TIGERS IN SHOW-ME STATE

Auburn is 2-3 all-time in games in the state of Missouri, but this is the first time the Tigers have played a game in the Show-Me State that is not part of a tournament.

Auburn went 2-1 in the 2000 Energia Thanksgiving Tournament in Kansas City, defeating Providence 80-69 and Robert Morris 89-71 while losing to Toledo 95-90 in double overtime.

The Tigers lost both games in the 1979 Show-Me Classic in Columbia to Arkansas State, 69-62, in overtime and to George Washington, 71-60.

"EASY E" 1ST FROSH TO START SEASON OPENER SINCE 2005

Earnest Ross became the first Auburn freshman to start a season opener since Quantez Robertson, Josh Dollard and Joey Cameron started the 2005-06 season opener vs. Lipscomb.

Ross, who started in place of injured senior guard Tay Waller, totaled six points, five rebounds, two assists and two steals in 25 minutes in the win vs. Niagara last Friday.

5 GAMES IN 10 DAYS

Auburn is in the midst of playing five

games in 10 days to open the season. The Tigers defeated Niagara 69-65 last Friday, play at Missouri State Monday and play in the Glenn Wilkes Classic in Daytona Beach, Fla., this Friday through Sunday against Central Florida, IUPUI and North Carolina State.

The Tigers will be on the road for six days in an eight day span this coming week.

4 STRAIGHT ROAD GAMES

After defeating Niagara in its season opener Friday, the Tigers begin a stretch of four straight games away from Auburn beginning at Missouri State Monday.

Auburn will then play three straight games in Daytona Beach in the Glenn Wilkes Classic this coming Friday through Sunday.

Auburn's next home game is against High Point on Nov. 25.

3rd STRAIGHT ROAD WIN?

Although this is Auburn's first road game of the season, the Tigers currently have a two-game winning streak on an opponents' homecourt dating back to last season.

If the Tigers can win at Missouri State Monday, the three-straight road wins would be the longest such streak since the 2002-03 team won at Puerto Rico-Mayaguez in the San Juan Shootout, at Arkansas and at South Carolina.

Auburn went 5-6 in true road games last season, including back-to-back wins in its last two of the season at Mississippi State and at Alabama.

11-0 IN FINAL 89 SECONDS

Trailing 65-58 to Niagara with 1:30 to play in its season opener on Friday, Auburn closed with an incredible 11-0 run in the final 89 seconds for a 69-65 victory.

During the span, Reed made a conventional 3-point play with 1:29 left, stole a pass and dunked it on the other end with 52 seconds to go and then had another conventional 3-point play to close out the run.

Lucas Hargrove set up the go ahead basket with a huge game-saving block of Rob Garrison's layup with two seconds remaining.

Korvotney Barber tied a career high with 22 points to lead Auburn to a 75-60 victory over Missouri State before 5,148 in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum Friday in the season opener for both teams. The Tigers used an 11-2 run to take a 63-53 lead with 5:14 to play after the Bears closed to within 52-51 with 9:13 left. Missouri State could only get to within 67-60 with just under two minutes to play before Auburn scored the final eight points of the game. The first half was much like the second half as the Tigers broke open a 27-25 lead with two minutes left by scoring the final seven points to take a 34-25 lead at the break. Auburn bridged

That's when Auburn's defense took over as it forced three straight Missouri State turnovers that led to three consecutive Auburn layups by DeWayne Reed, Brendon Knox and a dunk by Tay Waller. Barber finished the game shooting 10-of-14 from the floor and 2-of-3 from the foul line to go along with five rebounds, two blocks, an assist and steal. Waller added 14 points on 4-of-8 three-point shooting for the

Auburn came back from a seven point deficit and outscored Niagara 11-0 in the final 89 seconds to stun the Purple Eagles 69-65 in the final season opener in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum Friday. DeWayne Reed scored a career-high 24 points to lead the Tigers in the Glenn Wilkes Classic first round. Niagara used an 11-2 run to take a 65-58 lead with 2:24 to play but did not score again as Reed scored eight straight points to give Auburn a 66-65 lead with 12.5 seconds remaining. In that incredible run, Reed made a conventional 3-point play with 1:29 left, stole a pass and dunked it on the other end with 52 seconds to go and then had another conventional 3-point play to close out the run. Lucas Hargrove set up the go ahead basket with a huge game-saving block of Rob Garrison's layup with two seconds remaining. The game was close throughout before the crowd of 4,613 as neither team had a lead larger than five until Niagara went up by seven with 2:24 to go. Auburn played without senior starting guard Waller, who was out with a quad injury. Waller ranked second in the SEC last year with 100 made 3-pointers. The Tigers finished shooting 35.1 percent from the field and 18.2 percent (4-of-22) from 3-point range. Auburn did, however, make 25-of-30 free throws for 83.3 percent. Niagara had an early 12-7 lead seven minutes in but Auburn scored eight straight to go up 15-12. There were seven lead changes and eight first half ties,

They have a returning player in Justin Fuehrmeyer, who didn't play against us last year because he was hurt. He is very solid and can get the ball where he wants to get it. They have a lot of new faces and have seven new guys like we do."

(On how the way Auburn came back and won the Niagara game will give the Tigers a lift heading into a quick turnaround road game)

"It is big. Obviously, anytime you go on the road anything can happen. We are going to go into a hostile environment. They have a new arena (in its second season). It will be full. It is their home opener with an SEC team coming in. I expect it to be a tough environment to play in. We have players who are playing on the road for the first time. I think when you win a game

like this, obviously it gives you a little pep in your step ... especially with how we won it. Hopefully, we can learn from the mistakes we made against Niagara and learn with the right way and go in with some confidence on the road. I think that is big."

REED PRESEASON ALL-SEC 2nd TEAM SELECTION

Senior DeWayne Reed was a pre-season All-SEC second team selection by both the SEC Coaches and by the media panel at SEC Basketball Media Day.

Reed averaged 13.2 points and 3.7 assists, 2.6 rebounds and 1.9 steals as a junior last year helping lead the Tigers to a 24-12 record (10-6 SEC). The Houston, Texas, native ranked third in the SEC in steals, sixth in assists and 17th in scoring. He averaged 16.0 points in three NIT games, helping Auburn advance to the quarterfinals.



RAINMAKERS

Auburn shot a torrid 43.8 percent from 3-point range by making 14-of-32 behind the arc in its exhibition win over Miles College last Friday.

Tay Waller led the Tigers making 5-of-7 treys followed by Andre Malone (2-of-4), DeWayne Reed (2-of-5), Earnest Ross (2-of-5), Lucas Hargrove (1-of-1), Josh Wallace (1-of-1) and Larry Williams (1-of-4).

NEW AUBURN ARENA OPENS NEXT SEASON

The official groundbreaking of the new \$92.5 million Auburn basketball arena and practice facility was on Aug. 29, 2008, and the arena is ahead of schedule and is on track to be finished this July prior to the start of the 2010-11 season.

The Auburn Arena, with an approximate capacity of 9,600, will include over 29,000 square feet of student-athlete space, a two-court practice facility, coaches offices, the Auburn University Athletic Ticket Office, an AU Team Store, the relocated Lovelace Museum, two food courts along with many other amenities.

360 Architecture of Kansas City, Mo., has been working with Davis Architects of Birmingham on the design of the arena. The firm of Robins & Morton of Birmingham will serve as construction manager. The 243,792 square foot facility will be built on campus north and west of the existing Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum on Roosevelt Drive, across the street from the Student Activities Center parking lot.

The new arena will feature chair back seats along with bleacher seating for students. The building also will provide improved facilities for the student-athletes, including men's and women's locker room suites with sports medicine facilities, lounges and team meeting rooms. Along with a strength and conditioning center, a two-court practice facility will enable the men's and women's teams to practice simultaneously and while the arena is in use for other purposes.



The arena will have 12 luxury suites on the arena level that will not only open inside the facility, but will also open on the outside of the arena for multiple entertaining opportunities throughout the year. Loge box seating will also be available as well as on-site food preparation.

The seating configuration will offer better sight lines and will move fans closer to the court. The furthest seat will be just 43 feet in elevation from courtside, compared to 60 feet in elevation at Beard-Eaves, with two-thirds of the seats in the new facility being less than 27 feet in elevation from courtside.

The scoreboard will feature a high-definition video board with full message/information center technology. For the student fan amenities, there will be a private entrance, a private courtside commons and food court and courtside seating that permits standing with unobstructed views.

The new facility will serve as more than a sports complex. With over 12,000 square feet of banquet/entertainment space, its design affords ready adaptation into a site for concerts, other cultural events, convocations and other community gatherings. On-campus student housing is being constructed adjacent to the new arena creating a unique "student village" experience.

Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum is entering its 41st year of service to the University, while the new arena will be Auburn's fifth home arena in the 104 years of basketball. The Tigers other arenas have been The Gymnasium (1906-16), Alumni Gym (1916-48) and the Sports Arena (1948-69).

360 Architecture has been selected to design the new Oakland A's stadium and has designed the Miami Heat's American Airlines Arena, NHL's Columbus Blue Jackets' Nationwide Arena, the University of Missouri's Mizzou Arena and the Sprint Center in Kansas City, Mo.

TIGERS IN BEMC

In its 42nd and final year of play in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum, Auburn boasts a 295-115 record (.720) over the past 26 seasons. Overall, the Tigers are 382-177 (.683) since their first season in the Coliseum in 1968-69. Only five times in the 42-year history of the arena has Auburn experienced a losing record at home. The Tigers are 1-0 at home this season.

AUBURN TRIPLE-DOUBLES?

Never in the 103 seasons and 2,245 games of Auburn Basketball (1202-1042-1) (.536) has a Tiger recorded a coveted triple-double.

OVERTIME RECORD

Auburn has a 44-43 (.506) record in overtime games in its history. The Tigers last overtime game was a 60-59 loss to Dayton in the Chicago Invitational on Nov. 28, 2008. Auburn has not played an overtime game this year.

WHAT'S NEXT?

Auburn plays UCF next Friday at 5 pm Central in the second round of the Glenn Wilkes Classic in Daytona Beach, Fla. The Knights (1-0) opened the season with a 84-67 victory over UMass in Orlando on Friday. Isaac Sosa scored a career-high 26 points, making 6-of-7 from 3-point range to lead the Knights, who shot 54.5 percent from the field for the game. UCF plays host to Howard on Tuesday prior to playing Auburn. UCF returns three starters from last year's team that went 17-14 overall and tied for sixth in Conference USA with a 7-9 record. Sophomore guard Isaac Sosa is the leading returning scorer after averaging 8.2 points last season followed by sophomore guard A.J. Rompza (4.3 ppg) and junior guard Taylor Young (3.3 ppg). The biggest name on the UCF roster is 6-foot-3 freshman guard Marcus Jordan, the son of the best basketball player of all-time, Michael Jordan. UCF has averaged 18.6 wins over the last five seasons. UCF doesn't have any scholarship seniors, two juniors, four sophomores and six freshmen.

Auburn came back from a seven point deficit and outscored Niagara 11-0 in the final 89 seconds to stun the Purple Eagles 69-65 in the final season opener in Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum Friday. DeWayne Reed scored a career-high 24 points to lead the Tigers. Niagara used an 11-2 run to take a 65-58 lead with 2:24 to play but did not score again as Reed scored eight straight points to give Auburn a 66-65 lead with 12.5 seconds left. In that incredible run, Reed made a conventional 3-point play with 1:29 left, stole a pass and dunked it on the other end with 52 seconds to go and then had another conventional 3-point play to close out the run. Lucas Hargrove set up the go ahead basket with a huge game-saving block of Rob Garrison's layup with two seconds remaining. The game was close throughout as neither team had a lead larger than five until Niagara went up by seven with 2:24 to go. Auburn played without senior starting guard Waller, who was out with a quad injury. Waller ranked second in the SEC last year with 100 made 3-pointers. The Tigers finished shooting 35.1 percent from the field and 18.2 percent (4-of-22) from 3-point range. Auburn did, however, make 25-of-30 free throws for 83.3 percent. Sophomore Frankie Sullivan added 10 points and seven rebounds while Brendon Knox chipped in seven points and five boards in 22 minutes. Villanova transfer and fifth-year senior Bilal Benn led Niagara with 16 points and a game-high 13 rebounds while Anthony Nelson added a team-high 17 points and Demetrius Williamson 16 points and seven rebounds.
