MUSIC CITY BOWL CHAMPIONS

» Auburn (8-5, 3-5 SEC) defeated Purdue, 63-14, in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl at Nissan Stadium in Nashville, Tenn. It was Auburn's 43rd bowl appearance all-time, and its sixth straight under Gus Malzahn, the most consecutive seasons in a bowl for the Tigers since going bowling eight straight seasons from 2000-07. Auburn is now 24-17-2 all-time in bowl games.

» Auburn set bowl records for points scored (63/also an SEC bowl record), points in a half (56), points in a quarter (28), yards in a quarter (255), yards in a half (398) and yards in a game (586) against Purdue.

» JaTarvious Whitlow and Darius Slayton are the first Auburn players to score three touchdowns in a bowl game. Jarrett Stidham is the first Auburn player to throw five touchdown passes in a bowl game and his 373 passing yards were second-most ever by an Auburn player in a bowl.

» Slayton set an Auburn bowl game record with 160 receiving yards on just three catches (all TDs); the previous high was 159 yards by Herbert Casey in the 1990 Peach Bowl.

» Slayton's 74-yard touchdown catch from Stidham was the longest touchdown reception in Auburn bowl history; the previous high was 73 yards, Bo Jackson from Pat Washington in the 1986 Cotton Bowl. Whitlow's 66-yard TD reception from Stidham tied for the third-longest passing score in Auburn bowl history (also Ricardo Louis from Nick Marshall in the 2015 Outback Bowl).

» Whitlow was the first Auburn player to score both rushing and receiving touchdowns in a bowl game since the 2014 BCS national championship game (Tre Mason vs. Florida State).

» Big Kat Bryant's 20-yard interception return touchdown was only the fourth ever in a bowl by an Auburn player and the first since Walter McFadden in the 2010 Outback Bowl.

TOTAL OFFENSE

» There have been nine 600-yard total offense games and 25 500-yard games during Malzahn's tenure as head coach at Auburn, the latest being the 586-yard output against Purdue in the Music City Bowl, the third 500-yard game this season.

Auburn has gained at least 200 yards total offense in a quarter 17 times under Malzahn, the latest being 255 yards in the first quarter against Purdue, and nine times against SEC teams, including a 228-yard third quarter at Ole Miss this year.

KICKOFF COVERAGE

» Senior Ryan Davis, with 178 career catches, finished as the Auburn career receptions leader, passing Courtney Taylor (153 from 2003-06)

» Auburn allowed only nine rushing TD, tied for fifth best nationally. The Tigers held seven of 13 opponents without a rushing TD this season

» The Auburn defense allowed a TD on just 34.3 percent (12-35) of its opponents' trips into the red zone, second best in the nation

» Senior linebacker Deshaun Davis, with a team-leading 116 tackles, was one of 20 quarterfinalists for the Lott IMPACT Trophy

» Six of Auburn's 2018 opponents were ranked in the final CFP Top 25 and the Tigers played four of those away from home

» Tiger freshmen accounted for 239 of Auburn's 402 points this season (59.5 percent), including 25 of 49 TDs (51.0 percent)

» The Tigers were 14th nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 19.2 points per game

» Jarrett Stidham to Ryan Davis (154 completions) is the most productive pass tandem in Auburn history; the record was 140 by Pat Sullivan to Terry Beasley (1969-71)

» Auburn ranked fifth nationally in net punting at 41.91 yards

» Auburn was one of only 13 teams nationally to return three interceptions for touchdowns this season

» For the season, Auburn's 38 sacks (2.92/gm) ranked 16th nationally

SEC FIRST-YEAR ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL

» Auburn football had 12 representatives on the 2017-18 SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. » Auburn has scored in all 80 games of the Malzahn era, the second-longest streak in school history. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012, the last game prior to Malzahn taking over at Auburn.

» The 63 points scored against both Purdue and Alabama State are the most by Auburn during the Malzahn era. Under Malzahn, Auburn has scored 40 points or more 29 times in 80 games, 50 points or more 13 times and 60 points or more three times.

» Auburn has scored first in 25 of its last 31 games, dating back to the final four contests of the 2016 campaign, including nine times this season. The Tigers are 41-13 under Coach Gus Malzahn when scoring first.

» Auburn had 29 first downs against Liberty, 27 against Washington and 28 vs. Alabama State. Under Malzahn, the Tigers have gained 20 or more first downs in 55-80 games, with 33 games with 25+ first downs. Auburn averages 21.96 first downs per game under Malzahn.

» Auburn's 53-point win over Liberty was its 21st of 50 or more points at Jordan-Hare Stadium and the fourth of the Gus Malzahn era.

ON THE RUN

» JaTarvious Whitlow's season-high 170 rushing yards at Ole Miss were the most rushing yards for an Auburn freshman in an SEC game since Michael Dyer (180) at Ole Miss in 2010. It was his third 100-yard performance of the year.

» Against Alabama State, Whitlow (122 yards, 14 carries) and Shaun Shivers (117 yards, 13 carries, 1 TD) became the first pair of Auburn freshmen ever to rush for 100 yards each in a game, as the Tigers rushed for 429 yards overall, seventh most of the Malzahn era.

Whitlow followed that up with 104 yards rushing on 22 carries with a 7-yard touchdown against LSU, the first Auburn freshman since Michael Dyer in 2010 to rush for 100 yards in back-to-back games.

» Whitlow scored six rushing touchdowns, tied for second among Auburn all-time freshman rushers, along with two receiving scores. Arkansas was his first multiple-TD game and he had the first three scores (2 rush, 1 rec) of the Music City Bowl.

Whitlow's 785 rushing yards for the season rank third all-time among Auburn freshmen. Whitlow led all SEC freshmen and was 15th nationally among freshmen rushers.

» Auburn has produced a 100-yard rusher in 51 of 80 games under head coach Gus Malzahn. Twelve different Tigers have rushed for 100 yards in a game under Malzahn (63 100-yd performances).

Auburn's record with a 100-yard rusher during the Malzahn era is 40-11; with two 100-yard rushers in the same game, it's 12-0.

PASSING ATTACK

» Quarterback Jarrett Stidham recorded his 17th 200-yard passing game at Auburn with 373 yards (15-21, 5 TD) vs. Purdue in the Music City Bowl. His 373 yards vs. the Boilermakers was the fifth 300-yard passing game of his Auburn career.

» Stidham finished sixth among Auburn career passing leaders with 5,891 yards in 27 games. He reached the 5,000-yard mark faster (23 games) than any previous Auburn passer; Pat Sullivan passed 5,000 yards in his 24th game.

STUDENT-ATHLETE EXPERIENCE: FACILITIES

» An important upgrade in the recent Jordan-Hare Stadium renovation provides a new expanded home locker room for Auburn football student-athletes, more than doubling the previous space, accented with state of the art lighting, speakers and sound system in a customized orange and blue decor in the south end zone.

» Stidham recorded the highest completion percentage in a season opener in Auburn records for games with more than 25 passing attempts. Stidham was 26-36 (.722) for 273 yards with a touchdown vs. Washington. Previous best: 71.8% (28-39) by Patrick Nix vs. Ole Miss in 1995.

» At 33.28 ppg, Stidham ranked sixth nationally among QBs who have led their team to an average of at least 30 points over 20 or more career starts. His teams had 965 points in 29 career starts at Baylor and Auburn.

» Senior Ryan Davis finished with 178 career receptions, most in Auburn history. Davis ranks 14th in Auburn career receiving yardage (1,555).

Davis caught multiple passes in 27 straight games since the start of 2017, the fourth-longest streak in school history and the longest by an Auburn player since Karsten Bailey had a 28-game streak from 1996-98.

» Davis averaged 6.9 receptions in 11 games against ranked opponents since the beginning of 2017. In 2017, Davis set the Auburn single-season record for receptions (84) and ranked second in the SEC with 6.0 catches per game.

» Stidham to Davis is the most productive pass tandem in Auburn history, with 154 completions; the previous record was 140 by Pat Sullivan to Terry Beasley (1969-71).

» Darius Slayton, who finished 11th among Auburn career receiving yardage leaders (1,605), recorded his first multiple-TD game with three scores against Purdue in the Music City Bowl, giving him 11 TD for his career. He posted his third career 100-yard game with 160 yards on three catches (all touchdowns) against Purdue. He averaged 19.1 yards per catch this season and 20.3 yards per catch for his career.

» True freshman Anthony Schwartz' 76-yard touchdown reception against Tennessee was Auburn's longest offensive play of the season and the longest completion of Jarrett Stidham's Auburn career.

Schwartz scored his first TD against Alabama State, a 57-yard reception, then added a 23-yard rush in the second quarter for his first career TD run. Schwartz added rushing touchdowns against Alabama (9 yards), Southern Miss (6 yards) and scored on a fumble recovery in the endzone at Ole Miss. He added a 6-yard rushing score in the Music City Bowl to give him seven touchdowns for the season.

Schwartz finished ranked sixth in Auburn freshman receiving yards (357) and ninth in freshman receptions (22).

» True freshman Seth Williams, who led the SEC and ranked 10th nationally in yards per reception (20.54), finished the season ranked third in Auburn freshman receiving yards (534) and fifth in freshman receptions (26).

Williams scored on a pair of 11-yard catches vs. Texas A&M, the second the gamewinner with 1:41 remaining. He added a 45-yard TD catch against Liberty and finished that contest with 109 yards on five catches, his first career 100-yard game.

The first Auburn player with two TD catches in a game since Tony Stevens vs. Arkansas State (2016) and the first in an SEC game since Sammie Coates in the 2014 Iron Bowl, Williams was the first freshman with two receiving TD in a game since Ronney Daniels in 1999.

Williams also added touchdown catches against Tennessee (14 yards) and Southern Miss (46 yards) this year. His 62-yard non-TD reception at Ole Miss was Auburn's fifth longest pass play of the year.

DEFENSIVE DOMINATION

» Auburn allowed only nine rushing TD, tied for fifth fewest allowed nationally. The Tigers held seven of 13 opponents without a rush TD this season.

» The Auburn defense allowed a TD on just 34.3 percent (12-35) of its opponents' trips into the red zone, second best in the nation.

» Auburn's 53-0 victory over Liberty was the Tigers' first shutout since blanking Alabama A&M 55-0 in 2016, and the first shutout of an FBS opponent ULM (34-0) in 2008.

» Auburn held Liberty to 134 yards of total offense, the third time during the Steele tenure AU held an opponent below 150 total yards. Those three games under Steele are just one fewer than Auburn had from 2000-2015 combined.

The seven first downs Auburn allowed against Liberty were the fewest allowed since 2013 vs. Western Carolina (6) and the fewest against an FBS opponent since 2008 vs. Mississippi State (6).

» Auburn ranked 14th nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 19.2 points per game.

Auburn has allowed only 18.25 points per game in Kevin Steele's three seasons as coordinator, 10th among FBS teams.

» Nick Coe was SEC defensive lineman of the week three times this season., against Washington (2 TFL, 1 sack, FF), at Ole Miss (3.5 sacks) and versus Texas A&M (2 TFL, 1 sack).

Coe had at least 0.5 TFL in eight games and had 13.5 TFL and 7.0 sacks for the year.

» First team all-SEC linebacker Deshaun Davis recorded a career-high 13 tackles against No. 12 LSU, and tied career bests with 4.0 TFL, a sack, a PBU and two QB hurries, earning Lott Impact Player of the Week.

LB Darrell Williams (8 tackles, TFL, FR, PBU) was the SEC defensive player of the week for his play in the Washington win.

» Current players with career double-figure tackle games at Auburn: Deshaun Davis (10), Darrell Williams, Daniel Thomas (2); Marlon Davidson, Jeremiah Dinson (1).

» In 17 games against ranked opponents under Steele, Auburn has allowed an average of 22.9 ppg and has allowed 17 or fewer points eight times (47.1 percent).

Prior to his arrival, the Tigers allowed 31.5 ppg in 38 games against ranked opponents from 2009-15, and only held seven ranked opponents to 17 or fewer points (18.4 percent).

» Auburn is second nationally allowing just 28 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season; the Tigers are tied for sixth nationally allowing only 80 total TD during that span.

» Under Steele, Auburn has held the opponent under its season rushing average 32 times, including 15 of the last 17 games (not including season openers), the latest being Purdue. In 25 of those games, Auburn has held

its opponent to 40-or-more yards below its season average.

Liberty (avg. 159.2 ypg prior) gained only 55 yards rushing, the fourth time this year Auburn held an opponent below 100 yards rushing.

» In a three-season span, Auburn is eighth nationally having allowed only 4.96 yards per play since the start of the 2016 campaign.

» In 40 games under Steele, the Auburn defense has recorded 100 sacks (2.5 per game) and has been held without a sack only five times. Auburn has recorded at least 6.0 TFL in 26 of those games. The Tigers averaged 7.4 TFL per game this season, 20th nationally.

The Tigers have forced 56 turnovers (30 INT, 26 FR) and allowed only 27 rushing touchdowns during that stretch.

» Auburn is one of just 13 teams nationally with at least three interceptions returned for touchdowns this season.

» Noah Igbinoghene's fourth-quarter interception vs. Texas A&M ignited two Auburn scoring drives in the final 7:00 of that win.

Against Alabama State, Daniel Thomas recorded two interceptions, his first multiple-int game since the 2016 Alabama game. Thomas' first career TD came on his first quarter 29-yard interception. He is one of just five Auburn players since 1996 to record multiple INT in multiple games: Jonathan Jones (2), Walter McFadden (2), Larry Casher (2) and Brad Ware (3).

Jamien Sherwood also had a pick against ASU. Versus Arkansas, Javaris Davis recorded his first pick of the year with a 57-yd return.

Jeremiah Dinson and Christian Tutt grabbed their first career interceptions vs. Southern Miss. Dinson added another at Mississippi State, the first Auburn player with interceptions in back-to-back games since Joshua Holsey in 2016 vs. Ole Miss and Vanderbilt.

Jamel Dean had an interception at Georgia. Against Liberty, Darrell Williams scored on

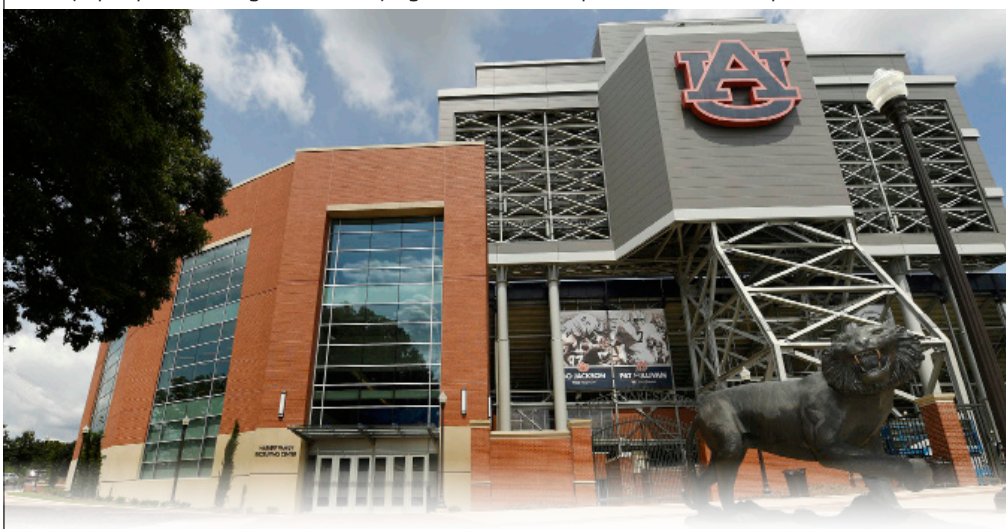

Big Kat Bryant (20-yd TD) and Javaris Davis recorded interceptions vs. Purdue in the Music City Bowl.

» Career interceptions by current players: Javaris Davis (6), Daniel Thomas (5); Jamel Dean, Jeremiah Dinson (2); Big Kat Bryant, Noah Iginobene, Smoke Monday, Jamien Sherwood, Christian Tutt, Darrell Williams (1).

» Auburn finished 27th nationally in pass defense completion percentage (55.5). Auburn tied for ninth nationally with three interceptions returns for touchdowns this season.

Auburn held Liberty to 79 yards passing, the second time this season and the third time in three seasons under Steele that Auburn held an opponent below 100 yards passing.

» Auburn ranked 20th nationally in TFL per game (7.4) this season, with 96 TFL and 38 sacks for the year.

Auburn recorded 11 sacks in back to back games vs. Ole Miss (6) and Texas A&M (5), the first time since 2004 the Tigers had five sacks in consecutive games (8 Kentucky, 7 Ole Miss). The Tigers had 17 sacks in the last four games after recording 15 in the first six games.

For the season, Auburn's 38 sacks (2.92/gm) ranked 16th nationally.

Top TFL totals this season: 12.0 Texas A&M; 12.0 Southern Miss; 10.0 Tennessee; 9.0 Washington; 9.0 Alabama State.

The Tigers ranked 103rd among FBS teams with just 19 sacks in 2015 prior to Kevin Steele's arrival. In his first season, Auburn recorded 25 sacks, ranked 71st nationally; in 2017, the Tigers racked up 37 sacks, 19th nationally and the most for Auburn since 2005 (39).

» Auburn's defense has allowed only six touchdowns in the first quarter in the last 31 games, and only five in the opening period since the start of 2017 (four this season).

» Nine current players have totaled more than 100 career tackles at Auburn: Deshaun Davis (266), Darrell Williams (183), Dontavius Russell (152), Marlon Davidson (126), Daniel Thomas (125), Jeremiah Dinson (123), Montavious Atkinson (117), Derrick Brown (114) and Javaris Davis (107).

Deshaun Davis is just the 15th Auburn player since 2000 to record 200 career tackles and ranks fourth among Auburn career tacklers since 2000.

» The Auburn defense recorded 59 three-and-outs through 13 games, an average of 4.54 per game, 16th best nationally.

SPECIAL TEAMS

» Marlon Davidson blocked three field goal attempts this season, second-best nationally. Jordyn Peters, also ranked second nationally, blocked three punts, making Auburn the only team nationally with two players with multiple blocked kicks/punts.

Auburn's seven blocked kicks/punts tied for best in the nation with Toledo and Baylor among FBS teams.

Seven blocked kicks are the most for a season in Auburn records back through 1996.

» Marlon Davidson blocked a Mississippi State field goal attempt, the first for Auburn since Derrick Brown blocked a UCF field goal attempt in last year's Peach Bowl.

Davidson added another field goal block against Tennessee, becoming the first Auburn player to block a FG attempt in consecutive games since Angelo Blackson in 2012.

Blocking a third field goal attempt at Ole Miss, Davidson tied for second-most FG blocks in a season in SEC history and ranks second among NCAA leaders this season. The last Auburn player with three blocks (kicks and punts) in a season was Alton Moore in 2001.

» Devan Barrett recovered a blocked punt for a touchdown against Alabama State for his second career score.

The punt was blocked by Jordyn Peters, who also recorded a punt block versus Arkansas, making him just the second Auburn player since 1996 to block two punts in a season (Justin Fetsko, 2003). Peters added a third blocked punt against Liberty. Smoke Monday blocked a punt versus Alabama.

» Auburn ranked fifth nationally in net punting (41.91). Punter Arryn Siposs averaged 44.2 yards per kick (18th ranked nationally), with 10 punts of 50+ yards. His career best was a 60-yarder vs. Arkansas.

Siposs' average of 48.3 yards per punt vs. Texas A&M was the best game average for an Auburn punter since Kevin Phillips averaged 49.2 yards per punt against Oklahoma in the 2017 Sugar Bowl. Siposs was also the first with three punts of 50+ yards in a game since Phillips had four at LSU in 2015.

» Auburn kickers have converted 274 consecutive PAT attempts back to the 2013 Tennessee game, the longest active streak in the FBS and the SEC record.

Cody Parkey (2013) and Daniel Carlson (2014-17) were Auburn's previous kickers during the streak; Carlson set the SEC individual record for consecutive PAT (198) before graduating. The NCAA record is 302, set by Florida State from 2012-16.

» Auburn is three games ahead of Hawai'i for the longest current span of games (129)

without having a punt blocked. Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.

» Redshirt freshman Anders Carlson was 3-5 on field goals in his debut against Washington, making kicks from 28, 32 and 53 yards. He added another 53-yard field goal against Liberty.

Those 53-yarders tie the second-longest field goal ever made by an Auburn freshman. The record: Win Lyle (55 yards vs. Tennessee in 1987); Robert McGinty was good on a 53-yarder against Cincinnati in 1984.

Anders Carlson is 44-44 on PAT attempts and 51-70 on touchbacks (11th nationally) on kickoffs during his young career.

» With 563 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons are chasing Florida State's Roberto and Ricky Aguayo (672 current points) for the most points scored by an active kicking duo of brothers who kicked for the same college.

» Auburn is one of 18 teams nationally to return both a kickoff and a punt for a TD this season, along with Alabama, Appalachian State, Boise State, Louisville, Maryland, Memphis, Michigan, New Mexico State, North Texas, Ohio, Pitt, TCU, Temple, Toledo, Troy, Utah State and Washington State.

» Noah Igbinoghene's 96-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against Arkansas was the first of his career, the first for Auburn since Corey Grant in 2013 vs. Tennessee and the longest Auburn kickoff return since Tre Mason vs. Washington State in 2013 (100 yards). Igbinoghene was named SEC special teams player of the week.

» Ryan Davis, who ranked 20th nationally with a 9.9-yard punt return average, is tied for 28th among FBS players with three returns of at least 20 yards and one of only 16 with three returns of at least 30 yards.

RANKINGS

» Auburn has played 35 games against ranked teams in Gus Malzahn's 80 games as the Tigers' head coach (43.8 percent of total games). Of those, 20 have been against Top 10 opponents. Auburn is 16-19 in games against ranked opponents under Malzahn, including a 7-13 mark against Top 10 teams.

» Auburn is 110-159-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. The Tigers are 51-41-2 at home against ranked teams, 27-68-2 on the road and 32-50-2 on a neutral field.

» The Tigers are 87-128-5 all-time facing ranked SEC opponents (41-32-2 at home, 27-61-2 away, 19-35-1 neutral). Ranked Auburn teams vs. ranked SEC teams are 56-48-3 overall (27-9-1 at home, 18-29-1 at the opponent's home, 11-10-1 on a neutral field).

» In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 319-249-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 134-59-6 all-time; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 185-190-12 overall. The Tigers are 28-20 in SEC action under Coach Gus Malzahn.

» Auburn's freshmen accounted for 239 of the Tigers' 402 points this season (59.5 percent), including 25 of 49 TDs (51.0 percent). Freshman scoring: Anders Carlson 89; JaTarvious Whitlow 48; Anthony Schwartz 42; Seth Williams 30; Shaun Shivers 18; Harold Joiner 6; John Samuel Shenker 6.

» Since 2001, Auburn is 140-26 (.843) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 196-34-1 (.851) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 535-54-9 (.902) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 336-9 (.974) when scoring 30 points, 168-3 (.982) when scoring 40 points, 77-0 when scoring 50 points and 27-0 when scoring 60 points.

» This season, 51 players saw their first game action in an Auburn uniform, including 22 true and 15 redshirt freshmen. Against Liberty, 81 players saw game action.

» On the 2018 squad, 40 players had at least one college start to their credit, 21 on offense and 19 on defense. Fourteen Tigers now have at least 20 college starts: Dontavius Russell 50, Chandler Cox 41, Marlon Davidson 39, Dashaun Davis 36, Jack Driscoll 32 (20@UMass), Darius Slayton 32, Jarrett Stidham 30 (3@Baylor), Ryan Davis 28, Darrell Williams 26, Derrick Brown 26, Javaris Davis 24, Jamel Dean 22, Mike Horton 20, Prince Tega Wanogho 20.

FAST FACTS

» Gus Malzahn has won or played for a conference title in seven of his 13 seasons as a collegiate coach.

» Malzahn had 35 victories in his first four seasons as Auburn head coach, the second-most in Auburn history behind only Terry Bowden.

» His 20-7 record was the second-best start in Auburn history, only behind Terry Bowden, who started 20-1-1 in 1993-94.

» Malzahn's teams have won their conference championships in three of the last eight seasons - with Auburn in 2010 and 2013 and Arkansas State in 2012.

» Having completed six seasons, Malzahn is fifth among Auburn football coaches all-time in total wins.

The leaders (and seasons coached): **176**, Ralph "Shug" Jordan (25); **99**, Pat Dye (12) and Mike Donahue (18); **85**, Tommy Tuberville (10); **53 Gus Malzahn (6); 48**, Jack Meagher (9); **47**, Terry Bowden (6); **33**, Gene Chizik (4); **29**, Doug Barfield (5); **22**, Chet Wynne (4).

» Two of the five most productive offenses in SEC history were Malzahn concoctions: Auburn 2013 (7,018) and Auburn 2010 (6,989).

» Since 2000, in the seven seasons Malzahn has been at Auburn, the Tigers have posted 22 50-point games; in the 10 seasons without Malzahn, Auburn recorded just seven 50-point games. The Tigers have recorded three 50-point games in a season three times since Malzahn took over as Auburn head coach (2013, 2016 and 2018).

» Just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, joining Bernie Moore (LSU, 1935) and John Vaught (Ole Miss, 1947).

» Malzahn is 40-10 (.800) at home as a collegiate head coach (5-1 in 2012 at Arkansas State; 8-0 in 2013, 6-1 in 2014, 3-4 in 2015, 6-2 in 2016, 7-0 in 2017 and 5-2 in 2018 at Auburn). He started his Auburn tenure with 13 consecutive home victories.

» In eight seasons at Auburn as an assistant or head coach, Malzahn's teams have had at least one first-team all-SEC selection each year.

» Malzahn's Auburn teams scored at least 20 points in his first 23 games as head coach; his Auburn teams have scored 20 points or more in 65 of 80 games.

» Has produced 16 1,000-yard rushers in 12 years as a college head coach/offensive coordinator. Malzahn has coached five 1,000-yard receivers and four 3,000-yard passers.

» 2013 national coach of the year awards: Eddie Robinson, Bobby Bowden, Bear Bryant, Home Depot, Associated Press, Liberty Mutual, Sporting News, SB Nation, USSA Amos Alonzo Stagg.

» In 14 seasons as a high school head coach in Arkansas, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame.

» Auburn has produced a rusher with 100 or more yards in 51 of 80 games under Malzahn.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium, the nation's 12th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451, is in its 80th year as home to the Auburn Tigers.

On football Saturdays in Auburn, Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes Alabama's sixth-largest city. More than 75,000 season tickets have been sold to Auburn home games in each of the last 23 years.

The stadium is named for Ralph "Shug" Jordan, Auburn's all-time winningest football coach, and Clifford Leroy Hare, a member of Auburn's first football team, president of the old Southern Conference and long-time chairman of Auburn's Faculty Athletic Committee.

Legendary coach Pat Dye has also had his name forever attached to Jordan-Hare Stadium, as the turf officially became known as Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. Dye, who served as coach and athletics director at Auburn (1981-92) and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame (2005), led Auburn to a 99-39-4 record and four SEC titles in his 12 seasons on the Plains.

What is now Jordan-Hare Stadium was dedicated November 30, 1939, at the Auburn-Florida game. Babe McGehee, who passed away in 2005, scored the first touchdown in what was then called "Auburn Stadium," by catching a pass from Dick McGowen. McGowen, who later coached at Auburn under Jordan, kicked the extra point and Auburn tied Florida, 7-7.

That first stadium held 7,500 seats and consisted of what is now the bottom part of the lower west stands. When the stadium was renamed "Cliff Hare Stadium" in 1949, 14,000 seats—the present lower east stands—had been added, raising capacity to 21,500.

Jordan became head coach in 1951 and the stadium underwent three major expansions in 15 years. More than 40,000 seats, virtually half of the stadium's present capacity, were added while Jordan was the coach.

Cliff Hare Stadium became Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973. It was the first stadium in the country to be named for an active coach.

Overall, Auburn has played 414 games in Jordan-Hare Stadium, winning 324, losing 83 and tying seven for a winning percentage of .791 against some of the best teams in college football.

JaTarvious Whitlow rushed for 104 yards and a touchdown but No. 12 LSU kicked a field goal as time expired to beat No. 7 Auburn 22-21.

LSU, aided by two pass-interference penalties, drove 52 yards on 14 plays to set up Cole Tracy's 42-yard game winner. Leading 14-10 in the third quarter, Jarrett Stidham's 4-yard touchdown pass to Darius Slayton on third-and-goal gave Auburn a two-score lead.

Slayton's touchdown marked 21 unanswered points for Auburn, turning a 10-point deficit into an 11-point lead. Auburn's drive began at its own 45, after LSU's fake punt jump pass fell incomplete.

LSU kicked a field goal late in the third quarter to cut the lead to 21-13, then scored on a 71-yard pass from Joe Burrow to Derrick Dillon to make it 21-19 with 8:18 to play.

LSU went for two, hoping to tie, but Jamel Dean broke up Burrow's pass in the end zone, preserving Auburn's lead. Deshaun Davis led Auburn's defense with 13 tackles, a sack and four tackles for loss. Derrick Brown added nine tackles. Trailing 10-0 in the second quarter after an LSU field goal, Auburn drove 75 yards on 10 plays for its first score.

On third-and-6, Stidham connected with Slayton for 9 yards, then found Seth Williams for 19 yards across midfield. From the 7, Whitlow ran up the middle for Auburn's first touchdown, trimming LSU's lead to 10-7.

Auburn's defense responded with a three-and-out, with a third down sack from Davis forcing an LSU punt, giving the home team possession again less than a minute after its touchdown.

The Tigers marched 66 yards on nine plays to take the lead, mixing passes from Stidham to Williams and Chandler Cox with runs by Whitlow and Shaun Shivers.

Shivers gave Auburn a 14-10 lead with a 7-yard touchdown run to the left with 1:31 remaining in the half. Stidham completed 16 of 28 passes for 198 yards and a touchdown. Whitlow averaged 4.7 yards on 22 carries, including a 19-yarder.

LSU led 7-0 after capitalizing on an interception on Auburn's first possession at Auburn's 34. The Bengal Tigers added a field goal with 8:37 remaining in the second quarter to lead 10-0.

There was never a doubt inside Jordan-Hare Stadium on Saturday night. No. 9 Auburn jumped in front 7-0 early in the first quarter, and the Tigers never looked back as they bounced back with a convincing 34-3 win over Arkansas.

Running back JaTarvious Whitlow put Auburn on the board on its opening drive with a five-yard touchdown run in which he ran up the middle untouched. The freshman added a second touchdown run later in the game and finished with 49 yards on 13 carries.

The first touchdown run from Whitlow was set up by a 48-yard punt return from Ryan Davis, which was the first of many significant plays from the Auburn special teams Saturday.

Later in the first half, Jordyn Peters deflected a punt - he nearly blocked one earlier in the game - that was returned by linebacker K.J. Britt down inside the Arkansas 10-yard line. That led to an Auburn field goal. Then sophomore Noah Igbinoghene broke the game wide open with a 96-yard kick return for a touchdown early in the third quarter that put the Tigers ahead, 24-3, at the time.

It was Auburn's first kickoff return for a touchdown since Corey Grant ran one back against Tennessee in 2013, and the longest kickoff return since Tre Mason ran one back 100 yards against Washington State that same season.

Like Malzahn alluded to above, it was another impressive performance from the Auburn defense, who held Arkansas to 290 total yards and kept the Razorbacks out of the end zone. The Tigers wreaked havoc in the backfield throughout the game with seven tackles for loss, two sacks and nine quarterback hurries. Both sacks came from true freshmen - Richard Jibunor and Smoke Monday.

Auburn also forced a pair of turnovers with an interception from Javaris Davis and a fumble forced by Igbinoghene that was nearly picked up and returned for a touchdown by fellow defensive back Daniel Thomas.

Quarterback Jarrett Stidham completed 15 of his 22 passes for 134 yards in the win. His favorite target, Ryan Davis, caught six passes for 40 yards. The senior wide receiver, who returned a punt 36 yards later in the fourth quarter, finished with a game-high 124 all-purpose yards.

It took more than six hours, but No. 10 Auburn beat Southern Miss 24-13 Saturday on Homecoming at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

A 164-minute weather delay late in the first half made for a long day and night for players and fans alike.

Christian Tutt's interception in the fourth quarter led to Anders Carlson's field goal, sealing Auburn's victory.

Jarrett Stidham's 53-yard pass to Darius Slayton set up Stidham's 2-yard touchdown pass to Chandler Cox, giving Auburn a 21-6 lead with 5:39 in the third quarter.

Southern Miss made it a one-possession game with a touchdown pass early in the fourth quarter, but Auburn's defense held firm, tallying 12 tackles for loss.

Stidham completed 19 of 33 passes for 245 yards and two touchdowns.

Kam Martin rushed for 90 yards on 24 carries.

Auburn (4-1) held the Golden Eagles to 45 rushing yards on 21 carries.

Tutt and Jeremiah Dinson made interceptions. Derrick Brown had a sack while Nick Coe and Marlon Davidson each had a half sack. Deshaun Davis led the Tigers with 10 tackles. Darrell Williams had nine tackles. The senior linebackers combined for 4.5 tackles for loss. Southern Miss was 2-for-13 on third down.

Auburn came out firing, with Stidham targeting Seth Williams for a deep pass on the Tigers' first offensive play.

That pass fell incomplete, but on Auburn's third possession, Stidham and Williams connected for a 46-yard touchdown pass to give the Tigers a 7-0 lead, Williams' first Auburn score.

In the second quarter, after a Southern Miss field goal, Auburn drove 73 yards on 13 plays, with Stidham twice completing passes to running backs on third-and-long for first downs.

Anthony Schwartz scored on a 6-yard jet sweep to put Auburn up 14-3 before a weather delay suspended the game for the better part of three hours with 4:27 left in the half.

Auburn's special teams again excelled. Jordyn Peters recovered a fumbled USM punt. Arrryn Siposs then punted 37 yards, pinning the Golden Eagles at their own 3 when Javaris Davis fielded his teammates' punt.

A three-and-out from Auburn's defense gave the Tigers the ball at USM's 47. After a 1-yard run, Stidham and Williams teamed up for their long TD.

Playing in its first true road environment all season, No. 8 Auburn never could find its rhythm Saturday night as the Tigers came up short at Mississippi State, 23-9.

Auburn struck first midway through the first quarter when Anders Carlson drilled a 47-yard field goal. The freshman made three of his four field-goal attempts on the night, and his 24-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter got the Tigers within a touchdown at 16-9.

However, with two minutes remaining, Mississippi State quarterback Nick Fitzgerald all but put the game away with a 21-yard touchdown to make it a two-score game.

The Auburn defense was led by safety Jeremiah Dinson, who had a career night with 15 tackles and also pulled down an interception for the second straight game. He's the first player since Joshua Holsey in 2016 to record interceptions in back-to-back games, and his 15 tackles are the most by an Auburn player since Daren Bates (16) against Ole Miss in 2012.

Marlon Davidson, Darrell Williams and Deshaun Davis all finished with 10 tackles apiece. It was a career high for Davidson, who also blocked a critical field goal midway through the fourth quarter that gave the Tigers a chance to come back and tie the game.

For Davis, it was his seventh career game with double-figure tackles, and he now has 203 career tackles - making him the 15th Auburn player since 2000 to reach 200 career tackles.

On offense, quarterback Jarrett Stidham went 19 of 38 for 214 yards with no interceptions. His favorite target was senior wide Ryan Davis, who caught a game-high eight passes for 91 yards. He's now fourth among Auburn career receiving leaders with 137 career receptions, passing Tyrone Goodson (136 from 1993-97). Fellow receiver Darius Slayton added four catches for 58 yards.

The rushing attack was paced by freshman Ja'Tarvious Whitlow, who ran eight times for 88 yards. He nearly scored a touchdown late in the third quarter, but the refs said he fumbled the ball as he reached it across the goal line after a 41-yard run. It was one of two Auburn fumbles on the night.

Trailing 24-14, Noah Igbinoghene's interception gave Auburn possession at its own 29 with 7:14 remaining. Jarrett Stidham then completed five passes, three to Darius Slayton for 43 yards, to give Auburn first-and-goal at the 1. Chandler Cox scored on the next play to cut A&M's lead to 24-21 with 5:14 to play.

Derrick Brown's sack helped force Texas A&M's punt, which Christian Tutt returned 28 yards to Auburn's 42 with 2:04 to play.

On the next play, Stidham hit Ryan Davis, who zigged and zagged up the middle for 47 yards to the Aggies' 11. From there, Stidham connected with Seth Williams for the game-winning score with 1:41 to play.

Stidham was 18 for 29 for 239 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions. Slayton had eight receptions for 107 yards. Texas A&M drove from its 16 past midfield, but Nick Coe's sack on the final play set off a joyous celebration that started in the stands and continued in Auburn's locker room.

Daniel Thomas forced a fumble and recorded a career-high 12 tackles. Auburn had five sacks and 12 tackles for loss. Trayveon Williams' third touchdown, a 1-yard run to cap the opening drive of the second half, gave the Aggies a 10-point lead at the 10:27 mark of the third quarter. Auburn shut out A&M the rest out of the game.

Auburn trailed 17-14 after a back-and-forth first half. After the Aggies kicked a field goal on their opening drive, Auburn's defense forced a turnover, with Jamel Dean recovering a fumbled option pitch at A&M's 20, with Thomas applying pressure on the pitch man.

Auburn took the lead on the next play, using deception. Stidham threw backwards to Ryan Davis, who fired to an open Sal Cannella for a 20-yard touchdown and a 7-3 lead with 1:37 left in the first quarter.

Texas A&M regained the lead on Williams' 38-yard touchdown run to make it 10-7 early in the second quarter. Stidham hit Slayton for 34 yards on a 9-play, 80-yard touchdown drive. On third-and-2 from the 11, Stidham zipped a pass across the field to a leaping Williams in the end zone for a 14-10 Auburn lead with 4:03 left in the half.

The Aggies took 17-14 lead before the half on a 14-yard screen pass to Williams.

Playing against a Top 5 opponent Saturday night, Auburn jumped out to an early lead and looked to play the part of spoiler, but No. 5 Georgia proved to be too much as the Tigers dropped a 27-10 decision on the road.

Georgia scored first with an early field goal, but Auburn responded on the next drive with an eight-play 75-yard drive that was capped by a touchdown pass from Ja'Tarvious Whitlow to John Samuel Shenker. Whitlow, the team's starting running back, lined up in the Wildcat formation, rolled to his left and found Shenker in the back of the end zone for the score.

For Shenker, it was his third career catch and first career touchdown. On the same drive, Auburn senior Ryan Davis made his 154th career reception and passed Courtney Taylor as the program's all-time leading receptions leader. Davis set a new career-high with 13 receptions in the game and finished with 72 yards receiving. He's now caught a pass in 24 consecutive games, the most by an Auburn player since Ricardo Louis had a 24-game streak from 2013-15.

Davis and quarterback Jarrett Stidham also made history together Saturday as they became the most productive pass tandem in Auburn history with 141 completions, passing Pat Sullivan and Terry Beasley (1969-71).

Like the offense, the Auburn defense also started strong, making a pair of goal-line stands on Georgia's first two drives that forced the Bulldogs to settle for two field goals. It was the ninth time this season the Tigers have held their opponent without a touchdown in the first quarter.

After Georgia's second field early in the second quarter, Auburn answered with another solid scoring drive and extended the lead to 10-6 with a 27-yard field goal from Anders Carlson.

However, the game turned in the final three minutes of the first half when the Bulldogs scored back-to-back touchdowns to take a 20-10 lead into the locker room. And then it was a 77-yard touchdown run from D'Andre Swift early in the fourth quarter that ultimately put the game out of reach.

Davis finished with a team-high 10 tackles, two tackles for loss and a sack. It was the 10th career double-figure tackle game for the senior linebacker, who now ranks ninth on Auburn's all-time tackles list with 245. He passed former linebacker Josh Bynes (240 from 2007-10) on Saturday.

The message all week was to send the 16 seniors out the right way. Auburn did just that Saturday with a 53-0 win over Liberty in what was the last game the seniors will play in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The Auburn defense got things started early when senior linebacker Darrell Williams intercepted a pass and returned it 26 yards for a touchdown to give the Tigers an early 10-0 lead. It was the first career interception for Williams.

Then on the very next drive, it was the special teams turn to make a play. Auburn cornerback Jordyn Peters came rushing in and blocked a punt that went out of the back of the end zone for a safety. It was the third blocked punt of the season for Peters, and it was Auburn's first blocked punt for a safety since the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl against Virginia.

The offense waited until early in the second quarter to score its first touchdown, but after that, four of the next six drive resulted in a touchdown. More importantly, the Tigers didn't turn the ball over.

Running back Kam Martin had over 100 yards rushing by halftime, and quarterback Jarrett Stidham accounted for two first-half touchdowns, including a 22-yard strike to Sal Cannella late in the second quarter that gave the Tigers a 32-0 lead heading into the intermission. Stidham finished 12 of 18 for 178 yards and two touchdowns through the air and also added another score on the ground.

As a team, Auburn ran for 340 yards and accounted 531 total yards on the day. Freshmen Seth Williams and Shaun Shivers both scored touchdowns, and backup quarterback Malik Willis added a rushing touchdown - his first of the season - late in the third quarter.

The defense, who set the tone early with the interception return for a touchdown, never let up. The standard for this unit every week is to pitch a shutout, and for the first time this season, the Tigers delivered as they kept Liberty off the scoreboard and allowed only 134 total yards of offense.

The interception by Darrell Williams was also one of four turnovers forced by Auburn in the game. Big Kat Bryant and T.D. Moultry both had sacks that caused fumbles, which were recovered by the Tigers. And freshman Smoke Monday brought in his first career interception late in the third quarter.

Between the defensive touchdown, the safety on special teams and the five touchdowns scored by the offense, it was the second game this season that Auburn scored on all three phases.

On the road against a top-ranked opponent, Auburn matched No.1 Alabama blow-for-blow in the first half in a 52-21 Iron Bowl loss.

Alabama quarterback Tua Tagovailoa threw four touchdown passes in the second half to break open a 3-point game.

Trailing 31-14, Jarrett Stidham hit Darius Slayton on a 52-yard touchdown pass to pull the Tigers within 10 at 31-21 with 3:31 remaining in the third quarter.

Alabama answered with touchdown passes late in the third quarter and early in the fourth to secure the victory.

Auburn trailed 17-14 after an inspired first half.

Shaun Shivers raced 75 yards for a touchdown on Auburn's first series, but a holding penalty nullified the score.

After Alabama took a 7-0 lead on a 7-yard quarterback run, Auburn answered with a 10-play, 73-yard touchdown drive. Five consecutive Ja'Tarvious Whitlow rushes netted 25 yards, crossing midfield.

Auburn then gained 12 yards on Stidham's pass to Ryan Davis. On third-and-13, Stidham hit Whitlow for 25 yards to the Alabama 14.

After a 5-yard Alabama penalty, Anthony Schwartz raced around right end for a 9-yard game-tying TD with 2:37 remaining in the first quarter.

Alabama took a 17-7 lead in the second quarter on a 4-yard pass from Tagovailoa to Henry Ruggs III, and a 30-yard field goal.

Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, then Smoke Monday blocked a punt, Auburn's fourth of the season, giving the Tigers possession on Alabama's 23.

One play later, Ryan Davis threw his second touchdown pass of the season, hitting Malik Miller for 23 yards, trimming Alabama's lead to 17-14 with 4:04 left in the half.

Auburn's defense ended the first half with back-to-back three-and-outs, holding Alabama to its season lows in first-half passing yards and total offense.

Tagovailoa was 25 of 32 for 324 yards and five touchdowns, adding a rushing TD.

Whitlow was the game's leading rushing, gaining 61 yards on 19 carries.

Auburn won the coin toss, elected to receive and never looked back in a 63-14 win over Purdue in the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl on Friday.

The 63 points is a new SEC record for points scored in a bowl game, and the Tigers set a bowl record with 56 of those 63 points in the first half. With Malzahn calling the plays for the first time all season, the offense scored touchdowns on all seven of its first-half drives and finished with 586 total yards.

Stidham, who already declared early for the NFL, completed 15 of 21 passes for 373 yards and a career-best five touchdown passes – which tied the Auburn single-game record. His first touchdown toss came on the third play of the game when he connected with running back JaTarvious Whitlow on a 66-yard touchdown pass to put Auburn on the board first.

It was Whitlow who scored again on the next drive, plunging in from two yards out. And then after a Javaris Davis interception, the freshman running back tacked on a third touchdown, a 1-yard run, in the first six minutes to give Auburn the early 21-0 lead.

After Whitlow scored his three touchdowns, it was Darius Slayton's turn to get into the act. The junior wide receiver caught a 74-yard touchdown pass at the end of the first quarter and then scored on a 52-yard pass the very next drive to make it 35-7. He later added a third touchdown reception in the first half, hauling in a 34-yard reception over the top of a Purdue defender.

With 160 yards receiving on the day, Slayton now ranks 11th among Auburn career receiving yardage leaders with 1,605 career receiving yards. This was the third 100-yard receiving game of his career.

Fellow wide receiver Anthony Schwartz added a 6-yard touchdown run in the first half. It was the freshman's fifth rushing touchdown of the season and seventh overall.

The other first-half touchdown came courtesy of the defense when Big Kat Bryant returned an interception 20 yards to the end zone on a ball that was deflected at the line of scrimmage by Tyrone Truesdell. It was Bryant's first career interception and first career touchdown.

Not to be outdone by the offense, the Auburn defense held a high-octane Purdue offense to 14 points and 263 total yards. The Tigers finished with seven tackles for loss and three sacks, including a sack from senior linebacker Deshaun Davis, who led the way with nine tackles. With 266 career tackles, Davis now ranks fourth among Auburn career tacklers since 2000. He finished the season with a career-best 116 stops.

Auburn scored another touchdown on its opening drive of the second half as the Tigers went 78 yards on 12 plays and found the end zone on a 5-yard pass to Ryan Davis. It was the first touchdown catch of the season for the senior wide receiver, who is the program's all-time leader in receptions.

With the win, Auburn is now 24-17-2 in bowl games and 2-0 in the Music City Bowl.
