

SEC Coaches Vote AU Third ... Conference Coaches voted the Tigers third in the SEC West in a preseason poll that was announced Jan. 22. Auburn trails LSU and Alabama and was ahead of Arkansas, Mississippi State and Ole Miss.

Tennessee was selected to win the East and the conference overall, while Georgia was No. 2, Florida third, South Carolina fourth and Kentucky fifth.

Hosting The 2007 SEC Tournament ... Auburn's Jane B. Moore Field will be the site of the 2007 SEC Softball Tournament, scheduled to be held May 10-12. It marks the first time the tournament will come to Auburn as the Tigers are just the fourth program to host since it came on-campus in 2004. Alabama, Florida and Georgia have also hosted the tournament.

The SEC Tournament is a single-elimination tournament, with four games scheduled for the first day. The championship game will be held that Saturday with the winner guaranteed the conference's automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament.

SEC Tournament Tickets ... Tickets for the tournament went on sale Feb. 1. Single-session tickets are \$10 for adults and \$5 for youth (18 and younger). A full-tournament ticket can also be purchased for \$20 for adult and \$10 youth. It will be good for all seven games of the tournament.
