Hasina Muhammad • Auburn
 Sophomore • Guard • Memphis, Tenn.

- Muhammad led Auburn to a 2-0 record last week with a road win at George Washington (69-59) and a home win over Temple (71-49).
- She led Auburn in scoring (18.5 ppg), rebounding (8.0 rpg), steals (7.0 spg) and blocks (2.5 bpg) per game over the two games
- At GW, she notched her first career double-double with 21 points and 10 rebounds while finishing a steal away from a triple-double as she picked up nine steals.
- Her 10 rebounds and nine steals set new career highs.
- Muhammad's nine steals are the most in the SEC this season and rank fourth all-time in single-game steals at Auburn.
- She returned against Temple for 16 points, six rebounds, six assists, five steals and three blocks
- The six assists were a career-high and the three blocks a season-high
- Muhammad has scored in double figures in all 10 games this season and in the 20s in four

Co-Freshmen of the Week

Sherise Williams • Mississippi State
 Forward • St. Louis, Mo.

- Williams scored a personal-best 21 points to lead Mississippi State to a 67-57 win against Florida A&M.
- Also hauled in seven rebounds and blocked three of the Bulldogs' five shots in the contest.
- Her three swats in Sunday's game moved her into fourth in the league in blocked shots with 1.8 per game.
- Williams has been the Bulldogs' top scorer the past four contests, averaging 13.8 ppg.

Maddie Stock • Missouri
 Guard • Town & Country, Mo.

- Stock scored 16 straight points in the second half for the Tigers as she finished with a career-best 22 on the day.
- She has now reached double-digits in two straight games and four times this season and has reset her career-high in each of the last two games.
- She shot .889 (8-for-9) including a three-point percentage of 85.7 (6-for-7).
- Also had four rebounds, two assists and two steals in the contest.

TEAM NOTES: The Vanderbilt women's basketball team (8-3) ran its winning streak to five games with a 76-63 upset at No. 12/13 Oklahoma on Sunday, December 16. The Commodores placed four in double-figures, led by 17 points from junior guard Christina Foggie. Senior forward Tiffany Clarke contributed 16 points and eight rebounds, while junior Jasmine Lister added 16 points and nine assists. Sophomore guard Kady Schranz scored 11 points. Senior Elan Brown added five rebounds and four steals. Freshman Heather Bowe contributed six points and seven rebounds, while senior guard Gabby Smith scored six off the bench. As a team, Vanderbilt forced 20 Oklahoma turnovers and scored 23 points off those miscues, while the Commodores picked up a season-best 12 steals. It marked the first road win over a top-15 opponent since 2008, when Vanderbilt won at No. 14 Georgia, 61-54, on February 3. Foggie and Clarke have emerged to form one of the top duos in the SEC. Clarke is averaging 15.1 points per game, sixth in the conference, while Foggie's 14.5 points per game rank seventh in the league. Next up, Vanderbilt hosts the College of Charleston on Saturday, December 22.
