SEC Women’s Basketball Tournament



Beginning with its inception and through 1986, the tournament was held at campus sites. The tournament was then sent to Albany, Ga., which served as the site for six years from 1987-92. The tournament then moved to Chattanooga, Tenn., where it was held from 1993-2000, with the exception of 1998 when the tournament moved to Columbus, Ga.

Since 2001 the tournament has enjoyed many sites, including Memphis (2001), Nashville (2002, 2004, 2008, 2011, 2012), Little Rock, Ark. (2003, 2006, 2009, 2015), Greenville, S.C. (2005) and Duluth, Ga. (2007, 2010, 2013, 2014).

SEC Tournament Tie-Breaker Procedures

Teams will be seeded No. 1 through No. 14 in the SEC Women’s Basketball Tournament bracket based upon the final regular season Conference standings. Teams that finished No. 1 through No. 4 in the final regular season standings shall receive a “bye” on the first and second days of the SEC Women’s Basketball Tournament.

1. Two-Team Tie. The following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken:

- A. Won-lost results of head-to-head competition between the two teams.
- B. Won-lost record of the two teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary).
- C. Coin flip by the Commissioner.

2. Three-Team Tie (or more). When three or more teams are tied, the following procedure will be used in the following order until the tie is broken. If two teams remain tied after a tiebreaker provision, the two-team tiebreaker formula will be used.

- A. Best winning percentage of games played among the tied teams (Example: Team A is 3-1, Team B is 2-2 and Team C is 1-3 – Team A would be seeded highest, Team B second-highest and Team C lowest of the three).
- B. Best winning percentage of the tied teams versus the No. 1 seed (and proceeding through the No. 14 seed, if necessary).
- C. If two teams remain, coin flip by the Commissioner.
- D. If three or more teams remain, draw by the Commissioner.

The Bulldogs won the game 64-62 behind a game-winning step-back jumper from freshman Morgan William. It was two of an SEC-high 14 points for William. The win was No. 20 for the Bulldogs, who have now claimed back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time since 2008-09 and 2009-10. MSU also improved to 5-2 in SEC play, the best league start since 2002-03. Sophomore Breanna Richardson sparked the Bulldogs with 16 points. That total matched this season's SEC high for her. Senior Martha Alwal also had her best league outing of the year, scoring 14 points in her first start of the season. Alwal also added a pair of blocked shots to move two back of sixth in SEC career history with 295. State played stellar defense again Thursday, holding the Rebels to 35.9 percent from the field, including 26.5 percent in the second half. MSU stays on the road Monday, taking on Auburn on the SEC Network. The Bulldogs return home for the season's second meeting against Vanderbilt before traveling to Knoxville to meet Tennessee on Sunday.

Morgan Batey scored a team-high 14 points for the Commodores, who have won four of their past five games. Kea added 11 points and a team-high seven rebounds. Ashley Williams led Alabama with 12 points. In the win over Arkansas on Thursday night, Vanderbilt held the Razorbacks without a field goal over the final 12:26 of the second half. Vanderbilt (11-8, 2-4) closed the game on a 20-7 run to overcome an 11-point deficit against the Razorbacks (11-7, 1-5), who missed their final 18 field goal attempts of the game. Vanderbilt, which trailed 32-23 at the half, improved to 8-2 at home. Rachel Bell and Kristen Gaffney finished with 11 points each for the Commodores, who did not attempt a 3-pointer in the second half. Kelcey Brooks, the SEC's leading scorer, had a game-high 20 points for the Razorbacks. Freshman Audrey-Ann Caron-Goudreau finished with five blocked shots. She is the first Vanderbilt player to block five or more shots in a game since Liz Sherwood had six against LSU on Jan. 10, 2008. Gaffney came off the bench to play a pivotal role for the Commodores, going 5-of-8 from the floor. In addition to her 11 points, she filled out her stat line with four rebounds, three assists, two blocks, one steal.
