- Auburn has played in back-to-back overtime games (vs. Florida, at LSU) for the second time ever, first time since 1996
- Alli Smalley is 6 points away from 26th on the Auburn career scoring list and 12 from 25th
- Alli Smalley is 24 points away from reaching 1,000 career points
- KeKe Carrier grabbed her 500th career rebound at LSU, Jordan Greenleaf grabbed her 500th rebound vs. Alabama
- KeKe Carrier has five double-doubles this season, ranking her in a tie for first in the SEC
- KeKe Carrier was named the SEC Player of the Week last week
- For the first time this season, Auburn played with 10 players against Alabama
- Sophomore guard Morgan Jennings played for the first time this season against Alabama
- Sophomore forward Chantel Hilliard returned to the court vs. Alabama after missing three games with an injury
- Auburn is coming off a 74-62 win over Alabama; South Carolina is coming off a 79-71 win over Kentucky
- Auburn defeated South Carolina in the lone meeting last season, 80-76, at Columbia on Jan. 8, 2009
- Auburn holds a 38-32 all-time record against Alabama, 23-8 when playing in Auburn, Nell Fortner is 9-1
- Auburn is 31-15 all-time against teams from the state of South Carolina, 13-11 when playing in South Carolina
- Auburn has a 176-141 all-time record in the SEC, Nell Fortner has a 37-37 record in conference play
- Auburn is 4-4 all-time on Jan. 17, 0-3 in SEC games; Nell Fortner has not coached on Jan. 17
- The Tigers are 179-92 all-time in the month of January, 16-20 under Fortner
- Auburn is 19-12 all-time vs. South Carolina, 7-7 when playing in Columbia
- Nell Fortner is 1-0 against South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley
- Fortner (1996 assistant, 200 head coach) and Staley (2008 assistant) are both former U.S. Olympic team coaches
- Nell Fortner has coached three (Dawn Staley, Carla McGhee, Nikki McCray) of South Carolina's coaches
- The Tigers are 3-4 on the road this season, 1-1 in SEC play
- Auburn is 77-2 under Fortner when scoring 70 or more points
- In the win over Liberty, Auburn's front-court out-scored the back court for the first time since Feb. 10, 2008; the Tigers repeated the effort at South Alabama, vs. Valparaiso and at San Diego State
- Senior KeKe Carrier has logged 11 straight games of 20 or more minutes for the first time in her career
- Nicolle Thomas scored 27 points against Florida State, the highest point output for an Auburn freshman since 1987
- The Tigers tied the Auburn single-game blocks record against Alabama A&M with 17
- Freshman Morgan Toles and sophomores Chantel Hilliard and Parrisha Simmons earned their first career starts in the season-opener against Troy; freshman Nicolle Thomas earned her first career start against Alabama A&M
- Morgan Toles and Nicolle Thomas started against Alabama A&M, marking the first time for Auburn to have multiple freshmen starters since March 3, 2006 against Tennessee in the SEC Tournament (Boddie, Bonner, Carrier)
- KeKe Carrier, Auburn's lone senior, started against Alabama A&M - her first since Feb. 11, 2007
- The Tigers are beginning their final season in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum before moving to the new Auburn Arena
- Auburn was picked eighth in the SEC Preseason Media and Coaches' polls, LSU (media) and Tennessee (coaches) were picked to win the league this season
- Alli Smalley was picked the the Coaches' Preseason All-SEC Second Team
- Nell Fortner is beginning her sixth season at Auburn, marking her longest tenure at any job
- The Tigers welcome four newcomers: Blanche Alverson, Morgan Toles, Nicolle Thomas, Pascale West
- Auburn begins the season with 6-7 KeKe Carrier and 6-8 Pascale West, two of the three tallest players in the SEC
- AU is without Reneisha Hobbs and Morgan Jennings after suffering ACL injuries, leaving the Tigers with a roster of nine
- Auburn will be a first- and second-round host of the 2011 NCAA Tournament in the new Auburn Arena

**QUICK HITS**

Auburn is in its 39th season of women's basketball and sports an all-time record of 776-335... AU has made 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, two WNIT appearances and three Final Fours in the program's history... Head Coach Nell Fortner is in her sixth season at Auburn with a 129-74 career record and a 112-63 record on the Plains... The Tigers are coming off a 30-4 season in 2008-09 with their first SEC title in 20 years and its second NCAA Tournament appearance in as many seasons.

**AUBURN-SOUTH CAROLINA SERIES**

This will be the 32nd meeting between Auburn and South Carolina with Auburn holding a 19-12 series advantage. The series is tied 7-7 when playing in Columbia, S.C. **SCOUTING AUBURN**

Auburn (11-6, 2-2) enters the game with Alabama on a two-game SEC win streak after taking down 11th-ranked LSU (64-62, OT) and in-state rival Alabama (74-62).

Leading the way for Auburn this season is senior KeKe Carrier with 14.8 points, 7.9 rebounds and 2.3 blocks per game. For her efforts last week at Florida and LSU, Carrier was named the SEC's Player of the Week. At the LSU game, Carrier also grabbed her 500th career rebound, becoming the 22nd Auburn player to reach the plateau.

Leading the team in scoring is junior Alli Smalley with 15.1 points per game, following her career-best outing of 27 points against Alabama. Her total gave her 976 career points, enough to move her up to 27th all-time at Auburn in career scoring.

Stepping up lately has been redshirt junior Jordan Greenleaf as she has averaged 5.8 points and 10.8 rebounds in SEC play. Her rebound total ranks second in the league. She is averaging 6.9 points and 7.7 rebounds on the season.

The Tigers put up one of their best shooting performances of the season against Alabama, knocking down 50.9 percent of their shots and 43.8 percent from 3-point range. Auburn, however, continued to struggled at the free throw line, hitting just 42.9 percent in the game and 58.0 percent on the season.

Auburn has also dominated the boards recently, out-rebounding SEC opponents by 11.3 per game. The Tigers average a 6.5 rebound margin on the season.

**SCOUTING SOUTH CAROLINA**

South Carolina (9-7, 2-2 SEC) has a worse record that Auburn, but that is not indicative of the season the Gamecocks have had. USC has taken on five ranked opponents this season, going 1-4 in those games. The lone victory came against 23rd-ranked San Diego State (58-55), a team that Auburn lost to, 66-55. The Gamecocks have also played No. 20 Oklahoma (L, 75-67), No. 5 Notre Dame (L, 78-55), No. 11 LSU (L, 70-58) and No. 4 Tennessee (L, 79-62).

South Carolina's two conference wins have come at Alabama, 80-68, and at home against Kentucky, 79-71, on Thursday.

Leading the team this season is junior transfer Valerie Nainima with 18.4 points per game. Right behind her is freshman center Kelsey Bone with 14.4 points and a team-best 9.9 rebounds per game.

La'Keisha Sutton is the top non-newcomer with 10.6 points per game, rounding out the double-digit scorers.

The Gamecocks shoot 42.9 percent from the field and rank third in the SEC with a 37.2 three-point field goal percentage. Vainima is the top 3-point threat, averaging 2.7 treys per game.

USC averages out-rebounding its opponents by 3.3 per game and have a -2.6 turnover margin. The Gamecocks average 19.8 turnovers per game while forcing 17.2.

**LAST TIME AGAINST SOUTH CAROLINA (Jan. 8, 2009)**

Trailing at halftime for just the third time during the season, the No. 9 Auburn women's basketball team out-scored South Carolina 51-45 in the second half, rallying for the 80-76 win at the Colonial Life Arena in Columbia, S.C.

The win was Auburn's first SEC-opening win since a 2001 victory against Kentucky.

The Gamecocks led 31-29 at the half on the back of 4-of-9 three-point shooting.

The senior combo of DeWanna Bonner and Whitney Boddie led Auburn to the win with a combined 50 of the team's 80 points. Bonner led all scorers with 29 points, chipping in six rebounds. Boddie had 21 points along with four rebounds, three assists and two steals.

KeKe Carrier provided a boost off the bench for Auburn, scoring six points while picking up a game-high 10 rebounds. She also tallied five blocked shots in the game.

Brianna Dickerson led South Carolina with nine points, all 3-pointers. C.J. Pace had a team-best four rebounds in the opening half.

The Tigers took control in the second half, scoring six straight points to open the period to take a four-point lead. Auburn would never trail again, building the lead to 10 at the 67-57 mark with 4:27 left to play. USC battled back, though, cutting the lead to two with 13 seconds left, but Auburn hit its free-throws down the stretch to come away with the 80-76 win.

**LAST TIME OUT FOR AUBURN**

Auburn junior Alli Smalley scored a career-high 27 points to lead the Tigers to a 74-62 win over Alabama Jan. 14 at Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum. Senior KeKe Carrier added 20 points and a team-high nine rebounds while redshirt junior Jordan Greenleaf surpassed the 500-rebound plateau, finishing the contest with eight and 502 on her career.

The Tigers came out quick, connecting on 11 of their opening 15 attempts from the field. With 16:38 on the clock, Smalley and Carrier single-handedly outscored the Tide 14-2, posting seven points apiece. A five-point flurry from Smalley capped the run at 12:35, giving the Tigers a 25-9 lead, forcing an Alabama 30-second timeout. Smalley scored 16 points by the 10-minute mark of the first half.

Auburn opened the game to a 21-point lead with just over five minutes left in the half, courtesy of a Nicole Thomas jumper. However, the Crimson Tide clawed their way back to within 13 as the Tigers took a 43-30 lead into the half.

Alabama was able to break Auburn's double-digit lead with eight minutes left in the game, but a quick nine-point run would

return the lead to 18 as the Tigers held on for the 14-point win. Carrier contributed six points in the run, highlighted by back-to-back layups courtesy of Alabama turnovers.

Celiscia Farmer led the Tide with 18 points while Ericka Russel pulled down eight boards.

**LAST TIME OUT FOR SOUTH CAROLINA**

South Carolina shot 55.4 percent from the field, holding Kentucky to 38.5 percent shooting, to come away with the 79-71 home victory. The loss was just the third of the season for the Wildcats.

Five Gamecocks scored in double figures, led by freshman Kelsey Bone with 23 points and nine rebounds. Valerie Nainima followed with 14 while Ieasia Walker added 10. Samone Kennedy and Charenee Stephens came off the bench for 10 and 11 points, respectively.

The teams traded the lead early, but USC was able to pull away and led by four at the half. The Gamecocks rallied in the second half, leading by as many as 15 with 2:05 left to play. UK used back-to-back 3-points to cut into the lead, but it was too late as USC held on for the eight-point win.

**AUBURN VS. THE SEC**

Auburn is 176-141 all-time in Southeastern Conference Games. Head coach Nell Fortner holds a 37-37 record in the conference.

**NELL FORTNER VS. DAWN STALEY**

This will be the second meeting between Nell Fortner and South Carolina's Dawn Staley with Fortner winning the lone meeting last season.

Fortner is in her sixth season at Auburn and seventh overall as a collegiate head coach, holding a 129-74 career record. Staley is in her second year at South Carolina and 10th overall as a head coach. She holds a 191-105 career record.

**AN OLYMPIC RING TO IT**

Sunday's game vs. South Carolina marks the second time this season for Nell Fortner, who was head coach of the U.S. National Team at the 2000 Sydney Olympics, to face another Olympic coach. USC head coach Dawn Staley was an assistant coach on the 2008 U.S. Olympic team in Beijing, China.

The Jan. 10 game against LSU will marked the first time this season that Auburn head coach Nell Fortner, who was head coach of the U.S. National Team at the 2000 Sydney Olympics, faced another Olympic coach. LSU head coach Van Chancellor served as the U.S. head coach at the 2004 Athens Olympics.

Fortner is 1-0 so far this season with a win over LSU's Van Chancellor, who was head coach of the 2004 U.S. Olympic team in Athens, Greece.

The other coach Auburn will face this season is Tennessee's Pat Summitt (1984 Head Coach, 1980 Assistant Coach).

**THE FORTNER CONNECTION**

Auburn head coach Nell Fortner will see some familiar faces when the Tigers take on South Carolina. USC second-year head coach Dawn Staley played for Fortner on the 2000 Olympic team that won a gold medal in Sydney, Australia. Also on that team was current Gamecock assistant coach Nikki McCray. McCray also played for Fortner in the WNBA while with the Indiana Fever.

USC's other assistant coach, Carla McGhee, played on the U.S. National Team at the 1996 Olympics - a team that Fortner was the assistant coach for. McGhee later served as an assistant coach at Auburn (2004-06) in Fortner's first two years on the Plains.

**10 PLAYERS**

For the first time this season, Auburn played with 10 players when it took on Alabama on Jan. 14. The Tigers welcomed back sophomores Chantel Hilliard and Morgan Jennings.

Hilliard suffered an injury at San Diego State and missed the first three SEC games. Jennings tore her ACL in July and made her first appearance of the season against the Crimson Tide.

Prior to the Alabama game, Auburn had been down to eight active players.

**GETTING FREE BASKETBALL**

After picking up the 64-62 overtime win at LSU on Jan. 10, Auburn completed its second overtime game in the season, as well as its second overtime game in a row. It marked just the second time ever for Auburn to play in back-to-back overtime games with it last occurring on Feb. 18 (L, 72-67 at Tennessee) and Feb. 20 (L, 73-72 at Arkansas) of 1996.

Auburn's 71-68 double overtime loss at Florida on Jan. 7 was the Tigers' first overtime game in more than a year and first double overtime game in more than 20 years.

It was the first overtime game since defeating Ohio State, 87-70, at home on Nov. 23, 2008.

Head coach Nell Fortner is now 3-3 all-time at Auburn in overtime games. Auburn is now 15-15 all-time in overtime games.

**MOVING ON UP**

Junior guard Alli Smalley (976 points) has been cruising up the career scoring rankings. She broke into the top 30 at the LSU game and her 27 points against Alabama moved her up to 27th all-time at Auburn in career scoring.

Entering Sunday's game, she needs six points to tie Diann McNeil (1984-88) for 26th in career scoring and 12 points to tie Tara Williams (1995-97) for 25th.

She is also 24 points away from reaching 1,000 and is five 3-pointers away from tying Kristen Mulligan (1992-96) for fourth all-time in career 3-pointers.

**A BIG WIN**

Auburn's 64-62 overtime win at LSU on Jan. 10 marked the highest-ranked team to fall to the Tigers since Auburn defeated 10th-ranked Tennessee, 82-68, on Jan. 25, 2009. It was Auburn's first win over a ranked team this season in three tries.

**CARRIER NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

For the first time in her career, Auburn senior KeKe Carrier was named the SEC Player of the week, the league announced Jan. 11. Carrier earned the award after leading Auburn the previous week with 20.5 points and 9.0 rebounds per game.

Against Florida, she tallied her fifth double-double of the season with 24 points and 12 rebounds. She scored 13 second-half points at Florida, leading the Tiger charge that overcame a 20-point deficit to force overtime. She also scored nine of Auburn's 16 overtime points.

Carrier again had a big second-half at LSU, scoring nine of her 17 points in the second half to lead the Tigers to an overtime win over the nationally-ranked Lady Tigers. The first rebound Carrier pulled down in the LSU game marked the 500th of her career.

**REACHING 500**

Senior KeKe Carrier's first rebound at LSU on Jan. 10 marked the 500th of her career, making her just the 22nd Auburn player ever to reach the 500-rebound plateau.

She currently has 514 career rebounds and ranks 22nd all-time, 25 behind Tara Williams (1995-97), who ranks 21st with 539.

Redshirt junior Jordan Greenleaf followed up in the very next game with her 500th rebound. Her eight boards against Alabama gave her 501 on her career, ranking her 23rd all-time in career rebounding - right behind Carrier.

**IN THE TOP 30**

With her 14 points at LSU on Jan. 10, junior Alli Smalley moved into the top-30 in career scoring at Auburn, passing Kristen Mulligan (1992-96), who was previously ranked 30th with 944 career points. Smalley currently ranks 27th with 976 points.

She is the fourth player recruited to Auburn by head coach Nell Fortner to make the list, joining DeWanna Bonner (1st, 2,162 points), Sherell Hobbs (12th, 1,372 points) and Whitney Boddie (29th, 951 points).

**AGAINST THE PALMETTO STATE**

Auburn holds a 31-15 all-time record against teams from the state of South Carolina. USC is the most frequent opponent as the teams have played 31 times. Records against South Carolina teams: Charleston Southern (3-0), Clemson (4-3), Furman (5-0) and South Carolina (19-12).

**NO. 200 FOR NELL**

The Jan. 3 game against Mississippi State marked the 200th of Auburn head coach Nell Fortner's career as a head coach. Through 200 games, Fortner held a 127-73 (.635) career record. Her first game as a head coach came on Nov. 22, 1996 in an 82-49 win over Loyola Marymount while head coach at Purdue.

**CARRIER AND GREENLEAF NAMED TO SURF 'N SLAM ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM**

For their performance Dec. 28-30 at the San Diego State Surf 'N Slam Classic, Auburn senior KeKe Carrier and junior Jordan Greenleaf were named to the All-Tournament Team.

Carrier averaged 14.5 points and 14.0 rebounds per game, including setting tournament records of 19 rebounds and six blocks - both against Valparaiso.

Greenleaf averaged 15.0 points and 8.5 rebounds per game while collecting four steals against SDSU in the championship game.

**PULLING DOWN 19**

In Auburn's 51-50 win over Valparaiso, senior KeKe Carrier pulled down 19 rebounds in the game, the most for an Auburn player in 11 years. The last time a Tiger pulled down 19 rebounds was Nov. 27, 1998 as Conswella Sparrow grabbed 19 boards against Florida A&M.

The 19 rebounds set a new Surf 'N Slam Tournament record and rank in a tie for 13th-most all-time at Auburn.

**GOING TO THE POST**

In Auburn's 70-64 win over Liberty, the Tiger front court accounted for 47 points, 67.1 percent of the offensive output. It marked the first time since a Feb. 10, 2008 win at Arkansas (73-68) for the Auburn front court to out-score the back court. Against the Razorbacks, the front court accounted for 48 of the 73 points for 65.8 percent.

The Tigers continued that trend in the next three games. At South Alabama, the front court scored 44 of the 71 points (62 percent), against Valpo it scored 39 of 51 (76.5 percent) and at San Diego State it scored 28 of 55 (50.9 percent).

Against Mississippi State, it was a 50-50 split between the front court and back court.

**WELCOME BACK**

After suffering an ACL injury in July, sophomore guard Morgan Jennings dressed for Auburn's Dec. 20 game at South Alabama. Though she did not play in the game, it marked the first of the season for her to dress out at.

**LOGGING THE MINUTES**

Senior center KeKe Carrier has been logging the minutes this season and has played more than 20 minutes in the last 11 games, including 31 at Florida. It marks the first time for Carrier to tally 20 or more minutes in 11 games in a row in her career. It beaks her previous long streak

of 10 games from Jan. 29 - March 3, 2006 of her freshman season.

**SUPER FRESHMAN**

Freshman Nicolle Thomas did against Florida State what no Auburn freshman has done in a long time. The Moultrie, Ga., native scored 27 points against the 12th-ranked Seminoles, the highest single-game scoring output by an Auburn freshman since Linda Godby scored 30 against Mercer on Feb. 23, 1987.

Thomas stepped up again at Florida, banking in a 3-pointer with three seconds left to cap off an Auburn comeback and send the game into overtime.

**DOUBLE DOWN**

Senior KeKe Carrier tallied Auburn's first double-double of the season against Florida A&M in the 2009 Seminole Classic. The Lake Charles, La., native put up a season-high 17 points while coming one short of her career high with 12 rebounds.

She followed up in the very next game with another, tallying career-highs of 28 points and 13 rebounds in Auburn's 76-63 win at North Carolina A&T. Carrier tallied her third of the season against Valpo with 20 points and a career-high 19 rebounds and followed up with her fourth against Mississippi State with 18 points and 10 rebounds. She tacked on her fifth double-double of the season with 24 points and 12 rebounds at Florida.

Carrier is tied for first in the SEC with five double-doubles this season. She is tied with Kentucky's Victoria Dunlap and Alabama's Tierney Jenkins.

**STARTING FRESHMEN**

In the Nov. 19 win over Alabama A&M, Nicolle Thomas made her first career appearance in the starting lineup, joining fellow freshman Morgan Toles. With two freshmen starting, it marked the first time for Auburn to have multiple freshmen in the starting lineup since March 3, 2006 when freshmen Whitney Boddie, DeWanna Bonner and KeKe Carrier started in the SEC Tournament against Tennessee.

**BACK IN THE LINEUP**

KeKe Carrier, the lone senior on Auburn's roster this season, made her 24th career start on Nov. 19 against Alabama A&M. It marked the first time for Carrier to start a game at Auburn since Feb. 11, 2007 when she started at Vanderbilt.

**HOME COOKIN'**

Since a 77-70 loss to Virginia on Jan. 5, 1992, the Auburn Tigers have compiled a 125-6 record against non-conference opponents in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum. Overall, Auburn has a 345-67 record in its home facility for an .837 winning percentage.

**15 IN A ROW**

Until the 79-59 loss to Texas A&M, the Auburn women's basketball team had won 15 consecutive games at Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum. With the season-opening win over Troy and victory over Alabama A&M, the Auburn women's basketball team has won its last 15 home games,

dating back to the 2007-08 season. Auburn's last home loss came on Feb. 28, 2008 in a 73-56 decision to Vanderbilt. The Tigers won the last home game of the 2007-08 season and followed up by winning all 12 home games last season.

**70 AND COUNTING**

Auburn junior guard Alli Smalley earned her first collegiate start on Dec. 29, 2007 at Saint Joseph's, the 14th game of her collegiate career, and has not left. Since then, Smalley has started in 70 consecutive games.

**BLOCK PARTY**

Auburn tied the single-game school record for blocked shots on Nov. 19, 2009 with 17 against Alabama A&M. Auburn has twice before recorded 17 blocks in a game, first on Dec. 1, 1993 against Lamar and again on Feb. 23, 1994 against South Alabama. In the Alabama A&M game, freshman Pascale West tallied seven blocks while KeKe Carrier added five.

**OUTSIDE THE LEAGUE**

Nell Fortner has guided the Tigers to a 69-19 ledger in non-conference play. When playing in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum, Fortner's teams have posted a 28-4 mark. The only four non-conference losses in BEMC came from Xavier on Dec. 2, 2005 (58-60), No. 2 Duke on Dec. 31, 2004 (61-80), No. 20 George Washington on Jan. 3, 2008 (68-66) and No. 15 Texas A&M on Nov. 22, 2009 (79-59).

**OFFENSE WINS GAMES**

Auburn is 77-2 when scoring 70 or more points in the Nell Fortner era. The only times Auburn has lost when scoring at least 70 points was on Jan. 20, 2005 vs. No. 7 Tennessee, 71-81 and Feb. 19, 2009 at No. 18 Vanderbilt, 73-70. When scoring less than 70 points, Auburn is 34-61 during the Fortner era.

**IN JANUARY**

Auburn is 179-92 all-time in the month of January, including a 16-20 mark under Nell Fortner (records begin in 1978-79 season, not all dates provided prior to or during that season).

**DROPPING THE BANNER**

Prior to the Nov. 22 game against Texas A&M, the Auburn women's basketball team dropped its NCAA Tournament and SEC Championship banners from last season. The Tigers went 30-4 during the 2008-09 campaign, making its second NCAA Tournament in as many years.

**HAPPY ANNIVERSARY COACH!**

Thursday's 83-56 win against Alabama A&M marked the five-year anniversary of Nell Fortner making her debut as Auburn's head coach. The Tigers lost her Auburn-opener, 64-56, en route to finishing 16-13 in her first sesason. Since then, Fortner has put together a 103-58 record on the Plains.

**SMALLEY NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC**

Auburn junior Alli Smalley, the lone starter from last year's squad, was named to the coaches' Preseason All-SEC Second Team. The Arab, Ala., native, finished the 2008-09 season averaging 11.1 points and 2.0 three-pointers per game. She finished the season with 68 treys, a mark that ranked second all-time at Auburn, hitting 39.8 percent of her attempts.

**AUBURN PICKED EIGHTH IN SEC PRESEASON MEDIA AND COACHES POLLS**

Coming off a 30-4 season and a SEC title, the Auburn women's basketball team was picked eighth in the preseason SEC media and coaches polls. LSU was picked as the preseason favorite in the media poll, garnering 206 points; Auburn tallied 85 points. Tennessee edged out LSU by one point in the coaches poll with 112, earning the title of preseason favorite. Auburn finished with 51 points.

**GREENLEAF RETURNS**

Jordan Greenleaf will return to the Auburn lineup after going down last December with an ACL injury. She played in five games last season, averaging 7.0 points and 5.2 rebounds, before suffering the injury during practice on Dec. 4. As a sophomore, Greenleaf averaged 6.2 points and 5.4 rebounds per game while leading the team in blocks with 1.3 per game.

**STARTING EXPERIENCE**

Only three active Auburn players, Alli Smalley, Jordan Greenleaf and KeKe Carrier, entered the 2009-10 season with experience as a starter. Smalley, a junior, has started in 70 of her 83 games as a Tiger, while Greenleaf has started in 76 of 87. Both have been fixtures in the starting lineup since their freshman seasons. Carrier, a senior, has started in 38 of 107 games at Auburn, mostly during her freshman and sophomore seasons.

Reneisha Hobbs and Morgan Jennings, who were both out with ACL injuries, also have starting experience. Hobbs started against UAB last season while Jennings started the first four games of the season in place of Whitney Boddie.

**TALL TIGERS**

Fans will notice a large Auburn lineup this season, one that has an average height of 72.5 inches (or approximately 6' 0.5") - a half inch taller than last season's average. With 11 players on the roster, five are 6-0 or taller. The Tigers also sport two of the three tallest players in the conference this season in 6-7 KeKe Carrier and 6-8 Pascale West. Kentucky freshman Anna Cole, at 6-7, is the only other SEC player in that league.

**MAKING IT HOME**

Nell Fortner enters her sixth season as Auburn's head coach, marking her longest tenure at any position in her career. The longest Fortner had stayed at a job prior to Auburn came from 1990-95 while she was an assistant coach at Louisiana Tech under legendary head coach Leon Barmore.

Blake Smalley, the older brother of junior guard Alli Smalley, is a manager and one-time member of the Orange Crushers, the male practice team. He has worked with the team the past three seasons.

William Alverson, the older brother of freshman forward Blanche Alverson, is in his first year as a member of the Orange Crushers practice team.

**NEW FACES**

Auburn welcomes four new faces to its lineup this season in freshmen Blanche Alverson (Andalusia, Ala.), Nicolle Thomas (Moultrie, Ga.), Morgan Toles (Fayetteville, Ga.) and Pascale West (LaGrange, Ga.).

The recruiting class was ranked 18th in the country by ESPN.com's HoopGurlz.

**WNBA CHAMPIONS**

Former Tigers DeWanna Bonner and Le'Coe Willingham earned a distinction no other Auburn player has ever achieved as the pair helped the Phoenix Mercury win the 2009 WNBA title.

Bonner averaged 11.2 points and 5.8 rebounds per game for the Mercury and was named the WNBA's Sixth Woman of the Year. Willingham started every game of the season and averaged 10.0 points and 4.2 rebounds per outing.

Phoenix finished the season with a league-best 23-11 record and went on to defeat San Antonio in the first round of the playoffs and Los Angeles in the Western Conference Finals. The Mercury had to go all five games to take down Indiana in the WNBA Finals.

**FINAL SEASON IN BEARD-EAVES**

The 2009-10 season will be the last one for the Auburn women's basketball team in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum as it will move across the street to the new Auburn Arena for the 2010-11 season.

BEMC has been a friendly home for the Tigers as they have posted a 341-65 record in the facility since 1979. The first Auburn women's game played in BEMC came on Jan. 11, 1974 as the Tigers, under head coach Susan Nunnely, defeated Alabama, 69-31.

Auburn was 12-0 at home last season, the only team in the SEC (men's or women's) to go undefeated at home. It marked the seventh time since 1979 for AU to go undefeated at home.

**AUBURN TO HOST 2011 NCAA TOURNAMENT**  
**FIRST AND SECOND ROUNDS**

The new Auburn Arena will close out its first season of operation, March 19-22, as a host site for the first and second rounds of the 2011 NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament. Auburn's bid to host the opening rounds was selected by the NCAA and announced on Oct. 29, 2009.

The 2011 event will mark the first time for Auburn to host the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament under its current bid format. The Tigers hosted NCAA Tournament games on nine occasions between

1983 and 1993, posting an 11-0 record over that time. Auburn last hosted on March 21, 1993 when the Tigers downed Louisville, 66-61.

Auburn will be one of 16 first- and second-round sites in 2011. The complete list of host sites includes Albuquerque, N.M. (University of New Mexico, The Pit/Bob King Court); Auburn, Ala. (Auburn University, Auburn Arena); Charlottesville, Va. (University of Virginia, John Paul Jones Arena); Cincinnati, Ohio (Xavier University, Cintas Center); College Park, Md. (University of Maryland, Comcast Center); Columbus, Ohio (Ohio State University, St. John Arena); Durham, N.C. (Duke University, Cameron Indoor Stadium); Knoxville, Tenn. (University of Tennessee, Thompson-Boling Arena); Salt Lake City, Utah (University of Utah, John M. Huntsman Center); Spokane, Wash. (Gonzaga University, McCarthy Athletic Center); Shreveport, La. (Louisiana Tech University, CenturyTel Center); Stanford, Calif. (Stanford University, Maples Pavilion); Storrs, Conn. (University of Connecticut, Harry A. Gampel Pavilion); University Park, Penn. (Pennsylvania State University, Bryce Jordan Center); Waco, Texas (Baylor University, Ferrell Center); and Wichita, Kan. (Wichita State University, INTRUST Bank Arena).

The 16 advancing teams will continue play at four regional sites: Dayton, Ohio (University of Dayton Arena), Spokane, Wash. (Spokane Veterans Memorial Arena), Dallas, Texas (American Airlines Center) and Philadelphia, Pa. (Liacouras Center). The 2011 NCAA Women's Final Four will be held at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis, Ind. on April 3 and 5.

**TIGERS ON THE TUBE**

As part of the SEC's new television agreement with ESPN, the Auburn women's basketball team will be televised eight times this season on Fox Sports Net, CSS, the SEC Network and ESPNU. The SEC Tournament will be televised on Fox Sports Net, ESPNU and ESPN2. In all, the SEC will be televised in more than 70 games this season.

Three of the TV games will be at home with the remaining five on the road. The Tigers' television debut will be Jan. 7 on CSS at Florida, followed by a Jan. 10 Fox Sports Net game at LSU. The home debut will be Jan. 21 on CSS against Vanderbilt, the first of four consecutive televised games.

Auburn will then make its SEC Net work debut, Jan. 24 at Kentucky, followed by its third and final CSS appearance Jan. 28 at Tennessee. The Tigers close out the month, Jan. 31, at home against Georgia on ESPNU.

Fox Sports Net will televise the final two appearances, Feb. 7 at Alabama and Feb. 14 at home against LSU.

**NEW ARENA OPENING 2010-11**

The official groundbreaking of the new \$92.5 million Auburn basketball arena and practice facility was on Aug. 29, 2008, and the arena will open prior to the 2010-11 season.

The arena, with approximate capacity of 9,600, will include more than 29,000 square feet of student-athlete space, a two-court practice facility, coaches offices, the Auburn University Athletic Ticket Office, an AU Team Store, the relocated Lovelace Museum, two food courts along with many other amenities.

360 Architecture of Kansas City, Mo., has been working with Davis Architects of Birmingham on the design of the arena. The firm of Robins & Morton of Birmingham is serving as construction manager. The 243,792 square foot facility will be built on campus north and west of the existing Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum on Roosevelt Drive, across the street from the Student Activities Center parking lot.

The new arena will feature chair back seats along with bleacher seating for students. The building also will provide improved facilities for the student-athletes, including men's and women's locker room suites with sports medicine facilities, lounges and team meeting rooms. Along with a strength and conditioning center, a two-court practice facility will enable the men's and women's teams to practice simultaneously and while the arena is in use for other purposes.

The arena will have 12 luxury suites on the arena level that will not only open inside the facility, but will also open on the outside of the arena for multiple entertaining opportunities throughout the year. Loge box seating will also be available as well as on-site food preparation.

The seating configuration will offer better sight lines and will move fans closer to the court. The furthest seat will be just 43 feet in elevation from courtside, compared to 60 feet in elevation at Beard-Eaves, with two-thirds of the seats in the new facility being less than 27 feet in elevation from courtside.

The scoreboard will feature a high-definition video board with full message/information center technology. For the student fan amenities, there will be a private entrance, a private court-side commons and food court and court-side seating that permits standing with unobstructed views.

The new facility will serve as more than a sports complex. With over 12,000 square feet of banquet/entertainment space, its design affords ready adaptation in to a site for concerts and other culturalevents, convocations and other community gatherings. On-campus student housing is being constructed adjacent to the new arena creating a unique "student village" experience.

Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum is entering its 42nd and final year of service to the University, while the new arena will be Auburn's fifth home arena in the 104 years of basketball. The Tigers other arenas have been The Gymnasium (1906-16), Alumni Gym (1916-48) and the Sports Arena (1948-69).

360 Architecture has been selected to design the new Oakland A's stadium and has designed the Miami Heat's American Airlines Arena, NHL's Columbus Blue Jackets' Nationwide Arena,

the University of Missouri's Mizzou Arena and the Sprint Center in Kansas City, Mo.

"I am very excited about this class," said Fortner. "This class falls along the lines of the 2005 class of DeWanna Bonner, Whitney Boddie, Sherell Hobbs and KeKe Carrier. I think this class has a chance to do some really special things during their time here at Auburn. We want to win championships and I feel they will have opportunities to win some championships while they are here."

With three players ranked in the top 100 in the nation, the signing class has been ranked 13th in the country by Blue Star, 18th by ESPN.com's HoopGurlz, 22nd by Dan Olson and 26th by All-Star Girls Report.

"This is a very balanced class and they all have room to get better," said Fortner. "They all have tremendous upside and have had success in their high school years and that is always good to have kids that are used to winning, they come in here and expect to win."

**Peyton Davis**

Davis is a 6-5 center who plays for Mortimer Jordan High School in Morris, Ala., and the Alabama Roadrunners club team. As a rising junior, Davis was named to the ESPN.com HoopGurlz Top 100 Watch List and enters her senior year ranked as the 27th best post prospect in the country. Davis was named to the all-state and all-area while also earning All-Metro Academic honors and a spot on the North-South All-Star Team. A two-sport athlete in high school, she was also an all-area volleyball selection last season, leading the Birmingham metro area in blocks and kills.

**Camille Glymph**

Glymph, a 5-10 guard, is entering her senior year at J.L. Mann High School in Greenville, S.C. She also plays for the Carolina Cougars club team. She enters the season ranked as the No. 52 overall prospect in the country by ESPN.com's HoopGurlz and the No. 13 guard prospect. A two-time all-state selection, Glymph has led Mann High School to two state championships during her tenure. She is also a three-time all-county and two-time all-region honoree

**Courtney Strain**

Strain, a 5-9 guard from Woodland, Ala., set the Alabama state scoring record as a junior last season at Woodland High School and is coming off a season in which she led the nation in scoring for the second year in a row with 34.5 points per game. A two-time Alabama 2A Player of the Year, she has been selected to the all-state first team in each of her three seasons at Woodland.

**Tyrese Tanner**

Tanner, a 6-2 forward, is playing for a Hoover High School team that is ranked 13th in the nation by ESPN.com. She enters her senior season ranked as the No. 43 overall prospect by Blue Star, 46th by All-Star Girls Report and 75th by ESPN.com's HoopGurlz. She is also ranked as the 13th-best wing in the country by HoopGurlz. She was ranked as high as seventh in the nation following her sophomore season in which she was named All-Region and All-Area for the second season in a row. She sat out her junior year because of injury, but has already made an impact in her return as she was the North team MVP in the annual North-South All-Star Game.

**Jassany Williams**

Williams, a 6-2 forward, plays for Nova High School in Davie, Fla. She enters her senior season ranked as the No. 59 overall prospect in the country by ESPN.com's HoopGurlz and is the seventh-best post prospect in the nation. She also received a top-100 ranking from the All-Star Girls Report, coming in at 83rd. She has been recognized as an ESPN Rise Magazine Player to Watch as she led her team to a state runner-up finish as a junior. Named to the All-Sun-Sentinel and Miami Herald First Teams, she has also been recognized as part of the FAB 5 of Broward County.

**SEC Women's Basketball Notes**

- The SEC has posted impressive non-conference records in the last decade. The SEC compiled a 138-51 (.730) non-conference record during the 2008-09 season.
- Since the 1990 season, the SEC has compiled a 2751-797 (.775) record against other conferences. The league has recorded 150+ wins during eight seasons and has never recorded a non-conference winning percentage below .723.
- SEC teams have earned appearances in 25 of 28 NCAA Final Fours, an accomplishment unmatched by any other league.
- Overall, SEC squads have filled 34 of the 112 Final Four berths, including having two Final Four teams in 1988 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1989 (Auburn, Tennessee), 1995 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1996 (Georgia, Tennessee), 1998 (Arkansas, Tennessee), 2004 (LSU, Tennessee), 2005 (LSU, Tennessee), 2007 (LSU, Tennessee) and 2008 (LSU, Tennessee).
- SEC teams have made 18 appearances in a nation-high 16 NCAA Championship games, winning eight NCAA Championships (Tennessee: 1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008).
- The league also had the distinction of providing both national finalists twice in its history in 1996 (Tennessee 83, Georgia 65) and in 1989 (Tennessee 76, Auburn 60).
  - SEC teams have won 318 NCAA Tournament games against 162 losses (.663) for an average of 11.4 NCAA wins per year.
- In addition, all 12 current members have appeared in the NCAA Tournament.
- The SEC has paced the pack in NCAA tournament bids 21 times in its 28-year history.
  - The SEC was the first league to ever have eight teams invited to the NCAA Tournament, doing so in 1999 and 2002.
  - The SEC was also the first league to ever have seven teams invited to the NCAA Tournament and earned this honor a leading seven times (1986, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2003, 2004).
  - The SEC is one of a handful of leagues to have won three national tournament titles with eight NCAA, two WNIT and three NWIT. Along with the eight NCAA championships won by Tennessee, Arkansas (1999) and Auburn (2003) captured the current Women's NIT titles. But the first-ever SEC national title belongs to Georgia, winners of the 1981 NWIT which predates the current NCAA tournament. LSU (1985) and Kentucky (1990) each won NWIT titles. Both Arkansas (1987) and South Carolina (1979) won the WNIT as members of their previous conferences.
  - In 2003, Auburn won the WNIT title with wins over South Alabama, Florida State, Richmond, Creighton and Baylor. In 1999, the Arkansas Lady Razorbacks defeated Wisconsin 76-64 to claim the SEC's first WNIT championship.
  - In 1981, Georgia defeated Pittsburg, California and Arizona State (in OT) to capture the NWIT Championship, the first-ever national championship of any kind for the SEC in women's basketball.

**AUBURN** - The Auburn women's basketball team opened its final season at Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum Nov. 8 with a 73-50 exhibition win over Georgia College and State University. Sophomore Parrisha Simmons recorded a double-double with 14 points and 11 rebounds while three other Tigers scored in double digits.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - An 11-0 run early in the second half put 12th-ranked Florida State up for good as the Seminoles (5-0) pulled out the 82-67 victory over Auburn (3-3) in the Tigers' first game of the 2009 Seminole Classic.
