## In Memory of Kenny McKinley • 1987-2010

South Carolina's football family was stunned and saddened upon learning of the death of former Gamecock standout wide receiver Kenny McKinley on Monday night.

McKinley, 23, died Monday in Denver, Colo. He was drafted by the Denver Broncos in the fifth round of the 2009 NFL Draft and appeared in eight games for the Broncos in 2009 before being placed on injured reserve with a knee injury. He was back on IR in 2010 after another preseason knee injury.

McKinley finished his South Carolina career as the school's all-time leader in both career receptions (207) and career receiving yards (2,781). He also set a school record by catching a pass in 43 straight games from 2005-08. He scored 19 touchdowns during his Gamecock career.



## #12 Gamecocks, #14 Tigers Set for Showdown of SEC Unbeatens

### SETTING THE STAGE

• No. 12/15 South Carolina looks for a 4-0 start for only the ninth time in school history when it makes its first road trip of the 2010 season on Saturday, traveling to Auburn to face the #17/14 Tigers at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Kickoff is set for 7:47 p.m. with a national broadcast slated for ESPN and ESPN3D.

• The Gamecocks are 3-0 (1-0 SEC) after defeating in-state rival Furman on Saturday, 38-19. South Carolina held the Paladins to 51 rushing yards and recorded seven sacks in the contest while Stephon Gilmore returned an interception 80 yards for a touchdown to seal the victory. Auburn (3-0, 1-0) won a thriller over Clemson on Saturday, taking a 27-24 overtime victory when the Upstate Tigers missed a field goal that would have extended the game.

• This will be the first meeting between the two schools when both are nationally ranked.

### THE SERIES

• Today marks the ninth game in the series with Auburn, which dates back to 1930. The Gamecocks are 1-6-1 all-time against the Tigers, including an 0-2 mark in games played at Auburn's Jordan-Hare Stadium. Carolina has lost four straight in the series. Auburn won the last meeting, 24-17 in Columbia, on Sept. 28, 2006.

### QUICK HITS

- South Carolina, ranked 12th in the latest Associated Press Top 25, has its highest national ranking since the week of Oct. 20, 2007, when the Gamecocks were ranked No. 6. It marks the Gamecocks' eighth appearance in the top 20 under **Steve Spurrier**.
- The Gamecocks are in search of their first SEC road victory since a win over Kentucky on Oct. 11, 2008, a stretch of five contests.
- South Carolina ranks first in the SEC in rushing defense, allowing 59.7 yards per game on the ground. Conversely, Auburn's rushing offense is tops in the league, averaging 259.3 yards per game.
- The Gamecocks have not allowed a first-half touchdown this year, and only three total touchdowns (two offensive).
- South Carolina leads the SEC in third-down conversions with a 56.4% rate, converting 22-of-39 attempts. The Gamecocks also lead the league in time of possession, averaging 32:32 per game.

## A South Carolina win over Auburn would...

- \* Move South Carolina to 4-0 for the first time since 2001 (started 5-0) and just the ninth time in school history.
- \* Be the Gamecocks' first over the Tigers since 1933 (lost last four meetings).
- \* Give the Gamecocks a win in their road opener for the second straight year.
- \* Be the Gamecocks' first win at an SEC West school since defeating Ole Miss on Oct. 4, 2008.
- \* Snap a five-game losing streak in SEC road games.
- \* Give Steve Spurrier his 107th victory as an SEC coach over an SEC opponent, moving him into sole possession of second place all-time in SEC history behind only Paul "Bear" Bryant.

### THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT: AUBURN

The Auburn Tigers are in their second season under head coach Gene Chizik, who has an 11-5 record at the helm of the program. The Tigers are 3-0 after a thrilling, 27-24 overtime win over Clemson on Saturday and ranked No. 17 in the latest Associated Press poll, No. 14 according to the USA Today Coaches Poll. Last season, the Tigers finished 8-5 and won the Outback Bowl against Northwestern.

### GAMECOCKS AND TIGERS

- This is the ninth all-time meeting between Auburn and South Carolina, with the Tigers holding a 6-1-1 edge, including a 2-0 mark in games played in Auburn. The Tigers are also 2-0 in Columbia, and 2-1-1 at neutral sites.
- South Carolina's lone win in the series came on Dec. 2, 1933, a 16-14 win in Birmingham, Ala. The teams did not meet again for 63 years.
- The teams met each year from 1930 to 1933, with the four games played at three different neutral sites. The 1930 game was played in Columbus, Ga.; the 1931 contest took place in Montgomery, and the games in 1932 and 1933 were played in Birmingham.
- The teams have only met four times since South Carolina joined the SEC prior to the 1992 season, with Auburn winning all four contests.
- This will be the first meeting between the Gamecocks and Tigers when both teams have been ranked in the national polls. In fact, it is the first time South Carolina has faced Auburn as a ranked team.

### TIES WITH AUBURN

- South Carolina has no players from the state of Alabama, but Auburn has one from South Carolina - OL Eric Mack from St. Matthews.

### AND THEN THERE WERE TWO

**LB Rodney Paulk** and **OL Hutch Eckerson** are the only South Carolina players left on the active roster from the last time the Gamecocks and Tigers met in 2006. Eckerson started at left tackle that night in Columbia, and Paulk had one tackle in the contest.

### PLAYING AND BEATING THE BEST

South Carolina's best win over a ranked opponent came in the 1981 season when it knocked off No. 3 North Carolina by a 31-13 score. The best home win came last season when the Gamecocks knocked off No. 4 Ole Miss by a 16-10 score. Here are the top wins in school history:

### SOMETHING'S GOTTA GIVE

This game could showcase the ever-popular showdown between the "irresistible force" and the "immovable object." South Carolina has the SEC's top-ranked rushing defense, allowing just 59.7 yards per game through its first three contests. On the other side of the ball, Auburn enters the game with the league's top rushing offense, averaging 259.3 yards per game on the ground.

### SPURRIER VS. AUBURN

South Carolina head coach **Steve Spurrier** is 10-5 all-time against Auburn, including a 10-3 mark while head coach at Florida. He is 4-3 all-time as a head coach in games at Auburn's Jordan-Hare Stadium. Spurrier's Gators defeated Auburn for the 2000 SEC Championship.

### SPURRIER VS. CHIZIK

This will be the first meeting between Carolina's **Steve Spurrier** and Auburn's Gene Chizik as head coaches. The coaches have, however, been on opposite sidelines before. Chizik was a graduate assistant at Clemson while Spurrier was head coach at Duke in 1988 and 1989; Spurrier's Blue Devils were 1-1 in two meetings with the Tigers. The Head Ball Coach defeated Chizik's team one other time: in 1999, Spurrier's Florida Gators defeated Central Florida 58-27 while Chizik was the Knights' defensive coordinator.

### LOOKING FOR HISTORY

If South Carolina defeats Auburn to improve to 4-0 on the season, the 2010 edition of the Gamecocks will be only the ninth team in school history to start a season with at least four straight wins. Below is a list of the other teams that have started 4-0 or better.

### IT'S BEEN A WHILE

The Gamecocks seek to snap a five-game losing streak at SEC road venues, dating back to the 2008 season. That year, Carolina lost its final road SEC game at Florida, then went winless at Georgia, Alabama, Tennessee and Arkansas in 2009. The last road win in conference play for the Gamecocks came on Oct. 11, 2008, with a 24-17 victory at Kentucky.

Offensively, the Gamecocks are 12-for-12 in red zone opportunities, scoring 10 touchdowns along with two field goals. Conversely, the Gamecock defense has allowed just six scores in 11 opportunities, with all six being field goals. South Caro-

lina is the only team in the SEC to have not allowed a red zone touchdown.

### PERFECT AGAINST NON-AQ SCHOOLS

With the Gamecocks' 38-19 win over Furman, Head Coach **Steve Spurrier** is a perfect 40-0 all-time against schools outside of BCS automatic qualifier conferences, including a 14-0 mark since coming to South Carolina. He defeated Florida Atlantic and South Carolina State in 2009, and will have a chance to extend his mark with a game against Troy still left to play in 2010.

### OUT OF THEIR LEAGUE

South Carolina is 2-0 outside of SEC play after defeating Furman on Saturday. They are 19-6 in non-conference games under **Steve Spurrier**, including wins in 17 of their last 21 non-league tilts. The year-by-year breakdown: 2005 (2-2); 2006 (5-0); 2007 (3-1); 2008 (3-2); 2009 (4-1); 2010 (2-0). Two non-conference games remain this year: Troy (Nov. 20) and Clemson (Nov. 27).

### BACK ABOVE .500

With the win over Furman, South Carolina moved its all-time football record back above .500 at 537-536-44 in its 117th year of intercollegiate football.

### WINNING MORE OFTEN

The Gamecocks have posted six consecutive seasons of at least a .500 record, going 6-5 in 2004, 7-5 in 2005, 8-5 in 2006, 6-6 in 2007, and 7-6 in both 2008 and 2009. If the Gamecocks get to that .500 mark this season, it will equal a school-record stretch from 1928-34 in which the Gamecocks had seven straight winning seasons.

### MARVELOUS MARCUS

So much for freshman jitters. In three games, freshman tailback **Marcus Lattimore** has rushed for 333 yards on 70 carries, scoring five of South Carolina's 10 offensive touchdowns on the season. For some perspective:

- Lattimore needs 516 more rushing yards over the final nine games to become the Gamecocks' all-time leading freshman, surpassing an 848-yard season by **Thomas Dendy** in 1982.
- Lattimore's 37 carries vs. Georgia were the third-most in a single game in school history (**Ron Bass** - 39 vs. North Carolina, 1974).
- His 182 yards vs. Georgia ranked as the 15th-best game in school history, tying **Steve Wadiak's** 182-yard effort against George Washington on Oct. 27, 1950.
- Only **Brandon Bennett**, with a 278-yard outburst against East Tennessee State on Oct. 5, 1991, ran for more yards in one game as a freshman. Bennett's mark also stands as the all-time school record.
- The names ahead of Lattimore in the all-time single-game rushing totals read like a who's who of backs at South Carolina - **Brandon Bennett, Jeff Grantz, Steve Wadiak, George Rogers, Derek Watson, Ron Bass, Duce Staley**.
- It was the eighth game of last year before a Carolina back amassed more than 70 carries (**Kenny Miles** had 78 following the Vanderbilt game).
- Not until after the Vanderbilt game last year (week eight)

### SPURRIER IN ELITE COMPANY

Head coach Steve Spurrier is one of just four coaches to record 100 or more wins as an SEC coach against SEC competition (he also has three wins against SEC teams while coaching at Duke). Here is how he stacks up against some of the other great coaches in SEC history:

**KICKING THINGS OFF...**

With the win over Southern Miss, the Gamecocks are 77-36-4 in season openers, a .672 winning percentage. The Gamecocks have wins in each of their last 11 and in 14 of their last 15 season lidlifters. The only loss in that stretch was a 10-0 setback at NC State in the 1999 season opener.

**GAMECOCKS IN SEC OPENERS**

The Gamecocks began their 19th season of competition in the Southeastern Conference with a 17-6 victory over Georgia on Sept. 11. They are 8-11 in 19 conference openers, 16 of which

have come against the Georgia Bulldogs. They are 6-10 when opening the league slate against the 'Dawgs, and 2-1 when facing a different opponent.

**TOUGH SCHEDULE**

Tough schedules are nothing new to South Carolina or anyone else in the SEC, for that matter. The Gamecocks' 2009 schedule rated as the second-toughest in the nation according to Phil Steele, and the going doesn't get any easier this season. Ten of the Gamecocks' 11 Division I opponents participated in bowl games following the 2009 season, with six emerging victorious:

**TWO NEW CAPTAINS**

Seniors **Cliff Matthews** and **Patrick DiMarco** return as co-captains for the second year, with two new additions as voted on by the team in August. Kicker/punter **Spencer Lanning** and defensive lineman **Ladi Ajiboye** will serve as the two additional captains for the Gamecocks in 2010.

**ELLIOT IN, WOLFORD OUT**

South Carolina only made one coaching change during the offseason when offensive line coach Eric Wolford left Columbia to take the head coaching position at Youngstown State. In his place, South Carolina welcomes **Shawn Elliott**, a native of Camden, S.C., who had served the past 13 seasons as an assistant coach at Appalachian State.

**SUCCESSFUL ERA**

South Carolina is enjoying one of its most successful stretches in the history of the program. Since coach **Steve Spurrier's** arrival prior to the 2005 season, Carolina has:

- Had back-to-back senior classes leave with a school-record 28 victories in their four-year careers. Only once previously had 28 wins over four years happened (1987-90).
- Put together back-to-back seven-plus win seasons for just the sixth time in school history. The others: 1924-25; 1979-80; 1987-88; 2000-01 and 2005-06.
- Posted six straight non-losing seasons, the longest stretch since seven straight such years from 1928-34.
- Been bowl-eligible for six consecutive years, the longest streak in the modern era.
- A head coach that has taken Carolina to four bowl games, the first coach in school history to do so, while needing just five years to accomplish the feat.
- Defeated a top-5 squad for only the second time in school history (No. 4 Ole Miss) in 2009.
- Developed a distinct home-field advantage. The Gamecocks went 6-1 at home in 2009, their best home mark since also going 6-1 in 1988.
- Posted a team GPA of 2.695 in the Fall 2009 semester, the highest on record.

**THEY PAY TO SEE THE GAMECOCKS PLAY**

- Gamecock fans gave Williams-Brice Stadium its biggest crowd in nearly two years with 80,974 on hand for the game vs. Georgia. The last bigger crowd was 81,731 vs. Tennessee on Nov. 1, 2008.
- A total of 70,438 paid to watch South Carolina defeat Southern Miss in the 2010 season opener on Sept. 2, and 73,681 were on hand for the win over Furman on Sept. 18.
- The Gamecocks have one of the top fan bases in collegiate

football. During the 2009 season, Carolina averaged 75,369 fans at Williams-Brice Stadium in Columbia, ranking 17th in the nation in average attendance. Not surprisingly, the two sellouts were in the season's final two games against top-ranked Florida (79,297) and versus Palmetto State rival Clemson (80,574). The Gamecocks also played in some hostile environments as well, including trips to Tennessee (96,623) and Alabama (92,012).

**WORKING OVERTIME**

The Gamecocks have played just two overtime games in their history, both at Tennessee. They dropped a 23-20 decision in Knoxville on Sept. 27, 2003, then fell by a 27-24 score on Oct. 27, 2007, also at Neyland Stadium. Every other SEC team has played at least three overtime games since the rule was established in 1996.

**COLUMBIA (AP)** — Kenny Irons ran for 117 yards and two touchdowns in his return to South Carolina and No. 2 Auburn knocked away a last-chance pass to keep its unbeaten season alive with a 24-17 victory over the Gamecocks on Thursday night.

Along with Irons' ground game and their rock-solid defense, the Tigers (5-0, 3-0 Southeastern Conference) displayed a passing game that helped them take every snap of the third quarter.

Brandon Cox completed nine of 13 passes for 125 passes in the third period to keep Auburn moving and the South Carolina offense off the field.

On the opening drive of the second half, Cox hit Lee Guess for 12 yards on third-and-11. The quarterback later connected with Tommy Trott on an 11-yarder that set up John Vaughn's 24-yard field goal.

Then with the Gamecocks (3-2, 1-2) feeling good about holding Auburn out of the end zone, coach Tommy Tuberville took a page from Steve Spurrier's book and stunned the Gamecocks with a perfectly executed onside kick. No South Carolina player was within 3 yards of the ball when it landed, and Jerraud Powers recovered for Auburn.

Cox came out firing again. He had an 18-yard pass to Taylor, an 8-yarder to Robert Dunn on fourth-and-6 and a 25-yarder to Taylor on third-and-21.

Irons finished the drive on the first play of the fourth quarter, scoring on fourth-and-goal from the 1 to put Auburn ahead 24-10.

Still, it took Auburn's defense to save this one.

South Carolina closed to a touchdown on Syvelle Newton's 25-yard pass to Jared Cook with 8:25 to go. Then the Gamecocks got the ball back one last time, driving to the Tigers 6. However, on fourth down, Newton's floater to Sidney Rice was batted away by Patrick Lee with 19 seconds left.

For Irons, it was a much sweeter time at Williams-Brice Stadium than his last game here. He was on the Gamecocks' sideline watching the team's 63-17 loss to Clemson and clearly in coach Lou Holtz's doghouse. Irons decided it was better to leave than

remained buried on the Gamecocks' depth chart.

Irons got going early. He had 38 yards on Auburn's first drive, finishing it off by stretching the ball over the goal line while caught in the arms of linebacker Jasper Brinkley.

Irons led Auburn to its other first-half touchdown. He had runs of 24 and 11 yards, and fullback Carl Stewart broke off a 20-yard run to the Gamecocks 7. Two plays later, Cox connected with Trott for a 9-yard touchdown pass and a 14-3 lead.

### Notes on the Carolina Offense

#### GARCIA'S OUR GUY...

- **QB Stephen Garcia** has completed 41-of-60 passes (68.3%) for 508 yards through three games. He is also the team's second-leading rusher with 25 carries for 68 yards and a pair of touchdowns.
- Garcia had a strong first outing of the season against Southern Miss, completing 16-of-23 passes for 193 yards. He also ran for a pair of touchdowns, the first time in his career to amass multiple TD runs in one game.
- Garcia threw his first two TD passes of the year in the win over Furman as he completed 13-of-20 passes for 150 yards.
- He has played in 24 games for the Gamecocks, starting 19 over two seasons (11-8 as a starter). He is 10-2 when starting at home, 1-4 on the road and 0-2 at neutral sites.
- Garcia is one of eight players in South Carolina history to pass for more than 4,000 yards, surpassing that mark vs. Georgia. He currently ranks in the top 10 in numerous career categories for South Carolina:
  - Career Passing Yards: 8th (4,202)
  - Career Completions: 8th (345)
  - Career Pass Attempts: 8th (614)
  - Career Passing TDs: 9th (25)
  - Career Completion Pct.: 5th (56.2% - 345 of 614)

#### ...BUT SHAW COULD PLAY

True freshman **Connor Shaw** has played extensively in two games, completing 4-of-5 passes in both of his appearances vs. Southern Miss and Furman. He also completed a touchdown pass to **D.L. Moore** in the win over Southern Miss. His first appearance came when lined up as a wide receiver in the package with **Stephon Gilmore** at quarterback.

#### THE RETURN OF THE GILMORE PACKAGE

Sophomore cornerback **Stephon Gilmore** took two snaps at quarterback in the Southern Miss game, rushing once for 14 yards and missing on his only pass attempt. He first showed his versatility in the 2009 Clemson victory, when he took the reins at quarterback for the second possession of the game and led the Gamecocks on a 7-play, 60-yard game-tying drive where he accounted for 59 of those yards (20 rushing, 39 passing). He also ran one play at quarterback in the Papa-johns.com Bowl.

#### WHAT A RUSH

- South Carolina has become a running team, as evidenced by 52 carries against Georgia and more rushing yards than passing yards in each of the first two games. Freshman **Marcus Lattimore** is a big reason for that, gaining 333 yards on 70 carries and scoring five touchdowns in his first three games. His 37-carry, 182-yard, 2-TD performance against Georgia was a game for the Carolina record books (see notes on pages 3-4).
- South Carolina has 595 rushing yards through three games, ranking fifth in the SEC. The Gamecocks have been last in the

league in rushing each of the previous two years.

- Carolina rushed for 224 yards vs. Southern Miss, the second-highest total under Spurrier. Lattimore and **Stephen Garcia** had two rushing touchdowns each, the first time for two SC players to have multiple rushing TDs since Florida '05.

#### ALSHON'S (STILL) ALL RIGHT

Sophomore **WR Alshon Jeffery** topped the 100-yard mark in receiving yards in each of the first two games, hauling in 7 passes in each game for 106 yards (Southern Miss) and 103 yards (Georgia). He barely missed the century mark with a 5-catch, 97-yard performance against Furman. He now has five 100-yard receiving games in his short career, and he became South Carolina's 23rd 1,000-yard receiver in the win over Furman.

#### FAST LEARNER

Sophomore **T.J. Johnson** moved to center for the first time against Southern Miss after starting every game at right guard during the 2009 season. He obviously picked up some things quickly as he was named the **SEC's Offensive Lineman of the Week** after helping pave the way for 449 yards of total offense in the opener against Southern Miss.

## Notes on the Carolina Defense

### THE STRENGTH OF THE SQUAD

- So far in 2010, the Gamecocks have only allowed 38 points through two games and three touchdowns, only two of which were offensive (the other was an interception return). The Gamecocks rank fourth in the SEC and ninth in the nation in scoring defense at 12.67 points per game.
- Since **Ellis Johnson** took over the South Carolina defense prior to the 2008 season, success has come quickly. The Gamecocks have finished in the nation's top 15 in total defense in each of the last two seasons, posting a 15th-place showing last season and a 13th place mark in 2008. Seven of 11 starters return from a defense that gave up 300.69 yards per game in 2009.

### SEEING RED

Defense in the red zone has been a huge reason for the Gamecocks' success through the first two games. Opponents are just 6-for-11 (54%) in red-zone opportunities in 2010 with no touchdowns to show for their 11 trips inside the Carolina 20-yard-line. Furman was 2-for-2 with a pair of field goals, Georgia was 2-for-3, and Southern Miss went 2-for-6, all coming away with a pair of field goals.

### WHAT A RUSH - OR NOT

- South Carolina has the SEC's top-ranked rushing defense, holding opposing offenses to just 59.7 yards per game on the ground, more than 20 yards fewer than second-ranked LSU. The Gamecocks rank sixth in the country in that category.
- For the third straight week, Carolina kept an opponent under 100 yards rushing. This time, it was Furman who managed just 51 yards on 27 carries (1.9 avg.), ranking as the fourth-fewest rushing yards by an opponent under **Steve Spurrier**. South Carolina is 16-2 under Spurrier when holding opposing offenses under 100 yards rushing.
- Georgia managed just 61 yards on the ground on 26 attempts (2.3 avg.).
- The Gamecock rushing defense came up big against Southern Miss, allowing just 67 yards on the ground on 27 attempts by the Golden Eagles.

### DEPTH COMES THROUGH AT LINEBACKER

With WLB **Shaq Wilson** missing the first three games against Southern Miss, Georgia and Furman with a nagging hamstring injury, others came through when needed.

- **Josh Dickerson** got the start at one spot with **Tony Straughter** in the other in each of the first three games, and both delivered with outings. Dickerson has 11 tackles through the first three games, including a career-high seven vs. Georgia. Straughter has seven stops on the year, and recovered a fumble and returned it 52 yards in the season-opener vs. Southern Miss.
- **Quin Smith** posted a career-high five tackles vs. Southern Miss and has nine on the year. **Rodney Paulk**, returning from two season-ending injuries in 2008 and 2009, had a breakthrough game vs. Furman when he recorded two tackles, including a sack.

### DEFENDING THE PASS

- **CB Stephon Gilmore** picked off a Furman pass and returned it 80 yards for a touchdown to seal the victory over the Paladins on Sept. 18. It was the second interception of Gilmore's career, and the first returned for a touchdown since Eric Norwood had a 35-yard runback against Georgia last season.
- The Gamecocks came up with seven sacks against the Paladins, the most since recording eight against Central Florida on Sept. 6, 1997. **Travian Robertson** led the way with two sacks - the first two of his career - while **Chris Culliver**, **Cliff Matthews**, **Rodney Paulk**, **Melvin Ingram** and **Byron Jerideau** had one each.
- Sophomore **DE Devin Taylor** had a huge game against Georgia, picking up a career-high two sacks and equaling his high-water mark with 3.0 tackles for loss, including a sack of Bulldog quarterback Aaron Murray on the game's final play. Taylor has anchored a defensive front-four that has four sacks on the season.
- The Gamecocks had the nation's second-best pass defense in 2008 when they allowed 159.23 yards per game through the air, but lost the likes of **Captain Munnerlyn**, **Stoney Woodson**, **Carlos Thomas** and **Emanuel Cook**. Last season, there was very little drop-off as the pass defense rated eighth in the nation, allowing 163.00 yards per game. And this year, only strong safety **Darian Stewart** is gone from a group that was very impressive with mostly freshmen and sophomores.

### IN SAFE(TY) HANDS

- **SS DeVonte Holloman** and **FS Akeem Auguste** have been all over the place through the first three games with Holloman racking up 20 tackles to lead the team and both finding themselves in position to make game-changing plays. Holloman has accounted for both opponent turnovers through two games, hauling in an interception vs. Southern Miss and forcing a Georgia fumble inside the Carolina 5-yard-line, which was recovered by **CB Stephon Gilmore** and returned 13 yards.
- With Southern Miss throwing the ball 57 times on Sept. 2, it is no surprise that the defensive backfield made the majority of the plays for Carolina. **Akeem Auguste** led the way with eight stops, including one for loss, while **DeVonte Holloman** had seven tackles and his second career interception. **Stephon Gilmore** and **Damario Jeffery** had six tackles apiece, while **C.C. Whitlock** and newcomer **Corey Addison** each had five.

### MOVING BACK ONCE AGAIN

Gamecock senior **Dion LeCorn** has moved to the defensive side of the ball for the second time in his career after playing the last several games of the 2008 season at Spur. He has played in 30 games over his three years at Carolina, hauling in 45 catches for 448 yards and five touchdowns. While playing defense in 2008, he was credited with six tackles.

### OPENING DEFENSE

The Carolina defense has been at its stingiest in the early part of games so far this season. Opponents have scored just 15 first-half points through three games, all coming by way of field goals, as the Gamecocks have not allowed a first-half touchdown yet this season.

### OPENING DEFENSE, PART TWO

When Southern Miss scored a touchdown with 1:33 to play in the fourth quarter, they became the first team to find the end zone against the Gamecocks in a season opener since the 2007 lidlifter against Louisiana-Lafayette, where the Gamecocks won 28-14. South Carolina pitched a 34-0 shutout of NC State in 2008, then won a defensive struggle against the Wolfpack in 2009 by a 7-3 score.

## THIS DATE IN GAMECOCK HISTORY

### September 25, 1971

#### Carolina 24, NC State 6

It was South Carolina's first season after leaving the ACC, and the first time to face a former conference foe in Columbia after departing the league. The Gamecocks took a 24-6 victory to improve to 2-1 on the year. The Gamecocks rolled up 239 rushing yards and three touchdowns on the ground and held the Wolfpack to 185 total yards in the victory.

### September 25, 1954

#### Carolina 34, #18 Army 20

In the season opener for both teams, South Carolina traveled to West Point and took down the 18th-ranked Army Black Knights, 34-20. It would be one of only two losses for Army that season (the other came in the season finale against Navy) and the Cadets would finish No. 7 in the final AP poll. The Gamecocks would move up to No. 15 in the AP Poll following the Army win and finish the season with a 6-4 record.

## Notes on the Carolina Special Teams

### DOUBLE DUTY

• Senior **Spencer Lanning** enters his second year handling both the kicking and punting duties. Last year, Lanning set a school record for consistency by connecting on 17-of-20 field goal attempts - including 12 in a row at one point - for an .850 field goal percentage. He also hit 28-of-29 extra point attempts with his only miss by virtue of a blocked kick. He led the team in scoring last year with 79 points, the sixth-best single season in school history. In addition, Lanning has a career punting average of 42.3 yards per kick over two seasons with a long of 58.

• Through three games, Lanning has punted five times for an average of 46.5 yards per punt; however, he has not punted enough to qualify for the national rankings. He is third in the SEC in that category.

### CAREER BEST, TIMES TWO

Spencer Lanning had a busy night against Furman on Sept. 18 as he punted five times, connected on five extra points and attempted a field goal. But in the midst of extended work, Lanning notched a pair of career bests. He drilled a 51-yard field goal in the third quarter, surpassing his previous best by four yards (47 vs. Tennessee and Clemson in 2009). He also boomed a 58-yard punt, two yards longer than a 56-yarder against Kentucky last season that had stood as his previous top mark.

### CULLIVER'S TRAVELS

Senior **Chris Culliver** is the school record holder in both career kickoff returns (100) and kick return yards (2,340). He broke the school record for kickoff returns on Sept. 19, 2009, vs. Florida Atlantic when his third return of the night was the 77th of his career, passing Robert Brooks who had held the record since 1991. He then topped Dick Harris' 38-year-old school mark for kickoff return yards (1,946) on his second return against Kentucky on Oct. 10. In his three years at Carolina, Culliver has averaged 23.4 yards per return. His longest return came in 2008 against Tennessee when he ran one back for 67 yards. Last season, he had a 61-yard return against Kentucky and a 57-yard runback against Georgia. Culliver needs 158 yards to move up to second all-time in league history in kick return yards.



## Head Coach Steve Spurrier

Steve Spurrier, who has coached a national championship team, won seven Southeastern Conference titles, and won nearly three-fourths of the college games in which he has coached, begins his fifth season as head coach at the University of South Carolina. Spurrier was introduced as Carolina's 32nd head coach on Nov. 23, 2004, before an overflow news conference crowd in the south end zone of Williams-Brice Stadium.

Now in his 21st collegiate season, Coach Spurrier has compiled a 180-68-2 (.724) won-loss record as a major college head coach, including a 38-28 mark (.576) at Carolina. He led the Duke Blue Devils to the 1989 Atlantic Coast Conference championship before returning to his alma mater, the University of Florida, as head coach in 1990. During his 12 seasons with the Gators, Spurrier's teams won seven Southeastern Conference championships, one national title and finished ranked in the nation's top 10 nine times. His record at Florida was an amazing 122-27-1 (.817). Spurrier, who won the 1966 Heisman Trophy as a quarterback for the Gators, most recently was head coach of the NFL's Washington Redskins (2002-03). He returned to the college ranks in 2005 after a one-year absence from the sidelines.

In his first season at South Carolina, Coach Spurrier led the Gamecocks to a 7-5 record and a second-place finish in the SEC Eastern Division. In doing so, he posted a five-game winning streak, the 15th consecutive year in which he has had a five-game winning streak, something no other coach in college history has accomplished. He was honored as the SEC Coach of the Year by the Associated Press after leading the Gamecocks to a school-record five straight SEC wins, their first win ever at Tennessee and their first win over Florida since the 1930s. It was the eighth time he has been honored as his league's Coach of the Year.

He came back with an 8-5 record in 2006, just the ninth time in school history that the Gamecocks posted eight or more wins in a season. The season was capped with a victory in the Liberty Bowl over Conference USA champion Houston. With that win, Coach Spurrier matched Joe Morrison for the most wins by a Carolina head coach in his first two seasons in Columbia.

In his third season with the Garnet & Black, Coach Spurrier's squad raced out to a 6-1 record and moved as high as No. 6 in the BCS rankings, before finishing the campaign with a 6-6 record. With 21 wins, he set the Carolina record for coaching victories after three seasons at the helm.

With a 7-6 record in 2008, Carolina has finished with a .500 or better overall record in each of Coach Spurrier's four seasons. He has logged 30 wins as the Carolina head coach, moving past Warren Giese into sole possession of seventh place on the Gamecocks' all-time list. Lou Holtz is next on the list with 33 career wins.

- His 122 victories at Florida from 1990-2001 rank as the best win total for a coach in his first 12 years at a school in major college history.
- Coached Florida to two National Championship Game appearances (1995 and 1996), claiming the 1996 national title.
- The only coach in SEC history and one of only two coaches in major college history to lead a squad to six straight seasons of 10 or more wins (1993-1998).
- His Gator teams appeared in the weekly polls 202 of a possible 203 weeks, including each of his last 202 consecutive weeks. From 1990-2001, the Gators were ranked number one in the polls 29 times.
- His six outright SEC titles ('91, '93, '94, '95, '96, 2000) ranked as the second-best total in SEC history, trailing only "Bear" Bryant's 11.
- Has been named his conference's Coach of the Year eight times (1988 and 1989 in the ACC with Duke, in 1990, 1991, 1994, 1995 and 1996 in the SEC with Florida and in 2005 in his first year at South Carolina).





### COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)—

Quarterback Stephen Garcia and freshman tailback Marcus Lattimore each ran for two touchdowns and South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier won his 18th straight college opener 41-13 over Southern Miss on Thursday night.

Garcia got things started with a 22-yard touchdown run and Lattimore followed with first-half scores of 3 and 7 yards to send the Gamecocks to a surprisingly easy win against the Golden Eagles.

And Lattimore wasn't the only young star to excel for Spurrier.

Sophomore Alshon Jeffery had 106 receiving yards and freshman Ace Sanders had a 53-yard rush - the Gamecocks' longest in four years - to set up Lattimore's first score.

Even freshman backup passer Connor Shaw came through, connecting with D.L. Moore for a 15-yard touchdown pass for South Carolina's final score.

South Carolina's rout was a welcome result after a restless summer. Spurrier and the Gamecocks have been dogged by the NCAA the past two months. Standout tight end Weslye Saunders, a central figure in the probe for possible contact with agents, did not play because of an unrelated team suspension.

Then South Carolina scratched two starters - left tackle Jarriel King and cornerback Chris Culliver - right before kickoff, although the athletic department would not say why.

Southern Miss kept the Gamecocks offstride early on, forcing a punt on South Carolina's opening series and quickly driving to the Gamecocks 22.

That's when momentum changed for good.

Akeem Auguste broke up a third-down pass that settled into the hands of safety DaVonte Holloman and South Carolina followed with a solid drive of its own led by Garcia.

The junior was 4-for-4 passing for 51 yards on the series and finished things with a gritty, 22-yard TD run.

Then South Carolina's youngest guns took control.

Speedy Sanders had his back-breaking end around to the Southern Miss 9. Two plays later, Lattimore bounced through for his first college score from 3 yards out.

Lattimore, considered the country's top tailback prospect last February, got the call a series later. This time, he picked his way through Southern Miss defenders for a 7-yard scoring run as South Carolina led 24-6 - its most points by halftime since the 2006 Liberty Bowl.


Garcia ended 16 of 23 for 193 yards.

Golden Eagles coach Larry Fedora followed Spurrier as Florida's playcaller in 2002 and tried to out-scheme him with a no-huddle, flood-the-field attack.

But Southern Miss twice bogged down in the red zone after the early pick, settling for two field goals.

Playmaking receiver DeAndre Brown was covered up most of the night by South Carolina's secondary. The junior, who caught 114 passes his first two seasons, didn't catch one against the Gamecocks until the final period when Southern Miss trailed 41-6.

Brown had the Golden Eagles' only touchdown, a 29-yard scoring catch with 1:33 left.

#### COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)—

South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier brought in Marcus Lattimore to run the ball.

And Spurrier let his prize freshman do it all day against No. 22 Georgia.

Lattimore rushed for 182 yards and two touchdowns to lead the 24th-ranked Gamecocks (2-0, 1-0 Southeastern Conference) to a 17-6 victory Saturday.

Lattimore carried 37 times in his first SEC game, punching in two 2-yard TDs and sealing things during a long, fourth-quarter field goal drive.

"I'm a little sore," Lattimore said.

He'll let the cheers at Williams-Brice Stadium soothe any lingering pain. The fans chanted his name at the end as Lattimore pounded the Bulldogs (1-1, 0-1) again and again.

Get used to it, SEC, because Spurrier sounds ready to ground it out all season.

He pushed past the defensive line for his first 2-yard touchdown. Lattimore had two defenders on his back on his next score and dragged them into the end zone for a second 2-yard TD.

He also had yardage on South Carolina's final scoring drive, starting with a 16-yard run and carrying eight of 11 plays to seal the game with Spencer Lanning's 24-yard field goal.

It was a complete reversal from most games in the South Carolina-Georgia series. It's usually a Bulldogs tailback who takes charge and the Gamecocks who play catch up.

This time, Georgia was outgained by more than 100 yards and held without a touchdown for the first time in three years since its last loss to South Carolina, 16-12, in 2007.

The Bulldogs' best chance to tighten the game came in the third quarter when they drove to the South Carolina 3 while trailing 14-6. But Washuan Ealey fumbled and cornerback Stephon Gilmore recovered to end the threat.

Right from the start, Georgia had no answer for Lattimore, the freshman who was considered the country's top high school running back last winter. He had runs of 16, 10 and 10 on South Carolina's opening drive that ended with Lattimore's first touchdown.

Lattimore was back at it right before halftime, giving the Gamecocks a 14-3 lead that Georgia couldn't match.


Spurrier likes Lattimore's square posture that keeps him moving forward even after he's hit. It also helped that Gamecocks called on Lattimore's favorite zone-read play from high school.

"That's all I did for four years," he said.

Georgia got a quick start from Ealey, the tailback who was suspended for the Bulldogs' opener last week. Ealey gained 32 yards on his team's opening drive, which stalled in the red zone when Orson Charles bobbled a third-down pass from Aaron Murray with running room ahead.

But the Bulldogs' attack sputtered the rest of the half, managing 13 yards as they went three-and-out three straight possessions.

Georgia finished with 253 yards while giving up 354 to the Gamecocks.

**COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)—**

South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier knows the best part of his 13th-ranked Gamecocks beating lower-division Furman.

"Glad the game's over," he said, "and we don't have to play them again for another 25 years."

Stephen Garcia threw for two touchdowns, freshman Marcus Lattimore rushed for one and South Carolina won 38-19 on Saturday, improving to 3-0 for the first time in three years. Not that it came easily against the Paladins - something that's happened before with FCS teams in Spurrier's six seasons.

The Gamecocks needed a fourth-quarter interception to hold on against Wofford 27-20 in 2006, then managed only a pair of touchdowns against those same Terriers in a 23-13 win.

The last time they played Furman was even worse for the Gamecocks, a stunning 28-23 win for Paladins at Williams-Brice Stadium in 1982.

And Furman (1-1) of the FCS Southern Conference seemed poised to make this one tight, cutting a 28-6 lead to 31-19 in the final period and driving for more before Stephon Gilmore's interception and 80-yard TD return finally settled things.

Furman's Adam Mims finished with 10 catches for 202 yards.

It was a drastic turn from a week ago, when the Gamecocks' stamped themselves contenders in the Southeastern Conference with a 17-6 win over Georgia.

Garcia's 15-yard scoring throw to Tori Gurley and Lattimore's 4-yard touchdown run put the Gamecocks up 14-0.

When Garcia completed a nifty 6-yard throw to D.L. Moore in the back of the end zone early in the third quarter, South Carolina led 28-6 and looked ready to rout Furman.

But the Gamecocks had trouble putting this one away.

Shawn Boone began Furman's comeback, tipping and catching Garcia's screen pass attempt near the goal line for a 3-yard touchdown return.

After Spencer Lanning's career best 51-yard field goal, the Paladins struck again with Tersoo Uhaa's halfback pass to Mims for a 72-yard touchdown.

Furman drove 53 yards to South Carolina's 30 the next time it had the ball before Cody Worley's overthrown pass settled in Gilmore's hands with a clear path to the end zone.

Still, Spurrier improved to 40-0 all time against programs from outside the BCS automatic qualifier conferences.

Things get decidedly tougher from here. The Gamecocks go to Auburn next Saturday and, after a week off, face top-ranked Alabama at home.

Garcia finished 13 of 20 for 150 yards with his first two interceptions of the year. Lattimore added 97 yards rushing and his fifth TD on the ground this year. Jeffery had five catches for 97 yards, coming up short of his third straight game with at least 100 receiving yards.

South Carolina's defense registered seven sacks and held Furman to 51 yards on the ground.

Spurrier was disappointed in some of his team's breakdowns, but hoped it would wake the players up to what might happen with a lack of focus. "Pretty sad some of the things that happened, but hopefully it happened in a game where we had a decent lead," he said. "We can try and prevent those things in the future."
