# HEAD COACH BRYAN HARSIN



Bryan Harsin was named Auburn's 28th head football coach on December 22, 2020. Harsin spent the previous seven seasons as head coach at Boise State where he compiled a 69-19 record while winning three Mountain West Conference titles.

A former Boise State quarterback, assistant coach and offensive coordinator, Harsin is 76-24 overall as a head coach – including one season at Arkansas State – and has directed his

programs to bowl games each season. His impressive resume at Boise saw him lead the Broncos to five 10-win seasons, seven consecutive bowl appearances and six MWC West Division Championships. He led the program to a 5-2 mark and a trip to the MWC championship game in 2020,

In his debut season Harsin led his alma mater back to where it rose to national prominence. Boise State went 12-2 in 2014, winning its first outright Mountain West Championship and capping the campaign with a 38-30 victory over Arizona in the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.

The victory in the Fiesta Bowl was the third such win for the Broncos in the previous nine seasons. Harsin, serving as offensive coordinator in the first two Fiesta Bowl victories, has been a part of each of the school's three appearances in the game.

The team's victory in the 2014 Mountain West Football Championship marked Boise State's first outright league title since joining the conference in 2011, and the first overall since 2009. The only alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State, Harsin has won conference championships as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.

Boise State also captured MW titles in 2017 and 2019, giving Harsin three in six seasons. In 2017, the Broncos capped the championship campaign with a 38-28 victory over Oregon in the Las Vegas Bowl. The Broncos concluded the year at 11-3 overall and ranked No. 22 in both the Associated Press and Coaches Polls.

The Broncos went 12-2 in 2019, recording the team's first perfect 8-0 conference record since joining the MW and earning the school's fifth all-time appearance in the Las Vegas Bowl. Boise State concluded the season ranked in both the AP (No. 23) and Coaches Polls (No. 22) and were No. 19 in the final rankings of the College Football Playoff Poll, the third-straight season finishing in the top 25 of the CFP.

In 2015, the Broncos went 9-4, climbing as high as No. 20 in both the AP and Coaches Polls. Boise State capped the 2015 campaign with a 55-7 victory over Northern Illinois in the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl, the fifth-largest margin of victory in the history of bowl games. In 2016, Harsin guided the Broncos to a 10-3 record and an appearance in the Motel 6 Cactus Bowl.

In 2018, the Broncos concluded the season ranked in all three

major polls - No. 23 in the AP Poll, No. 24 in the Coaches Poll and No. 25 in the CFP Rankings. The Broncos have been ranked in the top 25 in each of Harsin's six seasons, climbing as high as No. 13 in both the AP and Coaches Polls in 2016, and No. 13 in the Coaches Poll in 2019, Boise State's highest rankings since finishing eighth and sixth in each, respectively, in 2011.

Boise State went 10-3 in 2018, boasting the Mountain West Offensive Player of the Year in quarterback Brett Rypien – one of 11 All-Mountain West honorees. Rypien concluded his career as the Mountain West's all-time leader in career 300-yard passing games (21), completions (1,036) and passing yards (13,581). He also ranked second in league history in both wins by a starting quarterback (37) and career attempts (1,619), and tied for second in career touchdown passes (90).

Curtis Weaver made it three-straight MW Player of the Year honors for the Broncos in 2019, following Rypien's nod in 2018 and Leighton Vander Esch's Defensive Player of the Year award in 2017. Weaver established the MW career sacks record (34.0) in just three seasons before declaring early for the National Football League Draft, where he extended the Broncos' streak of consecutive years with an early entrant being selected. Boise State now has seven-consecutive such seasons, one of only nine schools in the country to boast such a distinction. The list also includes Alabama, Clemson, Florida, Florida

State, LSU, Penn State, Stanford and Washington.

Defensive end DeMarcus Lawrence (2014) started the streak, followed by running back Jay Ajayi (2015), linebacker Kamalei Correa (2016), running back Jeremy McNichols (2017), linebacker Leighton Vander Esch (2018), running back Alexander Mattison (2019) and Weaver.

Vander Esch was a first-round selection of the Dallas Cowboys after foregoing his final season of eligibility. In his rookie season, Vander Esch was named second-team All-Pro by the Associated Press.

The Broncos won at least 10 games in five of Harsin's seven seasons, giving Boise State 17 since joining what is now known as the Football Bowl Subdivision in 1996. The total ranks second behind only Ohio State during that time.

The Broncos' six-consecutive bowl appearances under Harsin from 2014-19 ran the school's streak to 18, which was tied for the nation's fifth-longest.

For his efforts in 2014, Harsin was named a finalist for the Paul "Bear Bryant" National Coach of the Year Award, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, given annually by the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year Foundation. He was also named the nation's top first-year head coach by the Football Writers Association of America.

A graduate of Capital High School in Boise, he played quarterback for the Broncos from 1995-99. Following his graduation from Boise State with a degree in business management, Harsin coached running backs and receivers at Eastern Oregon in 2000.

The former Bronco letterwinner began his coaching career at Boise State as a graduate assistant in 2001, before taking over the tight ends as a full-time assistant coach from 2002-05. When Chris Petersen was hired as head coach in 2006, Harsin assumed the role of offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Harsin was Petersen's offensive coordinator for five of his eight seasons as head coach (2006-10) and was named a finalist for the 2009 Broyles Award, awarded annually to the nation's top assistant coach. Boise State went 61-5 during his tenure as offensive coordinator.

With Harsin on staff, Boise State won 11 conference championships in just 17 seasons.

Following the 2010 season, Harsin went to Texas, where he served as co-offensive coordinator from 2011-12. While with the Longhorns, Harsin helped guide the ascension of an offense that ranked 88th in scoring prior to his arrival, to No. 24 nationally in 2012 (36.1).

Harsin then earned his first head coaching opportunity at Arkansas State in 2013, which claimed a share of the Sun Belt Conference championship and a berth in the GoDaddy.com Bowl that season.

Harsin and his wife Kes have two daughters, Devyn Lynn and Dayn Mykena, and a son, Davis.

# BRAD BEDELL

## TIGHT ENDS

Brad Bedell enters his first season as Auburn's tight ends coach. Bedell spent the past four seasons as Boise State's offensive line coach, including run game coordinator last season. A former All-American at Colorado, Bedell spent six seasons in the NFL prior to joining the coaching ranks.

In four seasons at Boise State, Bedell's offensive line had nine players garner 13 All-Mountain West honors, including five first team honors. Three Bronco linemen earned all-conference honors in 2020.

Four of the Broncos' five starting offensive linemen in 2019 received All-Mountain West recognition, with left tackle Ezra Cleveland and left guard John Molchon each being named first team. Center Garrett Larson earned second-team honors, while right guard Eric Quevedo was named honorable mention. Cleveland would go on to be selected in the second round (58th overall) of the 2020 NFL Draft by the Minnesota Vikings.

In 2019, the Bronco line extended Boise State's streak of seasons with a 1,000-yard rusher to 11, as freshman George Holani rushed for 1,014 yards. The 11-straight individual rushing performances for Boise State was the active longest streak in the country and second longest in college football history. The line also provided protection and paved the way for a Boise offense that was 19th in the country in scoring (34.7 ppg).

In Bedell's first year with the Broncos, four of Boise State's starting five linemen received all-conference recognition, highlighted by center Mason Hampton, who received first-team accolades. Hampton was also named a finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, awarded annually to college football's top scholar-athlete. Additionally, Ezra Cleveland, Archie Lewis and John Molchon picked up all-league recognition.

In 2018, Cleveland and Molchon repeated as all-league selections, each picking up first-team honors after helping to pave the way for a 10th-straight 1,000-yard individual rusher. The Broncos' offensive line also protected quarterback Brett Rypien, who was named the Mountain West Offensive Player of the Year following the season and helped Boise State conclude the season ranked in the top 25 nationally in both total offense (21st; 459.5 yards per game) and scoring offense (20th; 35.4 points per game).

Bedell, who previously worked under Harsin at Arkansas State, previously served as the assistant head coach and offensive line coach at Lamar, where he was hired in January 2017 following a season at Baylor.

Bedell began his coaching career as an offensive intern at Colorado (2007-09), his alma mater, where he garnered first-team All-America and All-Big 12 First Team honors at right guard following his senior campaign in 1999. He then went on to play six seasons in the National Football League, spending time with the Browns (2000-01), Dolphins (2003), Packers (2004-05) and Texans (2006).

Bedell's debut as a full-time assistant was spent at Northern Colorado in 2010, where he mentored a pair of All-Big Sky selections as offensive line coach. He moved on to UC Davis in 2011, serving as the team's offensive line coach and run game coordinator, again producing a pair of all-league selections.

He coached at New Mexico State in 2012, with another pupil picking up all-conference accolades, before joining Harsin at Arkansas State in 2013. A-State captured the Sun Belt Championship and a victory in the GoDaddy Bowl that season, helping to lead an offensive attack that averaged more than 200 rushing yards per game behind two All-Sun Belt honorees along the offensive line.

Following two seasons as the offensive line coach at Texas State (2014-15), Bedell joined the Baylor staff as an offensive quality control assistant and assistant director of operations in the spring of 2016 and remained on staff for the duration of the 2016 season.

# MIKE BOBO

## OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

A veteran coach in the Southeastern Conference, Mike Bobo is in his first season as offensive coordinator at Auburn. Bobo spent last season at South Carolina as offensive coordinator and quarterback coach after a five-year stint as head coach at Colorado State. He also spent 14 years at Georgia.

At Colorado State, he guided the Rams to bowl games in each of his first three seasons, making him the lone coach in program history to accomplish that feat, and joined Sonny Lubick as the only two to coach the Rams in multiple bowl games in their careers.

Overall, Bobo's teams left their marks on the offensive record book at CSU, as his squads own three of the top six marks for total offense in a season as well as the school record for most yards per game in a season, that coming in 2017. His Rams also posted three of the top seven scoring seasons in CSU history. In five seasons, he was 28-35 and 20-20 in the Mountain West Conference.

In 2019, the Rams ranked 14th in the nation in passing offense, averaging 305.3 yards per game through the air. The previous season, his CSU offense ranked 13th among all FBS programs in passing offense (304.9). Bobo's 2017 team ranked 11th nationally in total offense (492.5), second in third down conversions (50.3 pct.) and eighth in first downs (25.1).

In 2016, Bobo became the first head coach in CSU history to lead the Rams to a bowl game in each of his first two seasons. The Rams' offense fueled a late-season surge, averaging 47.8 points and 533.8 yards per game over the last six contests, including the bowl game. CSU ranked fourth in the nation in red zone scoring (94.6 pct.), 28th in scoring offense (35.3) and 30th in total offense (462.5).

Bobo became the only head coach in program history to win seven regular season games in his first season at the helm in 2015.

Bobo spent all but one of the first 22 years of his adult life at Georgia as a player or assistant coach. While in Athens, he had been a record-breaking starting quarterback and spent 16 seasons coaching, including the last eight (2007-14) as offensive coordinator.

Bobo's 14-year coaching stint at Georgia, began in January 2001 when head coach Mark Richt hired him as quarterbacks coach, for his second stint with the school. He had previously worked on the football staff in an administrative role in 1998, then as a graduate assistant in 1999. He was promoted to offensive coordinator in 2007.

During his time at UGA, Bobo helped lead the Bulldogs to 135 victories, including two Southeastern Conference championships, five SEC Eastern Division titles and eight bowl victories. The 2012 Broyles Award finalist held the offensive coordinator spot for 92 games with the Bulldogs, scoring 30-plus points 57 times, 40-plus points 29 times and more than 50 points 13 times.

Bobo guided several talented quarterbacks at Georgia, including Aaron Murray, Matthew Stafford and David Greene, along with wide receiver A.J. Green, running back Todd Gurley and many others. In all, Bobo helped mold four first-round NFL draft choices at Georgia: Stafford (No. 1 in 2009), running back Knowshon Moreno (No. 12 in 2009), Green (No. 4 in 2011) and Gurley (No. 10 in 2015).

Prior to joining Richt's staff at Georgia, Bobo served one year as an assistant coach at Jacksonville State.

Bobo was a quarterback for the Bulldogs from 1994-97, throwing for 6,334 yards, the third-most all-time by a Georgia quarterback, and set several Georgia passing records. As a senior in 1997, he threw for 2,751 yards on 199 completions in 306 attempts and had 19 TD to just eight interceptions.

Bobo, a native of Thomasville, Ga., and his wife, Lainie, have five children, a son Drew; triplets Olivia, Jake and Ava Grace; and Kate. His father, George, was a long-time successful high school coach in Georgia.

# NICK EASON

## DEFENSIVE LINE

Nick Eason is in his first season at Auburn as the Tigers' defensive line coach. A 10-year veteran of the National Football League from 2003-12 and former Clemson team captain, Eason coached for seven years in the NFL following his playing career.

The last two seasons, Eason was the defensive line coach for the Cincinnati Bengals. In his first season, Eason helped the Bengals' defensive line improve significantly as the season progressed. Cincinnati notched 11 more sacks in the second half of 2019 compared to the first eight games. The defense also allowed 84.1 fewer yards per game the second half of the season. Additionally, under Eason's guidance, DT Geno Atkins earned his eighth Pro Bowl nomination.

Eason spent 2014-17 with the Tennessee Titans, serving his first two seasons as assistant defensive line coach before moving up to the defensive line coach role for his final two years.

In his two seasons (2016-17) as Tennessee's defensive line coach, Eason's units played a central role on Titans defenses that ranked among the best in the NFL against the run. Tennessee's defensive line was led by star DT Jurrell Casey, who in his two seasons under Eason totaled 11 sacks, 37 QB hits and earned two Pro Bowl nominations.

In 2017, Tennessee's defensive line ranked fourth in the NFL against the run, allowing an average of just 88.8 yards per game. In 2016, Eason's first as defensive line coach, the Titans allowed just 88.3 rushing yards per game, and their No. 2 league rank against the run was the team's highest in 14 seasons.

In 2015, Eason helped guide Casey to a team-high seven sacks, 28 QB pressures and his first-career Pro Bowl invite. Eason also aided in the development of DE DaQuan Jones and NT Al Woods, who both emerged as quality starters and matched or bettered their career-best numbers in all categories.

In 2014, Eason's first as a full-time NFL coach, he helped oversee Tennessee's defensive transition from a 4-3 to a 3-4 front. He also helped Casey continue his ascent into one of the NFL's best interior defensive linemen, as he posted 86 tackles, including 13 for losses, and 27 QB pressures. Eason also guided NT Sammie Hill to career-highs in tackles (47), sacks (3.0), tackles for losses (seven) and QB pressures (8).

Eason's first coaching assignment after his playing days came in 2013, when he was an intern coach with the Cleveland Browns.

As a player, Eason saw action in 117 games over 10 seasons (2003-12) with the Browns, Pittsburgh Steelers and Arizona Cardinals. He finished his playing career with the Cardinals, where he spent two seasons (2011-12), appeared in 32 games and registered two sacks. Prior to his time with Arizona, Eason spent four seasons (2007-10) with the Steelers and helped the team to two Super Bowl appearances, including a victory in Super Bowl XLIII in the '08 season. He was a teammate in Pittsburgh with former Auburn standout and current staffer, Kendall Simmons.

Eason was originally a fourth-round selection by the Denver Broncos in the 2003 NFL Draft, but he spent his rookie season on Reserve/Injured after suffering an Achilles injury during training camp. The following season, Eason reemerged on the Broncos' active roster before being waived and signed by the Browns, with whom he played for three seasons (2004-06).

A native of Lyons, Ga., Eason played college football at Clemson, where he starred on the defensive line and became the first football player in school history to graduate with two years of eligibility remaining, earning his degree in sociology in August 2001. In 2008, he earned his master's degree in human resources. Eason played in 47 games with 35 starts for the Tigers and recorded 15 sacks and 30 tackles for losses. A two-time team captain his junior and senior seasons, he earned first-team All-ACC honors as a senior defensive tackle.

# ZAC ETHERIDGE

## CORNERBACKS

Zac Etheridge, a team captain on Auburn's 2010 national championship team, is in his first season coaching at Auburn, serving as cornerbacks coach. Etheridge spent the previous two seasons in the same capacity at the University of Houston.

At Houston, Etheridge mentored cornerbacks Marcus Jones and Damarion Williams, who thrived under his direction. Jones was named an All-American in 2020 at cornerback by Pro Football Focus (PFF) and was an All-American selection as a punt return specialist by the FWAA, CBS/247 Sports and the Phil Steele Magazine. Jones also was graded as one of the top-5 corners in 2020 by PFF. Under two seasons of Etheridge's tutelage, Williams blossomed into an all-conference player in 2020, starting 19 consecutive games for the Cougars.

Etheridge played a key role in Houston's improvement on defense in 2020, as the Cougars finished fourth in the American Athletic Conference in total defense (398.5 yards per game). Houston's defense also saw improvements from 2019 to 2020 in passing yards allowed, third down conversion defense percentage and tackles for loss.

This past December he was selected to the American Football Coaches Association 2021 35 Under 35 Coaches Leadership Institute. The prestigious program is aimed at identifying and developing premier, future leaders in the football coaching profession and is part of the AFCA Convention.

Prior to his arrival at Houston, Etheridge spent a season at the University of Louisiana, where he helped lead the Ragin Cajuns to a spot in both the Cure Bowl and the Sun Belt Conference Championship.

Etheridge spent two seasons at Western Carolina from 2016-17, where he started coaching the cornerbacks in 2016 before being elevated to a full-time position as an assistant coach with his focus switching to WCU's outside linebackers in 2017.

His coaching career began as a graduate assistant coach at Penn State under head coach Bill O'Brien, followed by two years as a defensive graduate assistant at Georgia Tech where he worked closely with the secondary.

A four-year starter at Auburn, Etheridge broke his neck during his junior season in 2009 against Ole Miss. Nine months later, after extensive rehabilitation, Etheridge returned to the starting lineup for Auburn and captained his team along a memorable run to the national title at the end of the 2010 season, finishing second on the team with 69 tackles, intercepting three passes, and returning a fumble 47 yards for a touchdown against Arkansas.

Etheridge garnered freshman All-America status from numerous publications following the 2007 season, starting 12 of Auburn's 13 games. He led Auburn with 75 tackles in 2008 and was named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 2009.

A native of Troy, Ala., Etheridge received the second annual James Owens Courage Award from Auburn in 2013. The award, named for the school's first African-American football player, was established to honor a player who has shown courage in the face of adversity.

A 2009 Auburn graduate with a degree in political science, Etheridge has a daughter, Mia.

## WILL FRIEND OFFENSIVE LINE

Will Friend has been named Auburn's offensive line coach, head coach Bryan Harsin announced Thursday. Friend spent the previous three seasons as the offensive line coach at Tennessee and, prior to that, was the offensive coordinator and offensive

line coach at Colorado State.

While at Tennessee, the Philadelphia, Miss. native mentored two-time All-SEC first team lineman Trey Smith. In 2019, UT offensive linemen Wanya Morris and Darnell Wright were both selected to the Freshman All-SEC squad, while Morris was tabbed a Freshman All-American.

Friend came to Tennessee after a three-year stint (2015-17) as the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Colorado State. In 2017, he led an offense that ranked 11th in the nation in total offense at 492.5 yards per game. Colorado State's 33.4 points per game in 2017 led the conference and ranked 31st in the nation.

Prior to Colorado State, Friend served as the offensive line coach at Georgia in 2011 before adding the title of running game coordinator in 2013. During his final season in Athens in 2014, Friend helped guide a Bulldogs' offense that averaged 41.3 points per game, which ranked eighth nationally, and racked up 457.8 yards of total offense per game.

A four-year starting guard at Alabama, a two-time All-SEC selection, and a member of Alabama's Team of the Decade for the 1990s, Friend began his coaching career at West Alabama in 2001. He was an offensive assistant at Tuscaloosa Central High School in 2002 before joining the Georgia staff as a graduate assistant (2003-04).

He spent the 2005-06 seasons as the offensive line coach at Gardner-Webb, then had a four-year stint (2007-10) as the offensive line coach at UAB. Overall, Friend has coached nine offensive linemen who have been selected in the NFL Draft.

Friend was a Parade Magazine All-America selection as a senior at Neshoba Central High in Philadelphia, Miss. He earned his bachelor's degree in human performance from Alabama in 1998.

A 1998 graduate from the University of Alabama, Friend and his wife, Carrie, have three children – Katie, Brooks and Charlie.

## DEREK MASON DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Former Vanderbilt head coach and Stanford defensive coordinator, Derek Mason is in his first year at Auburn as defensive coordinator.

Mason spent seven seasons at Vanderbilt (2014-20) where he became just the second coach in program history to lead a team to multiple bowl appearances. His 2018 team won six games and capped the regular season with a third

straight victory over rival Tennessee and fifth in seven years. It also marked Vanderbilt's second bowl appearance in three years under Mason.

Mason guided Vanderbilt to its eighth postseason appearance in 2016 and finished the regular season 6-6, including four wins over the final six games. The season featured marquee SEC victories over Georgia, Ole Miss and No. 24 Tennessee. Inside linebacker Zach Cunningham became Vanderbilt's first consensus All-American in more than three decades, sweeping first-team honors.

The architect of Stanford's vaunted 3-4 defense, Mason spent four seasons with the Cardinal and was elevated to defensive coordinator in 2011 after leading the program to a pair of Rose Bowl appearances and consecutive Pac-12 titles. Mason's elite defensive units at Stanford ranked among the NCAA's best in defensive efficiency for three consecutive seasons.

While facing seven ranked opponents in 2013, Stanford ranked third nationally in rushing defense (89.4 ypg), 10th in scoring defense (19.0 ppg) and 16th in total offense (343.1 ypg). The Cardinal was also one of only five teams to allow less than 100 rushing yards per game in 2013 and ranked fifth nationally with 44 sacks and seventh with 109 tackles for loss.

In 2012, Mason was a finalist for the Broyles Award, given annually to the nation's top assistant coach, after directing a Stanford defense widely considered the program's finest unit ever.

Mason's leadership paved the way to a historic defensive output, breaking Stanford's single-season record with 57 sacks and pacing the Pac-12 in scoring defense, total defense and rushing defense, and helped the Cardinal to an 11-2 season capped off with a Rose Bowl title. In 11 of 14 games, Stanford held its opponent to 20 or fewer points, including a 14-point effort in an overtime win at top-ranked Oregon, who led the FBS with a 54.8 scoring average. The 2012 Stanford defense held eight of 13 opponents under 100 yards rushing.

In 2011, Mason's first year as co-defensive coordinator, his unit ranked either first or second in the Pac-12 in six defensive categories, including rushing defense, third-down conversion defense, scoring defense, total defense, sacks and opponent first downs.

Mason also helped develop an array of Stanford defensive standouts, including All-Pro cornerback Richard Sherman, All-America defensive end Trent Murphy, All-America linebacker Shayne Skov and All-Pac-12 safety Ed Reynolds.

Prior to his arrival in Palo Alto, Mason served as an assistant defensive back coach for the Minnesota Vikings from 2007-09. He played a vital role in the team ranking sixth in total defense in 2008 and 2009 as the Vikings won NFC North titles each season. Mason was introduced to the NFL coaching circles through the Minority Fellowship program.

Before joining the Vikings, Mason tutored wide receivers at Ohio under Frank Solich, helping the Bobcats improve from 4-7 in 2005 to a 9-5 campaign and GMAC Bowl appearance the following year. Mason spent the 2004 season as wide receivers coach at New Mexico State, where the Aggies led the conference in passing.

During the 2002 campaign, Mason mentored receivers and assisted with special teams at Utah. The Utes featured the NFL Draft's No. 1 overall pick in quarterback Alex Smith and wide receiver Paris Warren, an eventual seventh-round pick.

Mason's move to Utah came after a three-year stint at Bucknell (1999-2001) in which he gained his first experience as a defensive assistant coach. At Bucknell, Mason served as defensive backs mentor for three straight winning Bison squads.

Mason's first three collegiate positions came as an offensive assistant at Mesa (Ariz.) Community College in 1994, Weber State in 1995-96 and Idaho State in 1997-98.

As a player, Mason was a two-year starter and four-year letter winner at Northern Arizona. Mason earned a bachelor's degree in criminal justice from Northern Arizona in 1993. A native of Phoenix, Mason was a standout football player at Camelback High School.

Jeff Pitman has been named the head football strength and conditioning coach at Auburn, head coach Bryan Harsin announced Tuesday. Pitman comes to Auburn after spending the previous eight years on Harsin's staff at Boise State (2014-20) and

Arkansas State (2013).

A Boise State graduate and certified strength and conditioning specialist by the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA), Pitman was the head strength and conditioning coach at Boise State from 1999-2006.

Pitman worked with the football program at Colorado, while also overseeing the speed, strength and conditioning needs for each of the Buffaloes' varsity programs. He also worked at Western Carolina from 2011-12 as the Strength and Conditioning Coordinator.

A three-year letterwinner for the Broncos from 1990-92, Pitman initially walked on to Boise State in 1988 before earning a scholarship and starting at center for two years. He was a member of the Broncos' 1990 team that finished 10-4 and reached the semifinals of the NCAA Division I-AA Playoffs.

He was recognized as an NSCA Strength and Conditioning All-American in 1992, one of just 10 Broncos in school history to win the award at the time.

He graduated from Boise State with a degree in health promotion in 1993, and then worked as a graduate assistant strength and conditioning coach at Minnesota. He earned his master's in education from Minnesota in 1995.

Certified as a level one club coach by USA Weightlifting in 1994, Pitman took his first full-time position as a collegiate strength coach at Montana State (1995-97), working with football, women's skiing and women's track and field.

He worked at San Jose State from 1997-99, supervising the training programs for all of the Spartans' varsity sports, before joining his alma mater.

# JEFF SCHMEDDING

ASSISTANT HEAD COACH/LINEBACKERS/DEFENSIVE RUN GAME COORDINATOR

Jeff Schmedding is in his first season at Auburn serving as assistant head coach, linebackers coach and defensive run game coordinator. Schmedding spent the past two seasons on Harsin's staff at Boise State as the defensive coordinator (play caller) for the Broncos.

After coaching Boise State's outside linebackers in 2019, he took over inside linebackers for the 2020 campaign. Schmedding's first season leading the defense was a strong one for the Broncos as they claimed the Mountain West championship with a 12-2 record and 8-0 mark in conference play. The Boise defense put together an impressive year, finishing in the top 15 nationally in team sacks (37) and in the top 25 nationally in scoring defense (20.6 ppg).

In 2019, Junior STUD end Curtis Weaver was named the 2019 Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year while leading the conference and finishing fifth nationally in sacks (13.5). His 34-career sacks are a Mountain West record as well. Weaver was selected in the fifth round of the NFL Draft by the Miami Dolphins. Junior defensive back Kekaula Kaniho was also named to the All-Mountain West First Team. Kaniho was named to the 2020 Lott IMPACT Trophy Watch List heading into the fall. Additionally, the Broncos had five other defensive players named to the 2019 Mountain West Second Team.

Prior to arriving in Boise, Schmedding spent the 15 seasons (2004-18) at Eastern Washington, helping to lead the Eagles to the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) National Championship in 2010. EWU also made the national title game in 2018 - one of 10 total FCS Playoff appearances during Schmedding's time with the program. In 2018, the Eagles' defense was first in the FCS in defensive touchdowns scored and second in forced turnovers.

Schmedding served as EWU's defensive coordinator from 2015-18, while also coaching safeties and rovers. He spent seven seasons (2008-14) as the Eagles' special teams coordinator, coaching linebackers (2008-09), safeties and nickels (2010-14) during that time. He began his career at EWU as a graduate assistant (2004-06) where he spent time with linebackers and the secondary before being promoted to a full-time role as safeties coach in 2007.

Schmedding's previous coordination of special teams was particularly impressive as well, especially in 2014. The Eagles ranked third in the FCS with four blocked punts, and was 10th in net punting (38.4), 15th in kickoff return average (22.8) and 28th in punt returns (11.8). That season, EWU scored touchdowns on a kickoff return, punt return and kickoff team.

As a position coach, Schmedding tutored several of the finest safeties in EWU history. Tevin McDonald earned All-America and first-team All-Big Sky Conference accolades in 2014 for the Eagles before signing a free agent NFL contract with the Oakland Raiders. In 2013, McDonald earned third-team All-Big Sky honors as well. Schmedding's safeties in 2012 featured Academic All-American Jeff Minnerly, Freshman All-American Jordan Tonani and second-team All-Big Sky selection Allen Brown.

In 2010 and 2011, Schmedding coached All-America safety Matt Johnson, who earned first-team All-Big Sky Conference honors both seasons before being selected in the fourth round of the NFL Draft by the Dallas Cowboys. Minnerly was honorable mention All-Big Sky both seasons. Schmedding also coached cornerbacks in 2011, a group which included eventual three-time first-team All-Big Sky selection T.J. Lee III. In 2010, EWU led the FCS with 26 interceptions.

Schmedding coached linebackers in 2008 and 2009, including J.C. Scherritt, who in 2009 was named to all six All-America teams and was second in the voting for the Buck Buchanan Award given to the top defensive player in the FCS. He set school and Big Sky records with 170 total tackles. He went on to win the award in 2010 and was a captain and Grey Cup champion for the Edmonton Eskimos.

Schmedding earned his bachelor's degree in physical education and coaching from Eastern Washington in 2002. A native of Spokane, Wash., he graduated from University High School where he was a standout wrestler and football player - he was the runner-up at the State 3A Wrestling Championships in the 215-pound division. Schmedding and his wife, Kristine, have been married for nearly 15 years and have two sons, Jack and Blake.

# BERT WATTS

## SPECIAL TEAMS COORDINATOR/OUTSIDE LINEBACKERS

Bert Watts, who spent the past season at Memphis as linebackers coach after three seasons at Fresno State, including two as defensive coordinator, is in his first season at Auburn. Watts coaches outside linebackers and is the Special Teams Coordinator.

Watts helped the Tigers to an 8-3 record and a bowl victory in 2020, while defensively the unit was top 20 nationally in red zone defense, turnovers gained and fumbles recovered.

In three seasons at Fresno State (2017-19), Watts' defense ranked in the Top 10 nationally in several statistical categories. In 2018, the Bulldogs finished with a 12-2 record and were Mountain West Champions.

In 2018, the Bulldogs ranked third nationally in scoring defense, surrendering 14.1 points per game. Fresno State also finished the 2018 campaign ranked in the Top 10 in the FBS in red zone defense (1st), scoring defense (3rd), passes intercepted (4th), passing efficiency defense (5th) and turnover margin (9th). Individually, Watts helped mentor linebacker Jeff Allison as the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year in 2018.

Prior to Fresno State, Watts spent four seasons as the defensive coordinator at UC Davis with a focus on the defensive backs unit.

His first season overseeing the UC Davis defense in 2013 resulted in four of his players earning postseason recognition from the Big Sky Conference. Two more were recognized the next season and five more earned honors from the conference in 2016.

Defensive lineman Nick King was a second team pick after amassing eight sacks, cornerback Jonathan Perkins had four pass breakups on his way to third-team accolades, linebacker Steven Pitts earned honorable mention after tallying 74 tackles and 11.5 TFLs, and cornerback Shamawn Wright was selected honorable mention after leading the team with nine PBUs. Pitts returned to the All-Big Sky honorable mention squad in 2014 and was joined by safety Charles Boyett.

In 2016, defensive tackle Inoke Raikadroka was named a second-team selection after compiling 24 tackles, 3.5 TFLs, 1.0 sacks and one fumble recovery in nine games played. Defensive tackle Zak Pettit, inside linebacker Nas Anesi, cornerback Keleen Culberson and safety Zach Jones earned honorable mention recognition.

The Basking Ridge, N.J. native also holds NFL experience, helping the Denver Broncos earn the top seed in the AFC playoffs in 2012.

A three-year letterwinner at Cal, Watts led the Bears' defense with 80 tackles as a senior in 2002. Following his senior year, he was the recipient of the team's Joe Roth Award, given to the player that exemplifies superior courage, attitude and sportsmanship.

Watts earned his undergraduate and graduate degrees in education from the University of California. He is married to the former Lyndsay Graubard, and the couple has two children, Vedder and Willow.

# CARNELL WILLIAMS

## RUNNING BACKS

Carnell ‘Cadillac’ Williams, a former all-American at Auburn, Williams is in his third season as the Tigers’ running backs coach.

Under Williams’ tutelage in 2020, freshman running back Tank Bigsby was named the SEC Co-Freshman of the Year and Associated Press SEC Newcomer of the Year after leading all freshmen in the conference with 834 rushing yards. Bigsby was the first Auburn freshman in school history to rush for three consecutive 100-yard games and his 834 yards were the second most all-time at Auburn by a rookie.

During his first season in 2019, the Tigers posted five 100-yard rushing games and D.J. Williams earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors for his performance against LSU. In two seasons, Williams’ backs have tallied nine 100-yard games and three SEC weekly honors.

As a player at Auburn, Williams helped lead Auburn to an undefeated season in 2004 while earning All-America honors that year. The 2005 NFL Rookie of the Year, Williams had a seven-year NFL career before entering the coaching ranks.

A native of Gadsden, Alabama, and product of Etowah High School, Williams finished his Auburn career (2001-04) with 3,831 yards on 741 attempts with 45 touchdowns. He broke the Auburn career record of most running attempts, passing Joe Cribbs, and most touchdowns scored, passing Bo Jackson, while finishing second in total rushing yards and all-purpose yards.

As a senior in 2004, Williams helped lead the Tigers to one of the best seasons in program history, winning an SEC Championship en route to a perfect 13-0 season and a Sugar Bowl victory. He led Auburn in rushing with 1,165 yards and 12 touchdowns while tallying 1,718 all-purpose yards. He earned All-America honors, was the SEC Special Teams Player of the Year, and named to the All-SEC team.

In his four seasons at Auburn, Williams earned nine SEC Player of the Week honors, the most in league history. During his time on the Plains, the Tigers were 37-14 and won three SEC Western Division titles (2001, ‘02, ‘04).

He remains as Auburn’s No. 2 all-time rushing and is the Tigers’ career leader in rushing attempts and rushing touchdowns.

The fifth pick overall pick of the 2005 NFL draft by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Williams was named the NFL Rookie of the Year after leading all rookies in rushing yards with 1,178, while posting six 100-yard rushing games in 14 starts. Williams spent six seasons with Tampa Bay before spending his final season in 2011 with the St. Louis Rams.

After being slowed by injuries for several years, Williams was narrowly edged for the AP 2009 Comeback Player of the Year Award by Tom Brady, finishing second after rushing for 821 yards on 210 carries with a 3.9 average and four touchdowns during the 2009 season.

Williams finished his NFL career with 4,038 yards with 21 touchdowns and 148 receptions for 1,002 yards and four scores.

Williams’ coaching career started at Henderson State in 2015 where he served as the running backs coach. After a stint at the University of West Georgia in 2016, Williams was the running backs coach for IMG Academy in Bradenton, Florida for two seasons (2017-18). Williams also served as the running backs coach for the Birmingham Iron of the Alliance of American Football (AAF).

Williams graduated from Auburn in December 2014. He and his wife Evan Williams have two boys: Cole and Cuinn.

# COACHING STAFF



## CORNELIUS WILLIAMS WIDE RECEIVERS

Cornelius Williams, who has spent the previous six years coaching wide receivers at Troy, is in his first season at Auburn. Williams, who won four Sun Belt championships and helped lead Troy to three bowl games as a player, was also the passing game coordinator at his alma mater the last two seasons.

During his time at Troy, Williams' receivers earned 14 All-Sun Belt honors including a pair of first team selections by Emanuel Thompson and most recently Damion Willis and Kaylon Geiger.

This past season, Troy's passing attack was 21st nationally in passing yards per game (290.2) and Geiger was 30th nationally with 752 receiving yards. In 2019, outside receivers Reggie Todd and Khalil McClain combined for 83 receptions, 12 touchdowns and 1228 yards. As a unit, the receivers topped the 100-yard mark 11 different times to shatter the Troy school record that previously stood at seven games.

As an offense, the Trojans topped the 500-yard mark in total offense on six different occasions to tie the program's DI record and scored 35-plus points eight times; the second most in program history and fourth most in Sun Belt Conference history. The Trojans finished ninth nationally in passing offense (313.2), 25th in scoring offense (33.8) and 18th in total offense (456.3).

Thompson led the Sun Belt with 80 receptions in 2016 -- the second most in a season in Troy history -- and finished third with 820 receiving yards. Deondre Douglas, who would earn three All-Sun Belt honors in his career, tied for third with 60 catches and 740 yards.

In 2018, Willis finished with the second most receiving yards in a game in school history after a 10-catch, 213-yard performance against Louisiana and ranked ninth nationally with seven catches of 40-plus yards despite missing a pair of games.

Troy finished the 2016 season 10-3 with a victory in the Dollar General Bowl, the first top-25 ranking in school and Sun Belt Conference history and the best win-improvement in the country. In 2017, Troy set a school FBS record for wins as the Trojans finished the season 11-2 with a Sun Belt championship, New Orleans Bowl title and a victory at No. 22 LSU.

Williams was a four-year letterman for the Trojans from 2006-09 and helped lead Troy to a combined 26-3 Sun Belt Conference record. He finished his Trojan career with 63 receptions for 764 yards and seven touchdowns.

Williams made his return to Troy after spending the previous two seasons as the wide receivers coach at UAB (2014) and Jacksonville State (2013).

UAB averaged 33.2 points and 431.8 yards of total offense in Williams' lone season coaching the Blazers. Both totals were good for fourth in the offense-heavy Conference USA and wide receiver J.J. Nelson was a fifth-round selection of the Arizona Cardinals in the 2015 NFL Draft.

Williams helped orchestrate a monumental turnaround at Jacksonville State as the Gamecocks went from a 6-5 team prior to his arrival to advancing to the FCS Quarterfinals. Additionally, wide receiver Josh Barge earned freshman All-America honors following the season.

Prior to Jacksonville State, Williams coached the wide receivers at North Alabama in 2012 and Murray State in 2011. In 2011, Murray State led the Ohio Valley Conference in scoring offense at 37.1 points per game, total offense with 460.9 yards per game and passing offense with 308.6 yards per game.

Williams was an offensive graduate assistant coach at South Alabama in 2010, helping the program to a 10-0 record and offensively averaged 439 yards and 41.3 points per game.

A standout at Hoover High School, Williams helped lead the Buccaneers to four consecutive Alabama 6A state championships and a combined 56-3 record. He was named all-state his senior year after setting a school record with 77 receptions for 1,300 yards and 18 touchdowns. He was selected to play in the Alabama-Mississippi All-Star Game and was ranked 16th in The Birmingham News' Super Seniors.

Williams graduated from Troy University in 2010 with a degree in sport and fitness management. He is married to the former Kiley Miller from Little Rock, Ark., and the couple has two daughters, Ellis and Wynn, and one son, Maverick.

## AUBURN ADMINISTRATION

### DR. JAY GOGUE

President



Jay Gogue returned to his alma mater on July 16, 2007, as Auburn University's 18th president and retired as president emeritus on July 1, 2017. He was appointed by the university's Board of Trustees to serve as interim president effective July 8, 2019, and later named president. The Waycross, Ga., native earned bachelor's and master's degrees from Auburn and a doctorate in horticulture from Michigan State University.

During his tenure as president, the academic strength of Auburn's student population increased, a new research center was established in Huntsville, Ala., a common book program that generates a shared academic experience was instituted and outreach partnerships with underserved schools in surrounding communities were established. His leadership during a period of sharp reductions in state support for the university budget protected Auburn's academic quality and prevented elimination of academic programs. During his brief retirement, Dr. Gogue remained engaged in the realm of academia, advising colleagues at numerous universities and teaching a course on higher education leadership to Auburn students.

Dr. Gogue was selected in 2013 for the Michigan State University Distinguished Alumni Award. In 2012, he was inducted into the Alabama Academy of Honor, a group of 100 Alabamians "chosen for accomplishment or service greatly benefitting or reflecting great credit on the State."

Before returning to Auburn, Dr. Gogue served as president of New Mexico State University beginning in 2000 and, in 2003, he was named president of the University of Houston and chancellor of the University of Houston System. He started his higher education administration career in 1986 at Clemson University as vice president for research and vice president/vice provost for agriculture and natural resources. Utah State University selected him as provost in 1995.

Dr. Gogue is a member of the Phi Kappa Phi and Golden Key honor societies, Sigma Chi Fraternity, Sigma Xi scientific research society and the National Society of Scabbard and Blade, the honorary military society for all branches of service. He met his wife, Susie, in the 8th grade, and they married during their undergraduate years at Auburn. Like Dr. Gogue, Mrs. Gogue also earned two Auburn degrees. They are the parents of three children and have one grandchild.

### ALLEN GREENE

Director of Athletics



Allen Greene, known as a dynamic and energetic leader, is in his third year at Auburn after being named the program's 15th director of athletics on January 18, 2018. He served in the same capacity at the University at Buffalo from November, 2015, until his arrival at Auburn.

One of the youngest athletics directors in the NCAA Power Five ranks, at 44, Greene is highly regarded by his peers. He is actively engaged in the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA), in which he was recently nominated to serve as an Executive Committee member, Minority Opportunities Athletics Association (MOAA), and LEAD1.

Under Greene's leadership, 35 programs have finished ranked in the top 25 nationally, including 12 programs in the top 10. The Auburn equestrian program has won a pair of national championships since his arrival and the men's and women's golf programs each advanced to the national semifinals.

The 2018-19 academic year was historic as the men's basketball program made its first-ever trip to the Final Four, while the baseball program returned to the College World Series for the first time in 22 years. It marked just the fourth time in Division I history a program sent a team to the Final Four and CWS while winning a football bowl game in the same academic year.

Greene's tenure as director of athletics at the University at Buffalo is noted for success on the field and in the classroom, as well as donor and corporate development efforts that led to an array of facility enhancements. Prior to being named AD at Buffalo, Greene served as the senior associate athletic director for administration and deputy director of athletics at UB. He previously worked in fundraising at Ole Miss for three years and Notre Dame for two years as fundraiser and five years in compliance.

A graduate of Notre Dame with a degree in finance, Greene was a three-year starter for the Fighting Irish baseball team and played three years in the New York Yankees minor league system. He later received his master's degree from Indiana University's South Bend campus.

Allen and his wife, Christy, have three children, daughters Rian and Seneca, and son Samuel.

# AUBURN UNIVERSITY

Money has proclaimed Auburn the best value in Alabama.

Auburn is one of the few universities to carry the torch as a land-, sea-, and space-grant university, and the exceptional learning environment at Auburn prepares students to excel in a global society. According to the National Survey of Student Engagement, Auburn provides a supportive campus environment, and its students report higher satisfaction with their overall academic experience than students at peer institutions. Kiplinger’s places the university on its list of “100 Best Public College Values,” a recognition that means Auburn delivers more for less. As a result, 93 percent of recent graduates indicate that they would choose Auburn all over again.



## A TOWN AND GOWN PARTNERSHIP

The city of Auburn consistently receives accolades for the lifestyle and amenities it offers—Auburn earned a top spot on Southern Living’s list of “The South’s Best College Towns.” The city has also been featured in numerous lists of best places to live and retire in publications such as Forbes and U.S. News & World Report.

Situated on a verdant campus of 1,841 acres, the university is a hub of activity in one of the state’s fastest growing cities, one frequently cited as a top place for entrepreneurs and families alike. Auburn is in east-central Alabama, approximately 30 miles from the Georgia border, 100 miles southwest of Atlanta, 100 miles southeast of Birmingham, and 50 miles east of Montgomery. 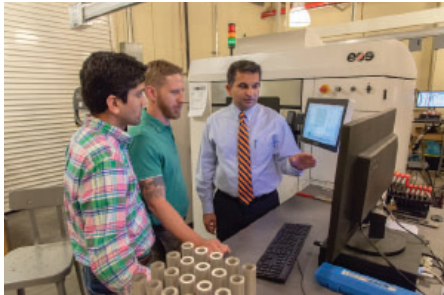

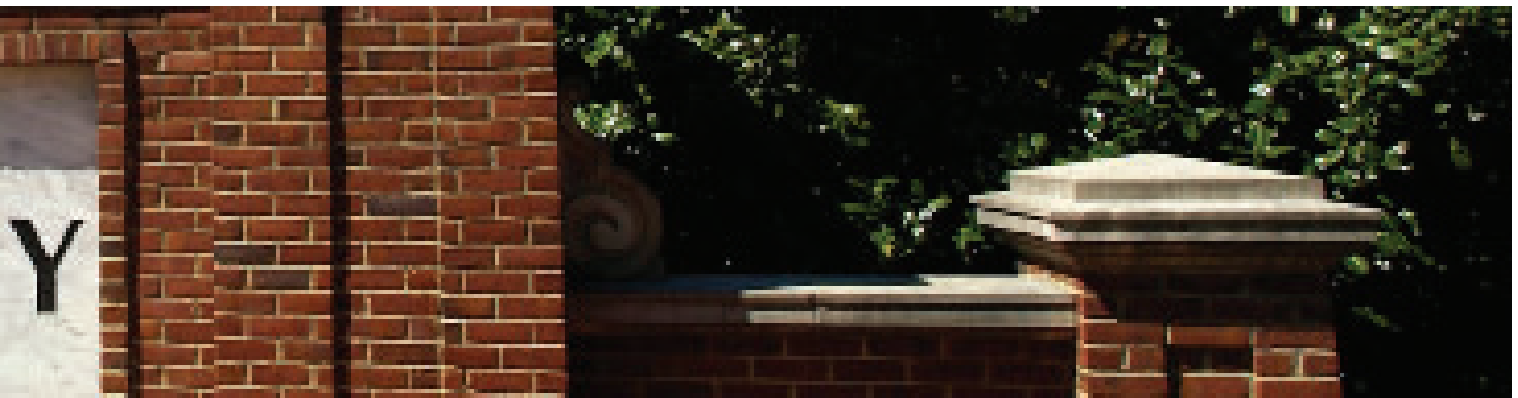

## AUBURN TRADITIONS

For more than 100 years, eagles have been associated with Auburn football. From a presence on the sidelines to rousing flights over the field, WAR EAGLE has become an Auburn icon.

The role of Auburn's eagles is to promote wildlife conservation as a part of the education initiatives of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the College of Veterinary Medicine's Southeastern Raptor Center. The USFWS permits the raptor center to house eagles and include them on hundreds of educational presentations each year—including Auburn's home football games. Currently, flighted eagles and numerous other non-releasable raptors are showcased in these educational programs. Eagles stir emotions in many people, as they have symbolized strength, power, and courage as well as other important values such as freedom, American heritage, and the preservation of our environment.

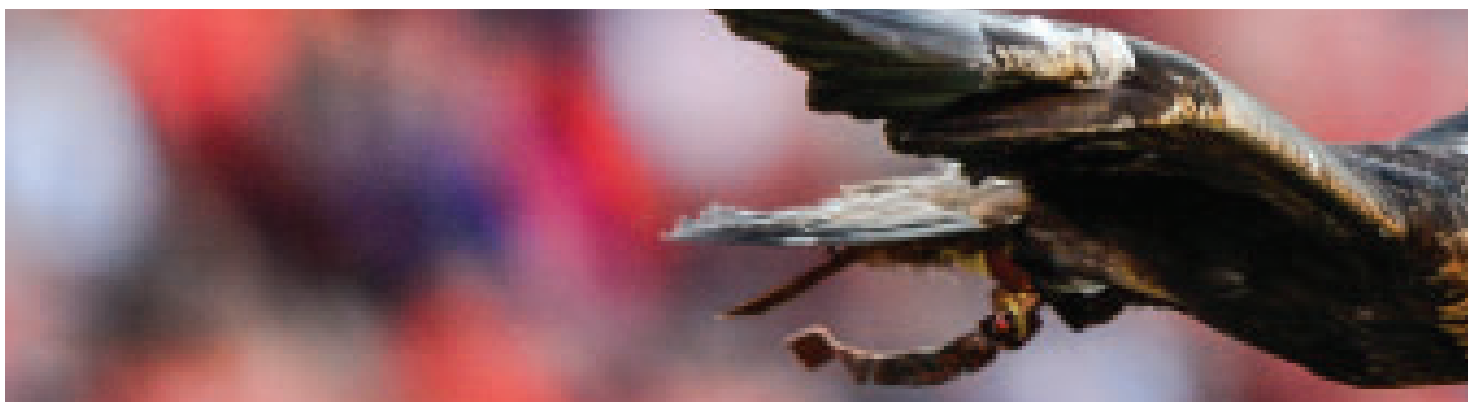
The tradition of the pregame eagle flight began in 2000, when golden eagle Tiger, War Eagle VI, made a short flight from the endzone to midfield. In the two decades since, the flights have grown into one of the most recognizable and widely anticipated college football traditions in the nation.

Tiger's first 50-yard hop has evolved into circling, soaring flights around the stadium. Her successor, a male golden named Nova was War Eagle VII, retired to his home

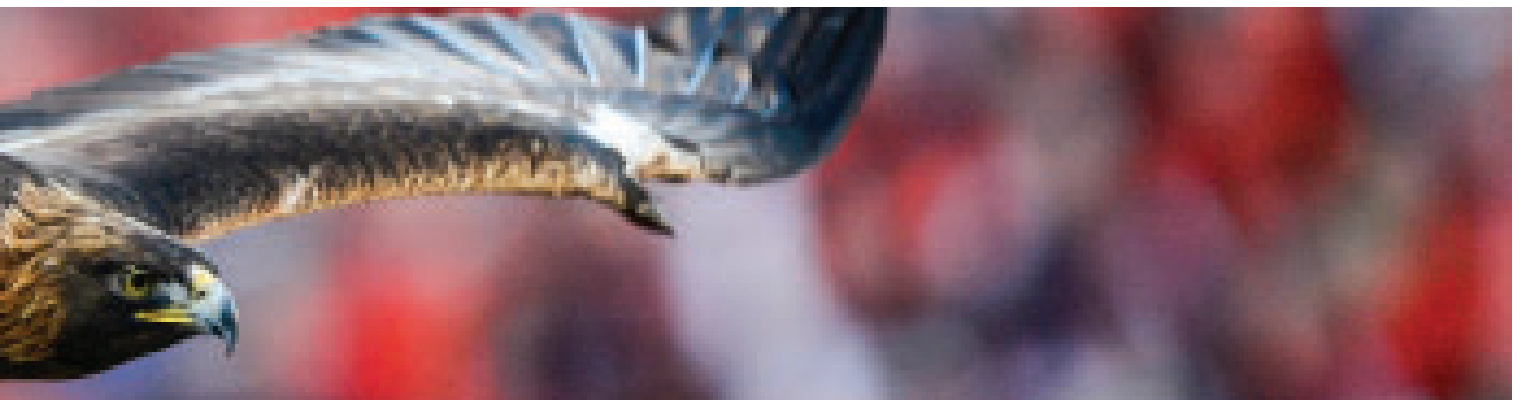

## TRADITIONS: TIGER WALK



Tiger Walk is an Auburn tradition that began in the early 1960s when Auburn players walked from Sewell Hall to the football stadium as fans lined Donahue Drive to wish the team well. Over the years, Tiger Walk has grown into a major part of game day at Auburn, so much so that it is listed on the players' game weekend itinerary. The largest Tiger Walk is believed to have taken place prior to the 1989 Iron Bowl, when more than 20,000 well-wishers lined the street. Every Tiger Walk prior to home games draws thousands, and it has become a tradition for Auburn football players as they enter stadiums on the road. Tiger Walk traditionally begins two hours before kickoff for every game at Jordan-Hare Stadium.



## ROLLING TOOMER'S CORNER

The rolling of Toomer's Corner was named in 2018 as the nation's "Best Sports Tradition" by the *USA Today* 10 Best Readers' Choice travel award contest. Toomer's Corner, where Auburn's campus meets the city of Auburn at the intersection of College Street and Magnolia Avenue, has long been the gathering place for Auburn athletic celebrations. After significant sports victories, Auburn students and citizens alike have joined forces to "roll" the Auburn Oaks at Toomer's Corner with toilet tissue.

Although there have been various legends as to how the Toomer's Corner tradition began, one of the more popular stories centers around when Toomer's Drugs had the only telegraph in the city. As the story goes, during away football games, when employees of the local drug store received news of a win, they would throw the ticker tape from the telegraph onto the power lines.



# ROLLING TOOMER'S CORNER



The current Auburn Oaks at Toomer's Corner were planted in February 2017, and fans are asked not to roll the trees because they are not fully established. Fans are, however, encouraged to roll the adjacent trees. In 2016, the university planted 10 descendants of the original Auburn Oaks along a curved walkway in Samford Park, with trees reaching from Samford Hall to Toomer's Corner. The 15-year-old oaks were cultivated from acorns from the original trees, a project managed by Auburn's Forestry Club and Wildlife Society. Fans are also asked not to roll these descendent trees as they are not fully developed. Members of the Auburn Family have the opportunity to name a tree for themselves or someone of their choosing in recognition of a \$50,000 philanthropic gift benefitting the School of Forestry and Wildlife Sciences.



# JORDAN-HARE STADIUM

Auburn's showcase football stadium seats 87,451 with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the East side. The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats. Ten years later 14,000 more seats were added and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium (named after a member of Auburn's first football team and eventual professor and dean of the School of Chemistry), although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span. Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980; the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season. The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973, recognizing Hall of Fame coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan.

The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships.

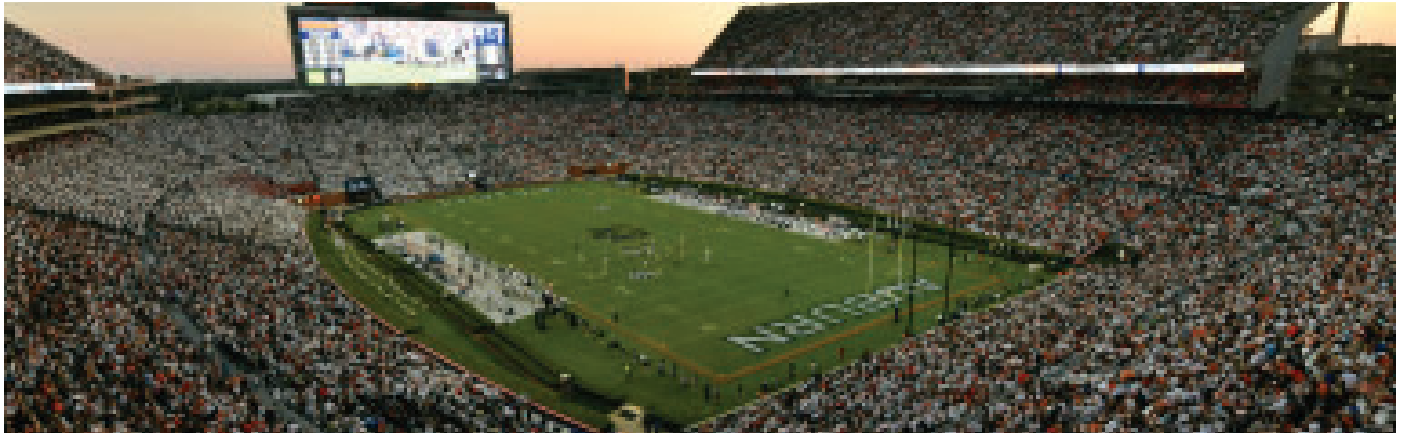

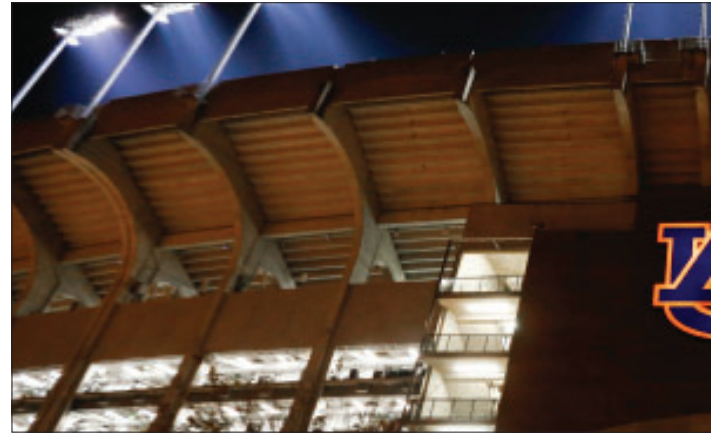

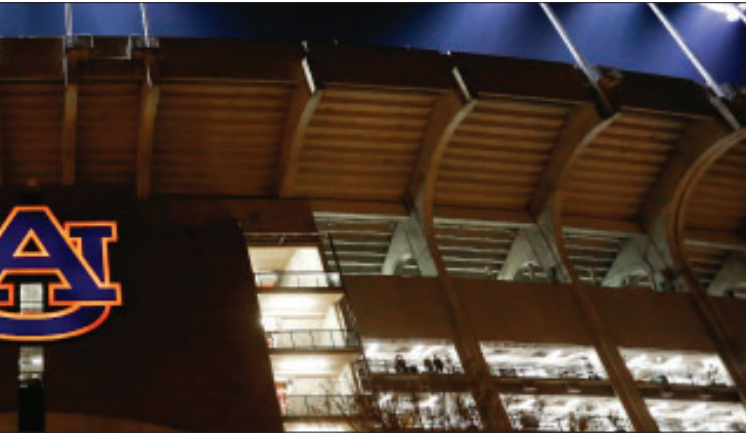

## SOUTH END ZONE RENOVATION

A leadership gift from Raymond and Kathryn Harbert allowed for the construction of the Harbert Family Recruiting Center, a gameday support and recruiting facility in the southwest corner of Jordan-Hare Stadium that opened prior to the 2018 season. The five-level, 44,000-square-foot facility includes exceptional recruiting space for football and Olympic sports, a club space for fans, a press box for media, and expanded and renovated locker rooms.

The Harbert Family Recruiting Center is the gold standard in college athletics recruiting. Also included in the redevelopment was the redesign of the former press box into a new premium seating experience for Auburn football's most loyal donors on the stadium's west side. Known as the Broadway Club, this luxury area offers the highest level of service within an upscale atmosphere and includes a spectacular view of the 50-yard line, deluxe interior finishes and furnishings available to 120 patrons.



## HEISMAN STATUES

The Auburn Family honored three of its all-time greats in a stirring ceremony under sunny skies on the east side of Jordan-Hare Stadium on Saturday, April 14, 2012.

A crowd of thousands roared as former Heisman Trophy winners Pat Sullivan, Bo Jackson and Cam Newton took the stage moments before towering statues immortalizing the Auburn greats from three different eras were unveiled.

## PAT SULLIVAN 1971

Auburn quarterback Pat Sullivan picked up the 'Tigers' first Heisman Trophy in 1971 after throwing for 20 touchdowns and racking up 2,096 yards of total offense. He led Auburn to a 9-2 record and a Sugar Bowl appearance in his senior season.



## HEISMAN STATUES

### BO JACKSON 1985

Bo Jackson plowed through defenses in 1985 for 6.4 yards per carry, earning Auburn's second Heisman Trophy. The three-sport athlete ran for 1,786 yards and 17 touchdowns while helping the Tigers to an 8-4 record and a Cotton Bowl appearance.



### CAM NEWTON 2010

Cam Newton put together one of the most remarkable college football seasons ever in 2010, throwing for 30 touchdowns and rushing for 20 while leading Auburn to a 14-0 record and the BCS National Championship. Newton tallied 4,327 yards of total offense while completing 66.1% of his passes.



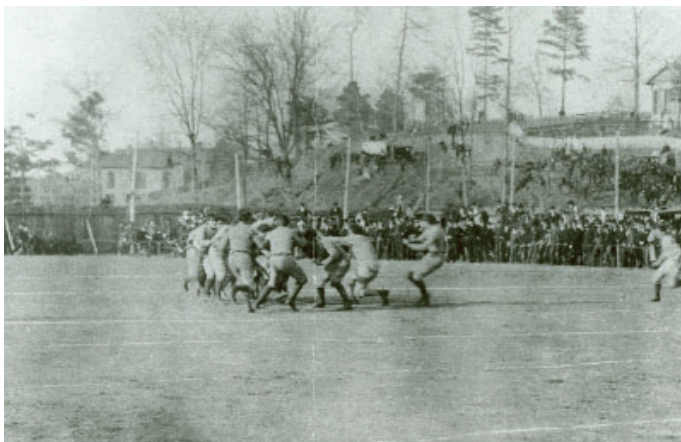
# THE IRON BOWL

## WHAT'S IN A NAME?

Of the first 53 meetings between Auburn and Alabama, 48 took place in Birmingham. The name "Iron Bowl" comes from Birmingham's historic role in the country's iron industry.

### 1893

The first Iron Bowl was played on Feb. 22, 1893 in Birmingham with Auburn taking the 32-22 win. The Tigers won the first two meetings and six of the first seven.



### 1982

The climax to a 23-22 Auburn victory over Alabama in 1982 was Bo Jackson's "Bo Over the Top" 1-yard leap over the Alabama goal line, which capped a 66-yard drive and set the stage for what Auburn people consider the Tigers' "coming out" party in the 1980s.



### 1972

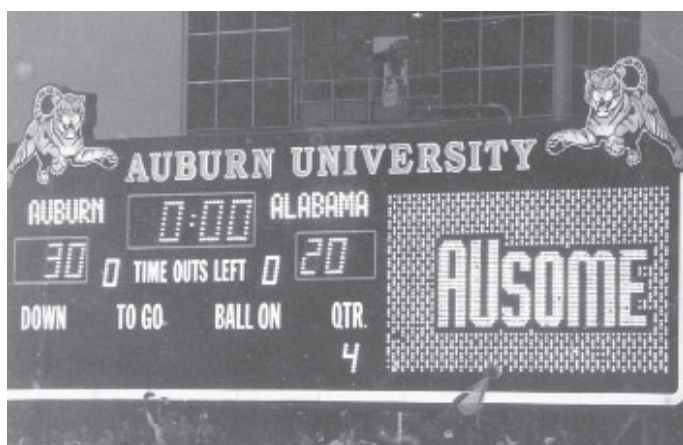
Trailing 16-3 with six minutes left, underdog Auburn's David Langner returned two blocked Alabama punts to win the game 17-16, handing the Crimson Tide their first loss of the season and ending hopes of a national title.



## THE IRON BOWL

### 1989

The first time Auburn and Alabama met in Auburn was in 1989, and the No. 11 Tigers beat the No. 2 Crimson Tide, 30-20, on Dec. 2, 1989.



### 2010

Down 24-0 in the second quarter, the Auburn defense inspired a school-record comeback for a 28-27 win in Tuscaloosa in 2010, en route to a national championship.



### KICK SIX

With one second remaining in the game, Auburn's Chris Davis returned a missed field goal 109 yards to give the Tigers a 34-28 win in the 2013 Iron Bowl.
