THE CHICK-FIL-A PEACH BOWL

» Auburn (10-3, 7-1 SEC) faces UCF (12-0, 8-0 AAC) in the 50th anniversary Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl played Monday, January 1, at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta.

Auburn is making its 42nd bowl appearance all-time, and its fifth straight under Gus Malzahn, the most consecutive seasons in a bowl for the Tigers since going bowling eight straight seasons from 2000-07. Auburn is 23-16-2 in bowl games.

It's the Tigers' sixth Peach Bowl appearance (4-1) and Auburn's 104th game played in Atlanta since its inaugural gridiron contest vs. Georgia there in 1892. Auburn is 48-47-8 all-time in Atlanta and 2-1 there under Gus Malzahn. Previous Peach Bowl appearances:

- » Auburn is 3-0 in the series vs. UCF, with wins at Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1997, 1998 and 1999. The Tigers have faced current members of the American Athletic Conference twice previously in bowl games, losing to Houston in the 1969 Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl and defeating Memphis in the 2015 Birmingham Bowl.
- >> This is the 87th time in program history Auburn will play multiple games in the same away city in a season; the last was Nashville (2003). It's the 10th season Auburn has played multiple games in Atlanta.
- » Auburn is the first team to defeat two CFP No. 1-ranked teams in the same season: 40-17 over Georgia and 26-14 over Alabama. Auburn is the only team to defeat a CFP No. 1 team by double digits, and the Tigers have done it twice this season. Auburn is the ninth team in the history of the AP poll to defeat multiple Top 2-ranked teams by double digits in the same season.

KICKOFF COVERAGE

- » Auburn, Louisville, South Florida and Ohio State are the only FBS teams averaging more than 225 yards rushing and 225 yards passing
- >> Kerryon Johnson's 17 touchdowns in SEC play were three more than any other SEC player. A Doak Walker Award semifinalist, Johnson is the ninth different Auburn player to rush for 1,000 yards in a season since 2009
- » Auburn, Alabama, Clemson, Georgia, Ohio State, Washington and Penn State are the only teams ranked in the top 25 in both scoring offense and scoring defense
- » Auburn's 327 points scored in SEC regular season action are a program best, and just the second time an Auburn team has topped 300 points in SEC play (306 points in 2010)
- » Auburn set a school record for most SEC wins in a season scoring 40 points or more with six such victories this season
- » Senior kicker Daniel Carlson, the first-ever three-time Lou Groza Award finalist, is the SEC career leader in scoring (471), FG made (90) and consecutive PAT made (195)
- » Kerryon Johnson is seventh in the FBS averaging 10.4 points per game this season (114 total points). He and Daniel Carlson (117 total points) are the only teammates ranked in the Top 20 nationally in total points scored
- >> Quarterback Jarrett Stidham leads the SEC in completion percentage (.667) and ranks seventh nationally
- \sim Auburn is one of only nine FBS teams with both a 2,800-yard passer and a 1,300-yard rusher this season
- » Auburn's three most recent opponents -- Alabama (11-1), Georgia (12-1) and UCF (12-0) -- are a combined 35-2 this season, with both losses coming to Auburn
- » Auburn is looking for its 11th win for the seventh time in program history. Other 11-win seasons include: 1983 (11-1), 1993 (11-0), 2004 (13-0), 2006 (11-2), 2010 (14-0) and 2013 (12-2).
- >> Auburn defeated CFP #1 teams twice in a three week span, defeating Georgia, 40-17, on Nov. 11 and Alabama, 26-14, on Nov. 25.

TOTAL OFFENSE

- » This is just the second season Auburn has had a player throw for 15 touchdowns and a player rush for 15 scores; Jarrett Stidham (17 pass) and Kerryon Johnson (17 rush) (also Cam Newton, 2010).
- Auburn has scored first in 11 of 13 games this year and in 15 of the last 17 games. The Tigers are 34-10 under Gus Malzahn when scoring first.

Auburn has scored on its opening drive in every game this season except the wins over Mercer, Texas A&M and Alabama.

» Against Missouri, Mississippi State and Ole Miss, Auburn scored 40+ points in three straight games for the first time since 2013 (62 Western Carolina, 45 Texas A&M, 45 Florida Atlantic).

Auburn scored 40+ points against three straight SEC opponents for the first time since the 2013-14 seasons: 59 vs. Missouri (2013), 45 vs. Arkansas and 41 vs. LSU (2014).

- » Auburn's 327 points scored in SEC regualr season action were a program best, and just the second time an Auburn team has scored more than 300 points in SEC play in a season (306 points in 2010).
- » Auburn scored on 49 of its 56 trips into the red zone this season with 36 TDs, including 35-37 with 26 TD in SEC regular season play. The Tigers' 87.5 red zone scoring percentage is 41st nationally.
- » Auburn's offense has produced 27 plays from scrimmage of at least 40 yards, tied for sixth nationally.
- Muburn has gained at least 200 yards total offense in a quarter 15 times under Gus Malzahn (once in 2017), eight against SEC teams.

Auburn's 629 total offense yards (354 rush/284 pass) at Arkansas were the 12th-best total in Auburn history, the sixth-best ever by Auburn in an SEC contest and the seventh-best outing under Malzahn.

The Tigers gained 535 yards total offense (351 rush/184 pass) in the opener against Georgia Southern, 510 total yards (146 rush, 364

pass) against Mercer, 511 total yards (244 rush, 272 pass) against Mississippi State, 561 against Ole Miss (326 rush/235 pass) and 552 vs. ULM (317 rush/235 pass).

There have been nine 600-yard total offense games and 22 500-yard games during Malzahn's tenure as head coach at Auburn.

» Auburn's eight 40-point games this season are the most in program history, and its six 40-point totals in SEC play are the most in school history, passing the 2010, 2013 and 2014 Tigers (four games).

It's also the 14th time the Tigers have had multiple 50-point games in a season. This is only the fourth time

Auburn has scored 50+ points in multiple SEC games (3 in 2010 and 2 in 2017, 2013 and 1970).

FIRST DOWNS

The Tigers posted 26 first downs at Arkansas and against Mercer and 25 in the wins over Georgia Southern, Ole Miss, Georgia, ULM and Alabama.

The Tigers have gained 20+ first downs in eight games this year and total 284 first downs for the season (21.8 per game).

Under Malzahn, the Tigers have gained 20 or more first downs in 48-66 games, with 29 games with 25+ first downs. Auburn averages 22.2 first downs per game under Malzahn.

ON THE RUN

» Only two schools had at least one 1,000-yard rusher per season from 2009-16: Auburn (10) and Boise State (8), and the Tigers have reached that mark again for 2017.

Auburn's 1,000-yard rushers during that span: Ben Tate (2009), Cam Newton (2010), Michael Dyer (2010 and 2011), Tre Mason (2012 and 2013), Nick Marshall (2013), Cameron Artis-Payne (2014), Peyton Barber (2015), Kamryn Pettway (2016), Kerryon Johnson (2017).

Johnson joined that list with a 167-yard performance against Georgia, and now has 1,320 yards for the season.

>> In the latest NCAA statistics, Kerryon Johnson leads the SEC in rushing yards per game (120.0), scoring (11.4 ppg) and all-purpose yards per game (137.09).

Johnson is on pace to become the fifth Auburn player to lead the SEC in rushing during Malzahn's eight years at Auburn (2010/ Cam Newton, 2013/Tre Mason, 2014/Cameron Artis-Payne, 2016/Kamryn Pettway).

- » Johnson is tied for seventh nationally with 17 rushing TD and is sixth with 19 total TD in 2017. In league play, his 17 total TD were three more than any other SEC player and he led the SEC with 15 rushing TD in league action. His 17 rushing scores are more than 43 FBS teams have for the season.
- » With five rushing touchdowns against Missouri, three versus Mississippi State and three TD against Ole Miss, Johnson was the first Auburn player to rush for 11 total TD in a three-game span since Peyton Barber in 2015, the only Auburn players to reach that mark.
- » A Doak Walker Award semifinalist, Johnson was the first Auburn player to rush for a touchdown in seven consecutive games since Nick Marshall during the 2013-14 seasons.
- » All-time Auburn leaders in rushing touchdowns in a season in SEC games:
 - 15 Cam Newton (2010)
 - 15 Kerryon Johnson (2017)13 Tre Mason (2013)
- » Against Alabama, Johnson rushed for 104 yards and a score, and threw a 3-yard touchdown pass to Nate Craig-Myers.
- » Johnson's 204 rushing yards on 28 carries against Ole Miss was a career high for the junior, and the 29th 200-yard rushing game in Auburn history.

After rushing for 156 yards on a careerbest 31 carries at LSU and gaining 63 yards in the first half at Arkansas, he added another 100-yard performance at Texas A&M with 145 yards gained on 29 carries, scoring on a 2-yard run and a 2-yard reception. With five catches in the game, he finished with 174 all-purpose yards. He rushed for 167 yards and scored on a 55-yard TD catch (career long reception) against Georgia.

- >> Johnson now ranks 12th on Auburn's career rushing list with 2,423 yards, 11 career 100-yard games, 31 career rushing touchdowns and seven career multiple-score games.
- Johnson's five rushing touchdowns at Missouri were the most by an Auburn player since Peyton Barber had five rushing TD vs. San José State in 2015, and just one shy of the Auburn record of six touchdowns set by Carnell Williams vs. Mississippi State in 2003.
- Auburn got 100-yard rushing performances vs. Georgia Southern from Kerryon Johnson (136 yards, 1 TD) and Kam Martin (136 yards, 1 TD), the first Auburn duo to rush for 130+ yards in a game since Carnell Williams (161) and Brandon Jacobs (182) vs. Mississippi State in 2003.

Johnson's 60-yard touchdown run in the first quarter was his longest career run and his 15th career TD (all rushing). Martin's third carry of the game went for 36 yards and his fourth career rushing touchdown. Martin broke off a 61-yard run in the fourth quarter, the longest of his career.

Kamryn Pettway rushed for 128 yards and three touchdowns against Mercer, his eighth career 100-yard rushing game and his third career multiple-touchdown game.

At Arkansas, Pettway rushed for 90 yards and three scores in the second half, including 86 yards rushing and three touchdowns in the third quarter.

>> Auburn has produced a 100-yard rusher in 47 of 66 games under head coach Gus Malzahn. Ten different Tigers have rushed for 100 yards in a game under Malzahn (58 100yd performances).

Auburn's record with a 100-yard rusher during the Malzahn era is 37-10; with two 100-yard rushers in the same game, it's 11-0.

QB JARRETT STIDHAM

Sophomore Jarrett Stidham leads the SEC and ranks seventh nationally in completion percentage (.667, 218-327) and ranks fifth in the league and 15th nationally in passing efficiency (154.0).

Averaging 217.5 passing yards per game with 17 touchdown passes for the season, his long completion was a 75-yard touchdown toss to Ryan Davis vs. Ole Miss.

- Stidham ranks third in passing yardage (2,827), first in completions (218) and seventh in touchdown passes (17) among Auburn single-season all-time leaders.
- >> In SEC regular season games, Stidham had a pass efficiency rating of 169.56. He was 125-186 (.672) in SEC action, passing for 1,819 yards and 12 scores. In SEC games only, Stidham led the conference in yards per attempt (9.8) and passing efficiency.
- Stidham ranks seventh nationally with 17 passes of at least 40 yards and is fifth with 10 50+-yard passes this season. He is tied for 19th with 22 30+-yard passes this season.

At Texas A&M, Stidham was 20-27 for 268 yards passing, with touchdown passes of 53, 4 and 2 yards, his first three-TD game at Auburn.

He added three more TD passes against Georgia, where he was 16-23 for 214 yards, and also scored on a 7-yard run. That made him the first Auburn QB since Cam Newton

(2010) to throw three scores in consecutive games.

» At Missouri, he was 13-17 for 218 yards and a touchdown. Against Mississippi State, Stidham was 13-16 for 264 yards and pair of scores, earning SEC player of the week and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose player of the week honors.

He was 14-21 against Ole Miss for 235 yards and touchdowns of 75 and 19 yards, and passed for 165 yards at LSU with a 49-yard TD and 218 yards at Arkansas.

» Stidham finished 32-37 for 364 yards passing against Mercer. His 32 completions were the second-most in a game in Auburn history (Patrick Nix, 34 vs. Arkansas in 1995).

At 86.5%, Stidham had the second best single-game completion percentage in SEC history [minimum 30 completions] (record: 88.6%, Tim Tebow, 31-35 vs. Cincinnati, 2009).

» Stidham had a stretch of 18 consecutive completions from midway through the first quarter through early in the third quarter, setting an Auburn record (previous: 16, Stan White vs. New Mexico State, 1993).

Stidham's 364 passing yards were the 11th-most in a single game in Auburn history, and marked the second 300-yard passing game of his career and Auburn's first individual 300-yard passer since Nick Marshall threw for a school-record 456 yards at Alabama in 2014.

» Against Georgia Southern in his Auburn debut, Stidham rushed for a 14-yard touchdown and notched his first passing TD, a 19-yard strike to Ryan Davis, then another in the fourth quarter, another 19-yard scoring pass to Will Hastings.

Stidham was the first QB to throw and run for a TD in his Auburn debut since Cam Newton vs. Arkansas State in 2010. Two other QBs threw and rushed for a TD in their Auburn debuts: Pat Sullivan vs. Wake Forest (1969) and Patrick Nix vs. Ole Miss (1994).

Stidham was 75-109 passing for 1,265 yards and 12 touchdowns as a true freshman at Baylor during the 2015 season. He appeared in 10 games, starting three games (Kansas State, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State).

THE TARGETS

» Ryan Davis has set the Auburn single-season record for receptions with 76; he ranks second in the SEC in receptions per game with 5.8 catches per contest.

The junior has 76 receptions for 768 yards and five scores in 2017. His first career 100-yard game came against Alabama, where he had 11 receptions for 139 yards.

Davis has eight games this season with six or more receptions; his previous best was 80 yards on seven catches with a 4-yard score at Texas A&M.

With 149 receiving yards on four catches at Arkansas, Darius Slayton recorded his first career 100-yard game and the 124th 100-yard receiving game in Auburn history (16th under Malzahn).

It was the most receiving yards by a Tiger since Ricardo Louis caught seven passes for 154 yards at Kentucky in 2015.

Slayton's 62-yard touchdown reception at Arkansas from Ryan Davis was a career long and also the longest TD completion by a non-quarterback in Auburn records.

Slayton followed up with 99 receiving yards on just two catches at Texas A&M, with a 53-yard TD from Stidham, and added a 42-yard score against Georgia and a 50-yard touchdown against ULM.

- » Slayton was the first AU receiver to catch a TD pass in four straight games since Emory Blake (seven games in 2010-11). His 404 yards receiving over the last five regular season games surpassed his career total of 292 yards entering this season.
- Slayton leads the team averaging 23.9 yards per reception on 24 catches, followed by Will Hastings (20.4 ypc on 20 receptions). Davis (5), Slayton (5), Hastings (3) and Nate Craig-Myers (3) lead the team in touchdown catches.
- » Nine Auburn players have caught at least one pass of 35 yards or longer this year.
- Auburn is tied for seventh nationally with 11 passes of 50 or more yards and is ninth nationally with 18 pass plays of 40+ yards.
- >> This season, 17 different Auburn receivers have caught at least one pass.

DEFENSIVE DOMINATION

- Auburn ranks 14th nationally in total defense and 10th in scoring defense, allowing 312.3 yards and 17.3 points per game.
- » Auburn is allowing 312.3 total yards per game, the fewest the Tigers have allowed in a season since 2007 (297.9).
- Auburn has allowed negative/no yards on 319 of 886 (36.0%) plays defended this season.
- » Auburn ranks ninth nationally allowing just 4.58 yards per play, the Tigers' best season mark since 2007 (4.53).
- >> Georgia Southern was held without a third-down conversion (0-15); the last time an Auburn defense held an opponent to 0 third-down conversions was vs. LSU (0-13) in 2014.
- » Auburn held Georgia Southern to 78 yards total offense, the fewest by an Auburn opponent since Ole Miss had 9 total yards in 1985 and tied for the fewest yards allowed in an FBS vs. FBS game this season.

That tied the fewest yards by an opponent in a season opener since UT-Chattanooga had 78 yards in 1967 and was the first time an opponent was held under 100 yards since Ball State had 92 yards in 2001.

» The Tigers held Georgia Southern (70) and Clemson (96) to fewer than 100 yards rushing, the first time the Auburn defense did that in back-to-back games since 2014. Ole Miss gained only 83 yards on the ground.

In 26 games under Kevin Steele as defensive coordinator, Auburn has held eight different opponents to 100 yards rushing or fewer, the latest being Georgia (46 rushing yards).

- Auburn's defense has allowed only three touchdowns in the first quarter in the last 18 games, only two in the opening period during 2017. The Tigers have allowed an average 53.4 yards first-quarter total offense this season.
- Auburn has registered 63 three-and-outs on 158 drives this season, averaging 4.85 per game, 12th-best nationally.
- The last time Auburn allowed 266 yards rushing or fewer in the first three games of a season was 2014 (258: Arkansas/153, San Jose' State/65, at Kansas State/40).

The last time Auburn surrendered 100-or-fewer yards in three straight games was at the start of the 2008 season (ULM/84, Southern Miss/37, at Mississippi State/38).

- >> Auburn has allowed only 17.1 points per game since the start of the 2016 season.
- » In 26 games under Steele, the Auburn defense has recorded 61 sacks (2.35 per game) and has only been held without a sack four times. Auburn has recorded at least 6.0 TFL in 17 of those games.

Those 61 sacks are the most in consecutive seasons at Auburn since recording 63 sacks in 2009-10. The Tigers' 36 sacks this season are their most since 2005 (39).

The Tigers have forced 35 turnovers (17 INT, 18 FR) and allowed only 18 rushing touchdowns during that stretch.

- » Auburn is tied for 20th nationally having allowed only four plays from scrimmage of at least 50 yards this season.
- Auburn is third nationally having allowed just 18 rushing TD since the start of the 2016 season and ranks sixth allowing only 50 total TD during that span.
- >> The Tigers rank ninth nationally, allowing only 129 plays of 10 yards or more (9.9/game).
- >> The Tigers rank ninth nationally and first in the SEC recovering 12 fumbles this season.

Against Clemson, Auburn forced and recovered two opponent fumbles for the first

time since last season's Mississippi State game. Forcing the fumbles were Jeff Holland and Marlon Davidson, with Jeremiah Dinson and Tray Matthews on the recoveries.

At Missouri, Holland, Montavious Atkinson and Jordyn Peters forced fumbles that were recovered by Davidson, Daniel Thomas and Tyrone Truesdell. Stephen Roberts forced an LSU fumble recovered by Carlton Davis.

At Arkansas, Jeff Holland forced two fumbles and recovered one; another fumble was forced by Derrick Brown and Deshaun Davis and Darrell Williams had recoveries.

Darrell Williams also recovered a Georgia fumble. Carlton Davis had a fumble recovery vs. ULM and and Tre' Williams recovered an Alabama fumble.

DEFENDING THE PASS

- » Auburn ranks 22nd nationally in defensive pass efficiency (113.06) and 14th in passing yards allowed per game, giving up just 177.8 yards per contest. The Tigers allow just 5.9 yards per pass attempt, tied for seventh nationally.
- Auburn has allowed only 2,311 passing yards this season, giving up 177.8 passing yards per game, the Tigers' best mark since allowing 173.2 yards per game in 2007.
- » Against ULM, Javaris Davis recorded his second interception of the season and Nick Ruffin scored on a 45-yard interception return. It's the first time since 2011 Auburn has had multiple interception scores in a season.
- » Sophomore Daniel Thomas grabbed Auburn's first interception of 2017 with a pick in the endzone on the final play of the win against Georgia Southern. Carlton Davis had an interception at Missouri, the fourth of his career.

Against Mississippi State, Tray Matthews recorded his fourth interception at Auburn and Javaris Davis recorded his first career pick six with a 37-yard return. That was Auburn's first interception touchdown since 2015 and its first in an SEC game since 2014.

- » Georgia Southern's eight passing yards were the fewest by an Auburn opponent since Vanderbilt had just seven yards passing against the Tigers in 1993.
- >> The Auburn defense has 66 interceptions in 66 games since the beginning of 2013. Five members of the current squad have multiple career interceptions.

- » Seven current players have totaled more than 100 career tackles each at Auburn: Tre' Williams (184), Tray Matthews (174), Deshaun Davis (143), Carlton Davis (138), Stephen Roberts (136), Dontavius Russell (113) and Darrell Williams (104). Nick Ruffin (91) could soon join that list.
- » Senior linebacker Tre' Williams led Auburn with a career-best 10 tackles, 2.0 sacks, 2.0 TFL and a QB hurry against Georgia Southern, Williams' third career double-figure tackle game and the seventh game he has been Auburn's leading tackler during his career.

Carlton Davis, with a career-best 11 tackles and two PBU, was the top tackler at Clemson.

Tre' Williams and Jeremiah Dinson led the Tigers with six tackles each against Mercer. Tray Matthews and Montavius Atkinson each had a team-best six tackles at Missouri.

Deshaun Davis tied a career high with a team-best 10 tackles against Mississippi State. Davis, Nick Ruffin and Jamel Dean led Auburn with seven tackles each vs. Ole Miss.

At LSU, Deshaun Davis, Darrell Williams, Roberts and Dontavius Russell each had seven stops. At Arkansas, Russell, Darrell Williams and Nick Coe led Auburn with six tackles each.

Derrick Brown was the tackle leader at Texas A&M with a career-best seven stops. Stephen Roberts, Carlton Davis and Jeremiah Dinson had six tackles each vs. Georgia to lead the Tigers.

Deshaun Davis had nine tackles, two TFL and a sack against ULM, and led Auburn with 10 tackles in the SEC championship game.

Auburn's 36 sacks are its most in a season since 2005 (39). Auburn has passed its season sack total from the past three years -- 2016 (25), 2015 (19) and 2014 (21).

The Tigers are 21st nationally this season in total sacks (2.77 per game). Auburn's 79 TFL this year rank 60th nationally (6.1/gm).

- yy Jeff Holland is fourth in the SEC and ranks 22nd nationally averaging 0.69 sacks per game (9.0 total for the season), ranking him tenth among Auburn's all-time single-season leaders.
- Auburn's 12 TFL and six sacks vs. Georgia Southern were the most by the Tigers since 14 TFL and six sacks vs. Ole Miss in 2013.

Four players collected the six sacks: Tre' Williams (2), Marlon Davidson (2), Derrick Brown and Jeff Holland. Williams, Davidson, Brown, Holland and Stephen Roberts had multiple TFL against the Eagles.

Against Clemson, Brown, Holland, Nick Coe, Montavious Atkinson, Tre' Williams and Dontavius Russell had a hand in sacks, and Davidson, Roberts, Jamel Dean and Darrell Williams added TFL.

Auburn totaled seven TFL against Mercer, six at Missouri and at LSU, five vs. Mississippi State and four vs. Georgia.

At Arkansas, Auburn's six sacks came from Holland (1.5), Jeremiah Dinson, Brown, Big Kat Bryant, Coe (0.5), Davidson (0.5) and T.D. Moultry (0.5), part of eight TFL that game. Those six sacks were the most by Auburn in an SEC game since six against Ole Miss in 2013.

LEGATRON

» The first-ever three-time Lou Groza finalist, Daniel Carlson holds 13 Auburn kicking records. The All-American holds the SEC records for career scoring (471 points), field goals made (90) and consecutive PAT made (195).

Carlson is also a member of the 2017 AFCA Good Works Team, a Senior CLASS Award and Pop Warner Award finalist and a Wuerffel Trophy semifinalist.

» Carlson has made 195 consecutive PAT kicks, the longest such string in Auburn history. He broke the SEC consecutive PAT record against Mississippi State (previous: John Becksvoort, Tennessee, 1991-94, 161 PAT).

He is now the leader in Auburn career PAT made and one of just six SEC kickers to convert 100% of more than 100 PAT attempts.

- Auburn kickers have converted 222 consecutive PAT attempts back to the 2013 Tennessee game, the longest active streak in the FBS.
- Senior Tyler Stovall was a semifinalist for the Mortell Holder of the Year Award. Stovall has been the holder for all of Daniel Carlson's SEC-record 463 kick points scored.
- » Auburn one game ahead of Hawai'i for the longest current string of games without having a punt blocked (116 games). The Tigers last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.
- » Auburn's blocked punt recovered for a touchdown at Texas A&M was the first blocked punt by the Tigers since 2013 (vs. Alabama) and the first recovered for a score since 2006 (Florida). Nick Ruffin had the block and Malik Miller the recovery for the touchdown.



Auburn-UCF Series History



LAST MEETING WITH UCF

For the second year in a row, Auburn (4-5, 1-5) used a fourth-quarter rally to defeat Central Florida (3-6) 28-10 Saturday in front of a Homecoming crowd of 75,804 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The win snaps a five-game losing skid for Auburn.

"Thankfully, we have finally broken the five game losing streak," said Coach Tommy Tuberville. "That is a lot of pressure and weight to handle in practice and off the field. We can finally relax and feel the relief of all the pressure."

The Tigers piled 21 points on the board in the game's last four minutes to spoil the Golden Knights upset hopes.

Trailing 10-7 late in the fourth quarter, Auburn quarterback Jeff Klein led his team on a 16-play, 70-yard drive. The drive concluded when Klein connected with wide receiever Reggie Worthy for a 16-yard touchdown pass with 3:41 left to play.

The score gave the Tigers their first lead since the first quarter.

"He (Worthy) was taller than the defender, and he did a good job using his wing-span and catching the ball." Tuberville said.

Central Florida failed to move the ball on the ensuing possession, turning the ball over on downs at their own 8-yard line.

Auburn made the score 21-10 on the next play as Heath Evans blasted into the end zone.

The Tigers were not finished with the sudden scoring outburst. Middle linebacker Alex Lincoln stepped in front of a Vic Penn pass and raced 20 yards for the touchdown just 54 seconds after the Tigers' last score.

"That was my first touchdown since high school," Lincoln said. "I wasn't looking around, just running. I knew if I got off that first tackler I could get to the corner."

Auburn showed signs of a running game in the first half, collecting 85 yards on 22 carries.

Evans started the game at tailback instead of his regular position of fullback. The bruising sophomore carried 15 tiems for 71 yards in the first half and finished the game with 81 yards and one touchdown.

A change in Central Florida's defensive alignment in the second half snuffed out Auburn's new-found rushing attack. The Tigers were held to only 13 yards rushing in the final two quarters, leaving Auburn with 98 total rushing yards on the game.

"They came out with seven and eight-man fronts in the second half and we didn't run well," Evans said. "It's really hard to run the ball on an eight-man front."

The tenacious Auburn defense completely eliminated the Knights' ground game.

Central Florida was held to negative 27 yards on just 33 attempts. Omari Howard was the rushing leader for the Knights with only 11 yards and a 2.2 yards-per-carry average.

While the Tigers shut down Central Florida's ground game, they struggled to contain Penn and wide receiver Chalres Lee.

Penn threw 52 times, completing 22 passes for 374 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions.

"I thought Victor did a remarkable job under extreme duress," said Central Florida coach Mike Kruczek. "He did a good job against what was in my opinion a very talented defense."

Lee was Penn's go-to-guy, pulling in 11 passes for 203 yards. Lee also scored Central Florida's only touchdown of the day, racing 83 yards for the score in the second quarter.

Auburn quarterback Ben Leard did not dress out for this week's game after suffering a concussion against Arkansas.

Klein, starting his fourth game in place of Leard, struggled much of the day but still completed 19 of 31 passes for 270 yards, two interceptions and two touchdowns.





Head Coach Gus Malzahn



In five years as head coach at Auburn, Gus Malzahn has led the Tigers to a 45-21 record, five consecutive bowl game, a Southeastern Conference Championship, two SEC West Division titles and an appearance in the BCS National Championship Game (2013). Malzahn has directed Auburn to four New Year's Day bowl games in five seasons, a program first since 2004-06.

Malzahn, 54-24 in six seasons as a head coach, has directed teams to seven conference championship game appearances in his 12 seasons as a collegiate coach, including a pair of SEC Championships at Auburn (2010, 2013) and a Sun Belt Championship at

Arkansas State in 2012.

The 2013 Bear Bryant, Bobby Bowden, Eddie Robinson, Home Depot, Sporting News, SB Nation, Liberty Mutual and Associated Press National Coach of the Year, Malzahn earned SEC Coach of the Year honors after guiding Auburn to the biggest turnaround in SEC history.

He led the Tigers to a 12-2 record and one of the most memorable seasons in school history in 2013, with historic wins over Georgia and Alabama and a record-setting SEC Championship win over Missouri. He became just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, joining LSU's Bernie Moore in 1935 and Ole Miss' John Vaught in 1947.

This season, Malzahn's team reached as high as No. 2 in the College Football Playoff Poll and played in the SEC Championship Game for the second time in five seasons, knocking off No. 1 Georgia and No. 1 Alabama in a November to remember on The Plains. It was the first time in poll history that a program has defeated two top-ranked teams during the same regular season.

The 2017 Tigers were one of four FBS teams to average more than 225 yards rushing and 225 yards passing this season and averaged 37.1 points per game in league play. Auburn averaged 40.9 points and 491.1 yards in SEC action, both program bests, while winning five of seven conference games by 21 points or more.

In 2016, Malzahn's team won six consecutive games, the third longest win streak by Auburn over the last 12 years, while finishing second in the nation's most difficult division, the SEC West. Under his direction, the 2016 Tigers ranked in the top 50 nationally in total offense and total defense, an Auburn first since 2005.

Auburn's balance in 2016 was displayed by a team that ranked first in the SEC and sixth nationally in rushing, coupled with a defense that was seventh in the country in scoring defense and 28th in total defense. The special team units have traditionally been a strong point under Malzahn and was no different in 2016 behind the strong leg of All-America and Groza Award finalist kicker Daniel Carlson.

In 2015, the youthful Tigers, which lost 14 players to the NFL from the previous season, faced 11 bowl teams en route to a Birmingham Bowl victory over Memphis. Malzahn's 2014 team was ranked in the nation's top 10 for a majority of the season before finishing 8-5 after navigating the nation's most difficult schedule featuring seven ranked foes.

One of the most innovative offensive minds in football, Malzahn's high-powered offense has averaged over 450 yards of total offense and 33.7 points per game in his five seasons at Auburn.

He has produced 15 1,000-yard rushers in 11 seasons as a college coach, at least one in each season, including Heisman Trophy finalist Tre Mason (1,816) and Nick Marshall (1,068) in 2013 and Cameron-Artis Payne (1,608) in 2014. Kamryn Pettway ran for 1,123 yards in 2016 despite missing significant time with injuries and Kerryon Johnson led the SEC with 1,320 yards in 2017.

On three occasions, he has had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season: 2013 (Auburn), 2010 (Auburn) and 2006 (Arkansas) and this year, in addition to Pettway, Kerryon Johnson notched 862 rushing yards. Malzahn has also coached five 1,000-yard receivers and three 3,000-yard passers. His 2007 Tulsa team had three 1,000-yard receivers.

Since Malzahn's arrival, Auburn has the top rushing offense in the SEC, averaging 257.0 yards per game. In 2013, Auburn led the nation in rushing at 328.3 yards per game, the first SEC team ever to do so. Three of the top six team rushing totals in SEC history (2010, 2013, 2016) have come under Malzahn's leadership.

Auburn was just the second team in SEC history to gain more than 7,000 yards of total offense in a season in 2013, finishing the year with 7,018 yards; the other was Texas A 8tM in 2012

The Tigers set a school record with 48 rushing touchdowns in 2013 and set a school record against SEC opponents with 677 yards of total offense vs. No. 5 Missouri in the SEC Championship Game. The Tigers set SEC Championship Game team records with 26 rushing first downs, 74 rushing attempts, 545 rushing yards and seven rushing touchdowns.

Tre Mason, a Heisman Trophy finalist and SEC Player of the Year in 2013, ranked third in the nation with 23 touchdowns, was fifth nationally with 1,816 yards rushing, sixth with 10.7 points per game, sixth with 169.57 all-purpose yards per game and eighth with 129.7 rushing yards per game. Mason set the Auburn single-season record with 1,816 rushing yards and 2,374 all-purpose yards, is second with 317 rushing attempts. His 46 rushing attempts and 304 rushing yards vs. No. 5 Missouri set SEC Championship Game records and fell three yards shy of the Auburn record.

Four Auburn players were taken in the 2014 NFL Draft, including two first round picks; offensive tackle Greg Robinson No. 2 overall to the St. Louis Rams and defensive end Dee Ford No. 23 to the Kansas City Chiefs. Mason was a third round selection by the Rams while fullback Jay Prosch was a sixth round pick by the Houston Texans. A total of 16 players have been drafted during Malzahn's tenure as head coach.

Malzahn has coached 10 All-Americans as head coach at Auburn: RB Tre Mason (2013), RS Chris Davis (2013), C Reese Dismukes (2014), PK Daniel Carlson (2015-16-17), DL Carl Lawson (2016), DL Montravious Adams (2016), OL Braden Smith (2016-17), DB Carlton Davis (2017), BUCK Jeff Holland (2017), and RB Kerryon Johnson (2017). Dismukes was named the 2014 Rimington Award winner as the nation's top center and Carlson was a three-time Lou Groza

Head Coach Gus Malzahn

Award.

The Tigers have faced the nation's most difficult schedule collectively during Malzahn's five years on the Plains facing 28 ranked opponents, including 15 in the top 10. Auburn was the nation's only program in 2016 to face both the No. 1 and No. 2 ranked programs and in 2017 it faced three of the four CFP Semifinalists a total of four times, earning two wins.

Malzahn has his coaching staff have been highly successful on the recruiting trail, recording five consecutive Top 10 nationally ranked recruiting classes, a first in the program's history.

Academically, Malzahn's Tigers have excelled as over 100 players have graduated since his arrival. In the fall 2016 semester a program-best 56 players posted a 3.0 grade point average.

Malzahn, who won the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach in 2010 while helping the Tigers to the national title, returned to Auburn after serving as the head coach at Arkansas State in 2012, where he led the program to the Sun Belt Conference title.

As offensive coordinator, Malzahn made an immediate impact during his tenure at Auburn, highlighted by a record-setting offense in 2010 when the Tigers finished 14-0 and claimed the school's first national title since 1957.

Malzahn's arrival in 2009 and style of offense marked a drastic turnaround from the 2008 season when Auburn struggled offensively. In a two-year period, the Tigers improved from a tie for 110th to seventh in the nation in scoring offense (from 17.3 to 41.2) and from 104th to seventh in total offense.

The 2010 Auburn offense set nine school records, while leading the SEC

and finished in the top 10 nationally in six statistical categories. He coached Heisman Trophy winner Cam Newton, who had one of the best single-season performances at the position in college football history. Newton threw for 2,908 yards and 30 touchdowns, while rushing for 1,586 yards and 20 TDs. Newton, the No. 1 overall draft pick in the 2011 NFL Draft, also won the Davey O'Brien, Manning and Maxwell Awards.

During two seasons (2007-08) at Tulsa, Malzahn's offenses were among the nation's finest, ranking first nationally in total offense. Tulsa's offense in 2007 established nine team and 12 individual school records; the 2008 Tulsa offense averaged 569.9 yards per game and was second nationally averaging 47.2 points per games.

Malzahn spent one season at Arkansas as offensive coordinator, coaching Heisman Trophy runner-up Darren McFadden and helping the SEC West champion Razorbacks finish fourth nationally in rushing offense.

Malzahn's coaching career began in his home state of Arkansas at the high school level. In 14 seasons as a high school head coach, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame.

Born in Irving, Texas, Malzahn graduated from high school in Fort Smith, Ark., and played football at Arkansas and Henderson State, earning his bachelor's degree from Henderson in 1990.

Malzahn is married to the former Kristi Otwell and they are the parents of two daughters, Kylie and Kenzie.

Steven Leath *Auburn University President*

Steven Leath became Auburn University's 19th president in June 2017. A proven university leader with expertise in teaching, outreach, research, and economic development, Dr. Leath's goal is to strengthen Auburn's impact as a leading land-grant institution. He has three

top priorities: educating students with a focus on leadership that prepares them for life; increasing research and scholarship while growing collaborations with business, industry, and government partners; and increasing the university's profi le nationally and internationally.

Prior to arriving at Auburn, Dr. Leath served for more than five years as president of Iowa State University, a top research institution with an international reputation in science and technology. While he was president, the university achieved its highest student graduation rate, lowered student debt, grew research expenditures, set fundraising records, secured its largest private gift for an academic facility and its largest cash gift, and expanded the research park.

Trained as a plant scientist, Dr. Leath served at three universities in teaching, research, and economic development posts en route to his positions at Iowa State and Auburn.

Dr. Leath was vice president for research and sponsored programs for the 16-campus University of North Carolina System. Under his leadership, external research grants and contracts steadily increased and technology transfer activities were streamlined to make the universities more attractive to private sector partners and more responsive to state needs. He also helped develop the North Carolina Research Campus, a private-public venture that fosters advancements in biotechnology, nutrition, and health.

At North Carolina State University in Raleigh, Dr. Leath held several positions of increasing responsibility and prominence. Those positions include director of the North Carolina Agricultural Research Service, associate dean of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, professor, and research leader and plant pathologist with the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Agricultural Research Service.

Dr. Leath began his academic career at the University of Illinois, Urbana, as an extension plant pathologist. He has published numerous articles on plant disease resistance, plant breeding, and related areas and has presented his scientific work throughout the U.S. and in numerous countries. He holds a bachelor's degree in plant science from Pennsylvania State University, master's degree in plant science from the University of Delaware, and doctorate in plant pathology from the University of Illinois.

Dr. Leath and his wife, Janet, have two sons, Eric and Scott, and two dogs.



Jay Jacobs
Athletics Director

Jay Jacobs was named Auburn's 14th Director of Athletics in December 2004. A walk-on football player under legendary coach Pat Dye, Jacobs earned his undergraduate and master's degrees in business administration from Auburn in 1985 and 1988 respectively and is a two-time graduate of the

Harvard Business School Leadership Best Practices program. He is a member of the Auburn chapter of Phi Kappa Phi honorary.

Under Jacobs' leadership, annual revenue has grown from \$46 million to over \$145 million. The department fully funds its 21 sports, 12 of which are women's sports, through the reinvestment of operating cash flow. During Jacobs' tenure as AD, each sports program has been provided a new or renovated facility through investments of over \$240 million. Auburn student-athletes currently hold an average cumulative GPA of 3.17, the highest in program history. Over 40 percent of Auburn's student-athletes are on track to graduate with honors, up from 25 percent five years ago. Fan satisfaction surveys consistently rank Auburn as having the best game day experience in the SEC.

Consistent with his vision to be the best school for the best athletes, Jacobs is acutely focused on the attainment of the Fearless & True capital campaign fund-raising goal of \$61.7 million that will support a range of facility enhancements.

Jacobs was named a 2017 NACDA / Under Armour Athletics Director of the Year and was one of five finalists for the 2017 Sports Business Journal Athletics Director of the Year. Jacobs is the current Chair of the Southeastern Conference Athletics Directors and is a member of NCAA Division I Strategic Vision and Planning Committee.

Jacobs is married to the former Angie Sapp of Dublin, Ga. The couple has three daughters.

After Johnson's 34-yard gain, his last carry of the night, Stidham's touchdown run gave Auburn a 17-7 lead.

Martin scored from 36 to give Auburn a 24-7 halftime lead.

Stidham's first touchdown pass, a 19-yarder to Ryan Davis, put Auburn up 31-7 early in the third quarter.

Carlson's second field goal, a 37-yarder, made it 34-7 with 5:20 left in the third.

Stidham connected with Will Hastings on a 19-yard touchdown pass with 9:18 remaining for the final score.

Stidham completed 14 or 24 passes for 185 yards, two touchdowns and an interception.

Hastings led Auburn with four receptions for 68 yards and a touch-

Auburn averaged 6.6 yards per carry.

Georgia Southern was 0-for-15 on third down. Tre' Williams led Auburn's defense with 10 tackles and two sacks.

Five Tigers made their first starts: Stidham, offensive linemen Prince

Auburn's defense recovered two fumbles and Daniel Carlson kicked a pair of fields goals but Clemson quarterback Kelly Bryant ran for two touchdowns in No. 3 Clemson's 14-6 win.

Kamryn Pettway led Auburn with 74 yards on 22 carries. Ryan Davis made 8 receptions for 32 yards.

Jarrett Stidham completed 13-of-24 passes for 79 yards.

Carlson extended his career Auburn scoring record to 371 points, No. 7 all-time in SEC history.

"They have a great defense," Stidham said. "They're defending national champions for a reason. They did a lot of good things on defense. We just have to execute a lot better."

Carlton Davis made 11 solo tackles to lead No. 13 Auburn's defense.

"Our defense, I already knew that they were an outstanding defense," Malzahn said. "That's a very good offense. They held them to 14 points, played their guts out and gave us a chance to win it."

Bryant's 27-yard scoring run on the opening drive of the second half accounted for the final score.

In the third quarter, Marlon Davidson caused a fumble, with Tray Matthews recovering, to give the Tigers an opportunity to close the gap.

In the fourth quarter, Stephen Roberts' 25-yard punt return gave Auburn its best field position of the second half at its 45.

Both defenses limited offenses accustomed to explosive performances, with Auburn holding Clemson to 283 yards while Clemson held Auburn to 117.

Auburn sacked Clemson's quarterbacks three times while Clemson recorded 11 sacks.

The visiting Tigers led 7-6 at the half.

Auburn scored on its opening possession, consuming more than half of the first quarter on a 15-play drive resulting in Daniel Carlson's 24-yard field goal

Jeremiah Dinson's fumble recovery gave Auburn the ball at Clemson's 11, setting up Carlson's 28-yard field goal with 14:17 left in the first half.

Late in the first half, Clemson drove 88 yards on 12 plays for the goahead score. Quarterback Kelly Bryant scored from the 3 with the ex-

tra-point giving Clemson a one-point lead at the half.

"We'll get better offensively, and we'll get this thing corrected," Malzahn said. "There's no doubt about that."

Quarterback Jarrett Stidham played easily his best game as an Auburn Tiger. Kamryn Pettway rushed for three touchdowns. But it was the Auburn defense that stood out once again and forced a key three-and-out in the fourth quarter that helped propel the Tigers past Mercer, 24-10, on Saturday.

Mercer had cut the lead to seven and had a chance to tie the game with a touchdown, but the defense was having none of it. On first down, Byron Cowart and Big Kat Bryant stopped the running back for a loss of three. After an incomplete pass on second down, Derrick Brown got pressure on the quarterback and knocked the pass down on third down. And backed up deep in their own territory, the Bears were forced to

When Auburn got the ball back, the offense marched down the field and put the game out of reach with a four-vard touchdown run from Pettway. It was Pettway's third touchdown on the day and second out of the Wildcat position. He finished with 128 yards on the ground and also caught three passes for 32 yards.

It was a signature day for Stidham, too, who went 32 of 37 through the air for 367 yards and connected with nine different receivers.

Auburn outgained Mercer, 510 to 246, but five turnovers by Auburn -four fumbles and one interception -- allowed the Bears to hang around into the fourth quarter.

"I feel like we moved the football and did some good things," Auburn coach Gus Malzahn said after the game. "I don't remember the last time we had a quarterback [go] 32 for 37. That's a positive sign. But the underlying thing that's really carrying with me is the five turnovers.

"I'm the head coach. We have to solve that. It starts with me. I have to solve that. We're going to get hard on that. It is uncharacteristic, but if you put that aside, there are some good things that you can carry on to conference play."

Defensively, Jeremiah Dinson and Tre' Williams led Auburn with six tackles apiece, and thanks to seven tackles for loss, the Tigers held Mercer to 3.7 yards per play. Freshman Traivon Leonard made the game-clinch-

ing stop on fourth down with less than two minutes remaining.

Fellow freshmen Noah Igbinoghene and Devan Barrett also made contributions on offense. Igbinoghene caught three passes for 24 yards, and Barrett added three grabs for 17 yards. In all, 11 freshmen participated for the Tigers on Saturday.

The game marked Auburn's first trip to Missouri in program history, and after a convincing 51-14 win, it's likely the visiting Tigers can't wait to come back. They dominated in all three phases and secured their first SEC victory of the season.

After struggling at times the past couple weeks, the offense put together its best performance through the first four games. On the first play from scrimmage, Jarrett Stidham connected with Kyle Davis for 58 yards -- the longest pass play of the season for Auburn. The drive was capped by a Kerryon-Johnson touchdown run, a theme for the rest of the night.

Johnson, playing for the first time since the season opener, ran for 48 yards and five touchdowns -- one shy of the Auburn single-game record set by Carnell "Cadillac" Williams in 2003. As a team, the Tigers rushed for 263 yards.

Stidham had another solid day through the air as he went 13 of 17 for 218 yards and threw a 57-yard strike to Nate Craig-Myers for his lone touchdown of the game. Late in the third quarter, he gave way to true freshman Malik Willis, who got his first snaps at quarterback and finished the game for Auburn.

The defense might not have played up to its standard, allowing 340 total yards, but it was still another impressive effort by a unit that came in No. 2 nationally in total defense. The performance was highlighted by six tackles for loss, two sacks and four turnovers.

The first turnover came on Missouri's second drive when Carlton Davis pulled in his first interception of the season. Then early in the second quarter, Jeff Holland hit Drew Lock as he was attempting to throw the ball. Teammate Marlon Davidson picked up the loose football and returned it 33 yards to set up another Auburn touchdown. In the second half, Montavious Atkinson forced a fumble that was recovered by Dan-

Dominating defense, a vertical passing game and a trio of Kerryon Johnson touchdowns highlighted No. 13 Auburn's 49-10 win Saturday over No. 24 Mississippi State.

Auburn gained 205 yards on four of Jarrett Stidham's passes, including a 57-yarder to Eli Stove that Stidham launched from deep in Auburn's end zone to begin a 99-yard drive.

While Stidham averaged 20 yards per completion (13-for-16 for 264 yards), Auburn limited MSU's Nick Fitzgerald to 157 passing yards, while forcing 20 incompletions.

Auburn intercepted Fitzgerald twice, with Javaris Davis' 37-yard interception return early in the fourth quarter giving the Tigers a 42-10 lead. Tray Matthews made Auburn's other interception.

Through five games, Auburn has allowed 55 points. The Tigers are the only FBS team to allow 14 or fewer points in each game this season.

Johnson gained 116 yards on 23 carries, scoring three touchdowns, including two in the second half as Auburn pulled away.

Malik Willis scored his first Auburn touchdown, a 67-yarder with 3:04 remaining for the final score.

On the game's third play, Johnson ran 58 yards to MSU's 5. Four plays later, Johnson scored his seventh touchdown of the season on fourthand-goal from the 1 after Malzahn called a timeout and decided against attempting a field goal.

State kicked a 40-yard field goal after recovering a Stidham fumble.

Auburn responded with razzle dazzle; a 49-yard flea flicker from Stidham to Darius Slayton. After Johnson's 13-yard run, Stidham hit Ryan Davis, who reached for the pylon for a 7-yard TD to put Auburn ahead 14-3 with 4:55 left in the first quarter.

After Auburn's defense forced its second three-and-out, Stidham found a wide open Will Hastings for a 47-yard, one-play drive that made it 21-3 with 13:38 remaining in the second quarter.

Auburn maintained the momentum when Daniel Thomas stopped

The early kickoff did nothing to deter Auburn on Saturday. The Tigers scored touchdowns on each of their first five drives, jumping out to a 35-3 lead in the first half, and finished with a 44-23 win over Ole Miss.

"I'm extremely proud of our team," Auburn coach Gus Malzahn said. "This was a game that a lot of teams could have come out and flopped around in the first half, especially with what happened last week with us and them. I'm really proud of our leadership that we answered the bell. We came out of the gate, playing extremely well on all three phases."

Kerryon Johnson picked up right where he left off the previous two weeks, rushing for a career-high 204 yards and three touchdowns on 28 carries. The junior running back has now rushed for 11 touchdowns over his last three games, and as of the conclusion of Saturday's game, he currently leads the nation with 12 rushing touchdowns on the season.

"It felt great," Johnson said. "I felt so close to normal, and I just couldn't hide it. In the open field, I was making people miss. I was able to get up to a faster speed than last week. And it just felt really good to be close to normal. I know I'm getting better. I just have to keep it going."

Led by Johnson, the Auburn offense piled up a total of 561 yards against Ole Miss. Quarterback Jarrett Stidham went 14 of 21 and threw for 235 yards and two touchdowns.

The longest play of the day came on Auburn's second drive when Stidham threw a short screen pass to Ryan Davis, who took it 75 yards to the house. Davis got key blocks from Austin Golson, Casey Dunn, Nate Craig-Myers, and Will Hastings, as he sprinted up the Auburn sideline before crossing the field and eventually crossing the goal line.

It was Auburn's longest offensive play of the season.

On defense, the Tigers slowed down a potent Ole Miss attack. Sophomore defensive tackle Derrick Brown led the way with six tackles, two tackles for loss, and he combined with teammate Jeff Holland on a sack.

Kerryon Johnson ran for 156 yards and scored his 13th touchdown of the season, but two late LSU field goals gave the Bengal Tigers a 27-23 win over No. 10 Auburn Saturday at Tiger Stadium.

DJ Chark's 75-yard punt return for a touchdown cut Auburn's lead to two points at 23-21 with 14:33 left in the game.

Connor Culp's 42-yard field goal gave LSU its only lead with 2:36 to play. The LSU kicker added a 36-yard kick with 38 seconds remaining.

Auburn's last drive ended at its 33-yard line when LSU sacked Jarrett Stidham on fourth down with two seconds left.

Needing a fast start after falling behind early in recent trips to Baton Rouge, Auburn delivered, getting points on the opening drive courtesy of Daniel Carlson's 46-yard field goal.

On LSU's third play, Stephen Roberts stripped the ball after Chark's 39-yard reception. Carlton Davis recovered, returning 12 yards to Auburn's 48.

One play later, Stidham hit Will Hastings for a 49-yard touchdown and a 10-0 Auburn lead with 11:31 remaining in the first quarter. Hastings had three receptions for 65 yards.

After Nick Coe's tackle for loss forced an LSU punt, Stidham beat a blitz by finding Ryan Davis, who ran 52 yards to the 3, leading to Johnson's 4-yard TD, No. 13 on the season. Johnson logged a career-high 31

Auburn added to its lead in the second quarter. Stidham's 25-yard pass to a diving Darius Slayton set up Carlson's second field goal, a 48-yarder, giving the visiting Tigers a 20-0 lead at the 12:50 mark.

Establish the running game? Check. Play with tempo? Check. Force turnovers? Check. Play four quarters? Check. Respond after last week's game? Check. Auburn checked all the boxes in a 52-20 win at Arkansas.

The Tigers (6-2, 4-1), who outgained Arkansas, 629 to 334, looked hungry and eager to prove they still belonged in the conversation as one of the contenders in the SEC.

The offense was spearheaded by its rushing attack as Auburn finished with 345 yards on the ground. It was a heavy dose of Kerryon Johnson in the first half, but Kamryn Pettway, who had been battling an injury all season, took over in the second half. The redshirt junior led the Tigers with 90 yards and three touchdowns on just 11 carries.

The quarterbacks also contributed to the ground game Saturday. Starter Jarrett Stidham rushed for 49 yards and a touchdown, and backup Malik Willis added 62 yards on just two carries as he led a scoring drive in the fourth quarter that finished with a four-yard pass from Willis to fellow freshman Devan Barrett. It was Barrett's first career touchdown at Auburn.

The play of the night, though, came midway through the third quarter following a turnover by the defense. It was the first play of the drive, and Auburn ran a reverse to Ryan Davis. But instead of running with it, the former high school quarterback chucked a deep pass on the run to a streaking Darius Slayton, who caught it and ran into the end zone for a 62-yard touchdown. Slayton led the Tigers with 146 yards receiving on four catches.

Not to be outdone, the Auburn defense wreaked havoc all night in the Arkansas backfield and put together another solid performance. The Tigers finished with eight tackles for loss, six sacks, three forced fumbles, and the first string didn't allow a touchdown.

Though six different Auburn players finished with at least half a sack,

Auburn blocked a punt for a touchdown to capture momentum, then put away the game with a 96-yard drive that consumed half of the fourth quarter in a 42-27 win at Texas A&M.

Trailing 13-7 late in the second quarter, Jarrett Stidham hit Darius Slayton for a 53-yard touchdown pass to reclaim the lead for Auburn.

Auburn's defense then forced a punt, which Nick Ruffin blocked and Malik Miller recovered for a touchdown, giving the Tigers 14 points in 1:16 and a 21-13 halftime lead.

After coming close to blocking an earlier punt, Ruffin requested another opportunity.

Auburn scored the first two touchdowns of the second half, taking a 35-13 lead on a 4-yard pass from Stidham to Ryan Davis and a 2-yard Kerryon Johnson run.

The Aggies scored on a long pass, then threatened to pull within one possession, but Auburn's defense stopped Texas A&M at the 4 early in the fourth quarter.

Then came the drive, a 13-play marathon that took 8:17 off the clock and resulted in Eli Stove's 4-yard touchdown run.

Johnson rushed for 145 yards on 29 carries, adding 29 receiving yards on 5 catches, including his first career touchdown reception. Johnson has scored 16 touchdowns this season, 15 in the past six games.

In a performance so dominant that another Prayer in Jordan-Hare was not required, No. 10 Auburn easily cleared the first hurdle of Amen Corner, defeating No. 1 Georgia 40-17.

Kerryon Johnson ran for 167 yards on 32 carries, more than tripling the combined output of Georgia's top running backs. Johnson's 55-yard screen pass touchdown, No. 17 on the season, culminated the convincing victory, earning Johnson additional Heisman Trophy consideration.

Daniel Carlson kicked four field goals and Jarrett Stidham threw three touchdown passes and ran for a TD.

Auburn's defense delivered as well, holding Georgia to 46 rushing yards on 32 carries and 230 total yards. After the Bulldogs scored a touchdown on the opening drive, Georgia did not reach the end zone again until the final minutes.

Trailing 7-0, Auburn answered on its first possession with Carlson's 54-yarder, the third longest of his career.

Jeff Holland secured a three-and-out for Auburn's defense, recording his ninth sack of the season. Carlson's second field goal pulled Auburn within 7-6 after the first quarter.

Auburn took the lead on Carlson's third field goal with 12:03 remaining in the first half.

A personal foul penalty against Georgia for leaping on Auburn's punt extended a Tiger drive, resulting in Stidham's 42-yard touchdown pass to Darius Slayton, giving Auburn a 16-7 halftime lead.

Darrell Williams recovered a fumbled Georgia punt, giving Auburn the ball on the Bulldogs' 23-yard line. Stidham scored on a 7-yard keeper put Auburn up 23-7.

After a long Ryan Davis punt return and personal foul penalty gave Auburn another short field, the Tigers scored in two plays on a 32-yard

screen from Stidham to Davis, marking 30 unanswered points.

After the teams traded field goals, Stidham and Johnson teamed up on their screen to put Auburn up 40-10.

The message from Gus Malzahn was clear all week. Auburn couldn't afford to let up after taking down No. 1 Georgia the week before. His team heard him loud and clear. Despite a slow start, the Tigers found their stride in the second half and cruised to a 42-14 win over Louisiana Monroe on Saturday.

The key to the putting away the Warhawks? Turnovers.

The Auburn defense forced three turnovers in the second half, which led to 14 points, and it was just the boost the Tigers needed to blow the

Sophomore cornerback Javaris Davis got it started midway through the third quarter when he jumped a slant route and corralled an interception. Two plays later, Jarrett Stidham connected with Kam Martin on a 41-yard touchdown pass to give Auburn a 28-7 lead.

On the very next Louisiana Monroe possession, it was Davis again who ripped the ball out and forced a fumble that was recovered by Nick Ruffin. Though Auburn's offense gave the ball away down inside the red zone, the defense responded its next time out as Ruffin intercepted a pass and returned it 45 yards for a touchdown to put the Tigers up 35-7.

Auburn's offense had its share of highlights Saturday as well. The Tigers marched down the field on the opening drive, and Kerryon Johnson capped a nine-play, 80-yard drive with an 8-yard touchdown run. Johnson, the SEC's rushing leader coming into the game, finished with 137 yards on 22 carries. Martin added 83 yards and a touchdown on the ground.

Later in the first half, Stidham threw a 50-yard touchdown pass to Darius Slayton to give Auburn a 14-7 lead going into halftime. The sophomore quarterback went 18 of 24 for 235 yards with the two touchdowns and one interception.

For the game, the offense finished with 547 total yards -- 312 rushing and 235 passing. Malzahn is now 20-1 in games where Auburn rushes for more than 300 yards.

For the second time in three weeks, Auburn knocked off No. 1, claiming the SEC Western Division championship with a 26-14 Iron Bowl win.

The Tigers are heading to Atlanta for a rematch with Georgia in the SEC Championship Game. Auburn beat the Bulldogs 40-17 at home on Nov. 11.

Trailing 14-10 after an Alabama touchdown on the opening drive of the second half, Auburn scored the game's final 16 points on touchdown runs by Kerryon Johnson and Jarrett Stidham, and Daniel Carlson's second field goal.

Johnson put Auburn ahead to stay with a 1-yard touchdown run with 3:02 left in the third quarter.

Stidham gave Auburn a two-score lead with a 16-yard touchdown run with 12:49 remaining in the fourth quarter.

Auburn's defense did the rest, holding Alabama to 314 yards. Auburn held Alabama without a third-down conversion until in the fourth quar-

"Our defense was outstanding. Our crowd was unbelievable," Malzahn said. "Two weeks in a row, our crowd helped us."

Stidham and Ryan Davis teamed up 11 times for 139 yards, Davis' first 100-yard game. Davis set Auburn's single-season reception record with 69 catches.

Stidham completed 21 of 28 passes for 237 yards, adding 51 rushing yards and a touchdown on 12 carries.

Auburn scored first, driving 94 yards on 12 plays. Stidham began a streak of five straight completions with a 25-yard gain across midfield to Nate Craig-Myers.

On third-and-2 from the Alabama 3, Johnson's jump pass found Craig-Myers uncovered in the end zone for a 7-0 Auburn lead.

After Alabama answered with a 36-yard touchdown pass, Auburn regained the lead at the end of the half.

After twice beating the No. 1 team to claim the SEC Western Division crown, Auburn came up short in the SEC Championship Game, losing to Georgia 28-7 Saturday at Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

Trailing by six points going to the fourth quarter, Auburn drove to midfield, but Georgia recovered a fumble and scored four plays later to take a 14-point lead. The Bulldogs added a 64-yard touchdown run for the final score.

Auburn scored a touchdown on the game's opening drive, marching 75 yards in 10 plays, 21 yards coming on Jarrett Stidham's pass to Chandler Cox, his longest career reception.

On third-and-goal from the 6, Stidham rifled a touchdown pass to a slanting Nate Craig-Myers for a 7-0 Auburn lead.

Stidham completed his first eight attempts, finishing 16 of 32 for 145 yards and his 17th touchdown pass of the season.

On Georgia's first possession, a blitzing Tray Matthews sacked Georgia's Jake Fromm on first down for a loss of 7, Matthews' first career sack. Two plays later, Dontavius Russell sacked Fromm, forcing a punt.

Early in the second quarter, Auburn drove to Georgia's 14, but Georgia recovered a fumble at the 16. The Bulldogs then drove 84 yards for a tying touchdown, with Fromm finding Isaac Nauta for a 2-yard TD pass.

Georgia added a 27-yard field goal with 4:59 in the second quarter to take a 10-7 halftime lead.

Auburn began the second half with a promising drive, gaining 52 yards on three consecutive plays, including a 24-yard pass from Stidham to Ryan Davis on third-and-6. Kerryon Johnson gained 15 yards on a quick pitch, then Stidham found Davis again for 13.

The drive stalled at the 14-yard-line, with Georgia blocking a 31-yard field goal attempt. The Bulldogs kicked a 35-yard field goal to lead 13-7 with 1:26 left in the third quarter.

Davis made seven receptions for 65 yards, extending his single-season record to 76.

1937 Bacardi Bowl

Auburn's bowl history began in 1937 when the Tigers and Villanova tied 7-7 in the Bacardi Bowl, sometimes referred to as the Rhumba Bowl or the Cigar Bowl, the climaxing event of Cuba's annual National Sports Festival.

The game was played in Havana, Cuba, and was the first bowl game to ever be played outside the United States.

An Auburn drive in the first quarter stalled on the 10-yard line where the Wildcats took over on downs. After a Villanova punt, Auburn back Billy Hitchcock broke loose around left end and rambled 40 yards for the Tigers only score. The score at the half was Auburn 7, Villanova 0.

Auburn stopped a Villanova drive on its own 12-yard line during the third quarter but couldn't get field position. Villanova was able to tie the score when they blocked an Auburn quick kick and the ball bounced into the endzone where Wildcat lineman Matthews Kuber fell on it for the score. The PAT tied up the game.

Auburn's return to the States marked an end to more than 11,000 miles of football travel for the 7-2-2 Tigers that finished the season ranked 13th in the nation under coach Jack Meagher.

The game was played in a revolutionary atmosphere. Fulgencio Batista, the dictator who would be overthrown by Fidel Castro 22 years

later, had just assumed power. The game was almost canceled because Batista's picture was not in the game program. A quick trip to the printer saved the Bacardi Bowl and allowed Auburn's bowl history to get off to a significant and historical beginning.

Southeastern Conference officials lifted a ban which forbade SEC teams to play postseason games in bowls other than the Rose and Sugar Bowls and allowed Auburn to play Michigan State in the Orange Bowl.

A capacity crowd of 19,000 fans watched an aggressive Auburn team defeat the powerful Spartans, 6-0 limiting Michigan State to only two first downs, the first coming late in the third quarter, and 57 total offensive yards, 32 yards rushing and 25 passing. Auburn racked up 233 yards on the ground and 79 through the air for 312 total yards.

Auburn's only score was set up by a George Kenmore 60-yard punt return that put the Tigers on the Spartan 36-yard line. On the first play from scrimmage Kenmore passed to Ralph O'Gwynne at the Spartan


two-yard line. On fourth and goal from the one, O'Gwynne circled left end for the only score of the game.

In Auburn's first bowl appearance in 15 years, and first bowl game under Ralph "Shug" Jordan, the Tigers starting offensive backfield included a future Governor of Alabama (Fob James) and a future coach of the University of

Georgia (Vince Dooley), but Texas Tech was not impressed and handed the Tigers a 35-13 defeat.

Dooley guided Auburn to a touchdown the first time they had the ball as the Tigers went 60 yards in 10 plays, with James' 21-yard run being a key play in the drive. Bobby Duke scored from the one. A tough Auburn defense held the Red Raiders, the nation's highest scoring team, to just 11 yards in the first quarter. But it wasn't long before they would get on track.

Texas Tech scored early in the second period on a 30-yard pass

Auburn became the first team to play in the same bowl game twice in the same year when they defeated Baylor 33-13 in the 1954 Gator Bowl. The Tigers had met Texas Tech in the Jan. 1, 1954, Gator Bowl, but then Gator Bowl

officials decided to move the game away from New Year's Day.

Baylor fumbled the opening kickoff, Auburn recovered and five plays later "Joltin Joe" Childress scored the first Auburn touchdown.

Baylor came back with a nine-play, 63-yard drive to tie the score at 7-7 at the end of the first quarter.

Auburn's two possessions of the second quarter resulted in a pair of touchdowns, a 43-yard run by Fob James and a four-yard Bobby Freeman to Jimmy Long pass which capped a 92-yard drive. Auburn led at the half, 21-7.

The Tigers scored twice in the second half, sandwiching their scores around a five-play, 66-yard drive by the Bears. Childress capped an

87-yard Auburn drive with a three-yard run, and the Tigers ended the scoring with a threeplay 67-yard drive to win going away, 33-13.

Childress was the game's MVP with 134 yards on 20 car-

Auburn finished the season with an 8-3 record under Coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan.

from Jack Kirkpatrick to Bobby Cavazos. Auburn came back after an intercepted pass, and Dooley scored on a 10-yard run to end the drive. The Tigers led 13-7 at halftime, but it was all downhill from there.

Texas Tech scored the first two times they had the ball in the second half, once after blocking an Auburn punt, to lead at the end of three quarters, 21-13. Two touchdowns on two possessions in the fourth quarter made the final score read Texas Tech 35, Auburn 13.

It was Auburn's third straight trip to the Gator Bowl and Vanderbilt's first bowl game ever, and that might tell the story of Auburn's 25-13 upset loss to the Commodores.

Vanderbilt scored first on a seven-yard Don Orr to Joe Stephenson pass which was set up by a Howell Tubbs fumble, the first of three for him that day, which gave the Commodores the ball on the Tigers' 39-yard line. Auburn scored early in the second quarter, driving 72 yards for the TD. Tubbs passed to Fob James for 38 yards and the touchdown. Vanderbilt scored quickly, going 76 yards in four plays as Orr scored from the three-yard line. The

Another Tubbs fumble set up Vanderbilt's first scoring drive of the second half. Recovering at the Auburn 45-yard line, Vanderbilt took eight plays to score with Phil King going over from the one, giving Vanderbilt a 19-7 lead. A poor punt and a 15-yard penalty gave the Commodores the ball on the Auburn 26-yard line after the Tigers were unable to move. On the first play of the fourth quarter, Charlie Horton scored from the Auburn one to give Vanderbilt a 25-7 lead. Auburn finished the scoring with a seven-yard Jimmy Cook to Red Phillips pass at the end of a six-play, 66-yard drive to make the final score 25-13.

extra point was not good and the Commodores led at the half, 13-7.


Auburn fumbled five times with Vanderbilt recovering all five to

A trip to the Orange Bowl capped a near perfect season for the Auburn Tigers. Coach "Shug" Jordan led his Tigers to a 9-1 record with a rugged defense and an option offense featuring All-America quarterback Jimmy Sidle

and halfback Tucker Frederickson. Auburn had defeated Alabama 10-8 to earn the chance to play the Big Eight powerhouse Nebraska Cornhuskers.

Auburn found itself in the hole on the second play from scrimmage as Nebraska quarterback Dennis Claridge sneaked off right guard for a 68-yard touchdown gallop that left Auburn trailing 7-0 before most of the fans were seated. Two Dave Theissen field goals gave the Cornhuskers a 13-0 lead with over 10 minutes remaining in the first half. That is the lead the Nebraska team took in the locker room.

The "Jekyll and Hyde" Auburn team was as dominating in the second half as they were inept in the first half. Sidle led the resurgence of the Tigers by capping off their only scoring drive with a 13-yard run in the third quarter. With only 1:30 left in the game, the Tigers were on the Nebraska 10-yard line. But a costly motion penalty and an incomplete fourth down desperation pass sealed the Cornhusker victory.

It was the Seventh Annual Liberty Bowl, but the first to be played in the present site of Memphis, Tenn., that saw the Ole Miss Rebels hold off a gallant Auburn comeback to win 13-7. Ole Miss got the scoring started

when Johnny Keyes connected on a 42-yard field goal in the first period. Auburn marched right back and scored when fullback Tom Bryan broke off left tackle and raced 44 yards for the touchdown. The score at halftime was Auburn 7, Ole Miss 3.

The Rebels took the opening kickoff and ran off nine consecutive rushing plays to march to the Tiger six-yard line. From there reserve quarterback Joe Graves went to the air and found wingback Doug Cunningham for a six-yard touchdown pass. The extra point gave Ole Miss a 10-7 lead. Keyes added another field goal to complete the scoring but not the action. Auburn marched deep into Rebel territory. But, with only seconds remaining, the Tigers' desperation fourth down pass fell incomplete, preserving the win for the Rebels.

The Tigers broke open a 10-10 halftime deadlock and exploded to a 31st Annual Sun Bowl win in El Paso, Texas.

Auburn jumped to a 10-0 lead early in the game behind a 65-yard scoring pass from quarterback Loran Carter to

halfback Mickey Zofko and a 52-yard field goal by John Riley. Arizona came back with a touchdown pass and field goal of their own to tie the score as the players headed for the locker room at the half.

Auburn reserve quarterback Tommy Traylor scampered nine yards to open the second half scoring for the Tigers on their first possession of the half. Two plays later, Buddy McClinton picked off an errant Wildcat pass, one of three interceptions for McClinton, and raced 32 yards for another Auburn score. Riley added another field goal and

Carter flipped a 43-yard touchdown pass to Tim Christian to complete the Tiger scoring.

The game's oddest play occurred when Auburn punter Connie Frederick had a punt blocked by Arizona. The Wildcats almost recovered the loose ball for a touchdown but Frederick managed to get to the ball first and was able to punt the ball a second time.

Auburn's defense combined for a Sun Bowl record of eight interceptions.

McClinton was named the game's Most Valuable Player while teammate David Campbell was named Most Valuable Lineman from his defensive tackle position.

Auburn played its first football game indoors losing to Houston 36-7 in the Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl.

Houston executed its veer offense to perfection and executed Auburn in the process. Behind the leadership of

sophomore quarterback Gary Mullins, the Cougars piled up Astro-Bluebonnet records for rushing yards with 376 and total yards with 516.

Auburn's Terry Beasley, just a sophomore, fumbled the ball away at the Tiger 29-yard line on the opening kickoff. The Cougars covered those 29 yards in seven plays with Mullins sneaking over from the one-yard line.

Later, Houston capped an 80-yard drive with a Carlos Lopez 27-yard field goal to take a 10-0 lead early in the second quarter. A bowl record 57-yard punt by Auburn's Connie Frederick put Houston back at its own 16-yard line, but the Cougars stormed away with an 84-yard, five-play drive. Strong went 74 yards on the first play of the drive and scored the touchdown on fourth and goal from the one.

Auburn mounted its only scoring drive of the game, going 67 yards in five short plays in the second quarter. A 36-yard halfback pass from Mickey Zofko to Frederick finished the drive. The Tigers seemed to take the momentum into the locker room after blocking a Cougar 25-yard field goal attempt late in the quarter.

After receiving the second half kickoff, the Cougars marched 73 yards in eight rushing plays and scored when Ted Heiskell cracked over from the one yard line. The two-point conversion attempt failed and Houston led 22-7. Auburn drove to the Houston 28-yard line before a Rat Riley 45-yard field goal was blocked. Auburn never recovered.

This game was billed as the "Battle of the Quarterbacks," and it was that and more. Auburn had Pat Sullivan, heir apparent to the Heisman Trophy the next year, and Ole Miss had Archie Manning, one of the top QBs in SEC his-

torv

Auburn started off quickly as it was the familiar combination of Sullivan to Terry Beasley for a 13-yard scoring strike with just over three minutes gone in the game. Auburn scored twice more before Ole Miss could retaliate. Sullivan connected with Alvin Bresler for an eight-yard touchdown pass. On the first play from scrimmage after the kickoff, Auburn recovered a Rebel fumble and went up 21 points as Sullivan executed the quarterback draw for 37 yards and a touchdown.

Manning led a Rebel comeback by directing his team to a 79-yard, 10-play drive capping it off with a one-yard run. Manning later connected with Floyd Franks on a 34-yard touchdown pass to cut Auburn's lead to 21-14 at the half.

A 42-yard, Sullivan-to-Beasley pass set up Auburn's first score in

Manning was again the key to the Rebels' final score as he scrambled for a 37-yard gain to the Auburn 34. From there Chumbler went over from the one to cut the Tigers' lead to seven.

The game was not as close as the score indicated and the score was bad enough. Auburn's long-dreamed-

of, much-hoped-for trip to the Sugar Bowl turned into a nightmare as the Oklahoma Sooners, capitalizing on

three first half turnovers, executed their wishbone offense to perfection in building up a 31-0 halftime lead before cruising back to Norman with a 40-22 win.

The Sooners took the opening kickoff 77 yards in 13 plays and ran off over six minutes on the clock as they scored their first touchdown of the day on a Leon Crosswhite four-yard run, giving Oklahoma a quick 6-0 lead. The option was working to perfection five minutes later as quarterback Jack Mildren kept the ball for a five-yard touchdown run. A 71-yard punt return for a touchdown by Joe Wylie following Auburn's next possession opened the flood gates. Mildren scored twice more before the half on runs of four and seven yards to complete the first half whitewash and head into the locker room with a 31-0 lead.

After a 53-yard field goal by the Sooners, Auburn finally got on the scoreboard when Harry Unger dove over right guard from the one yard line. Oklahoma again scored on the option, this time Greg Pruitt sweeping around the left side from two yards out to make the

Two Oklahoma fumbles set up the Tigers' last two scores as Sullivan connected with Sandy Cannon for an 11 yard touchdown pass and Unger again dove over from the one yard line. Final score, Oklahoma 40 -Auburn 22.

No one gave Auburn much of a chance in this, the 28th Annual Gator Bowl Classic. The Colorado Buffaloes were bigger, stronger and said to be quicker and meaner. Auburn lost its starting quarterback Randy Walls to a

knee injury at the start of the bowl practice and had to bring on virtually unknown and untested Wade Whatley to lead the offense. Those experts who didn't think Auburn had a chance just didn't know these Tigers. The Tigers were predicted to finish with a 2-9 record against the nation's toughest schedule. Instead they finished with a 10-1 record and earned the nickname "The Amazin's" because they never seemed to know the odds and they never admitted defeat. The Tigers defeated No. 2 ranked and unbeaten Alabama 17-16 after blocking two consecutive punts for touchdowns in the final minutes of the game. Coach "Shug" Jordan called "The Amazin's" his favorite team.

Gardner Jett opened the Tiger scoring in the Gator Bowl with a 27-yard field goal early in the second quarter of action. A Colorado fumble on the ensuing possession gave the ball to the Tigers on the Buffalo 16-yard line. Five plays later, Whatley slid over from the one for Auburn's first touchdown.

Auburn's second touchdown of the game came with just over six minutes to play in third quarter when the Tigers executed the halfback pass to perfection. Mike Fuller received the pitch from Whatley and connected with Rob Spivey for a 22-yard score capping a six-play,

56-yard drive. Colorado scored its only points of the game on a 33-yard Fred Lima field goal with 7:30 left to play in the game, which ended an 80-yard 14-play drive.

The Tigers retaliated with a fake field goal that resulted in Auburn's final score. Holder Dave Beck took the snap, straightened up and threw to Dan Nugent for a 16-yard touchdown with one minute left to play to make the final score.

Missouri's defense kept Auburn's offense off balance from the opening kickoff and stormed away with a 34-17 win in the 39th Annual Sun Bowl.

Auburn was able to score first following a Missouri fumble which

Auburn's Rusty Deen recovered at the Missouri 49. Auburn's seven play drive could only muster 30 yards and the Tigers settled for a 35-yard Roger Pruett field goal.

After an exchange of punts, Missouri recovered an Auburn fumble at the AU 35-yard line. One play later, Missouri had the lead as quarterback Chuck Link passed to John Kelsey for the TD.

Missouri scored again one minute later following another Auburn fumble. Ray Bybee scored on a two-yard run capping a three-play, 24-yard drive.

Missouri continued to move the ball, scoring on a 10 play 48-yard drive, with Ray Smith connecting with Kelsey from two yards for his

second touchdown, and a 21-3

re to Thomas Gossom from 17 yards out. Only eight seconds remained in the half and Auburn had cut the lead to 21-10.

On the ensuing kickoff, Missouri's John Moseley took the ball 84 yards for the touchdown. Missouri went to the locker room with a comfortable

A Longhorn fumble gave the Tigers the ball at the Texas 27. Two Mitzi Jackson runs covered the distance to the endzone as Auburn went up 14-0 with only nine minutes gone in the game.

Auburn's January 1 date with Southern California in Orlando's Citrus Bowl marked the fifth consecutive bowl game for the Tigers, the third New Year's Day Bowl.

Auburn's all-time football record stood at 499 victories. A 16-7 triumph over USC, the nation's winningest bowl team, gave the Tigers their 10-2 record and the 500th

USC was the first on the scoreboard when linebacker Marcus Cotton intercepted a Jeff Burger pass and returned it 24 yards for a Trojan touchdown. But those were the only points USC scored the rest of the day.

In the second period, the Tigers culminated an 80-yard drive with Burger hitting tight end Walter Reeves with a three-yard touchdown pass. 

After a scoreless first period, Wisconsin started the second quarter by driving to the Auburn seven-yard line where the Badgers had a first and goal, but Auburn's defense forced Wisconsin to settle for a 20-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead.

Auburn responded on the next drive as Ronnie Brown gained 43 yards on six carries culminating with a one-yard touchdown to give the Tigers a 7-3 lead. Wisconsin managed another field goal before the half to make the score 7-6 at the intermission.

Auburn struck first in the second half, going 80 yards on 16 plays and taking 7:16 off the clock. Carnell Williams finished the drive with a one-yard plunge up the middle for the touchdown.

In the fourth quarter, Jim Sorgi led Wisconsin on a 52-yard drive, capping it with a 12-yard pass to Lee Evans for a touchdown and a twopoint conversion pass to tie the game at 14.

The Badgers seemed to have the momentum in their favor until Carlos Rogers deflected a pass that Will Herring intercepted on the Auburn 13-yard line. Two plays later, Campbell connected with Jeris McIntyre on third and eight for a 51-yard gain to the Wisconsin 34-yard line. It took Auburn just three more plays to put it in the end zone as

Brown scored for the second time from two yards out.

Auburn put an exclamation point on the game during the ensuing Wisconsin drive when Reggie Torbor and Karlos Dansby sandwiched Sorgi, causing a fumble. T.J. Jackson recovered it, and two plays later Auburn put the final points on the board with a one-yard run by Williams to make the score 28-14.

Campbell passed for 138 yards, rushed for 67 yards and engineered two fourth-quarter scoring drives. Auburn's defense held Wisconsin to 261 yards. Torbor collected 2.5 sacks and Dansby totaled a team-high 10 tackles including 1.5 sacks.

Auburn completed a perfect season as the No. 3 Tigers held off a late Virginia Tech rally for a 16-13 victory in the NOKIA Sugar Bowl at the Louisiana Superdome. The win improved the Tigers' record to 13-0

and ensured the first 13-win season in school history.

Auburn, just the seventh team to go undefeated in league play since the Southeastern Conference went to divisional play in 1992, jumped out to a 16-0 lead in the first three quarters before the Hokies got on the board. Two late fourth-quarter scores allowed Virginia Tech back into the game, but an onside kick with two minutes left was recovered by the Tigers.

Iason Campbell, voted the NOKIA Sugar Bowl's Most Valuable Player, threw for 189 yards on 11-of-16 passing and one score. Campbell, who played his last game in an Auburn uniform, connected with Devin Aromashodu on a 5-yard touchdown pass late in the third quarter, giving the Tigers a 16-0 advantage.

The tandem of senior running backs Ronnie Brown and Carnell Williams rushed for 68 and 61 yards, respectively.

Placekicker John Vaughn connected on three field goals in the first half from 23, 19 and 24 yards to send the Tigers to a 9-0 lead entering halftime. The three field goals tied an Auburn record in a bowl game, last set by Jaret Holmes at the 1998 Peach Bowl.

After Campbell connected with Aromashodu for a 16-0

The win gave Auburn three straight bowl game victories, a first for the school since 1982-84. It also sent Auburn to its 15th straight victory dating back to the 2003 season, the program's longest since 1993-94 and second longest streak in school history. The 15 consecutive wins gave the Tigers national prominence as the third-longest in the nation at the end of the season, trailing only Southern California and Utah.

Vaughn connected on his 20th field goal of the season at the 6:20 mark of the

third quarter, the game's only points of the second half, to give Auburn its 11th win of the season for the fourth time in school history.

The Auburn defense was stout against Nebraska, limiting the Cornhuskers to just 230 yards of total offense, including 73 in the second half. Karibi Dede began the defense's dominance in the first half, intercepting a Zac Taylor pass and returning it 52 yards to the Nebraska 9-yard line.

Just two plays later, the Auburn offense punched it in the end zone when Brandon Cox found Carl Stewart for a 9-yard score with 56 seconds remaining in the first quarter, evening the score at 7.

Early in the second quarter, the Tigers recovered a fumble at the Cornhuskers' 14 on a failed fake punt attempt. Four plays later, Stewart scored his second TD on a 1-yard run.

After Vaughn's third quarter field goal, the Huskers managed to get in Auburn territory just twice. They punted from Auburn's 34 in the third quarter, and Taylor threw a fourth-down incompletion from Auburn's 30 late in the fourth quarter.

The Tiger defense finished with two sacks and 11 tackles for loss, highlighted by Sen'Derrick Marks' 2.5. Will Herring finished with seven solo

	tackles, including two for loss, as
— 17 — 14	was named the game's outstanding defensive player.

Cox finished the game 10-of-21 passing for 111 yards and one score. Of those 10 completions, six were to Courtney Taylor, who, on his fourth catch of the game, broke the Auburn school record for most receptions in a career. He finished with 153.

Kenny Irons paced the Tiger rushing game with 72 yards on 24

Nebraska started the game's scoring on a Nate Swift 13-yard touchdown reception from Taylor at the 7:37 mark of the first quarter.



Tigers record season highs in plays and yards with a spread offense. Auburn ran 90 plays for 423 yards, including 47 rushes and a season-high 43 passes.

Auburn scored first in a low-scoring first half, following a threeand-out by Clemson on the opening possession with an 11-play, 58-yard drive that culminated in Wes Byrum's 36-yard field goal.

After managing just 52 yards of offense in the first quarter, Clemson's C.J. Spiller raced 83 yards down the left sideline to give Clemson a 7-3 lead.

Auburn took the opening kickoff in the second half and marched 78 yards on 10 plays as Burns hit Mario Fannin with a 22-yard pass to give Auburn a 10-7 lead.

Clemson finished an 11-play drive with a 22-yard field goal on the first play of the fourth quarter, knotting the score at 10-10.

After Cox was intercepted, Clemson quickly drove 32 yards for the go-ahead score when James Davis plunged in from a yard out with

11:24 remaining.

Auburn answered right back, again mixing Cox and Burns in the backfield successfully during an 11-play, 70-yard drive. Cox's 18-yard pass to Robert Dunn and a 15-yard rush by Burns set up Ben Tate for a 1-yard run that tied the score at 17-17 with 8:27

In overtime, Clemson settled for a 25-yard field goal on its first posession.

On Auburn's overtime possession, Cox found Rod Smith for 12 yards on 3rd-and-13, then snuck ahead for 2 yards and the first down. Two plays later, Burns powered in for the score, sending the Auburn sideline into a frenzy.

Cox connected on 25-of-39 passes for 211 yards in his final game for Auburn.

The Auburn defense, led by defensive MVP Pat Sims, held Clemson to just 293 yards of offense and 12 first downs.

Wes Byrum kicked the sixth and biggest game-winning field goal of his career on the last play of the game from 19 yards to give No. 1 Auburn a 22-19 victory over Oregon in the BCS National Championship Game. It was Auburn's second national title in history and ninth comeback win in 14 games during

the 2010 season.

After Oregon had tied the score at 19 with a touchdown and two point conversion with 2:33 to go, the biggest drive in Auburn history began at its own 25-yard line. After a 15-yard pass from Cam Newton to Emory Blake, Michael Dyer, who was named the Offensive Player of the Game after rushing for 143 yards on 22 carries, looked to be tackled after a short gain, but was never down while laying on top of an Oregon defender, and he bounced up to complete a 37-yard run to the Oregon 23.

After short gains by Dyer and Newton, Dyer followed with a 16-yard gain up the middle to the 1 with 10 seconds remaining. One play later, Byrum provided the final heroics.

Oregon scored on the second play of the second quarter on a 26-yard field goal by Rob Beard for the first points of the game. On Auburn's next possession, Newton threw a 35-yard touchdown pass to Kodi Burns for a 7-3 Auburn lead.

Oregon responded after taking over at the Duck 7 as Thomas threw an 81-yard pass on first down to Meahl, then found James on an 8-yard TD pass. A 2-point conversion run by kicker Rob Beard on a fake gave Oregon an 11-7 lead.

The Tigers then drove to the Oregon 1, but Newton's fourth-down pass

Auburn came with a blink of an eye of winning its second national championship in the last four years.

FSU stole a page out of Auburn's playbook for the dramatic finish when Kermit Whitfield re-turned a kickoff 100 yards with 4:31 for a brief lead, and then Jameis Winston threw a 2-yard touchdown pass to Kelvin Benjamin with 13

seconds remaining to send Florida State to a 34-31 victory in the BCS Championship Game on Monday night in the Rose Bowl. It prevented the biggest comeback story in college football history, though Auburn still finished with a remarkable season and a 12-2 record. The Tigers came within seconds of winning their second national title in the last four seasons.

Oh, Auburn tried to win with its usual heroics. Tre Mason broke Bo Jackson's single-season rushing record when he scored on a 37-yard run with 1:19 remaining to give Auburn a 31-27 lead. But Winston, the Heisman Trophy winner, drove the Seminoles in for the game-winner.

Auburn had beaten Georgia, Alabama, and Missouri to get this far, and won four games in the final minute, or second. But not this night. Florida State was the one with the heroics.

Auburn led 21-3, then found itself up 21-20 with 10:55 left in the game. Florida State took the lead in the fourth quarter, but Mason's TD run gave the Tigers a late lead.

Auburn found new pages in its playbook in the first half, throwing touchdown passes to Tre Mason and Melvin Ray for the first time in their careers as Marshall out-played the Heisman winner Winston in the first half.

Marshall completed passes to seven different receivers in the first half. But even with the passing, Auburn stuck with its familiar successful formula of letting Mason run. The tailback who went for 304

yards on 46 carries hit halftime Monday night with 96 yards on 18 carries.

Marshall hit the break having hit 7-of-13 passes for 113 yards and those two touchdown. Winston was only 6-of-15 passing for 62 yards and no touchdowns, though he did set up FSU's only first-half touchdown with a nice scramble to the Auburn 3.

Auburn got two early sacks against him, then forced him to fumble to set up the Tigers' third touchdown.

Credit punter Steven Clark for setting up Auburn's first touchdown when he flipped the field when he kicked the ball dead at the Florida State 2. The Seminoles couldn't move it, and, after a Chris Davis punt return, the Tigers found themselves in great field position at the FSU 25. Six plays later, Marshall threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to Ma-son to make it 7-3 Auburn with 3:07 left in the first quarter.

Auburn scored on its next possession in a most surprising way when Marshall found Ray running alone down the middle of the field for a 50-yard touchdown pass and a 14-3 lead with 13:48 left in the second quarter.

Auburn kept hammering away at Winston, and, after a short run, recovered his fumble at the FSU 27. Marshall made it 21-3 when he ran around end on a 4-yard run with 5:01 left in the second quarter. Florida State got that touchdown back after successfully faking a punt, watching Winston run for 21 to the Auburn 3 and scoring on the next play on a Devonta Freeman run. That made the halftime score 21-10.

Tigers even the score on the next possession. Harper blocked the first punt of his career as Auburn took over on the Virginia 15. The Tigers tied it 7-7 as Frazier scored on a 3-yard touchdown run up the middle with 4:02 left in the opening quarter. McCalebb set it up with a 12-yard run the play

Mason scored his first career rushing touchdown to open the third quarter with a 22-yarder to put Auburn up 35-17 almost four minutes in.

Virginia scored with 6:20 left in the third, cutting the lead to 35-24, but the Cavaliers would come no closer.

Steven Clark pinned Virginia at its own 6-yard line and the Tigers defense held the Cavs to three and out as Gabe Wright made his first career sack at the 1-yard line. Then, Angelo Blackson blocked UVa's punt out of the end zone for a safety and a 37-24 lead with 1:57 remaining in the third. It's the first time Auburn had blocked two punts in the same game since 2003 vs. Louisiana-Monroe.

Quan Bray took the ensuing kickoff and returned it 57 yards to the Virginia 15. Parkey nailed a 45-yard field goal after a personal foul and false start penalty to make it 40-24 with 47 seconds to go in the third.

Parkey drilled his second field goal of the game, a 37-yarder, to give Auburn a 43-24 lead with 8:09 remaining.

Starting quarterback Sean White suffered broken forearm on the first drive of the game and Oklahoma ran past the Tigers in the second half in a 35-19 victory in the Superdome.

Running back Kerryon Johnson threw a 1-yard touchdown pass to Jalen Harris on the last play of the game, but that was Au-

burn's first touchdown since the first series of the game.

It was the most points Auburn allowed this season, and not even a 103 rushing game by Auburn 1,000-yard rusher Kamryn Pettway could change that.

The Tigers had surprised the skeptics this year. Auburn, picked to finish sixth in the SEC West in a preseason poll, finished tied for the second-best record in the league, and qualified for the Sugar Bowl as the highest-ranked SEC team outside of the playoffs. Auburn, which won six straight games when most everybody was healthy, finished 8-5, struggling late in the season as the injuries mounted. Oklahoma won its 10th straight game to finish 11-2.

White's star-crossed career includes touchdowns and injuries in each of his two seasons. He missed games last year, and then the final two regular-season game this season as well.

Coach Gus Malzahn said White was finally fully healthy in the days leading up to the Sugar Bowl. But the Sugar Bowl injury, likely in the first quarter, sidelined White again.

White knows the feeling. He suffered a shoulder injury at midseason this season and played through it before missing the Alabama A&M and Alabama games after aggravating the injury against Georgia in the 10th game of the sea-

The first half was a game of starts and stops. There were 11 penalties in the first 20 minutes. Most of them were by Oklahoma. The Sooners cleaned that up in the second half.

Auburn's offense looked good early, mixing things up, moving the ball smartly and scoring on its first drive of the game. Chandler Cox darted in from the 3 to give Auburn a 7-0 lead with 9:04 left in the first quarter.

With White hurt, the Tigers turned to ol' reliable Daniel Carlson for their next two scores of the first half, a 49-yard field goal to put Auburn up 10-7 with 7:16 left in the second quarter, and a 39-yard field goal about 6 1/2 minutes later.

But Oklahoma hit halftime up 14-13 thanks to a 13-yard scoring pass from Baker Mayfield to Mark Andrews, then a 3-yard run by Joe Mixon. Oklahoma outscored Auburn 14-0 in the third quarter, on a Mayfieldto-Dede Westbrook 7-yard pass and a 4-yard run by Mixon. Then Samaje Perine scored on a 2-yard run to make it 35-13 with 12:40 left in the fourth quarter.

Oklahoma finished with 524 yards. Auburn had 339.
