LSU WINS NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP SEC WINS NCAA-BEST 5 BOWL GAMES

TIGERS WIN NATIONAL TITLE

LSU defeated Oklahoma, 21-14, in the Nokia Sugar Bowl to win its second national championship and the SEC's 15th national crown.

The Nokia Sugar Bowl served as the Bowl Championship Series National Championship Game.

The Tigers last won a national championship in 1958. It is the SEC's first national championship since Tennessee took the honors in 1998.

Since the expansion of the SEC and the start of the SEC Football Championship Game in 1992, the league has had four different national champions - Alabama in 1992, Florida in 1996, Tennessee in 1998 and LSU in 2003.

The SEC and the Big 12 have won more national championships than any other conference since 1992. The SEC has won 3.5 national crowns with four different teams. The Big 12 has 3.5 national titles among two teams while the ACC has two among one team, and the Big Ten has 1.5 among two teams.

SEC HAS NCAA-HIGH FIVE BOWL VICTORIES

The SEC and the Atlantic Coast Conference each won five bowl games during the 2003-04 college football post-season bowl season, earning the most wins among NCAA Division I-A conferences.

The SEC was 5-2 in its seven games while the ACC won five of its six bowl games.

The SEC was 3-0 vs. the Big 12, 2-1 vs. the Big Ten and 0-1 vs. the ACC in post-season bowls this season.

SEC HAS NCAA-HIGH FIVE TEAMS RANKED IN FINAL POLLS

LSU's number one national ranking in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll leads a roster of five SEC teams ranked in the final 2003 college football rankings.

The Tigers are also ranked number two in the final Associated Press poll.

The SEC and the Big Ten each had five teams listed in the final rankings. The Big 12 had four teams while the ACC had three and the Pac-10 and the Mid-American had two teams each.

Georgia is ranked sixth in the coaches poll and seventh in the AP poll, while Ole Miss is 14th in the coaches poll and 13th in the AP poll.

Tennessee comes in at 16th in the coaches poll and 15th in the AP poll and Florida rounds out the SEC teams, ranked 25th in the coaches poll and 24th in the AP poll.

Since conference expansion in 2002, the SEC has had 59 teams ranked in the final USA Today/ESPN Coaches and AP polls, an average of almost five teams per season.

SEC BOWL REVENUE DISTRIBUTION

- (A) For bowl games providing receipts which result in a balance of less than \$1,500,000, the participating institution shall retain \$800,000 plus a travel allowance as determined by the SEC Executive Committee. The remainder shall be remitted to the Commissioner and will be divided into 13 equal shares with one share to the Conference and one share to each member institution.
- (B) For bowl games providing receipts which result in a balance between \$1,500,000 and \$3,999,999, the participating institution shall retain \$1,000,000 plus a travel allowance as determined by the SEC Executive Committee. The remainder shall be remitted to the Commissioner and will be divided into 13 equal shares, with one share to the Conference and one share to each member institution.
- (C) For bowl games providing receipts which result in a balance between \$4,000,000 and \$5,999,999, the participating institution shall retain \$1,200,000 plus a travel allowance as determined by the SEC Executive Committee. The remainder shall be remitted to the Commissioner and will be divided into 13 equal shares, with one share to the Conference and one share to each member institution.
- (D) For bowl games providing receipts which result in a balance between \$6,000,000 or more, the participating institution shall receive \$1,700,000 (\$1,800,000 if the SEC team is a participant in the Bowl Championship Series game which determines the National Championship) plus a travel allowance as determined by the SEC Executive Committee. The remainder shall be remitted to the Commissioner and will be divided into 13 equal shares, with one share to the Conference and one share to each member institution.
- (E) Bowl Revenue Protection Insurance and the cost of unused tickets up to 3,000 tickets, shall be deducted prior to the Conference distribution.

SEC HAS THREE NATIONAL SCHOLAR-ATHLETES FOR SECOND STRAIGHT YEAR

For the second straight year, the Southeastern Conference has had three of its football student-athletes named to the National Scholar-Athlete Class of the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. This year, the organization's list includes only eight student-athletes from NCAA Division I-A.

From the SEC, the list includes Ole Miss senior quarterback Eli Manning (Marketing), LSU senior offensive tackle Rodney Reed (Accounting) and Auburn senior linebacker Dontarrious Thomas (Management).

Last year, the SEC had three of six NFF Scholar-Athletes - Vanderbilt linebacker Hunter Hillenmeyer, LSU linebacker Bradie James and Georgia offensive tackle Jon Stinchcomb.

To be eligible for a NFF/CHOF postgraduate fellowship, the nominee must be a senior or graduate student in his final year of eligibility, have a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, have shown academic application and performance, have outstanding football ability as a first-team player, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.

SEC ENACTS SPORTSMANSHIP PROPOSALS

The institutions of the Southeastern Conference, prior to the 2003 football season, enacted proposals this season that will promote and demonstrate the positive aspects of sportsmanship at future SEC sporting events.

The SEC adopted a general sportsmanship statement that will serve as the principle for its institutions to follow. It states, "Coaches and student-athletes of a member institution, as well as individuals employed by or associated with that institution, including alumni, fans, patrons and boosters, shall conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their behavior shall at all times reflect the high standards of honor and dignity that characterize participation in the collegiate setting. For intercollegiate athletics to promote the character development of participants, to enhance the integrity of higher education and to promote civility in society, coaches, student-athletes and all others associated with these athletics programs and events should adhere to such fundamental values as respect, fairness, civility, honesty and responsibility. These values should be manifest not only in athletics participation but also in the broad spectrum of activities affecting the athletics program.

"It is the responsibility of each member institution to establish policies for sportsmanship and ethical conduct in intercollegiate athletics consistent with the educational mission and goals of the institution. Furthermore, member institutions are responsible for educating on a continuing basis all constituencies about these policies."

Each institution will participate in the promotion of proper sportsmanship at its home games, by featuring public address announcements, video spots and game program advertisements. The SEC and its institutions also will place radio, television and print advertisements in its media inventories.

Also, the league has developed a formal policy on items being thrown onto the playing field/court. Each school in the SEC has adopted the "zero-tolerance" policy for such behavior, which will result in the violators being ejected from the stadium.

In the sport of football, visiting teams will not be allowed to come back out onto the stadium turf to celebrate a victory, and the visiting team's band will be allowed to play no more than two songs following the conclusion of the game.

Also, in football, cheerleaders and mascots will be restricted to designated sideline areas between the bench boundary and the end line, as well as behind the respective end zone to the goal post, and behind the photographer zone. At no time, may cheerleaders or mascots enter the playing field (defined as any area beyond the 6-foot limit lines surrounded the playing field) while the game is in progress. Home team cheerleaders and mascots shall not enter any visiting team area. Any type of physical contact between team mascots and cheerleaders is strictly prohibited.

The SEC has had a history of addressing the issues of sportsmanship and fan behavior in recent years. Prior to these proposals being passed, the league has adopted policies pertaining to the placement of student sections and bands as related to visiting bench areas, prohibition of artificial noisemakers, elimination of "pass outs" during games, restrictions on "huddles" or "dances" on the field or court, pregame warmup "buffer zone" in football and pregame sportsmanship announcements on video boards and public address systems.

SEC vs. SEC games have traditionally been among the most competitive in the nation. After 15 weeks of this season, 49 SEC vs. SEC games have an average scoring margin of 16.33 points per contest. 38.8 percent of the SEC's games (19-of-49) have been decided by ten-points-or-less. 2003 SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE TEAM-BY-TEAM NOTES

**ALABAMA CRIMSON TIDE** (4-9, 2-6 SEC)

Alabama ends the year with nine losses, the second-most in school history. Only the 1955 (0-10) team lost more games ... Shaud Williams' 278 rushing attempts this season rank third on the Alabama single-season list, while the 1,356 rushing yards are also the third-most in school history. Williams missed the single-season rushing record by 105 yards. The single-season record is held by Bobby Humphrey, who ran for 1,471 yards as a junior in 1986 ... SS Chris James is the only player in Alabama history to block four punts in a single-season (vs. Oklahoma, Southern Miss, Ole Miss and Hawai'i).

LSU TIGERS (13-1, 7-1 SEC)

LSU won its second national championship and its first since 1958 with a 21-14 win over Oklahoma in the Nokia Sugar Bowl ... Earlier in the year, the Tigers won its second SEC title in the last three years and its ninth in school history with a 34-13 win over Georgia in the SEC Championship Game ... 13 wins in a single season is a school record ... Freshman RB Justin Vincent was the MVP of the Sugar Bowl with 117 yards and a TD and also MVP of the SEC Championship Game with 201 yards and 2 TDs ... QB Matt Mauck is now 18-2 all-time as LSU's starting signal-caller.

ARKANSAS RAZORBACKS (9-4, 4-4 SEC)

Arkansas reached nine wins for the second-straight season following 2002's 9-5 record ... It marks the first time the Hogs have had back-to-back seasons of at least nine wins since accomplishing the feat five straight years from 1985-89 ... TB Cedric Cobbs was the Offensive MVP of the MainStay Independence Bowl with 141 yards and a TD ... Senior LB Caleb Miller earned Defensive MVP honors after registering 16 stops, with 10 solo tackles ... Jr. CB Ahmad Carroll has announced plans to enter the 2004 NFL Draft joining teammate OT Shawn Andrews on the list.

OLE MISS REBELS (10-3, 7-1 SEC)

Ole Miss finishes at 10-3 to record its first 10-win season since going 10-2 in 1971 under Billy Kinard ... The Rebels are 12-3 since ending a five-game losing streak with a 24-12 win over Mississippi State in the 2002 regular-season finale ... QB Eli Manning was named the Offensive MVP of the SBC Cotton Bowl while DE Josh Cooper was the Defensive MVP ... Ole Miss broke single-season school record for first downs (295), total points scored (442) and total offensive yards per game (433.2) ... The Rebel defense has 29 consecutive games with at least one sack ... Ole Miss has at least one sack in 46 of their last 47 games.

**AUBURN TIGERS** (8-5, 5-3 SEC)

The Tigers became the first SEC team to win the Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl since the bowl's inception in 1998 ... The Tigers had a fourth down conversion in 12 of 13 games this year (except Tennessee) ... RB Carnell Williams scored his 17th touchdown of the year, moving him into a tie for first place, with Bo Jackson (1985), in school history for single-season rushing TDs ... Williams moved into fifth in school history for single season rushing yards (1,307) ... He also moved into fourth for single season all-purpose yards with 1,647 all-purpose yards this season.

MISSISSIPPI STATE BULLDOGS (2-10, 1-7 SEC)

State's 10 losses this season marks the first time the Bulldogs have had 10 setbacks in one season since 1988, when MSU went 1-10 ... TB Nick Turner concluded the 2003 season with a single-season school record of 1,664 all-purpose yards ... QB Kevin Fant concluded 2003 with a single-season school record of 186 pass completions ... He concluded his Bulldog career second all-time at State in passing yardage (5,631), second in completions (461), second in attempts (866), third in TD passes (33) and fourth in total offense (5,424) ... WR Justin Jenkins had a single-season school record nine TD receptions in 2003.

FLORIDA GATORS (8-5, 6-2 SEC)

UF posted three wins against top 11 opponents this season and played the third toughest schedule in the nation ... Ron Zook became the first coach at UF to lead the Gators to three consecutive wins over ranked teams in the three consecutive weeks ... UF faced a school-record tying six ranked opponents during the regular season and ties the school record of seven ranked opponents, all seven teams ranking in the top 15 ... Florida is the only school in the BCS ranking to own wins over two teams in the top 12 of the BCS poll ... Florida also has faced more teams in the top nine (four) and the top 12 (five) than any other team in the nation.

SOUTH CAROLINA GAMECOCKS (5-7, 2-6 SEC)

Tight end Brian Brownlee caught his first two career touchdown passes against Clemson ... The attendance of 83,987 in the CU-USC game was the fifth largest ever at Williams-Brice Stadium ... Total attendance for eight home games this season was 646,754, an average of 80,844 ... Six of eight South Carolina games this season drew more than 80,000 ... The 63 points by Clemson were the most ever by the Tigers against South Carolina ... Deandre Eiland had his second interception of the season and the ninth of his career against the Tigers ... Freshman RB Demetris Summers had 61 yards rushing on 12 carries.

**GEORGIA BULLDOGS** (11-3, 6-2 SEC)

Georgia earned a share of the SEC Eastern Division title with Tennessee and Florida ... Senior PK Billy Bennett set an SEC and NCAA record for field goals made in a season with 31 this season and in a career (87) ... Bennett's 409 career points is an SEC record and second in NCAA history ... Junior ROV Sean Jones has three blocked kicks this season, which ties a school record ... QB David Greene was named the MVP of the Capital One Bowl, completing 27-of-37 for 327 yards with 3 TDs and no INTs ... This season, Alabama and Kentucky were the only teams to score on their first possession against the Bulldogs.

TENNESSEE VOLUNTEERS (10-3, 6-2 SEC)

Tennessee earned a share of the SEC Eastern Division title ... The Vols were tied with Georgia and Florida ... Tennessee ends the 2003 season with an 10-3 mark ... Tennessee has won at least 8 games for 15 consecutive seasons, only Michigan (19) and Florida State (17) have a longer current streak ... UT reached 10-win mark for 18th time in school history, including seven times since 1993 this season ... The Vols have been to 15 straight post-season bowl games, the 4th longest current streak in college football ... QB Casey Clausen set UT bowl records for completions (31) and attempts (55) in the Peach Bowl.

KENTUCKY WILDCATS (4-8, 1-7 SEC)

With 43 punt return yards vs. Tennessee, Derek Abney became the first NCAA Division I-A player to reach 2,000 receiving yards, 2,000 kickoff return yards, and 1,000 punt return yards in a career. He finished his career with 5,856 career all-purpose yards (2,339 receiving yards, 2,315 kickoff return yards and 1,042 punt return yards), second-highest total in SEC history ... QB Jared Lorenzen finished his career with 10,354 passing yards, the fourth-highest total in SEC history. He also closed out with 10,637 yards of career total offense, third all-time in the SEC.

**VANDERBILT COMMODORES** (2-10, 1-7 SEC)

Soph. Kwane Doster finished the regular season with 1,039 all-purpose yards, which is currently fifth in the SEC ... Doster has rushed for 386 yards and has 571 kickoff return yards as well as 82 on receptions ... QB Jay Cutler finishes his sophomore campaign, completing 187-of-327 passes for 2,347 yards with 18 TDs and 13 INTs ... Another soph., WR Erik Davis, had 41 receptions for 638 yards and 8 TDs ... His 3.42 catch per game average is ninth in the SEC ... In two seasons, Cutler has 4,472 total offensive yards (692 rushing; 3,780 passing), an average of 186.3 yards per game.

STREAKS AND SUCH

The SEC has won three straight Sugar Bowls with LSU winning two of the last three. The Tigers defeated Illinois, 47-34, in the 2002 game and Georgia knocked off Florida State, 26-13, in the 2003 game.

The SEC has won three straight Capital One Bowls with Tennessee defeating Michigan, 45-17, in the 2002 game while Auburn beat Penn State, 13-7, in the 2003 game. Georgia won its first Capital One Bowl since 1993.

The SEC won the Cotton Bowl for the first time since the 2000 game when Arkansas defeated Texas, 27-6. Ole Miss won its first Cotton Bowl since 1956.

The SEC has lost two straight Outback Bowls with the Gators falling both times.

The SEC has won eight straight Independence Bowls with Arkansas claiming its first win in the Shreveport game.

The SEC has lost three straight Peach Bowls with Tennessee falling both times.

The SEC won its first Music City bowl since the game's inception in 1998.

SEC LEADS ALL CONFERENCES IN POST-SEASON BOWL PARTICIPATION

During the last seven seasons, the Southeastern Conference has sent 53 teams to post-season bowl games, the most of any conference in the nation. Since 1997, the SEC is 30-23 in bowl games. Eleven of the SEC's 12 teams have been to post-season bowls in the last seven seasons.

As of Jan. 8, the SEC will return seven of its top 10 rushers, seven of its top 10 quarterbacks, five of its top 10 receivers and six of its top 10 tacklers.

Auburn's Carnell Williams is the SEC's leading returning rusher, gaining 1,307 yards on 241 carries and 17 TDs in 2003. LSU's Justin Vincent, Tennessee's Cedric Houston, Miss. State's Nick Turner, South Carolina's Demetris Summers and Daccus Turman and Arkansas' Matt Jones also currently have plans to return in 2004.

LSU's Matt Mauck is the SEC's leading returning quarterback with a pass efficiency rating of 148.2. Mauck completed 229 of 358 passes for 2,825 yards with 28 TDs and 14 INTs. Arkansas' Matt Jones, Florida's Chris Leak, Auburn's Jason Campbell, Georgia's David Greene, Vanderbilt's Jay Cutler and Alabama's Brodie Croyle also currently have plans to return in 2004.

LSU's Michael Clayton is the SEC's leading returning receiver with 78 catches for 1,079 yards and 10 TDs in 2003. Georgia's Reggie Brown and Fred Gibson along with LSU's Skyler Green and Erik Davis of Vanderbilt also currently have plans to return in 2004.

Kentucky ILB Chad Anderson led the SEC tackles per game in 2003 and is the SEC's leading returning tackler in 2004. Anderson recorded 125 stops, 73 of them solos, in 11 games last season. Vanderbilt LB Moses Osemwegie, Kentucky ILB Dustin Williams, Georgia DB Thomas Davis, Alabama LB DeMeco Ryans and Florida LB Channing Crowder also currently have plans to return in 2004.
