FOOTBALL TRAVELS TO BIRMINGHAM

» Auburn (6-6, 3-5) will face No. 21 Houston (11-2, 8-0 AAC) in the TicketSmarter Birmingham Bowl on Tuesday, December 28, at Protective Stadium in Birmingham. ESPN will televise the 11:00 a.m. CT matchup, Auburn's ninth consecutive bowl game.

IN BOWL GAMES

» Auburn is making its 46th bowl appearance all-time, and its ninth straight, tying the school record for the most consecutive seasons in a bowl for the Tigers since going bowling nine straight years from 1982-90.

Auburn is 24-19-2 all-time in bowl games and 1-0 in the Birmingham Bowl, winning 31-10 over Memphis in 2015. The Tigers are 43-57-3 all-time in games played in Birmingham, most of those at Legion Field.

The Tigers have a 29-25-6 record against current members of the American Athletic Conference, including UCF, Cincinnati, East Carolina, Houston, Memphis, South Florida, SMU and Tulane.

Auburn is 11-15-1 against ranked opponents in bowl games.

SERIES HISTORY

» This will be the seventh matchup all-time between Auburn and Houston on the gridiron. The teams first met in 1956, a 12-0 Auburn win in Auburn. The last matchup was in 1973, a 7-0 Auburn win in Auburn. The only previous postseason meeting between the schools was a 1969 Houston win by a 36-7 score in the Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl in Houston.

IN DECEMBER

» Auburn is 23-25-2 (.480) all-time in December. Away from Auburn, the Tigers are 22-24-2 (.470). Auburn is 2-0 in games on December 28 all-time, a 34-10 Sun Bowl win over Arizona in 1968 and a 63-14 Music City Bowl win over Purdue in 2018.

KICKOFF COVERAGE

» TE John Samuel Shenker is one catch and 33 yards away from breaking Auburn's single-season record by a tight end for catches and receiving yards. He currently has 28 receptions and 359 receiving yards

» Auburn is second in the SEC in net punting (42.59) and ranks 17th nationally in that statistic. Oscar Chapman is second among the league's punters with a 44.8 punting average, 24th best nationally

» The SEC coaches selected cornerback Roger McCreary as a first team all-conference honoree; linebacker Zakoby McClain and edge Derick Hall were second team all-SEC selections. Jarquez Hunter is on the SEC all-freshman team

» Auburn is second in the SEC and is 12th nationally in team TFL at 7.67 per game (92 total TFL for the season)

» The Tigers rank ninth nationally in 4th-down defense percentage (.360)

» Auburn's wins over Arkansas and Ole Miss were the Tigers' first wins over ranked teams in consecutive games since the 2013 season

» All-America cornerback Roger McCreary, a Reese's Senior Bowl invitee, was among 18 semifinalists for the Chuck Bednarik Award; he has earned first team All-America honors from The Athletic, AP and ESPN

» With 14 tackles and a career-best two sacks vs. Ole Miss, Zakoby McClain was the SEC, Lott IMPACT and Reese's Senior Bowl defensive player of the week. He was the first Tiger to record at least 14 tackles in consecutive games (also 15 at Arkansas) since Rudy Ford in 2016

» Kicker Anders Carlson and center Nick Brahms are CoSIDA first team Academic All-Americans

THE HARSIN DEBUT

» Head coach Bryan Harsin began his tenure on the Plains with a 60-10 victory over Akron. Harsin now holds an 82-30 career record (69-19 in seven seasons at Boise State; 7-5 in one season at Arkansas State).

Auburn's 60 points were the most by an Auburn coach in his first game; the previous best was 37 points in Gene Chizik's opener vs. Louisiana Tech in 2009. Auburn's 142 points in the first three contests set a new program record for the most points in a head coach's first three games.

TOTAL OFFENSE

» Auburn has scored 30 or more points six times this season including 60 and 62 point efforts in its first two games of the season. This is the third season Auburn scored at least 60 points in each of its first two games, along with 1932 and 1922. The Tigers have scored 30+ points in three of their last five SEC games.

» Auburn overcame double-digit deficits to win consecutive games for the first time since 2010. The Tigers trailed Georgia State 24-12 before scoring the game's last 22 points in a 34-24 victory,

highlighted by a 13-play, 98-yard drive in the fourth quarter.

At LSU, Auburn was down 13-0 in the second quarter before rallying for a 24-19 victory, the Tigers' first win in Baton Rouge since 1999.

That was the Tigers' largest come-from-behind win on the road since the 2010 Iron Bowl. The game-winning drive totaled 92 yards in 11 plays, capped by a 1-yard Jarquez Hunter TD run with 3:11 remaining.

» Auburn's 1,151 yards of total offense through the first two games to start the season were the most in recorded history, surpassing the 2009 season (1,145).

» Since 2001, Auburn is 161-33 (.8299) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 217-41-1 (.843) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is 557-61-9 (.896) when scoring 20 points.

All-time, Auburn is 350-10 (.972) when scoring 30 points, 176-3 (.983) when scoring 40 points, 83-0 when scoring 50 points and 29-0 when scoring 60 points.

» Auburn has scored in 116 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in school history. Auburn was last shut out by No. 2 Alabama 49-0 in Tuscaloosa in 2012.

» Auburn piled up 613 total yards against Akron, 20th most in program history and the most since the Tigers gained 633 yards vs. Kent State in 2019. Those were the second most yards in an opener in program history. The most came against SW Louisiana in 1985 (695 yards).

» The duo of Jarquez Hunter and Tank Bigsby is averaging 131.6 rushing yards per game this season (1,579 total yards) and has totaled 13 TD on the ground.

Hunter ranks 12th among all FBS players and fifth among freshman averaging 7.09 yards per carry, which would rank eighth on Auburn's single-season yards per carry list.

Bigsby has five 100-yard games this season, while Hunter has two.

» With 1,003 yards this season, sophomore Tank Bigsby has become Auburn's first 1,000-yard rusher since Kerryon Johnson in 2017.

Bigsby rushed for 100 yards+ in the first three games this season; that gave him four consecutive 100-yard rushing games back through last season, the first Auburn RB to do so since Kerryon Johnson in 2017.

The 48th player in Auburn history to rush for more than 1,000 career yards, he now ranks 23rd with 1,837 career yards and 15 career scores.

Against Alabama State, he rushed for 122 yards on 11 carries; his 51-yard run in the

third quarter was a career long.

Against Akron, Bigsby led Auburn with 119 rushing yards and two scores in its season-opening win. He added 102 yards and two scores at Penn State and 140 yards rushing with a TD vs. Ole Miss.

Bigsby's 164 yards rushing on 22 carries at South Carolina with a 7-yard touchdown was the second-largest yardage total of his career.

» In 2020, Bigsby, the SEC Freshman of the Year, was eighth in the SEC in all-purpose average (122.4/gm, third among FBS freshmen) and his 834 rushing yards ranked second among all FBS freshmen. Bigsby was the first Auburn player to average 6.0 yards per carry since James Bostic in 1993.

» True freshman Jarquez Hunter already ranks ninth among Auburn freshman rushers for a season with 580 yards.

Hunter rushed for 147 yards on just eight carries against Alabama State, the highlight being a 94-yard touchdown run, the longest run in Auburn history; the previous long was 92 yards by Ralph O'Gwynn vs. Loyola in 1936. That recordsetting run is tied for seventh longest in the nation this season.

Hunter was SEC freshman of the week for his 65 yards rushing with the gamewinning touchdown against LSU.

» Against Akron, Hunter rushed for 110 yards and a nine-yard touchdown. He was the first Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener since Onterio McCalebb (148 yds vs. Louisiana Tech in 2009). The last Auburn freshman to rush for 100 yards in a season opener before McCalebb? It was Bo Jackson vs. Wake Forest in 1982.

McCalebb was also the last freshman to open the season with back-to-back 100-yard games at Auburn (148, La Tech and 114, Miss St) in 2009.

» Auburn is averaging 241.2 passing yards per game, one of the most productive seasons through the air in Auburn history.

With 2,894 passing yards to date, the Tigers have already posted the sixth-best total in Auburn history. With a bowl game, the Tiges are on pace for 3,135 passing yards, which would rank third in program history.

» Quarterback Bo Nix passed for a career-high 377 yards on 27-of-41 passing with two touchdowns in the Tigers' loss to Mississippi State last week. Nix suffered an ankle injury during the second half and will miss the remainder of the 2021 season.

Transfer QB T.J. Finley made his first start in an Auburn uniform at South Carolina, his sixth career start. As a true freshman in 2020 at LSU, Finley threw for 941 yards on 80-140 passing with five touchdowns and five interceptions. He rushed for 34 yards on 29 attempts with one touchdown.

Finley led LSU to wins over South Carolina and Arkansas. At South Carolina (10/24/20), Finley completed 17-21 passes for 265 yards and two touchdowns (one interception), as the Tigers won, 52-24.

The South Carolina contest was the first time in 60 games, dating back to the 2016 season, that Auburn's starting QB wasn't named Jarrett Stidham or Bo Nix. The last time an Auburn signal caller besides Stidham or Nix started was Sean White against Oklahoma in the 2017 Sugar Bowl.

» Nix is 628-1057 (59.4%) in his career for 7,251 yards and 39 passing scores.

He ranks second in career pass completions (628) and attempts (1,057), third in career passing yardage (7,251) and tied for fifth in career TD passes (39).

Against Mississippi State, he had a career-high 377 passing yards on 27-41 passing with two TDs. His 377 yards were the seventh most in Auburn history and the most since Nick Marshall's school-record 456 passing yards at Alabama in 2014.

Nix recorded his fourth career game with three passing TDs against Akron. In the opener, Nix tied a career-best mark by completing 11 straight passes to begin the game. He previously completed 11 straight passes in Auburn's victory at Ole Miss in 2020.

» Nix rushed for two touchdowns and passed for another in the win over Ole Miss. He was 22-30 passing, gaining 276 yards with a TD pass to Jarquez Hunter. His TD runs were 11 and 7 yards.

Nix now has nine career games with a passing and rushing TD, passing Cam Newton (7) for the most such games among Auburn quarterbacks since 2000.

» In Auburn's win at LSU, Nix made things happen on the ground and through the air, rushing for 74 yards and a TD, and showing off his fancy footwork on a pair of fourth-down conversions where he scrambled from multiple would-be tacklers, finding Tyler Fromm for a touchdown and Demetris Robertson to keep alive a late second-quarter drive. Nix earned SEC offensive player of the week honors.

Nix threw for 275 yards in Auburn's season-opening win over Akron, becoming the seventh quarterback in Auburn history to top 5,000 career passing yards.

The junior passed his father, Patrick, who threw for 4,957 yards from 1992-95, after entering the night tied with him on the school's all-time career passing yardage list.

Going 20-22 with three TD passes against the Zips, Nix' pass efficiency rating of 240.91 was the second-best rating of his career; the best was 241.6 vs. Mississippi State in 2019.

» Nix threw a school record 256 consecutive passes without an interception dating back to last year's Iron Bowl before his interception against Georgia. The junior has now had three streaks of at least 100 passes without an interception in his career, including the previous school record 250 consecutive passes without an INT from 2019-20 and a streak of 118 in 2019.

» Nix made 34 consecutive starts at quarterback from the 2019 season opener vs. Oregon through this year's Mississippi State game.

That tied for the second most consecutive starts by an Auburn signalcaller since 1969 with Phil Gargis (1974-76); the career record in consecutive QB starts is 45 by Stan White (1990-93).

» T.J. Finley engineered a 13-play, 98-yard go-ahead scoring drive against Georgia State, culminating in a 10-yard fourth-down touchdown pass to Shedrick Jackson with just 0:45 remaining. Only six Auburn scoring drives since 1970 have been longer than 98 yards.

» Shedrick Jackson caught the go-ahead 10-yard pass from T.J. Finley with 0:45 remaining in the Georgia State game, one of four receptions against the Panthers.

Jackson led Auburn with five catches and 79 receiving yards against Akron. The senior totaled just 10 catches and 130 yards in his first three seasons at Auburn.

For the season, Jackson has 38 receptions for 514 yards and one score.

» Sophomore Kobe Hudson caught a 28-yard TD for his first career score, and was Auburn's leading receiver against Penn State (66 yds) and Georgia State (76 yds).

Hudson leads the squad with 40 receptions for the season for 523 yards and three touchdowns, the latest a 15-yard score from T.J. Finley to open the scoring in the Iron Bowl.

Against Mississippi State, Kobe Hudson had eight catches for 107 yards while Ja'Varrius Johnson had four for 102 yards, both career-high yards for each. It was the first time Auburn had a pair of 100-yard receivers in a game since Sammie Coates (206) and Duke Williams (121) at Alabama in 2014. It was the sixth time in Auburn history that two Tigers had 100 receiving yards in the same game.

Ja'Varrius Johnson caught the first three passes of his career for 51 yards, including a 34-yard TD, against the Zips.

Bowl Notes

» Grad transfer Demetris Robertson has been an important addition to the Auburn offense this season, adding 35 receptions for 474 yards and four touchdown catches, along with a rushing score.

Robertson scored his first Auburn touchdown in the second quarter against Alabama State, a 6-yard reception from Bo Nix. His second TD reception was 28 yards in the third quarter and he added a 36-yard rush for a third score, the first Auburn player with three TD in a game since JaTarvious Whitlow vs. Mississippi State in 2019. The last Tiger with two TD catches in a game was Seth Williams vs. Kentucky last season.

Robertson had a team-best six receptions for 60 yards in the win at LSU and a 71-yard TD catch at Arkansas.

» Tight end John Samuel Shenker's 102-yard production on five catches at LSU was the first 100-yard game by an Auburn tight end since 1994 (Andy Fuller, 115 yards vs. Florida).

Shenker has had five catches in a game three times this season (vs. Akron for 38 yards and at Penn State for 62 yards). He had four receptions for 50 yards at Texas A&M.

His 28 catches this season tie him for first among the season leaders for TE receptions at Auburn. His 359 season yards are second-most ever by an Auburn tight end.

Shenker needs just one catch and 33 yards to break the single-season marks in both categories.

Shenker is ninth in career catches by an Auburn tight end with 43, and he is seventh in career tight end receiving yardage at 517.

FOR THE DEFENSE

» With 14 tackles and a career-best two sacks vs. Ole Miss, linebacker Zakoby McClain was the SEC, Lott IMPACT and Reese's Senior Bowl defensive player of the week. He's the first Tiger to record at least 14 tackles in consecutive games (also 15 at Arkansas) since Rudy Ford in 2016.

» Auburn did not allow a fourth-quarter point in any of its three SEC wins (at LSU, at Arkansas, vs. Ole Miss). In those three SEC wins, Auburn outscored its opponent 27-0 in the fourth quarter.

» Auburn held consecutive opponents Ole Miss and Texas A&M without a passing TD. It's the first time the Tigers have held consecutive opponents without a passing touchdown since 2017, when they did it against Georgia Southern and Clemson.

It is the first time Auburn has gone consecutive games without allowing a passing TD when both games were against SEC opponents since 2006, when the Tigers held Mississippi State and LSU without a passing score.

» Sophomore Colby Wooden was named SEC co-defensive lineman of the week with

four tackles and two sacks in the win at Arkansas. He repeated that weekly conference award with five tackles against Ole Miss.

» The 10 points allowed by Auburn in the first two games of the season marked the fewest points the Tigers have allowed in any two-game span since giving up three points each vs. Ole Miss and Tennessee Tech in 2007.

That was the fewest points Auburn allowed in the first two games of a season since the Tigers opened the 1996 season with shutouts of UAB and Fresno State.

The shutout of Alabama State was the 244th all-time shutout for Auburn.

» The Auburn defense held Akron to -3 rushing yards. That marks the fewest rushing yards allowed since the 2001 Florida game (-36 yards). LSU rushed for 33 yards, Alabama State gained only 46 yards on the ground, Mississippi State gained 72 rush yards, Alabama gained 71 and Penn State was held to 94 yards rushing.

» With 826 combined career kicking points, the Carlsons (Daniel and Anders) are the all-time leaders in the most points scored by a duo of brothers who kicked for the same college, passing Kris and Drew Brown at Nebraska (743 points from 1995-98, 2014-17).

» Nehemiah Pritchett's 165 kickoff return yards against Georgia State ranked seventh-best for a game in Auburn history. Pritchett's 72-yard return was the longest by Auburn since Noah Igbinoghene (96 yards) in the 2020 Outback Bowl.

» Auburn continues the longest FBS current span of games (165) without having a punt blocked; Auburn last had a punt blocked vs. Mississippi State in 2009.

» Second among SEC punting leaders, Oscar Chapman had a then-career-high seven punts at Texas A&M. His four punts inside the 20 against the Aggies also marked a career high.

His 63-yard punt in the third quarter was the third-longest of the Aussie's career. With his 65-yarder vs. Ole Miss, it marked the first time that Chapman has recorded 60+ yard punts in back-to-back games in his career.

Against Alabama, Chapman punted 10 times, averaging 42.7 yards per punt with four inside the 20.

During that string, the Tigers scored 24 non-offensive touchdowns, including three kickoffs, five punts (2 blocked), four fumbles, 11 interception returns and one missed field goal.

MORE TIGER STRIPES...

» Auburn QB Bo Nix (ankle) and PK Anders Carlson (knee) both suffered season-ending injuries against Mississippi State. Nix started 34 consecutive games at QB and is in top three in nearly every school career passing category; Carlson is third at AU in career scoring, points kicking and field goals made.

» Edge defender T.D. Moultry has played in 58 Auburn games, most on the current squad

and setting the Auburn record of most games played in a career, breaking the previous mark of 54 set by running backs Tre Smith (2002-06) and Mario Fannin (2006-10).

» On the current Auburn roster, 49 players have at least one college start to their credit, 26 on offense and 23 on defense.

Twelve Tigers have started 20 or more collegiate games: Bydarrius Knighten (48 overall; 43 games at SE Missouri State), Brandon Council (37 overall; 24 at Akron), Caylin Newton (26 overall; 25 at Howard), Bo Nix (34), Nick Brahms (33), Owen Pappoe (29), John Samuel Shenker (26), Roger McCreary (23), Smoke Monday (23), Colby Wooden (23), Brodarious Hamm (20) and Zakoby McClain (20).

» Auburn has an all-time record of 338-88-7 at Jordan-Hare Stadium since 1939; the .794 winning percentage ranks seventh nationally.

There have been 60 capacity crowds of 87,451 since seating was increased in 2004, the latest this season against Alabama.

» Auburn outscored opponents 56-10 in the fourth quarter in its six wins this season, including 27-0 in the Tigers' three SEC victories. In those three SEC wins, Auburn has outgained its opponents 366-185 in the final period.

Overall, the Tigers have outgained their opponents 656-305 in the fourth quarter in six victories this season and have scored six offensive TDs while allowing just one score in the final quarter of those games.

» There are 22 players on the Auburn roster who have earned their bachelor's degrees, eighth best in the FBS and most in the SEC. Others will graduate during Fall Commencement December 10-11.

» In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 333-262-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 142-64-6 all-time; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 191-197-12 overall.

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. -- Jeremy Johnson helped Auburn close its 2015 season in fine fashion when he came off the bench to lead the Tigers to a 31-10 victory over Memphis in the Birmingham Bowl.

Johnson threw the go-ahead touchdown pass in the third quarter, ran for another score early in the fourth and brought life to what had been a hard-fought game. It was 10-10 on a rainy day before the dramatics began in front of a Birmingham Bowl-record crowd of 59,430 in venerable Legion Field.

Auburn running back Jovon Robinson was named the game's MVP after rushing for 126 yards. The Tigers' defense turned in an MVP performance, too, holding previously-potent Memphis to 205 total yards.

Johnson's play, coupled with an Auburn defense that allowed just three points and Peyton Barber crossing the 1,000-yard rushing barrier for the season, allowed the Tigers to finish the season with a 7-6 record. Memphis finished at 9-4.

Johnson, subbing for starter Sean White, threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to Jason Smith for the lead with 3:12 left in the third quarter. His 5-yard touchdown run on the first play of the fourth quarter made it 24-10.

Barber's running allowed Auburn to have at least one 1,000-yard rusher in seven straight seasons.

Auburn showed a little trickery early in the game before pounding away at Memphis in the second half.

A fake punt set up a 20-yard Daniel Carlson field goal for Auburn's first score and Kerryon Johnson scored on an 8-yard run out of the wildcat formation for a 10-0 first quarter lead. Carlson's field goal was a record-setter. It gave him 23 on the season, a single-season Auburn record. Johnson's TD run came with 1:58 left in the first quarter.

A Memphis field goal and a Reggie Ball 56-yard interception return tied things up in the second quarter. Blake Countess came through with another big play for Auburn, blocking a Jake Elliott field goal try with 5:55 left before halftime.

Head Coach Bryan Harsin



Bryan Harsin is in his first year as Auburn's head football coach after spending the previous seven seasons as head coach at Boise State where he compiled a 69-19 record while winning three Mountain West Conference titles. Harsin was named Auburn's 28th head football coach on December 22, 2020.

A former Boise State quarterback, assistant coach and offensive coordinator, Harsin is 82-30 overall as a head coach – including one season at Arkansas State – and has directed

his programs to bowl games each season. His impressive resume at Boise saw him lead the Broncos to five 10-win seasons, seven consecutive bowl appearances and six MWC West Division Championships. He led the program to a 5-2 mark and a trip to the MWC championship game in 2020.

In his debut season Harsin led his alma mater back to where it rose to national prominence. Boise State went 12-2 in 2014, winning its first outright Mountain West Championship and capping the campaign with a 38-30 victory over Arizona in the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.

The victory in the Fiesta Bowl was the third such win for the Broncos in the previous nine seasons. Harsin, serving as offensive coordinator in the first two Fiesta Bowl victories, has been a part of each of the school's three appearances in the game.

The team's victory in the 2014 Mountain West Football Championship marked Boise State's first outright league title since joining the conference in 2011, and the first overall since 2009. The only alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State, Harsin has won conference championships as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.

Boise State also captured MW titles in 2017 and 2019, giving Harsin three in six seasons. In 2017, the Broncos capped the championship campaign with a 38-28 victory over Oregon in the Las Vegas Bowl. The Broncos concluded the year at 11-3 overall and ranked No. 22 in both the Associated Press and Coaches Polls.

The Broncos went 12-2 in 2019, recording the team's first perfect 8-0 conference record since joining the MW and earning the school's fifth all-time appearance in the Las Vegas Bowl. Boise State concluded the season ranked in both the AP (No. 23) and Coaches Polls (No. 22) and were No. 19 in the final rankings of the College Football Playoff Poll, the third-straight season finishing in the top 25 of the CFP.

In 2015, the Broncos went 9-4, climbing as high as No. 20 in both the AP and Coaches Polls. Boise State capped the 2015 campaign with a 55-7 victory over Northern Illinois in the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl, the fifth-largest margin of victory in the history of bowl games. In 2016, Harsin guided the Broncos to a 10-3 record and an appearance in the Motel 6 Cactus Bowl.

In 2018, the Broncos concluded the season ranked in all three major polls - No. 23 in the AP Poll, No. 24 in the Coaches Poll and No. 25 in the CFP Rankings. The Broncos have been ranked in the top 25 in each of Harsin's six seasons, climbing as high as No. 13 in both the

AP and Coaches Polls in 2016, and No. 13 in the Coaches Poll in 2019, Boise State's highest rankings since finishing eighth and sixth in each, respectively, in 2011.

Boise State went 10-3 in 2018, boasting the Mountain West Offensive Player of the Year in quarterback Brett Rypien – one of 11 All-Mountain West honorees. Rypien concluded his career as the Mountain West's all-time leader in career 300-yard passing games (21), completions (1,036) and passing yards (13,581). He also ranked second in league history in both wins by a starting quarterback (37) and career attempts (1,619), and tied for second in career touchdown passes (90).

Curtis Weaver made it three-straight MW Player of the Year honors for the Broncos in 2019, following Rypien's nod in 2018 and Leighton Vander Esch's Defensive Player of the Year award in 2017.

Defensive end DeMarcus Lawrence (2014) started the streak, followed by running back Jay Ajayi (2015), linebacker Kamalei Correa (2016), running back Jeremy McNichols (2017), linebacker Leighton Vander Esch (2018), running back Alexander Mattison (2019) and Weaver.

Vander Esch was a first-round selection of the Dallas Cowboys after foregoing his final season of eligibility. In his rookie season, Vander Esch was named second-team All-Pro by the Associated Press.

Head Coach Bryan Harsin

The Broncos won at least 10 games in five of Harsin's seven seasons, giving Boise State 17 since joining what is now known as the Football Bowl Subdivision in 1996. The total ranked second behind only Ohio State during that time.

For his efforts in 2014, Harsin was named a finalist for the Paul "Bear Bryant" National Coach of the Year Award, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, given annually by the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year Foundation. He was also named the nation's top first-year head coach by the Football Writers Association of America.

A graduate of Capital High School in Boise, he played quarterback for the Broncos from 1995-99. Following his graduation from Boise State with a degree in business management, Harsin coached running backs and receivers at Eastern Oregon in 2000.

The former Bronco letterwinner began his coaching career at Boise State as a graduate assistant in 2001, before taking over the tight ends as a full-time assistant coach from 2002-05. When Chris Petersen was hired as head coach in 2006, Harsin assumed the role of offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Harsin was Petersen's offensive coordinator for five of his eight seasons as head coach (2006-10) and was named a finalist for the 2009 Broyles Award, awarded annually to the nation's top assistant coach. Boise State went 61-5 during his tenure as offensive coordinator.

With Harsin on staff, Boise State won 11 conference championships in 17 seasons.

Following the 2010 season, Harsin went to Texas, where he served as co-offensive coordinator from 2011-12. While with the Longhorns, Harsin helped guide the ascension of an offense that ranked 88th in scoring prior to his arrival, to No. 24 nationally in 2012 (36.1).

Harsin then earned his first head coaching opportunity at Arkansas State in 2013, which claimed a share of the Sun Belt Conference championship and a berth in the GoDaddy.com Bowl that season.

Dr. Jay Gogue

President



Jay Gogue returned to his alma mater on July 16, 2007, as Auburn University's 18th president and retired as president emeritus on July 1, 2017. He was appointed by the university's Board of Trustees to serve as interim president effective July 8, 2019, and later named president. The Waycross, Ga., native earned bachelor's and master's degrees from Auburn and a doctorate in horticulture from Michigan State University.

During his tenure as president, the academic strength of Auburn's student population increased, a new research center was established in Huntsville, Ala., a common book program that generates a shared academic experience was instituted and outreach partnerships with underserved schools in surrounding communities were established. His leadership during a period of sharp reductions in state support for the university budget protected Auburn's academic quality and prevented elimination of academic programs. During his brief retirement, Dr. Gogue remained engaged in the realm of academia, advising colleagues at numerous universities and teaching a course on higher education leadership to Auburn students.

Dr. Gogue was selected in 2013 for the Michigan State University Distinguished Alumni Award. In 2012, he was inducted into the Alabama Academy of Honor, a group of 100 Alabamians "chosen for accomplishment or service greatly benefitting or reflecting great credit on the State."

Before returning to Auburn, Dr. Gogue served as president of New Mexico State University beginning in 2000 and, in 2003, he was named president of the University of Houston and chancellor of the University of Houston System. He started his higher education administration career in 1986 at Clemson University as vice president for research and vice president/vice provost for agriculture and natural resources. Utah State University selected him as provost in 1995.

Dr. Gogue is a member of the Phi Kappa Phi and Golden Key honor societies, Sigma Chi Fraternity, Sigma Xi scientific research society and the National Society of Scabbard and Blade, the honorary military society for all branches of service. He met his wife, Susie, in the 8th grade, and they married during their undergraduate years at Auburn. Like Dr. Gogue, Mrs. Gogue also earned two Auburn degrees. They are the parents of three children and have one grandchild.

Allen Greene

Director of Athletics



Allen Greene, known as a dynamic and energetic leader, is in his fourth year at Auburn after being named the program's 15th director of athletics on January 18, 2018. He served in the same capacity at the University at Buffalo from November 2015, until his arrival at Auburn.

A leader and visionary in an ever-changing landscape of college athletics, Greene is highly regarded by his peers. He is currently serving on the Executive Committee of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and is the Co-Chair of the Black AD Alliance. Greene, 44, also is actively involved with Minority Opportunities Athletics Association (MOAA) and LEAD1.

Under Greene's leadership, Auburn has had 35 programs finished ranked in the top 25 nationally, including 12 programs in the top 10. The Auburn equestrian program has won a pair of national championships since his arrival and the men's and women's golf programs each advanced to the national semifinals. In 2019 the men's basketball program made its first-ever trip to the Final Four, while the baseball program returned to the College World Series for the first time in 22 years.

Greene's tenure at Auburn has also been highlighted by the approval and construction of the 93-million-dollar Football Performance Center, due for completion in 2022. The largest capital project in Auburn Athletics history, the new football facility included two of the three biggest single donations in the program's history.

While at the University at Buffalo, Greene's leadership was noted for success on the field and in the classroom, as well as donor and corporate development efforts that led to an array of facility enhancements. Prior to being named AD at Buffalo, Greene served as the senior associate athletic director for administration and deputy director of athletics at UB. He previously worked in fundraising at Ole Miss for three years and Notre Dame for two years as fundraiser and five years in compliance.

A graduate of Notre Dame with a degree in finance, Greene was a three-year starter for the Fighting Irish baseball team and played three years in the New York Yankees minor league system. He later received his master's degree from Indiana University's South Bend campus.

Allen and his wife, Christy, have three children, daughters Rian and Seneca, and son Samuel.

2021 Auburn Football Game Recaps

GAME 1 // AUBURN 60, AKRON 10 // SEPT. 4, 2021 // SEC+ | ESPN+ // JORDAN-HARE STADIUM (83,821) // AUBURN, ALA.

Auburn kicked off the Bryan Harsin era with a dominating performance, overpowering Akron 60-10 at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Bo Nix completed his first 11 pass attempts and was 20-for-22 for 275 yards and three touchdowns. The Tigers scored touchdowns on their first five possessions and Anders Carlson kicked a 44-yard field goal with 2 seconds left in the half to give Auburn a 37-0 halftime lead.

Tank Bigsby scored the season's first touchdown on a 32-yard run to cap Auburn's opening drive. Bigsby rushed for 119 yards on 13 carries and a pair of TDs.

After Auburn's defense forced a three-and-out, Nix hit Shaun Shivers out of the backfield for a 19-yard touchdown on first-and-goal to put the Tigers ahead 13-0.

Nix found Ja'Varrius Johnson running alone down the middle for a 34-yard touchdown that gave Auburn a 20-0 lead.

Auburn drove 92 yards in six plays to take a 27-0 lead. Nix began the drive from Auburn's 8-yard line with a 42-yard pass to Sherrick Jackson. Nix found Kobe Hudson for a 28-yard touchdown on his 10th straight completion.

The Tigers stopped Akron again on fourth down to regain possession at the Zips' 45. Nine plays later, Bigsby scored his second TD from the 1 to give Auburn a 34-0 lead with 3:13 remaining in the half.

Auburn got the ball back once more at its 8-yard line at the 1:06 mark and promptly drove 65 yards in seven plays to set up Carlson's field goal. Nix was 5 of 6 on the drive for 50 yards and also scrambled for a 15-yard gain.

Shivers gave Auburn a 44-0 lead with a 26-yard touchdown run, his second score of the night.

After an errant Akron snap on a punt attempt led to a safety that made it 46-0, T.J. Finley relieved Nix and scored his first Auburn touchdown on a 1-yard sneak to give the Tigers a 53-0 lead. True freshman running back Jarquez Hunter began the drive with a 37-yard gain on his first carry, Auburn's longest rush.

T.D. Moultry recorded a career-high seven tackles, including three of Auburn's 11 tackles for loss. Zakoby McClain, the nation's leading tackler in 2020, shared the team lead with seven tackles.

Demetris Robertson scored three touchdowns and No. 25 Auburn scored on defense and special teams to shut out Alabama State 62-0 on a record-setting Saturday at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Robertson caught a pair of touchdown passes from Bo Nix before scoring on a 36-yard reverse, the latter two TDs coming in Auburn's 35-point third quarter.

Colby Wooden blocked a field goal that Nehemiah Pritchett returned 80 yards for a touchdown, and Barton Lester blocked a punt that led to a field goal to help Auburn take a 20-0 halftime lead.

Roger McCreary returned an interception 35 yards for a touchdown to put Auburn ahead 41-0 midway through the third quarter.

For the second straight game, Tank Bigsby and Jarquez Hunter both rushed for more than 100 yards, with Hunter gaining most of his on one carry, a 94-yard burst that marked the longest run in Auburn history and gave the Tigers a 55-0 lead at the end of the third quarter.

Hunter led Auburn with 147 yards on eight carries. Bigsby added 122 yards on 11 rushes, helping the Tigers pile up 364 rushing yards on 39 carries, an average of 9.3 yards per carry.

Nix completed 9 of 17 passes for 108 yards and two touchdowns. Finley was 2-for-2 for 66 yards and a touchdown.

Anders Carlson kicked a pair of field goals to give Auburn a 6-0 lead after the first quarter. Nix and Robertson connected from 6 yards to put the Tigers on top 13-0 early in the second quarter.

T.J. Finley relieved Nix in the third quarter and threw a 49-yard touchdown pass to Malcolm Johnson Jr.

Zakoby McClain led Auburn with 10 tackles, his eighth career double-digit performance. The Tigers recorded 11 tackles for loss, including sacks by T.D. Moultry and Eku Leota.

The Tigers held the Hornets to 46 rushing yards on 29 carries, an average of 1.6 yards per rush.

Auburn has scored 60 or more points in back-to-back games for the first time since 1932.

A crowd of 82,745 enjoyed a sunny afternoon on the Plains, in which Auburn honored first responders on the 20th anniversary of

GAME 3 // #10 PENN STATE 28, #22 AUBURN 20 // SEPT. 18, 2021 // ABC // BEAVER STADIUM (109,958) // UNIVERSITY PARK, PA.

Playing in front of the largest crowd ever to witness an Auburn football game, the No. 22 Tigers had two potential game-tying possessions in the final seconds before falling to No. 10 Penn State 28-20 Saturday at Beaver Stadium.

Trailing by eight with 7:02 to play, Auburn drove 73 yards in four minutes before an incomplete pass on fourth-and-goal at PSU's 2-yard line with 3:08 left. Auburn's defense forced a punt, giving the Tigers another opportunity, starting at AU's 38-yard line with 38 seconds left and no timeouts.

Bo Nix completed three passes to advance to PSU's 26, but his final throw fell incomplete against Penn State's prevent defense as time expired.

Auburn's defense stopped Penn State on fourth-and-1 on the opening drive to give the Tigers possession on Auburn's 44.

Bigby rushed for 18 yards on the Tigers' first play and Anders Carlson gave Auburn a 3-0 lead with a 45-yard field goal.

The Nittany Lions scored on Sean Clifford's 4-yard touchdown pass to Jahan Dotson to cap an 88-yard drive to lead 7-3 with 2:24 left in the first quarter.

Auburn answered with an 11-play, 75-yard drive, converting three third downs. Nix connected with John Samuel Shenker for 10 yards on third-and-2, then on third-and-12, Nix hit Kobe Hudson for 36 yards to PSU's 13.

Bigby took over from there with three consecutive runs, completing the drive with a 4-yard touchdown run on third-and-1 to regain the lead for Auburn, 10-7 at the 12:28 mark of the second quarter.

Penn State responded with a 91-yard touchdown drive, reclaiming a 14-10 lead on Clifford's 2-yard pass to Brenton Strange with 1:23 remaining in the half. Penn State took advantage of an Auburn turnover on the opening play of the second half, driving 20 yards in four plays and taking a 21-10 lead on Tyler Warren's 2-yard rush.

Trailing by 11, Auburn responded to the adversity with a run-oriented, 15-play drive, rushing 12 times for 59 yards, including Bigby's 6-yard touchdown run on a toss sweep to trim PSU's lead to 21-17 with 5:52 left in the third quarter.

Auburn then stopped Penn State short of a first down on a fake punt, leading to Carlson's 43-yard field goal on the first play of the fourth quarter that pulled the Tigers within one point at 21-20.

The Nittany Lions extended their lead to 28-20 on Noah Cain's 3-yard run to cap a 75-yard drive with 10:48 to play, but Chandler Wooten's tackle for loss on third down forced a punt that led to the first of Auburn's two late scoring chances. Wooten led Auburn with 10 tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss.

Nix completed 23 of 44 passes for 255 yards and a touchdown and added 74 rushing yards and a TD on 12 carries.

Cade York kicked a pair of field goals in the third quarter to give LSU a 19-10 lead heading to the final quarter.

Nix scored on a 5-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter to cap a nine-play, 75-yard drive and pull Auburn within two points at 19-17.

Tight ends figured prominently in Auburn's offense, with John Samuel Shenker making five catches for 102 yards and Fromm adding three for 40.

Zakoby McCain led the Tigers' defense with 12 tackles. Derick Hall added eight tackles and 1.5 sacks. After allowing a touchdown on LSU's first possession, Auburn kept LSU out of the end zone the rest of the game.

LSU built a 13-0 lead on a 31-yard touchdown pass from Max Johnson to Kayshonn Boutte and a pair of York second-quarter field goals before Nix's razzle dazzle.

Auburn defeated Georgia State the previous week on a fourth-down touchdown pass from T.J. Finley to Shedrick Jackson.

GAME 7 // AUBURN 38, #19 ARKANSAS 23 // OCTOBER 16, 2021 // CBS // RAZORBACK STADIUM (73,370) // FAYETTEVILLE, ARK.

Bo Nix accounted for three touchdowns and Auburn took the lead on a defensive score in the third quarter to help the Tigers beat No. 17 Arkansas 38-23 at Reynolds Razorback Stadium.

Leading 31-23, the Tigers put away the game with a 12-play, 75-yard drive that chewed up 6 minutes and 11 seconds, culminating on Nix's 23-yard touchdown run with 2:30 to play.

Nix completed 21 of 26 passes for 292 yards and two touchdowns, adding 42 rushing yards on five carries and a TD.

After Oscar Chapman's 57-yard punt pinned the Razorbacks at their 11-yard-line, Colby Wooden's second sack set up third-and-15 at the Arkansas 6. Derick Hall sacked Jefferson in the end zone, forcing a fumble that Marcus Harris recovered for a touchdown to give Auburn a 21-17 lead. Harris made another huge play on the next drive, stopping Jefferson short of a first down on fourth-and-3 at Auburn's 29-yard-line.

The Tigers scored on the next play when Nix connected with Demetris Robertson for a 71-yard touchdown pass to put Auburn ahead 28-17 with 4:16 remaining in the third quarter.

The Razorbacks drove 75 yards in 13 plays, scoring on a 10-yard touchdown run on the final play of the third quarter.

Roger McCreary broke up the Razorbacks' pass on a 2-point attempt, preserving Auburn's 28-23 lead as the fourth quarter commenced.

After Anders Carlson kicked a 29-yard field goal to give the Tigers a 31-23 lead with 10:35 to play, Auburn forced a three-and-out, giving Auburn possession at its 25-yard-line with 8:41 to play, setting the stage for Nix's touchdown run.

Auburn marched 75 yards on six plays on the game's opening drive with Nix completing all five of his pass attempts for 72 yards, including a 39-yard touchdown pass to Ja'Varrius Johnson for a 7-0 Tigers lead.

After Arkansas kicked a field goal to trim Auburn's lead to 7-3 after the first quarter, the Tigers made it 14-3 with 9:59 left in the half on Tank Bigsby's 1-yard touchdown run. Nix was 3-for-3 on the drive for 36 yards, including a 19-yard completion to Landen King on third-and-4.

Bigsby rushed for 17 yards to the Razorbacks' 1-yard line before scoring two plays later.

Late in the half, the Razorbacks drove 84 yards on 12 plays, scoring on KJ Jefferson's 11-yard touchdown pass to Treyton Burks with 18 seconds left to trail 14-10 at halftime before 73, 370 at Reynolds Razorback Stadium.

Zakoby McClain led Auburn with 15 tackles while fellow senior linebacker Chandler Wooten added 10.

Bo Nix accounted for three touchdowns, Tank Bigsby rushed for 140 yards and No. 18 Auburn kept No. 10 Ole Miss out of the end zone in the second half in the No. 18 Tigers' 31-20 win Saturday at sold-out Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Jaylin Simpson's end zone interception in the fourth quarter preserved Auburn's two-score lead and the Tigers stopped the Rebels three times on fourth down inside Auburn's 20-yard line in the second half.

The Tigers' defense held Ole Miss (6-2, 3-2) to a 49-yard field goal in the third quarter, forcing two three-and-outs. Zakoby McClain led the way with 14 tackles and two sacks.

In SEC West wins over LSU, Arkansas and Ole Miss, the Tigers have outscored opponents 27-0 in the fourth quarter.

Anders Carlson's 28-yard field goal gave Auburn a 31-20 lead with 10:52 remaining in the fourth quarter to culminate an 11-play, 76-yard drive that included a 24-yard Bigsby run and a 24-yard pass from Nix to Kobe Hudson.

Auburn scored touchdowns on four of its five first-half drives to take a 28-17 halftime lead.

The Tigers drove 82 yards in 11 plays on their opening possession with Nix rushing for an 11-yard touchdown. Nix was 3-for-3 on the drive for 33 yards while rushing for 18 yards, including another of his patented, sack-avoiding scrambles.

After Ole Miss kicked a 29-yard field goal on its first drive, Auburn answered with a 10-play, 72-yard touchdown drive.

Bigsby began the drive with a 26-yard run, then went airborne on third-and-goal from the 1 to put Auburn ahead 14-3 late in the first quarter.

In the second quarter, Ole Miss drove 88 yards in 15 plays, cutting Auburn's lead to 14-10 on Snoop Conner's 13-yard TD run.

Auburn answered quickly, gaining 35 yards on Nix's pass to Demetris Robertson and scoring on Nix's 7-yard touchdown run to lead 21-10 with 6:20 left in the half.

Ole Miss quarterback Matt Corral led the Rebels on a 75-yard drive, scoring on an 11-yard touchdown run to trim Auburn's advantage to 21-17 with 2:42 remaining in the second quarter.

The Tigers executed their two-minute offense to perfection, driving 69 yards in 11 plays and scoring on Nix's 9-yard pass to Jarquez Hunter with 11 seconds left in the half.

In a game that featured no offensive touchdowns, No. 13 Texas A&M beat No. 12 Auburn 20-3 in front of 109,835, the second largest crowd in Kyle Field history.

Texas A&M's Michael Clemons recovered a fumble and returned it 24 yards early in the fourth quarter for the game's only touchdown. The Aggies added a two-point conversion pass to lead 17-3.

After a long Texas A&M run, Donovan Kauffman forced a fumble that Roger McCreary recovered at Auburn's 5-yard line.

Auburn (6-3, 3-2) drove 41 yards but came up 1 yard short on fourth down to give the Aggies possession at the Tigers' 46 with 6:50 to play.

Ladarius Tension's 4-yard tackle for loss on the first play of the second half led to a three-and-out. Tension registered a career high eight tackles. Smoke Monday led Auburn with nine tackles.

The Tigers then drove 56 yards on 10 plays but missed a chance to take a lead when a 33-yard field goal attempt was wide right.

Texas A&M (7-2, 4-2) used a 49-yard completion to set up a 29-yard field goal to take a 6-3 lead with 3:39 remaining in the third quarter.

Seth Small's third field goal gave the Aggies a 9-3 lead with 13:40 left in the game. Small's fourth field goal made it 20-3 with 3:16 remaining.

After Texas A&M kicked a field goal on its first drive of the game, Auburn answered with a 14-play drive of its own, with Shaun Shivers twice moving the chains on third down, first with a 10-yard catch-and-run on third-and-9, then a 7-yard run on third-and-5.

Auburn earned first downs on three consecutive plays beginning with the Shivers run, then Nix connected with John Samuel Shenker for 12 yards, followed by Nix's 11-yard rush, setting up Anders Carlson for a game-tying 32-yard field goal with 15 seconds left in the first quarter.

Auburn's defense forced back-to-back three-and-outs in the second quarter, but the Tigers were unable to capitalize on favorable field position.

Auburn's defense prevented the Aggies from converting on all six third-down attempts in the first half, leading to a 3-3 halftime tie. The Aggies finished 3-for-13 on third down while Auburn was 4-for-16.

Bo Nix completed 20 of 41 passes for 153 yards. Tank Bigsby rushed for 69 yards on 15 carries, a 4.6 average per rush. Shenker led Auburn with 50 receiving yards on four catches. Shivers caught all six of his targets for 40 yards.

South Carolina answered with a 67-yard touchdown drive, taking a 21-17 lead on Jason Brown's third touchdown pass, a 7-yarder to Josh Vann on third-and-goal at the 4:57 mark of the third quarter.

Auburn drove 67 yards in 15 plays, including a 19-yard pass to Jackson on fourth-and-16, but the Tigers missed a 25-yard field goal attempt with 14:10 remaining in the game.

Auburn built a 14-0 lead in the first quarter, forcing a three-and-out on South Carolina's first possession thanks to Eku Leota's third-down sack that gave the Tigers possession at midfield after a Gamecocks punt.

Auburn drove 49 yards in six plays, scoring on Finley's 10-yard touchdown pass to Demetris Robertson for a 7-0 lead.

Donovan Kaufman ended South Carolina's next drive with his first career interception at Auburn's 1-yard line, returning it 38 yards.

The Tigers then marched 61 yards on seven plays, with Finley connecting twice with Jackson for 42 yards to set up Bigsby's 7-yard touchdown run that made it 14-0 late in the first quarter.

The Gamecocks scored on a 28-yard touchdown pass on fourth-and-three with 6:15 to play in the half, then tied the score at 14-14 on Brown's second TD pass, a 3-yarder to Trai Jones with 24 seconds remaining.

With a ferocious pass rush and precision coverage, Auburn kept No. 3 Alabama out of the end zone until the final minute before falling 24-22 in quadruple overtime at Jordan-Hare Stadium in the first-ever overtime Iron Bowl. Bryce Young's two-point pass to John Metchie accounted for the winning points after Auburn went first and threw an incomplection in the fourth overtime.

The first overtime began with Alabama's 6-yard touchdown pass from Young to Slade Bolden to give the Crimson Tide its first lead of the night at 17-10. Auburn answered when Landen King scored his first career touchdown with a spectacular one-handed catch of T.J. Finley's 5-yard pass to tie at 17-17 after Ben Patton's extra point.

Patton delivered again in the second OT, giving Auburn a 20-17 lead with a 49-yard field goal. Will Reichard's 38-yard field goal sent the game to a third extra period with a 20-20 tie.

In the third overtime, ough hit Metchie for a 22-20 lead but Auburn answered when Finley rolled right and tossed back to his left to John Samuel Shenker to tie it at 22-22, sending the game to the decisive fourth OT.

Auburn took advantage of a short field by driving 39 yards in four plays for the only touchdown of the first half. On third-and-14, Finley threw a back-shoulder pass to Demetris Robertson for 29 yards, Auburn's longest gain of the game. On the next play, Finley found Kobe Hudson who raced to a 15-yard touchdown that put the Tigers ahead 7-0 with 6:50 left in the first half.

Patton's 33-yard field goal gave Auburn a 10-0 lead with 11:43 remaining in the third quarter.

Early in the fourth quarter, following a Crimson Tide interception, Alabama drove to Auburn's 7, but a Derick Hall sack on third-and-goal, forcing a 30-yard field goal at the 8:44 mark of the fourth quarter. Hall recorded three of Auburn's seven sacks, a career best.

Tank Bigsby rushed for 22 yards to start Auburn's next drive, which ended when Shedrick Jackson downed Oscar Chapman's punt on Alabama's 2-yard line. After driving to their own 46, Alabama went for it fourth-and-1, but the Tigers stopped running back Trey Sanders for no gain. Alabama used its remaining timeouts to stop the clock, Chapman and Jackson again pinned the Crimson Tide at their 3-yard line with 1:35 to play.

Alabama drove 97 yards on 12 plays, scoring the game-tying touchdown with 24 seconds left on Young's 28-yard pass to JaCorey Brooks, sending the game to overtime.

Colby Wooden led Auburn with a career-high 11 tackles. Zakoby McClain and Roger McCreary made seven tackles each while McCreary added four of the Tigers' seven pass breakups.

The Tigers stopped Alabama 14 times on 22 third-down attempts and held the Crimson Tide to 1-of-4 on fourth down.

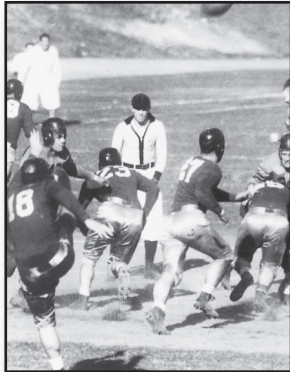

Auburn's bowl history began in 1937 when the Tigers and Villanova tied 7-7 in the Bacardi Bowl, sometimes referred to as the Rhumba Bowl or the Cigar Bowl, the climaxing event of Cuba's annual National Sports Festival. The game was played in Havana, Cuba, and was the first bowl game to ever be played outside the United States.

An Auburn drive in the first quarter stalled on the 10-yard line where the Wildcats took over on downs. After a Villanova punt, Auburn back Billy Hitchcock broke loose around left end and rambled 40 yards for the Tigers only score. The score at the half was Auburn 7, Villanova 0.

Auburn stopped a Villanova drive on its own 12-yard line during the third quarter but couldn't get field position. Villanova was able to tie the score when they blocked an Auburn quick kick and the ball bounced into the endzone where Wildcat lineman Matthews Kuber fell on it for the score. The PAT tied up the game.

Auburn's return to the States marked an end to more than 11,000 miles of football travel for the 7-2-2 Tigers that finished the season ranked 13th in the nation under coach Jack Meagher.

The game was played in a revolutionary atmosphere. Fulgencio Batista, the dictator who would be overthrown by Fidel Castro 22 years later, had just assumed power.

The game was almost canceled because Batista's picture was not in the game program. A quick trip to the printer saved the Bacardi Bowl and allowed Auburn's bowl history to get off to a significant and historical beginning.

Southeastern Conference officials lifted a ban which forbade SEC teams to play postseason games in bowls other than the Rose and Sugar Bowls and allowed Auburn to play Michigan State in the Orange Bowl.

A capacity crowd of 19,000 fans watched an aggressive Auburn team defeat the powerful Spartans, 6-0 limiting Michigan State to only two first downs, the first coming late in the third quarter, and 57 total offensive yards, 32 yards rushing and 25 passing. Auburn racked up 233 yards on the ground and 79 through the air for 312 total yards.

Auburn's only score was set up by a George Kenmore 60-yard punt return that put the Tigers on the Spartan 36-yard line. On the first play from scrimmage Kenmore passed to Ralph O'Gwynne at the Spartan two-yard line. On fourth and goal from the one, O'Gwynne circled left end for the only score of the game.

Coach Jack Meagher's Tigers finished the season with a 6-2-3 record.

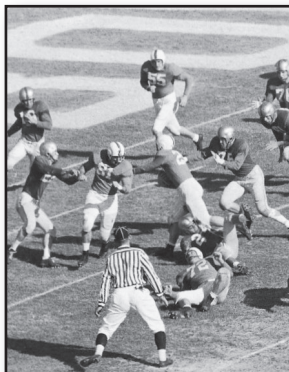

In Auburn's first bowl appearance in 15 years, and first bowl game under Ralph "Shug" Jordan, the Tigers starting offensive backfield included a future Governor of Alabama (Fob James) and a future coach of the University of

Georgia (Vince Dooley), but Texas Tech was not impressed and handed the Tigers a 35-13 defeat.

Dooley guided Auburn to a touchdown the first time they had the ball as the Tigers went 60 yards in 10 plays, with James' 21-yard run being a key play in the drive. Bobby Duke scored from the one. A tough Auburn defense held the Red Raiders, the nation's highest scoring team, to just 11 yards in the first quarter. But it wasn't long before they would get on track.

Texas Tech scored early in the second period on a 30-yard pass from Jack Kirkpatrick to Bobby Cavazos. Auburn came back after an intercepted pass, and Dooley scored on a 10-yard run to end the drive. The Tigers led 13-7 at halftime, but it was all downhill from there.

Texas Tech scored the first two times they had the ball in the second half, once after blocking an Auburn punt, to lead at the end of three quarters, 21-13. Two touchdowns on two possessions in the fourth quarter made the final score read Texas Tech 35, Auburn 13.

Auburn became the first team to play in the same bowl game twice in the same year when they defeated Baylor 33-13 in the 1954 Gator Bowl. The Tigers had met Texas Tech in the Jan. 1, 1954, Gator Bowl, but then Gator Bowl

officials decided to move the game away from New Year's Day.

Baylor fumbled the opening kickoff, Auburn recovered and five plays later "Joltin Joe" Childress scored the first Auburn touchdown.

Baylor came back with a nine-play, 63-yard drive to tie the score at 7-7 at the end of the first quarter.

Auburn's two possessions of the second quarter resulted in a pair of touchdowns, a 43-yard run by Fob James and a four-yard Bobby Freeman to Jimmy Long pass which capped a 92-yard drive. Auburn led at the half, 21-7.

The Tigers scored twice in the second half, sandwiching their scores around a five-play, 66-yard drive by the Bears. Childress capped an

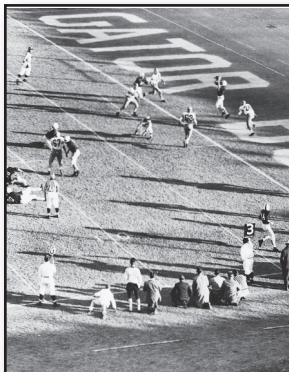

It was Auburn's third straight trip to the Gator Bowl and Vanderbilt's first bowl game ever, and that might tell the story of Auburn's 25-13 upset loss to the Commodores.

Vanderbilt scored first on a seven-yard Don Orr to Joe Stephenson pass which was set up by a Howell Tubbs fumble, the first of three for him that day, which gave the Commodores the ball on the Tigers' 39-yard line. Auburn scored early in the second quarter, driving 72 yards for the TD. Tubbs passed to Fob James for 38 yards and the touchdown. Vanderbilt scored quickly, going 76 yards in four plays as Orr scored from the three-yard line. The extra point was not good and the Commodores led at the half, 13-7.

Another Tubbs fumble set up Vanderbilt's first scoring drive of the second half. Recovering at the Auburn 45-yard line, Vanderbilt took eight plays to score with Phil King going over from the one, giving Vanderbilt a 19-7 lead. A poor punt and a 15-yard penalty gave the Commodores the ball on the Auburn 26-yard line after the Tigers were unable to move. On the first play of the fourth quarter, Charlie Horton scored from the Auburn one to give Vanderbilt a 25-7 lead. Auburn finished the scoring with a seven-yard Jimmy Cook to Red Phillips pass at the end of a six-play, 66-yard drive to make the final score 25-13.

Auburn fumbled five times with Vanderbilt recovering all five to set up the Tigers' most disappointing loss of the 1955 campaign. The Tigers finished with an 8-2-1 record.

Joe Childress was voted Auburn's outstanding player.

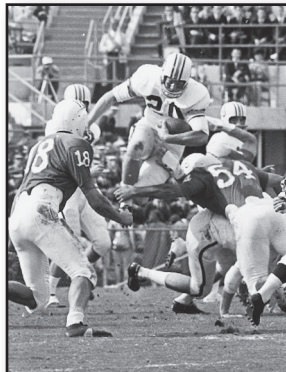

A trip to the Orange Bowl capped a near perfect season for the Auburn Tigers. Coach "Shug" Jordan led his Tigers to a 9-1 record with a rugged defense and an option offense featuring All-America quarterback Jimmy Sidle and halfback Tucker Frederickson. Auburn had defeated Alabama 10-8 to earn the chance to play the Big Eight powerhouse Nebraska Cornhuskers.

Auburn found itself in the hole on the second play from scrimmage as Nebraska quarterback Dennis Claridge sneaked off right guard for a 68-yard touchdown gallop that left Auburn trailing 7-0 before most of the fans were seated. Two Dave Theissen field goals gave the Cornhuskers a 13-0 lead with over 10 minutes remaining in the first half. That is the lead the Nebraska team took in the locker room.

The "Jekyll and Hyde" Auburn team was as dominating in the second half as they were inept in the first half. Sidle led the resurgence of the Tigers by capping off their only scoring drive with a 13-yard run in the third quarter. With only 1:30 left in the game, the Tigers were on the Nebraska 10-yard line. But a costly motion penalty and an incomplete fourth down desperation pass sealed the Cornhusker victory.

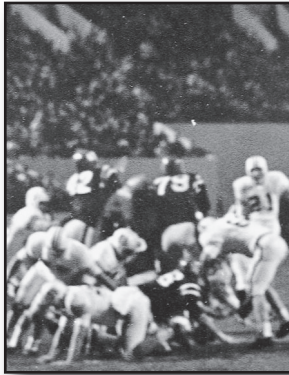

Ole Miss got the scoring started when Johnny Keyes connected on a 42-yard field goal in the first period. Auburn marched right back and scored when fullback Tom Bryan broke off left tackle and raced 44 yards for the touchdown. The score at halftime was Auburn 7, Ole Miss 3.

The Rebels took the opening kickoff and ran off nine consecutive rushing plays to march to the Tiger six-yard line. From there reserve quarterback Joe Graves went to the air and found wingback Doug Cunningham for a six-yard touchdown pass. The extra point gave Ole Miss a 10-7 lead. Keyes added another field goal to complete the scoring but not the action. Auburn marched deep into Rebel territory. But, with only seconds remaining, the Tigers' desperation fourth down pass fell incomplete, preserving the win for the Rebels.

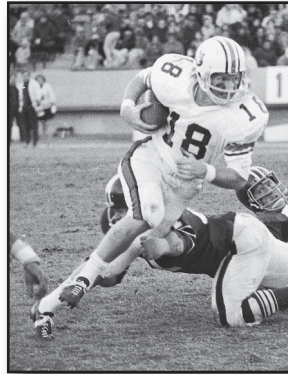

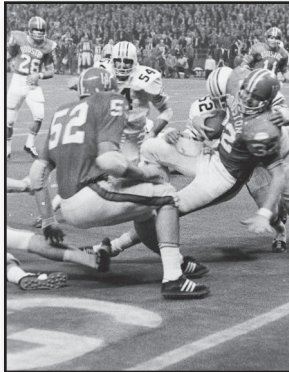

Auburn played its first football game indoors losing to Houston 36-7 in the Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl.

Houston executed its veer offense to perfection and executed Auburn in the process. Behind the leadership of

sophomore quarterback Gary Mullins, the Cougars piled up Astro-Bluebonnet records for rushing yards with 376 and total yards with 516.

Auburn's Terry Beasley, just a sophomore, fumbled the ball away at the Tiger 29-yard line on the opening kickoff. The Cougars covered those 29 yards in seven plays with Mullins sneaking over from the one-yard line.

Later, Houston capped an 80-yard drive with a Carlos Lopez 27-yard field goal to take a 10-0 lead early in the second quarter. A bowl record 57-yard punt by Auburn's Connie Frederick put Houston back at its own 16-yard line, but the Cougars stormed away with an 84-yard, five-play drive. Strong went 74 yards on the first play of the drive and scored the touchdown on fourth and goal from the one.

Auburn mounted its only scoring drive of the game, going 67 yards in five short plays in the second quarter. A 36-yard halfback pass from Mickey Zofko to Frederick finished the drive. The Tigers seemed to take the momentum into the locker room after blocking a Cougar 25-yard field goal attempt late in the quarter.

This game was billed as the "Battle of the Quarterbacks," and it was that and more. Auburn had Pat Sullivan, heir apparent to the Heisman Trophy the next year, and Ole Miss had Archie Manning, one of the top QBs in SEC his-

tory.

Auburn started off quickly as it was the familiar combination of Sullivan to Terry Beasley for a 13-yard scoring strike with just over three minutes gone in the game. Auburn scored twice more before Ole Miss could retaliate. Sullivan connected with Alvin Bresler for an eight-yard touchdown pass. On the first play from scrimmage after the kickoff, Auburn recovered a Rebel fumble and went up 21 points as Sullivan executed the quarterback draw for 37 yards and a touchdown.

Manning led a Rebel comeback by directing his team to a 79-yard, 10-play drive capping it off with a one-yard run. Manning later connected with Floyd Franks on a 34-yard touchdown pass to cut Auburn's lead to 21-14 at the half.

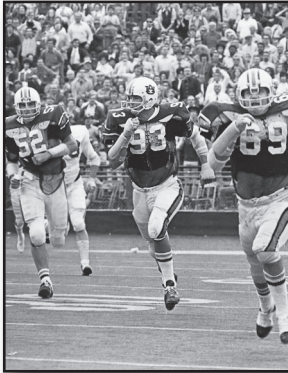

The game was not as close as the score indicated and the score was bad enough. Auburn's long-dreamed-of, much-hoped-for trip to the Sugar Bowl turned into a nightmare as the Oklahoma Sooners, capitalizing on three first half turnovers, executed their wishbone offense to perfection in building up a 31-0 halftime lead before cruising back to Norman with a 40-22 win.

The Sooners took the opening kickoff 77 yards in 13 plays and ran off over six minutes on the clock as they scored their first touchdown of the day on a Leon Crosswhite four-yard run, giving Oklahoma a quick 6-0 lead. The option was working to perfection five minutes later as quarterback Jack Mildren kept the ball for a five-yard touchdown run. A 71-yard punt return for a touchdown by Joe Wylie following Auburn's next possession opened the flood gates. Mildren scored twice more before the half on runs of four and seven yards to complete the first half whitewash and head into the locker room with a 31-0 lead.

After a 53-yard field goal by the Sooners, Auburn finally got on the scoreboard when Harry Unger dove over right guard from the one yard line. Oklahoma again scored on the option, this time Greg Pruitt sweeping around the left side from two yards out to make the score 40-7.

Two Oklahoma fumbles set up the Tigers' last two scores as Sullivan connected with Sandy Cannon for an 11 yard touchdown pass and Unger again dove over from the one yard line. Final score, Oklahoma 40 - Auburn 22.

No one gave Auburn much of a chance in this, the 28th Annual Gator Bowl Classic. The Colorado Buffaloes were bigger, stronger and said to be quicker and meaner. Auburn lost its starting quarterback Randy Walls to a

knee injury at the start of the bowl practice and had to bring on virtually unknown and untested Wade Whatley to lead the offense. Those experts who didn't think Auburn had a chance just didn't know these Tigers. The Tigers were predicted to finish with a 2-9 record against the nation's toughest schedule. Instead they finished with a 10-1 record and earned the nickname "The Amazin's" because they never seemed to know the odds and they never admitted defeat. The Tigers defeated No. 2 ranked and unbeaten Alabama 17-16 after blocking two consecutive punts for touchdowns in the final minutes of the game. Coach "Shug" Jordan called "The Amazin's" his favorite team.

Gardner Jett opened the Tiger scoring in the Gator Bowl with a 27-yard field goal early in the second quarter of action. A Colorado fumble on the ensuing possession gave the ball to the Tigers on the Buffalo 16-yard line. Five plays later, Whatley slid over from the one for Auburn's first touchdown.

Auburn's second touchdown of the game came with just over six minutes to play in third quarter when the Tigers executed the halfback pass to perfection. Mike Fuller received the pitch from Whatley and connected with Rob Spivey for a 22-yard score capping a six-play, 56-yard drive. Colorado scored

Missouri scored again one minute later following another Auburn fumble. Ray Bybee scored on a two-yard run capping a three-play, 24-yard drive.

On the ensuing kickoff, Missouri's John Moseley took the ball 84 yards for the touchdown. Missouri went to the locker room with a comfortable 28-10.

Missouri opened the second half scoring on a five-play, 33-yard drive that began after recovering an Auburn fumble. Smith found Jim Sharp in the corner of the endzone on a 14-yard scoring strike to make Missouri's lead 34-10.

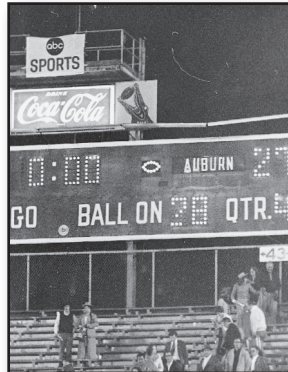

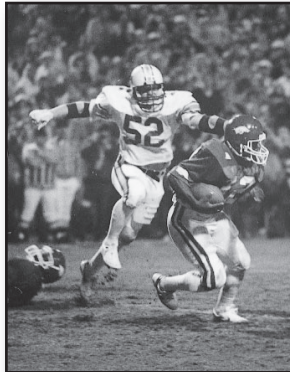

Halfback Bo Jackson closed out his injury-shortened junior season with a Liberty Bowl MVP performance against the Razorbacks of Arkansas. Jackson gained 88 yards on 18 carries and scored two touchdowns, with his final score the

difference in the game.

Arkansas scored first with 7:27 in the first quarter on a 31-yard field goal by Greg Horne. But with 3:00 left in the first period, Jackson capped off an 80-yard drive as he scored on a 2-yard run. Robert McGinty's PAT attempt was no good.

Auburn scored again before the first quarter was over when freshman cornerback Kevin Porter stepped in front of Arkansas quarterback Brad Taylor's intended receiver and raced 35 yards for a touchdown. Quarterback Pat Washington ran in for the two-point conversion. Porter's interception was the first of four interceptions the Auburn defense recorded in the game.

Arkansas made the score 14-9 with 11:56 remaining in the game when fullback Marshall Foreman scored from two yards out, three plays after Arkansas had recovered an Auburn fumble on the Tiger 6-yard line. The Hogs' two-point attempt failed.

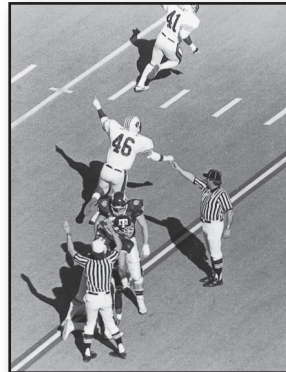

Auburn took its 8-3 regular season record to Dallas, Texas, to face SWC Champion Texas A&M in the 50th annual Cotton Bowl Classic. The bowl marked the fourth-consecutive bowl game for the Tigers and the fulfillment of a commitment by the players to play in a New Year's Day contest.

Heisman Trophy winner Bo Jackson's five-yard touchdown burst early in the first quarter gave the Tigers an early 7-0 lead, but two score by the Aggies gave A&M the lead, 12-7, at the end of the first period.

With 8:28 remaining in the first half, Jackson took a pass from QB Pat Washington and raced 73 yards for a touchdown to again give Auburn the lead 13-12. But a 26-yard field goal by Aggie PK Scott Slater with 50 seconds remaining in the half would give Texas A&M the lead for good.

Auburn managed only a field goal in the second half, a 26-yarder by freshman Chris Johnson, while Texas A&M romped to a 36-16 victory.

Twice in the fourth quarter, Auburn failed to convert fourth-down situations, one halting a drive at the Aggie two-yard line.

QB Pat Washington was two of seven for 82 yards and was replaced due to injury in the second quarter by Jeff Burger, who was five for 10 for 72 yards. Bo Jackson capped off his Heisman season by rushing for 129 yards on 31 carries and one touchdown and catching two passes for 73 yards and a touchdown. He was named the offensive Player of the Game.

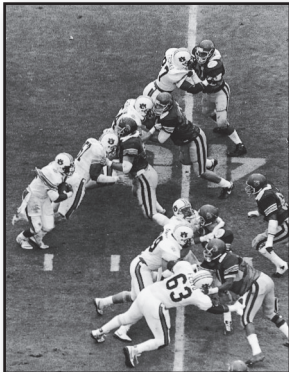

Auburn's January 1 date with Southern California in Orlando's Citrus Bowl marked the fifth consecutive bowl game for the Tigers, the third New Year's Day Bowl.

The Tigers' 9-2 regular season had left them one victory shy of becoming only the fifth team in Auburn history to win 10 games in a single season. Auburn's all-time football record stood at 499 victories. A 16-7 triumph over USC, the nation's winningest bowl team, gave the Tigers their 10-2 record and the 500th all-time Auburn win.

USC was the first on the scoreboard when linebacker Marcus Cotton intercepted a Jeff Burger pass and returned it 24 yards for a Trojan touchdown. But those were the only points USC scored the rest of the day.

In the second period, the Tigers culminated an 80-yard drive with Burger hitting tight end Walter Reeves with a three-yard touchdown pass. With 1:30 remaining in the first half, All-America tailback Brent Fullwood ran in from four yards out for a score. PK Chris Knapp kicked his second PAT of the quarter to give Auburn a 14-7 lead.

With 4:48 left, OLB Aundray Bruce hit USC QB Rodney Peete in the backfield, causing a fumble which was recovered by a teammate, Nate Hill on the Auburn 48-yard line.

The Auburn defense held strong throughout the second half. In the fourth quarter, Auburn DT Tracy Rocker dropped Peete for a 13-yard sack and a safety, making the score 16-7.

Bruce, who recorded three QB sacks and caused a fumble which set up an Auburn scoring drive, was voted the overall Citrus Bowl MVP.

Auburn finished the season ranked sixth in the nation in the final AP poll and eighth in the UPI rankings.

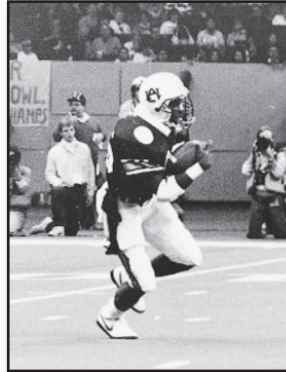

A 9-1-1 regular-season record and the 1987 Southeastern Conference championship earned the Tigers a trip to New Orleans and a January 1 date with unbeaten Syracuse in the USF&G Sugar Bowl.

Sophomore kicker Win Lyle's 30-yard field goal with one second remaining in the game gave the Sugar Bowl the first tie in its 54-year history, a 16-16 deadlock.

The game matched the best of the South against the best of the East — the sixth-ranked Tigers and the fourth-ranked Orangemen. Auburn's first touchdown was set up on a 58-yard flanker reverse pass from wide receiver Duke Donaldson to wide receiver Lawyer Tillman. With 5:45 remaining in the first quarter, quarterback Jeff Burger hit Tillman for a 17-yard score.

The Tigers held a 10-7 lead at halftime, but the Orangemen tied it at 10-10 by the end of the third quarter. Syracuse kicker Tim Vesling booted field goals of 32 and 38 yards in the fourth quarter while Auburn's Lyle was good on tries of 41 and 30 yards, the final kick tying the game for good.

Tillman, the game's leading receiver with six catches for 125 yards, was named the game's offensive MVP by ABC-TV.

The trip to New Orleans was Auburn's fourth New Year's Day bowl game in five years.

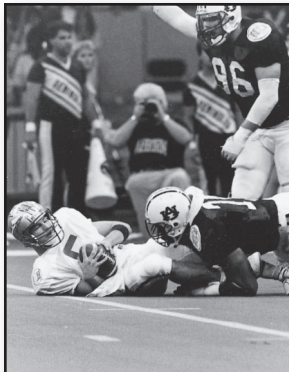

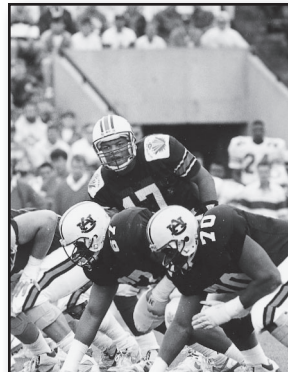

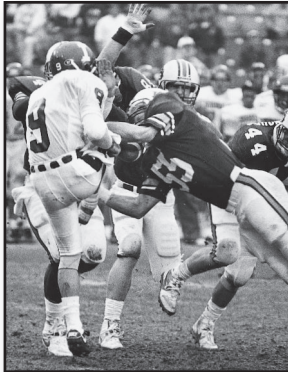

Auburn opened the scoring with White's first touchdown of the day, a six-yard run with 3:37 to play in the first quarter. Indiana tied the game at 7-7 on the final play of the first period when Trent Green

scored from three yards out.

Auburn scored on an 11-yard White to Alex Smith pass and tacked on a 26-yard Jim Von Wyl field goal to take a 17-10 lead into the half.

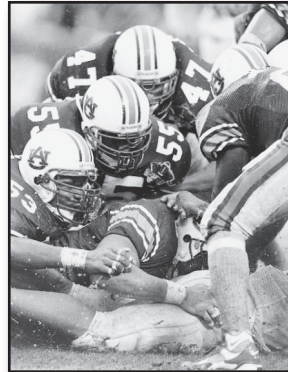

Army's J. Parker's 27-yard field goal attempt with 29 seconds remaining sailed wide right as Auburn held off a late Cadet charge to win the 1996 Independence Bowl, 32-29.

In winning its first bowl game in six years, Auburn utilized the talents of quarterback Dameyune Craig. Craig threw for an Independence and Auburn bowl record 370 yards while rushing for 75 more in earning Offensive MVP honors.

Craig led Auburn to the game's first 20 points, throwing touchdown strikes to Tyrone Goodson (30 yards) and Willie Gosha (seven yards) and setting up a pair of Jaret Holmes field goals.

Meanwhile, the Tiger defense held Army's option attack in check for most of the first half. The Cadets finally got on the scoreboard when Bobby Williams scored with 1:27 remaining in the first half to make it 20-7, Auburn.

Auburn built its lead to 32-7 in the third quarter on a 33-yard scramble by Craig and an 18-yard burst by Rusty Williams. Two-point attempts after both scores failed.

Army made a valiant comeback in the fourth quarter as Demetrius Perry and Bobby Williams both scored touchdowns to cut Auburn's lead to 32-21 with 5:52 left. Cadet quarterback Ronnie McAda then found Rod Richardson on a 30-yard catch-and-run for another touchdown with 1:27 remaining. Williams' two-point run made the score 32-29.

After recovering the ensuing on-side kick and moving the ball to Auburn's 10, Army tried the 27-yard field goal attempt by Parker on third down.

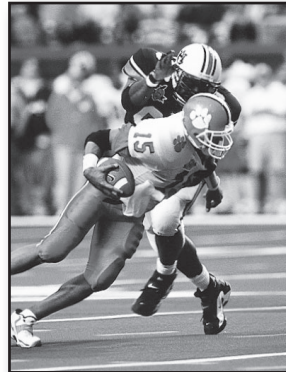

Auburn scored 15 fourth-quarter points to support a tenacious Tiger defensive effort in a 21-17 Peach Bowl win over Clemson.

Auburn trailed 17-6 entering the final stanza, but cut the lead to 17-12 on Dameyune Craig's 22-yard scramble early in the quarter.

Five minutes later, Rusty Williams put the Tigers ahead to stay, 18-17, with a seven-yard run. Jaret Holmes added a 22-yard field goal, his third of the day, with 4:11 left.

Auburn's defense dominated the game, holding Clemson under 100 yards in both rushing (60) and passing (86) and to just 146 yards total. Auburn held Clemson to just four first downs and had just one of 14 third-down attempts converted against it.

Holmes' career-long 52-yard field goal gave Auburn a 3-0 with 9:49 left in the first quarter. But Clemson took the lead midway through the second quarter after blocking a Holmes' punt. Chad Speck returned the block 18 yards for a touchdown and a 7-3 Clemson lead.

Auburn trimmed the lead to 7-6 with a 24-yard Holmes field goal before halftime, but another blocked punt set up another Clemson touchdown with 5:15 left in the third.

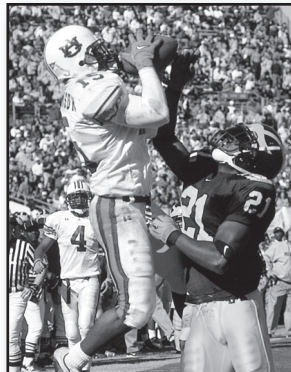

The 20th-ranked Auburn Tigers made a late fourth quarter charge, but fell short, losing to 17th-ranked Michigan Wolverines, 31-28, in the Capital One Florida Citrus Bowl.

The Tigers utilized the arm of senior quarterback Ben Leard, who set two Auburn bowl records by throwing for 394 yards and three touchdowns. Answering a first quarter 31-yard Wolverine touchdown pass from Drew Henson to David Terrell, Leard threw his first touchdown to Ronney Daniels in the second quarter to tie the game at 7-7.

Auburn took the lead as Leard hit senior Clifton Robinson on a 20-yard touchdown with 11:04 before the half. But Henson connected on a four-yard pass to B.J. Askew to tie the game at 14-14. Michigan regained the lead on an 11-yard scamper from Anthony Thomas to end the first half at 21-14.

Michigan built its lead to 28-14 in the third quarter as Thomas, named the game's MVP, entered the endzone on a 25-yard burst, his longest of the day. Auburn junior running back Rudi Johnson crossed the goal line with 4:08 to go in the third, to bring Auburn within seven, 28-21. The Wolverines connected on a 41-yard field goal by Hayden Epstein to increase their lead to 31-21 to end the quarter.

Leard responded by connecting with freshman Deandre Green on a 21-yard pass in the endzone to trim Michigan's lead to three, 31-28, with 2:26 to go.

Duval's ensuing on-side kick was recovered by Michigan and the Wolverines ran out the clock to earn the 31-28 win.

Leard was named Auburn's offensive MVP while Javor Mills, who recorded six tackles and two sacks, was the Tigers' defensive MVP.

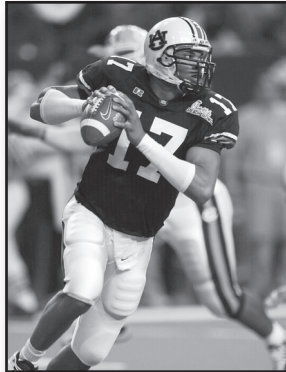

A New Year's Eve invitation to the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl pitted 7-4 Auburn against 7-5 North Carolina. In a defensive battle, North Carolina held off a late fourth quarter charge to beat Auburn, 16-10, in the Georgia Dome in

Atlanta.

In the first quarter, North Carolina recovered a fumble and returned it 18 yards to the Tiger 10-yard line. Two plays later, North Carolina tailback Willie Parker took the ball off right end for the UNC touchdown.

The only other score in the half came when the Tar Heels drove the ball 84 yards resulting in a field goal by kicker Jeff Reed.

North Carolina came out of halftime and added to their lead as Peach Bowl Offensive MVP QB Ronald Curry scrambled 62 yards for a touchdown putting UNC ahead 16-0.

The Auburn defense responded well, not allowing any more points for the rest of the game and treated football fans to a play that will be remembered in Auburn football history.

An errant Darian Durant pass was snatched out of the air by whip Karlos Dansby as he was falling out of bounds. Dansby then tossed the ball to linebacker Dontarrius Thomas to complete an amazing interception. The play was later nominated for the ESPY Awards' "Most Spectacular Play" of the year.

The Auburn offense, feeding off the momentum from the interception, moved the ball down the field. Jason Campbell connected with Casinious Moore on an 11-yard pass that set up Damon Duval's 34-yard field goal with 13:16 left in the game.

After recovering a muffed snap late in the fourth quarter, backup QB Daniel Cobb connected with tight end Lorenzo Diamond, who rumbled 12 yards for an Auburn touchdown, pulling the Tigers within six points.

North Carolina recovered the ensuing onside kick to hold on for the 16-10 win.

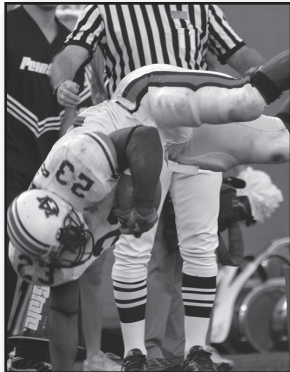

On a warm and windy day in Orlando, the 19th-ranked Auburn Tigers knocked off 10th-ranked Penn State behind a stymieing defense and Capital One Bowl MVP Ronnie Brown's 184-yard, two-touchdown performance.

Penn State's Larry Johnson, who finished third in the Heisman Trophy balloting, was unable to get on track as Auburn's defense limited him to only 72 yards on 20 carries.

Auburn fumbled on its first possession giving Penn State the ball on the 15-yard line, but the Nittany Lions were forced to settle for a 21-yard Robbie Gould field goal.

The Auburn defense held the Nittany Lion offense the rest of the half, allowing only a 27-yard field goal by Gould.

After a sluggish first half, the Tigers came out in the third quarter with a run-dominated offensive scheme and Ronnie Brown punished the Penn State defenders to the tune of 119 second-half yards.

Auburn took its first possession of the second half and marched 74 yards, scoring on a one-yard Brown touchdown run, which put Auburn ahead, 7-6. The fast Tiger defense took control, allowing Penn State only 31 yards of offense in the third quarter.

Penn State replaced quarterback Zack Mills with Michael Robinson, who sparked the Nittany Lion offense to a fourth quarter field goal, putting Penn State up 9-7.

On Auburn's next possession, Damon Duval's punt was downed at the one-yard line pinning Penn State deep in its own territory.

After a short punt by Penn State, Auburn drove the ball inside the red zone, where Ronnie Brown bounced a run to the outside taking it 17 yards for the game winning touchdown.

Brown's 184 yards rushing were the most ever by an Auburn player in a bowl, and it was the most yards rushing by anyone in the 2003 bowl season. Dontarrius Thomas was named the game's defensive MVP after helping hold Penn State to just 268 yards.

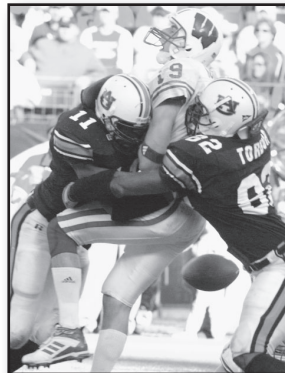

With the combination of a stellar defensive performance that included six sacks and the leadership of MVP Jason Campbell, Auburn put together 14 fourth-quarter points en route to a 28-14 Music City Bowl win over Wisconsin.

After a scoreless first period, Wisconsin started the second quarter by driving to the Auburn seven-yard line where the Badgers had a first and goal, but Auburn's defense forced Wisconsin to settle for a 20-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead.

Auburn responded on the next drive as Ronnie Brown gained 43 yards on six carries culminating with a one-yard touchdown to give the Tigers a 7-3 lead. Wisconsin managed another field goal before the half to make the score 7-6 at the intermission.

Auburn struck first in the second half, going 80 yards on 16 plays and taking 7:16 off the clock. Carnell Williams finished the drive with a one-yard plunge up the middle for the touchdown.

In the fourth quarter, Jim Sorgi led Wisconsin on a 52-yard drive, capping it with a 12-yard pass to Lee Evans for a touchdown and a two-point conversion pass to tie the game at 14.

The Badgers seemed to have the momentum in their favor until Carlos Rogers deflected a pass that Will Herring intercepted on the Auburn 13-yard line. Two plays later, Campbell connected with Jeris McIntyre on third and eight for a 51-yard gain to the Wisconsin 34-yard line. It took Auburn just three more plays to put it in the end zone as

Brown scored for the second time from two yards out.

Auburn put an exclamation point on the game during the ensuing Wisconsin drive when Reggie Torbor and Karlos Dansby sandwiched Sorgi, causing a fumble. T.J. Jackson recovered it, and two plays later Auburn put the final points on the board with a one-yard run by Williams to make the score 28-14.

Campbell passed for 138 yards, rushed for 67 yards and engineered two fourth-quarter scoring drives. Auburn's defense held Wisconsin to 261 yards. Torbor collected 2.5 sacks and Dansby totaled a team-high 10 tackles including 1.5 sacks.

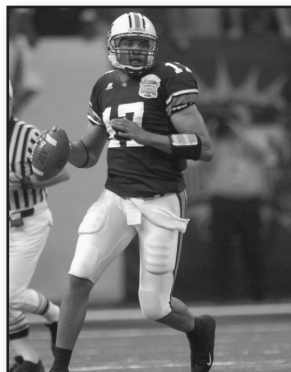

Auburn completed a perfect season as the No. 3 Tigers held off a late Virginia Tech rally for a 16-13 victory in the NOKIA Sugar Bowl at the Louisiana Superdome. The win improved the Tigers' record to 13-0 and ensured the

first 13-win season in school history.

Auburn, just the seventh team to go undefeated in league play since the Southeastern Conference went to divisional play in 1992, jumped out to a 16-0 lead in the first three quarters before the Hokies got on the board. Two late fourth-quarter scores allowed Virginia Tech back into the game, but an onside kick with two minutes left was recovered by the Tigers.

Jason Campbell, voted the NOKIA Sugar Bowl's Most Valuable Player, threw for 189 yards on 11-of-16 passing and one score. Campbell, who played his last game in an Auburn uniform, connected with Devin Aromashodu on a 5-yard touchdown pass late in the third quarter, giving the Tigers a 16-0 advantage.

The tandem of senior running backs Ronnie Brown and Carnell Williams rushed for 68 and 61 yards, respectively.

Placekicker John Vaughn connected on three field goals in the first half from 23, 19 and 24 yards to send the Tigers to a 9-0 lead entering halftime. The three field goals tied an Auburn record in a bowl game, last set by Jaret Holmes at the 1998 Peach Bowl.

The win gave Auburn three straight bowl game victories, a first for the school since 1982-84. It also sent Auburn to its 15th straight victory dating back to the 2003 season, the program's longest since 1993-94 and second longest streak in school history. The 15 consecutive wins gave the Tigers national prominence as the third-longest in the nation at the end of the season, trailing only Southern California and Utah.

Brian Calhoun rushed for 213 yards and one touchdown and John Stocco passed for 301 yards and two scores as Wisconsin defeated Auburn, 24-10, in the 2006 Capital One Bowl. The loss snapped Auburn's three-game bowl win-

ning streak.

Wisconsin took a 17-0 lead into halftime, but the Tigers scored 10 straight points to pull within 17-10 early in the fourth quarter. Brandon Cox found Courtney Taylor for a 9-yard score at the 14:49 mark of the fourth to pull Auburn within seven.

However, Calhoun rushed for a 33-yard touchdown less than two minutes later, giving the Badgers the final 24-10 outcome.

Cox finished 15-of-33 for 137 yards and one touchdown, while Kenny Irons rushed for 88 yards -- giving him 1,293 on the season - the sixth-best single-season mark in Auburn history.

Ben Obomanu ended his Auburn career with five receptions for 62 yards. His senior counterpart, Anthony Mix, caught two passes for 11 yards, giving him 1,010 yards in his career.

Wisconsin opened the game's scoring when Stocco found Brandon Williams on a 30-yard reception at the 7:55 mark of the first quarter.

UW's Taylor Mehlhaff connected on his only field goal of the day, a 19-yarder, at the end of the first quarter, then watched as Stocco found

Owen Daniels for a 13-yard touch-

down pass in the second quarter. John Vaughn connected on a 19-yard field goal, his 12th of the season, in the third quarter to put Auburn on the board.

Defensively, David Irons led the Tigers with 11 tackles.

Senior Wayne Dickens posted his second multiple-sack game of the season, finishing with two, while Stanley McClover had one.

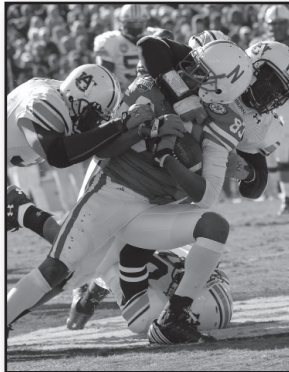

John Vaughn's 42-yard field goal in the third quarter proved to be the game winner as Auburn took the 71st AT&T Cotton Bowl Classic with a 17-14 victory over Nebraska in Dallas.

Vaughn connected on his 20th field goal of the season at the 6:20 mark of the third quarter, the game's only points of the second half, to give Auburn its 11th win of the season for the fourth time in school history.

The Auburn defense was stout against Nebraska, limiting the Cornhuskers to just 230 yards of total offense, including 73 in the second half. Karibi Dede began the defense's dominance in the first half, intercepting a Zac Taylor pass and returning it 52 yards to the Nebraska 9-yard line.

Just two plays later, the Auburn offense punched it in the end zone when Brandon Cox found Carl Stewart for a 9-yard score with 56 seconds remaining in the first quarter, evening the score at 7.

Early in the second quarter, the Tigers recovered a fumble at the Cornhuskers' 14 on a failed fake punt attempt. Four plays later, Stewart scored his second TD on a 1-yard run.

After Vaughn's third quarter field goal, the Huskers managed to get in Auburn territory just twice. They punted from Auburn's 34 in the third quarter, and Taylor threw a fourth-down incompleteness from Auburn's 30 late in the fourth quarter.

The Tiger defense finished with two sacks and 11 tackles for loss, highlighted by Sen'Derrick Marks' 2.5. Will Herring finished with seven solo tackles, including two for loss, and was named the game's outstanding defensive player.

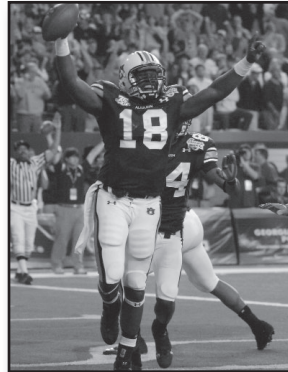
Kenny Irons paced the Tiger rushing game with 72 yards on 24 carries.

Kodi Burns scored on a 7-yard run in overtime to lift No. 22 Auburn to a 23-20 victory over No. 15 Clemson in the Chick-fil-A Bowl, in the first overtime game in Auburn's bowl history.

Burns' score put the finishing touches on a performance that saw the Tigers record season highs in plays and yards with a spread offense. Auburn ran 90 plays for 423 yards, including 47 rushes and a season-high 43 passes.

Offensive MVP Onterio McCalebb rushed for a season-high 109 yards and had 180 all-purpose yards, Emory Blake caught six passes for a career-high tying 108 yards and Barrett Trotter came off the bench to throw for 175 yards and one touchdown to lead Auburn to a 43-24 victory over Virginia in the Chick-fil-A Bowl in the Georgia Dome on Dec. 31.

Trotter completed 11-of-18 passes after he and Kiehl Frazier came in for injured starter Clint Moseley in the first quarter. Frazier had 16 carries for 55 yards and became the ninth Tiger to score two touchdowns in a bowl game. Tre Mason gained 64 yards on nine carries and had his first career rushing touchdown.

Auburn used a big second quarter as it scored 21 consecutive points to take control of the game, 28-14. After Virginia took a 14-7 lead, Auburn quickly answered as McCalebb ran it in from three yards out on third down to tie it 14-14 with 10:33 left in the half.

Then, Parkey successfully recovered his onside kick at the Auburn 41 as the Tigers went on to take the lead for good, 21-14, on Frazier's 1-yard third down rush with 8:44 left. Trotter completed a 50-yard pass to Blake to the Virginia 5. Auburn's 14 consecutive points came on 11 plays and 144 yards in 4:08.

On the ensuing possession, Chris Davis snuffed out a Virginia fake field goal after Eltoro Freeman broke up a Cavalier pass in the end zone the play before. Auburn scored a touchdown on its third-straight possession as Trotter completed a 29-yard touchdown pass to McCalebb with 59 seconds left in the half to give Auburn a 28-14 lead.

Virginia scored first, but walk-on Garrett Harper stepped up to help the Tigers even the score on the next possession. Harper blocked the first punt of his career as Auburn took over on the Virginia 15. The Tigers tied it 7-7 as Frazier scored on a 3-yard touchdown run up the middle with 4:02 left in the opening quarter. McCalebb set it up with a 12-yard run the play before.

Mason scored his first career rushing touchdown to open the third quarter with a 22-yarder to put Auburn up 35-17 almost four minutes in.

Virginia scored with 6:20 left in the third, cutting the lead to 35-24, but the Cavaliers would come no closer.

Steven Clark pinned Virginia at its own 6-yard line and the Tigers defense held the Cavs to three and out as Gabe Wright made his first career sack at the 1-yard line. Then, Angelo Blackson blocked UVA's punt out of the end zone for a safety and a 37-24 lead with 1:57 remaining in the third. It's the first time Auburn had blocked two punts in the same game since 2003 vs. Louisiana-Monroe.

Quan Bray took the ensuing kickoff and returned it 57 yards to the Virginia 15. Parkey nailed a 45-yard field goal after a personal foul and false start penalty to make it 40-24 with 47 seconds to go in the third.

Parkey drilled his second field goal of the game, a 37-yarder, to give Auburn a 43-24 lead with 8:09 remaining.

Auburn came with a blink of an eye of winning its second national championship in the last four years.

FSU stole a page out of Auburn's playbook for the dramatic finish when Kermit Whitfield returned a kickoff 100 yards with 4:31 for a brief lead, and then Jameis Winston threw a 2-yard touchdown pass to Kelvin Benjamin with 13 seconds remaining to send Florida State to a

34-31 victory in the BCS Championship Game on Monday night in the Rose Bowl. It prevented the biggest comeback story in college football history, though Auburn still finished with a remarkable season and a 12-2 record. The Tigers came within seconds of winning their second national title in the last four seasons.

Oh, Auburn tried to win with its usual heroics. Tre Mason broke Bo Jackson's single-season rushing record when he scored on a 37-yard run with 1:19 remaining to give Auburn a 31-27 lead. But Winston, the Heisman Trophy winner, drove the Seminoles in for the game-winner.

Auburn had beaten Georgia, Alabama, and Missouri to get this far, and won four games in the final minute, or second. But not this night. Florida State was the one with the heroics.

Auburn led 21-3, then found itself up 21-20 with 10:55 left in the game. Florida State took the lead in the fourth quarter, but Mason's TD run gave the Tigers a late lead.

Auburn found new pages in its playbook in the first half, throwing touchdown passes to Tre Mason and Melvin Ray for the first time in their careers as Marshall out-played the Heisman winner Winston in the first half.

Marshall completed passes to seven different receivers in the first half. But even with the passing, Auburn stuck with its familiar successful formula of letting Mason run. The tailback who went for 304 yards on 46 carries hit halftime Monday night with 96 yards on 18 carries.

Marshall hit the break having hit 7-of-13 passes for 113 yards and those two touchdowns. Winston was only 6-of-15 passing for 62 yards and no touchdowns, though he did set up FSU's only first-half touchdown with a nice scramble to the Auburn 3.

Auburn got two early sacks against him, then forced him to fumble to set up the Tigers' third touchdown.

Credit punter Steven Clark for setting up Auburn's first touchdown when he flipped the field when he kicked the ball dead at the Florida State 2. The Seminoles couldn't move it, and, after a Chris Davis punt return, the Tigers found themselves in great field position at the FSU 25. Six plays later, Marshall threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to Mason to make it 7-3 Auburn with 3:07 left in the first quarter.

Auburn scored on its next possession in a most surprising way when Marshall found Ray running alone down the middle of the field for a 50-yard touchdown pass and a 14-3 lead with 13:48 left in the second quarter.

Auburn kept hammering away at Winston, and, after a short run, recovered his fumble at the FSU 27. Marshall made it 21-3 when he ran around end on a 4-yard run with 5:01 left in the second quarter. Auburn played it to the end, and then some, but it wasn't enough to beat Wisconsin and Melvin Gordon in the Outback Bowl on Thursday.

The Badgers won 34-31 in overtime when they made a field goal on their first possession, and Auburn missed a 45-yard try

when it got the ball.

Gordon rushed for 251 yards and three touchdowns, though Auburn had the lead with eight seconds left in regulation. Wisconsin tied the game a second later on a field goal, and won it in the first overtime period.

The end of the game was like the rest of the game, a see-saw affair that featured big runs and good plays.

Auburn quarterback Nick Marshall picked one good play, and then another, in two drives near the end that gave the Tigers two leads. That's when Auburn found the proper balance between the run and the pass.

The Tigers answered two Wisconsin leads with decisive drives. Cameron Artis-Payne scored on a 2-yard run with 2:55 remaining. Before that, the Tigers had taken the lead a drive that saw Artis-Payne rip off a 21-yard run, Corey Grant run for 21, too, and Marshall throw a 21-yard touchdown pass to C.J. Uzomah.

Marshall came through after that, too.

He led the Tigers to the Wisconsin 7, and, on fourth down, his pass to Sammie Coates may have been a TD had it not been for pass interference. It didn't matter. Artis-Payne scored on the next play.

Auburn finished the season with a 8-5 record. Wisconsin finished at 11-3.

The Tigers led at the half, but Gordon carried four times for 55 yards, including the final 25, on the first series of the second half to tie Auburn at 14-all.

On fourth-and-1, Gordon broke loose for a 53-yard touchdown run to give Wisconsin a 21-17 lead with 20 seconds left in the third quarter.

But Auburn mixed it up on the Badgers from there, with Artis-Payne ripping off a 21-yard run, with Corey Grant doing the same, and with Marshall throwing a 21-yard touchdown pass to Uzomah for a 24-21 lead with 11:21 left in the fourth quarter.

Auburn regained the lead on a career-long 51-yard field goal by Daniel Carlson.

Wisconsin scored on its first series on a 7-yard pass from Joel Stave to Corey Clement, but the Tigers tied the game on a 2-yard touchdown run with 2:16 left in the first quarter, and went ahead on a Marshall 66-yard TD pass to Ricardo Louis.

Those plays, and interceptions by Trovon Reed and Jermaine Whitehead, had Auburn ahead 14-7 at the half.

The first half was more of the same for Marshall, who threw for a single-game school record of 456 yards against Alabama in the previous game, then threw for 131 more in the first half against Wisconsin.

Jeremy Johnson helped Auburn close its 2015 season in fine fashion when he came off the bench to lead the Tigers to a 31-10 victory over Memphis in the Birmingham Bowl.

Johnson threw the go-ahead touchdown pass in the third quarter, ran for another score early in the fourth and brought life to what

had been a hard-fought game. It was 10-10 on a rainy day before the dramatics began in front of a Birmingham Bowl-record crowd of 59,430 in venerable Legion Field.

Auburn running back Jovon Robinson was named the game's MVP after rushing for 126 yards. The Tigers' defense turned in an MVP performance, too, holding previously-potent Memphis to 205 total yards.

Johnson's play, coupled with an Auburn defense that allowed just three points and Peyton Barber crossing the 1,000-yard rushing barrier for the season, allowed the Tigers to finish the season with a 7-6 record. Memphis finished at 9-4.

Johnson, subbing for starter Sean White, threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to Jason Smith for the lead with 3:12 left in the third quarter. His 5-yard touchdown run on the first play of the fourth quarter made it 24-10.

Barber's running allowed Auburn to have at least one 1,000-yard rusher in seven straight seasons.

Auburn showed a little trickery early in the game before pounding away at Memphis in the second half.

A fake punt set up a 20-yard Daniel Carlson field goal for Auburn's first score and Kerryon Johnson scored on an 8-yard run out of the wildcat formation for a 10-0 first quarter lead. Carlson's field goal was a record-setter. It gave him 23 on the season, a single-season Auburn record. Johnson's TD run came with 1:58 left in the first quarter.

A Memphis field goal and a Reggie Ball 56-yard interception return tied things up in the second quarter. Blake Countess came through with another big play for Auburn, blocking a Jake Elliott field goal try with 5:55 left before halftime.

Starting quarterback Sean White suffered a broken forearm on the first drive of the game and Oklahoma ran past the Tigers in the second half in a 35-19 victory in the Superdome.

Running back Kerryon Johnson threw a 1-yard touchdown pass to Jalen Harris on the last play of the game, but that was Auburn's first touchdown since the first series of the game.

It was the most points Auburn allowed this season, and not even a 103 rushing game by Auburn 1,000-yard rusher Kamryn Pettway could change that.

The Tigers had surprised the skeptics this year. Auburn, picked to finish sixth in the SEC West in a preseason poll, finished tied for the second-best record in the league, and qualified for the Sugar Bowl as the highest-ranked SEC team outside of the playoffs. Auburn, which won six straight games when most everybody was healthy, finished 8-5, struggling late in the season as the injuries mounted. Oklahoma won its 10th straight game to finish 11-2.

White's star-crossed career includes touchdowns and injuries in each of his two seasons. He missed games last year, and then the final two regular-season game this season as well.

Coach Gus Malzahn said White was finally fully healthy in the days leading up to the Sugar Bowl. But the Sugar Bowl injury, likely in the first quarter, sidelined White again.

White knows the feeling. He suffered a shoulder injury at midseason this season and played through it before missing the Alabama A&M and Alabama games after aggravating the injury against Georgia in the 10th game of the season.

Oklahoma quarterback Baker Mayfield, a Heisman Trophy finalist, simply kept playing, scrambling and throwing touchdown passes. He raised his season TD total to 40 against Auburn.

The first half was a game of starts and stops. There were 11 penalties in the first 20 minutes. Most of them were by Oklahoma. The Sooners cleaned that up in the second half.

Auburn's offense looked good early, mixing things up, moving the ball smartly and scoring on its first drive of the game. Chandler Cox darted in from the 3 to give Auburn a 7-0 lead with 9:04 left in the first quarter.

With White hurt, the Tigers turned to ol' reliable Daniel Carlson for their next two scores of the first half, a 49-yard field goal to put Auburn up 10-7 with 7:16 left in the second quarter, and a 39-yard field goal about 6 1/2 minutes later.

But Oklahoma hit halftime up 14-13 thanks to a 13-yard scoring pass from Baker Mayfield to Mark Andrews, then a 3-yard run by Joe Mixon. Oklahoma outscored Auburn 14-0 in the third quarter, on a Mayfield-to-Dede Westbrook 7-yard pass and a 4-yard run by Mixon. Then Samaje Perine scored on a 2-yard run to make it 35-13 with 12:40 left in the fourth quarter.

Oklahoma finished with 524 yards. Auburn had 339.

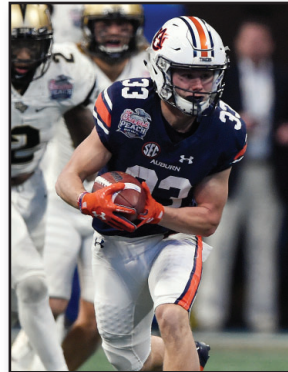

Auburn's bid to win 11 games came up short Monday as the Tigers dropped a 34-27 decision to UCF in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl.

Despite the loss, it was a game where Auburn never stopped fighting.

After falling behind 13-6 in the first half, the Tigers scored two quick touchdowns in the second half to take back the lead. It began with a 72-yard kickoff return from Noah Igbonoghene that got the crowd at Mercedes-Benz Stadium back in it. Then two plays later, Jarrett Stidham connected with Will Hastings for 26 yards and a touchdown to tie the game.

Hastings finished with six receptions for 117 yards, both career highs.

The next time Auburn got the ball, the offense went 82 yards on 10 plays and scored on a four-yard touchdown run from Kerryon Johnson. It was Johnson's 18th rushing touchdown of the season and his 20th touchdown overall.

Johnson, who finished with 71 yards rushing on 22 carries, passed Stacy Danley for 11th on the Auburn career rushing list.

UCF responded with back-to-back touchdowns, but Auburn defensive tackle Derrick Brown kept the Tigers in it when he blocked a 23-yard field goal to keep it a one-possession game with just less than seven minutes remaining.

Even after Stidham threw an interception that was returned for a touchdown on the following drive, the sophomore quarterback responded with an impressive six-play, 89-yard drive that made it a one-possession game once again. Eli Stove capped the drive with a seven-yard touchdown run, but Stidham completed three straight passes to Hastings for 61 yards.

For the game, Stidham finished 28 of 43 for 331 yards.

Ultimately, Auburn's comeback bid fell short. The Tigers got down to the UCF 21-yard line with a chance to tie the game, but Stidham's last-gasp attempt was intercepted in the end zone.

It was a disappointing end to a season that included 10 wins, wins over Alabama and Georgia, and a division title. It was also the final game for a group of 19 seniors that left their mark both on and off the field during their time at Auburn.

Auburn blew out Purdue, 63-14, to win the Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl. The 63 points was a new SEC record for points scored in a bowl game, and the Tigers set a FBS bowl record with 56 of those 63 points in the first half.

The offense scored touchdowns on all seven of its first-half drives and finished with 586 total yards. Quarterback Jarrett Stidham completed 15 of 21 passes for 373 yards and a career-best five touchdown passes – which tied Auburn’s single-game record.

His first touchdown toss came on the third play of the game when he connected with running back JaTarvious Whitlow on a 66-yard touchdown pass to put Auburn on the board first. It was Whitlow who scored again on the next drive, plunging in from two yards out, and after a Javaris Davis interception, the freshman tacked on a third touchdown, a 1-yard run, in the first six minutes to give Auburn the early 21-0 lead.

After Whitlow scored his three TDs, it was Darius Slayton’s turn to get into the act. The junior wide receiver caught a 74-yard touchdown pass at the end of the first quarter and then scored on a 52-yard pass the very next drive to make it 35-7. He later added a third touchdown reception in the first half, hauling in a 34-yard reception over the top of a Purdue defender.

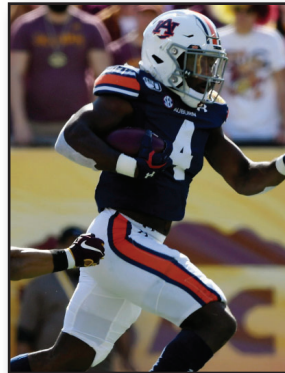

There were some early fireworks from No. 12 Auburn in the 2020 Outback Bowl, but it wouldn’t be enough as the Tigers’ bid for 10 wins fell short with a 31-24 loss to No. 18 Minnesota on Wednesday.

Auburn started the game on defense where linebacker K.J. Britt made a tackle for loss on the opening play, and then three plays later, senior cornerback Javaris Davis intercepted Minnesota quarterback Tanner Morgan and returned it 23 yards to the Gophers’ 17-yard line. Auburn answered immediately with another big play. This time, it was on special teams as Noah Igbinghene returned the ensuing kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown. It also matched the longest kickoff return for a touchdown in Outback Bowl history.

Minnesota scored the next 14 points to take its first lead of the game, but the lead didn’t last long as the Auburn offense put together a 7-play, 64-yard drive capped by a 37-yard touchdown pass from Bo Nix to Sal Cannella on a critical 4th-and-5 play.

It was the 16th touchdown pass of the season for Nix, who added to his season-long freshman records at Auburn with 17 completions (217) for 176 yards (2,542) and the lone score (16) Wednesday. Minnesota finally broke through with 10:26 left when Morgan connected with

Auburn completed the 2020 season with a 35-19 loss to No. 15 Northwestern in the 75th Vrbo Citrus Bowl at Camping World Stadium on New Year's Day.

The Tigers played without leading rusher Tank Bigsby and several other offensive and defensive starters.

Auburn quarterback Bo Nix completed 25 of 42 passes for 292 yards and a touchdown. Linebackers Owen Pappoe and Zakoby McClain led the defensive effort with 11 tackles each. Jamien Sherwood added 10.

After Pappoe's sack helped force a Northwestern punt, Nix connected down the sideline with Elijah Canion, who stiff-armed a defender for 20 yards en route to his first Auburn touchdown, a 57-yarder that trimmed Northwestern's lead to 14-13 in the middle of the third quarter.

Jaylin Simpson's open-field tackle on fourth down regained possession for Auburn, but the Tigers were forced to punt. The Wildcats added to their lead on quarterback Peyton Ramsey's 30-yard touchdown run to go ahead 21-13 late in the third quarter.

Northwestern (7-2) tackled Nix short of a first down on fourth-and-inches at midfield, then drove 50 yards for a touchdown to take a 28-13 lead. The Tigers were 2-of-13 on third down and 1-for-3 on fourth down while the Wildcats combined to go 10-for-22 on those downs.

After Nix exited with an injury, Auburn fumbled two plays later at its 24-yard line, with Northwestern connecting on an 8-yard touchdown pass on third-and-7 to lead 35-13 in the middle of the fourth quarter.

Nix returned, leading Auburn on a 10-play, 75-yard touchdown drive. D.J. Williams capped the drive with a 2-yard TD run. Auburn's two-point attempt failed to convert.

Auburn trailed 14-6 at halftime after Ramsey threw two first-quarter touchdown passes for a 14-0 lead.

The Tigers outscored the Wildcats 6-0 in the second quarter on a pair of Anders Carlson field goals.
