AUBURN-MISSOURI STATE SERIES

This is the first meeting between Auburn and Missouri State.

JEFF LEBO vs. MISSOURI STATE

This is the first time Jeff Lebo has faced Missouri State as a head coach, assistant coach or player.

JEFF LEBO vs. CUONZO MARTIN

This is the first time Auburn's Jeff Lebo and Missouri State's Cuonzo Martin have coached against each other.

TIGERS IN SEASON OPENERS

Auburn has a 71-31 (.696) record in season openers, including a 50-8 mark at home, 12-17 on the road, 4-3 at neutral sites and 5-3 in non-recorded sites. The Tigers have won 25 of their last 30 openers.

Auburn had won nine-straight season openers prior to losing at Tulane 77-62 last season.

JEFF LEBO IN SEASON OPENERS

Auburn's Jeff Lebo has a 6-4 record in season openers, including a 3-1 mark at Auburn. The Tigers lost at Tulane 77-62 in last year's opener, defeated Troy 71-68 in the 2006-07 season opener, defeated NIT-bound Lipscomb 69-54 in the 2005-

06 season opener and upset Temple in Philadelphia 80-78 four years ago.

Two of Lebo's four season-opening losses have come at sixth-ranked Kansas (Kansas 90, UTC 76) in 2003-04 and at Tennessee (Tennessee 72, Tennessee Tech 63) in 2001-02. One of his best season-opening wins came when he was at the Tennessee Tech helm in a 73-67 upset at South Carolina.

Auburn's last game against a team from the Missouri Valley came in No. 22 Auburn's 72-69 victory over Creighton in the NCAA Tournament first round on Mar. 16, 2000, in the Metrodome in Minneapolis, Minn.

Missouri State is the first of two Missouri Valley opponents for the Tigers this year along with Northern Iowa in the Chicago Invitational on Nov. 29.

T(R)AY WALLER

Junior Tay Waller scored a game-high 27 points in only 21 minutes on 7-of-12 shooting from 3-point range in Auburn's exhibition victory over Morehouse College Nov. 7. The Manchester, Ga., native went 10-of-16 from the field and had three assists and two steals.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE TEZ

Tez Robertson totaled 19 points, 10 rebounds, five assists and two steals vs. Morehouse College. The Cincinnati, Ohio, native was perfect on all four 3-point attempts while making 6-of-7 shots from the field.

NEWCOMERS SHINE

In addition to Tay Waller's dazzling outing against Morehouse, four other Tiger newcomers had impressive debuts. Junior college transfer Johnnie Lett started and totaled eight points and 10 rebounds in 23 minutes while fellow JC transfer

BARRETT 26th IN CAREER SCORING

Senior Rasheem Barrett now has 1,069 career points and is 25th in all-time scoring at Auburn.

He is one point shy of Derrick Dennison for 24th, six points behind Bubba Price for 23rd, 18 points short of Bryant Smith for 22nd and 36 points away from Lance Weems for 21st.

TEZ DISPENSER

Junior Quantez Robertson led the SEC with 37.5 minutes played, ranked second in the SEC in assist/turnover ratio (2.30,

game vs. Towson and missed the rest of last season. He didn't play the minimum number of games to be eligible for the NCAA stats.

VOT IN THE SEC RANKINGS

Junior Korvotney Barber was leading the SEC shooting 72.0 percent from the field (59-of-82) last season. He would have led the league last year when he shot 60.7 percent but did not have enough attempts.

Auburn 98, Morehouse College 50 (Nov. 7, 2008, in Auburn, Ala.)

Tay Waller scored a game-high 27 points in only 21 minutes to lead Auburn to a 98-50 exhibition victory over Morehouse College in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum last Friday. Waller made 7-of-12 shots from 3-point range as part of 10-of-16 shooting from the field while not playing the final 12:18 of the game. Quantez Robertson added 19 points making all four 3-pointers attempted, and had 10 rebounds and 5 assists in 31 minutes. DeWayne Reed had 14 points in 18 minutes, Johnnie Lett 8 points and

28th nationally), second in steals (2.10, 35th nationally) and eighth in assists (4.07).

The Cincinnati, Ohio, native scored a season-high 16 points on 6-of-8 shooting from the field vs. Mississippi State Feb. 9. He also had five rebounds and four steals.

10 rebounds and Brendon Knox 7 points and 7 boards. Auburn led by as much as 51 on two occasions at 92-41 on a conventional Jake Drum three-point play with 3:56 left and then on a Drum layup for a 94-43 lead with 2:52 left. The Tigers pulled away in the final five minutes of the first half as they increased a 24-15 lead to as much as 46-19 before settling for a 46-22 halftime edge. Waller scored 18 of his 27 points in the first half in 13 minutes on 4-of-7 three-point shooting and 7-of-10 shooting from the field. Auburn led 71-31 with 13:29 left in the game and the lead never dipped below 40 points the rest of the way. For the game, Auburn shot 51 percent from the field (39-of-76) and 46 percent from 3-point range (15-of-33) but was poor from the foul line shooting 36 percent (5-of-14). Morehouse College was led by Kenney Boyd's 21 points and 10 rebounds as the Maroon Tigers were held to 36 percent shooting from the field, 22 percent from 3-point range and were outrebounded 47-35.

down there when Wisconsin was No. 7 in the country at the point down in South Padre Island. They can really shoot it. They are tough. They have had some injury problems to date, and they are missing some guys. They can shoot it from a lot of different spots. They can defend. They are well-coached, and they have a new coach. It is always scary when you have a new coach, and you don't have a lot of film on the other team because you don't really know exactly what they are going to do. It is really scary from a coaching standpoint of knowing their personnel because they have some freshmen and also with a new coach on how they are going to play."

(Are your players ready to play a regular season game?)

"They are ready. It is a long haul when you only have one exhibition game. We have had 22-23 practices and are ready to bang against somebody else and ready

for the games to start."

(On Auburn's tempo)

"We are going to try to play fast. We are going to try to extend defensively. Offensively, we always try to utilize the three and take the first good shot that comes around. They are very good defensively so that first good one may take a little bit of time. We like to play fast. We like to score points. We like to run up and down and extend their defense a little bit. We don't have everything in for the first game, but we will try to start out like we have done in the past and play pretty fast. When we get healthy, I think we will have good depth in the backcourt especially so I think that is where I think we will have a little bit of advantage."

(How do you gameplan against a new coach?)

"You kind of look at his background and where he came from. He came from Pur-

due so you kind of study them a little bit and see what they have done in the past. We do have an exhibition game so typically in those exhibition games coaches try to keep things close to the vest a little bit and not try to show a whole lot. It's difficult in those first couple of games really. We have another one against Mercer with a new coach that is coming up right after that that you are a little concerned about because so early in the season, you are not prepared for everything that you can possibly see - different zones, different fullcourt presses, different things like that that you are not ready for in three weeks of practice."

SEASON NOTES

NEW ARENA OPENING 2010-11

The official groundbreaking of the new \$92.5 million Auburn basketball arena and practice facility was on Aug. 29, 2008, and the arena will open prior to the 2010-11 season.

The arena, with approximate capacity of 9,600, will include over 29,000 square feet of student-athlete space, a two-court practice facility, coaches offices, the Auburn University Athletic Ticket Office, an AU Team Store, the relocated Lovelace Museum, two food courts along with many other amenities.

360 Architecture of Kansas City, Mo., has been working with Davis Architects of Birmingham on the design of the arena. The firm of Robins & Morton of Birmingham will serve as construction manager. The 243,792 square foot facility will be built on campus north and west of the existing Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum on Roosevelt Drive, across the street from the Student Activities Center parking lot.

The new arena will feature chair back seats along with bleacher seating for students. The building also will provide improved facilities for the student-athletes, including men's and women's locker room suites with sports medicine facilities, lounges and team meeting rooms. Along with a strength and conditioning center, a two-court practice facility will enable the men's and women's teams to practice simultaneously and while the arena is in use for other purposes.

The arena will have 12 luxury suites on the arena level that will not only open inside the facility, but will also open on the outside of the arena for multiple entertain-

ing opportunities throughout the year. Loge box seating will also be available as well as on-site food preparation.

The seating configuration will offer better sight lines and will move fans closer to the court. The furthest seat will be just 43 feet in elevation from courtside, compared to 60 feet in elevation at Beard-Eaves, with two-thirds of the seats in the new facility being less than 27 feet in elevation from courtside.

The scoreboard will feature a high-definition video board with full message/information center technology. For the student fan amenities, there will be a private entrance, a private court side commons and food court and court side seating that permits standing with unobstructed views.

The new facility will serve as more than a sports complex. With over 12,000 square feet of banquet/entertainment space, its design affords ready adaptation in to a site for concerts and other cultural events, convocations and other community gatherings. On-campus student housing is being constructed adjacent to the new arena creating a unique "student village" experience.

Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum is entering its 41st year of service to the University, while the new arena will be Auburn's fifth home arena in the 104 years of basketball. The Tigers other arenas have been The Gymnasium (1906-16), Alumni Gym (1916-48) and the Sports Arena (1948-69).

360 Architecture has been selected to design the new Oakland A's stadium and has designed the Miami Heat's American Airlines Arena, NHL's Columbus Blue Jackets' Nationwide Arena, the University of Missouri's Mizzou Arena and the Sprint Center in Kansas City, Mo.

Tay Waller scored a game-high 27 points in only 21 minutes to lead Auburn to a 98-50 exhibition victory over Morehouse College. Waller made 7-of-12 shots from 3-point range as part of 10-of-16 shooting from the field while not playing the final 12:18 of the game. Quantez Robertson added 19 points making all four 3-pointers attempted, and had 10 rebounds and 5 assists in 31 minutes. Auburn led by as much as 51 at 92-41 with 3:56 left. The Tigers pulled away in the final five minutes of the first half as they increased a 24-15 lead to as much as 46-19 before settling for a 46-22 halftime edge. Auburn led 71-31 with 13:29 left in the game and the lead never dipped below 40 points the rest of the way. For the game, Auburn shot 51 percent from the field (39-of-76) and 46 percent from 3-point range (15-of-33) but was poor from the foul line shooting 36 percent (5-of-14). Morehouse College was led by Kenney Boyd's 21 points and 10 rebounds as the Maroon Tigers were held to 36 percent shooting from the field, 22 percent from 3-point range and were outrebounded 47-35.
