#### SCOUTING DAYTON

The Flyers defeated Mercer 71-53 Tuesday in Dayton and have also defeated Wofford (52-49), Delaware State (62-42) and Bethune-Cookman (78-38) ... Chris Wright notched a double-double with 16 points, 11 rebounds and three blocks vs. Mercer, while Charles Little added 11 points, Marcus Johnson 10 points and Chris Johnson eight points and eight rebounds off the bench ... Luke Fabrizio came off the bench to knock down three 3-pointers in nine attempts to finish with nine points and four rebounds in 12 minutes vs. Mercer ... the victory over Bethune-Cookman was the Flyers largest margin of victory in seven years ... the Flyers are led in scoring by 6-foot-8 sophomore forward Chris Wright (15.0 ppg, 6.5 rpg) and junior guard Marcus Johnson (11.5 ppg, 3.8 rpg) ... Dayton allows only 45.5 points per game and limits its opponents to 32 percent shooting from the field and 31 percent from 3-point range ... the Flyers have a +20.3 scoring margin and shoot 40 percent from

Dayton is picked to finish sixth in the 14-team Atlantic 10 preseason coaches poll ... the Flyers have two returning starters from last year's team that went 23-11 overall and tied for seventh in the Atlantic 10 at 8-8 ... they lost in the NIT quarterfinals at Ohio State 74-63.

**AUBURN-DAYTON SERIES**

This is the third meeting between Auburn and Dayton and the first since the 1972-73 season. Holding a 2-0 series edge over Auburn, Dayton defeated Auburn 106-63 on Dec. 18, 1972, in Dayton and the Flyers defeated the Tigers 85-71 in the 1965 Sugar Bowl Tournament on Dec. 29, 1965, in New Orleans, La.

**JEFF LEBO vs. DAYTON**

Auburn's Jeff Lebo is 1-0 against Dayton as a head coach, and he is 2-0 all-time against the Flyers.

As a head coach, Lebo's UT-Chattanooga Mocs won at Dayton 68-59 in the NIT first round on March 15, 2002.

As an assistant coach under Eddie Fogler at Vanderbilt, Lebo's Commodores won at Dayton 75-53 on Dec. 5, 1992.

**JEFF LEBO & BRIAN GREGORY**

This will be the first time Auburn coach Jeff Lebo and Dayton head coach Brian Gregory have coached against each other.

**CHICAGO INVITATIONAL**

The tournament will move to Hoffman Estates, Ill., a suburb of Chicago, for the final two games in the Sears Centre Friday and Saturday. Auburn will play Dayton Friday at 5 pm Central and then

Northern Iowa on Saturday at 4:30 pm Central.

The Tigers lost to Mercer 78-74 in the first round Nov. 19 in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum and defeated Bethune-Cookman 61-46 in the second round in Auburn.

**2nd of 3 vs. ATLANTIC 10**

Dayton is the second of three Atlantic 10 opponents Auburn will play this season. The Tigers came back from a 15-point halftime deficit to defeat George Washington 83-71 on Nov. 22 and will close out its Atlantic 10 swing at Xavier on Dec. 3.

Auburn is playing its second Missouri Valley Conference team in six games this year when it plays Northern Iowa Saturday. The Tigers defeated Missouri State 75-60 in both teams' season openers Nov. 14 in Auburn.

**WELCOME BACK VOT**

Korvotney Barber is averaging 14.5 points while shooting a team-best 60 percent from the floor this year.

He scored a game-high 22 points on 10-of-14 shooting from the field in Auburn's 75-60 season opening win over Missouri State. The Manchester, Ga., native backed that up with 17 points vs. Mercer.

He was lead-

ing the nation shooting 72.0 percent from the field when he broke his left hand three minutes into Auburn's Dec. 29 game vs. Towson and missed the rest of last season.

**T(R)AY WALLER**

Junior Tay Waller is shooting 38 percent from 3-point range this year despite going 0-of-6 from behind the arc vs. Bethune-Cookman Tuesday. He has made 15-of-40 shots from 3-point range for an average of 3.8 treys a game.

The Manchester, Ga., native had 14 points with four treys vs. Missouri State and then a team-high 22 points with six treys vs. Mercer.

He scored a game-high 19 points, making 5-of-13 three-point attempts, vs. George Washington to go along with five steals and four rebounds.

**MANCHESTER MATES**

Manchester (Ga.) High School has been good to Auburn as the Tigers' top two leading scorers, Korvotney Barber and Tay Waller, were teammates there.

The duo is combining for 38.6 percent of Auburn's scoring by averaging 28.3 points per game and shooting 50 percent (42-of-84) from the field and 38 percent

**Auburn 61, Bethune-Cookman 46 (Nov. 25, 2008, in Auburn, Ala.)**

DeWayne Reed scored 14 points and Quantez Robertson added 12 points to lead Auburn to a 61-46 victory over Bethune-Cookman in the Chicago Invitational second round in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum Tuesday. The Tigers (3-1) allowed the third fewest points to the Wildcats (1-3) in the Jeff Lebo era. The Tigers outscored the Wildcats 15-6 to open the second half to push their lead to 43-22 with 11:44 remaining. Auburn enjoyed its largest lead at 56-33 on a Frankie Sullivan 3-pointer with 4:38 left before Lebo emptied his bench. Auburn shot 47 percent (20-of-43) from the field, 33 percent (7-of-21) from 3-point range and 61 percent (14-of-23) from the foul line while holding

Bethune-Cookman to 30 percent shooting and 26 percent from 3-point range. The Tigers committed a season-high 17 turnovers, but outrebounded the Wildcats, 39-28. Tay Waller, who came into the game as Auburn's leading scorer with an 18.3 points per game average, was held scoreless as he missed all six of his shots taken, all from 3-point range, and only one of them coming in the second half. Korvotney Barber, who was averaging 16.7 points, was hampered by foul trouble as he scored only eight points in 24 minutes while being saddled with four fouls. Robertson added eight rebounds and two assists to his stat line while Lucas Hargrove had nine points, five rebounds and five assists in 28 minutes. Brendon Knox chipped in eight points and seven rebounds in 18 minutes off the bench while Frankie Sullivan was also strapped with three fouls and scored six points by going 2-of-3 from 3-point range in only 17 minutes. Bethune-Cookman was led by Jarrell Thomas' 16 points and John Holmes' 13 points and seven rebounds. A Johnnie Lett layup put Auburn ahead to stay at 4-2 and the sluggish Tigers grew their lead to 28-16 at the half.

**NEW ARENA OPENING 2010-11**

The official groundbreaking of the new \$92.5 million Auburn basketball arena and practice facility was on Aug. 29, 2008, and the arena will open prior to the 2010-11 season.

The arena, with approximate capacity of 9,600, will include over 29,000 square feet of student-athlete space, a two-court

practice facility, coaches offices, the Auburn University Athletic Ticket Office, an AU Team Store, the relocated Lovelace Museum, two food courts along with many other amenities.

360 Architecture of Kansas City, Mo., has been working with Davis Architects of Birmingham on the design of the arena. The firm of Robins & Morton of Birmingham will serve as construction manager. The 243,792 square foot facility will be built on campus north and west of the existing Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum on Roosevelt Drive, across the street from the Student Activities Center parking lot.

The new arena will feature chair back seats along with bleacher seating for students. The building also will provide improved facilities for the student-athletes, including men's and women's locker room suites with sports medicine facilities, lounges and team meeting rooms. Along with a strength and conditioning center, a two-court practice facility will enable the men's and women's teams to practice simultaneously and while the arena is in use for other purposes.

The arena will have 12 luxury suites on the arena level that will not only open inside the facility, but will also open on the outside of the arena for multiple entertaining opportunities throughout the year. Loge box seating will also be available as well as on-site food preparation.

The seating configuration will offer better sight lines and will move fans closer to the court. The furthest seat will be just 43 feet in elevation from courtside, compared to 60 feet in elevation at Beard-Eaves, with two-thirds of the seats in the new facility being less than 27 feet in elevation from courtside.

The scoreboard will feature a high-definition video board with full message/information center technology. For the student fan amenities, there will be a private entrance, a private courtside commons and food court and courtside seating that permits standing with unobstructed views.

The new facility will serve as more than a sports complex. With over 12,000 square feet of banquet/entertainment space, its design affords ready adaptation in to a site for concerts and other cultural events, convocations and other community gatherings. On-campus student housing is being constructed adjacent to the new arena creating a unique "student village" experience.

Tay Waller scored a game-high 27 points in only 21 minutes to lead Auburn to a 98-50 exhibition victory over Morehouse College. Waller made 7-of-12 shots from 3-point range as part of 10-of-16 shooting from the field while not playing the final 12:18 of the game. Quantez Robertson added 19 points making all four 3-pointers attempted, and had 10 rebounds and 5 assists in 31 minutes. Auburn led by as much as 51 at 92-41 with 3:56 left. The Tigers pulled away in the final five minutes of the first half as they increased a 24-15 lead to as much as 46-19 before settling for a 46-22 halftime edge. Auburn led 71-31 with 13:29 left in the game and the lead never dipped below 40 points the rest of the way. For the game, Auburn shot 51 percent from the field (39-of-76) and 46 percent from 3-point range (15-of-33) but was poor from the foul line shooting 36 percent (5-of-14). Morehouse College was led by Kenney Boyd's 21 points and 10 rebounds as the Maroon Tigers were held to 36 percent shooting from the field, 22 percent from 3-point range and were outrebounded 47-35.

Korvotney Barber tied a career high with 22 points to lead Auburn to a 75-50 victory over Missouri State before 5,148 in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum Friday in the season opener for both teams. The Tigers used an 11-2 run to take a 63-53 lead with 5:14 to play after the Bears closed to within 52-51 with 9:13 left. Missouri State could only get to within 67-60 with just under two minutes to play before Auburn scored the final eight points of the game. The first half was much like the second half as the Tigers broke open a 27-25 lead with two minutes left by scoring the final seven points to take a 34-25 lead at the break. Auburn bridged the two halves together with a 12-0 run to go up 39-25 less than two minutes in. Trailing 45-33, Missouri State outscored Auburn 15-3 to close to within 50-48 at 10:49 as the Bears made seven of their first nine 3-pointers of the second half. That's when Auburn's defense took over as it forced three straight Missouri State turnovers that led to three consecutive Auburn layups by DeWayne Reed, Brendon Knox and a dunk by Tay Waller. Barber finished the game shooting 10-of-14 from the floor and 2-of-3 from the foul line to go along with five rebounds, two blocks, an assist and steal. Waller added 14 points on 4-of-8 three-point shooting for the Tigers, Hargrove had 13 points, five assists and three rebounds, Brendon Knox 10 points and three rebounds off the bench and Quantez Robertson seven points, seven rebounds and four assists. Chris Cooks led Missouri State with 18 points and Spencer Laurie added 14 points and six rebounds while Cardell McFarland had 14 points and three rebounds. Auburn had 20 assists on its 28 made field goals and outscored Missouri State 42-14 in the paint.

James Florence scored a game-high 25 points as Mercer outrebounded its way to a 78-74 upset of Auburn in the Chicago Invitational first round in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum. The Tigers were outrebounded 46-21 by the Bears and only made 6-of-14 foul shots in the second half, including a poor 2-of-8 in the final 7:20 after Auburn took a 67-65 lead. Atlantic Sun Conference member Mercer improved to 2-0 against the SEC Western Division as it won at Alabama 72-69 four days prior. Tay Waller led Auburn with 22 points on 6-of-13 three-point shooting but missed several minutes down the stretch with cramps. Korvotney Barber had 17 points and three blocks while DeWayne Reed added 11 points, five assists and zero turnovers and Quantez Robertson 10 points, five assists and a game-high six rebounds. Waller scored the first basket of the game and then Florence made a foul shot and Emerson a jumper to give Mercer a lead that they didn't relinquish until Robertson made a pair of free throws for a 30-28 lead with 4:39 left in the half. The Bears led by as much as 13-4 five minutes in and had its largest lead at 22-12 before the Tigers used an 8-1 run to get back into the game. Leading 44-40 at the half, Mercer pushed its lead to 47-40 on a conventional 3-point play by Calvin Henry. Auburn then scored eight straight points for a 48-47 lead with 18:16 left and the margin never went above more than three points either way until a Florence three-pointer to give Mercer a 72-68 lead with 4:11 left. The Tigers trailed 73-68 with 2:29 remaining but were down only 76-74 with nine seconds left and had the ball. Robertson drove the length of the court and missed a contested shot in the lane that went out of bounds under the glass with five seconds left. The official under the glass pointed Auburn's direction and then the official by midcourt over-ruled him by calling a charge on Robertson. After an Auburn foul, Calvin Henry sank two foul shots to seal the game. The Tigers only committed seven turnovers while forcing 19 Bears turnovers.

Auburn came back from a 15-point halftime deficit to double up George Washington in the second half for an 83-71 victory in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum. Tay Waller scored 19 points and Frankie Sullivan had 17 points on 4-of-7 three-pointers to lead the Tigers. It was a tale of two halves as the Tigers trailed 44-29 at intermission after the Colonials shot 57 percent from the field and 59 percent (10-of-17) from 3-point range. In the second half, Auburn limited George Washington to only 33 percent shooting from the field and 22 percent (2-of-9) from 3-point range. Auburn outscored George Washington 54-27 in the second half mostly by turning a 51-41 deficit almost six minutes into a 54-53 Tiger lead, capping a 12-3 Auburn run on a Tay Waller 3-pointer with 10 minutes to play. It was Auburn's first lead since 20-17 with eight minutes in the first half. Trailing by one, Auburn went on an 8-1 mini-run to go up 64-57 with six minutes left. After GW closed to within two a minute later, Auburn scored eight straight points for a 72-62 lead, the last bucket on Waller's fifth 3-pointer of the game with 2:43 remaining. The final minutes were a stark contrast from the 78-74 loss to Mercer when Auburn missed 6-of-8 free throws in the final 7:20. Against George Washington, Auburn drained 14-of-17 foul shots in the final 4:15 as the Colonials started fouling intentionally with three minutes to play. After being outrebounded by 25 against Mercer, the Tigers had a 37-26 edge on the Colonials even after being outrebounded by three at the half.
