Texas A&M's Elston Turner, a 6-foot-5, 212-pound senior guard from Sacramento, Calif., was named SEC Player of the Week after averaging 27.5 points on 64.5 percent shooting to go with seven rebounds and three assists in wins over Arkansas and at Kentucky. He made an incredible 14-of-19 shots in the win at Kentucky, including 6-of-10 from beyond 3-point range, to become the first Aggie to reach the 40-point plateau since Jan. 5, 1985. Additionally, Turner became just the third opponent to score 40 or more points against the Wildcats at Rupp Arena. Earlier in the week, Turner tallied 15 points and a career-best eight rebounds in a win over Arkansas, Texas A&M's first-ever SEC win.



Mississippi State's Craig Sword, a 6-foot-3, 189-pound freshman guard from Montgomery, Ala., was named SEC Freshman of the Week after averaging 17 points, 3.5 rebounds and two steals in wins over South Carolina and at Georgia. He led the Bulldogs to a win in their SEC opener with a career-best 18 points on 6-of-11 shooting against South Carolina. His two free throws with 46 seconds left broke a 52-all tie, and then he answered on the defensive end with a steal and a dunk for a 56-52 advantage. In his first SEC road game, Sword registered 16 points, four rebounds and two steals at Georgia.



Around The SEC:

- Alabama will be playing its 2,500th game on Saturday when it hosts Texas A&M.
- Arkansas' Marshawn Powell registered his second-best scoring output with 28 points to go with 11 rebounds in a double overtime win against Auburn.
- Former Auburn All-American and NBA All-Star Mike Mitchell will have his No. 30 Auburn jersey retired this coming Saturday during the Tigers' game

with Kentucky.

- Florida has played suffocating defense this season, holding eight of its opponents under 50 points and 11 under 60 points.
- Georgia's Kentavious Caldwell-Pope has led Georgia in points in all but two games and has reached double-figures in every game this season.
- Kentucky's Ryan Harrow has scored in double figures in seven-straight games and is averaging 15.6 over that stretch.
- LSU has scored 70 points or more in 11 games this year, that surpasses the number of games LSU scored 70 or more in the entire 2011-12 season.
- Ole Miss' Murphy Holloway is nearing the top of the Ole Miss rebound list with 913 career boards. The senior now only trails Walter Actwood's school record of 945 career boards.
- Mississippi State has held eight of its opponents under 60 points. In the last seven games, the Bulldogs are yielding just an average of 58.5 points.
- Missouri is 27-10 in the month of January since the 2008-09 season
- South Carolina's 10 non-conference victories marked the most since the 2008-09 campaign.
- Tennessee's Jordan McRae is averaging 24.0 ppg over his last four games. He tallied a career-high 26 against Memphis and Ole Miss.
- Texas A&M's Elston Turner scored a career-high 40 points at Kentucky. It was the first by an Aggie since 1985 (28 years), and the 10th in program history
- Vanderbilt set Memorial Gym records for 3-pointers made (17) and attempted (40) against Ole Miss.

2013 SEC Tournament

March 13-17 • Bridgestone Arena • Nashville, Tenn

The 2013 Southeastern Conference Men's Basketball Tournament returns to Bridgestone Arena in Nashville. It will be the fourth time that the arena has served as the host of the SEC Tournament, having also hosted in 2001, 2006 and 2010. Also the home of the NHL's Nashville Predators, Bridgestone Arena has the distinction of being one of the busiest venues in the United States over the past decade and a half, hosting more than 18 million guests during that time. Seating capacity is approximately 18,160 for basketball games.



The winner of the 13-game tournament receives the SEC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The tournament seeds are determined by the 18-game conference schedule during the regular season. Teams are seeded 1-14 based on their regular season conference finish.

Atlanta served as host of the inaugural SEC Tournament played following the 1932-33 season and did so again after the 1933-34 season. The event was held every year through 1952, with the exception of 1935. After a 26-year layoff (1953-78), the tournament was renewed in 1979. The 2012 tournament will be the 52nd in league history and the 33rd since the renewal.

The SEC has shown extraordinary balance in the tournament, evidenced by the fact that a different school won the first seven titles after the renewal. The event has helped set the stage for SEC teams in the NCAA Tournament, as 21 of tournament champions since the tournament resumed in 1979 have advanced to at least the Sweet 16. Three of the last 15 SEC Tournament champions have gone on to win the national championship. Since the renewal in 1979, the SEC Tournament Champion has failed to win at least one NCAA Tournament game only four times.

Kentucky leads the league with 27 SEC Tournament titles. Alabama is second with six, while Tennessee ranks third with four. Florida and Mississippi State each have three championship trophies while Georgia and Vanderbilt have two. Arkansas, Auburn, LSU, Ole Miss and former league member Georgia Tech have each won one SEC Tournament championship.

SEC Tournament Tie-Breaker Procedures

Teams should be seeded No. 1 through No. 14 in the SEC Men's Basketball Tournament bracket based upon the final regular season SEC standings. Teams that finished No. 1 through No. 4 in the final regular season standings shall receive a "bye" on the first day of the SEC Men's Basketball Tournament.

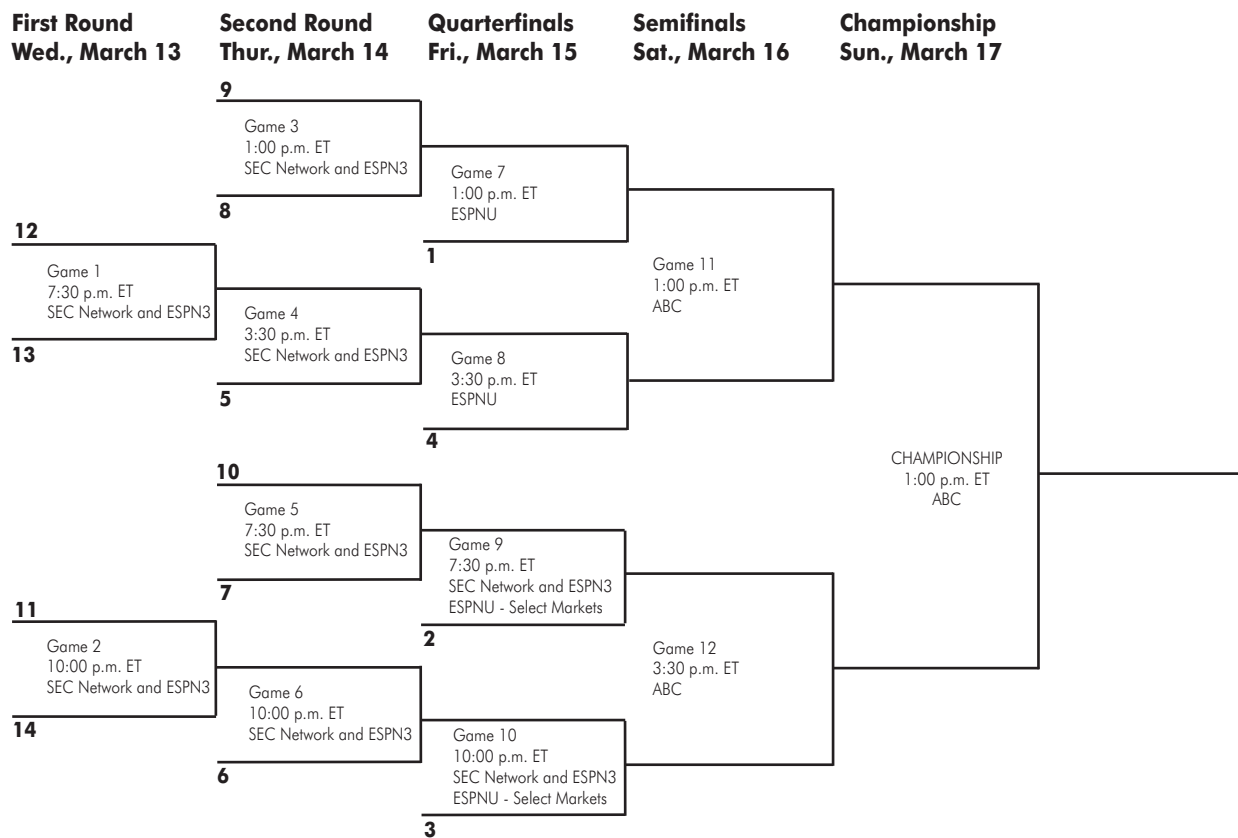
1. Two-Team Tie. The following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken:
 - A. Won-lost results of head-to-head competition between the two teams.
 - B. Won-lost record of the two teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 12 seed, if necessary).
 - C. Coin flip by the Commissioner.

2. Three-Team Tie (or more). When three or more teams are tied, the following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken. If two teams remain tied after a tiebreaker provision, the two-team tiebreaker formula will be used.
 - A. Best winning percentage of games played among the tied teams (Example: Team A is 3-1, Team B is 2-2 and Team C is 1-3 - Team A would be seeded highest, Team B second-highest and Team C lowest of the three).
 - B. Best winning percentage of the tied teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 12 seed, if necessary).
 - C. If two teams remain, coin flip by the Commissioner.
 - D. If three or more teams remain, draw by the Commissioner.

For the purpose of seeding, if an institution is precluded from participating in the tournament, it shall automatically be seeded last in its division. The No. 5 seed with the best record will then receive a bye. However, for the purpose of breaking ties, that team shall remain where it finished in the regular-season standings BEFORE being seeded last.

SEC Success

Throughout the history of men's college basketball, the Southeastern Conference has captured 11 NCAA Championships and four NIT titles, putting the SEC as one of the nation's top basketball conferences.

During the 2006-07 academic year the Southeastern Conference became the first conference to win the Division I National Championship in Football (Florida), Men's Basketball (Florida) and Women's Basketball (Tennessee) in the same school year.

Only the SEC and the Big East have ever won both the men's and women's basketball titles in one season. SEC won both three times in 1996, 1998 and 2007. The Big East has won both twice in 2003 and 2004.

The SEC swept both the NIT and NCAA Tournaments in 2006 when Florida won its first NCAA championship and South Carolina earned its second straight NIT title. Only four conferences have won both the NIT and NCAA title, including the Big East (2003), ACC (1992) and Big Ten (1979).

- The SEC has won three of the last eight NCAA titles (2006-Florida, 2007-Florida, 2012 Kentucky). No other conference has won more than two NCAA titles during that stretch.

- The SEC recorded a .500 record or better against the other five major conferences in 2012. SEC teams posted a .700 (7-3) mark against Big 12 teams, .643 (9-5) against the ACC, .555 (5-4) against the Pac-12 and .500 (5-5) against the Big Ten.

- The SEC has won at least 68 percent of its non-conference games since the league expanded to 12 teams in 1991-92.

- In the 2012 NCAA Tournament, the SEC posted a 7-2 record against the other five major conferences.

- The SEC led all other conferences with 12 players selected in the 2012 NBA Draft, including eight that were selected in the first round.

- The top three picks in the 2012 NBA Draft played in the SEC: Kentucky's Anthony Davis (1st overall), Kentucky's Michael Kidd-Gilchrist (2nd overall) and Florida's Bradley Beal (3rd overall).

- Over the last six NBA Drafts, 42 SEC players have heard their names called.

- In 2012 Kentucky's Anthony Davis had one of the most prolific seasons in basketball history. He led the Wildcats to the national title, was named national player of the year, was the number one overall pick in the NBA Draft and was a member of the gold medal winning squad at the London Olympics.

- A total of eight SEC teams received postseason invitations in 2012. Four received NCAA Tournament bids (Alabama, Florida, Kentucky, and Vanderbilt) while four (LSU, Ole Miss, Mississippi State and Tennessee) were invited to play in the National Invitation Tournament.

- Kentucky is the all-time NCAA leader in wins with 2,090 and the Wildcats' 111 NCAA Tournament victories are the most in tournament history. UK's 52 NCAA Tournament appearances are the most in the nation.

- Kentucky's John Calipari is 38-13 (.745) in the NCAA Tournament. Florida's Billy Donovan is 28-10 (.737) in NCAA Tournament games.

- The SEC has won 11 NCAA men's basketball tournament titles with Kentucky claiming eight (1948, 1949, 1951, 1958, 1978, 1996, 1998 and 2012). Florida has two (2006, 2007) and Arkansas has one (1994).

- Since 1993, the SEC has won six men's basketball national championships – Arkansas (1994), Kentucky (1996), Kentucky (1998), Florida (2006), Florida (2007) and Kentucky (2012). Only the ACC (6) has won as many men's basketball titles during this time.

- Every team in the SEC has made at least one NCAA Tournament appearance in the last 10 editions of the NCAA Tournament.

- The SEC is 48-26 (64.9 percent) in the first round of the NCAA Tournament over the last 14 tournaments (since 1999). In 1999 the SEC won each of its six first round games, becoming the first conference to have six teams win their first round games in the same season.

- Each of the 126 conference games will be televised live as part of the SEC's historic 15-year agreements with CBS Sports and ESPN that began in 2009-10. Almost half of the SEC's league games will be distributed nationally with ESPN or ESPN2 televising 31 contests, ESPNU showing 18 and CBS Sports five. Additionally, nine games will be offered on ESPN3. The SEC's games on ESPN platforms are exclusively branded as the "SEC on ESPN."

Six On Wooden List

Six student-athletes from the Southeastern Conference were listed when the Los Angeles Athletic Club announced its Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 on Nov. 8. Kenny Boynton (Florida), Kentavious Caldwell-Pope (Georgia), Phil Pressey (Missouri), Jarnell Stokes (Tennessee), B.J. Young (Arkansas) and Patric Young (Florida) each made the preseason list. Transfers, freshmen and medical redshirts are not eligible for the Preseason Top 50. The players on the list are considered strong candidates for the midseason list and the official voting ballot, both of which are open to freshman and transfer students.

Nine On Naismith List

Nine players from the SEC highlight the 2012-2013 Naismith early season watch list, the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced on Nov. 13. Kenny Boynton (Florida), Michael Dixon, Jr. (Missouri), Archie Goodwin (Kentucky), Nerlens Noel (Kentucky), Alex Poythress (Kentucky), Phil Pressey (Missouri), Jarnell Stokes (Tennessee), BJ Young (Arkansas) and Patric Young (Florida) highlight the list. The 50-player watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2012-2013 college basketball season. The Naismith Men's College Player of the Year presented by AT&T will be awarded on April 7, 2013 in Atlanta.

SEC/Big East Challenge

The Southeastern Conference matched up against the Big East Conference for 12 games over three days in early December for the SEC/Big East Challenge. Six of the games will be played at SEC home arenas while six will be played at home facilities for Big East schools. ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU will combine to televise all 12 games of the three-day event.

First Round Success

The SEC is 48-26 (64.9 percent) in the first round of the NCAA Tournament over the last 14 tournaments (since 1999). In 1999 the SEC won each of its six first round games, becoming the first conference to have six teams win their first round games in the same season.

How Sweet It Is

The Southeastern Conference has had at least one team advance to the Sweet 16 in 22 of the last 23 years. The SEC record for most teams advancing to the Sweet 16 is four which was accomplished in 1986 (Alabama, Auburn, Kentucky, LSU) and in 1996 (Arkansas, Georgia, Kentucky, Mississippi State). Eleven of the SEC's 12 members have advanced to the Sweet 16 since 1996.

In the last 20 NCAA Tournaments (1993-2012), the SEC's 13 Final Four appearances are the second-most by any conference.

The SEC has had a total of five different teams to make the national semifinals, behind only the Big Ten and Big East's 's eight over the 20-year span.

SEC teams have made a total of 24 all-time appearances in the Final Four (29 including five appearances by Arkansas prior to joining the SEC).

SEC Second To None

During the 2006-07 academic year the Southeastern Conference became the first conference to win the Division I National Championship in Football (Florida), Men's Basketball (Florida) and Women's Basketball (Tennessee) in the same school year.

Only the SEC and the Big East have ever won both the men's and women's basketball titles in one season. SEC won both three times in 1996, 1998 and 2007. The Big East has won both twice in 2003 and 2004.

The SEC swept both the NIT and NCAA Tournaments in 2006 when Florida won its first NCAA championship and South Carolina earned its second straight NIT title. Only four conferences have won both the NIT and NCAA title, including the Big East (2003), ACC (1992) and Big Ten (1979)

Spreading The Wealth

Since the 1980-81 season, each of the 12 active SEC members has captured either an SEC divisional, overall or tournament title and 11 different schools have won or shared the SEC Championship since the league's inception in 1933.

After leading by eight points at the half, the Alabama men's basketball team used a dominating second period to pull away from the Mississippi State Bulldogs, finishing the game with a 32-point, 75-43 victory in Starkville, Miss. The victory was the largest win by an Alabama team in Humphrey Coliseum. Levi Randolph led the Tide with 18 points, which tied his career-best, followed closely by sophomore guard Rodney Cooper's 17 points. Sophomore forward Nick Jacobs recorded the Tide's first double-double of the year with career highs of 16 points and 11 rebounds, while sophomore guard Trevor Lacey chipped in 11 points and a game-high six assists. Leading scorer Trevor Releford did not play due to an injured ankle he suffered in practice earlier in the week. The contest was close until late in the first half, when the Tide began a run that put the game away. Trailing 19-18 with 7:36 left in the opening stanza, Alabama went on the 12-3 spurt to take a 30-22 lead into intermission. UA then opened the second half with 15-straight points on five three-point baskets, three of which came from Lacey. In all, the 27-3 run which spanned halftime lasted 11:25 and turned a 19-18 deficit into a 45-22 lead with 17:04 remaining in the game. The Tide finished the contest shooting 53.4 percent (31-of-58) from the floor and a season-best 61.5 percent (8-of-13) from beyond the arc. UA also controlled the boards with a 35-23 edge on the boards, including 13 offensive rebounds that resulted in a 13-2 edge in second chance points. Alabama was equally impressive on the defensive end of the floor, forcing 21 turnovers to own a big 25-11 advantage in points off turnovers. The Tide finished with a 12 steals and held the Bulldogs to 35.6 percent shooting from the field and 27.8 percent from beyond the three-point arc. Alabama returns home Saturday, Jan. 19 against Texas A&M.

With 26 seconds on the clock, sophomore guard BJ Young netted a three-point basket give the University of Arkansas basketball team a six-point lead as the Razorbacks caged the Auburn Tigers in double overtime with an 88-80 victory. The stiff competition had the 13,404 fans at Bud Walton Arena on their feet much of the night in a game that featured nine lead changes and two overtimes. Arkansas played in its first double overtime game in the SEC era with its last contest that lasted 50 minutes occurred on Feb. 24, 1987, when the Hogs defeated Texas A&M on the road, 100-97. Marshawn Powell recorded his second double-double of the season and the third for Arkansas this season when he netted 28 points, 11 rebounds and two assists. His point total moved him into 31st on Arkansas' all-time scoring list as he passed former Razorbacks Jerry Carlton and Eric Ferguson. In addition to Young's game-winner he had a stellar night grabbing 22 points off 8-of-16 shooting, six rebounds and five assists. Even though Arkansas played 50 minutes of basketball, the Razorbacks only turned the ball over an astonishing eight times. Five of Arkansas' turnovers came in the opening 20 minutes of play and the Hogs played the final 30 minutes with just three miscues. The Razorbacks were able to force Auburn into 19 turnovers that led to 20 Arkansas points. The Razorbacks hit the road to face Ole Miss in Oxford, Miss., this Saturday at 12:47 p.m.

Frankie Sullivan scored 23 of his 26 points after halftime and had a career-high nine rebounds but it wasn't enough as Auburn lost an 88-80 double overtime heartbreaker to Arkansas in Bud Walton Arena on Wednesday. Rob Chubb recorded his second consecutive double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds. Allen Payne drained a 3-pointer with five seconds left in regulation to send the game into overtime after Auburn hadn't scored since the 6:26 mark. The game was tied at 75 after the end of the first overtime as Sullivan's layup with 41 seconds left tied it. However, BJ Young's 3-pointer with 26.7 seconds left in the second overtime gave the Hogs an 84-78 lead and sealed the win. Auburn shot 50 percent from the floor for the game, including 44 percent from 3-point range. The Tigers went 8-of-12 behind the arc in the second period alone. The Tigers shot 7-of-17 from the foul line and outrebounded the Hogs 39-36. Auburn returns home to play host to Kentucky (11-5, 2-1 SEC) on Saturday at 8 pm Central at Auburn Arena.

The No. 11/9 University of Florida men's basketball team improved its record to 12-2 (2-0) after its first two conference games of the 2012-13 season. In its first SEC game of the year, Florida defeated Georgia 77-44 on Wednesday, January 9. It was the second-largest margin of victory in the history of the series. The team then handed LSU its first defeat at home this season, beating the Tigers, 74-52, on Saturday, January 12. Against the Bulldogs, redshirt senior Mike Rosario led the Gators in scoring with 19 points. Erik Murphy and Patric Young both had 11 points, as well. In his first start of the season, junior Casey Prather had 10 points and a career-best seven rebounds. In Baton Rouge, senior Kenny Boynton scored 20 points, nailing 4-of-8 from beyond the arc. Boynton also passed Erving Walker and Udonis Haslem on UF's all-time scoring list and now ranks third in school-history with 1,782 points. Junior Will Yeguede notched his third-career double-double against the Tigers with 10 points and a team-high 13 rebounds. In addition, Young had 14 points and Murphy had 12 points. This week, UF plays both SEC-newcomers, Texas A&M and Missouri. The Gators will first travel to College Station, Texas for its bout with the Aggies on Thursday, January 17. Then, the team will then host the nationally-ranked Tigers on Saturday, January 19 in the O'Connell Center.

Five Missouri players scored in double figures as No. 17 Missouri topped Georgia 79-62 Wednesday night at Mizzou Arena to deny the Bulldogs their first SEC victory. Senior guard Vincent Williams led the way for Georgia (6-10, 0-3) with a career-high 23 points and four rebounds. Sophomore guard Kentavious Caldwell-Pope also contributed 15 points. In the first half, Georgia weathered several Missouri (13-3, 2-1) runs and after trailing by as many as 14 points, closed the half on an 8-2 run to trail 38-30 at halftime. Georgia's Vincent Williams, who entered the game averaging just 4.1 points per game, led Georgia with 13 first-half points, including two three-pointers. Georgia shot 55 percent in the half, including 5-of-9 from distance. Missouri pulled away with a 15-6 run midway through the second half to extend its lead to 64-47 with just over six minutes remaining. The Tigers grabbed their largest lead of the game at 67-49 just a minute later with a pair of free throws from Missouri guard Keion Bell. Bell finished the game with 14 points and four assists. The Bulldogs committed 19 turnovers in the game, including 11 in the second half. Though the Tigers just outrebounded the Bulldogs 31-29, they outscored Georgia 32-12 in the paint. Georgia returns home to square off with LSU Saturday night at 8 p.m.

The first half continues to tell the tale for the Wildcats. UK is 11-0 this season when leading at halftime, 0-5 when trailing. Kentucky won the rebounding 34-30. UK is 9-2 this season when outrebounding the opponent. Willie Cauley-Stein had seven points and five rebounds. He has made 24 of 34 shots (70.6 percent) over the last seven games. Ryan Harrow notched 12 points and four assists. Harrow has scored double figures in seven-straight games and is averaging 15.6 over that stretch. Julius Mays had nine points, including the pair of crucial 3-pointers with the game hanging in the balance. With one assist and one turnover tonight, Mays has a 25-7 assist-turnover ratio over the last nine games. Nerlens Noel had another stat-stuffing line tonight with 12 points, nine rebounds, two assists, four blocked shots and four steals. He has at least six rebounds in every game this season. Noel has blocked at least one shot in every game this season and at least two rejections in eight-straight games and has made 37 of 51 shots (72.5 percent) in the last nine games. Alex Poythress totaled 10 points, including two-of-two 3-pointers, and eight rebounds - his 11th double-figure scoring game of the season. Kyle Wiltjer paced the Wildcats with 17 points, the fifth time this season he has led the team in scoring.

The Tigers lost an overtime game on Wednesday, 82-73, to South Carolina at home, sending LSU to 0-3 in the league. Anthony Hickey had 18 points to lead LSU and Charles Carmouche had 13. LSU is now 4-6 in overtime games over the last five years. The Tigers travel to Athens, Ga., for an 8 p.m. EST game on CSS and Cox Sports TV at Stegeman Coliseum in Georgia. The teams have split the last two years on their home floors. LSU remains the only team in the league averaging in double figure steals and Anthony Hickey continues to lead the league in steals average. LSU plays next at home on Wednesday night against Texas A&M on the SEC Network.

Ole Miss puts the SEC's longest current win streak on the line when it hosts the Arkansas Razorbacks in Oxford. The Rebels are looking for their first 4-0 start in the SEC since 1936-37, when Ole Miss started league play with five-straight wins. A win would also give Ole Miss its best start since starting the 2007-08 season 15-1. The Rebels' are 3-0 in league play for the first time since 2005-06. Ole Miss' win over No. 10 Missouri was the Rebels' first victory over a top-10 foe since knocking off No. 10 Kentucky in 2011. The Rebels earned victories at Tennessee and at Vanderbilt in the same season for the first time since 1980. Senior F Murphy Holloway pulled down eight boards at Vanderbilt and continues to inch towards the top of the Ole Miss rebound list with 913 career boards. The senior now only trails Walter Actwood's school record of 945 career boards. After a 26-point outburst at Vanderbilt, junior G Marshall Henderson leads the SEC in scoring at 19.1 ppg and ranks sixth in the nation averaging 3.8 made 3-pointers per game. Head coach Andy Kennedy (139) is just five wins away from tying B.L. Graham (144) for the most wins in Ole Miss history. Kennedy's record at Ole Miss is 139-80 in seven season, while Graham posted a 144-168 mark over 13 season as head coach. After picking up a pair of its first win at Vanderbilt since 2001, Ole Miss is seeking its first 4-0 start in the SEC since 1936-37, when the Rebels started league play with five-straight wins. A win would also give the Rebels their best start since beginning the 2007-08 season 15-1.

South Carolina suffered two losses in SEC play last week, the first a 56-54 decision at Mississippi State on Wednesday in the league lidlifter for both schools. The Gamecocks struggled offensively in the contest, hitting just 39.2 percent (20-51) from the field, a near season worst in the category. Junior guard Brian Richardson posted career highs in several categories vs. Mississippi State, including posting a career best 20 points to lead the Gamecocks in the contest. Richardson is enjoying a career year in 2012-13, posting 9.0 points and 3.0 rebounds per contest. Carolina's 24 turnovers at Mississippi State on Wednesday marked the second-most in a game this season for the Gamecocks (25 vs. Missouri State). The Gamecocks returned to Colonial Life Arena on Saturday to host Auburn in the SEC home opener on Saturday. The contest was a back-and-forth battle with 27 lead changes and the score tied 13 times. Junior guard Bruce Ellington posted a team best 18 points in the game, dishing five assists against just two turnovers in a season high 36 minutes on the court. Sophomore guard Damien Leonard was stellar in the game, posting 17 points, hitting 6-of-9 from the field, including 5-of-8 from 3-point range. Leonard was the high bench scorer for Carolina in the contest. Auburn posted the highest field goal percentage at 58.5 percent (24-41) of any South Carolina opponent this season. The Gamecocks continue league play at LSU on Wednesday, before welcoming Vanderbilt to Columbia on Saturday for the weekend contest.

Tennessee came up short in its bid for the Vols first win at Rupp Arena since 2006 as Kentucky captured a 75-65 victory on Tuesday night. Tennessee fell to 0-3 in the SEC and 8-7 overall, losing for the fourth game in a row. Jordan McRae led the Vols in scoring for the fourth game in a row with 23 as he is averaging 24.0 over the last four games. He became the first Vol since Chris Lofton with four consecutive games of 20 points or more. Lofton, who sat behind the Vols bench on Tuesday, did it in five games in a row in Jan.-Feb. 2008. The Vols were in foul trouble all night as both Yemi Makanjuola and Jarnell Stokes fouled out after combining for just six points and eight rebounds in only 27 total minutes. The Vols shot 56 percent in the first half, but did not attempt a free throw. The Vols return home to host Mississippi State on Saturday at 4 p.m.

The Aggies won back-to-back league games to kick off SEC play last week, defeating Arkansas 69-51 in College Station on Wednesday before notching a 83-71 victory over defending national champion Kentucky at Rupp Arena on Saturday. The 83 points during the win at UK were the most for the Aggies in a conference game since a 91-89 overtime victory over Missouri on Jan. 15, 2011. It was also the most points in a road conference game since Texas A&M scored 86 in an overtime loss at Texas in 2007. Senior guard Elston Turner put together one of Aggie basketball's most impressive individual performances during the win at UK, scoring 40 points on 16-of-19 shooting. Turner was selected as ESPN.com's National Player of the Week for the performance which was the first 40-point game by an Aggie since Don Marbury against Baylor on Jan. 5, 1985. He also became just the third opponent to score 40 or more points against the Wildcats at Rupp Arena, joining Chris Jackson of LSU, who scored 41 against UK on Feb. 15, 1990, and David Robinson of Navy, who holds the record with 45 points at Rupp Arena on Jan. 25, 1985. The Aggies, who struggled rebounding during non-conference play, have held the edge on the boards in each of their first two conference games by a combined margin of 86-57. Redshirt sophomore Kourtney Roberson has been a big part of the rebounding revival, notching his first career double-double against Arkansas with 13 points and a career-high-tying 12 boards. The Arcadia, La., native narrowly missed a second straight double-double, finishing with 10 points and nine rebounds at Kentucky. The Aggie will gun for their first victory over a ranked-opponent on Thursday when they host nationally-ranked Florida at Reed Arena.

The Commodores suffered an 89-79 overtime loss to Ole Miss Tuesday night at Memorial Gym. The loss snaps a five-game winning streak versus the Rebels. Vanderbilt made a three-pointer for the 847th game in a row, which ranks second in the nation behind UNLV. VU has made a three in every game since the line's inception in the 1986-87 season. Vanderbilt made 12 three-pointers (12-of-20) in the first half, which was a season-high for a single half, and set a new Memorial Gym record with 17 made three-point field goals (17-of-40). It is the most three-pointers in a game since Vanderbilt made 15 versus Lafayette in 2011. The previous Memorial Gym record was 16, and it happened twice (16, Vanderbilt vs. South Carolina, 1/9/94; Vanderbilt vs. Arkansas, 2/11/95). The 40 three-point attempts set a new school and Memorial Gym record for most attempts in a single game. The previous mark was 38 set versus Mississippi State in an overtime game 2008. Both teams combined to shoot 58 three-pointers, which was two off the Memorial Gym record. The Commodores came up one three-pointer short of tying the school record for most three-pointers made in a single game (18 at Tennessee, 1/18/05). Four different Commodores finished in double-figures (Bright, Jeter, Johnson and Parker). It is the second time this season at least four players reached double-digits in a single game. Vanderbilt dished out 20 assists as a team, which is a season-high. Sheldon Jeter and Dai-Jon Parker made their first career starts versus Ole Miss. Jeter scored 13 points, which marks the second-time he has reached double-figures on the season. Jeter tied a career-high with two assists. Kedren Johnson recorded a career-high eight assists. Johnson led the Commodores with 19 points. He has scored in double-figures in 12-of-16 games this season. Johnson set a new career-high with five made three-point field goals on a career-high 11 attempts. Dai-Jon Parker scored a career-high 16 points and dished out a career-high four assists. Vanderbilt heads to South Carolina this Saturday for a 12:30 p.m. CT tip.
