Former head coach Joe Ciampi is Auburn's winningest all-time coach and is a Class of 2005 member of the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame.

In 27 years as a head coach, Ciampi posted an overall record of 607-213, which ties him as the 13th-winningest Division I coach in wins all-time. In his 25 seasons with Auburn, Ciampi amassed a record of 568-203.

Ciampi guided Auburn to 16 NCAA appearances, which included 10 berths in the Sweet Sixteen, six appearances in the Elite Eight and three Final Four appearances. His teams won three Mideast Regional championships and played in the national championship game in 1988, 1989 and 1990. In 2003, Ciampi led the Tigers to a Women's National Invitational Tournament Championship.

Auburn won four Southeastern Conference regular-season titles in 1981, 1987, 1988 and 1989 and four SEC Tournament titles in 1981, 1987, 1990 and 1997 under Ciampi. He was named the National Coach of the Year in 1987, 1989 and 1993 and the SEC Coach of the Year in 1985, 1988 and 1989.

Auburn finished with a 26-7 record in 1981, claiming the 1981 SEC regular-season title. In just the second season of the SEC, Auburn won nine games against conference teams.

Auburn freshman Becky Jackson scored 615 points that season, leading all freshman scorers in Auburn history. Jackson also added 359 rebounds on the year, which remains second in freshman history.

Jackson went on to score 2,068 points and 1,118 rebounds in her career, which led both categories all-time at Auburn at the time.

The 1981 SEC Tournament Championship was as it should be for all Alabamians, a battle between Auburn and Alabama. The Tigers defeated Alabama 61-50 in Baton Rouge, La., in the second-ever SEC Tournament.

Tiger All-American Jackson, and tournament MVP, led the Tigers with 14 rebounds and 11 points. Teammate Angie Hannah led all scorers with 14 points and Lori Monroe contributed 10 points and 10 rebounds.

The Crimson Tide shot just 33.9 percent from the field in the 11-point Auburn victory.

Auburn's Hannah joined Jackson on the SEC All-Tournament team.

Auburn clinched the 1987 SEC regular season title by defeating LSU 71-62 in Baton Rouge. With that win, Auburn finished the regular season with a record of 26-1 and 8-1 in SEC play for their second regular-season title in school history.

The one loss on the season came in a one-point heartbreaker to Georgia earlier in the season.

Vickie Orr led the team in the win over LSU with 22 points, followed by Mae Ola Bolton with 13 and Ruthie Bolton scoring 12.

Auburn fought back to avenge its only loss of the season, defeating Georgia, 83-57, in the SEC Tournament title game. The title was the second for Auburn.

The No. 2-ranked Tigers were led by tournament MVP Vickie Orr, who scored a career-high 32 points and grabbed 12 rebounds in the win. Helene Barody also contributed 12 assists and Diann McNeil scored 16 points.

The game remained close with a Auburn leading 37-29 at the half, but the potent Tiger offense took control of the game, while the defense held the Bulldogs to just 33 percent in the second half.

The Tigers held Georgia's leading scorer, Katrina McClain to just nine points, well below her average of 26.

Auburn defeated Tennessee 102-96 in the semifinals.



Auburn picked up its second-consecutive SEC regular season title with an 89-57 defeat of Vanderbilt in Nashville with a 26-1 overall record and a 9-0 SEC mark.

The win not only gave the Tigers the SEC title, but also put them in the No. 1 spot nationally in the Associated Press poll.

Against Vanderbilt, Sharon Stewart had an outstanding game, scoring 28 points while grabbing 23 rebounds on the day. She was followed by Diann McNeil and Ruthie Bolton with 12 points each.

The lone loss of the season came against fifth-ranked Iowa, 73-69, at the Miami/Burger King Classic.

The Tigers went on to a 32-3 record overall and a trip to their first of three consecutive NCAA Tournament championship games. Auburn ended up falling in the title game to Louisiana Tech 54-56.

The Tigers finished the season with a 10-3 record against teams ranked in the AP Top-25 with all three losses coming against teams ranked in the top five.

Auburn spent the entire season ranked in the top-three of the AP poll, including two weeks as the No. 1 team in the nation.

On the season, Orr led the team in scoring with 16.1 points per game and finished second in rebounding with 6.8 per game. Stewart led the team on the boards with 8.8 rebounds per contest and was second to Orr in scoring with 13.8 points.

Ten minutes into the game, Auburn went on a 17-4 run, building a 37-23 lead for the Tigers, one they would not relinquish.

The Tigers went on to a 32-2 record on the year falling only in the finals of the SEC Tournament and the NCAA Championship game to Tennessee.

Auburn posted an 8-2 record against teams ranked in the AP top-25 with both losses coming against the Lady Vols.

The Tigers were ranked in the top 10 in the nation throughout the entire season and spent nine weeks as the top team in the country.

On the season, Orr led the team in both scoring and rebounding with 15.9 points and 8.6 rebounds per game. Jones was second on the team in scoring with 14.5 per game, along with a team-best 16 three-pointers on the season.


Coming into the tournament, Auburn was the No. 9 seed with a 5-7 conference record. The Tigers went on to win four consecutive games in four days, a feat no other team has recorded in SEC history.

When the Tigers reached the final game with No. 6 Florida, a 52-47 victory, the contest was anti-climactic after the impressive run Auburn had at the tournament.

On its way to the title game, Auburn defeated Ole Miss, 72-64, No. 4 Georgia, 67-61 and tournament-favorite No. 8 Tennessee, 61-59, in the semifinals.

In the win over No. 6 Florida, Laticia Morris led the Tigers with 22 points and eight rebounds, followed by Tiffany Krantz with 10 points.

Auburn held Florida to just 27 percent from the field and 44 percent from the free throw line. Auburn, however hit 85.7 percent from the free throw line and would use those shots to secure the win by sinking 12-of-14 in the final three minutes of the game.

# Nine-Time SEC Champions

The 2008-09 Auburn women's basketball team rattled off 20-straight wins to open the season, en route to the team's first Southeastern Conference regular-season title in 20 years and a 30-4 season record.

After sweeping its non-conference schedule, the Tigers won their first five SEC games, including an 82-68 win over Tennessee in front of a sellout crowd at Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum, before falling to Georgia. Auburn won another five games in a row before taking its second loss to Vanderbilt, but capped off the season with a pair of wins for a 12-2 SEC slate.

Auburn clinched at least a share of the title with a 65-59 home win over Georgia before taking sole possession of the championship with a 94-57 victory over Arkansas. Vanderbilt and LSU both finished two games behind the Tigers with 10-4 records.

SEC Player of the Year DeWanna Bonner led Auburn against Georgia with 22 points and nine rebounds, followed by an eight-point, nine-assist, six-rebound effort from Whitney Boddie.

The Tigers were able to clinch the SEC title outright a week later with the home win over the Razorbacks. All 10 Tigers saw action in the game as Bonner tallied 25 points to lead the way for the Auburn win. Sherell Hobbs followed with 18 points while Boddie tallied 10 of her own along with eight assists.

The Tigers went on to finish runner-up in the SEC Tournament, falling to Vanderbilt in the championship game. Auburn also advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Auburn's first trip to the NCAA Tournament Final Four was a memorable one for the Tigers. It was so close, they could taste the title.

With a 14-point lead in the championship game against Louisiana Tech, Auburn was eyeing its first-ever NCAA title. The Tigers would never see that title come to fruition, however, as the Lady Techsters fought back, defeating Auburn 56-54.

Auburn was up 33-19 just 47 seconds into the second half to take the largest lead of the game. Louisiana Tech climbed back and took the lead with 2:13 remaining in the game at 53-51.

Auburn's Vickie Orr tied up the game at 53-53 with a jumper, but Louisiana Tech's Angela Lawson took the lead for good for the Lady Techsters on a three-point shot with 59 seconds remaining.

Auburn defeated Long Beach State in the semifinals of the Final Four 68-55, earning the right to play Louisiana Tech in the finals. Ruthie Bolton led the team with 18 points, 10 steals and seven assists, including scoring 10 of Auburn's final 18 points in the game.

Louisiana Tech advanced to the finals by defeating defending national champion Tennessee 68-59 in the Final Four.

The Tigers advanced to their second NCAA Tournament title game, but again came up short with a 76-60 loss to a familiar foe, the Tennessee Lady Vols.


Tennessee gave Auburn its only two losses of the season, as the Tigers concluded the season with a 32-2 record.

Vickie Orr played for the Tigers from 1985-89, and remains Auburn's No. 3 scorer in school history with 2,035 points.

Orr is one of just three players to reach the 2,000-point mark and is one of three Auburn players to reach the top five in both points and rebounds (fourth).

With her 1,006 career rebounds, Orr became a fast Auburn legend. The three-time All-American at Auburn was named the Alabama Collegiate Female Athlete of the Year in 1989 and was a finalist for the Champion/WBCA and Naismith Player of the Year Awards.

Her legend grew as the Decatur, Ala., native moved on to international success following her days on the Plains. In 1992, Orr was instrumental in leading the U.S. to a gold medal in the Olympics. She helped lead her teams to gold medals in the 1990 Goodwill Games, World Championships and the U.S. Olympic Festival.

Ruthie Bolton came to the Plains in her older sister Mae Ola's shadow. It didn't her long to step out on her own, however, as Ruthie became possibly the most recognizable name in Auburn women's basketball history.

Bolton played in a record 132 contests for the Tigers and holds the record for games started in a season at 35 and steals in a game with 10.

When Bolton's time at Auburn was up, the McLain, Miss., native continued advancing her skill and went on to a highly-successful 15-year professional basketball career including being a part of 10 U.S. national teams.

In addition to playing for the Sacramento Monarchs of the WNBA from 1997-2002, Bolton became recognizable as a two-time gold medalist in the 1996 and 2000 Olympic games as part of team USA.

In 1991, Bolton was named the USA Basketball Female Athlete of the Year.

Carolyn Jones, or C.J., as she is referred to, was a two-time All-American in 1990 and 1991.

Jones was the first player in Southeastern Conference history to be named the SEC Player of the Year in back-to-back seasons.

She remains Auburn's fifth-best scorer with a career 1,831 points and is second for points in a season with 703.

If you needed a hot shooter down the stretch, Jones was the person you called as she holds the career record for three-point percentage at .415.

In addition to her All-America honors, Jones was named the Alabama Female Athlete of the Year, a finalist for Champion/WBCA and Naismith Player of the Year and the 1990 SEC Tournament Most Valuable Player.

In 1992, Jones helped lead the U.S. Olympic team to the bronze medal and the 1990 World Championship and Goodwill Games titles.
