WEEKEND STORY LINES

- Auburn hosts long-time rival Georgia for a three-game series at Plainsman Park. All three games will be televised by SECN.
- Two Tigers have started all 42 games so far in 2015 -- OF Anfernee Grier and SS Cody Nulph.
- Grier leads the SEC with 19 doubles and 65 hits, totals that rank fourth and seventh in the country.
- Sophomore RHP Cole Lipscomb was named SEC Pitcher of the Week following his CG, 10 K effort vs. Ole Miss.
- The 14-run margin of victory in Auburn's 14-0 victory over Ole Miss last Saturday was the Tigers' most lopsided SEC win since defeating Ole Miss 18-4 on May 21, 2010.
- Damon Haecker has played five different positions (2B, 3B, SS, LF, RF) in 2015, the first time an Auburn player has accomplished that feat since Justin Bryant played five in 2010 (2B, 3B, SS, OF, DH).
- The Tigers are 25-3 when holding its opponent to five or fewer runs and is 16-3 when scoring at least six runs in a game.
- Auburn is 17-2 when playing error-free baseball this season. In its 26 wins, Auburn has compiled a .987 fielding percentage with 13 errors. In their 16 losses, the Tigers have fielded at a .957 clip with 26 errors.
- With 26 bunt singles on the season, Auburn is tied for the SEC lead with Mississippi State and ranks second nationally.
- Auburn is 23-2 when leading after six innings, 21-3 when leading after seven and 21-0 when leading after the eighth.
- Auburn has scored 220 runs this season and needs just 15 more runs to match its total from the entire 2014 season.

THE AUBURN SKIPPER

Three-time Oklahoma Baseball Coaches' Association Coach of the Year (1998, 2001, 2010)
 Four-time Mid-Continent Conference Coach of the Year (1998, 1999, 2000, 2002)
 Two-time NBC Coach of the Year (1993, 1994)

Sunny Golloway, who enters his second season on the Plains in 2015, was named Auburn's 17th head baseball coach on June 14, 2013.

Golloway spent the previous eight seasons (2005-13) as head coach at the University of Oklahoma, where he led the Sooners to seven NCAA Regional berths, four NCAA Super Regionals and the 2010 College World Series.

"The goal in this search was to find a proven winner who can put our baseball program in a position to compete for championships, and we found our man in Coach Golloway... After having the chance to hear his vision for Auburn baseball, there is no doubt in my mind he has the tenacity, the passion and the drive to get our program back to a level that matches our strong baseball heritage."

GOLLOWAY IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Golloway has been a proven winner at each of his head coaching stops. In 17 full seasons as a head coach - eight seasons each at Oklahoma and Oral Roberts as well as one at Auburn - Golloway has amassed a record of 735-381-1 (.660), including 12 seasons with at least 40 wins entering the 2015 season. He recorded a mark of 346-181-1 (.656) in eight-plus seasons as the Oklahoma head coach, an average of more than 40 wins per season. Prior to the 2013 season, Golloway's winning percentage ranked No. 15 nationally among active head coaches.

GOLLOWAY IN 19th SEASON AS HEAD COACH

In 2013 at Oklahoma, Golloway led the Sooners to a 43-21 overall record, a Big 12 Tournament title, an NCAA Regional title and a Super Regional appearance. His final team at Oklahoma also produced a pair of All-Americans, including pitcher Jonathan Gray, the No. 3 overall pick in the 2013 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Under Golloway, Oklahoma posted the program's fifth-straight 40-win regular season in 2013, making Oklahoma one of a few programs nationally to win at least 40 games in five consecutive years. The Sooners finished third in the Big 12 standings while making the program's sixth-straight NCAA postseason appearance (36th overall). OU finished the 2013 campaign ranked as high as No. 18 in the nation after falling to LSU in the NCAA Baton Rouge Super Regional.

The Sooners hosted three NCAA Regionals under Golloway while appearing in the program's only Super Regional appearances (2006, 2010, 2012 and 2013) and making it back to the College World Series in 2010 for the first time since 1995.

Golloway has 23 years' experience as a collegiate coach. He served as an assistant coach at Oklahoma from 1992-95, helping lead the Sooners to three trips to the College World Series in those four years and a national title in 1994. He took over as head coach at Oral Roberts in 1996, and the Golden Eagles won the Mid-Continent Conference title and advanced to an NCAA Regional in each of his final six seasons at ORU.



BIG LEAGUE GUIDANCE

Golloway has produced 83 MLB draft picks in his 18-year tenure as a collegiate head coach, and a total of 116 players have been draft selections in his 23 years in college baseball. He has also coached 95 all-conference selections between his three head coaching stops, including 61 All-Big 12 selections at Oklahoma from 2006-13.

Three of OU's recruiting classes under Golloway were ranked in the top 10 in Collegiate Baseball's national rankings, including the 2007 group of newcomers that was tabbed the fourth best in the country, the highest ranking since 1987 and tied for the second best in program history. At ORU, Golloway posted a mark of 335-156 (.682). He coached 16 All-Americans, three Freshman All-Americans and 26 of his ORU players were drafted or signed professional contracts. He was honored four times as Mid-Continent Conference Coach of the Year by his peers (1998, 1999, 2000, 2002).

Golloway is a former Team USA assistant and head coach of several collegiate summer teams. In the summer of 2002, he was selected to serve as pitching coach for the USA Baseball National Team. Under his direction, the team recorded the lowest ERA in its history. Golloway also helped team USA to a silver medal.

FAMILY MAN

Coach Golloway and his wife, Charlotte, have three children: Sunni Kate, Taylor and Callen.

NEWS & NOTES

D-ROB RACKS UP RBIs

- Sophomore IF Daniel Robert batted .429 (9-for-17) last week, including a .583 mark in the Ole Miss series. He drove in eight runs and scored 4 times.
- Robert racked up the first pair of three-RBI games in his Auburn career in both games of the Alabama A&M doubleheader.
- The sophomore from Hoover, Ala. walked three times and hit a three-run home run in game one and had three RBIs in four at-bats in game two.

LIPSCOMB EARNS SEC AWARD

- Sophomore RHP Cole Lipscomb was named SEC Pitcher of the Week following his first career complete game against Ole Miss. Lipscomb earned the win to improve to 5-1 on the season and struck out a career-high 10 batters.
- The award is the second consecutive for Auburn after fellow Tiger hurler Keegan Thompson was named SEC Pitcher of the Week on April 31. The last time Auburn won two such awards in one season was 2002 (Eric Brandon and Colby Paxton).

GRAY LEADS THE WAY

- Melvin Gray carries a nine-game hitting streak into the weekend. During the streak, Gray has gone 13-for-32 (.406) at the plate with three doubles, seven RBIs and six runs scored. He is also 4-for-4 in stolen bases.
- With a hit Thursday night, he would join Anfernee Grier and Kyler Deese as the only Auburn players to have a hitting streak of at least 10 games this season.

SOLID IN THE FIELD

- Auburn tied a program record with a .970 fielding percentage in 2014 and is on its way to another record-breaking season in the field. The Tigers currently hold a .975 mark overall, including a .977 mark in conference play.
- The Auburn defense did not commit an error from the eighth inning on March 21 vs. Vanderbilt until the sixth inning on April 3 vs. Arkansas, a span of 49.2 innings. The streak of five straight error-free games was the longest for Auburn since a five game streak from March 18-March 23 last season.

KYLER ON CUE

- Kyler Deese ranks third on the team in batting average (.321) and RBIs (10) in conference play. He has played in 18 SEC games with 16 starts.
- Overall, Deese is fourth on the team with 21 RBIs, and has driven in four runs this season that have tied a game or given Auburn the lead.

SATURDAY OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

- Auburn's 14 runs and 19 hits in game 2 of the doubleheader vs. Ole Miss on 4/18 were the most in an SEC game in each category since the Tigers scored 15 runs on 20 hits at Kentucky on April 9, 2011.
- The 14-run margin of victory in Auburn's 14-0 victory over Ole Miss last Saturday was the Tigers' most lopsided SEC win since defeating Ole Miss 18-4 on May 21, 2010.

GRIER IN GEAR

- Anfernee Grier's 22 extra base hits (19 2B, 2 3B and 1 HR) this season are the most by an Auburn player since Casey McElroy had 27 and Kevin Patterson had 24 in 2011.
- Grier's 19 doubles are the most for an Auburn player in a season since Joseph Sanders and Mike Bianucci had 19 in 2008.
- The sophomore from Phenix City, Ala. leads the SEC in hits (65) and doubles (19) and ranks fourth in batting average (.378).

MORE NEWS & NOTES

SHUTOUT RANKINGS

- Auburn has three shutouts in SEC play this season, which equals the Tigers' total number of SEC shutouts in the last four seasons combined. Overall, Auburn's staff has thrown five shutouts this season, which is tied for fifth-most in program history.
- The Tigers' five shutouts overall ranks ninth in the country and second in the Southeastern Conference.

XBH, XBH READ ALL ABOUT IT

- Auburn's 79 doubles and 107 extra base hits this season surpass the team's totals of 65 doubles and 89 extra base hits from 2014 (56 games). The Tigers have matched their home run total from last season with 15.
- In the last 14 games, Auburn has hit 31 doubles as a team. Auburn's 13 triples are the most for the Tigers since hitting 19 in 2012.

KEEGAN IS PITCHER OF THE WEEK

- Auburn RHP Keegan Thompson was named the SEC Pitcher of the week for his effort at No. 1 LSU. It's the first SEC POTW award of his career.
- Thompson tossed his second-straight complete game with three strikeouts and just one run allowed in defeating LSU. He is the first Auburn pitcher with consecutive complete games since Colter Bean (2000).

BIG WEEK FOR BULLPEN

- In its series at LSU, Auburn's bullpen threw seven innings of 1-hit, shutout baseball with no walks and four strikeouts highlighted by Justin Camp's effort on Sunday where he allowed one hit over 5.1 innings with three strikeouts.
- This was following six innings of shutout baseball by the Tigers' relievers against Georgia State on Wednesday night. For the week, Auburn's bullpen threw 13 scoreless innings, allowing four hits and striking out eight while giving up zero walks.

STOLEN BASE SUCCESS

- Auburn tied a season-high with four stolen bases at Samford. It was the Tigers' fourth game with multiple stolen bases this season.
- Auburn was successful on two of its three stolen base attempts at Georgia Tech. It was just the Tigers' third game with multiple stolen bases this season.
- The Tigers have 23 stolen bases on the season led by Anfernee Grier's six. Five different Auburn players have at least three steals and 10 different players have stolen at least one base.
- Auburn was 2-for-2 on steal attempts against Georgia State, the fifth game this season with multiple stolen bases for the Tigers.
- In game two of its doubleheader vs. Alabama A&M on Wednesday, Melvin Gray became the first Auburn player to record two stolen bases in a game this season.

OUCH!!!!

- Auburn's hitters have been hit by a pitch 121 times in 98 games under head coach Sunny Golloway. The Tigers were hit by a pitch a total of 92 times in the two seasons prior to him taking the reigns of the program (115 games).
- Sophomore infielder/outfielder Damon Haecker has been hit by a pitch a team-high 21 times over the last two seasons.
- Auburn won a game over Arkansas on a walk-off hit by pitch in the bottom of the ninth as Cody Nulph was hit with the bases loaded to bring in the winning run.

THOMPSON IN CONTROL

- All-American Keegan Thompson is second in the conference in SEC play with four wins so far this season. In those games, he has gone 4-1 with a 2.50 ERA and has struck out 29 batters in 39.2 IP.
- Thompson has four career CGs and has gone at least 6.2 innings in six of his last seven starts (6 vs. SEC competition & 1 vs. Georgia Tech) and has posted a 2.50 ERA with 50 K's in 54 innings of work
- Against LSU, Thompson allowed one run on six hits with one walk and three strikeouts against the SEC's top-hitting team. He became the first Auburn pitcher in 15 years to throw consecutive complete games. Colter Bean was the last Auburn hurler to accomplish the feat, doing so against UNC Charlotte and South Carolina in 2000.

HISTORICAL SHUTOUTS

- Auburn shut out Mississippi State 5-0 on Friday night and 4-0 on Saturday, making it the first time that the Tigers have thrown shutouts in consecutive SEC games since March 17, 2002 vs. Kentucky (5-0) and March 22, 2002 at Tennessee (3-0).
- It was the first time Auburn had thrown shutouts in consecutive games since March 2, 2001 vs. Charleston Southern (5-0) and March 6, 2001 vs. Georgia Tech (4-0) and the first time Auburn had thrown two shutouts in an SEC series since shutting out Ole Miss 5-0 and 1-0 on March 12, 1988.
- The shutouts were Auburn's first vs. Mississippi State in Starkville since 1976 and first vs. the Bulldogs anywhere since 1979. Additionally, the series also marked the first time Auburn had back-to-back road SEC shutouts since beating Georgia 1-0 and 19-0 on May 5-6, 1967.

MORE PITCHING AT MSU

- Auburn's pitching staff only allowed three runs in its series at Mississippi State. On the weekend, the Tigers lowered their team ERA from 3.80 to 3.51.
- The three runs were the fewest Auburn had allowed in a 3-game SEC series since holding South Carolina to three runs in 1992. The Tigers beat the Gamecocks 4-1, 3-2 (7 innings) and 6-0.
- It was the second time this season allowing three or less runs to a three-game series opponent (Radford). Prior to the Radford series, that feat had not occurred since Feb. 2003 against Elon.
- The series win was Auburn's first over Mississippi State since 2012 and the first in Starkville since 2009.

CAMP IS CLUTCH

- Auburn closer Justin Camp has been clutch for the Tigers in 2014. The junior from Decatur, Ala. has 35 strikeouts in 28.2 innings pitched this year.
- Camp has recorded six saves surpassing Auburn's team leader in 2014, Terrance Dedrick, who had four.
- Auburn's eight saves through its first 22 games equaled the total the Tigers had in all of 2014.
- As Auburn made a comeback in game three with Vanderbilt, Camp provided 4.0 innings and struck out 4 while allowing only one run.
- He provided 5.1 innings of shutout relief in the Sunday game at LSU, only allowing one hit and striking out three while not allowing a walk.

GRIER SETS THE TABLE

- Grier recorded a hit in each of the first 15 games of the season, extending his hitting streak to 17 games dating back through the final two games of the 2014 season.
- He had 11 multi-hit games and a hit in 23 of the first 25 games in 2015. In 35 games from 5/1/14 through 3/24/15, Grier hit in 32-of-35 starts with an average of .380 (52-for-137) in that stretch.
- Grier's career-high streak of 17 games was the longest for Auburn since Casey McElroy hit in 18 straight during the 2011 season.

GRIER NAMED SEC POTW

- Anfernee Grier was named the SEC Player of the Week on March 2. He batted .500 with nine hits in 18 at-bats, including going 5-for-8 against No. 27 Georgia Tech and No. 10 Oklahoma State.
- Grier scored six runs and drove in three RBI. Also was a perfect 2-for-2 in stolen base attempts as Auburn posted a 3-1 record on the week.

KEEGAN DOMINATES

- In his two starts against Georgia Tech and Alabama, Keegan Thompson struck out 21 in 14.1 IP against only 1 walk while posting a 2.51 ERA.
- His 12 punch outs vs. Alabama in the Capital City Classic were the most by an Auburn pitcher since Jon Luke Jacobs struck out 13 vs. Alabama State on Feb. 28, 2012 and the most vs. SEC competition since Grant Dayton had 12 vs. Mississippi State on May 2, 2008.

RACKING UP THE K'S

- Auburn's pitching staff tallied 10 games with double digits strikeouts in the first 25 games of 2015. That is four more double-digit strikeout games than the Tigers had in all of 2014.
- On the season, Auburn has averaged 8.1 strikeouts per nine innings, which is the Tigers' best mark since striking out 8.7 batters per nine innings in 1999. That mark ranks 59th nationally and sixth in the SEC.

K'S IN WINS VERSUS LOSSES

- Auburn pitching staff has a 238:75 strikeout to walk ratio in the team's 26 wins and a 94:80 strikeout to walk ratio in its 16 losses. The staff has averaged 9.2 strikeouts and 2.9 walks in its wins and 5.9 strikeouts and 5.0 walks in its losses.

BACK-TO-BACK JACKS

- Against Alabama State, Auburn's Daniel Robert and Hunter Tackett hit back-to-back home runs in the fourth inning to cut its deficit to 3-2 in the game.
- It was the first time Auburn hitters had gone deep back-to-back since Cullen Wacker and Garrett Cooper did it at Texas A&M in the third inning on April 6, 2013.
- It was the first time the feat had occurred at Plainsman Park since Justin Fradejas and Dan Gamache went yard against Texas Southern on 4/27/11.

TIGERS IN THE DRAFT

- Auburn has nine players on its team that chose to attend Auburn rather than signing a professional contract. Those nine players have been drafted a total of 10 times.

- Auburn pitchers allowed only one earned run to Radford in three games (24 innings of baseball). The staff only allowed three runs total and posted a team ERA of 0.38 for the series.
- Auburn's three earned runs allowed in the three-game series with Radford are the fewest allowed by the Tigers in a three-game series since holding Elon to just three runs from Feb. 28 - March 2, 2003. Auburn swept with 11-1, 3-1 & 7-1 wins.

CALL ME MR. HECK-ER

- The correct pronunciation for Auburn sophomore infielder Damon Haecker's last name is HECK-er.

PERFECT GAME CLASS RANKS

- Multiple members of the Auburn roster were ranked highly among their peers according to Perfect Game.
- RHP/IF Keegan Thompson was ranked as the 14th best sophomore in all of college baseball. OF Anfernee Grier came in at No. 46 on the list.
- Junior RHP Trey Wingenter ranked 78th in his class, while OF Sam Gillikin was listed as the 89th best third-year player.
- RHP Rocky McCord was ranked the 37th best senior in all of college baseball and OF Hunter Tackett was ranked as the 83rd best freshman.

BIG HURT ENTERS THE HALL

- Former Auburn first baseman Frank Thomas became the first player that played in the SEC to go into the National Baseball Hall of Fame when he was elected in 2014.
- The two-time American League MVP was elected in his first year on the ballot following a stellar career that included four All-Star selections and a World Series win in 2005 while with the Chicago White Sox.

GOLDEN SPIKES WATCH LIST

- Auburn sophomore RHP/IF Keegan Thompson was named to the Golden Spikes preseason watch list by USA Baseball on Feb. 10.
- Thompson was one of 50 players named to the preseason list

HOLLIDAY JOINS STAFF

- Auburn added new associate head coach/pitching coach Tom Holliday in June. Holliday has helped lead 15 teams to College World Series experiences and two national championships.
- He comes to Auburn after spending the past eight seasons as associate head coach at North Carolina State, where he most recently helped lead the Wolfpack to the 2013 College World Series and groomed ace pitcher Carlos Rodon into the No. 3 overall MLB Draft pick in 2014. He is the father of St. Louis Cardinals outfielder Matt Holliday and Oklahoma State head coach Josh Holliday.

EXPERIENCED SOPHOMORES

- Auburn returns six sophomore position players that saw substantial playing time as freshmen.
- The group of infielder Keegan Thompson, outfielder Anfernee Grier, infielder Damon Haecker, catcher Blake Logan, infielder Daniel Robert and outfielder J.J. Shaffer combined to start 197 games in 2014.
