The Field

Eleventh-ranked Auburn (ninth in the Golf World/NGCA poll) joins the 17 other top 25 teams in the field at the NCAA Championship. The other six teams competing are all ranked in the top 50. The Tigers tee off #10 with No. 29 TCU and No. 13 Arizona on Tuesday at 1:20 p.m. MT. Auburn tees off of #1 Wednesday at 8:50 pm. MT. Live scoring can be found at www.golfstat.com.

The Course

Auburn returns to the UNM Championship Course for the second time this season after playing the NCAA Fall Preview back in September. Auburn tied for sixth of 18 at that event. UNM Championship Course is a par-71, 7,248-yard course in Albuquerque, N.M. The course opened in 1967 and has since hosted four NCAA Championships. Auburn at the NCAA Championship

Auburn has advanced to the NCAA Championship 12 of the last 13 years and a total of 14 times. Last season the Tiger finished ninth (309-304-300-300--1213). Auburn's highest finish in the NCAA Championship was a tie for second in 2002. The Tigers best individual finish is also a tie for second as Danielle Downey set the mark in 2002.

Tigers in the Polls

Auburn is ranked No. 11 in the May 11 *Golfweek* poll and ninth in the May 7 *GolfWorld*/NGCA Coaches poll. In the individual *Golfweek* rankings, Cydney Clanton is 13th, followed by Candace Schepperle in 48th and Margaret Shirley in 69th.

Quoting Head Coach Kim Evans ...

On team's performance at Regionals.

"We played a little shaky at times because of the nature of the tournament, but all-in-all I was pleased. I saw a team that could have played better and could have played worse, but didn't. They really played the last nine holes well. The last day the scores really went up and down and they stepped up and finished strong the last four or five holes."

On the UNC Championship Course.

"We played on the course in the fall at the Preview. We like this course. I think the wind and fast greens will be factors. That will make par-3's stretch out even longer. The driver of the golf ball is going to play well and someone who has their putter hot. Altitude does play some role. When we were there before I think we saw about a half club difference increase. The winds are just going to play a huge part."

On the team.

"We are a young team and have taken some hits this year, but have grown up along the way. The team is ready to play; they are very excited right now. I think they all feel, and I feel that all five of them haven't played as a team yet, throwing in the same scores on the same day together. They have all thrown in scores, they just haven't done it as an Auburn team. I really think their goal is to get there and really see what they can do and pull each other through and get four good scores each day. If that happens we will be real happy."

Versus the Competition

Auburn is 54-40-2 versus the competition at the NCAA Championship this season. Auburn holds the season series record with Alabama, Denver, Furman, LSU, Oklahoma State, South Carolina, TCU, Texas, Texas A&M, Tulsa, UNLV, Virginia and Wake Forest. Arizona, Arkansas, Arizona State, Duke, Florida, Georgia, Purdue, Southern Cal and UCLA hold the series advantage over Auburn. UC Davis is the only team in the field Auburn has not met this season.

Kim Evans at the NCAA Championship

Kim Evans is making her 12th appearance at the NCAA Championship as head coach at Auburn. It also marks the fourth straight appearance for the Tigers. The Tigers best finish during that span was second in 2002. The Tigers have finished in the top five three times, with the last time coming in 2005 when the team came in third. Evans has coached nine All-Americans that earned 20 total honors.

Familiar Territory

Auburn is no stranger to the UNM Championship Course as this will be its second trip this season to Albuquerque. Last September Auburn competed in the NCAA Fall Preview on the same course and finished tied for sixth in the 18-team field.

Clanton Named to US vs. Japan Championship Team

The GCAA announced the 12-member team for the 2008 Fuji Xerox USA vs. Japan Collegiate Golf Championship and included on that list is freshman Cydney Clanton. The 33rd annual competition will be held July 16-18 at Tokyo Golf Club.

Auburn Takes Fourth at East Regional

Auburn grabbed fourth place at the NCAA East Regional for the second straight year to earn its fourth straight trip to the NCAA Championship. It also marked the eighth top-five finish for Auburn under Kim Evans.

Cydney Clanton Named SEC Freshman of the Year

Clanton has played in every tournament this season and currently averages a team best 73.57 strokes-per-round, a mark good enough for third in the SEC and 13th in the nation. She has amassed six top-10 finishes this year, including four in the top-five. Her best finish of the year came at the UT Mercedes-Benz Collegiate Championship in October where she tied for first.

Trio of Tigers Earn All-SEC Honors

Cydney Clanton also earned First-Team All-SEC honors. Candace Schepperle and Margaret Shirley were voted to the second team. It was Schepperle's second straight year on the second team and Shirley's third consecutive appearance.

Pick Your Poison

Of the five Auburn golfers on the course this weekend, three have at least one top-10 finish to their credit, and two have a top-five finish this season. Cydney Clanton has five top-five finishes this season, including tying for the win at the UT Mercedes-Benz Collegiate Championship, while Margaret Shirley tied for fourth at the SEC Championship. Candace Schepperle and Mariana Macias are the other two Tigers with top-10 finishes. Schepperle tied for seventh at the Liz Murphey Collegiate Classic and SEC Championship, while Macias tied for 10th at the Lady Tar Heel Invitational.

Clanton Turns in Career Best 66 at UCF Challenge

Freshman Cydney Clanton shot a career best 66 in the opening round of the UCF Challenge on March 9. The score is the second lowest 18-hole score in Auburn history and the best score by an Auburn freshman ever.

Kim Evans Inducted into Hall of Fame

Kim Evans, along with Amy Fruhwirth, former collegiate great at Arizona State were inducted into the NGCA Hall of Fame on January 13. Evans became the 41st member of the Coaches Hall of Fame and Fruhwirth became the 51st member of the Players Hall of Fame.

Clanton Makes Her Mark Early

Cydney Clanton led the team with a 72.07 stroke average in her first season of collegiate play this past fall. She finished fall play ranked No. 11 in the country after turning in three top five finishes and another top 20 placing.

Tigers Find New Home

The women's and men's golf team have a new facility to call home. The Jack Key Golf Teaching Facility officially opened its doors to the two programs late last fall. The facility was officially dedicated on March 31. The facility includes locker rooms, team lounge areas, video analysis, covered hitting bays, club repair, meeting rooms and coaches offices.

Five SEC Championships

Six NCAA Top 10 Finishes

No. 1 rankings, top-10 finishes in the NCAA Championship, Auburn and Kim Evans all go hand in hand. Evans, who has led the Tigers to five SEC Championships, including the 2006 title, was the 2002 NGCA National Coach of the Year as the Tigers amassed an incredible record of 162-7-3 (.951). In the fall of 2005, Golfweek named the Auburn women's program the fourth most successful program in the past five years.

Evans, who is in her 14th year at Auburn, has led the Tigers to eight consecutive NCAA Championship appearances, including six top-10 finishes with a tie for second in the nation in 2002 and third in 2005. Auburn's five SEC titles under Evans came in 1996, 2000, 2003, 2005 and 2006.

Last season, the Tigers found themselves at the top of the rankings all season and turned that into a ninth-place finish at the NCAA Championship. Nicole Hage earned All-American honors as Evans has now coached her players to 20 All-America accolades. Hage was also voted first team All-SEC, while Margaret Shirley and Candace Schepperle earned a place on the second team. In addition, Schepperle was named SEC Freshman of the Year; Evans' fifth newcomer to earn the honor.

In 2006, Evans coached the Tigers to a sixth place finish at the NCAA East Region and a 12th place finish at the NCAA Championships. Two players were named All-Americans, and Maria Martinez was named SEC Women's Golfer of the Year. The team tied a school record with five tournament victories, taking first place in the Derby Invitational, the LSU/Cleveland Golf Classic, the Lady Gamecock Classic, the SEC Championship and the Lady Buckeye Invite.

In 2005 Evans led the Tigers to the NCAA Central Region title and senior Diana Ramage earned medalist honors in the tournament. Three players were named All-Americans, as well as All-SEC team members in 2005.

The Tigers finished the 2002 season ranked No. 1 nationally in *Golfweek* and were No. 1 in the nation in *Golfweek's* 2002-03 preseason poll.

Evans has coached and helped with the development of nine All-Americans that have earned 20 awards, five SEC Players of the Year and five SEC Freshmen of the Year. Auburn's streak of eight-straight NCAA appearances was the fourth longest stint of any school in the nation at that time. Since 2000, the Tigers have won 23 tournament championships.

The 1981 Auburn graduate has turned a once

mediocre program into a consistent National Championship contender.

In 2004, freshman Nicole Hage won SEC Freshman of the Year honors and was named as the Co-SEC Player of the Year. Along with Hage, Maria Martinez earned first team All-SEC honors.

Auburn won three tournaments in 2003 with the SEC Championship, the ACC/SEC Challenge and the Mercedes-Benz Collegiate. Senior Celeste Troche became the first four-time All-American in Tiger history while Danielle Downey was an honorable mention All-American. Troche, Downey and Diana Ramage were all All-SEC first-team selections and Maria Martinez was a second-teamer.

Evans led the Tigers to a school-best tie for second in the 2002 NCAA Championship. The Tigers finished the season ranked No. 1 nationally in *Golfweek*. Courtney Swaim, Troche and Downey each earned All-American honors as Swaim and Troche were first-team selections with Downey on the second team.

Evans was named SEC Coach of the Year for the third time in seven seasons while Kingsley Barrett became the third-straight Tiger to claim SEC Freshman of the Year honors. Downey, Swaim and Troche were first-team All-SEC selections while Troche was also selected to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

The Tigers had a then school-best fourth-place finish in the 2001 NCAA Championship. Celeste Troche earned first-team All-America honors and was an Academic All-American and SEC Player of the Year, and Ramage won the Tigers' second consecutive SEC Freshman of the Year award. The Tigers won a school record five tournaments.

The Tigers finished sixth in the 2000 NCAA Championship and won the 2000 SEC Championship for the second time in five years. Freshmen Danielle Downey, who won three individual tournaments including the SEC Championship, and Celeste Troche, who was the SEC Freshman of the Year, were both named sec-

ond-team All-Americans. Both were first-team All-SEC selections and a quartet of Tigers, Kami Smith, Crystal Ferrier, Kimberly Strong and Audrey Fisher, were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

The Tigers finished 15th in the 1999 NCAA Championship while Robin Cook was named a second-team All-American for the second straight year. Kami Smith earned Academic All-America honors. Six Tigers were named All-SEC with Cook earning SEC Player of the Year honors.

In 1998, the Tigers finished 19th at the NCAA Championship. Cook was named second-team All-American and three Tigers garnered All-SEC honors along with three being named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

The Tigers finished 13th in the nation in 1997 as the team advanced to the NCAA Championship at the Scarlet Course in Columbus, Ohio. Katie Gallina was named an All-American and the Tigers had four All-SEC selections and two SEC Academic Honor Roll picks. Evans led the Tigers to a 143-36 (.799) record during the 1996-97 season. In 1996, Evans became only the second women's golf coach in Auburn history to be named SEC Coach of the Year and District South Coach of the Year, along with the legendary Bud Marsee.

Auburn's 1996 SEC Championship was the school's second ever, the first coming in 1989. Evans also led the Tigers to their first trip to the NCAA Championship in six years in 1996 as the Tigers finished 18th in the country. Marci Clemons was an All-American and won the prestigious Dinah Shore Award and Edith Munson Award. Three Tigers were selected All-SEC and one to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

Evans was formerly an assistant coach for the men's golf team at Georgia Tech from 1988-1994 and the assistant executive director of the Atlanta Junior Golf Association for six years.

In 1981, she graduated from Auburn with a Bachelor of Science degree while also lettering for the Tigers from 1978-81.

Upon her graduation from Auburn, Evans worked as a golf activity coordinator and golf professional at Sandestin Resort in Destin, Fla., where she obtained her PGA Class A

status.

Evans has a long list of golf achievements including being on the Board of Directors for "The Alabama First Tee Chapter" in 1999 and is the 3rd Vice-President of the National Golf Coaches Association for 1999-2000. She was awarded the

Georgia PGA Junior Golf Leader Award in 1992; was a member of the PGA National Junior Golf Steering Committee from 1992-93; Georgia State Golf Association Advisory Committee, 1992-1994; Georgia Junior Golf Foundation Board of Directors, 1992-1994; Special Olympics Committee for Golf in 1994; and Instructor for the LPGA Mazda Executive Women's Clinic in 1993. She was the guest speaker for the 1990 USGA Women's Regional Workshop and at the AAHPERD Regional Convention in 1993.

She spearheaded and directed the "See Jane Build Golf Day" in September 1995 to benefit Habitat for Humanity in Lee County and was selected to the South District Selection Committee for 1995-96. While at Georgia Tech, she was involved in several campus activities such as directing the Georgia Tech Annual Gift Giving, The United Way for four years, the Tournament Coordinator of the Local Contributors Golf Tournament for the NCAA Women's Final Four in 1993 and the Mandy Miller Golf Classic (Women's Basketball Scholarship Endowment Program) for three years. Evans was a co-Director for the "Go For the Gold Twilight Run" (fund raising for women's athletics) in 1991.

Evans spends time with many charities and is a member of the Professional Golf Association of America. Among Evans' achievements from the recent past include the creation of the Auburn Tiger Invitational (now named the Auburn Tiger-Derby Invitational after former Auburn golfer and Curtis Cup Champion Virginia-Derby Grimes). She was also instrumental in landing the 1996 NCAA East Regional and 2003 NCAA Championship at Grand National in Opelika, Ala.

"The individuals are the best part of coaching," said Evans of her players. "Of course everybody likes to win. But, when you're dealing with individuals, and they accomplish their goals, we all come together and accomplish our team goals.

"When you have quality student-athletes and mix them with the game of golf, I can't see a better combination."
