The Tigers take on Tennessee Tech and Notre Dame to open Friday. Virginia Tech and Tulsa are the opponents Saturday followed by UAB Sunday.

Currie Throws Her Seventh Career No-No ... Holly Currie tied a career-high with 15 strikeouts en route to her seventh career no-hitter in Auburn's 8-0, six-inning win over Georgia State Wednesday.

Currie, who threw five no-hitters last season, worked quickly, throwing 100 pitches. She walked just two, with eight of her 15 strikeouts coming in the first three innings. No Georgia State batter advanced past second base. The Panthers hit the ball out of the infield just once in a fly out to Lauren Walton in the fifth inning.

Tatiana Fernandez and Lindsey Harrelson both hit their first home runs of the season in the win over the Panthers.

A Look Ahead ... Auburn enjoys almost a week off after the Tiger Invitational. The Tigers will head to nearby Columbus, Ga., for the NFCA Leadoff Classic Feb. 23-25.

At the Classic, Auburn is scheduled to play No. 15 Michigan, North Carolina, Southern Illinois and Hofstra. All four teams in pool play advanced to an NCAA Regional last season.

Strikeouts ... Holly Currie and Anna Thompson have combined for 76 strikeouts in just 46 2/3 innings this season. That's an average of more than 1.6 strikeouts per inning.

What returns in 2007 ... The Auburn softball team returns 12 letterwinners from last season's club that went 36-22 overall and earned its first berth into an NCAA Regional Championship game. The Tigers have four seniors -- Holly Currie, Sara Ghezzi, Nicole Russo and Lauren Walton -- who will anchor the 18-player roster. Currie and Ghezzi are multiple postseason award-winners, while Russo and Walton have seen substantial playing time.

As noted above, the Tigers return approximately 60 percent of their offense from last season, with Currie, Ghezzi and sophomore Tatiana Fernandez headlining the lineup. Ghezzi earned All-SEC Second Team honors last season while Fernandez was recognized as a All-Freshman honoree.

Newcomers ... The Tigers welcome six newcomers into the fold this season, including four freshmen and two transfers. The four freshmen are pitcher Anna Thompson and infielders Whitney Wyatt, Krista Klein and Alicia Hunolt. Junior transfer Jessica Martin and sophomore Lindsey Harrelson both come from Central Alabama Community College in Alexander City.

Current Auburn assistant coach Jack Byerley headed the program at CACC from 1996-2000.

Deese In 11th Season ... Auburn head coach Tina Deese is in her 11th season at the helm of the Auburn softball program and 19th overall. The former Huntingdon College head coach is 335-291-1 in 11 seasons with the Tigers and has taken Auburn to three straight NCAA postseason berths.

Deese is the only SEC head coach to remain with her club since its inception. She has the sec-

ond-most tenure of any SEC coach, trailing South Carolina's Joyce Compton, who is in her 21st year with the Gamecocks.

Deese won her 600th career game in Auburn's 1-0 victory March 8 of the 2006 season. That came just a month after she won her 300th game at Auburn in 15-1 defeat of Miami (Ohio) in the second game of the season on Feb. 10.

Thompson's Auspicious Start ... Freshman Anna Thompson may have gone 0-3 in Hawaii, but that record is deceiving. The Huntsville, Ala., native had an impressive first collegiate weekend. She struck out 38 in just 23 innings and limited opponents to just 13 hits and three walks.

Thompson posted three double-digit strikeout efforts, getting 11 each against Nebraska on Feb. 8 and Hawaii Feb. 9. She then struck out 10 in a 5 2/3 inning relief effort Feb. 10.

Thompson's 38 strikeouts is already more than one-third of the way toward the AU single-season freshman record of 103 set by Janet Spivey in 2003.

Rotation ... Jorja Bell had just 11 at bats entering the 2007 season, but has surpassed that number with 17 official plate appearances this season. The New Zealand native has started all seven games this season, splitting time behind the plate, at first base and as designated player.

A Closer Look At Thompson And Currie ... Anna Thompson and Holly Currie have combined to start six of Auburn's seven games and pitch in 46 2/3 of the team's 49 innings. Combined, the duo has 76 strikeouts and allowed just 27 hits.

Even better, Thompson and Currie have walked a total of 11 batters. The duo's WHIP (Walks plus hits per inning pitched) is at an astounding .81. Thompson and Currie's strikeouts to walks ratio is an incredible 6.9:1.

Going Deep ... Auburn has four home runs in seven games this season, and coincidentally, all four have been two-run shots. Sara Ghezzi and Holly Currie hit two-run jacks against DePaul Feb. 10, while Tatiana Fernandez and Lindsey Harrelson went deep against Georgia State Feb. 14 at Jane B. Moore Field.

Ghezzi Nearing 200 ... Sara Ghezzi needs just seven games played to become the 10th Tiger in team history to see action in 200 career games. With eight starts, she'll become just the seventh AU player with 200 or more starts.

That's A Mighty Fine Schedule You Have There ... The 2007 schedule may be one of the best in Auburn's history. Of the team's 37 opponents this season, 18 reached the postseason last year. In fact, the Tigers will face stiff tests throughout their early season tournaments. Auburn will play eight teams that made it to an NCAA Regional last year through the first month of play. The Tigers will be especially tested at the NFCA Leadoff Classic Feb. 23-25 where they will face North Carolina, Michigan, Southern Illinois and Hofstra, all postseason clubs a year ago.

Tiger Seniors ... Auburn's seniors have been the most accomplished group in team history, winning 130 games overall and 55 in Southeastern Conference play since 2004.

Just Learn To Say 'No' ... Holly Currie's no-hitter against Georgia State Feb. 14 marked the seventh of her career. The senior holds the AU career record for no-no's. She also holds the single-season record with five last season. She is the only Tiger with a perfect game, achieved February 11, 2005 against the College of Charleston.

Ghezzi, Ghezzi and More Ghezzi ... One of the most consistent players in Auburn history, Sara Ghezzi is also one of the most recognized. The senior outfielder is the first Tiger to earn three SEC honors in her first three seasons. She was a Freshman All-SEC member her first year, then followed that up in 2005 with an All-SEC First Team selection. Last year, after batting .357 overall and .295 in conference games, she was selected to the second team.

Currie, Part 2 ... Holly Currie also has 665 career strikeouts, placing her second in team history. Her 101st strikeout this season will give her 728 for her career, which would surpass Kristen Keyes, currently the team's record holder, who had 627 from 2002-04.

Currie has 20 career double-digit strikeout efforts.

Outstanding Defense ... Auburn has committed just three errors in the team's seven games this season, spanning a total of 175 total chances. That's good for a .983 fielding percentage.

The defensive prowess was never more important than in Holly Currie's no-hitter against Georgia State. Nicole Russo made a stab of a sharply-hit grounder at the start of the fifth inning to keep the no-hitter alive. The play was just one of two assists awarded to Auburn players in the win.

TV Time ... Currently, the Tigers are scheduled to air on television once in the third game a three-game series at Tennessee. The game will be April 22 at 1 p.m. CT. and will air on Fox Sports.

Should the Tigers advance to the SEC Tournament Championship Game, they will be on Fox Sports at 12 p.m. CT.

SEC Coaches Vote AU Third ... Conference Coaches voted the Tigers third in the SEC West in a preseason poll that was announced Jan. 22. Auburn trails LSU and Alabama and was ahead of Arkansas, Mississippi State and Ole Miss.

Tennessee was selected to win the East and the conference overall, while Georgia was No. 2, Florida third, South Carolina fourth and Kentucky fifth.

Checking In With The Fall ... Auburn went 8-0 in its fall games, outscoring its opponents by a combined 63-0 score. Sara Ghezzi led the offense with a .636 batting average, hitting one home run.

She also posted four doubles and 16 RBI. Brittany Scott went 7 for 15 in the eight games while Holly Currie was 11 for 24 with two home runs and nine RBI.

Anna Thompson led the team's pitchers with 34 strikeouts in 14 innings. She limited opponents to a .087 batting average. Opponents hit .094 against Currie, who worked 16 innings, striking out 25 while walking just four. Brittany Day, meanwhile, struck out nine batters in nine innings. She allowed just three hits.

Change In The SEC Schedule ... The Southeastern Conference reduced its schedule by two games for the 2007 season, giving each team 28 conference games instead of the 30 that had been the norm since the SEC's inception in 1997.

Beginning this year, teams will play 14 games on the road and at home. Each team will still play two midweek series -- one away and one at home -- although those will now be two games instead of three. Those games will be played as a doubleheader.

Jane B. Moore Field ... Auburn will call Jane B. Moore Field home for the 10th straight season. The venerable facility hosted its first game in 1998 and was officially dedicated in Dr. Moore's name in 2003. The facility, which hosted a 2005 NCAA Regional, seats 1,500 and will be the site of the 2007 SEC Tournament.

The Tigers are **131-80 (.621)** at Jane B. Moore Field since 1998 and are **65-18 (.783)** the past three seasons.

Last season, the Tigers rode a 19-win season at home as the team saw an average of 439 fans at Jane B. Moore Field, easily a record.

Hosting The 2007 SEC Tournament ... Auburn's Jane B. Moore Field will be the site of the 2007 SEC Softball Tournament, scheduled to be held May 10-12. It marks the first time the tourna-

ment will come to Auburn as the Tigers are just the fourth program to host since it came on-campus in 2004. Alabama, Florida and Georgia have also hosted the tournament.

The SEC Tournament is a single-elimination tournament, with four games scheduled for the first day. The championship game will be held that Saturday with the winner guaranteed the conference's automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament.

SEC Tournament Tickets ... Tickets for the tournament went on sale Feb. 1. Single-session tickets are \$10 for adults and \$5 for youth (18 and younger). A full-tournament ticket can also be purchased for \$20 for adult and \$10 youth. It will be good for all seven games of the tournament.

About The Auburn Assistants ... Head coach Tina Deese is assisted by coaches Jack Byerley and Stewart McGill. Byerley is in his third season with the Tigers and McGill his first, although he has served as a student manager the past two seasons.

Byerley came to the Auburn program prior to the 2005 season after two seasons as the head coach at Francis Marion in South Carolina. Prior to serving as head coach there, he was an assistant at Florida. His first stop in the SEC came after a four-year stint as the head coach at Central Alabama Community College. Byerley was the head coach at Robertsdale (Ala.) High School from 1989-96.

McGill is well-known in SEC circles after serving as a student manager with Auburn the past two years after two seasons in the same position at Arkansas. He also has two years of international head coach experience after guiding the Florida Quicksilver at the annual Canada Cup in British Columbia. Current Tigers Lauren Walton, Holly Currie, Ashley Arcuri and Jorja Bell played for McGill's team this past offseason.

Tigers Switch To Under Armour ... The Auburn softball uniforms may have looked the same in 2006 to the casual observer, but the Tigers made one key change to the uniforms. The uniforms are now made by Under Armour Performance Apparel as part of a five-year contract signed in December of 2005 that makes Under Armour the official outfitter of all of Auburn's athletic teams. The contract, worth \$10.6 million in sponsorship, product and additional benefits, will see Auburn's athletic teams wearing Under Armour uniforms, cleats, apparel and accessories beginning in the 2006-07 academic year.
