

2007-08 Season Review

Injuries and setbacks severely hampered Auburn's 2007-08 season in which the Tigers went 14-16 overall and finished last in the SEC with a 4-12 record.

Auburn's players missed a combined 4,733 minutes on the season that included 119 total missed games.

The Tigers, who had only been playing with seven scholarship players in the six games from Nov. 19-Dec. 22, lost Korvotney Barber three minutes into the Dec. 29 Towson game with a broken left hand, leaving only six scholarship players available.

Barber was leading the nation in field goal pct. (.720) and led the Tigers in scoring (14.8), rebounding (7.3) and blocks (1.4). The Manchester, Ga., native missed the rest of the season, and the Tigers suffered from it.

Lucas Hargrove, who broke his left hand Dec. 5, missed four games before playing eight minutes vs. Texas A&M-Corpus Christi Jan. 2 to bring the available scholarship players number back to seven.

The Tigers added Quan Prowell for the West Virginia game Dec. 5, but lost Hargrove with a broken left hand to keep the Tigers at seven available scholarship players.

Prowell had missed the first five regular season games while being suspended. Josh Dollard, who averaged 12.5 points and 7.0 rebounds as a sophomore, was redshirted, Archie Miaway was ineligible and 7-foot-1 center Boubacar Sylla suffered a stress reaction in his ankle against Kennesaw State Nov. 13 and missed the rest of the year.

After opening the season with a 77-62 loss at Tulane, Auburn won four straight games, including nine of its next 10.

The Tigers won a 63-60 nailbiter at Alabama State and blasted Charleston Southern 89-59 in Charleston. Rasheem Barrett was named SEC Player of the Week after totaling 25 points, four rebounds, four assists, two steals and a block in the win vs. Charleston Southern. He came into the game shooting 37 percent from the field and 28 percent from 3-point range before turning in his 10-of-13 (.769) shooting performance and 3-of-5 (.600) from 3-point range.

Auburn defeated George Washington 74-70 in the BB&T Classic in the Verizon Center in Washington, D.C. Frank Tolbert had a gamehigh 24 points and five steals while Korvotney

Barber added 21 points and nine rebounds in the win over GW.

After losing to West Virginia in the SEC-Big East Invitational in Birmingham, Ala., the Tigers rang up five straight home wins over Mercer, Alabama A&M, Towson and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi.

After closing out pre-conference play with a loss to Xavier, Auburn lost to Arkansas 76-70 in its SEC opener and lost at Florida 72-56.

Auburn enjoyed a three-game winning streak by downing LSU 74-67 in Baton Rouge, defeating No. 15 Ole Miss 80-77 and Presbyterian 78-65.

In the win at LSU, Auburn came back from a 17-point deficit to win its first SEC game of the season behind a then career-high 20 points, five rebounds and three steals from DeWayne Reed while Tolbert added 16 points and nine rebounds.

The win over No. 15 Ole Miss marked the Tigers' fourth win in the last five games vs. ranked teams in a year and two days. Tolbert tied a then career-high with 29 points while Reed notched back-to-back career-high scoring games with 21 points. Reed made 4-of-7 three-pointers and had six assists, four rebounds and three steals, playing all 40 minutes.

From here on, however, the Tigers only won two of its final 13 games.

Auburn lost five straight at Alabama, LSU, at No. 18 Vanderbilt, Kentucky and Mississippi

The Tigers earned a season sweep over Ole Miss with a 90-78 victory in Oxford. Prowell scored 25 points and Reed added a career-high 23 points for the Tigers, who shot a season-best 63 percent from the floor, scored a season high in points and had their largest margin of victory in Oxford since the 1999 SEC Championship season.


After an 89-70 loss at No. 2 Tennessee, Auburn defeated Alabama 88-76 behind a career-high 28 points from Lucas Hargrove in his second career start while Prowell added 22 points and nine rebounds before a sold out Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum.

Auburn ended the season with five straight losses at Mississippi State, to South Carolina and Georgia at home, at Arkansas and to No. 17 Vanderbilt in the SEC Tournament first round.

Tolbert became the 29th member of Auburn's 1,000-point club with 16 points in the win at LSU Jan. 16.

The River Falls, Ala., native finished 17th on the Tigers' all-time scoring chart with 1,242 points.

Rasheem Barrett became the 30th member of Auburn's 1,000-point club with 10 points

in the win vs. Alabama on Feb. 24. He now has 1,069 career points and is 25th in all-time scoring.

Quantez Robertson led the SEC with 37.5 minutes played, ranked second in the SEC in assist/turnover ratio (2.30, 28th nationally), second in steals (2.10, 35th nationally) and eighth in assists (4.07).

The Cincinnati, Ohio, native scored a seasonhigh 16 points on 6-of-8 shooting from the field vs. Mississippi State Feb. 9. He also had five rebounds and four steals.

Auburn committed a season-low four turnovers at Mississippi State Feb. 27.

The Tigers forced 164 turnovers while committing only 115 turnovers total in this span.

Auburn forced 24 turnovers vs. both Kentucky and Mississippi State, 15 at Ole Miss and 18 at No. 2 Tennessee.

FRANK ON FIRE

Senior Frank Tolbert averaged 16.5 points in Auburn's last 11 games. He scored 20 points in 29 minutes vs. South Carolina Mar. 1 and totaled 17 points, 5 assists and 4 rebounds at Arkansas Mar. 8.

He notched his second career double-double with 24 points and a career-high tying 10 rebounds at No. 2 Tennessee Feb. 20. His only other double-double came in an 18-point, 10rebound performance vs. Arkansas in 2007.

Battling an injured right ankle, Tolbert had 15 points, including 13 in the second half, in the Tigers' 90-78 win at Ole Miss.

The River Falls, Ala., native had 17 points, a career-high 6 steals, 4 rebounds, 4 assists and 2 blocks vs. Mississippi State Feb. 9.

Tolbert scored a career-high 32 points, including 26 in the second half, in Auburn's 78-71 loss at Vanderbilt Feb. 2. In the second half alone, Tolbert went 8-of-12 from the field, 5-of-6 from 3-point range and 4-of-5 from the foul line. He also had a team-high 8 rebounds to go along with 2 assists and 2 steals.

TURNOVER IMPROVEMENT

Auburn averaged 11.3 turnovers (238) over its final 21 games after committing 18.2 turnovers per game in its first nine games.

Auburn committed a season-low four turnovers at Mississippi State Feb. 27.

The Tigers had 15 or more turnovers only three times in the final 20 games in contrast to committing 15 or more in eight of the first nine this season. They had four games of 20 or more turnovers.

TOLBERT 17th ON AUBURN'S ALL-TIME SCORING CHART

Senior Frank Tolbert became the 29th member of Auburn's 1,000-point club with 16 points in the win at LSU Jan. 16.

The River Falls, Ala., native finished 17th on the Tigers' all-time scoring chart with 1,242 points.

BARRETT JOINS 1.000-POINT CLUB

Junior Rasheem Barrett became the 30th member of Auburn's 1,000-point club with 10 points in the win vs. Alabama on Feb. 24. He now has 1,069 career points and is 25th in alltime scoring.

He was the second Tiger to reach the elite membership this season. Senior Frank Tolbert eclipsed the mark on Jan. 16 at LSU.

TEZ DISPENSER

Junior Ouantez Robertson led the SEC with 37.5 minutes played, ranked second in the SEC in assist/turnover ratio (2.30, 28th nationally), second in steals (2.10, 35th nationally) and eighth in assists (4.07).

The Cincinnati, Ohio, native scored a season-

high 16 points on 6-of-8 shooting from the field vs. Mississippi State Feb. 9. He also had five rebounds and four steals.

40 MINUTE MEN ...

Auburn's Quan Prowell played all but five minutes in Auburn's last four regular season games at Mississippi State, vs. South Carolina, vs. Georgia and at Arkansas (35 minutes played).

Quantez Robertson has played all but four minutes in five of Auburn's final six games. The only games he didn't play 40 minutes in the stretch were the South Carolina game in which he played 39 minutes and at Arkansas (37 minutes).

IRON MEN

STARTING TEZ

Auburn junior Quantez Robertson has started all 90 games in his three years at Auburn. The Cincinnati, Ohio, native started all 28 games as a freshman in 2005-06, all 32 games in 2006-07 and all 30 games in 2007-08.

VOT WAS LEADING NATION IN FG%

Korvotnev Barber was leading the nation shooting 72.0 percent from the field when he broke his left hand three minutes into Auburn's Dec. 29 game vs. Towson and didn't played since. He didn't play the minimum number of games to be eligible for the NCAA stats.

Frank Tolbert scored a game-high 25 points to lead four Tigers in double figures as Auburn defeated NAIA Bluefield College 89-75 in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum in its lone exhibition game. Korvotney Barber added 16 points and nine rebounds, DeWayne Reed 16 points and nine assists while Matt Heramb had 11 points. Bluefield went 13-of-42 from 3-point range while Auburn was 2-of-14. The Tigers took the lead for good on a Heramb 3-pointer at 15-12 that sparked a 15-1 run that led Auburn to a 16-point lead. The Tigers led 48-36 at the half. The Ramblin' Rams cut Auburn's lead to 79-72 with 2:56 left, but Tolbert scored eight of Auburn's last 10 points to ensure the win. Tolbert scored 18 of his 25 points in the second half, going 10-of-14 from the field. Curtis Dixon led Bluefield with 21 points.

Tulane 77, Auburn 62 November 9, 2007 Fogelman Arena New Orleans, La.

Tulane used balanced scoring and a suffocating defense to defeat Auburn 77-62 in Fogelman Arena in the season opener for both teams. It ended a string of nine-straight season-opening wins for the Tigers. Auburn hit its first three 3pointers to take an early 9-4 lead but only made one of its next 12 treys. Tied at 16 with 12:57 left in the first half, Auburn only scored two points in the next 8:16, including a six-minute scoring drought. During the dry spell, Auburn fell behind 28-18 with 4:41 left. Trailing 38-27 at halftime, Auburn trailed by as much as 21 points at 56-35 with 10 minutes remaining. The Tigers used a 20-7 run to close to within 63-55 with 4:05 left. A Kevin Sims 3-pointer put the Green Wave up 11 with 3:44 to play, and Auburn wouldn't get any closer. Auburn shot 39 percent from the field, 32 percent from 3-point range and a mere 48 percent from the foul line. Rasheem Barrett led the Tigers with 16 points on 5-of-13 shooting while Korvotney Barber added 11 points and 10 rebounds, DeWayne Reed 11 points and Frank Tolbert 10 points, six rebounds and four steals. Donnavan Stith led Tulane with 12 points and Kevin Sims 11 along with three players with nine points each. Tulane's bench outscored Auburn's bench 30-7 as the Tigers played without senior Quan Prowell, who was serving the second game of a six-game suspension.

Auburn 74, Kennesaw State 62 November 13, 2007 Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum Auburn, Ala.

Six players scored in double figures to lead Auburn to its 18th-straight home opening win in a 74-62 victory over Kennesaw State in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum. Korvotney Barber, Frank Tolbert and Rasheem Barrett each scored 12 points, DeWayne Reed and Quantez Robertson 11 apiece and Lucas Hargrove 10. In an odd stat line, Auburn shot 57 percent from the field, 47 percent from 3-point range and only 41 percent from the foul line. The Tigers opened with an 11-2 run and the lead never dipped below double digits after a Lucas Hargrove dunk for a 26-16 lead with 6:50 left in the first half. Holding a 38-23 halftime lead, Auburn led by as much as 25 at 54-29 with 13:06 remaining. The Tigers led 70-49 with 4:07 left before Ronell Wooten hit three of his five 3-pointers to help Kennesaw draw to within the final 12 point margin. Wooten scored a game-high 23 points on 5-of-12 three-point shooting.

The Tigers, who shot a seasonbest 63 percent from the floor, scored a season-high in points and had their largest margin of victory in Oxford since the 1999 SEC Championship season. Trevor Gaskins had 15 points for Ole Miss. David Huertas and Eniel Polynice had 13 points apiece.
