#### Georgia vs. Auburn

• Georgia, as the Eastern Division's No. 4 seed, plays West #5 seed Auburn to open the 2011 Southeastern Conference Tournament in Atlanta, Ga. The Bulldogs finished the regular season at 20-10 overall, 9-7 in the SEC and good enough for a third-place tie with Vanderbilt in the East standings.

• These two teams met nearly five weeks ago on Feb. 5 in Athens. Behind a career-best performance from **Jeremy Price**, the Bulldogs prevailed 81-72 in overtime. Georgia needed Price's clutch effort after squandering an eight-point lead in the second half, and a four-point margin in the final 25 seconds. More from this game follows later in this notes package.

• This annual gathering returns to the Georgia Dome for the first time since 2008, when a category F2 tornado on Friday night forced the postponement of the Bulldogs' second-round game. That contest, of course, was moved to Georgia Tech, where Georgia won three games in a 30-hour span to take the championship and earn an unlikely NCAA Tournament berth.

• Regardless of Georgia's post-season outcome, 2011 has already been an historic season. Its 20 wins marks the 11th time in 105 years of basketball at UGA for such a milestone. The Bulldogs' third-place finish in the Eastern Division is the program's best since 2003. Along the way was a 9-game winning streak, the first for Georgia since the Final Four year of 1983.

## Covering Georgia Basketball

### • Interviews

• Interview opportunities for players and Coach Fox will be on pre-determined dates and times during the season. As much advance notice as possible will be given before these dates. These opportunities will take place before the team's daily practices, which generally start at 3:00 p.m. on weekdays. Media are encouraged to arrange interviews in advance with Tim Hix of the Sports Information Office.

• Interviews with players are not allowed on the day of a game.

• NCAA rules require the team to have one "off" day per week. This off day changes occasionally but will most likely be on Sundays. Every effort will be made to give the media as much advance notice as possible about the upcoming practice schedule.

• Locker, training and weight room facilities are open only to coaches, players and support staff.

### • Practices

• Practices will be CLOSED to the media this season.

• However, television and still photographers will be able to shoot the FIRST 15 MINUTES of each practice. During this 15-minute period, all photographers are asked to remain in the baseline areas normally reserved for shooting in a game.

### • Post-Game Interviews

• This season the Bulldogs will no longer use the Training Facility locker room for Game Day. After a brief "cooling-off" period, Coach Fox and requested players will be available in the theater-type Conference Room, located through Portal #2. Coach Fox will answer questions first before proceeding to his post-game radio show. Requested players will follow in the Conference Room.

### • Weekly Satellite Feeds

The Georgia Sports Communications Office offers Tuesday satellite feeds that feature practice footage, as well as interviews with Coach Fox and players on upcoming opponents.

## Georgia vs. Auburn

• Thursday's game is the 176th meeting between these two schools. The series began in 1908 and has been renewed annually since 1945. Georgia's win on Feb. 5 in Athens this season gave it an 88-87 lead in the series.

• Auburn is the third most frequent opponent in UGA hoops history. Florida ranks first (195 meetings) and Georgia Tech is second (185).

• Seven times Georgia and Auburn have met in the SEC Tournament and Georgia has won four of them. Most recently, they met in 2007 in a game won by the Bulldogs 80-65. Most prominently, these two programs met in 1979, the first year the tournament was resumed, in a game that required four overtimes before Auburn prevailed 95-91.

• Since the SEC was pared into East and West divisions, the home team has won the annual meeting 16 of 20 times. The exceptions: Georgia won twice at Auburn (1994, 2008) and vice versa in 1999 and 2009.

• A geographical breakdown of the series follows:

**Games in Athens: UGA leads 59-22**

## Noteworthy...

• Of RPIs and such...Georgia's own RPI rating has varied widely as the season has progressed. It began in the mid-100s and has reached as high as 35.

> Average RPI of the 19 teams that Georgia has beaten: 162 [high of 12 (Kentucky) and low of 288 (Manhattan)].

> Average RPI of the eight teams that have beaten the Bulldogs: 23 [high of 10 (Notre Dame) and low of 79 (Alabama)].

The loss at Alabama last Saturday was Georgia's first to a team with a lesser RPI than its own.

• Last season, 13 of Georgia's 31 games were considered "close" by either of the following definitions: either an overtime period or a 2-possession game inside the final minute of play. The Bulldogs were 5-8 in those games. This season, 15 of Georgia's 29 games thus far fit those definitions, including the first eight, and the Bulldogs are 12-3 in those contests.

Additionally, nine of Georgia's games thus far have been decided on the final possession. The Tennessee game on Jan. 18 was the only one to NOT go Georgia's way.

• Just three Georgia teams in the past 20 years have finished their regular seasons with winning records on the road: 1991 (8-5), 1995 (7-5) and 2002 (6-5). The current squad — with its 7-3 mark in road games — has assured itself of becoming the fourth team to earn that distinction.

• This year's Bulldogs became just the third Georgia squad in 30 years to go undefeated in December. The other two? Perhaps the two best teams in UGA history: 1982-83 and 2002-03.

• Another comparison to the 2003 season: Georgia sold out its first four games of the SEC schedule, its most consecutive sellouts since '03. That year, the final nine contests of the home schedule (Pitt + eight SEC games) sold out. Having completed its home schedule, Georgia's final average home attendance of 8,250 is the program's best since the 2004 season.

• Georgia's defensive FG percentage of .396 ranks just third in the SEC, but it is one of the best in UGA history. Only one other Bulldog team of the past 50 years (1997...final record of 24-9) held its opponents under 40 percent shooting for an entire season. No Georgia opponent in 30 tries thus far has shot over 50 percent from the field.

• Georgia guards **Gerald Robinson** and **Dustin Ware** recently reached 100 assists this season. The last time a Georgia team featured two 100-assist men was in 2001 (D.A. Layne & Rashad Wright). This year's duo marks the ninth time in UGA history two teammates reached 100 assists.

One additional note about this: **Travis Leslie** enters the postseason needing 11 assists to reach 100 for the season. No Georgia team has ever featured three 100-assist men.

> Georgia has a 38-48 overall record (.442) in Tournament games. That's seventh-best among the 16 teams that have participated in the Tournament's history (includes ex-members Ga. Tech, Tulane and Sewanee).

> Georgia has reached the finals six times: 1940, 1981, 1983, 1988, 1997 and 2008. It's reached the semis 13 times, fifth-best among all SEC teams.

> Georgia's first championship came in 1983, and it served as a springboard for the Bulldogs' march to the NCAA Final Four.

> Since the tournament was revived in 1979, an SEC team has advanced from the first round to the title game (four straight games) just nine times. Georgia has done it thrice:

1988 Lost to Kentucky in title game  
 1997 Lost to Kentucky in title game  
 2008 Defeated Arkansas in title game

> For 19 straight years, from 1980-98, Georgia played at least into the tournament second round. Its 1st-round exit in '99 ended that string, and the Bulldogs had met a similar fate each succeeding time before an opening-round win over Auburn in 2004.

> Georgia owns at least a share of several tournament records:

- Longest Game: 4 OTs vs. Auburn in 1979.
- Fewest Points: 11 vs. Tennessee in 1937
- Fewest FGs: 3 vs. Tennessee in 1937
- Fewest FTs Made: 1 vs. Mississippi State in 2009
- Most 3-pt. FGA: 17 by Jody Patton vs. Tennessee in 1991

• Most 3-pt. FGM: 8 by Levi Stukes vs. Auburn in 2004 (1 of 5 players to hold the record)

> By beating them in the SEC Tournament, Georgia has had the unusual distinction of playing three recent SEC coaches in their last games at their respective schools: **Dale Brown** of LSU (1997), **Richard Williams** of Mississippi State (1998) and **Cliff Ellis** of Auburn (2004).

> Twelve Georgia players have made the All-Tournament team, six since the tourney was revived in 1979. Before **Sundiata Gaines** and **Terrance Woodbury** made the team in 2008, it had been 11 years since Georgia's last appointment: **Dominique Wilkins** (MVP in '81), **Vern Fleming** (MVP in 1983), **Pat Hamilton** in 1988, **Ray Harrison** in 1997; **Sundiata Gaines** (MVP) and **Terrance Woodbury** in 2008.

**Noteworthy (Cont'd.)**

- **Dustin Ware** could make a strong, credible case as Georgia's MVP of the conference schedule. The junior guard averages 1.0 point per game higher scoring in league games, but the efficiency of his contribution is what stands out. Through the 16-game SEC schedule, Ware led the league in two categories: 3-point percentage (49.3) and, by a wide margin, assist-to-turnover ratio (3.4/1).

- **Trey Thompkins** recently became one of nine Bulldogs all-time to have amassed 1,200 points and 600 rebounds in a career. Just two of these luminaries, however, have done it in three years' time: Thompkins and career rebounding leader **Bob Lienhard**, who played before the dawn of freshman eligibility in 1972.

- This year's Georgia team has already won more true road games (7) than Georgia had won in the previous three seasons combined.

The 2010 Bulldogs' road struggles appear to be an anomaly among teams coached by **Mark Fox**. In his 6+ years as a head coach, his teams have won an impressive 60 percent of their road games (53-35), and that mark *includes* last year's 0-11 record.

- Georgia is on track to have a positive Assist / Turnover Ratio for the first time since 2003. Leading the way is junior **Dustin Ware**, who ranks 4th among all NCAA Division I players in this category in the most recent national rankings.

- Georgia led the SEC in rebounding margin through the 16-game league schedule. The Bulldogs were outrebounded just twice during that span. In their nine SEC wins, they have an average margin of +13.3, highlighted by +25 and +18 margins in wins over Miss. State and Auburn.

**Thompkins, Leslie Reach 1,000 Pts.**

- This season **Trey Thompkins** has become the 40th player in UGA history to reach 1,000 for his career. The most recent Bulldog to reach that milestone was **Terrance Woodbury** in 2009. Already, Thompkins has climbed over 23 people on Georgia's career scoring chart with 1,329 points.

- **Travis Leslie** reached the milestone in the Florida game last week. His career total of 1,036 becomes more impressive when you consider that he scored just 165 points (6.3/game) as a freshman and missed the

final five games of the season.

**Robinson a Difference Maker**

- Last season head coach **Mark Fox** noted that **Gerald Robinson**, who sat out the 2010 year after transferring from Tennessee State, would have tilted the balance in Georgia's favor in several of its close games. Through December this season, Robinson delivered clutch plays that directly resulted in three Bulldog victories:

**11/20 at St. Louis:** Robinson drove the lane, drew three defenders and, in heavy traffic, fed Jeremy Price for a game-winner with :01 left.

**12/2 vs. UAB:** Robinson scored four points and had a key rebound in the final 14 seconds of perhaps the Bulldogs' best win of the season thus far.

**12/7 at Georgia Tech:** Robinson scored a key basket and assisted Dustin Ware on the biggest bucket of the game, a 3-pointer that broke a 70-all tie with 18 seconds left.

**Tales from the Road**

Georgia certainly had its share of travel troubles in the recently completed SEC season...

- The snow and ice that crippled the Southeast in mid-January also caused Georgia to improvise most of its travel during a 2-game road swing. First, the Bulldogs bused to Nashville on Jan. 11 because no plane could land in Athens. After their game at Vandy, they were stranded for two extra days because a plane still could not land in Athens. By the time they bused to Oxford on Friday, all systems were go on a return flight home. Distance traveled by bus: approx. 550 miles.

- Even more travel troubles: in the first week of February, Georgia spent over 20 hours traveling to its mid-week game at Arkansas. The Bulldogs first bused to Augusta because fog prevented a plane from landing in Athens. Next, they spent three hours on the tarmac in Augusta while examining their options for landing in a snowstorm-stricken Arkansas. Finally, after spending Tuesday night in Augusta, the Bulldogs arrived in Fayetteville early Wednesday afternoon.

### Thompkins, Leslie Nab SEC Honors

Georgia juniors **Trey Thompkins** and **Travis Leslie** this week were named to the All-Southeastern Conference 1st and 2nd teams, respectively, as voted by the league's 12 head coaches.

For Thompkins, it marked the second straight year in which he earned 1st-team status. He's the first Bulldog since Jarvis Hayes (2002 & 2003) to win the honor in two consecutive seasons. Leslie was named to the 9-man Second Team for the first time of his collegiate career.

### Georgia and the SEC

Following are a few tidbits about Georgia's history in the SEC:

- Georgia's all-time record in SEC games, covering 77 years, is 484-711 (.405). That ranks 10th of the 12 current SEC members.

- Georgia can claim one SEC regular-season championship (1990), one regular-season divisional title (2002) and two SEC Tournament crowns (1983, 2008).

- Georgia has had just one AP SEC Player of the Year: **Dominique Wilkins** in 1981 and no POY, as voted by the league's coaches since 1987. Other superlative post-season awards include Coaches' SEC Defensive Player of the Year (**Rashad Wright** in 2004), AP SEC Newcomer of the Year (**Jarvis Hayes** in 2002), and Scholar-Athlete of the Year (**Dave Bliss** in 2008).

- Wilkins was the first of four Georgia players to lead the SEC in scoring at season's end. He averaged a league-best 23.6 points per game in 1981. Others to follow him have been **Vern Fleming** (19.8 ppg in 1984), **Jumaine Jones** (18.8 ppg in 1999) and **Jarvis Hayes** (18.6 ppg in 2002).

- Georgia has an all-time SEC Tournament record of 38-49. The 2008 tourney marked the first time since 1997 that Georgia has reached the finals.

- Since the league expanded and was pared into East and West Divisions in 1992, Georgia has a 139-180 (.434) record. Eight times since '92 Georgia has had a league record of .500 or better (1993, '95, '96, '97, '01, '03, 07, '11).

- Since the league's expansion, Georgia has a 75-123 record (.376) record against the Eastern Division, a 63-57 mark (.518) against SEC Western Division teams. Bulldog teams have had winning records against the West in 13 of 19 years. Georgia's only undefeated season against the West came in 2003.

- In the 16-game SEC schedule format, Georgia's most wins came in 2003, when it compiled an 11-5 mark. The Bulldogs' timing, however, left much to be desired. That same year, Kentucky won the East with a perfect 16-0 mark and Florida placed second at 12-4. Georgia's 11-5 mark would've won the West by two games.

### Game Summary

**Jeremy Price** turned in a career-best effort and it couldn't have come at a more opportune time, when Georgia struggled throughout against a determined Auburn squad.

The Bulldogs had their share of chances to put Auburn away, both early and late. They surged in front 29-20 on a Price dunk with 6:26 left before halftime and matched it two minutes later at 33-24 on free throws by **Trey Thompkins**.

Auburn, however, fought back on consecutive 3-pointers from **Earnest Ross** and **Josh Langford**, followed by a layup from **Chris Denson**, the latter pulling the Tigers within 33-32 with 2:08 left in the opening half.

Georgia never trailed in the second half, building its lead as large as eight points, yet never seemed able to secure the victory. In the final seconds, Ross intercepted an inbounds pass by Thompkins and converted a layup that knotted the score at 67.

The Bulldogs controlled the extra period primarily with defense. They took the lead for keeps when Thompkins rebounded an Auburn miss and found **Dustin Ware** streaking for a layup and a 73-72 margin. Georgia then held Auburn scoreless on its final six possessions of the overtime.

Price matched his career highs in scoring and blocks, and he set new highs in rebounding and minutes...This marked the first time in three years that Georgia won SEC games consecutively.

**Trio Signs with Bulldogs**

The early national signing period went from Nov. 10-17, and the Georgia staff took full advantage. Head coach Mark Fox announced that day the signing of three prospective student-athletes -- two high schoolers and one junior-college transfer -- to national letters-of-intent to attend Georgia and play for the Bulldogs next season: **Tim Dixon** of Columbus, Ga., **Kentavious Caldwell-Pope** of Greenville, Ga., and **John Florveus** of Fort Myers, Fla.

Dixon, a 6-10, 215-pound forward, is currently starting his senior season at Oldsmar Christian School in Oldsmar, Fla. He transferred to Oldsmar after starring for three seasons at Kendrick High School in Columbus. Dixon averaged 16.1 points, 11 rebounds and 6.4 blocks per game as a junior in 2010 for the Cherokees.

Caldwell-Pope is beginning his senior season at Greenville High School, where he has built a reputation as one of the nation's top backcourt scorers. Last season the 6-6, 185-pound guard averaged 29.7 points per game in leading the Patriots to a 20-7 record and the second round of the Class AA state playoffs. He is rated as the third-best shooting guard in the country, 11th-best prospect overall by Rivals.com recruiting analysis.

Florveus, a 7-0, 215-pound center, is a sophomore at Hillsborough Community College in Tampa, Fla. He played as a prepster at Dunbar High School in Fort Myers before heading to Hillsborough. As a freshman last season, he averaged 4.0 points and 3.5 rebounds, but also 2.5 blocks per game, which ranked him 24th nationally in junior-college statistics.

"Two of our needs that we wanted to address with this class were length and scoring ability," Fox said. "We feel like we've certainly addressed those needs well with two long, athletic players in Tim Dixon and John Florveus, and we also added a great shooter who can score from the perimeter in Kentavious. We believe they will all fit our system very well."
