**“War Eagle”**

Auburn’s battle cry, not Auburn’s nickname. There are several legends concerning the origin of the War Eagle battle cry, dating back to 1864 and the Civil War at the Battle of the Wilderness in Virginia.

For over 100 years, eagles have been associated with Auburn University’s football program. From a static presence on the sidelines to rousing flights over the field, WAR EAGLE has become an Auburn icon.

The role of Auburn University’s eagles is to promote wildlife conservation as a part of the education initiatives of the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service and the College of Veterinary Medicine’s Southeastern Raptor Center. The USF&WS permits the Raptor Center to house eagles and use them on hundreds of educational presentations each year – including Auburn’s home football games. Currently, three flighted eagles and numerous other non-releasable raptors are used for these educational programs. Eagles stir emotions in many people as they have come to symbolize strength, power and courage as well as other important values such as freedom, American heritage and the preservation of our environment. Golden Eagles Tiger (War Eagle VI), Nova (War Eagle VII) and Spirit (a Bald Eagle) are the eagles who have inspired football fans with their graceful flights over Jordan-Hare Stadium.

# AUBURN UNIVERSITY

Auburn's beautiful main campus--graced by greenery and open spaces and highlighted by historic Samford Park--is made up of 375 buildings spread across 1,875 acres. Buildings in the main campus area are within walking distance of each other. Residence halls are only a short walk from classrooms, dining and athletic facilities. Auburn is located in the Southeastern United States in east-central Alabama about 30 miles from the Georgia border.

- *U.S. News and World Report* has ranked Auburn among the top 50 public universities for 18 consecutive years. Auburn is ranked a "Best Value" by the Princeton Review.

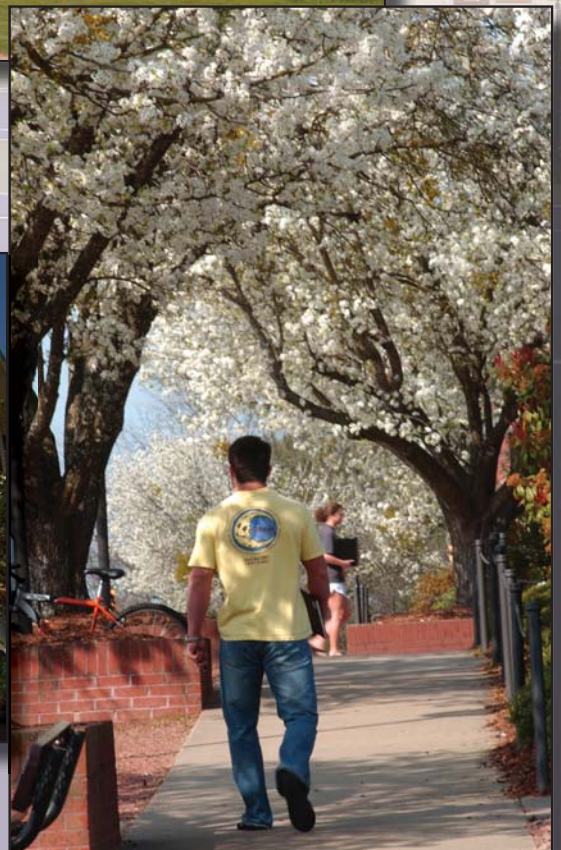
- AU invests in extensive national assessments to obtain quality, data-driven information for measuring and continually improving instruction and student preparation.

- More than 92 percent of our students and more than 95 percent of our alumni say that if they could start college over again, they would choose Auburn.

- A 2005 Harvard survey ranked AU as one of the top six colleges and universities in the country as a place for young faculty to work, which has a lot to do with actively engaging students.

- AU is the only university in the country to offer an undergraduate degree in wireless engineering, and the first in the Southeast to offer degrees in software engineering.

- AU Libraries maintains the largest library in the state, with 3.2 million volumes in its collection. The library subscribes to more than 9,000 journals and 250 electronic databases, provides library instruction and tours to students, prospective students and parents, and serves as an instructional resource for faculty.

## **Auburn People**

Auburn faculty and alumni are world-class achievers in practically every arena. Here are just a few examples:

- AU has graduated more than 232,658 students since it began in 1856. Currently, we have 210,472 alumni living around the world.
- There are 98 Auburn clubs around the country whose primary goal is to raise scholarships for incoming freshmen. The Auburn Alumni Association and Auburn Club Program awarded a total of 188 scholarships for the 2011-12 school year. Two clubs have endowments of more than \$100,000 and the Alumni Association Endowment stands at more than \$2.7 million.
- The Student Alumni Association, with membership of over 3,400 students, offers three student scholarships for its rising senior members.
- The Auburn Alumni Association has more than 46,000 members and contributes more than \$95,000 each year toward professorships and other faculty awards.

One of the state's fastest growing cities, Auburn has a population of about 57,000. An adjacent twin-city, Opelika, has a population of about 30,000. Atlanta, Ga., is only 100 miles to the northeast via Interstate 85; Birmingham is 100 miles to the north via U.S. 280 or I-85/65; Montgomery is 50 miles to the southeast via I-85; and the Gulf beaches are about 200 miles away. The university enjoys the advantages of security, seclusion and clean air and water. Auburn is a clean city with a mild climate that offers many cultural opportunities



### Charlotte G. Lowder Student Athlete Development Center

The Charlotte G. Lowder Student Athlete Development Center, with 33,000 square feet of dedicated space to students and learning, gives Auburn University the physical infrastructure that allows the ability to implement and expand the array of programs designed to enhance the academic performance of Auburn student-athletes. Located adjacent to the Auburn Athletic Complex, the facility is centrally located for easy access for all Tiger athletic teams.

The goals of the Charlotte G. Lowder Student Athlete Development Center are to create an opportunity for one-stop learning for all services including academic counseling, life skills, and tutorial services; to utilize the technology available to support academic missions; and to create a showplace that honors achievements of student-athletes. In addition, programs are designed to develop leadership skills and a strong altruistic attitude, which are fundamental characteristics of the Auburn graduate.

Within the walls of the center are the Academic Hall of Honor designed by Auburn student-athletes, two "smart" classrooms with new and innovative technology that hold 50 people per room, seven counselor offices as well as administrative support, the PAW (Promoting Academic Winners) office, Operation Follow-Through, the Student Athletic Advisory Committee office, 40 four-person tutorial rooms, a library resource area, a soft-study lounge, a 25-station computer classroom, the student "Cantina" for snacks and beverages and the tutor coordinator office.

The construction of the Student Athlete Development Center was made possible by the generosity of Robert and Charlotte Lowder and from the Lowder Family Foundation. Student-Athlete Support Services

The Tiger CHAMPS/Life Skills program focuses on five commitments that the NCAA has specified as necessary to a holistic approach to student development programming. Auburn University is committed to the growth and development of its student-athletes by promoting the following areas:

## ATHLETIC ADMINISTRATION



### Jay GOGUE

President

Jay Gogue began his tenure as Auburn University's 18th president on July 16, 2007.

The Waycross, Ga., native is a two-time Auburn graduate in horticulture, receiving a bachelor's degree in 1969 and a master's in 1971. In 1973, he earned a doctorate in horticulture from Michigan State University.

Shortly after returning to his alma mater, Gogue engaged the talent and insight of the Auburn family toward development of a dynamic and forward-looking strategic plan to guide the University for the future. Students, alumni, employees, business leaders and other stakeholders contributed to a roadmap that will strengthen Auburn's academic, research and outreach mission, improve operational efficiency and develop human capital.

Gogue arrived at Auburn with ample experience in the top ranks of academia. He was selected president of New Mexico State University in 2000 and, in 2003, named president of the University of Houston and chancellor of the University of Houston System.

Gogue worked for the National Park Service from 1973 to 1986, rising to the position of chief administrative scientist for several regions of the U.S. Park system. He began his distinguished career in higher education administration in 1986 as associate director of the Office of University Research at Clemson University, where he also served as vice president for research and vice president/vice provost for agriculture and natural resources. Utah State University selected Gogue as provost in 1995.

Gogue met his wife, Susie, in the 8th grade, and they married during their undergraduate years at Auburn. Susie also earned two Auburn degrees. They are the proud parents of three children and have one grandchild.

He is a member of Phi Kappa Phi and Golden Key honor societies, Sigma Chi Fraternity, Sigma Xi scientific research society and the National Society of Scabbard and Blade, the honorary military society for all branches of service. Gogue previously served as an accreditation reviewer for the Pacific Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges.



### Jay JACOBS

Athletics Director

Auburn Director of Athletics Jay Jacobs has a vision of leading Auburn Athletics to becoming the nation's preeminent Athletics Department.

In his tenure at the helm of the Tigers' program, the department has prospered athletically, academically and financially.

Under Jacobs' leadership, Auburn Athletics has made major strides benefiting Auburn student-athletes, coaches and fans. The department has focused on five strategic goals under his leadership: Winning, graduating student-athletes, managing the department's fiscal affairs, complying with SEC and NCAA rules and providing a professional game day experience.

The Auburn Athletics Department has consistently ranked in the top 10 percent of the NACDA Directors Cup and has claimed eight national championships under Jacobs, including a school-record four titles in 2005-06, along with 14 Southeastern Conference titles.

Academically, Auburn has earned five public recognitions by the NCAA for scoring in the 90th-100th percentile nationally in the Academic Progress Rate (APR).

Jacobs served as the Senior Associate Athletics Director for Tiger Unlimited prior to his appointment as Director of Athletics and has initiated several successful business ventures for the Athletics Department, including a five-year contract with Under Armour Performance Apparel and nine-year extension with multi-media rights holder ISP Sports.

During Jacobs' tenure, Auburn has also moved forward with numerous facility projects designed to benefit Tiger athletic programs and their fans, most notably, the construction of the \$92.5 million state-of-the-art basketball arena and practice facility that will open prior to the 2010-11 season.

Jacobs was named Auburn's 14th Director of Athletics on Dec. 22, 2004, after working in almost every area of the Auburn Athletics Department for the previous 20 years.

Jacobs earned his undergraduate and master's degrees in business administration from Auburn in 1985 and 1988, respectively, and was a member of the Auburn football team, earning two letters as an offensive tackle in 1982 and 1983.

He is married to the former Angie Sapp of Dublin, Ga. The couple has three daughters, Haley, Meagan and Jayne.

# ERIC SHORE

HEAD COACH / 22ND YEAR / FRANCIS MARION ('84)

Eric Shore, Auburn's all-time winningest men's tennis coach, enters his 22nd season on the Plains during the 2011-12 season. After posting a 16-10 record in 2011, Shore now holds a 287-231 career record at Auburn for a .566 winning percentage.

Since beginning his Auburn coaching career before the 1991 season, Shore has established Auburn as one of the top programs in the country, averaging nearly 14 wins per season with 17 NCAA Tournament appearances.

Shore became the all-time winningest men's tennis coach in Auburn history on Feb. 5, 2005 as he guided his squad to a victory over Samford to capture win No. 193. Shore passed former head coach Hugh Thomson's 192 career wins as the latter was head coach from 1982-1990.

Since coming to Auburn in 1990, Shore has guided the Tigers to five top-15 finishes and 17 NCAA tournament appearances in the last 18 years, including three Sweet 16 appearances and two top-eight appearances.

Under Shore's guidance, the Tigers have had 18 All-America selections and 29 All-SEC honorees. In addition, 31 Tigers have participated in the NCAA Singles and Doubles Championships since Shore came to Auburn.

At the 2005 Wimbledon Championships, former Auburn great and Shore-coached Stephen Huss rewrote history, along with partner Wesley Moodie, by becoming the first qualifiers ever to capture the Gentlemen's Doubles Title. Huss also became the first Auburn tennis player ever to win a Wimbledon title.

Last season, the Tigers clinched their 12th straight NCAA Tournament berth and opened the championships with a 4-1 win over UNC Wilmington. Auburn fell in the second round to No. 6 Georgia, 4-0. Tim Puetz and Daniel Cochrane advanced to the second round of the NCAA Doubles Tournament, and Puetz was selected for the NCAA singles draw. Puetz and Cochrane finished the season as the No. 13 pair in the ITA rankings, ending the year with a 15-8 record.

The 2002 season proved to be one of many successes as Shore led the doubles team of Andrew Colombo and Mark Kovacs to the NCAA title. The duo went on to earn the honor of ITA Doubles Team of the Year. In the same season, the team advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championships for the third time in school

history, defeating East Tennessee State, Mississippi State and Washington before falling to #4 UCLA in the quarterfinal round. Shore also led the Tigers to the quarters in 1998, defeating Illinois in the Sweet 16.

In addition to the many honors Shore's athletes have earned, he has also coached 24 players ranked in the final top 50 season rankings, including 16 ranked in the top-25 in singles and doubles.

A native of Ottawa, Ontario, Canada, Shore graduated from Francis Marion College in Florence, S.C., in 1984 with a Bachelor of Science degree in psychology. While at Francis Marion, Shore finished his playing career ranked 20th nationally in NAIA singles.

Immediately after graduation, Shore was employed as the assistant tennis pro at the Scarsdale Golf Club in Hartsdale, N.Y. After leaving New York, he returned to South Carolina to coach the men's and women's tennis teams at Francis Marion and worked as an assistant pro at the Florence Country Club.

In 1985, Shore took over as assistant coach at the University of South Carolina and was instrumental in helping the Gamecocks achieve a top-five national ranking in 1989. While at South Carolina, he earned a master's degree in physical education in 1990. Shore also served as coordinator of the United States Tennis Association Boys' National Intersectional Team Championships.

Shore and his wife, Ann, have two daughters, Brooke (16) and Francie (10).

# GABOR PELVA

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH / SEVENTH YEAR / AUBURN ('05)

Gabor Zoltan Pelva enters his seventh season as an assistant coach with the Auburn men's tennis team.

Pelva is in his 10th year overall with the Tigers, including his three stellar seasons as a player. In his six previous years as part of the men's tennis coaching staff, Pelva has helped the Tigers to an 82-68 record and six NCAA Tournament appearances.

Pelva, a Novi Sad, Serbia, native, finished his career at Auburn as a two-time All-American and a two-time first team All-SEC selection with a 65-31 career singles and 59-44 career doubles record.

In 2004 he was ranked as high as sixth in singles and fourth in doubles by ITA and finished the season as a NCAA singles semi-finalist - the highest finish ever for an Auburn men's tennis player. Pelva's No. 6 singles ranking was also the highest individual ranking ever for an Auburn tennis player.

He also won the Arizona State Thunderbird Invitational twice during his time at Auburn. The first was in 2003, in the singles draw, and the second coming the following year in doubles along with Robbert Lathouwers.

Although one of Auburn's most outstanding players, Pelva is no stranger to the leadership role as he represented the team in both 2004 and 2005 as captain. He also served his coach in Serbia as both a player and assistant.

Now as a coach for Auburn, Pelva is living a dream that began when he was a teenager.

"At 16, I was plagued with injuries that kept me out for the crucial years that I needed to cross over into professional tennis," said Pelva. "However, college was a perfect fit for me where I thrived as a student and as an athlete. I loved the college matches and the team atmosphere, and now as a coach, I feel I have one of the best jobs I can ask for."

As an assistant for the Tigers, Pelva is in charge of conditioning along with strength trainer Damon Davis. He also assists Shore with practice plans, general match decisions and recruiting.

"He has made a good transition from being a great player to being a coach," said Shore. "He has been working well with the guys technically and he brings a lot to the team. I am looking forward to working with him for a while."

Pelva graduated from Auburn in 2005 with a Bachelor of Science in exercise science and completed his master's degree in 2008 in exercise science and sport management. He also speaks four languages: Serbian, Hungarian, German and English, and has won four Yugoslavian national titles.





# CITY OF AUBURN/AUBURN UNIVERSITY YARBROUGH TENNIS CENTER



In 2005, Auburn University set out to make its men's and women's tennis teams two of the best programs in the country, starting with a state-of-the-art facility.

As one of the best facilities in the Southeastern Conference, Auburn hosted the 2008 SEC Women's Tennis Championships and the men's tournament in 2009.

In August of 2006 construction began on Auburn's new facility. On Nov. 2, 2007, the City of Auburn/Auburn University Yarbrough Tennis Center was dedicated and opened as a new phase in Auburn tennis.

The City of Auburn/Auburn University Yarbrough Tennis Center replaces the Luther Young Tennis Complex, Auburn's tennis home since 1978.

The facility has 33,314-square feet of indoor space with six indoor courts, 12 outdoor courts with stadium seating and 16 clay courts. The Yarbrough Tennis Center also houses a pro shop, men's and women's locker rooms, concessions and a meeting area. All 12 courts are world-class lighted courts used for both competition and practice by the Auburn tennis teams.

"This outstanding facility is a result of the hard work and dedication of numerous people from the City of Auburn and Auburn University," said Auburn Athletics Director Jay Jacobs. "One of the finest tennis facilities in the Southeastern Conference, the Yarbrough Tennis Center will be a tremendous asset for the men's and women's tennis programs at Auburn for years to come."
