THE GAME

Auburn goes on the road for the first time during the 2006 season when the Tigers visit Mississippi State. It will be the first Southeastern Conference game of the year for Auburn, which opened the season with a 40-14 home victory last Saturday against Washington State. Mississippi State will be playing its second league game, having opened its season with 15-0 home loss Aug. 31 vs. South Carolina.

AUBURN HEADLINES

- ▶ Auburn is 40-27-5 in Southeastern Conference openers, winning 13 straight SEC openers dating back to 1993.
- ▶ Auburn has won 16 of its last 17 SEC games, and 17 of its last 18 against SEC opponents counting the 2004 SEC Championship game.
- ▶ Since the start of the 2000 season, Auburn has the best record among all SEC teams in regular-season league games with a mark of 36-12.
- ▶ Auburn has won five straight games against Mississippi State and 18 of the last 24 games in the series.
- ▶ Brandon Cox has completed 73.9 percent (17-of-23) of his passes in two previous appearances against Mississippi State.
- ▶ Auburn has posted a 23-3 record since the start of the 2004 season, which is the third-best record in NCAA Division I-A during that span.
- ▶ Auburn is 5-0 all-time in games played on Sept. 9.
- ▶ Auburn is 134-44-5 (.746) all-time in the month of September, including a 24-5 mark under Tommy Tuberville.
- ▶ Kenny Irons has rushed for at least 100 yards in seven straight regular season games after posting 183 yards in the opener vs. Washington State. Irons is averaging 131.2 yards rushing over his last 11 games.
- ▶ John Vaughn booted four field goals including a career-best 52-yarder vs. Washington State, and now ranks fifth in Auburn history with 234 career points.
- ▶ Auburn has scored 40 or more points seven times under offensive coordinator Al Borges, who is in his third season with the Tigers, and have scored 30 or more 19 times during his tenure.
- ▶ Under Tommy Tuberville, Auburn is 38-0 when scoring 30 or more points in a game. Auburn has won 43 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points in a game.

AUBURN IN SEC OPENERS

Auburn is 40-27-5 in SEC openers, winning 13 straight openers dating back to 1993.

In its last eight SEC openers, Auburn has outscored its opponents, 286-91. Last season, Auburn blanked Mississippi State, 28-0, after thumping the Bulldogs, 43-14, in 2004. The Tigers defeated Ole Miss, 19-9, in 1997; 17-0, in 1998; 35-27, in 2000; and 27-21 in 2001. In 1999, Auburn defeated LSU, 41-7, and beat Vanderbilt 31-6 and 45-7 in 2002 and 2003.

TUBERVILLE IN SEC OPENERS

Tommy Tuberville is 7-4 in SEC conference openers, including a 7-0 mark at Auburn. Four of his seven conference openers at Auburn have come on the road: 1999 at LSU (41-7), 2000 at Ole Miss (35-27), 2003 at Vanderbilt (45-7) and 2004 at Mississippi State (43-14).

AUBURN-MSU NOTES

Auburn leads the all-time series with Mississippi State, 55-22-2 ... Saturday's meeting between the two schools will mark the 52nd consecutive year the two schools have played each other ... Auburn has won five straight in the series and 18 of the last 24 ... Auburn won on its last two trips to Starkville by nearly identical scores (43-14 in 2002, 42-14 in 2004) ... Mississippi State has been held to 18 or fewer points in each of the last seven games in the series, averaging 12.9 points per game during that span ... Just 10 games in the last 36 years have been decided by seven points or less, including three consecutive from 1999-2001 ... The Auburn defense has held Mississippi State to an average of 91.6 rushing yards in the last seven meetings.

MISSISSIPPI STATE QUICK HITTEES

Mississippi State dropped its season opener at home to South Carolina, 15-0 ... The Bulldogs are hoping to avoid their first 0-2 start since 2003 and just their second since 1993 ... Sophomore quarterback Michael Henig, a native of Montgomery, Ala., suffered a broken collarbone in the second quarter of the game vs. South Carolina ... MSU has held six of its last 12 opponents to 17 points or less ... In his first college game, true freshman Anthony Dixon led MSU with 64 yards rushing vs. the Gamecocks.

MISSISSIPPI TIGERS

Auburn's roster includes five players who hail from the state of Mississippi. Sophomore LB Steve Gandy and sophomore FB Mike McLaughlin are both from Waynesboro, senior OG Tim Duckworth is from Taylorsville, junior DE Quentin Groves hails from Greenville and freshman LB Hendrick Leverette is from Hattiesburg.

AUBURN-MISSISSIPPI STATE COACHING TIES

- ▶ Mississippi State defensive line coach Brick Haley coached at Clemson in 1998 while Auburn tight ends coach Steve Ensminger was the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach.
- ▶ Mississippi State defensive backs coach Melvin Smith was on the Ole Miss staff in 1994 when Auburn running backs coach Eddie Gran began his stint with the Rebels.

COX SHINES VS. BULLDOGS

Junior quarterback Brandon Cox has been on target in two previous appearances vs. Mississippi State. Cox is 17-of-23 (73.9 percent) for 245 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions during his career against MSU. He was 12-of-18 for 202 yards and two TDs in last year's game vs. the Bulldogs, and connected on all five of his passes for 43 yards and a score during his freshman season in 2004.

ON THIS DATE

Auburn is 5-0 all-time on games played on Sept. 9, including a 14-3 victory over Mississippi State in 1972 in Jackson. Auburn blanked Pacific (55-0) in 1989, crushed UT-Chattanooga (76-10) in 1995, won at Ole Miss (35-27) in 2000 and beat Western Carolina (56-0) in 2002.

The 76 points scored by Auburn on Sept. 9, 1995, are the eighth-most points scored in a game in school history. The Tigers have outscored their opponents 236-40 in the five games played on this date, averaging 47.2 points per game.

IN SEPTEMBER

Auburn is 134-44-5 (.746) all-time in the month of September, including a 24-5 mark under Tommy Tuberville. The Tigers have won 10 of their last 11 games played in September, and have won four straight dating back to a 23-14 loss to Georgia Tech in the 2005 season opener.

THREE-YEAR DOMINATION

Auburn has posted a record of 23-3 (.885) since the start of the 2004 season, giving the Tigers the third-best record in the NCAA over the past three seasons. Only USC (26-1, .963) and Texas (25-1, .962) have better winning percentages than Auburn during that span.

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES

There were several noticeable differences in the stat sheets when comparing Auburn's 40-14 victory over Washington State to last season's season-opening 23-14 loss to Georgia Tech. For starters, Auburn rushed for 293 yards Saturday against the Cougars after posting just 50 yards rushing in last season's opener. The Tigers, who

averaged just 2.2 yards per carry vs. Tech, averaged 6.7 yards per rush vs. Washington State.

Turnovers were a big key last season vs. Georgia Tech, as Auburn committed five miscues, including four interceptions. Saturday, Auburn did not commit a turnover.

Auburn also reversed a big time of possession deficit, keeping the ball for 34:02 Saturday vs. Washington State, after collecting just 25:38 time of possession last year vs. Georgia Tech.

IRONS OFF TO A FAST START

Senior Kenny Irons is off to a much faster start this season that he had last year when he led the SEC in rushing with 1,293 yards. In fact, Irons had more yards rushing on Auburn's first offensive play from scrimmage this season (a 42-yard burst), then he had in the first two games combined last season, when he had just 34 yards rushing through two contests.

Irons' 183-yard performance in the opener vs. Washington State was the second-best total of his career, trailing only a 218-yard effort last season at LSU, and his highest ever total at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

MORE FAST START NEWS

Kenny Irons started both the first and second halves of Saturday's game vs. Washington State with a bang. On Auburn's opening possession, he ran 42 yards on the first play. On the Tigers' first drive of the second half, he raced 58 yards for a touchdown on the first play. Irons totaled 100 yards rushing on the first offensive plays of the two halves.

SEC RUSHING LEADER RETURNS

The SEC's leading rusher in rushing last season with 1,293 yards (107.8 ypg) and 13 touchdowns, senior Kenny Irons is bidding to become the first player to lead the SEC in rushing in consecutive years since LSU's Kevin Faulk in 1997-98. Irons would become just the second back to accomplish the feat in the last 20 years.

In the last 30 years, Auburn has had three players prior to Irons who returned after leading the SEC in rushing. Although none repeated as SEC rushing champ, all three posted 1,000-yard seasons the following year.

Joe Cribbs had an SEC-best 1,205 yards rushing in 1978, then ran for 1,120 yards and 14 TDs as a senior in 1979. However, teammate James Brooks ran for 1,208 yards as a junior that season to claim the league rushing crown. Brooks totaled 1,314 yards and nine scores as a senior in 1980.

Stephen Davis was the SEC rushing king in 1994 with 1,263 yards, before totaling 1,068 yards and 14 touchdowns in 1995.

THE HUNDRED-YARD MAN

Kenny Irons has eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark in seven of his last eight games

and nine of his last 11. During the past 11 games, Irons has totaled 1,443 yards rushing (131.2 yards per game), which would rank as the third-best single-season total in school history, trailing only Bo Jackson (1,786 in 1985) and Rudi Johnson (1,567 in 2000).

CUTTING DOWN ON MISCUES

After throwing six interceptions in his first five games last season, junior quarterback Brandon Cox has become adept at cutting down on mistakes, having thrown just two picks in his last seven games. Cox, who ranks third in Auburn history in lowest interception percentage (.0279 - 10 interceptions on 358 attempts), has had just two of his last 202 pass attempts intercepted, after starting last season with six interceptions on his first 122 attempts.

JUST FOR KICKS

Senior John Vaughn started his season with a bang, connecting on a career high four field goals on Auburn's first four possessions last Saturday vs. Washington State. Twice during the first half, Vaughn booted a career-long field goal.

After a 31-yard kick on the opening drive, Vaughn drilled a career-best 44-yarder on Auburn's second possession. He topped that mark with a 52-yard boot, which is tied for ninth longest in school history, early in the second quarter before adding a 30-yard field goal moments later.

Vaughn finished with a career-high 16 points scored, pushing his career total to 234 points, which ranks fifth in school history.

MUSCHAMP ERA UNDERWAY

Auburn's new defensive coordinator, Will Muschamp, made believers off his defensive philosophy with a solid showing vs. a high-powered Washington State squad. The Cougars averaged 489.3 yards and 33.5 points last season, but were limited to just 274 yards and 14 points vs. Auburn.

Quarterback Alex Brink, who threw for 2,891 yards last season, was limited to 67 yards on 11-of-24 passing, while star wideout Jason Hill, who averaged 109.7 yards receiving per game last season, caught four balls for only 18 yards.

HERRING TRANSITION SUCCESSFUL

One of the more notable changes to the Auburn defense was the move of Will Herring, a three-year starter at free safety, to linebacker. Early results are a success, as Herring intercepted a pass, knocked down another and had three solo tackles in the opener against Washington State. Herring also took a direct snap on a fake punt and rushed 42 yards in the third quarter vs. the Cougars.

Tigers Terrific Since 2000

Since the start of the 2000 season, Auburn has one of the best records in all of Division I-A football. The Tigers' record of 55-21 (.724) ranks 14th among all 117 programs. The list of the top 20 programs since 2000 in terms of winning percentage follows:

SEC SUCCESS

Auburn has won 16 of its last 17 Southeastern Conference games and 17 of its last 18 games against SEC schools, including the 2004 SEC Championship game victory over Tennessee. Auburn's success against conference schools dates back to more than last year's championship run, as since the start of the 2000 season, the Tigers have the best record among the 12 league schools in regular season conference games. The following are the combined conference records of the 12 SEC schools from 2000-06.

OL HAS EXPERIENCE

Although they hadn't started a game as a group prior to the season opener vs. Washington State, Auburn's starting offensive linemen have a wealth of experience, combining for 133 games played and 55 starts. Senior guard Ben Grubbs has played in 38 games, starting the last 26, while his counterpart at guard, senior Tim Duckworth, has played in 21 games on the offensive side, making 11 starts. Senior center Joe Cope has started 12 of his 15 career games played, while senior tackle Jonathan Palmer (34 games, four starts) and King Dunlap (25 games played, two starts) are new to the starting lineup this year but have seen extensive action.

FIRST-TIMERS

The following players played in their first career games at Auburn last Saturday vs. Washington State: Antonio Coleman, Mario Fannin, Alonzo Horton, Gabe McKenzie, Jerraud Powers, Airron Savage, Craig Stevens, Ben Tate and Patrick Trahan. From that group, Savage not only played in his first game but also made his first career start.

OFFENSE PUTS UP POINTS

The 40 points scored by Auburn in the season-opening victory against Washington State were the most by an Auburn team in an opener since 1995, when the Tigers beat Ole Miss 46-13. Under offensive coordinator Al Borges, who is in his third season at Auburn, the Tigers have scored at least 40 points seven times, and Auburn has reached the 30-point mark 19 times.

OFFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

Auburn's offense is looking to fill the void left by three career 1,000-yard receivers (Devin Aromashodu, Anthony Mix and Ben Obomanu) who moved on to the NFL following the 2005 season. But the Tigers return players responsible for nearly all of their offensive production running and passing the ball last season.

TAYLOR'S TIME

Although Auburn lost three wideouts to the NFL following last season, the Tigers are not without a talented returner at that position. In fact, senior Courtney Taylor has more career receptions and receiving yards than any other active player in the SEC. His 1,445 career

receiving yards already ranks ninth in Auburn history, and his 102 career catches are tied for fifth best.

SEC ACTIVE LEADERS

Courtney Taylor is not the only Auburn player who leads all active SEC players in a particular statistical category. Tre Smith is the conference's active leader in both career punt return yards (621 on 72 returns) and total kick return yards (922 yards/621 punts and 301 kickoffs). John Vaughn, with 132 career PAT kicks made, is the conference's active leader and ranks ninth in SEC history.

THE TIME HAS COME

Prior to this season, new timing rules were put into effect to reduce the length of college football games. The belief was that each game would be shortened by several plays, and if Auburn's season opener is any indication, there will be fewer plays, although the difference was relatively minor in the opener. In the past five seasons Auburn games have averaged between 126.2 and 134.9 plays per game, but in the opener vs. Washington State, the teams combined for just 124 total plays.

The following chart shows the average plays run in games this season compared to the averages from the previous five seasons.

TIGERS HAVE SUCCESS ON TV

Auburn is 17-6 all-time in games played on Lincoln Financial Sports (formerly Jefferson Pilot Sports). The Tigers have won seven straight dating back to 2002, including victories in 2005 against Mississippi State (28-0) and Ole Miss (27-3).

Auburn's appearance on ESPN2 during the season opener proved to be a good sign for the Tigers, as Auburn is now 10-0 all-time when playing on ESPN2. Auburn had one game televised by ESPN2 in 2005, earning a 48-7 victory over South Carolina at Jordan-Hare Stadium on Oct. 1.

STIFLING DEFENSE

By limiting Washington State to 14 points in the season opener, Auburn continued its trend of stellar defensive play. The Tigers have held 19 of their 26 opponents to fewer than 20 points since the start of the 2004 season. Auburn opponents are averaging just 13.3 points per game during that span.

AUBURN BY THE NUMBERS

The Tigers return 58 lettermen from last season, including 26 on offense, 25 on defense and seven specialists. Auburn returns five starters on offense and six on defense.

Auburn's roster of 118 players includes 21 seniors, 21 juniors, 26 sophomores, 20 redshirt freshmen and 30 freshmen. The underclassmen (76) represent 64.4 percent of the Tigers' roster.

A number of walk-ons joined the program after the first day of classes on August 16.

BIGGEST SENIOR CLASS

Head Coach Tommy Tuberville has a senior class that includes 21 players at Auburn in 2006. The Tigers' group of 21 seniors is the most during the Tuberville era, surpassing the 2004 group that had 18. During Tuberville's tenure, Auburn's other senior classes have consisted of: 15 in 2005, 13 in 2003, 15 in 2002, 10 in 2001, 14 in 2000 and 14 in 1999.

The 2006 seniors include: TE Cole Bennett, P Kody Bliss, DL Christopher Browder, K Matt Clark, C Joe Cope, LB Karibi Dede, OT Tim Duckworth, OG Ben Grubbs, WR Lee Guess, DE Marquies Gunn, SS Brant Haynie, LB Will Herring, CB David Irons, RB Kenny Irons, P Patrick Martyn, OL Jonathan Palmer, FS Pete Ruzicka, LB Kevin Sears, RB Tre Smith, WR Courtney Taylor and K John Vaughn.

IRON MEN

Of Auburn's 21 seniors, 12 have seen time in more than 30 games during their careers. Tre Smith and Will Herring, who both have red-shirted during seasons in which they saw limited action, have played in 42 and 41 games, respectively, to lead the group. Kody Bliss and Karibi Dede join Smith and Herring as players who have played in all 39 games over the past four seasons. Courtney Taylor and Ben Grubbs have played in 38 games, followed by Cole Bennett (37), John Vaughn (36), Marquies Gunn (35), Kevin Sears (34), Jonathan Palmer (34) and Tim Duckworth (32).

STARTS STREAK

Will Herring has a chance to set the Auburn record for consecutive starts this season. Herring has started 37 consecutive games, which is 10 shy of the school record of 47 held by OL Jenó James (1996-99). Former QB Stan White (45 games from 1990-93) has the second-longest starting streak in Auburn history.

Other players who have lengthy starting streaks include OG Ben Grubbs, who has started 26 straight games, and LB Karibi Dede, who has started each of the last 13 games.

GONE ON D

Defensively in 2006, Auburn is looking to replace five starters from last year's squad that ranked sixth in the nation in scoring defense (15.5), including three starters on the defensive line and a pair of linebackers. DT Wayne Dickens, NG T.J. Jackson, DE Stanley McClover, LB Antarrrious Williams and LB Travis Williams combined to total 230 tackles and 20.5 sacks in 2005.

Travis Williams was second on the team with 68 tackles, while Antarrrious Williams (51) ranked third, Jackson (41) ranked eighth and Dickens (38) ranked tenth. McClover's eight sacks led the team while Dickens ranked second with 6.5.

In addition to ranking sixth in the nation in scoring defense, the 2005 Auburn defense finished 19th nationally in total defense, allowing 315.3 yards per game.

IN THE POLLS

For the fourth consecutive year, Auburn is nationally ranked to begin the season. The Tigers are fourth in the Associated Press preseason poll, and sixth in the preseason *USA Today* coaches poll.

It is the first time under head coach Tommy Tuberville and first time since the 1995-98 seasons that Auburn has been ranked at the start of four consecutive seasons.

LOFTY BEGINNINGS

Auburn's preseason ranking of No. 4 in the Associated Press preseason poll is the highest preseason ranking for the Tigers since the 1990 squad was ranked third to open the season.

This marks the 15th season that Auburn has started the year ranked in the AP top 10.

30+ POINTS EQUALS VICTORY

Under Tommy Tuberville, Auburn is 38-0 when scoring 30 or more points in a game. Auburn has won 43 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points in a game.

The last time the Tigers lost when registering at least 30 points was a 56-49, four overtime loss to Georgia in 1996.

In the last 22 years, Auburn is 112-2 when scoring 30 points.

TUBERVILLE IN EIGHTH SEASON

Tommy Tuberville is in his eighth season at Auburn in 2006 and his 12th as a head coach in the Southeastern Conference. Tuberville has the third-longest tenure in the SEC (second-longest active streak) behind Phillip Fulmer of Tennessee and Steve Spurrier of South Carolina, who will each coach his 14th season in the league this year.

Tuberville has amassed a record of 61-27 in eight seasons at Auburn and an overall mark of 86-47. He has led the Tigers to six straight bowl appearances.

Tuberville is fourth all-time at Auburn in wins, and is the fifth-longest tenured coach in school history.

12 AND COUNTING

In his 12th year as a head coach, Tommy Tuberville has five assistant coaches who have been with him all 12 years. That group includes: defensive tackles/ nose-guard coach Don Dunn, running backs/special teams coach Eddie Gran, wide receivers coach Greg Knox, offensive line coach Hugh Nall and defensive ends coach Terry Price.

POSITION CHANGES

Several players have changed positions since the 2006 season. The most notable change is that Will Herring, a three-year starter at free safety, has moved to linebacker this year.

Anthony Campbell has moved from defensive back to wide receiver, while Tristan Davis, who spent time at running back last year, is back in the defensive backfield in 2006.

Alonzo Horton has switched from defensive end to linebacker, while Steve Gandy moved from safety to linebacker. Andrew McCain switched from defensive tackle to offensive tackle, while Danny Perry moved from tight end to fullback.

SENIORS GO FOR NEW MARK

Auburn not only established a new school record for victories in a two-year period by winning 22 games over the past two seasons, but the Tigers also set a new three-year mark (30 wins) while tying the four-year record (39). Auburn's senior class entered the 2006 season needing nine victories to tie last year's senior group as the winningest senior class in school

history, and 10 wins to become the winningest senior class in Auburn history.

TIGER GRADS

Auburn begins the season with 11 graduates on the roster, which is the most of any Division 1-A football team.

The Tiger graduates include: TE Cole Bennett (business administration), P Kody Bliss (business marketing), C Joe Cope (economics), LB Karibi Dede (rehab special education), WR Lee Guess (business marketing), LB Will Herring (exercise science), CB David Irons (Sociology), P Patrick Martyn (business), RB Tre Smith (business), RB Carl Stewart (political science) and NG Josh Thompson (physical education).

FATHERS AND SONS

Auburn tight ends coach Steve Ensminger is the father of Auburn freshman quarterback Steven Ensminger, while junior fullback Danny Perry is the son of Director of Football Operations Jimmy Perry. The younger Ensminger is the first Tiger to have his father on the coaching staff since Joe Whitt, Jr., played wide receiver from 1998-99 while Joe Whitt, Sr., who coached at Auburn from 1981-2005, was a linebackers coach.

Previously, Gene Lorenzo, an assistant coach from 1951-75, saw his son Mac letter at offensive tackle from 1970-72, earning All-SEC honors as a senior, and Paul Davis, an assistant coach from 1967-80 and 1987-90, watched his son Rhett letter at split end from 1972-73.

JORDAN-HARE STADIUM

Now in its 67th year as home to the Auburn football team, Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's ninth-largest on-campus stadium, with a capacity of 87,451 fans. The Tigers are 250-60-7 (.800) at Jordan-Hare Stadium, including a 36-6 (.857) mark in the last six years. AU went 7-0 at home in both 2000 and 2004, and posted a 6-1 mark last season.

Auburn is currently riding a seven-game

home winning streak and has won 15 of its last 16 games at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

JORDAN-HARE ADDITIONS

Jordan-Hare Stadium underwent a \$30.5 million facelift since last season as Phase Three of the Jordan-Hare Renovation Project. The most noticeable change is the addition of a courtyard on the west side of the stadium. To improve the lack of space in the interior concourse of the stadium, 115,000 square feet was added as the West concourse expanded out toward Donahue Drive. The surface of the concourses in the stadium were upgraded as well.

Also, the southwest ramp leading to the upper deck has been extended, creating a new entrance gate at the bottom of that ramp. The number of lighting fixtures has increased and the quality of those fixtures has improved. There are also more concession stands and women's restrooms in the stadium.

Inside the stadium, two ProAd displays have been placed on the East and West upper deck fascias, and the North end zone scoreboard was replaced. In conjunction with the new scoreboard, all of the timing devices throughout the stadium have been retrofitted so that they will now all be communicating with one another.

TIGERS SWITCH TO UNDER ARMOUR

The Auburn football uniforms may look the same in 2006 to the casual observer, but the Tigers have made one key change to the uniforms. The uniforms are now made by Under Armour Performance Apparel as part of a five-year contract signed in December of 2005 that makes Under Armour the official outfitter of all of Auburn's athletic teams. The contract, worth \$10.6 million in sponsorship, product and additional benefits, will see Auburn's athletic teams wearing Under Armour uniforms, cleats, apparel and accessories beginning in the 2006-07 academic year.

TUBERVILLE GOES HOLLYWOOD

Head coach Tommy Tuberville appeared in a new Under Armour commercial that debuted during Auburn's season-opening game vs. Washington State. The 30-second spot, which promotes Under Armour's new line of football cleats and apparel, will air nationally throughout the college football season.

TIGER PROS

Auburn has demonstrated a proficiency for placing players in the National Football League. As of Aug. 21, 37 former Auburn Tigers were listed on NFL rosters. The Washington Redskins have the most former Tigers, with five former Auburn players on the roster, while the Miami Dolphins and New York Giants have four each.

TIGERS ON CSS

Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast (CSS) will broadcast encore presentations of Auburn football every Sunday at 6 p.m. ET/5 p.m. CT. Games broadcast by an ESPN network or Lincoln Financial Sports will feature replays of the original broadcast. For non-televised games and games broadcast by CBS, Andy Burcham will handle play-by-play duties and Cole Cubelic will do color commentary on the replay. CSS will also air the Auburn Football Preview every Friday at 4 p.m. CT.

CSS is a 24-hour regional sports network serving approximately 4.5 million households across 11 Southeastern states.

Auburn rebounded from a season-opening loss to shut out Mississippi State 28-0 in the teams' Southeastern Conference opener as the Tigers scored a touchdown in each of the four quarters of play.

Auburn's win over Mississippi State gave the Tigers a 10-game win streak in SEC conference games and an 11-game streak over SEC teams.

Auburn quarterback Brandon Cox threw to nine different receivers for a 12-of-18 effort for 202 yards passing. Auburn tight ends appeared to be the targets of choice as Cooper Wallace had a team-high three receptions for 21 yards and Cole Bennett grabbed two passes for 45 yards and a touchdown.

Carl Stewart rushed for 44 yards on nine carries on the day and was followed by Brad Lester with 39 yards on six carries. Kenny Irons added 35 yards on 13 carries.

Auburn got on the board on its second drive with a 33-yard pass to Bennett from Cox at the 6:56 mark in the first quarter.

On the Tigers' ensuing possession, Cox found Devin Aromashodu from 5-yards out, giving Auburn a 14-0 lead with 13:04 remaining in the second quarter.

The Auburn defense remained strong, giving Auburn an opportunity for a shutout. The Tigers added to their lead as safety Will Herring rounded up a Mississippi State fumble in the end zone, giving Auburn a 21-0 advantage.

Auburn had a few firsts down the stretch including the Tigers' final score of the day, a 6-yard touchdown rush by Brad Lester, the first of his career. In just three plays and 30 yards, Auburn captured its 28-0 shutout of the Bulldogs.

With 202 yards passing on the day, Cox became the first Auburn quarterback since Dameyune Craig in 1997 to throw for more than 200 yards in the first two games of the season.

Mississippi State quarterback Omarr Conner completed 10 passes for 116 yards and one interception and was sacked five times

by the Auburn defense. Tee Milons led the team with four receptions for 54 yards and Derek Ambrose collected 42 yards on six carries.

Mississippi State troubles continued with the loss to Auburn as the game marked the 13th consecutive road loss and the 18th straight SEC road loss for the Bulldogs.

Kenny Irons rushed for 183 yards and a touchdown and Brad Lester scored twice as fourth-ranked Auburn opened its season with a 40-14 victory over Washington State.

Irons rushed for his ninth career 100-yard game -- and seventh straight in regular season games -- averaging 9.1 yards on 20 carries. He opened up the third quarter with a 58-yard touchdown run that gave Auburn a 26-7 lead a minute in.

Irons also caught three passes for 40 yards, giving him 223 multi-purpose yards, marking his career high.

Lester posted his third career multiple touchdown game, but the first in which he caught a pass and rushed for a score. The sophomore ended Auburn's first-half scoring with a 34-yard pass from Brandon Cox, then rushed for a 12-yard touchdown early in the fourth quarter. He ended the game with 37 yards on six carries.

Cox completed 11-of-18 passes for 191 yards and a touchdown. The junior improved to 9-3 all-time as Auburn's starting quarterback and has now thrown a touchdown in 11 of his 12 career starts.

The Tigers scored their first 12 points on four field goals from senior kicker John Vaughn, who connected on attempts of 31, 44, 52 (career long) and 30 yards, marking his career best. It was also the most by an Auburn kicker since Jaret Holmes posted four field goals against Alabama in 1997.

Washington State held the lead briefly in the first quarter after Jason Hill caught a 2-yard pass from Alex Brink, giving the Cougars a 7-6 advantage. The Tigers, however, scored the next 20 points, capped off by Irons' 58-yard run to open the second half.

Cody Boyd ended Washington State's scoring with a 50-yard pass from Gary Rogers midway through the third quarter, bringing the Cougars to within 12. However, Auburn finished off Washington State with Lester's 12-yard run and a 1-yard touchdown run by Carl Stewart late in the fourth quarter. The final score completed Auburn's 40-point night, which marked the most by Auburn against a Pacific-10 Conference opponent.

Karibi Dede paced the Tigers with eight tackles, followed by Merrill Johnson and Aairon Savage, who both had four. Auburn finished with five sacks, led by Sen'Derrick Marks' 1.5.

Will Herring accounted for the game's lone turnover, picking off Brink at the 8:41 mark of the fourth quarter.
