YARBROUGH TENNIS CENTER





In 2005, Auburn University set out to make its men's and women's tennis teams two of the best programs in the country, starting with a state-of-the-art facility.

In August of 2006 construction began on Auburn's new facility. On Nov. 2, 2007, the City of Auburn/Auburn University Yarbrough Tennis Center was dedicated and opened as a new phase in Auburn tennis.

The facility has 33,314-square feet of indoor space with six indoor courts, 12 outdoor courts with stadium seating and 16 clay courts. The Yarbrough Tennis Center also houses a pro shop, men's and women's locker rooms, concessions and a meeting area. All 12 courts are world-class lighted courts used for both competition and practice by the Auburn tennis teams.

As one of the best facilities in the Southeastern Conference, Auburn hosted the 2008 SEC Women's Tennis Championships and the men's tournament in 2009. The facility also played host to NCAA Women's Tennis Regionals in 2016 and 2017.

The City of Auburn/Auburn University Yarbrough Tennis Center replaced the on-campus Luther Young Tennis Complex, Auburn's tennis home since 1978.

COACHING STAFF



CAROLINE LILLEY Head Coach

3rd Season at Auburn • 3rd Season as a Head Coach Alma Mater: Georgia Tech, 2012 Hometown: Portland, Oregon

Caroline Lilley is in her third year as the Auburn women's tennis head coach. She was named head coach on June 14, 2019.

In her first two seasons, Lilley has helped the Tigers to tremendous success, including a berth in the 2021 NCAA Tournament, where Auburn advanced to the second round. Auburn posted an overall record of 14-9 with a 7-6 mark in SEC play, finishing sixth in the final conference standings. Under her leadership, sophomore Selin Ovunc became the program's seventh All-American (and second in singles) by advancing to the Round of 16 at the NCAA Championships. Ovunc and Carolyn Ansari were named to the All-SEC Second Team, and senior Taylor Russo was named the regional winner of the ITA Cissie Leary Sportsmanship Award. In Lilley's first full season at the helm of the program, Auburn finished with a national ranking of No. 22.

Lilley's first season at Auburn in 2020, while shortened by the global COVID-19 pandemic, showed great promise as the Tigers had recorded an 8-6 record in dual matches and a 1-3 mark in SEC play when the season was halted in March. Several student-athletes earned conference and regional accolades: senior Taylor Russo was named ITA Southern Region Senior Player of the Year and to the SEC Community Service Team, and freshman Selin Ovunc was the ITA Southern Region Rookie of the Year. Russo and Ovunc teamed up in doubles to win the ITA Southern Regional championship and were ranked as high as No. 9 nationally. As a team, the Tigers were No. 42 nationally in the final published ITA ranking of the spring.

Lilley spent the previous four seasons at the University of Kansas where she helped the Jayhawks to four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including the program's first-ever Big 12 Conference Championship in 2019.

Named assistant head coach at Kansas in December 2018, Lilley joined the KU staff as an assistant coach in May 2015 after a successful stint as an assistant coach at Gonzaga.

In the 2018-19 season, Lilley helped KU to a 21-4 record, a trip to the NCAA Sweet 16 and the Big 12 title. The Jayhawks were ranked for 16 consecutive weeks during the season, peaking at No. 7 before finishing No. 13 in the final polls. Three Jayhawks, Nina Khmelnitckaia, Janet Koch and Anastasia Rychagova all earned first-team All-America honors by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA). The doubles team of Koch and Khmelnitckaia reached the No. 1 ranking in the country, and Kansas as a team did not lose a doubles point all season. She made her presence felt immediately at Kansas in her first spring season in 2016, helping the Jayhawks reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 17 years. Kansas finished second in the Big 12 Conference, the Jayhawks highest finish in 18 years. The four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances were a program first since earning four-straight berths from 1996-99. In 2018 Lilley helped lead KU to its first victory in the NCAA Tournament since 1999.

National rankings have become the norm for KU tennis since Lilley's arrival; the Jayhawks have appeared in the ITA rankings in all or part of every season Lilley has coached at KU. In 2018 KU spent 11-straight weeks in the top-20, including a season-ending ranking of 18 in 2018, the program's highest end-of-season ranking since 1998 (17th).

Individual players as well have earned national rankings under Lilley's tutelage. In fall 2017 junior Anastasia Rychagova became the first Jayhawk singles player to be ranked No. 1 in the country, and in May 2018 she became KU's first singles All-American in 20 years.

In recognition of her work at KU, Lilley was voted ITA Central Region Assistant Coach of the Year in 2018.

A Portland, Oregon native, Lilley spent the two seasons prior to joining the KU staff as an assistant coach at Gonzaga, where in 2014 the Zags earned at Top 75 national ranking for the first time in program history, a feat they repeated in 2015. With her help Gonzaga signed the #7 recruiting class for mid-major schools, the highest-ranked recruiting class in school history. National recognition is nothing new for Lilley. She had an accomplished playing career at both Kentucky (freshman and sophomore years) and Georgia Tech (junior and senior years). She was ranked with five different doubles partners throughout her college career, with a high of No. 6. She was nationally ranked in singles as well, with a high of No. 67.

As a junior she posted a personal-best 26-12 singles record, contributing to Georgia Tech's consistent presence as a top-15 program in the country.

Graduating with a business administration degree with a concentration in finance, Lilley left Georgia Tech with the second-best doubles winning percentage in Tech's history – 69 percent (38-17, including 20-7 in dual match play).

Lilley earned her MBA, with a concentration in finance, from Kansas in 2018.

MEGAN FALCON Associate Head Coach

1st Season at Auburn Alma Mater: LSU, 2009

Megan Falcon was named associate head coach for Auburn women's tennis on July 12, 2021.

Falcon was associate head coach for the Jayhawks from 2019-21, which followed a three-year stint as assistant coach at Wisconsin. As a student-athlete at LSU, she was one of their most decorated players in program history as a three-time All-American, NCAA singles semifinalist and 2007 SEC Player of the Year.

"To work alongside someone I not only respect as a coach but also admire as a person is incredibly humbling," Lilley said. "Megan's ability to develop players is rooted in her commitment to cultivating meaningful relationships. Her experiences, both as a player and as a coach, speak volumes to her character and relatability. There is no one else in the country I would rather have investing in our young women. She is world-class in all she does."

In her two years at Kansas, Falcon saw the team post a 7-4 record during the pandemicshortened 2020 season, peaking at No. 19 in the nation. She also mentored three nationally ranked singles players and three ranked doubles teams while with the Jayhawks.

"I'm thankful and excited for the opportunity to join Auburn and help Coach Lilley build on what she's started here," Falcon said. "She and I believe deeply in the value of collegiate athletics in the lives of young women and share a common vision for the future of Auburn women's tennis. Having competed in the SEC as a student-athlete, I know Auburn is a special place, and I believe I will fit right in. War Eagle!"

At Wisconsin, Falcon helped lead the Badgers to a runner-up finish in the Big Ten in 2019 - the team's highest finish since 2002 - and their first NCAA Tournament berth since 2005. She helped engineer a 14-win improvement from her first season to her third with Wisconsin and saw Sara Castellano named to the All-Big Ten first team in 2019. She was an assistant coach at Gonzaga during the 2015-16 season, where the Bulldogs set a program record with 16 wins and finished second in the West Coast Conference, the highest finish in program history.

Falcon began her coaching career as the Director of Junior Tennis at Bocage Racquet Club in Baton Rouge, La.

A native of Alameda, Calif., Falcon finished her collegiate career as one of the top players in LSU women's tennis history. In her LSU career, Falcon reached No. 1 in the nation in singles and the No. 10 ranking in doubles. The 2007 SEC Player of the Year and three-time All-SEC First Team selection, Falcon was voted one of the 30 greatest LSU Tiger student-athletes of the decade after participating in the 2007 Pan American Games and being named finalist for the 2007 Honda National Player of the Year Award.

Falcon also spent two seasons on the professional circuit, attaining a WTA Ranking of 331 in singles and 413 in doubles. An ITA Scholar-Athlete, Falcon graduated with a degree in history and international studies from LSU in 2009.

Finished season on six-match unbeaten streak and won seven of her last nine ... Played doubles with four different partners during spring season, the last half of the season with Selin Ovunc ... Earned one ranked win in doubles with Madeline Meredith, defeating No. 57 Jacobs/Tkachenko of Kentucky, 7-5 ... Won four doubles matches in SEC regular season, plus one in SEC Tournament (Arkansas) and one in NCAA Tournament First Round (Oklahoma State) ... Named to All-SEC Second Team and SEC All-Newcomer Team ... Ranked No. 6 in final ITA Southern Regional rankings ... Named to SEC Academic Honor Roll.

Fall 2020:

Went 2-7 in singles and 5-4 in doubles in the fall with all matches coming against SEC competition ... Went 3-0 in doubles playing with Yu Chen, earning two wins at the SEC Challenge in Tuscaloosa ... Earned one singles win at both the Music City Scramble and the SEC Challenge.
