Gene Chizik is no stranger to Auburn. The program's defensive coordinator from 2002-04, Chizik was named Auburn's 26th head coach on December 13, 2008, after serving the two previous seasons as head coach at Iowa State.

A 23-year coaching veteran, Chizik helped Auburn and Texas to consecutive undefeated seasons in 2004 and 2005. His three-year stint as Auburn's defensive coordinator culminated in 2004, when he helped guide the Tigers to a 13-0 season while earning the Frank Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach.

Chizik also served as the assistant head coach and co-defensive coordinator at Texas from 2005-06 where he helped the Longhorns to a perfect season and national championship in 2005.

During his tenure at Auburn, Chizik's 2004 defense led the nation in scoring defense (11.3 ppg) and was fifth nationally in total defense, allowing just 277.6 yards per contest. In three years at Auburn, Chizik helped the Tigers to a 30-9 mark includ-

ing an 18-6 Southeastern Conference record. In 2003, Auburn's defense was fifth nationally in total defense.

In his two seasons in Austin, the Longhorns were 22-3. At one point, he was a part of 29 consecutive victories, which began in 2003 at Auburn and ended in 2006 at Texas.

Chizik's reputation as an outstanding teacher is evident by the fact that he tutored a remarkable three consecutive Thorpe Award winners, starting with Auburn's Carlos Rogers in 2004, followed by Texas' Michael Huff and Aaron Ross in 2005 and 2006, respectively.

During his two seasons at Iowa State, the 46-year old Chizik was in the midst of a rebuilding process, directing the Cyclones to a 5-19 mark. The Iowa State administration rewarded Chizik's leadership and vision for the program by offering him a two-year contract extension following the 2008 season.

Chizik's first win came against intrastate rival Iowa in 2007, making him the first Cyclone coach since 1907 to beat the Hawkeyes in his inaugural season. The 2007 season also included conference wins over Kansas State and bowl-bound Colorado.

Auburn's undefeated season of 2004 saw one of the best defensive teams ever to wear a Tigers uniform. Not only did they lead the nation in scoring defense, but they surrendered just four rushing touchdowns all season, including allowing none over the first eight games of the season. That vaunted 2004 defense featured eight of 11 starters that went on to play in the NFL, including 2005 first-round draft pick cornerback Carlos Rogers and defensive lineman Jay Ratliff, who earned All-Pro honors with the Dallas Cowboys in 2008.

The 2003 AU defense under Chizik was just as talent laden as the undefeated squad, as eight of 11 starters went on to play in the NFL as well. Led by first-team All-SEC picks Karlos Dansby, DeMarco McNeil and Dontarious Thomas, Auburn was fifth nationally in total defense, seventh in rushing defense and ninth in the country in scoring defense.

By allowing less than 300 yards of total offense in consecutive seasons in 2003 (281.6 ypg) and 2004 (277.6 ypg), it marked the first time at Auburn since a six-year run from 1985-90, that an Auburn defense had accomplished the feat in back-to-back campaigns.

In his first season at Auburn, Chizik took a club that was 39th nationally in total defense the season before he arrived and improved it to 26th in the country while holding three Top 10 teams - LSU, Alabama and Penn State - to less than 10 points each en route to victory.

During his 39 games at Auburn as defensive coordinator, the Tigers were able to defeat nine Top 10 programs, win three bowl games, and hold 24 of 39 opponents to two touchdowns or less, including 14 that managed single digits against his aggressive, physical defenses.

He also tutored three All-Americans in Dansby, Rogers and Junior Rosegreen and had nine players earn 10 first-team All-SEC honors. Chizik had 10 players over three seasons that went on to be NFL draft picks.

Chizik's defense played an integral part in Texas' 2005 national championship season as the Longhorns ranked eighth nationally in scoring defense, 10th in total defense and fourth in pass efficiency defense. UT allowed opponents to reach 300 yards of total offense only five times in 2005 and held the remaining eight opponents to less than 267 yards. Ten UT defenders were all-Big 12 Conference selections, including four who made the first team.

In 2006, Chizik's Longhorn defenders were second nationally against the rush (58.8 ypg.) after 12 games, including limiting No. 1 Ohio State to just 79 yards on the ground. His aggressive schemes resulted in 100 tackles for loss, 96 quarterback hurries and 30 takeaways during the 2006 regular season.

Chizik coached six Longhorns to All-American honors in his two seasons, including Aaron Harris, Michael Huff and Rod Wright in 2005, and Tim Crowder, Michael Griffin and Aaron Ross in 2006. His defensive players earned 18 All-Big 12 awards during his tenure.

Prior to his arrival at Auburn, Chizik was the defensive coordinator for four seasons (1998-01) at Central Florida, where he improved a unit





that was 81st nationally in total defense before his arrival to one that was 16th in the country in 2001.

Chizik spent six seasons at Stephen F. Austin from 1992-97, overseeing the linebackers (1992-94) and secondary (1995-97). While at Stephen F. Austin, Chizik helped the Lumberjacks to back-to-back NCAA Division I-AA playoffs, including a national semifinal appearance in 1995.

He began his coaching career as defensive coordinator (1986-88) at Seminole High School in St. Petersburg, Fla., before becoming a graduate assistant at Clemson for a pair of 10-win teams in 1988-89. Chizik's first full-time college coaching position came at Middle Tennessee State, where he helped lead the Blue Raiders to NCAA Division I-AA playoffs in both of his seasons (1990-91) and to a conference championship in 1990.

Chizik earned his B.A. degree in education from Florida in 1985 and his M.A. in guidance and counseling from Clemson in 1991.

A Clearwater, Fla., native, Chizik and his wife, Jonna, have identical twin daughters, Landry Grace and Kennedy Danielle, and a son, Cally.

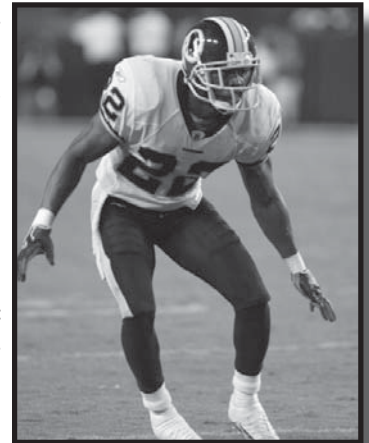

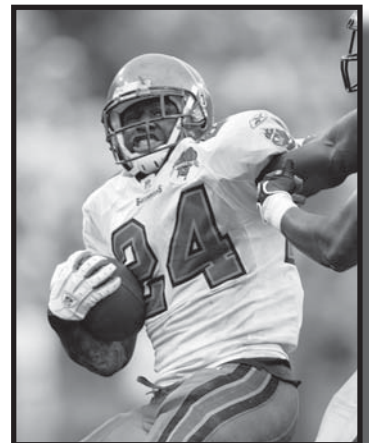

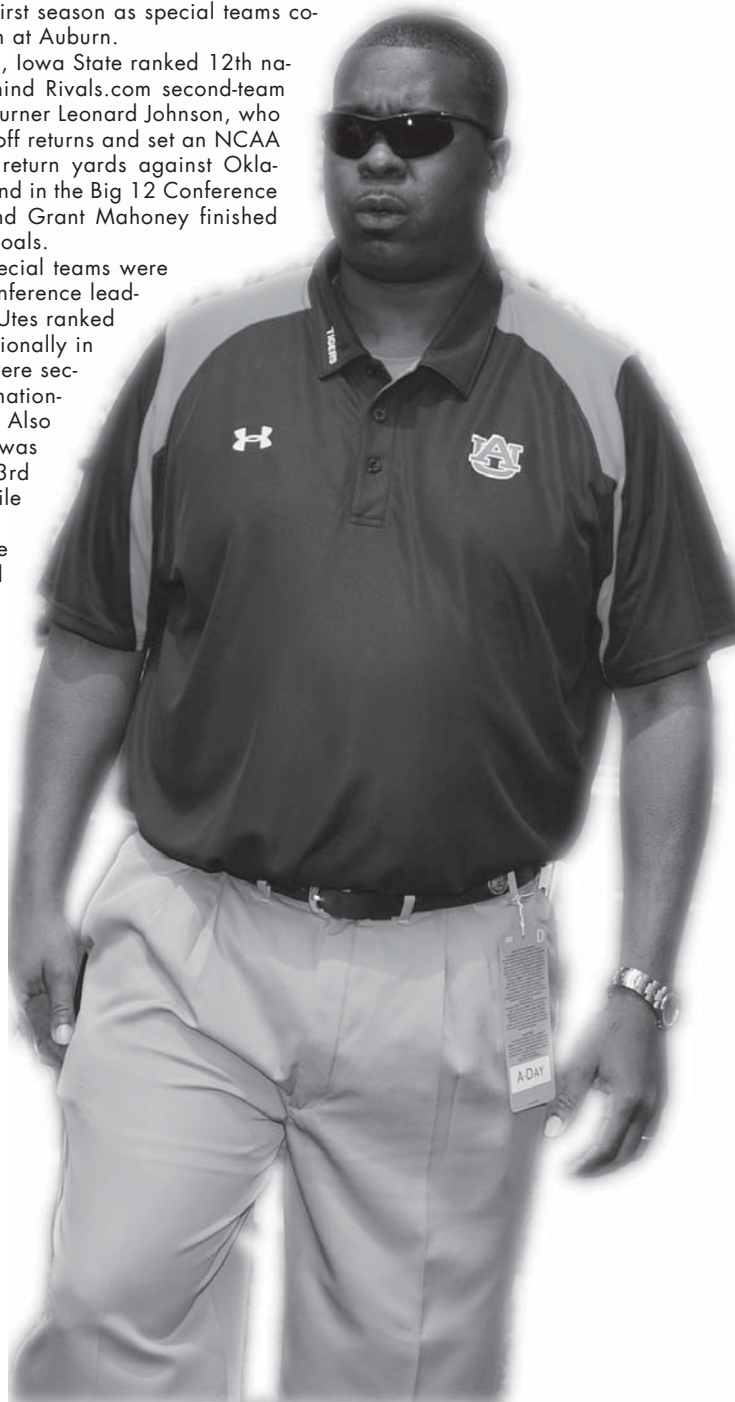

Jay Boulware is in his first season as special teams coordinator and tight ends coach at Auburn.

In 2008 under Boulware, Iowa State ranked 12th nationally in kickoff returns, behind Rivals.com second-team freshman All-American kick returner Leonard Johnson, who ranked 19th nationally in kickoff returns and set an NCAA FBS record with 319 kickoff return yards against Oklahoma State. ISU was also second in the Big 12 Conference in kickoff returns in 2008, and Grant Mahoney finished second in the league in field goals.

While at Utah, his Ute special teams were among the Mountain West Conference leaders in several categories. The Utes ranked first in the MWC and 31st nationally in kickoff returns in 2005, and were second in the league and 30th nationally in kickoff returns in 2006. Also in 2006, Marquis Wilson was second in the MWC and 23rd nationally in punt returns, while



Brice McCain was second in the MWC in kickoff returns.

Boulware was a two-year letterman at offensive line while playing for the University of Texas. He began his coaching career at Texas, where he helped the Longhorns to bowl games all three seasons.

Under his direction, several Boulware-coached players have earned national honors and played in the National Football League. At Northern Illinois, he recruited future All-American and current Atlanta running back Michael Turner. During Boulware's tenure at NIU, the Huskie offense ranked 12th nationally in rushing as two-time all-MAC offensive lineman Ryan Diem moved on to the NFL, where he plays for the Indianapolis Colts. While at Arizona, Boulware coached all-Pac 10 tailback Mike Bell, who now plays for the New Orleans Saints.

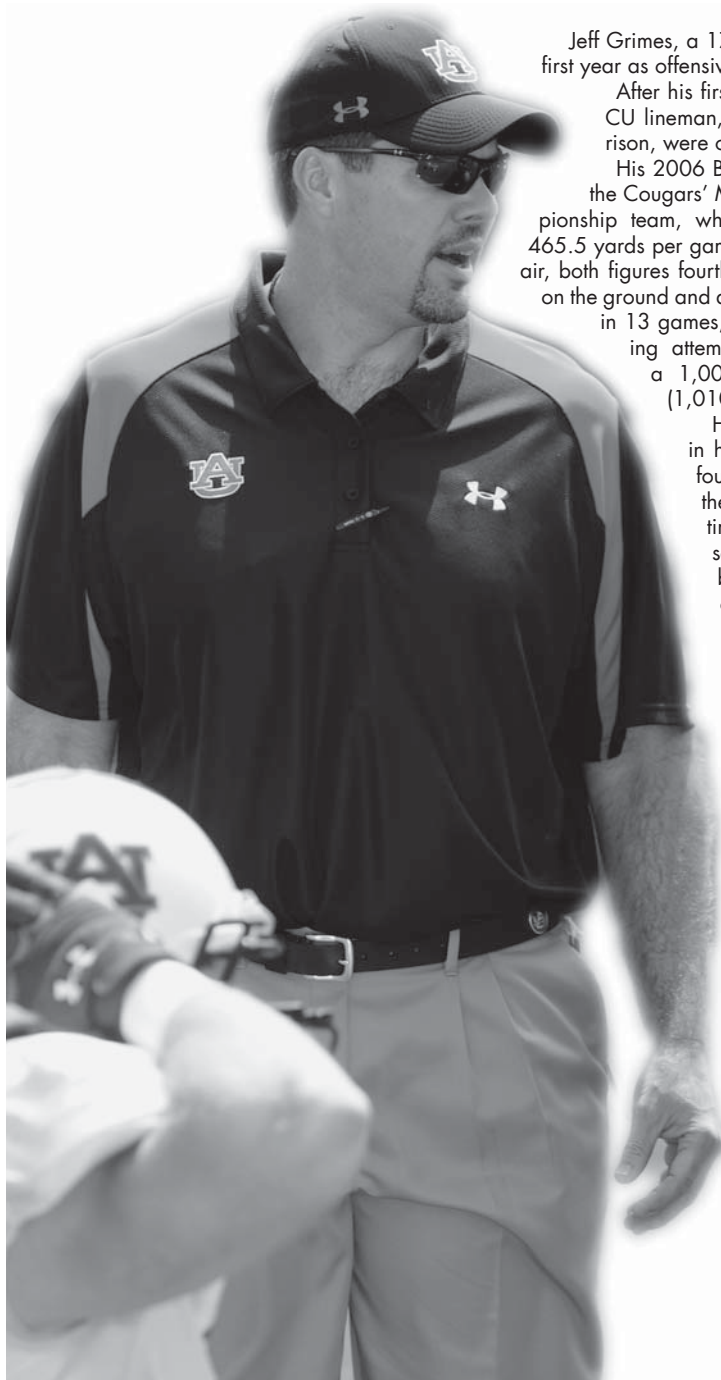

OFFENSIVE LINE



Jeff Grimes, a 17-year coaching veteran, is in his first year as offensive line coach at Auburn.

After his first season at Colorado, two of his CU linemen, Tyler Polumbus and Edwin Harrison, were on NFL rosters in 2008.

His 2006 BYU linemen were a large part of the Cougars' Mountain West Conference championship team, which finish 11-2. BYU averaged 465.5 yards per game on offense, 323.5 through the air, both figures fourth in the nation, averaged 141.9 on the ground and allowed just 15 quarterback sacks in 13 games, or just one for every 30.1 passing attempts. The Cougars also boasted a 1,000-yard rusher in Curtis Brown (1,010 yards).

His players achieved great success in his tenure at Arizona State. With four of his 2001 seniors drafted into the NFL, it marked just the second time that had been done at any school since the NFL adopted the seven-round draft format in 1993. He then assembled a new offensive line in 2002 that protected the ninth-rated passing offense in the country, the core of the same group that a year later helped Loren Wade break the ASU freshman rushing record and lead the Pac-10 in yards per carry.

In one season at Boise State in 2000, Grimes' offensive line helped the Broncos lead the nation in scoring offense and accumulate 175 rushing yards per game.

At Hardin Simmons, the Cowboys were 21-2 in his two seasons, reaching the national semifinals in 1999 and averaged 39.4 points per game during his tenure, eclipsing 50 on six occasions.

Grimes earned four letters as an offensive tackle for UTEP between 1987 and 1990. He was in training camp with both the Los Angeles Raiders of the NFL and the San Antonio Riders of the World Football League before entering coaching.

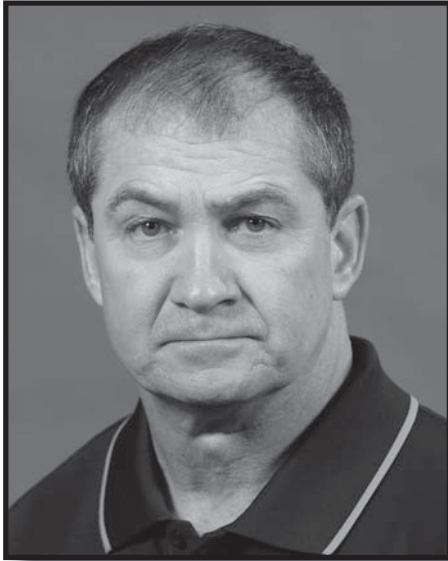

CORNERBACKS



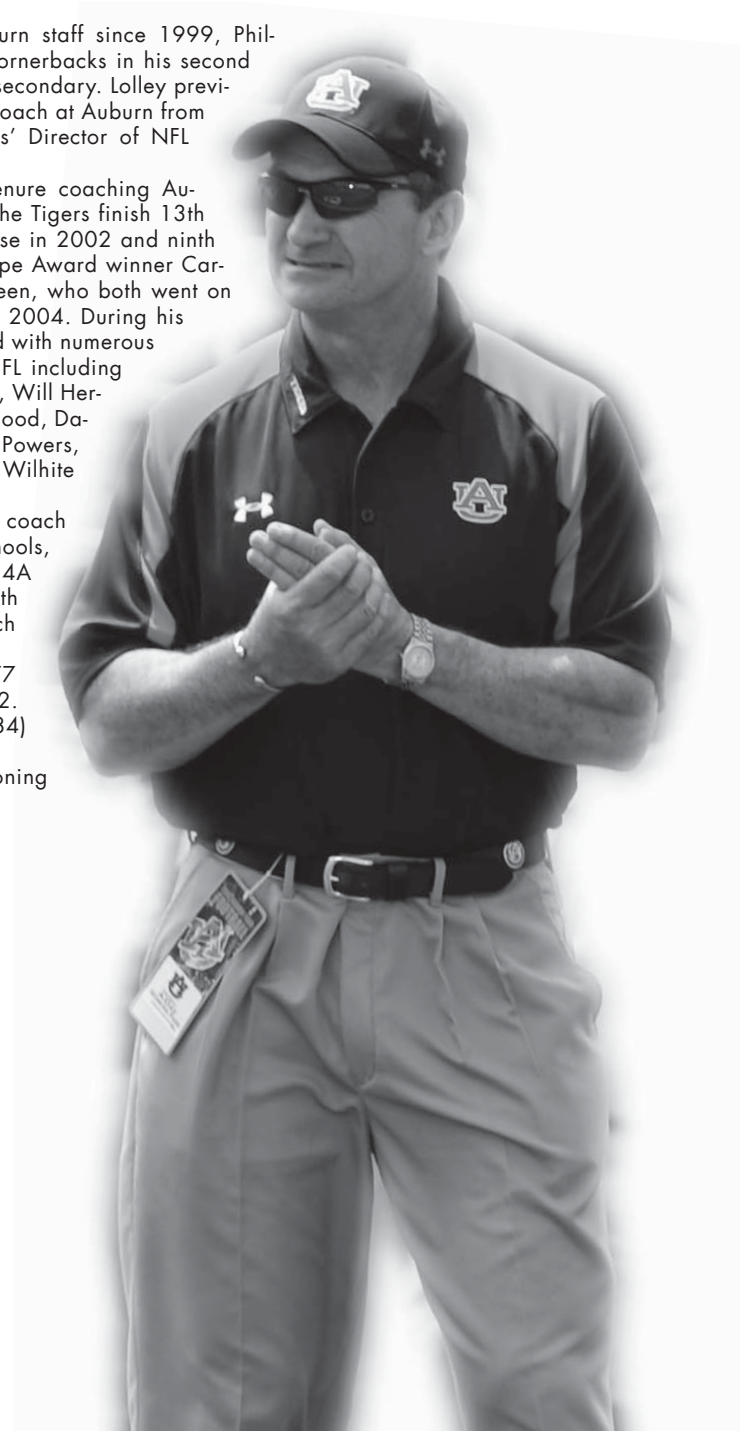
A member of the Auburn staff since 1999, Phillip Lolley coaches Auburn's cornerbacks in his second stint working with the Tigers' secondary. Lolley previously served as a secondary coach at Auburn from 2002-03, and was the Tigers' Director of NFL Relations from 2004-08.

During Lolley's first tenure coaching Auburn's secondary, he helped the Tigers finish 13th in the nation in scoring defense in 2002 and ninth in 2003. Lolley coached Thorpe Award winner Carlos Rogers and Junior Rosegreen, who both went on to earn All-America honors in 2004. During his time at Auburn, he has worked with numerous players that went on to the NFL including Rogers, Rosegreen, Eric Brock, Will Herring, Kevin Hobbs, Roderick Hood, David Irons, Patrick Lee, Jerraud Powers, Travaris Robinson, Jonathan Wilhite and Horace Willis.

A 22-year high school coach standout in the state of Alabama, Lolley served as head coach at three schools, including North Jackson High School, where he led the program to the 1993 4A state championship. A native of Butler, Ala., Lolley spent 11 seasons at North Jackson from 1988-98, where his team advanced to the state playoffs each year.

Lolley began his coaching career at South Choctaw Academy in 1977 before becoming the head coach at Warrior Academy in Eutaw, from 1978-82. He also served as defensive coordinator at Demopolis High School (1982-84) and head coach at Stevenson High School (1984-87).

Prior to his coaching stint at Auburn, Lolley was a strength and conditioning coach on the Plains from 1999-00.

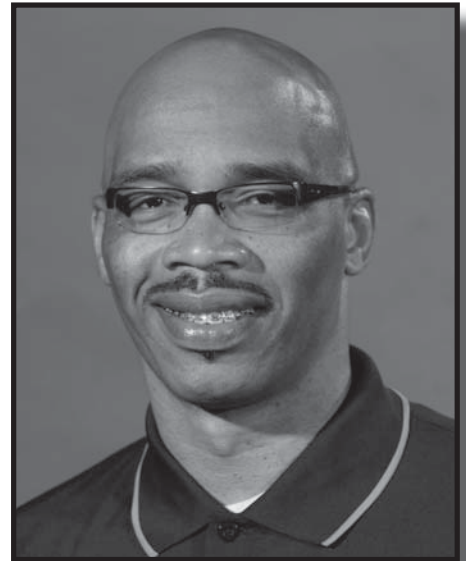

Curtis LUPER

RUNNING BACKS



Curtis Luper is in his first year as running backs coach at Auburn, and also serves as the Tigers' recruiting coordinator, after a four-year stint at Oklahoma State. Under Luper, the OSU running attack led the Big 12 Conference in rushing the last three seasons and finished the 2008 campaign averaging 245.5 yards per game, which ranked eighth nationally.

Oklahoma State finished seventh nationally and first in the Big 12 Conference in rushing in 2006 and 2007, averaging 243.2 and 208.0 yards per game, respectively. Under Luper's tutelage, the Cowboys had back-to-back 1,000 yard rushers in Kendall Hunter (1,555) in 2008 and Dantrell Savage (1,272) in 2007.

During his time as an assistant coach at New Mexico, Luper coached the Mountain West Conference's career rushing leader in DonTrell Moore and helped the Lobos finish 16th nationally in rushing in 2003. New Mexico advanced to bowl games in each of Luper's three seasons in Albuquerque.

Luper began his playing career at Oklahoma State, where he played from 1984-87, but his stay was interrupted from 1988 to 1992 when he served as an air traffic controller for the United States Army.

During his tenure in the Army, Luper spent eight months combined at Fort McClellan in Anniston, Ala. and Fort Rucker near Enterprise, Ala.

He completed his eligibility at Stephen F. Austin as a 27-year-old running back in 1993, when he led the team in rushing with over 1,000 yards and scoring.

Luper is currently completing his doctorate degree, having completed all but his dissertation, on which he is currently working.

Gus MALZAHN



OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR/QUARTERBACKS

Gus Malzahn is in his first season as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Auburn.

During his two seasons at Tulsa, Malzahn's offenses were among the nation's finest, ranking first nationally in total offense in 2007 and 2008.

The 2008 Tulsa offense averaged 569.9 yards per game and was second nationally averaging 47.2 points per games. The Hurricane offense was first in the country in third down conversion percentage (57.0 pct.) and yards per play (7.27 ypp) and was also fifth nationally in rushing offense (268.0) and ninth in passing offense (301.9 ypg).

In 2007, Malzahn's offense ranked as the nation's top offense, gaining 543.9 yards per game. The Hurricane also ranked third nationally for passing, fifth for pass efficiency and 10th for scoring offense.

Tulsa's offense in 2007 established nine team school records

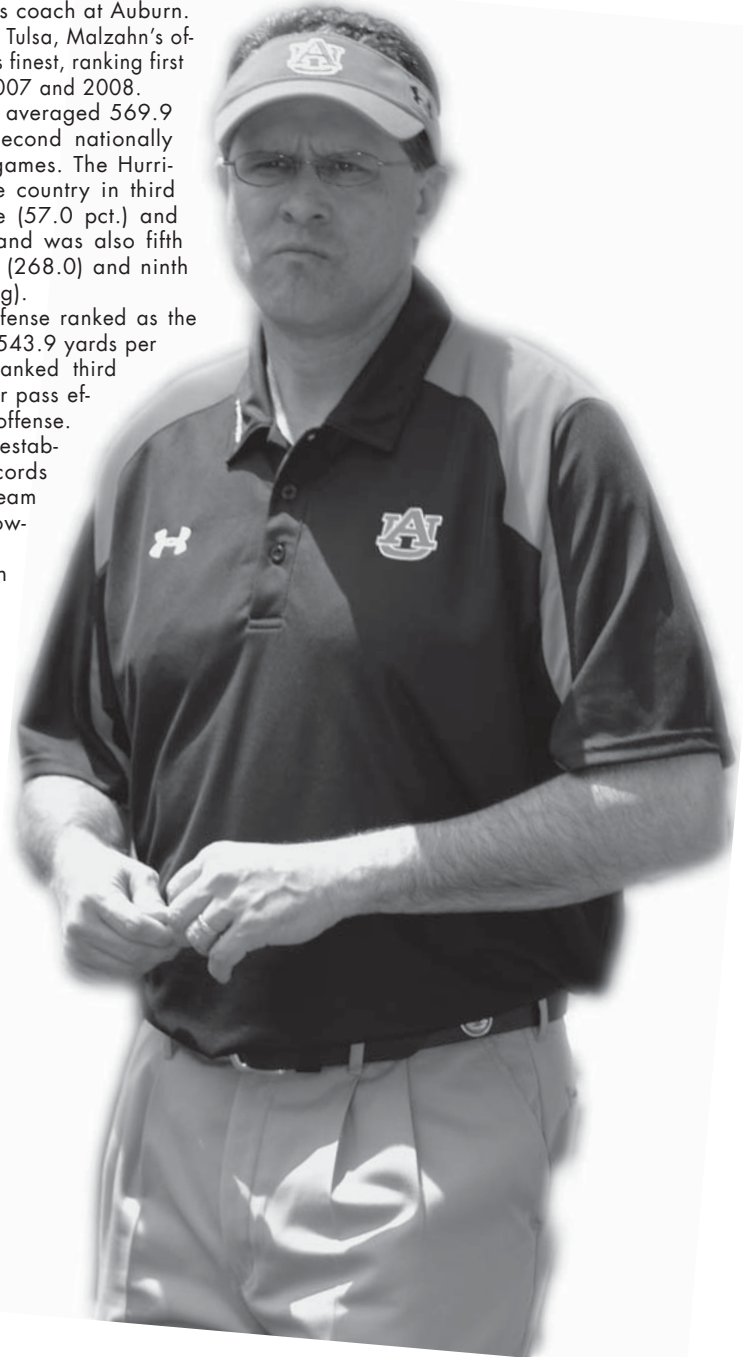
and 12 individual records. The Hurricane also set nine Conference USA team records, while Tulsa quarterback Paul Smith broke an NCAA record by throwing for at least 300 yards in 14 consecutive games.

During Malzahn's one season at Arkansas, the Razorbacks finished with a 10-4 record and were SEC West Division Champions.

Two of Malzahn's three collegiate offenses have ranked in the top 10 nationally in rushing, including the 2008 Tulsa team that was fifth averaging 268.0 yards per game, and his 2006 Arkansas offense that was fourth nationally (228.5 ypg) behind Heisman Trophy runner-up Darren McFadden and fellow All-American Felix Jones.

Arkansas was also ranked among the top-35 nationally in total offense and scoring offense. He was named the Rivals.com National Offensive Coordinator of the Year in 2006.

In 14 seasons as a high school head coach, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. Malzahn coached two quarterbacks, Josh Floyd and Rhett Lashlee, who set national passing records. Malzahn also tutored 2005 Gatorade, Parade Magazine and Rivals.com National Player of the Year Mitch Mustain at Springdale High School.

Tracy ROCKER

DEFENSIVE LINE

Former Auburn All-American Tracy Roker is in his first season as the defensive line coach at Auburn. Roker was the first SEC player ever to win both the Outland and Lombardi Trophies, and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2004 and Alabama's state Sports Hall of Fame in 2005.

A two-time All-American (1987, '88) selection, Roker was named SEC Player of the Year during his senior season. He finished his career with 354 tackles, including 21 quarterback sacks and 48 tackles for loss.

During his tenure, Auburn won SEC Championships in 1987 and 1988, and he was voted to Auburn's Team of the Century in 1993.

In his one season at Ole Miss, the Rebels tied for first nationally in tackles for loss with 112 and tied for fourth in the nation with 39 sacks. Ole Miss' defense also was fourth nationally in rushing defense (85.5 ypg), 19th in total defense (307.3 ypg) and 20th in scoring defense (19.0 ppg).

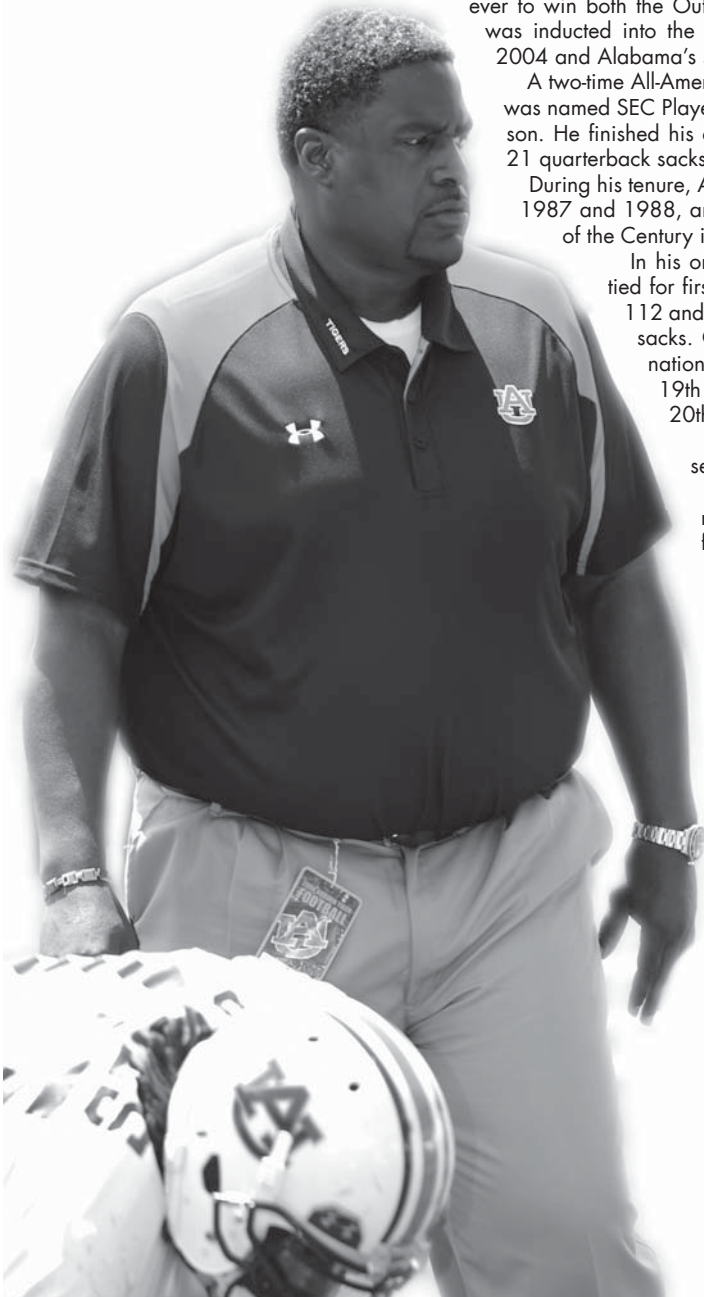
Roker mentored Peria Jerry to second-team All-American honors and Greg Hardy to third-team recognition.

Roker's 2006 line at Arkansas ranked No. 4 in the SEC and 33rd in the nation in rushing defense, holding opponents to 114.57 yards per game. Arkansas also ranked first in the SEC and No. 21 nationally in tackles for loss with 6.93.

Under Roker's guidance, Jamaal Anderson earned honorable mention All-American honors after totaling 14 sacks and 20.5 tackles for loss, ranking third nationally in sacks per game and 12th in tackles for loss. He was selected as the eighth pick of the first round of the 2007 NFL Draft, while fellow Razorback defensive lineman Keith Jackson was taken in the seventh round.

In his first season with the Razorbacks, UA's 2003 defensive line helped the Hogs finish fifth in the SEC in total defense, allowing 344.0 yards per game.

While at Troy State, three of his players received Division I-AA All-America honors, including Al Lucas, who earned the 1999 Buck Buchanan Award as the top defensive player in Division I-AA.

DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR/LINEBACKERS



Ted Roof, who was nominated in 2000 for the Broyles Award, given annually to the nation's top assistant coach, is in his first season as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Auburn.

Roof spent the 2008 season as defensive coordinator at Minnesota, where the Gopher defense allowed 135 fewer yards and 12 fewer points per game than in 2007, while improving from 1-11 to 7-6 and a bowl appearance.

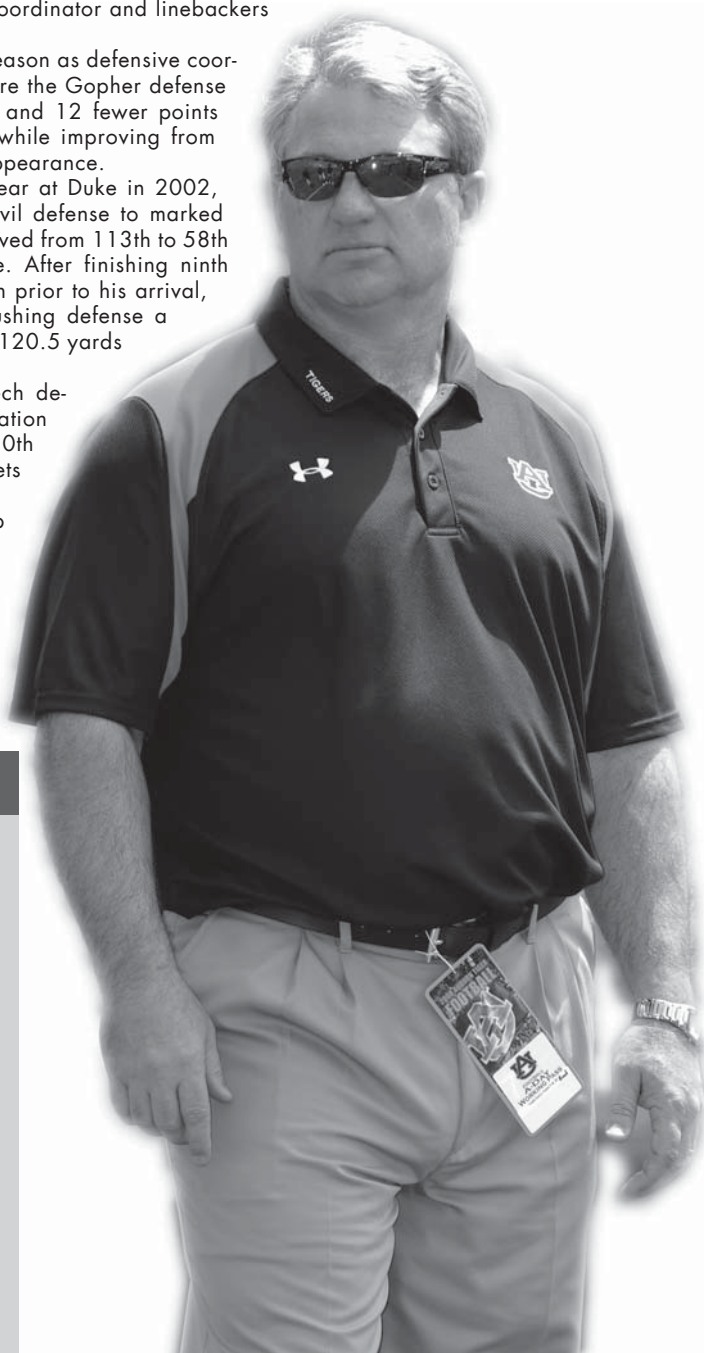
Likewise in his first year at Duke in 2002, Roof directed the Blue Devil defense to marked improvements, as Duke moved from 113th to 58th nationally in total defense. After finishing ninth in the ACC against the run prior to his arrival, Duke led the league in rushing defense a year later by allowing just 120.5 yards per game on the ground.

His 2000 Georgia Tech defense ranked 12th in the nation in rushing defense and 20th

in scoring defense, allowing just 19.0 points per game, as the Yellow Jackets posted a 9-3 record and were ranked 17th in the final national poll.

In 2001 under Roof, the Yellow Jackets were again one of the top defenses in the nation, ranking 23rd nationally in total defense and 32nd in rushing defense.

As a player, Roof was a starter his final three seasons at Georgia Tech and served as team captain as a senior. A first team All-ACC selection in 1985, Roof ranks seventh on the Jackets' all-time tackling list with 417. Named the Defensive Back of the Year in 1985 by the Atlanta Touchdown Club, Roof was enshrined into the Georgia Tech Athletics Hall of Fame in 1998.

Trooper TAYLOR

ASSISTANT HEAD COACH/WIDE RECEIVERS

Trooper Taylor is in his first season as assistant head coach and wide receivers coach at Auburn.

In 2008 in his only season at Oklahoma State, Taylor helped the Cowboys produce instant results as the OSU offense produced two first-team All-Americans in wide receiver Dez Bryant and running back Kendall Hunter.

Bryant earned consensus All-America honors after having 87 receptions for 1,480 yards and a school-record 19 touchdowns. A Biletnikoff Award finalist and academic all-conference member, Bryant led the Big 12 and was third nationally in receiving. Hunter, meanwhile, rushed for 1,555 yards and 16 scores with nine 100-yard rushing games.

With Taylor serving as co-offensive coordinator, the 2008 Oklahoma State offense also boasted a finalist for the Manning Award presented to the nation's top quarterback (Zac Robinson) and a finalist for the Mackey Award presented to the nation's top tight end (Brandon Pettigrew).

Nationally known for his prowess on the recruiting trail, Taylor was recognized by Rivals.com as a top-25 recruiter in 2005 and 2007.

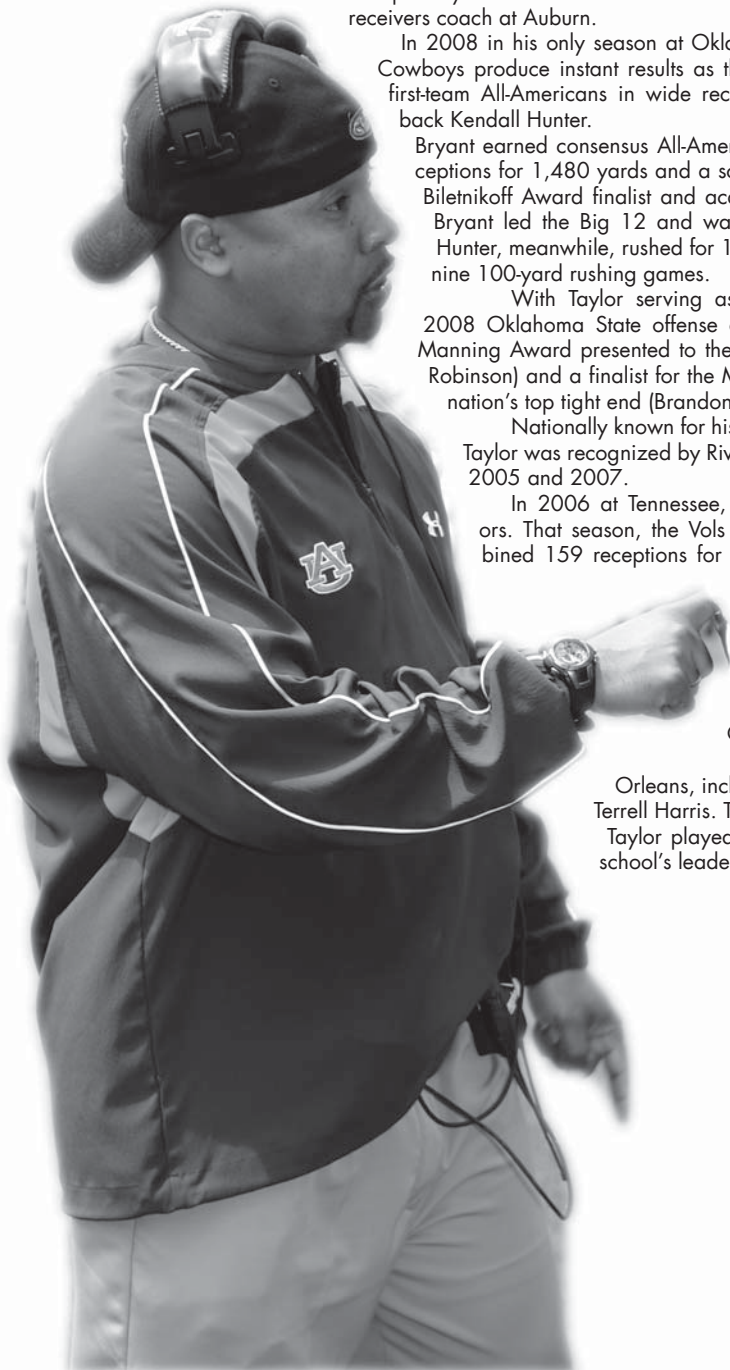
In 2006 at Tennessee, Taylor coached future NFL wide receiver Robert Meachem to All-America honors. That season, the Vols receiving trio of Jayson Swain, Bret Smith and Robert Meachem tallied a combined 159 receptions for 2,439 yards and 22 touchdowns. With all three players gone in 2007, Taylor coached the new pass-catching trio of Lucas Taylor, Austin Rogers and Josh Briscoe to a combined 175 catches for 2,130 yards and 14 touchdowns.

He also directed the Vols running backs from 2004-05, coaching Cedric Houston and Gerald Riggs Jr., who became Tennessee's only pair of 1,000-yard rushers in the same season, in 2004.

While at Tennessee, he helped the program make appearances at the 2005 Cotton Bowl, the 2007 Outback Bowl and the 2008 Outback Bowl.

Taylor coached four Tulane wideouts into the NFL during his tenure in New Orleans, including the nation's top receiving trio in 2001 of Adrian Burnette, Kerwin Cook and Terrell Harris. They combined to lead the country with 2,384 receiving yards on 185 catches.

Taylor played defensive back at Baylor from 1988-91 and finished his playing career as the school's leader in kickoff returns (53) and return yardage (1,063).

Tommy Thigpen is in his first season as an assistant coach for the secondary at Auburn.

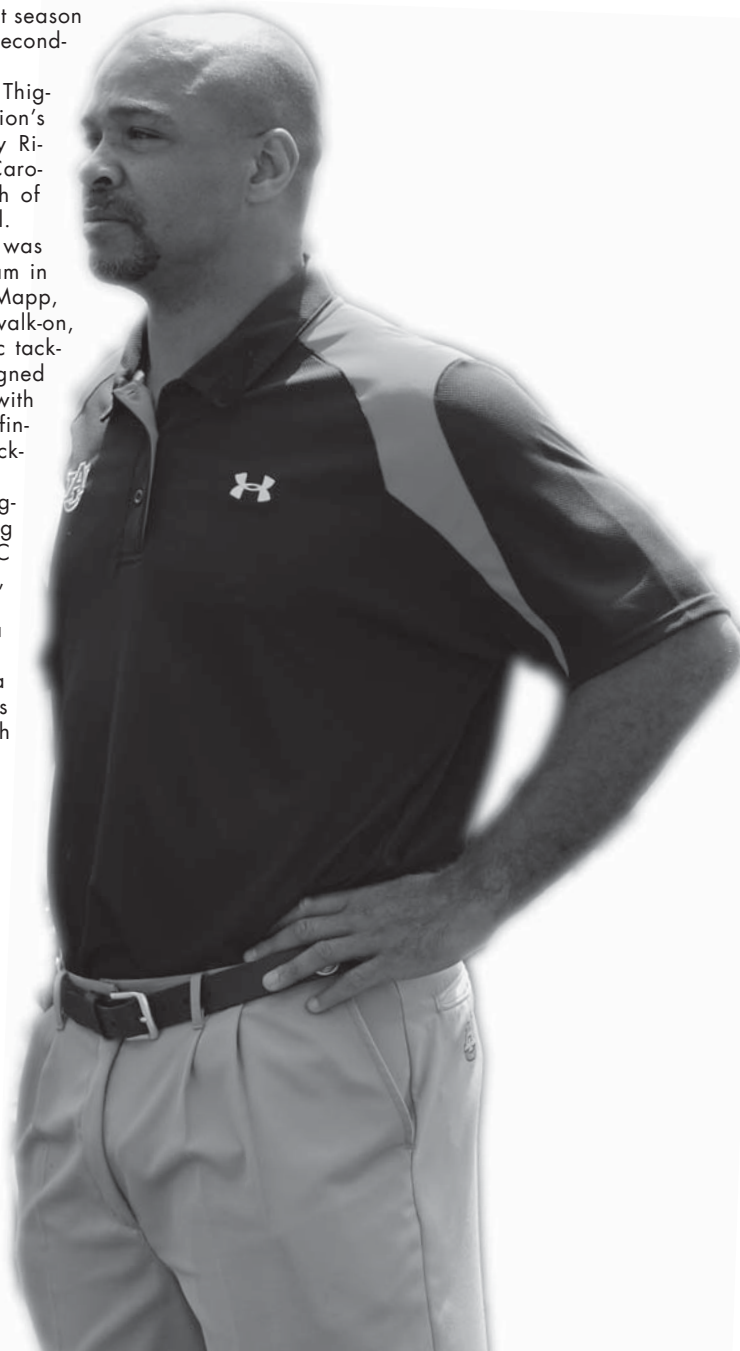
An exceptional recruiter, Thigpen was named one of the nation's top 25 recruiters in 2007 by Rivals.com and tutored North Carolina's leading tacklers in each of his four seasons at Chapel Hill.

Among his pupils at UNC was Durrell Mapp, who led the team in tackles in 2006 and 2007. Mapp, who came to Carolina as a walk-on, left as one of the most prolific tacklers in Tar Heel history and signed an NFL free agent contract with the Green Bay Packers. He finished second in the ACC in tackles per game

At Bowling Green State, Thigpen helped coach one of the Mid-American Conference's top defenses, leading the MAC in turnover margin in 2002. BGSU also finished second in the MAC in pass efficiency defense, while Thigpen's special teams also were impressive, blocking seven punts and one field goal.

Thigpen, 38, achieved accolades as a Parade All-America and Virginia Defensive Player of the Year at Potomac High School in Dumfries, Va.

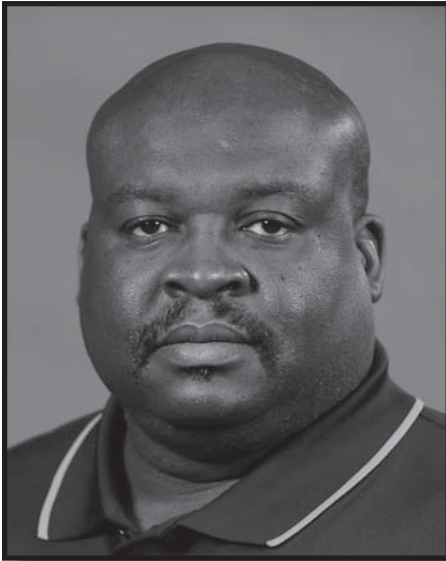

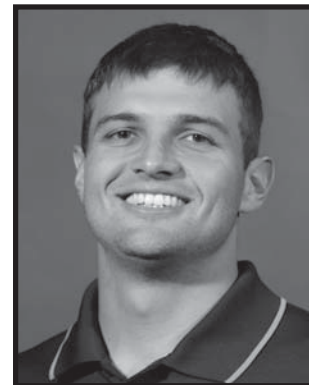

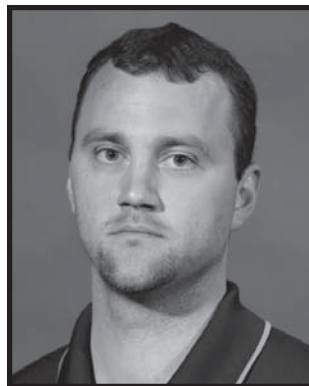

Jay Gogue began his tenure as Auburn University's 18th president on July 16, 2007.

The Waycross, Ga., native is a two-time Auburn graduate in horticulture, receiving a bachelor's degree in 1969 and a master's in 1971. In 1973, he earned a doctorate in horticulture from Michigan State University.

Shortly after returning to his alma mater, Gogue engaged the talent and insight of the Auburn family toward development of a dynamic and forward-looking strategic plan to guide the University for the future. Students, alums, employees, business leaders and other stakeholders contributed to a roadmap that will strengthen Auburn's academic, research and outreach mission, improve operational efficiency and develop human capital. The Auburn Board of Trustees adopted the strategic plan on June 27, 2008.

Gogue arrived at Auburn with ample experience in the top ranks of academia. He was selected president of New Mexico State University in 2000 and, in 2003, named president of the University of Houston and chancellor of the University of Houston System.

Gogue worked for the National Park Service from 1973 to 1986, rising to the position of chief administrative scientist for several regions of the U.S. Park system. He began his distinguished career in higher education administration in 1986 as associate director of the Office of University Research at Clemson University, where he also served as vice president for research and vice president/vice provost for agriculture and natural resources. Utah State University selected Gogue as provost in 1995.

Gogue met his wife, Susie, in the 8th grade, and they married during their undergraduate years at Auburn. Susie also earned two Auburn degrees. They are the proud parents of three children and have two grandchildren.

He is a member of Phi Kappa Phi and Golden Key honor societies, Sigma Chi Fraternity, Sigma Xi scientific research society and the National Society of Scabbard and Blade, the honorary military society for all branches of service. Gogue previously served as an accreditation reviewer for the Pacific Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges.

Auburn Director of Athletics Jay Jacobs has a vision of leading Auburn Athletics to becoming the nation's preeminent Athletics Department.

In his tenure at the helm of the Tigers' program, the department has prospered athletically, academically and financially.

Under Jacobs' leadership, Auburn Athletics has made major strides benefitting Auburn student-athletes, coaches and fans.

The department has focused on five strategic goals under his leadership: Winning, graduating student-athletes, managing the department's fiscal affairs, complying with SEC and NCAA rules and providing a professional game day experience.

The Auburn Athletics Department has consistently ranked in the top 10 percent of the NACDA Directors Cup and has claimed eight national championships under Jacobs, including a school-record four titles in 2005-06, along with 14 Southeastern Conference titles.

Academically, Auburn has earned five public recognitions by the NCAA for scoring in the 90th-100th percentile nationally in the Academic Progress Rate (APR).

Jacobs served as the Senior Associate Athletics Director for Tigers Unlimited prior to his appointment as Director of Athletics and has initiated several successful business ventures for the Athletics Department, including a five-year contract with Under Armour Performance Apparel and a nine-year extension with multi-media rights holder ISP Sports.

During Jacobs' tenure, Auburn has also moved forward with numerous facility projects designed to benefit Tiger athletic programs and their fans, most notably, the construction of the \$92.5 million state-of-the-art basketball arena and practice facility that will open prior to the 2010-11 season.

Auburn’s Eagles

For over 100 years, eagles have been associated with Auburn University’s football program. From a static presence on the sidelines to rousing flights over the field, WAR EAGLE has become an Auburn icon.

The role of Auburn University’s eagles is to promote wildlife conservation as a part of the education initiatives of the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service and the College of Veterinary Medicine’s Southeastern Raptor Center. The USF&WS permits the Raptor Center to house eagles and use them on hundreds of educational presentations each year – including Auburn’s home football games. Currently, three flighted eagles and numerous other non-releasable raptors are used for these educational programs. Eagles stir emotions in many people as they have come to symbolize strength, power and courage as well as other important values such as freedom, American heritage and the preservation of our environment. Golden Eagles Tiger (War Eagle VI), Nova (War Eagle VII) and Spirit (a Bald Eagle) are the eagles who have inspired football fans with their graceful flights over Jordan-Hare Stadium.

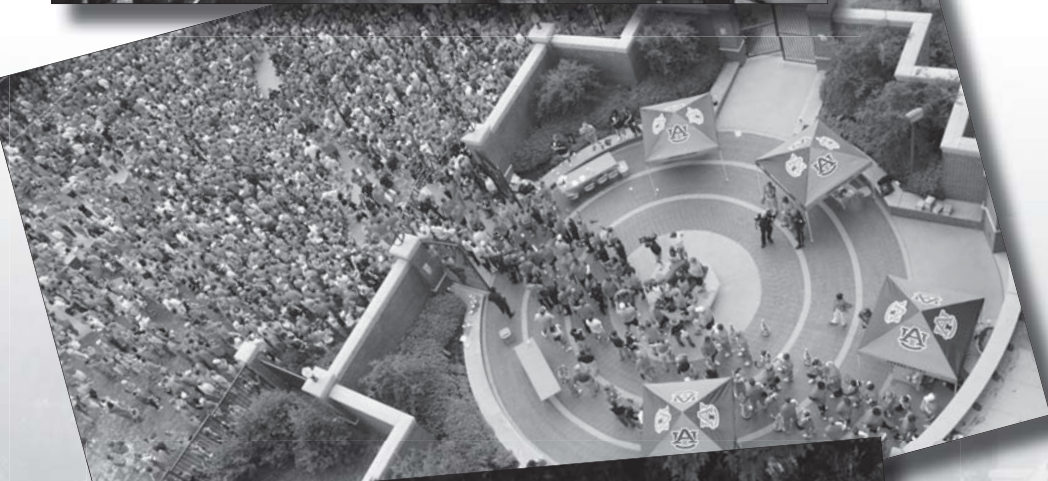

Tiger WALK

An Auburn Tradition

An Auburn tradition which began in the early 1960s when Auburn players would walk from Sewell Hall to the football stadium and fans would line Donahue Drive to wish them well. Over the years Tiger Walk has grown into a major part of game day at Auburn, so much so that it is listed on the players' game weekend itinerary. The largest Tiger Walk is believed to have taken place prior to the 1989 Alabama game when more than 20,000 well wishers lined the street. Every Tiger Walk prior to home games draws thousands, and, over the last couple of years the Tiger Walk has become a standard as Auburn football players enter stadiums on the road. Tiger Walk is two hours before kickoff for every game.



Toomer's CORNER

The center of town where the Auburn University campus meets the City of Auburn. Toomer's Corner, where College Street intersects Magnolia Avenue, has long been the gathering place for Auburn athletic celebrations. After any football win, and significant victories in other sports, Auburn students and citizens alike join forces to "roll" the trees (and anything else that doesn't move) at Toomer's Corner with toilet tissue. Celebrations after significant football victories can go on for hours and leave the heart of town looking like a blizzard passed through.

Jordan-Hare Stadium

Auburn's showcase football stadium which seats 87,451 with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the East side of the stadium. The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats that are now incorporated into the West stands. Ten years later 14,000 more seats were added and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium, although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span. Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980 and the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season. The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973.

Pat Dye Field

The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships. Auburn's home games are now played at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Lowder Student Athlete Development Center, with 33,000 square feet of dedicated space to students and learning, gives Auburn University the physical infrastructure that allows the ability to implement and expand the array of programs designed to enhance the academic performance of Auburn student-athletes. Located adjacent to the Auburn Athletic Complex, the facility is centrally located for easy access for all Tiger athletic teams.

The goals of the Charlotte G. Lowder Student Athlete Development Center are to create an opportunity for one-stop learning for all services including academic counseling, life skills, and tutorial services; to utilize the technology available to support academic missions; and to create a showplace that honors achievements of student-athletes. In addition, programs are designed to develop leadership skills and a strong altruistic attitude, which are fundamental characteristics of the Auburn graduate.

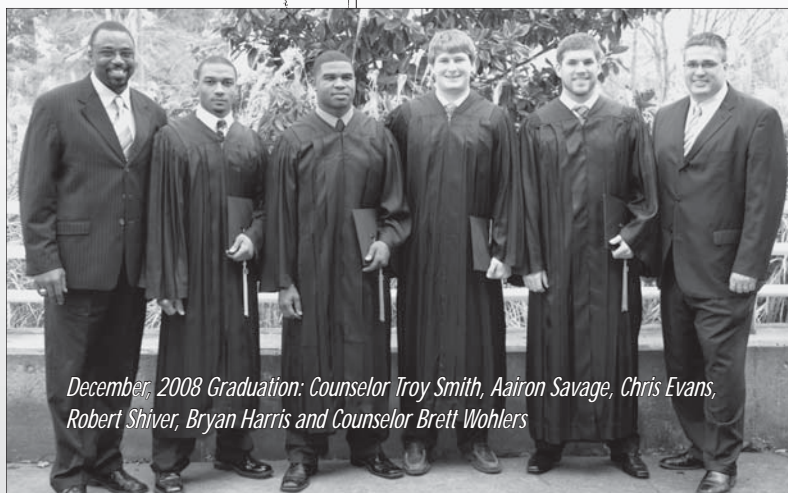
Within the walls of the center are the Academic Hall of Honor designed by Auburn student-athletes, two "smart" classrooms with new and innovative technology that hold 50 people per room, seven counselor offices as well as administrative support, the PAW (Promoting Academic Winners) office, Operation Follow-Through, the Student Athletic Advisory Committee office, 40 four-person tutorial rooms, a library resource area, a soft-study lounge, a 25-station computer classroom, the student "Cantina" for snacks and beverages and the tutor coordinator office.

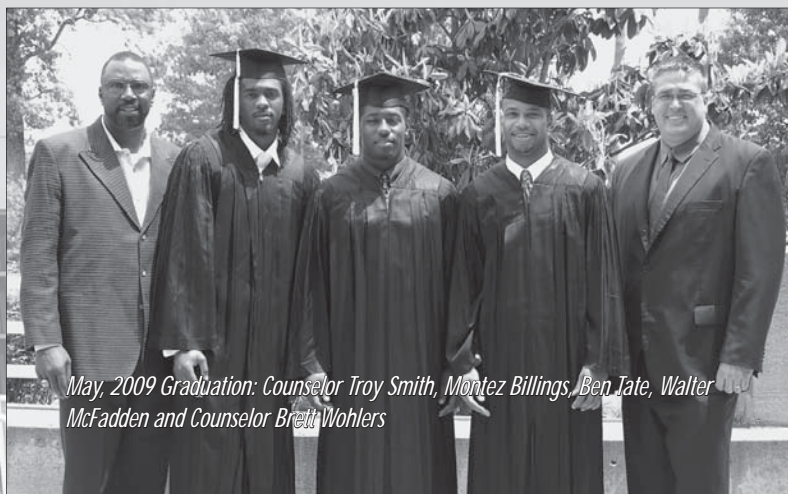

Auburn is located in the southeastern United States in east-central Alabama about 30 miles from the Georgia border.

U.S. News & World Report has ranked Auburn among the top 50 public universities nationwide for 16 consecutive years. Auburn is ranked a "Best Value" by the Princeton Review.

AU invests in extensive national assessments to obtain quality, data-driven information for measuring and continually improving instruction and student preparation.

More than 92 percent of our students and more than 95 percent of our alumni say that if they could start college over again, they would choose Auburn.

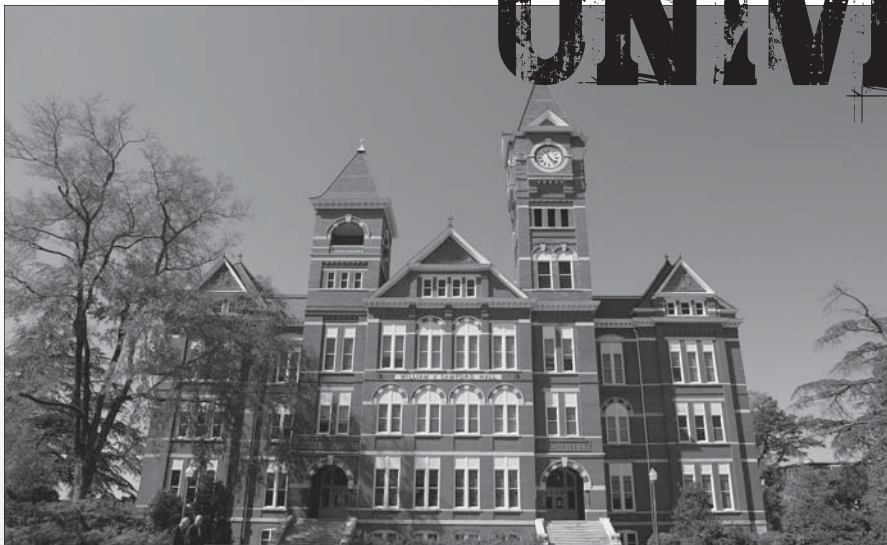
A 2005 Harvard survey ranked AU as one of the top six colleges and universities in the country as a place for young faculty to work, which has a lot to do with actively engaging students.
