OPENING DRIVE

• SJSU won their fourth season opener in a row with a 21-17 win over Portland State on Sept. 1. The Spartans have won four straight to start a season for the first time since 1976 and are now 44-54-17 in season-opening games.

• The win over Portland State was the 500th win in program history.

• The attendance on Sept. 1 was 16,291, the highest for a home opening game since September 17, 2011.

• The three turnovers created by the Spartans defense against PSU were the most since having three against SDSU (10/6/20) and the two interceptions by the Spartans defense were the most since having two picks against Nevada last season (11/6/21).

• This is the third meeting between the schools with all three meetings being at Auburn and first meeting since 2015.

• The Spartans last played an SEC team in 2019 when they beat Arkansas, 31-24, on the road and **Brent Brennan** is 1-0 against SEC schools as a head coach.

• This is the first time in SJSU history the same head coach, offensive coordinator and defensive coordinator are on the staff for the fifth season in a row.

• Head coach **Brent Brennan** enters his sixth season at the helm of the Spartans. He joins **Claude Gilbert** for fourth on the SJSU all-time coaching list. Gilbert coached from 1984-89.

• The Spartans took advantage of the transfer portal this offseason by bringing in 13 with four of them from power five schools. SJSU now has seven players on the roster who came from power five schools.

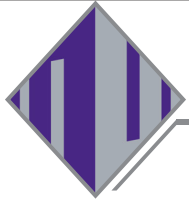

IN MEMORIAM **LAWRENCE FAN**

Lawrence Tang Fan (1954-2022) was born in San Francisco, California, on September 9, 1954. He was a proud 1972 graduate of Lowell High School and received his degree in economics from the University of California Berkeley in 1976. After heading to the Midwest to earn his master's degree at Western Illinois in 1978, he worked at LaSalle University in the sports information department. Lawrence returned to the Bay Area when he accepted the Sports Information Director position at San Jose State in 1980.

Sports were a constant in Lawrence's life. A lifelong San Francisco Giants and San Francisco 49ers fan (how appropriate), he talked fondly of taking the buses to see games at Kezar Stadium with his brother, Stephen. His father was a 49ers season ticket holder until his death, even picking out his seats at Levi's Stadium. Lawrence and his brother continued this tradition as they remained ticket holders.

Serving in the SJSU Athletics Department for 42 years, Lawrence was a champion in representing San Jose State to local, state and national media. He put the Spartan student-athletes before himself and served the Bay Area media in many capacities including arranging interviews for all Spartan athletes and serving as the spokesman for the department.

One of his greatest achievements that he was proud to publicize happened on November 11, 2021, when he worked his 500th consecutive San Jose State football game.

Lawrence has been a great mentor to those who worked in the sports information/media relations/strategic communications industry. He never forgot a face or a fact and treated everyone the same, whether you were the star guard on the basketball team, a walk-on on the women's water polo team, a national media member or a student reporter in your first semester.

His legacy will live on in everyone.

- Junior quarterback **Chevan Cordeiro** played his first game as a Spartan and scored three touchdowns including a 32 yard touchdown run. Cordeiro threw for 239 yards and one touchdown while scoring two on the ground which includes the game-winner against PSU with 1:11 left in the fourth quarter.

- SJSU returns one of the best defenses in college football from a season ago. Nine starters return with six of them earning All-Mountain West recognition last year. The Spartans let up the fourth fewest yards in the Mountain West at 4,455 yards.

- The Spartans brought in their best recruiting class of all-time in 2022 according to 247sports.com. It ranked third in the Mountain West Conference according to average and included 16 3-star recruits.

- Graduate linebacker **Kyle Harmon** was one of the best tacklers in college football last season. Harmon ended the campaign with 133 tackles which was good for third in the nation. The Antioch, Calif. native was named Preseason All-Mountain West this season and was First Team All-Mountain West in 2021 and 2020. Harmon's 11 tackles in the opener against PSU was good for second in the Mountain West.

- Graduate cornerback **Nehemiah Shelton** finished last season third in the country averaging 1.4 pass deflections a game. Shelton went five consecutive games breaking up a pass last season. The Gardena, Calif. native had nine tackles in three games a season ago and had one game with 10 tackles against New Mexico State (10/2/21).

MEDIA INFORMATION

Credential Requests

Credentials are issued for news and editorial coverage on a case-by-case basis to those filing game stories, accredited members from established media outlets, and personnel assigned by the sports information office. Requests should be directed to Sky Kerstein, sky.kerstein@sjsu.edu. The credential recipient agrees to all conditions set forth by the University relating to conduct and print, video, audio, digital and photographic game coverage.

Football Press Box

The CEFCU Stadium press box is located on the 7th Street side of the stadium and is an open-air facility. Carry a jacket with you. The press box remains open three hours after each contest.

Football Game Day Parking

Media parking passes for home football games are issued by the athletics media relations office.

Football Telephone Lines & Wireless Internet

Nine telephone lines and wireless internet are available for the working media in the press box area.

Photographers

Credentials are issued to newspapers, wire services, video crews and team photographers. NCAA rules limit photographers to a wide area behind the restraining line around the playing field and outside the 25-yard lines.

Production Truck & Satellite Uplink Parking

Production truck and satellite uplink parking is on the 7th Street side of the stadium. Arrangements must be made to park a truck overnight inside CEFCU Stadium.

Radio Broadcasts

The radio broadcast booth for the designated official flagship station of the visiting team at CEFCU Stadium is Box A on the mezzanine level of the press box and has space for five working individuals. ISDN and regular telephone service are provided.

Scouts

Space limitations prohibit seating and standing in the press box for scouting purposes.

Statistics & Services

Game statistics, play-by-play accounts and post-game quotes are compiled and distributed. FAX service is available. A meal is available two hours before kickoff.

Team Practices

During the football season, the Spartans practice in the morning. In-person, post-practice interview opportunities with the student-athletes, generally, occur at approximately 12:00 p.m. on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. Please contact the media relations office in advance with an interview request. Brent Brennan will have his weekly media availability at 1 p.m. every Tuesday in the Gold Room in Simpkins Stadium Center.

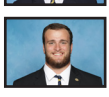

Brent Brennan, a San Jose native and second-generation Spartan, enters his sixth season as the San Jose State University football head coach in 2022.

The Spartans come off a 5-7 injury plagued season in 2021 in which backup quarterback Nick Nash was moved to wide receiver for a few games due to lack of healthy bodies. Two Spartans signed NFL contracts in the offseason in Jack Snyder (LAR) and Derrick Deese, Jr. (DET).

In 2020, Brennan led the Spartans to a 7-1 record with their first Mountain West Conference championship and first league title of any kind since sharing the 1991 Big West Conference championship and first outright crown since winning the Big West in 1990. The Spartans were back in the post-season bowl picture for the first time since 2015 and ranked in the final Associated Press poll since 2012 (24).

The Spartans ended the 2020 season at the Offerpad Arizona Bowl while playing the fifth toughest schedule of the season according to the NCAA.

San Jose State's .875 winning percentage from its 7-1 record was the third best in school history and best by a Spartan team since 1940. The Spartans were one of the last four undefeated teams in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) in 2020. Brennan became the first San Jose State football coach to receive votes in the Associated Press' coach of the year balloting with three first place votes and a fifth-place finish. He was a semifinalist for the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award and the George Munger Coach of the Year Award conveyed by the Maxwell Football Club of Philadelphia.
