#### FOOTBALL PREPARES FOR BIRMINGHAM BOWL

» Auburn faces the Memphis Tigers in the 10th annual Birmingham Bowl at Legion Field in Birmingham, Ala., on Wednesday, December 30. ESPN will televise the 11 a.m. CT contest. Auburn's all-time record at Legion Field is 42-57-3.

» This will be the final game at Auburn for 17 seniors: Blake Countess, Xavier Dampeer, Devonte Danzey, Kenny Flowers, Kris Frost, Justin Garrett, Keymiya Harrell, Jonathan Jones, DaVonte Lambert, Ricardo Louis, Duncan McKinney, Cassanova McKinzy, Daniel Pond, Melvin Ray, Lawyer Tillman, Tucker Tuberville, and Jonathan Wallace.

#### SERIES HISTORY

» Memphis holds a 2-0 lead in the all-time series, winning 31-20 in Auburn in 1975 and posting a 28-27 victory in Memphis in 1976.

Auburn is 27-24-6 all-time against teams now in the American Athletic Conference, with games against UCF, Cincinnati, East Carolina, Houston, Memphis, USF, SMU and Tulane.

#### IN BOWL GAMES

» This is Auburn's 40th all-time bowl appearance and the 14th in the last 16 seasons. Auburn has a 22-15-2 record in bowl games. The Tigers' first bowl game was a 7-7 tie with Villanova in the Bacardi Bowl in Havana, Cuba, following the 1936 season.

Alabama is the eighth different state in which Auburn has played a bowl game, along with Florida, Tennessee, Texas, Louisiana, Georgia, Arizona and California, plus a bowl game in Cuba.

#### KICK OFF COVERAGE

» Daniel Carlson is one of two kickers nationally with four 51+-yard field goals in college football this season. His 56-yard field goal vs. Louisville is the fifth-longest in college football in 2015

» A Lou Groza Award finalist and Walter Camp second-team All-American, Carlson has five 50+-yard field goals in his last 12 games, beating the total of 50-yd FG by all Auburn kickers in the previous 150 games combined, back to 2003

» Senior captain Jonathan Wallace is one of 11 FBS student-athletes named to the 2015 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team for his commitment to community service

» Johnathan Ford ranks second in the SEC with 113 total tackles. That's the most by an Auburn player in a season since Dontarrious Thomas (121 tackles) in 2001

» The Tigers are fourth nationally in kickoff returns, averaging 27.97 yards per runback

» 19 Auburn players will play in the Birmingham Bowl with a bachelor's degree, four with master's degrees

» Auburn is fourth in the nation with only 17 kickoff returns allowed and tied for fourth with only seven punts returned. The Tigers' total 24 combined returns allowed leads all FBS teams and their 445 combined return yards allowed (kickoffs and punts) rank fourth nationally

» Kicker Daniel Carlson (first team) and offensive tackle Shon Coleman (second team) earned all-SEC recognition for 2015

» This is the 10th time in program history Auburn will play in two bowl games in the same calendar year

#### AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

» Auburn is 103-149-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. Auburn is 45-38-2 at home against ranked teams, 27-64-2 on the road and 31-47-2 against ranked teams on a neutral field.

#### IN DECEMBER

» Auburn is 20-23-2 (.467) all-time in December games, all but one of those played away from Auburn. The Tigers have a 2-0 record in games played on December 30.

#### ON THE RUN

» Auburn has produced a 100-yard rusher in 28 of 39 games under head coach Gus Malzahn.

Seven different Tigers have rushed for 100 yards in a game under Malzahn (35 100-yard rushing performances). Auburn's record with a 100-yard rusher during the Malzahn era is 21-7.

» Auburn is among five schools with at least one 1,000-yard rusher per season from 2009-14, along with Wisconsin (10), Oregon (8), Auburn (8), Boise State (6), and Nebraska (6).

The Tigers' 1,000-yard rushers during that string: Ben Tate (2009), Cam Newton (2010), Michael Dyer (2010 and 2011), Tre Mason (2012 and 2013), Nick Marshall (2013) and Cameron Artis-Payne (2014).

# Bowl Notes

## ALL-SEC

» Daniel Carlson's first team all-SEC selection marked the third straight year Auburn has had at least one first team selection (2013: Tre Mason, RB; Dee Ford, DE; Reese Dismukes, C; Greg Robinson, OT. 2014: Reese Dismukes, C; Cameron Artis-Payne, RB).

In Gus Malzahn's six seasons at Auburn as both an assistant and head coach, Auburn has had at least one all-SEC first team selection every season.

» Carlson is Auburn's first all-SEC place kicker since Kody Bliss in 2006 (second team) and the first first team selection since Bliss in '05.

» Shon Coleman's selection to the all-SEC second team marks the sixth season (in six years) that Gus Malzahn has had an offensive lineman receive all-SEC recognition at Auburn: 2009 - Lee Ziemba (second team); 2010 - Ziemba (first team), Ryan Pugh (first team); 2011 - Brandon Mosley (second team); 2013 - Reese Dismukes (first team); 2014 - Reese Dismukes (first team).

» Carlton Davis' SEC all-freshman selection is Auburn's first by a defensive back since Daren Bates in 2009. From 2006-09, Auburn had at least one SEC all-freshman selection at defensive back: 2006 - Jerraud Powers, Aairon Savage; 2007 - Zac Etheridge; 2008 - Neiko Thorpe; 2009 - Daren Bates.

## PEYTON BARBER

» With 976 yards rushing on 226 carries with 13 scores and five 100-yard games for the season, sophomore Peyton Barber is ninth among SEC rushers with 81.3 yards/gm. He's one of only three FBS player to rush for at least four TDs in a game twice this season.

» He rushed for 120 yards and four TD at Arkansas, with three TD scored in OT. He is 20th among all FBS players with 13 rushing touchdowns this season, a mark that is tied for eighth all-time in a season in Auburn history.

Barber has scored all four of Auburn's touchdowns in overtime this season.

» Barber's 11 rushing TDs vs. San José State, Kentucky and Arkansas ties Kenneth Dixon of Louisiana Tech for the most by any FBS player this season over a three-game stretch.

» Barber's five touchdown runs (three in the first half) vs. San José State were his first multiple TD game, and the most by an Auburn player in a game since Carnell Williams scored six times in a 45-13 win over Mississippi State in 2003.

The last Auburn player to rush for four or more scores in a game was Tre Mason vs. Missouri in the 2013 SEC championship game. The last AU player with three rushing touchdowns in the first half was Cameron Artis-Payne vs. San José State last season.

» According to CFBStats.com, Barber is 15th among all FBS players with 62 rushes resulting in a first down this season. **Barber is second in the FBS with 42 such gains during the second half/OT.**

» Barber is the eighth player in Auburn history (records back to 1965) to score four+ rushing TD in a single game and the fifth since 2000 (Rudi Johnson-2000; Carnell Williams-2003; Cam Newton-2010; Tre Mason-2x in 2013).

» Barber's five rushing TD vs. San José State are the second-most by an FBS player this season, tied with Keenan Reynolds of Navy (vs. East Carolina), Louisiana-Lafayette's Elijah McGuire (vs. Northwestern State), and Arkansas' Alex Collins (vs. UT Martin); and just behind Louisiana Tech's Kenneth Dixon (6 vs. North Texas).

» With his 115-yard rushing performance against Louisville, Barber became the 62nd player in Auburn history to rush for 100 yards in a game. Barber carried the ball 24 times versus Louisville; previously, he showed 10 carries for 54 yards in six games.

» Barber followed that up with 125 yards rushing vs. Jacksonville State, including the game-winning 4-yard TD run in overtime, making him the 22nd Auburn player who has rushed for 100 yards in at least two straight games. An Auburn player has posted consecutive 100-yard games 45 times in the program's history.

» Barber rushed for a then-career-best 137 yards on 27 carries against Mississippi State, and topped that with 147 yards on 28 carries with five TD the next week vs. San José State. He had 92 yards and two scores at Kentucky.

» Barber has 28 carries on third down and six or fewer yards to go, and has gotten a first down on 21 of those carries.

## JOVON ROBINSON

» With 159 yards rushing on 27 carries at Texas A&M, junior Jovon Robinson became the 63rd player in Auburn history to rush for 100 yards in a game, and the seventh Auburn player of the Malzahn era. That's the best performance by an Auburn rusher this season.

» His 107 yards in the first half at Texas A&M were the most in a first half since Tre Mason had 195 vs. Missouri in the 2010 SEC championship game.

» Robinson's 1-yard TD run against the Aggies was the first of his career, the sixth Auburn player to rush for a TD this season.

» Robinson rushed for a team-best 93 yards on 12 carries against Georgia and a team-high 99 yards with a 13-yard TD in the first half against Idaho.

For the season, Robinson has gained 513 yards on 90 carries in seven games, an average of 5.7 yards per carry and 73.3 yards per game.

## JEREMY JOHNSON

» Junior QB Jeremy Johnson, the first Auburn QB to start back-to-back season openers since Chris Todd (2008-09), has thrown at least one TD pass in eight of his nine career starts. He is 6-3 as a starter.

» His 18 career TD passes have been to 11 different receivers: Melvin Ray (3), Ricardo Louis (3), D'haquille Williams (2), Sammie Coates (2), Tony Stevens (2), Jason Smith, Quan Bray, Marcus Davis, Jay Prosch, Roc Thomas and C.J. Uzomah.

» Johnson topped the 1,000-yard career passing mark vs. Jacksonville State. For his career, Johnson has completed 143-234 passes for 1,900 yards with 18 TDs and 9 INTs.

## SEAN WHITE

» Sean White was the first Auburn freshman QB to make his first start in an SEC game since Jeff Klein at Tennessee in 1999. Auburn has had six freshman QB starters since 2000.

» In his debut against Mississippi State, White was 20-28 passing for 188 yards with one interception. For the season, he is 75-130 (57.7) in completion percentage.

» White is the first Auburn quarterback to throw for 250 or more yards in three consecutive games since Dameyune Craig in 1997. He's the first AU freshman to ever accomplish the feat. Auburn freshmen had thrown for at least 250 yards in a game a total of five times in Auburn history prior to this season.

» White is the second freshman signal caller to throw for at least 250 yards in multiple games in Auburn history, joining Stan White, who topped the mark four times in 1990.

» With the win at Kentucky, White was the first Auburn freshman quarterback to win an SEC road game since Jason Campbell at Vanderbilt in 2001.

White's 255 passing yards at Kentucky (17-27) were the second-most by an AU freshman in an SEC game; Stan White threw for 338 yards against Tennessee in 1990. Those 255 passing yards were sixth-most by an AU freshman QB and most since Jeff Klein (270 vs. UCF) in 1999.

White topped all those marks with 258 yards passing (12-28, 1 TD, 1 INT) vs. Ole Miss.

## RICARDO LOUIS

» Senior Ricardo Louis has 97 career catches for 1,321 yards and eight TD catches, along with 535 rushing yards and two rushing TD. He is 11th among Auburn career leaders in receptions (97) and 16th in receiving yardage (1,321).

» Louis had 114 yards receiving in the first quarter at Kentucky, the most receiving yards in a quarter by an Auburn player since Sammie Coates had 142 yards receiving in the second

quarter of the 2014 Iron Bowl. Louis finished with a career-high 154 yards receiving, topping his previous high of 131 vs. Georgia (2013).

» He totalled 137 yards against Ole Miss on four receptions, with a 47-yard TD catch, his third career 100-yard receiving game.

» Louis had a 24-game reception streak (the longest at Auburn since Rod Smith went 25 consecutive games with a catch in 2007-08) broken at Texas A&M.

» Against Louisville, Louis scored on a 33-yard pass from Jeremy Johnson and also scored on an 8-yard run -- the first Auburn player to score a receiving and a rushing TD in the same game since Tre Mason against Florida State in the BCS Championship game in 2013, and the first Auburn receiver to do so since Ben Obomanu vs. Alabama in 2005.

It was Louis' first career game scoring multiple touchdowns, and the second time he caught a TD pass in consecutive games.

» Louis' career-best 10 receptions vs. Jacksonville State were the most by an AU player since Emory Blake (10) vs. Arkansas in 2012. Louis tied for the fourth-best single game in AU history, and only the eighth player at Auburn with 10 or more receptions in a game.

» He was the first Auburn receiver in program history to rush for more than 100 yards with a 102-yard effort against South Carolina in 2014.

» Louis' most famous score is the 2013 "Prayer In Jordan-Hare," where he caught a tipped pass from Nick Marshall on 4th-and-18 for a 73-yard touchdown that won the Georgia game with 0:25 remaining in the contest.

## MELVIN RAY

» Senior Melvin Ray has caught 31 career passes for 518 yards and four touchdowns. **In his career, 25 of his 31 catches have gone for either a first down or a touchdown.**

» His 10-yard TD reception from Jeremy Johnson vs. Jacksonville State tied that game with just 1:22 remaining in regulation. He had a nine-yard TD catch from Johnson at LSU.

The other two career scores were a 50-yarder from Nick Marshall in the BCS Championship in 2013 and a 49-yard strike from Johnson in the 2014 season opener

against Arkansas.

## FIRST DOWNS

» Auburn has had 20 or more first downs in 27 of its last 34 games. In 39 games under Gus Malzahn as head coach, Auburn has gained 20 or more first downs in a game 30 times.

In 16 of its last 34 games, Auburn has gained at least 25 first downs. In 2015, the Tigers are averaging 19.5 first downs per game; under Gus Malzahn as head coach, Auburn has averaged 22.6 first downs.

## AVERAGE PER DOWN

» Here's a breakdown of Auburn's offensive production on first, second, third and fourth down, in terms of the plays run, yards gained and average gain:

» Auburn's offensive TDs have come eight times on first down (4 rush, 4 pass); nine times on second down (7 rush, 2 pass); and seven times on third down (5 rush, 2 pass).

## WHEN SCORING 20+ AND 30+

» Since 2001, Auburn is 114-21 (.849) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 170-29-1 (.857) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is now 316-9 (.976) when scoring 30 points.

## ON DEFENSE

» Auburn held Georgia to 243 yards, the fewest yards for an Auburn opponent since the Tigers held Samford to 238 yards last season, and the fewest allowed by Auburn in an SEC game since the Tigers held Florida to 194 yards in 2011.

» The 10 points allowed by the Auburn defense vs. Texas A&M are the fewest against a ranked SEC opponent on the road since 2004 at No. 10 Tennessee (10 points), and the fewest in a SEC road game by the Tigers since allowing just two points at Mississippi State in 2008.

» The Auburn defense gets better on third downs the deeper it gets into the game. The Tiger defense improves throughout the game when it has a chance to get off the field. Opponent 3rd-dwn conversion % by half:

## TOP TACKLERS

» Five current players have more than 100 career tackles at Auburn: Cassanova McKinzy (263), Kris Frost (241), Johnathan Ford (211), Jonathan Jones (127) and Montravius Adams (105).

» Ford has seven double-digit tackle games this season and ranks second in the SEC with 113 total tackles. That's the most for a season since Dontarrious Thomas (122) in 2001.

Since 2001, only three other Auburn defenders have recorded more than 100 tackles in a season: Daren Bates (104 in 2011), Josh Bynes (104 in 2009) and Neiko Thorpe (102 in 2011).

» Ford's 14 tackles vs. San José State, Kentucky and Ole Miss were a career high, the most by an Auburn player since Kris Frost tallied 14 tackles vs. South Carolina last season.

Ford led Auburn with 12 tackles in the win over Louisville and added 12 more stops against Jacksonville State and 10 at LSU.

The last Auburn player with 10+ tackles in three straight games was Demetruce McNeal in 2012 at Vanderbilt (12), vs. Texas A&M (10) and vs. New Mexico State (10).

» Frost had his third double digit-tackle game of the season (sixth career) at Kentucky with 11 stops.

» Three Auburn players recorded 10 tackles each in the LSU game: Frost, Ford and Tré Williams (career high). The last time three Auburn defenders had 10+ tackles in a game was against ULM in 2012: Daren Bates (14), Demetruce McNeal (11), Jake Holland (10).

» Linebacker Cassanova McKinzy led Auburn with 13 tackles against Jacksonville State, his sixth career double-figure game, and sacked JSU's QB Eli Jenkins for a 16-yard loss on 3rd-and-goal in overtime.

McKinzy has a team-high 5.0 sacks (-45 yards) for Auburn this season. Montravius Adams has 2.0 sacks (-18 yards) for the season.

## INTERCEPTORS

» Johnathan Ford's 48-yard interception return for a touchdown against Idaho was his second interception of the season and fifth pick of his career. It was his first interception score and second career score at Auburn. The Tigers' last interception return for a touchdown was Jermaine Whitehead vs. Arkansas in the 2014 season opener.

» Jonathan Jones' 29-yard interception against Idaho was his first of the season and the seventh of his career; he had six during his junior season.

» The Tigers have intercepted at least one pass in eight of 12 games. Auburn intercepted a pass in five consecutive games prior to the Georgia contest.

» Seven different Auburn players have at least one interception this season.

» Auburn recorded multiple interceptions in four games this season: San José State, Ole Miss, Texas A&M, Idaho.

» Pickoffs by Blake Countess, Justin Garrett and Carlton Davis at Texas A&M marked Auburn's most interceptions in a game since last year's Outback Bowl vs. Wisconsin (3).

» Tray Matthews opened the Louisville game with a 35-yard interception return on the first play from scrimmage. It was the first INT on an opening drive by Auburn since the 2013 Arkansas game.

» Ford recorded an interception in the Jacksonville State game, the fourth pick of his career. Kris Frost recorded his second career interception at Arkansas.

» Justin Garrett and Carlton Davis both recorded their first career interceptions against San José State. Blake Countess and Kris Frost had picks against Ole Miss.

» True freshman Carlton Davis recorded the second interception of his career when he picked off Kentucky quarterback Patrick Towles in the end zone in Auburn's 30-27 win in Lexington.

Davis is the first Auburn freshman to record multiple interceptions since T'Sharvan Bell had three picks as a redshirt frosh in 2009, and the first freshman to record an INT in consecutive games since Will Herring in 2003.

Davis is one of just 12 freshmen nationally to record three or more interceptions this season, and the only SEC freshman to do so.

» The Auburn defense has 48 interceptions in 39 games (1.23/gm) since the beginning of the 2013 season. Prior to that, the Tigers had 34 interceptions in 49 games dating back to the final 10 games of 2009.

#### LOU GROZA FINALIST DANIEL CARLSON

» Sophomore Daniel Carlson's 56-yard field goal vs. Louisville, a Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game record, is the **fifth-longest kick in college football this season**. It was a career long; his previous was 51 yards vs. Wisconsin last year.

The 56-yarder was the longest by an Auburn kicker since 2003 (57 yds, Philip Yost vs. Western Kentucky) and ties John Riley (at Tennessee, 1969) for the third-longest FG in Auburn history.

» "Legatron" is one of only two kickers nationally this season to make four field goals of 51+ yards. Carlson's four 50+ yard FG in a season break the AU single season record of three set by John Riley in 1969. He has tied the Auburn career record for 50+ yard FG with five, shared with Neil O'Donoghue (1975-76).

» The Lou Groza Award finalist has made 22 field goals this season, tying the Auburn single-season record:

» Against Texas A&M, Carlson was 4-4 on FG, the sixth time in his career he has made at least three field goals in a game. He was 2-2 against Georgia. In his last six games, Carlson is 16-of-17 on FG attempts with two 52-yard field goals.

» Carlson made 16 consecutive field goals, an Auburn record, breaking the mark set in 1997:

» Carlson ranks sixth in Auburn career field goals made (40), and is just one of four Auburn kickers all-time who have made 15+ field goals in multiple seasons:

» Carlson is 5-6 on career FG of at least 50 yards, making a 51-yarder in the Outback Bowl, a 56-yarder (one yard short of the Auburn record) in the opener vs. Louisville, a 51-yarder vs. Mississippi State and a 52-yarder

at Kentucky and against Ole Miss.

He is the just the third AU kicker with 50+-yd FGs in back-to-back games, along with John Riley (1969; Tennessee/56, Kentucky/54) and John Vaughn (Washington State/52, Miss State/55). In 1987, Win Lyle had FGs of 55 and 52 yards in a game vs.Tennessee.

» Carlson has made 93 consecutive PAT kicks, the fourth longest such string in Auburn history. He is now eighth in career PAT made at Auburn.

Last season, Carlson was 57-57 on PAT attempts -- third among Auburn single-season leaders for FG made and the best 100% season in AU history. Carlson was second in Auburn single-season kick scoring with 111 points, tied with Cody Parkey (2013) and his 18 made field goals were third best in a season at Auburn.

» This season, 45 of Carlson's 63 kickoffs have gone for touchbacks, the fourth best percentage (71.43%) nationally. For his career, 95 of 144 kickoffs (65.9%) have been touchbacks.

#### PUNTER KEVIN PHILLIPS

» Junior college transfer Kevin Phillips had a solid start as Auburn's punter. Averaging 41.1 yards per kick, 16 of Phillips' 52 punts landed inside the 20 and nine were longer than 50 yards. He had only seven punts returned this season.

» Phillips' 50.0 yd/punt average at LSU (6/300) was the best for an Auburn punter since Daniel Carlson averaged 53.3 yds/punt (3/160) against Arkansas in the 2014 season opener.

» Phillips' 56-yard punt at LSU was a career long, and the longest Auburn punt since the 2014 season opener vs. Arkansas, when Daniel Carlson had a 62-yarder.

» With four 50+ yard punts at LSU, Phillips had the most 50-yd punts in a game for Auburn since a school record five 50+ yard punts by Skip Johnston vs. Florida (53.2 avg) in 1978.

#### ON SPECIAL TEAMS

» The Tigers are fourth in the nation in kickoff returns, averaging 27.97 yards per runback. Auburn's long return of the season was 61 yards by Blake Countess vs. San José State.

Auburn is tied for fourth nationally with 12 kickoff returns of at least 30 yards this season, tied for fourth with five 40+yard kickoff returns and tied for 16th with two 50+-yard returns this season.

» Auburn's 297 kickoff returns yards (142 vs. San Jose State and 155 at Kentucky) were the most kickoff return yards for the Tigers in a two-game span since 436 return yards in the first two games of 2011 (257 vs. Utah State; 179 vs. Mississippi State).

» Auburn has returned three punts for a touchdown in its last 30 games. Prior to that, the Tigers had returned three punts for scores in 277 games dating back to 1991.

» Auburn has 30 players currently on NFL active rosters and injured reserve, representing 18 different NFL teams

» Three more former Tigers are on NFL practice squads: Reese Dismukes (Carolina), Trovon Reed (Seattle) and Jermaine Whitehead (San Francisco)

» Auburn had 43 players in NFL preseason camps in 2015, representing 22 different NFL teams

» Auburn has had 29 players taken in the first round and four No. 1 overall draft picks: Cam Newton (Carolina, '11), Aundray Bruce (Atlanta, '88), Bo Jackson (Tampa, '86) & Tucker Frederickson (NY Giants, '65)

» At least one former Tiger has been selected to 16 of the last 17 Pro Bowls. Auburn has had at least one former player in eight of the last 11 Super Bowls

### MORE TIGER STRIPES...

» Auburn is +9 in turnovers (14/5) in its last eight games after posting a -5 turnover margin (9/4) in its first four games. Auburn has scored 75 points off turnovers this season.

» The Tigers are one of seven teams with at least 20 different starters this season on both sides of the ball, along with Colorado, Nebraska, Ole Miss, Oregon State, Rice and UCF. Auburn has had 22 different starters on offense and 22 on defense.

» The Tigers have a 29-game home non-conference winning streak. Auburn's last home non-conference loss was a 26-23 OT defeat to South Florida in 2007.

Auburn has won 14 consecutive regular season games against non-conference competition since a 26-19 loss to No. 14 Clemson in the 2012 season opener. Auburn's all-time regular season record in non-conference play since SEC action began in 1933 is 241-67-6.

Auburn finished 4-0 in its regular season non-conference schedule, the 28th time since joining the SEC in 1933 the Tigers did not lose a game in non-conference regular season action.

» The Tigers have 740 total victories, 13th among the all-time winningest FBS football programs. The 23 FBS teams with 700+ all-time wins: Michigan, Texas, Nebraska, Notre Dame, Penn State, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Alabama, Tennessee, Southern Cal, Georgia, LSU, Auburn, West Virginia, Syracuse, Virginia Tech, Texas A&M, Georgia Tech, Pitt, Washington, Florida, Arkansas and Clemson.

» Auburn's 56 points scored vs. Idaho were the most by the Tigers since the San José State win in 2014 (59). It was the fifth time during the Malzahn era that Auburn scored 50+ points.

» Auburn has played in front of 26 consecutive regular-season sellout crowds at home and away, including 16 consecutive sell-outs at Jordan-Hare Stadium; the last regular season non-sellout was in 2013 at Tennessee.

### ONE-SCORE GAMES

## LAST MEETING WITH MEMPHIS

Part of the blame for Auburn's defeat at the hands of the Memphis State Tigers lies in the passing trio of quarterback Lloyd Patterson and speedy receivers Ricky Rivas and Keith Wright. But Auburn defensive secondary coach Buddy Nix said he thought a lack of confidence, coupled with some early-season injuries on the part of his Tigers played a great part in the loss.

"We're not blessed with great speed back there, but we've got the needed skill. What we need now is some confidence in our boys," he said. "I don't know if you get it with a win, but I know we must get it."

The two starting defensive backs, Lance Hill and Jeff Gray, have had surgery on tendons in their hands within the past five weeks and have not played at 100 percent yet. However, Nix was forced to start Hill at quick cornerback against Memphis State since his listed starter, sophomore Alan Hardin, had a 102 degree temperature most of last week.

"We thought Hardin might have pneumonia, and he hadn't practiced all week, so we started Lance even though he has his right hand clubbed (in bandages)," he added. "We've played every-body we have except a couple of freshmen at some time or another."

His starting backfield for the first half of the season has included Hill, Gray, Gray's replacement at free safety Danny Arnold, Rick Freeman, Mike McCloud and Hardin. According to Nix, the four whom have the best week of practice will start against Georgia Tech Saturday.

The problem with having both good running backs and a good pair of receivers is you can't overload your pass defense to stop the run, or your pass defense will slip, and you can't overload to stop the pass or your rushing defense will fall," Nix said.

The War Eagle pass defenses did fall Saturday night and three long receptions by Rivas and Wright proved it. Each had a catch in excess of 35-yards for a touchdown and Rivas caught a pass on 3rd and 24 late in the game to set up the final Memphis State touchdown. The final Rivas pass was caught between two Auburn defenders and Nix said "we played it poorly."

According to Nix, the big turning points of the game could have been the roughing the kicker penalty late in the second quarter on the Auburn 47 and the pass interference call against Hill with less than a minute left in the first half.

"The two fumbles we lost kept us from winning but didn't lose it for us," Nix said. "We didn't play very well defensively, yet we still had many opportunities."

"Memphis State was a very balanced team and Georgia Tech is not as balanced. But no matter what a team has done in the past, you can always look forward to seeing a test of your weaknesses the next week," Nix said, referring to the poor pass defense showing exhibited last week in Memphis.

"Pass defense is a team effort. If one segment breaks down, the whole defense does," Nix added in closing.

# Head Coach Gus Malzahn



In three years as head coach at Auburn, Gus Malzahn has led the Tigers to a 26-12 record and three bowl games, including two January bowl games, and a Southeastern Conference Championship and an appearance in the BCS National Championship Game in 2013.

Named the 2013 National Coach of the Year after leading the Tigers to a 12-2 record and one of the most memorable seasons in school history, Malzahn's second squad finished 8-5 record after

navigating the nation's most difficult schedule. In 2014, Auburn faced 11 teams that were bowl eligible, with five road games against ranked opponents. This year, Malzahn's youthful Tigers, which lost 14 players to the NFL from the previous season, faced navigated a schedule included 10 teams that advanced to postseason play. One of the most innovative offensive minds in football, Malzahn's high-powered offense has accounted for an average of 453.6 yards total offense and 34.3 points per game over two seasons.

Malzahn, 35-15 in four seasons as a head coach, has won or played for a conference title in six of his 10 seasons as a college coach, including winning a conference crown in three of the last six seasons with Auburn in 2010 and 2013 and Arkansas State in 2012. He became just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, joining LSU's Bernie Moore in 1935 and Ole Miss' John Vaught in 1947.

The 2013 Bear Bryant, Bobby Bowden, Eddie Robinson, Home Depot, Sporting News, SB Nation, Liberty Mutual and Associated Press National Coach of the Year, Malzahn earned SEC Coach of the Year honors after guiding Auburn to the biggest turnaround in SEC history.

He has produced 12 1,000-yard rushers in nine seasons as a college head coach/coordinator, at least one in each season, including Heisman Trophy finalist Tre Mason (1,816) and Nick Marshall (1,068) in 2013 and Cameron-Artis Payne (1,608) in 2014. Malzahn has also had five 1,000-yard receivers and three 3,000-yard passers. He has had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season three times: 2013 (Auburn), 2010 (Auburn) and 2006 (Arkansas). His 2007 Tulsa team had three 1,000-yard receivers.

In 2013, Auburn led the nation in rushing at 328.3 yards per game (the first SEC team ever to do so), and they have been the SEC's top rushing team over the last two years, averaging 293.2 yards a contest.

Auburn was just the second team in SEC history to gain more than 7,000 yards total offense in a season in 2013, finishing the year with 7,018 yards; the other was Texas A&M in 2012.

The Tigers set a school record with 48 rushing touchdowns in 2013 and set a school record against SEC opponents with 677 yards of total offense vs. No. 5 Missouri in the SEC Championship Game. The Tigers set SEC Championship Game team records for rushing 26 first downs, 74 rushing attempts, 545 rushing yards and seven rushing touchdowns.

Tre Mason, a Heisman Trophy finalist and SEC Player of the Year in 2013, ranked third in the nation with 23 touchdowns, was fifth nationally with 1,816 yards rushing, sixth with 10.7 points per game, sixth with 169.57 all-purpose yards per game and eighth with 129.7 rushing yards per game. Mason set the Auburn single-season record with 1,816 rushing yards and 2,374 all-purpose yards, is second with 317 rushing attempts. His 46 rushing attempts and 304 rushing yards vs. No. 5 Missouri set SEC Championship Game records and fell three yards shy of the Auburn record.

Four Auburn players were taken in the 2014 NFL Draft, including two first round picks; offensive tackle Greg Robinson No. 2 overall to the St. Louis Rams and defensive end Dee Ford No. 23 to the Kansas City Chiefs. Mason was a third round selection by the Rams while fullback Jay Prosch was a sixth round pick by the Houston Texans.

In his two seasons at Auburn, Malzahn has coached four All-Americans: running back Tre Mason and return specialist Chris Davis in 2013, center Reese Dismukes in 2014, and place kicker Daniel Carlson in 2015. Dismukes was also named the Rimington Award winner as the nation's top center in 2014 and Carlson was a Lou Groza Award finalist this season.



# Head Coach Gus Malzahn

Malzahn, who won the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach in 2010 while helping the Tigers to the national title, returned to Auburn after serving as the head coach at Arkansas State in 2012, where he led the program to the Sun Belt Conference title.

As offensive coordinator, Malzahn made an immediate impact during his tenure at Auburn, highlighted by a record-setting offense in 2010 when the Tigers finished 14-0 and claimed the school's first national title since 1957.

Malzahn's arrival in 2009 and style of offense marked a drastic turnaround from the 2008 season when Auburn struggled offensively. In a two-year period, the Tigers improved from a tie for 110th to seventh in the nation in scoring offense (from 17.3 to 41.2) and from 104th to seventh in total offense.

The 2010 Auburn offense set nine school records, while leading the SEC and finished in the top 10 nationally in six statistical categories. He coached Heisman Trophy winner Cam Newton, who had one of the best single-season performances at the position in college football history. Newton threw for 2,908 yards and 30 touchdowns, while rushing for 1,586 yards and 20 TDs. Newton, the No. 1 overall draft pick in the 2011 NFL Draft, also won the Davey O'Brien, Manning and Maxwell Awards.

During two seasons (2007-08) at Tulsa, Malzahn's offenses were among the nation's finest, ranking first nationally in total offense. Tulsa's offense in 2007 established nine team and 12 individual school records; the 2008 Tulsa offense averaged 569.9 yards per game and was second nationally averaging 47.2 points per games.

Malzahn spent one season at Arkansas as offensive coordinator, coaching Heisman Trophy runner-up Darren McFadden and helping the SEC West champion Razorbacks finish fourth nationally in rushing offense.

Malzahn's coaching career began in his home state of Arkansas at the high school level. In 14 seasons as a high school head coach, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame.

Malzahn is married to the former Kristi Otwell and they are the parents of two daughters, Kylie and Kenzie

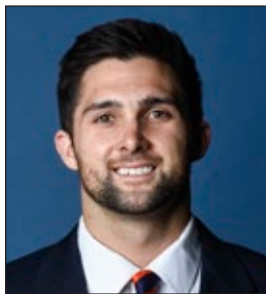

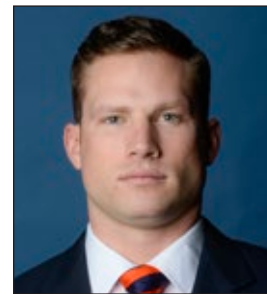

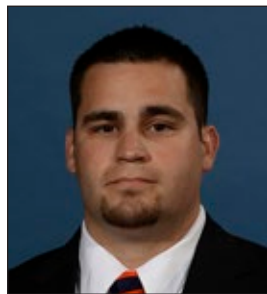

## Jay Gogue

*Auburn University President*

Jay Gogue's Auburn career started long before he was selected as the university's 18th president. The Waycross, Georgia, native earned Auburn bachelor's and master's degrees in horticulture before earning a doctorate in that field from Michigan State University.

Since returning as president in July 2007, Dr. Gogue has worked to improve the academic strength of Auburn's student body and encouraged research and outreach.

Under his leadership, Auburn is implementing a strategic plan focused on enhancing student success, supporting faculty excellence, strengthening public engagement, and promoting research, scholarship and creative work.

In addition to fulfilling duties as Auburn's president, Dr. Gogue enjoys maintaining a connection with students in the classroom. He teaches a graduate course in higher education administration where students learn university governance, leadership, budgeting and more.

Dr. Gogue was selected in 2013 for the Michigan State University Distinguished Alumni Award. In 2012, he was inducted into the Alabama Academy of Honor, a group of 100 Alabamians "chosen for accomplishment or service greatly benefiting or reflecting great credit on the State." He held a 2012 appointment to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's academic advisory council. Other memberships include Phi Kappa Phi and Golden Key honor societies, Sigma Xi scientific research society, and the National Society of Scabbard and Blade, the honorary military society for all branches of service.

He began his career at the U.S. Department of the Interior, where he worked for 12 years. Prior to returning to Auburn, he held a number of academic and administrative positions, starting at Texas A&M University as an assistant professor teaching and conducting research in plant science. Dr. Gogue later served as vice president for research and vice president/vice provost for agriculture and natural resources at Clemson University and as provost at Utah State University. He was selected as president of New Mexico State University in 2000. In 2003, he was named president of the University of Houston and chancellor of the University of Houston System.

Dr. and Mrs. Susie Gogue first met in the 8th grade. They married while both were Auburn undergraduates. They have three children, one grandchild and two dogs.



## Jay Jacobs

*Athletics Director*

As the steward of an elite athletics program, Jay Jacobs is acutely focused on serving the needs of Auburn's student-athletes and fans while enhancing and promoting the Auburn Athletics brand. Jay's steadfast commitment to the Auburn Family centers on academic excellence, athletic success, institutional compliance and control, the game day experience, facility upgrades, and donor support.

Under Jay Jacobs' leadership, Auburn University has consistently ranked in the top 10 percent of the NACDA Directors Cup and has claimed 11 national championships, including a school-record four titles in 2005-06. In 2010, the football program claimed the BCS National Championship while the 2013 football team won its third SEC championship in the past decade and advanced to the BCS National Championship Game for the second time in four years. Under Jacobs' watch, Auburn's athletics programs have captured 24 Conference titles.

Growing revenue from \$46 million to over \$120 million during Jacobs' tenure as AD has allowed for investment in numerous facility projects designed to benefit Auburn's student-athletes and their fans including the construction of the state-of-the-art Auburn Arena and basketball practice facility, a \$16 million multipurpose 100-yard indoor practice facility, and a new \$6 million Wellness Kitchen giving Auburn one of the finest dining facilities in the country.

Jacobs assumed the position of Auburn's 14th Director of Athletics in January 2005 after working in almost every area of the Auburn Athletics Department for the previous 20 years. Jacobs earned his undergraduate and master's degrees in business administration from Auburn in 1985 and 1988 respectively and is a graduate of the Harvard Business School Leadership Best Practices program. He was a member of the Auburn football team, earning two letters as an offensive tackle in 1982 and 1983. He is a member of the Auburn chapter of Phi Kappa Phi honorary. He currently serves as the Chair of the Southeastern Conference Athletics Directors and is a member of the NCAA Division I Strategic Vision and Planning Committee.

Jacobs is married to the former Angie Sapp of Dublin, Ga. The couple has three daughters, Haley, Meagan and Jayne. They are also foster parents.

Auburn led 24-0 in the third quarter before Louisville made it interesting, cutting its deficit to seven with 2:18 to play. The Tigers played keep-away from there.

The Tigers happily showed off their new defense early, setting up an early touchdown following an interception, scoring again on an 82-yard fumble return by Justin Garrett and generally frustrating offensive-minded Louisville until the second half.

Will Muschamp, the former Auburn defensive coordinator who returned to his former job last December, was a complement to Gus Malzahn's offense, Barber, quarterback Jeremy Johnson and receiver Ricardo Louis' offensive exploits.

Johnson threw for a touchdown and ran for another, Louis caught a touchdown pass and ran for another and Barber came off the bench, replacing the injured Roc Thomas, to break through the 100-yard barrier, gaining 95 of those in the second half when Auburn needed him most.

Auburn led 24-0 midway through the third quarter and everything seemed to be in fine shape.

The latter half of the game was more of a challenge, and losing defensive end Carl Lawson to an injury didn't help.

Lawson wasn't the only one who missed time after being hurt. Auburn played on.

The rebuild offensive line helped Auburn to 190 rushing yards.

Johnson hit 11-of-21 passes for 137 yards and a touchdown and three interceptions.

Auburn's defense showed the way this time in the first half, setting up a Johnson 1-yard touchdown run following a Tray Matthews interception on Louisville's first play; and Garrett's 82-yard fumble return to give the Tigers a 14-0 lead with 6:54 left in the second quarter.

That was the longest fumble return since at least 1969 when Auburn began recording that stat.

Daniel Carlson then hit a career-best 56-yard field goal to make 17-0 with 34 seconds left in the half. That was the longest Auburn field goal since 2003 when Philip Yost hit a 57-yarder and the third longest in school history.

A 33-yard Johnson-to-Ricardo Louis touchdown pass made it 24-0 with 11:21 in the third quarter. Louisville finally scored on a 33-yard John Wallace field goal with 7:07 left in the third, then made it 24-10 on a 10-yard run by Lamar Jackson.

Louis' 8-yard touchdown on an end around gave Auburn a 31-10 lead with 10:04 remaining in the game. The Cardinals scored to make it 31-17 with 6:21 remaining. Louisville cut it to 31-24, but didn't get the ball back.

Auburn went young early, starting true freshmen Chandler Cox and Tim Irvin. They were the first true freshmen to start on opening day since Reese Dismukes in 2011.

Auburn turned on college football's largest video board Saturday and showed a thriller.

Jeremy Johnson threw a 10-yard touchdown pass to Melvin Ray with 39 seconds left, and Peyton Barber scored on a 4-yard run in overtime as Auburn beat Jacksonville State 27-20 on a surprising Saturday in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn scored first in overtime and then turned away the Gamecocks.

It was more than a lot of Auburn fans expected, especially when Jacksonville State's Troymaine scored on a 5-yard touchdown run with 5:38 left to give the Gamecocks a 20-13 lead.

Johnson also threw a 51-yard touchdown pass to running back Roc Thomas for a 13-10 lead in the give-and-take game.

Auburn figures to get a tougher test, still, in next Saturday's game at LSU in its SEC opener.

The Tigers improved to 2-0. Jacksonville State fell to 1-1.

Barber came through at the end. He caught a 9-yard pass from Johnson in overtime, and then scored the game-winner on the next play.

Barber followed up his 115-yard rushing game in the opener with 125 more yards against Jacksonville State.

Johnson hit 21-of-32 passes for 236 yards and two touchdowns and two interceptions.

It was a tough start. Auburn didn't score a touchdown in the first half, and, indeed, trailed 10-6 at halftime.

Auburn's first-half scoring was limited to a pair of Daniel Carlson field goals, a 27-yarder and a 49-yarder. Jacksonville State got a 32-yard field goal from Connor Rouleau, and took the lead on an 11-yard touchdown pass from Eli Jenkins to Josh Barge with 5:31 left in the first half.

**GAME 3**

Auburn didn't have an answer for LSU running back Leonard Fournette, who trumped a comeback bid that started from way back Saturday in Tiger Stadium.

The big running back rushed for 228 yards and three touchdowns, and was the engine that carried LSU over Auburn 45-21.

Auburn quarterback Jeremy Johnson ran for a touchdown and threw for two more, but it wasn't enough to overcome LSU's 24-0 halftime advantage.

Auburn came out with some life to start the second half. Johnson raced 65 yards straight up the middle for a touchdown early in the third quarter. It was the longest TD run by an Auburn quarterback since Cam Newton scored on a 71-yard run in 2010.

But Fournette was strong early, going 29 yards for a touchdown to go over 200 yards on the day for a 31-7 lead with 10:56 left in the third quarter. Later, Johnson threw a 9-yard TD pass to Melvin Ray to cut it to 38-14 and then a 10-yard touchdown pass to Duke Williams.

Auburn fell to 2-1 overall and 0-1 in the SEC heading into next Saturday's home game against Mississippi State. LSU improved to 2-0 overall and 2-0 in the league.

Fournette didn't waste time letting his intentions known. He raced 71 yards on the first offensive play of the game and had 169 rushing yards by halftime. LSU led 24-0 by then behind Fournette and quarterback Brandon Harris, who had 63 rushing yards in the first half.

LSU had the ball 8½ more minutes in the first half.

Punter Kevin Phillips had four kicks of 50+ yards. Auburn had three defenders with double-figure tackles for the first time since 2012: Kris Frost, Johnathan Ford and Tré Williams.

**GAME 4**

Quarterback Sean White was steady in his first college game and the defense showed some moxie, but neither was enough to stop Mississippi State from beating Auburn 17-9 Saturday night in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

White, a redshirt freshman, was 20-of-28 for 188 yards passing and showed a willingness to run after being named Auburn's starting quarterback earlier in the week. The Tigers' defense kept Auburn close enough.

Auburn finished with more yards and first downs than State.

Peyton Barber had more than 100 yards rushing before the third quarter was done and finished with 137, his third 100-plus rushing game this season. Auburn wasn't afraid to mix in Roc Thomas and Kerryon Johnson, either.

The Tigers fell to 2-2. State improved to 3-1. Auburn will try to rebound next Saturday's homecoming game against San Jose State in a 3 p.m. game in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Carlson's 30-yard field goal cut State's lead to 14-3 with 9:41 left in the third quarter, and his 30-yarder made it 14-6 with 3:06 left in the quarter. Auburn was close to doing more. The Tigers had been inside the State 10 four times by then, but had only two field goals to show for it.

State's Westin Graves' 45-yard field goal made 17-6 with 1:11 left in the third quarter. Carlson's 51-yarder made it 17-9 with 1:07 left in the game.

Auburn's defense kept the game close in the first half in a bounce-back performance from the previous game at LSU, though State led 14-0 at the break. The Bulldogs rode the arm of Prescott to do it. He hit 16-of-20 passes for 180 yards and two touchdowns in the first half.

But White was steady in his own right in the first half, completing 9 of 10 passes for 92 yards.

The first half stats were close enough, with State holding a 200-180 edge in total yards. But Auburn was turned away early when White was intercepted near the end zone, and then the Tigers missed a short field goal in the final minute of the first half.

Defensive coordinator Will Muschamp called for a change of attitude, and drilled the point home with a different starting lineup, one that included two true freshmen starting in the secondary and different starting linebackers from the previous week.

State scored its first-half touchdowns on a 32-yard pass from Prescott to Gabe Myles and a 17-yard pass from Prescott to De'Runnya Wilson.

Sean White teamed up with Ricardo Louis for big plays, and Auburn rode a fast start and a good finish to beat Kentucky 30-27 Thursday night in Commonwealth Stadium.

White, confirmed as the starting quarterback only an hour before kickoff, hooked up with Louis early to help Auburn to a 23-10 halftime lead.

Louis had five catches for 114 yards in the first quarter, and seven in the game, and Daniel Carlson hit three field goals in the first half. Peyton Barber scored on two touchdown runs, including a big one on a 3-yard run with 7:56 remaining.

Auburn held Kentucky on fourth down with 25 seconds remaining.

Auburn improved to 4-2 overall and 1-2 in the Southeastern Conference. Kentucky fell to 4-2 overall and 2-2 in the league.

White completed 17 of 27 passes for a career-best 255 yards in his third college game.

"We had some explosive plays, really for the first time all year. We actually got into a rhythm," said coach Gus Malzahn. "We were very good on third downs in the first half."

Auburn converted eight of 11 third-down conversions in the first half, and finished making 11 of 18.

That fast start may have been the difference. White promptly led Auburn to two quick touchdowns. Austin MacGinnis kicked a 28-yard field goal for Kentucky to make it 17-10, but Carlson hit a 29-yard field goal to give Auburn a 20-10 lead with 1:43 left in the first quarter. Carlson hit a 52-yard field goal on the last play of the half.

His three 50-plus-yard field goals this year ties Auburn's single season record for field goals of 50 or more yards.

Auburn led 23-20 at the half, but Williams' 6-yard touchdown run cut Auburn's lead to 23-17 with 11:49 left in the third quarter.

McGinnis wasn't finished, either. He kicked a 31-yard field goal with 1:03 left in the third quarter to cut the Auburn lead to 23-20.

Comeback Auburn came back in the closing seconds to tie things up, but it was Arkansas that scored last to beat the Tigers 54-46 in a four-overtime thriller in Razorback Stadium on Saturday.

The Tigers, down by 14 points early and trailing by a touchdown going into the fourth quarter, tied the game with four seconds left in regulation on a Daniel Carlson's 41-yard field goal. Auburn took its first lead of the game in the first overtime. The teams traded touchdowns, and in some cases, 2-point conversions from there, before Auburn's last-ditch throw to the end zone fell incomplete.

"Our kids fought, and I think everybody saw that," said coach Gus Malzahn.

Malzahn left the game saying Auburn showed plenty of resolve, that the Tigers are better than when they started, and they'd practice hard to get ready for next week's home game against Ole Miss.

Quarterback Sean White was steady, completing 19 of 32 passes for 254 yards. Peyton Barber had four rushing touchdowns.

Auburn took a 46-38 lead in the third overtime when Barber scored his fourth touchdown, and White completed a 2-point conversion pass to Melvin Ray. Arkansas answered, scoring on a fourth-and-2 play and converting on a 2-point conversion pass.

Barber rushed for 120 yards to go along with his four touchdowns.

Auburn had a 96-yard drive, its longest of the season.

Jeremy Johnson, the former starter, came in to quarterback Auburn for one play, and scored on a 1-yard run to tie Arkansas in the fourth quarter. The Hogs went up by 3, then it was game on for everybody.

Jason Smith scored on a 9-yard run on his first-ever Auburn carry.

Auburn finished the first half and started the second half in strong fashion after a sleepy start for the 11 a.m. game. Both teams piled on the points in overtime.

Sean White's sore knee limited him in practice, but it didn't stop him from keeping Auburn in contention on game day before losing to Ole Miss 27-19 Saturday in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

White, who showed he was ready in pregame warmups, and threw his first college touchdown pass, a 47-yarder to Ricardo Louis, in short order. Daniel Carlson kicked four field goals for Auburn.

Auburn used a revolving door at quarterback to start the game, with White, Jeremy Johnson and Kerryon Johnson taking snaps. But it was White who had the big play to Louis for a 10-3 lead.

White played most of the way at quarterback, though Johnson had a long pass completion after lining up at receiver.

Auburn's defense showed some toughness, stopping Ole Miss on a fourth-and-1 at the 5 in the middle of the third quarter. Later, a Kris Frost interception set up an Auburn field goal. But the Rebels still came up with big offensive plays.

Ole Miss scored first in the second half on a Gary Wunderlich's 37-yard field goal for a 13-10 lead. Carlson hit a 23-yard field goal to make it 13-13, but the Rebels took a 20-13 lead when Chad Kelly threw a 45-yard touchdown pass to Derrick Jones.

It was Auburn's most complete game of the season.

Johnson, who started the first three games before being replaced by White, threw a touchdown pass to give Auburn a 7-3 lead, then watched Jovon Robinson score from the 1 for a 14-3 advantage with 13:40 left in the second quarter. Texas A&M would cut it to 20-10 late in the third quarter, but that was in the midst of a Daniel Carlson field goal parade. His third, early in the fourth quarter, put Auburn on top 23-10. Another one made it 26-10 midway through the fourth.

Auburn's defense turned away two A&M scoring threats with interceptions near the goal line in the tone-setting first half. The Tigers also stopped the Aggies on a fourth-and-1 at the Auburn 23. Jeremy Johnson threw a highlight reel touchdown pass to Jason Smith, but in a game of field goals, it wasn't enough to carry the day for Auburn at the Iron Bowl.

Alabama's Adam Griffith kicked five field goals and the Tide threw a touchdown pass of its own in the third quarter and added a touchdown late to beat Auburn 29-13 Saturday in the 80th renew of the rivalry.

The Johnson-to-Smith 77-yard touchdown pass was the stuff of the Prayer in Jordan-Hare win over Georgia, and Auburn's Kick Six win over Alabama in 2013. But while Smith made a great catch by tipping the ball to himself while running full speed, it didn't result in a win.

Auburn ended the regular season with a 6-6 record. Four of the losses were one-possession games, losing by eight or fewer points. The loss to Alabama was by double digits, thanks to a Tide touchdown with 26 seconds left.

It was a rebound for Griffith at Jordan-Hare Stadium. He missed a long field goal try on the last play of the 2013 Iron Bowl, the miss that Chris Davis turned into the Kick Six 109-yard return that beat Alabama on the final play.

This time, Griffith kicked four field goal in the first half for a 12-6 Alabama lead. He outdueled Auburn's Daniel Carlson, who hit two of his three tries.

Griffith hit field goals of 27, 40, 26 and 50 yards in the first half. Carlson ran his streak to 16 consecutive field goals when he hit field goals of 24 and 48 yards. He missed one after that.

Auburn fans cheered before the game upon seeing the return of Cam Newton, one of the stars of Auburn's 2010 Iron Bowl win. The fans cheered again when the big video board showed Davis' Kick Six return.

Alabama then benefited from two personal foul penalties on Auburn on one play, gaining those 30 yards without trying, setting up Griffith's final field goal, a 46-yarder. Alabama's final touchdown came on a Henry 25-yard run with 26 seconds left.

# Auburn Bowl History

## 1937 Bacardi Bowl

Auburn's bowl history began in 1937 when the Tigers and Villanova tied 7-7 in the Bacardi Bowl, sometimes referred to as the Rhumba Bowl or the Cigar Bowl, the climaxing event of Cuba's annual National

Sports Festival. The game was played in Havana, Cuba, and is the first and only bowl game to ever be played outside the United States.

An Auburn drive in the first quarter stalled on the 10-yard line where the Wildcats took over on downs. After a Villanova punt, Auburn back Billy Hitchcock broke loose around left end and rambled 40 yards for the Tigers only score. The score at the half was Auburn 7, Villanova 0.

Auburn stopped a Villanova drive on its own 12-yard line during the third quarter but couldn't get field position. Villanova was able to tie the score when they blocked an Auburn quick kick and the ball bounced into the endzone where Wildcat Lineman Matthews Kuber fell on it for the score. The PAT tied up the game.

Auburn's return to the States marked an end to more than 11,000 miles of football travel for the 7-2-2 Tigers that finished the season ranked 13th in the nation under coach Jack Meagher.

The game was played in a revolutionary atmosphere. Fulgencio Batista, the dictator who would be overthrown by Fidel Castro 22 years later, had just assumed power. The game was almost canceled because

## 1938 Orange Bowl

Southeastern Conference officials lifted a ban which forbade SEC teams to play postseason games in bowls other than the Rose and Sugar Bowls and allowed Auburn to play Michigan State in the Orange Bowl.

A capacity crowd of 19,000 fans watched an aggressive Auburn team defeat the powerful Spartans, 6-0 limiting Michigan State to only two first downs, the first coming late in the third quarter, and 57 total offensive yards, 32 yards rushing and 25 passing. Auburn racked up 233 yards on the ground and 79 through the air for 312 total yards.

Auburn's only score was set up by a George Kenmore 60-yard punt return that put the Tigers on the Spartan 36-yard line. On the first play from scrimmage Kenmore passed to Ralph O'Gwynne at the Spartan

two-yard line. On fourth and goal from the one, O'Gwynne circled left end for the only score of the game.

Coach Jack Meagher's Tigers finished the season with a 6-2-3 record.

In Auburn's first bowl appearance in 15 years, and first bowl game under Ralph "Shug" Jordan, the Tigers starting offensive backfield included a future Governor of Alabama (Fob James) and a future coach of the

University of Georgia (Vince Dooley), but Texas Tech was not impressed and handed the Tigers a 35-13 defeat.

Dooley guided Auburn to a touchdown the first time they had the ball as the Tigers went 60 yards in 10 plays, with James' 21-yard run being a key play in the drive. Bobby Duke scored from the one. A tough Auburn defense held the Red Raiders, the nation's highest scoring team, to just 11 yards in the first quarter. But it wasn't long before they would get on track.

Texas Tech scored early in the second period on a 30-yard pass from Jack Kirkpatrick to Bobby Cavazos. Auburn came back after an intercepted pass, and Dooley scored on a 10-yard run to end the drive. The Tigers led 13-7 at halftime, but it was all downhill from there.

Texas Tech scored the first two times they had the ball in the second half, once after blocking an Auburn punt, to lead at the end of three quarters, 21-13. Two touchdowns on two possessions in the fourth quarter made the final score read Texas Tech 35, Auburn 13.

Auburn became the first team to play in the same bowl game twice in the same year when they defeated Baylor 33-13 in the 1954 Gator Bowl. The Tigers had met Texas Tech in the Jan. 1, 1954, Gator Bowl, but then

Gator Bowl officials decided to move the game away from New Year's Day.

Baylor fumbled the opening kickoff, Auburn recovered and five plays later "Joltin Joe" Childress scored the first Auburn touchdown.

Baylor came back with a nine-play, 63-yard drive to tie the score at 7-7 at the end of the first quarter.

Auburn's two possessions of the second quarter resulted in a pair of touchdowns, a 43-yard run by Fob James and a four-yard Bobby Freeman to Jimmy Long pass which capped a 92-yard drive. Auburn led at the half, 21-7.

The Tigers scored twice in the second half, sandwiching their scores

around a five-play, 66-yard drive by the Bears. Childress capped an 87-yard Auburn drive with a three-yard run, and the Tigers ended the scoring with a three-play 67-yard drive to win going away, 33-13.

Childress was the game's MVP with 134 yards on 20 carries.

Auburn finished the season with an 8-3 record under Coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan.

## 1955 Gator Bowl

It was Auburn's third straight trip to the Gator Bowl and Vanderbilt's first bowl game ever, and that might tell the story of Auburn's 25-13 upset loss to the Commodores.

Vanderbilt scored first on a seven-yard Don Orr to Joe Stephenson pass which was set up by a Howell Tubbs fumble, the first of three for him that day, which gave the Commodores the ball on the Tigers' 39-yard line. Auburn scored early in the second quarter, driving 72 yards for the TD. Tubbs passed to Fob James for 38 yards and the touchdown. Vanderbilt scored quickly, going 76 yards in four plays as Orr scored from the three-yard line. The extra point was not good and the Commodores led at the half, 13-7.

Another Tubbs fumble set up Vanderbilt's first scoring drive of the second half. Recovering at the Auburn 45-yard line, Vanderbilt took eight plays to score with Phil King going over from the one, giving Vanderbilt a 19-7 lead. A poor punt and a 15-yard penalty gave the Commodores the ball on the Auburn 26-yard line after the Tigers were unable to move. On the first play of the fourth quarter, Charlie Horton scored from the Auburn one to give Vanderbilt a 25-7 lead. Auburn finished the scoring with a seven-yard Jimmy Cook to Red Phillips pass at the end of a six-play, 66-yard drive to make the final score 25-13.

Auburn fumbled five times with Vanderbilt recovering all five to set up the Tigers most disappointing loss of the 1955 campaign. The Tigers finished with an 8-2-1 record.

Joe Childress was voted Auburn's outstanding player.

## 1964 Orange Bowl

A trip to the Orange Bowl capped a near perfect season for the Auburn Tigers. Coach "Shug" Jordan led his Tigers to a 9-1 record with a rugged defense and an option offense featuring All-America quarterback

Jimmy Sidle and halfback Tucker Frederickson. Auburn had defeated Alabama 10-8 to earn the chance to play the Big Eight powerhouse Nebraska Cornhuskers.

Auburn found itself in the hole on the second play from scrimmage as Nebraska quarterback Dennis Claridge sneaked off right guard for a 68-yard touchdown gallop that left Auburn trailing 7-0 before most of the fans were seated. Two Dave Theissen field goals gave the Cornhuskers a 13-0 lead with over 10 minutes remaining in the first half. That is the lead the Nebraska team took in the locker room.

The "Jekyll and Hyde" Auburn team was as dominating in the second half as they were inept in the first half. Sidle led the resurgence of the Tigers by capping off their only scoring drive with a 13-yard run in the third quarter. With only 1:30 left in the game, the Tigers were on the Nebraska 10-yard line. But a costly motion penalty and an incomplete fourth down desperation pass sealed the Cornhusker victory.

Auburn dominated in the second half, combining for 110 rushing yards and 101 passing yards while limiting Nebraska to 43 yards on the ground and nine in the air.

Sidle finished the day with 96 yards rushing on 21 carries.

It was the Seventh Annual Liberty Bowl, but the first to be played in the present site of Memphis, Tenn., that saw the Ole Miss Rebels hold off a gallant Auburn comeback to win 13-7.

Ole Miss got the scoring started when Johnny Keyes connected on a 42-yard field goal in the first period. Auburn marched right back and scored when fullback Tom Bryan broke off left tackle and raced 44 yards for the touchdown. The score at halftime was Auburn 7, Ole Miss 3.

The Rebels took the opening kickoff and ran off nine consecutive rushing plays to march to the Tiger six-yard line. From there reserve quarterback Joe Graves went to the air and found wingback Doug Cunningham for a six-yard touchdown pass. The extra point gave Ole Miss a 10-7 lead. Keyes added another field goal to complete the scoring but not the action. Auburn marched deep into Rebel territory. But, with only seconds remaining, the Tigers' desperation fourth down pass fell incomplete, preserving the win for the Rebels.

The Tigers broke open a 10-10 halftime deadlock and exploded to a 31st Annual Sun Bowl win in El Paso, Texas.

Auburn jumped to a 10-0 lead early in the game behind a 65-yard scoring pass from quarterback Loran Carter to halfback Mickey Zofko and a 52-yard field goal by John Riley. Arizona came back with a touchdown pass and field goal of their own to tie the score as the players headed for the locker room at the half.

Auburn reserve quarterback Tommy Traylor scampered nine yards to open the second half scoring for the Tigers on their first possession of the half. Two plays later, Buddy McClinton picked off an errant Wildcat pass, one of three interceptions for McClinton, and raced

32 yards for another Auburn score. Riley added another field goal and Carter flipped a 43-yard touchdown pass to Tim Christian to complete the Tiger scoring.

The game's oddest play occurred when Auburn punter Connie Frederick had a punt blocked by Arizona. The Wildcats almost recovered the loose ball for a touchdown but Frederick managed to get to the ball first and was able to punt the ball a second time.

Auburn's defense combined for a Sun Bowl record of eight interceptions.

McClinton was named the game's Most Valuable Player while teammate David Campbell was named Most Valuable Lineman from his defensive tackle position.

Auburn played its first football game indoors losing to Houston 36-7 in the Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl.

Houston executed its veer offense to perfection and executed Auburn in the process. Behind the leadership of sophomore quarterback Gary Mullins, the Cougars piled up Astro-Bluebonnet records for rushing yards with 376 and total yards with 516.

Auburn's Terry Beasley, just a sophomore, fumbled the ball away at the Tiger 29-yard line on the opening kickoff. The Cougars covered those 29 yards in seven plays with Mullins sneaking over from the one-yard line.

Later, Houston capped an 80-yard drive with a Carlos Lopez 27-yard field goal to take a 10-0 lead early in the second quarter. A bowl record 57-yard punt by Auburn's Connie Frederick put Houston back at its own 16-yard line, but the Cougars stormed away with an 84-yard, five-play drive. Strong went 74 yards on the first play of the drive and scored the touchdown on fourth and goal from the one.

Auburn mounted its only scoring drive of the game, going 67 yards in five short plays in the second quarter. A 36-yard halfback pass from Mickey Zofko to Frederick finished the drive. The Tigers seemed to take the momentum into the locker room after blocking a Cougar 25-yard field goal attempt, late in the quarter.

This game was billed as the "Battle of the Quarterbacks," and it was that and more. Auburn had Pat Sullivan, heir apparent to the Heisman Trophy the next year, and Ole Miss had Archie Manning, one of the top QBs

in SEC history.

Auburn started off quickly as it was the familiar combination of Sullivan to Terry Beasley for a 13-yard scoring strike with just over three minutes gone in the game. Auburn scored twice more before Ole Miss could retaliate. Sullivan connected with Alvin Bresler for an eight-yard touchdown pass. On the first play from scrimmage after the kickoff, Auburn recovered a Rebel fumble and went up 21 points as Sullivan executed the quarterback draw for 37 yards and a touchdown.

Manning led a Rebel comeback by directing his team to a 79-yard, 10-play drive capping it off with a one-yard run. Manning later connected with Floyd Franks on a 34-yard touchdown pass to cut Auburn's lead to 21-14 at the half.

A 42-yard, Sullivan-to-Beasley pass set up Auburn's first score in the second half, as Mickey Zofko hit off right tackle for a six yard touchdown run early in the third quarter. Manning led his team back again with a 42-yard run to put the Rebels at the Auburn 23-yard line.

Auburn's final score came on a Larry Willingham 55-yard punt return with only nine seconds remaining in the third quarter, to take the Tigers to a 35-21 advantage.

Manning was again the key to the Rebels final score as he scrambled for a 37-yard gain to the Auburn 34. From there Chumbler went over from the one to cut the Tigers' lead to seven.

Auburn's long-dreamed-of, much-hoped-for trip to the Sugar Bowl turned into a nightmare as the Oklahoma Sooners, capitalizing on three first half turnovers, executed their wishbone offense to perfection in building up a 31-0 halftime lead before cruising back to Norman with a 40-22 win.

The Sooners took the opening kickoff 77 yards in 13 plays and ran off over six minutes on the clock as they scored their first touchdown of the day on a Leon Crosswhite four-yard run, giving Oklahoma a quick 6-0 lead. The option was working to perfection five minutes later as quarterback Jack Mildren kept the ball for a five-yard touchdown run. A 71-yard punt return for a touchdown by Joe Wylie following Auburn's next possession opened the flood gates. Mildren scored twice more before the half on runs of four and seven yards to complete the first half whitewash and head into the locker room with a 31-0 lead.

After a 53-yard field goal by the Sooners, Auburn finally got on the scoreboard when Harry Unger dove over right guard from the one yard line. Oklahoma again scored on the option, this time Greg Pruitt sweeping around the left side from two yards out to make the score 40-7.

Two Oklahoma fumbles set up the Tigers' last two scores as Sullivan connected with Sandy Cannon for an 11 yard touchdown pass and Unger again dove over from the one yard line. Final score, Oklahoma 40 - Auburn 22.

No one gave Auburn much of a chance in this, the 28th Annual Gator Bowl Classic. The Colorado Buffaloes were bigger, stronger and said to be quicker and meaner. Auburn lost its starting quarterback Randy Walls, to a knee injury at the start of the bowl practice and had to bring on virtually unknown and untested Wade Whatley to lead the offense. Those experts who didn't think Auburn had a chance just didn't know these Tigers. The Tigers were predicted to finish with a 2-9 record against the nation's toughest schedule. Instead they finished with a 10-1 record and earned the nickname "The Amazin's" because they never seemed to know the odds and they never admitted defeat. The Tigers defeated No. 2 ranked and unbeaten Alabama 17-16 after blocking two consecutive punts for touchdowns in the final minutes of the game. Coach "Shug" Jordan called "The Amazin's" his favorite team.

Gardner Jett opened the Tiger scoring in the Gator Bowl with a 27-yard field goal early in the second quarter of action. A Colorado fumble on the ensuing possession gave the ball to the Tigers on the Buffalo 16-yard line. Five plays later, Whatley slid over from the one for Auburn's first touchdown.

Auburn's second touchdown of the game came with just over six minutes to play in third quarter when the Tigers executed the halfback pass to perfection. Mike Fuller received the pitch from Whatley and connected with Rob Spivey for a 22-yard score capping a six-play, 56-yard drive. Colorado scored its only points of the game on a 33-yard Fred Lima field goal with 7:30 left to play in the game which ended an 80-yard 14-play drive.

The Tigers retaliated with a fake field goal that resulted in Auburn's final score. Holder Dave Beck took the snap, straightened up and threw to Dan Nugent for a 16-yard touchdown with one minute left to play to make the final score.

Missouri's defense kept Auburn's offense off balance from the opening kickoff and stormed away with a 34-17 win in the 39th Annual Sun Bowl.

Auburn was able to score first following a Missouri fumble which Auburn's Rusty Deen recovered at the Missouri 49. Auburn's seven play drive could only muster 30 yards and the Tigers settled for a 35-yard Roger Pruett field goal.

After an exchange of punts, Missouri recovered an Auburn fumble at the AU 35-yard line. One play later, Missouri had the lead as quarterback Chuck Link passed to John Kelsey for the TD.

Missouri scored again one minute later following another Auburn fumble. Ray Bybee scored on a two-yard run capping a three-play, 24-yard drive.

Missouri continued to move the ball, scoring on a 10 play 48-yard drive, with Ray Smith connecting with Kelsey from two yards for his second touchdown, and a 21-3 Missouri lead.

With 3:08 to play in the first half, Auburn started on its only real offensive threat of the game. Quarterback Phil Gargis passed to Thomas Gossom from 17 yards out. Only eight seconds remained in the half and Auburn had cut the lead to 21-10.

On the ensuing kickoff, Missouri's John Moseley took the ball 84 yards for the touchdown. Missouri went to the locker room with a comfortable 28-10.

Missouri opened the second half scoring on a five-play, 33-yard drive that began after recovering an Auburn fumble. Smith found Jim Sharp in the corner of the endzone on a 14-yard scoring strike to make Missouri's lead 34-10.

The Auburn Tigers made their sixth Gator Bowl appearance, and their third in five years, a success when they defeated the Darrell Royal-coached Texas Longhorns 27-3. Had not Auburn fumbled seven times, a

bowl record, the score might have been even more embarrassing as the Tigers dominated from the opening kickoff.

The Tigers stopped the Longhorns on the Texas four-yard line following the opening kickoff and Texas never seemed to recover. Auburn got its first chance with the ball at its 40-yard line and promptly drove 60 yards for its first touchdown. The drive was capped when quarterback Phil Gargis connected with Ed Butler for a seven-yard score.

A Longhorn fumble gave the Tigers the ball at the Texas 27. Two Mitzi Jackson runs covered the distance to the endzone as Auburn went up 14-0 with only nine minutes gone in the game.

Texas started a drive on their own 23-yard line. The Longhorns moved the ball to the Auburn 18-yard line, behind the running of freshman running back, Earl Campbell, before the drive sputtered. The Longhorns settled for a Billy Scott 35-yard field goal with 1:00 left to play in the first quarter and Auburn led 14-3.

When Texas tried to punt the ball away from inside their own 10-yard line, Auburn's Jim McKinney blocked the punt out of the endzone for a safety.

Auburn scored its final points in the fourth quarter. Gargis passed to Butler for 14 yards and a touchdown for one score. The Tiger 29-yard drive was set up by a Mike Fuller interception of a Texas pass. Gargis passed to Dan Nugent for the two-point conversion. Chris Wilson kicked a 28 yard field goal with 0:09 showing on the game clock.

The Auburn Tigers, 8-3 on the year and yearning for national recognition, defeated Boston College 33-26 before a sellout crowd of 51,296 in the Tangerine Bowl. The Tigers faced one of the nation's best passers in BC

quarterback Doug Flutie, but in the end it was Auburn, not Boston College, who lived by the pass. Auburn QB Randy Campbell was named the game's Most Valuable Player, narrowly edging teammates Lionel James who gained 101 yards on 18 carries, and Mark Dorminey, who intercepted one of Flutie's passes and was the game's most valuable defensive player. The Tigers traveled by land as well as air. Ten Auburn backs carried the football, with James' 101 yards and Bo Jackson's two touchdowns leading the way. In all, Auburn gained 490 yards against BC; 313 rushing, 177 passing. Auburn led 23-10 at the half and stretched the lead to 33-10 before Boston College mounted a comeback against Auburn reserves. The Eagles scored on the last play of the game for the 33-26 final.

Al Del Greco's 19-yard field goal with 23 seconds remaining in the game gave Auburn a hard fought 9-7 win over Michigan and its first Sugar Bowl Championship.

It was Del Greco's third field goal of the night as the Coral Gables, Fla., senior accounted for all of Auburn's scoring. In addition to the game winner, Del Greco had kicks of 31 and 32 yards.

Auburn's Bo Jackson was the game's leading rusher, gaining 130 yards on 22 carries. Jackson, closing out a brilliant sophomore season which saw him become a consensus All-American, was named winner of the Miller-Digby Trophy as the game's outstanding player.

Auburn's winning drive covered 60 yards in 16 plays. The Tigers took possession on their own 39 with 7:44 left in the game. The ball was on the Michigan one when Auburn elected to kick the field goal

rather than go for a touchdown on fourth and one.

Coach Pat Dye's Tigers finished with an 11-1 record, the SEC Championship, and a third place national ranking in the AP, UPI and USA Today polls. The New York Times computer poll ranked the Tigers No. 1 based on results and schedule difficulty. Auburn's 1984 opponents averaged winning 70 percent of their games, not counting the games with Auburn.

Auburn took its 8-3 regular season record to Dallas, Texas, to face SWC Champion Texas A&M in the 50th annual Cotton Bowl Classic. The bowl marked the fourth-consecutive bowl game for the Tigers and the

fulfillment of a commitment by the players to play in a New Year's Day contest.

Heisman Trophy winner Bo Jackson's five-yard touchdown burst early in the first quarter gave the Tigers an early 7-0 lead, but two score by the Aggies gave A&M the lead, 12-7, at the end of the first period.

With 8:28 remaining in the first half, Jackson took a pass from QB Pat Washington and raced 73 yards for a touchdown to again give Auburn the lead 13-12. But a 26-yard field goal by Aggie PK Scott Slater with 50 seconds remaining in the half would give Texas A&M the lead for good.

Auburn's January 1 date with Southern California in Orlando's Citrus Bowl marked the fifth consecutive bowl game for the Tigers, the third New Year's Day Bowl.

The Tigers' 9-2 regular season had left them one victory shy of becoming only the fifth team in Auburn history to win 10 games in a single season. Auburn's all-time football record stood at 499 victories. A 16-7 triumph over USC, the nation's winningest bowl team, gave the Tigers their 10-2 record and the 500th all-time Auburn win.

USC was the first on the scoreboard when linebacker Marcus Cotton intercepted a Jeff Burger pass and returned it 24 yards for a Trojan touchdown. But that would be the only points USC would score the rest of the day.

In the second period, the Tigers culminated an 80-yard drive with Burger hitting tight end Walter Reeves with a three-yard touchdown pass. With 1:30 remaining in the first half, All-America tailback Brent Fullwood ran in from four yards out for a score. PK Chris Knapp kicked his second PAT of the quarter to give Auburn a 14-7 lead.

With 4:48 left, OLB Aundray Bruce hit USC QB Rodney Peete in the backfield, causing a fumble which was recovered by a teammate, Nate Hill on the Auburn 48-yard line.

The Auburn defense held strong throughout the second half. In the fourth quarter, Auburn DT Tracy Rocker dropped Peete for a 13-yard sack and a safety, making the score 16-7.

Bruce, who recorded three QB sacks and caused a fumble which set up an Auburn scoring drive, was voted the overall Citrus Bowl MVP.

Auburn finished the season ranked sixth in the nation in the final AP poll and eighth in the UPI rankings.

A 9-1-1 regular-season record and the 1987 Southeastern Conference championship earned the Tigers a trip to New Orleans and a January 1 date with unbeaten Syracuse in the USF&G Sugar Bowl.

Sophomore place-kicker Win Lyle's 30-yard field goal with one second remaining in the game gave the Sugar Bowl the first tie in its 54-year history, a 16-16 deadlock.

The game that matched the best of the South against the best of the East — the sixth-ranked Tigers and the fourth-ranked Orangemen. Auburn's first touchdown was set up on a 58-yard flanker reverse pass from wide receiver Duke Donaldson to wide receiver Lawyer Tillman. With 5:45 remaining in the first quarter, quarterback Jeff Burger hit

Tillman for a 17-yard score.

The Tigers held a 10-7 lead at halftime, but the Orangemen tied it at 10-10 by the end of the third quarter. Syracuse place-kicker Tim Vesling booted field goals of 32 and 38 yards in the fourth quarter while Auburn's Lyle was good on tries of 41 and 30 yards, the final kick tying the game for good.

Tillman, the game's leading receiver with six catches for 125 yards, was named the game's offensive MVP by ABC-TV.

The trip to New Orleans was Auburn's fourth New Year's Day bowl game in five years.

White's game-winning touchdown was his second of the day as the Tigers finished the 1990 season 8-3-1. For his efforts the freshman was named the Offensive MVP of the game. Auburn linebacker Darrel Crawford was named the Defensive MVP as the Tigers limited Indiana to just 220 yards total offense.

Auburn opened the scoring with White's first touchdown of the day, a six-yard run with 3:37 to play in the first quarter. Indiana tied the game at 7-7 on the final play of the first period when Trent Green scored from three yards out.

Auburn scored on an 11-yard

White to Alex Smith pass and tacked on a 26-yard Jim Von Wyl field goal to take a 17-10 lead into the half.

Following a scoreless third period, the Hoosiers took a 23-17 lead into the game's final minutes on the strength of two more touchdown runs by Green. Green's third touchdown of the day came with just 2:27 to play.

White and receiver Herbert Casey converted on a pair of critical third down situations on Auburn's final drive of the game to set up White's game winner in the last bowl game Auburn would play with Pat Dye as head coach.

Auburn took possession deep in its own territory with 1:43 remaining in the half. On third down with 19 seconds left, Nix, on the run, threw an ill-advised pass down the sideline that fell into the hands of free safety Kim Herring.

Penn State quickly went to work. Richardson completed a 43-yard pass down the left sideline to Joe Jurevicius at the Auburn eight. With five seconds left, Richardson found running back Mike Archie over the middle for a score.

The Nittany Lions scored on all four possessions in the third quarter. In the first drive, Richardson capped an eighty-yard effort with a nine-yard strike to Engram.

Midway through the fourth, following a Penn State fumble, Auburn mounted a 43-yard scoring drive. Fullback Kevin McLeod raced up the middle for a touchdown and a final margin of 43-14.

In winning its first bowl game in six years, Auburn utilized the talents of quarterback Dameyune Craig. Craig threw for an Independence and Auburn bowl record 370 yards while rushing for 75 more in earning Offensive MVP honors.

Craig led Auburn to the game's first 20 points, throwing touchdown strikes to Tyrone Goodson (30 yards) and Willie Gosha (seven yards) and setting up a pair of Jaret Holmes field goals.

Auburn built its lead to 32-7 in the third quarter on a 33-yard scramble by Craig and an 18-yard burst by Rusty Williams. Two-point attempts after both scores failed.

Army made a valiant comeback in the fourth quarter as Demetrius Perry and Bobby Williams both scored touchdowns to cut Auburn's lead to 32-21 with 5:52 left. Cadet quarterback Ronnie McAda then found Rod Richardson on a 30-yard catch-and-run for another touchdown with 1:27 remaining. Williams' two-point run made the score 32-29.

After recovering the ensuing on-side kick and moving the ball to Auburn's 10, Army tried the 27-yard field goal attempt by Parker on third down.

Auburn trailed 17-6 entering the final stanza, but cut the lead to 17-12 on Dameyune Craig's 22-yard scramble early in the quarter.

Five minutes later, Rusty Williams put the Tigers ahead to stay, 18-17, with a seven-yard run. Jaret Holmes added a 22-yard field goal, his third of the day, with 4:11 left.

Auburn's defense dominated the game, holding Clemson under 100 yards in both rushing (60) and passing (86) and to just 146 yards total.

Auburn held Clemson to just four first downs and had just one of 14 third-down attempts converted against it.

Holmes' career-long 52-yard field goal gave Auburn a 3-0 with 9:49 left in the first quarter. But Clemson took the lead midway through the second quarter after blocking a Holmes' punt. Chad Speck returned the block 18 yards for a touchdown and a 7-3 Clemson lead.

Auburn trimmed the lead to 7-6 with a 24-yard Holmes field goal before halftime, but another blocked punt set up another Clemson touchdown with 5:15 left in the third.

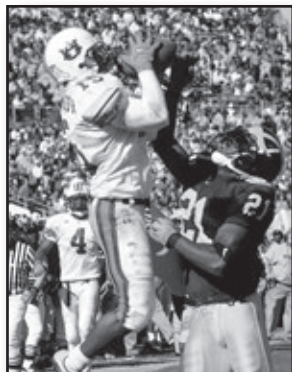

The 20th-ranked Auburn Tigers made a late fourth quarter charge, but fell short, losing to 17th-ranked Michigan Wolverines, 31-28, in the Capital One Florida Citrus Bowl.

The Tigers utilized the arm of senior quarterback Ben Leard who set two Auburn bowl records by throwing for 394 yards and three touchdowns. Answering a first quarter 31-yard Wolverine touchdown pass from Drew Henson to David Terrell, Leard threw his first of touchdown to Ronney Daniels in the second quarter to tie the game at 7-7.

Auburn took the lead as Leard hit senior Clifton Robinson on a 20-yard touchdown with 11:04 before the half. But, Henson connected on a four-yard pass to B.J. Askew to tie the game at 14-14. Michigan regained the lead on an 11-yard scamper from Anthony Thomas to end the first half at 21-14.

Michigan built its lead to 28-14 in the third quarter as Thomas, named the game's MVP, entered the endzone on a 25-yard burst,

Dome in Atlanta.

In the first quarter, North Carolina recovered a fumble and returned it 18 yards to the Tiger 10-yard line. Two plays later, North Carolina tailback Willie Parker took the ball off right end for the UNC touchdown.

The only other score in the half came when the Tar Heels drove the ball 84 yards resulting in a field goal by kicker Jeff Reed.

North Carolina came out of halftime and added to their lead as Peach Bowl Offensive MVP QB Ronald Curry scrambled 62 yards for a touchdown putting UNC ahead 16-0.

The Auburn defense responded well, not allowing any more points for the rest of the game and treated football fans to a play that will be remembered in Auburn football history.

An errant Darian Durant pass was snatched out of the air by whip Carlos Dansby as he was falling out of bounds. Dansby then tossed the ball to linebacker Dontarrious Thomas to complete an amazing interception. The play was later nominated for the ESPY Awards' "Most Spectacular Play" of the year.

The Auburn offense, feeding off the momentum from the interception, moved the ball down the field. Jason Cambell connected with Casinious Moore on an 11-yard pass that set up Damon Duval's 34-yard field goal with 13:16 left in the game.

After recovering a muffed snap late in the fourth quarter, backup QB Daniel Cobb connected with tight end Lorenzo Diamond, who rumbled 12 yards for an Auburn touchdown, pulling the Tigers within six points.

North Carolina recovered the ensuing onside kick to hold on for the 16-10 win.

On a warm and windy day in Orlando, the 19th-ranked Auburn Tigers knocked off 10th-ranked Penn State behind a stymieing defense and Capital One Bowl MVP Ronnie Brown's 184 yard, two touchdown

performance. Penn State's Larry Johnson, who finished third in the Heisman Trophy balloting, was unable to get on track as Auburn's defense limited him to only 72 yards on 20 carries.

Auburn fumbled on its first possession giving Penn State the ball on the 15-yard line, but the Nittany Lions were forced to settle for a 21-yard Robbie Gould field goal.

The Auburn defense held the Nittany Lion's offense the rest of the half, allowing only a 27-yard field goal by Gould.

After a sluggish first half, the Tigers came out in the third quarter with a run-dominated offensive scheme and Ronnie Brown punished the Penn State defenders to the tune of 119 second half yards.

Auburn took its first possession of the second half and marched 74 yards, scoring on a one-yard Brown touchdown run, which put Auburn ahead, 7-6. The fast Tiger defense took control, allowing Penn State only 31 yards of offense in the third quarter.

Penn State replaced quarterback Zack Mills with Michael Robinson who sparked the Nittany Lion offense to a fourth quarter field goal, putting Penn State up 9-7.

On Auburn's next possession, Damon Duval's punt was downed at the one-yard line pinning Penn State deep in their own territory.

After a short punt by Penn State, Auburn drove the ball inside the red zone, where Ronnie Brown bounced a run to the outside taking it 17 yards for the game winning touchdown.

Brown's 184 yards rushing were the most ever by an Auburn player in a bowl, and it was the most yards rushing of anyone in the 2003 bowl season. Dontarrious Thomas was named the game's defensive MVP after helping hold Penn State to just 268 yards.

After a scoreless first period, Wisconsin started the second quarter by driving to the Auburn seven-yard line where the Badgers had a first and goal, but Auburn's defense forced Wisconsin to settle for a 20-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead.

Auburn responded on the next drive as Ronnie Brown gained 43 yards on six carries culminating with a one-yard touchdown to give the Tigers a 7-3 lead. Wisconsin managed another field goal before the half to make the score 7-6 at the intermission.

Auburn struck first in the second half, going 80 yards on 16 plays and taking 7:16 off the clock. Carnell Williams finished the drive with a one-yard plunge up the middle for the touchdown.

In the fourth quarter, Jim Sorgi led Wisconsin on a 52-yard drive, capping it with a 12-yard pass to Lee Evans for a touchdown and a two-point conversion pass to tie the game at 14.

The Badgers seemed to have the momentum in their favor until Carlos Rogers deflected a pass that Will Herring intercepted on the Auburn 13-yard line. It took Auburn just three more plays to put it in the end zone as Brown scored for the second time from two yards out.

Auburn put an exclamation point on the game during the ensuing Wisconsin drive when Reggie Torbor and Karlos Dansby sandwiched Sorgi, causing a fumble. T.J. Jackson recovered it, and two plays later Auburn put the final points on the board with a one-yard run by Williams to make the score 28-14.

Campbell passed for 138 yards, rushed for 67 yards and engineered two fourth-quarter scoring drives. Auburn's defense held Wisconsin to 261 yards. Torbor collected 2.5 sacks and Dansby totaled a team-high 10 tackles including 1.5 sacks.

Auburn completed a perfect season as the No. 3 Tigers held off a late Virginia Tech rally for a 16-13 victory in the NOKIA Sugar Bowl at the Louisiana Superdome. The win improved the Tigers' record to 13-0

and ensured the first 13-win season in school history.

Auburn, just the seventh team to go undefeated in league play since the Southeastern Conference went to divisional play in 1992, jumped out to a 16-0 lead in the first three quarters before the Hokies got on the board. Two late fourth-quarter scores allowed Virginia Tech back into the game, but an onside kick with two minutes left was recovered by the Tigers.

Jason Campbell, voted the NOKIA Sugar Bowl's Most Valuable Player, threw for 189 yards on 11-of-16 passing and one score. Campbell, who played his last game in an Auburn uniform, connected with Devin Aromashodu on a 5-yard touchdown pass late in the third quarter, giving the Tigers a 16-0 advantage.

The tandem of senior running backs Ronnie Brown and Carnell Williams rushed for 68 and 61 yards, respectively.

Placekicker John Vaughn connected on three field goals in the first half from 23, 19 and 24 yards to send the Tigers to a 9-0 lead entering halftime. The three field goals tied an Auburn record in a bowl game, last set by Jaret Holmes at the 1998 Peach Bowl.

After Campbell connected with Aromashodu for a 16-0

AU lead, Virginia Tech's Josh Morgan found the end zone twice -- the first on a 29-yard reception from Bryan Randall and the second on an 80-yarder with two minutes to play.

The win gave Auburn three straight bowl game victories, a first for the school since 1982-84. It also sent Auburn to its 15th straight victory dating back to the 2003 season, the program's longest since 1993-94 and second longest streak in school history. The 15 consecutive wins gave the Tigers national prominence as the third-longest in the nation at the end of the season, trailing only Southern California and Utah.

Brian Calhoun rushed for 213 yards and one touchdown and John Stocco passed for 301 yards and two scores as Wisconsin defeated Auburn, 24-10, in the 2006 Capital One Bowl. The loss snapped Auburn's three-game bowl

winning streak.

Wisconsin took a 17-0 lead into halftime, but the Tigers scored 10 straight points to pull within 17-10 early in the fourth quarter. Brandon Cox found Courtney Taylor for a 9-yard score at the 14:49 mark of the fourth to pull Auburn within seven.

However, Calhoun rushed for a 33-yard touchdown less than two minutes later, giving the Badgers the final 24-10 outcome.

Cox finished 15-of-33 for 137 yards and one touchdown, while Kenny Irons rushed for 88 yards -- giving him 1,293 on the season - the sixth-best single-season mark in Auburn history.

Ben Obomanu ended his Auburn career with five receptions for 62 yards. His senior counterpart, Anthony Mix, caught two passes for 11 yards, giving him 1,010 yards in his career.

Wisconsin opened the game's scoring when Stocco found Brandon Williams on a 30-yard reception at the 7:55 mark of the first quarter.

UW's Taylor Mehlhaff connected on his only field goal of the day, a 19-yarder, at the end of the first quarter, then watched as Stocco found

Owen Daniels for a 13-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter.

John Vaughn connected on a 19-yard field goal, his 12th of the season, in the third quarter to put Auburn on the board.

Defensively, David Irons led the Tigers with 11 tackles.

Senior Wayne Dickens posted his second multiple-sack game of the season, finishing with two, while Stanley McClover had one.

## 2007 AT&T Cotton Bowl Classic

John Vaughn's 42-yard field goal in the third quarter proved to be the game winner as Auburn took the 71st AT&T Cotton Bowl Classic with a 17-14 victory over Nebraska in Dallas.

Vaughn connected on his 20th field goal of the season at the 6:20 mark of the third quarter, the game's only points of the second half, to give Auburn its 11th win of the season for the fourth time in school history.

The Auburn defense was stout against Nebraska, limiting the Cornhuskers to just 230 yards of total offense, including 73 in the second half. Karibi Dede began the defense's dominance in the first half, intercepting a Zac Taylor pass and returning it 52 yards to the Nebraska 9-yard line.

Just two plays later, the Auburn offense punched it in the end zone when Brandon Cox found Carl Stewart for a 9-yard score with 56 seconds remaining in the first quarter, evening the score at 7.

Early in the second quarter, the Tigers recovered a fumble at the Cornhuskers' 14 on a failed fake punt attempt. Four plays later, Stewart scored his second TD on a 1-yard run.

After Vaughn's third quarter field goal, the Huskers managed to get in Auburn territory just twice. They punted from Auburn's 34 in the third quarter, and Taylor threw a fourth-down incompleteness from Auburn's 30 late in the fourth quarter.

The Tiger defense finished with two sacks and 11 tackles for loss, highlighted by Sen'Derrick Marks' 2.5. Will Herring finished with seven solo tackles, including two for loss, and was named the game's outstanding defensive player.

Cox finished the game 10-of-21 passing for 111 yards and one score. Of those 10 completions, six were to Courtney Taylor, who, on his fourth catch of the game, broke the Auburn school record for most receptions in a career. He finished with 153.

Kenny Irons paced the Tiger rushing game with 72 yards on 24 carries.

Nebraska started the game's scoring on a Nate Swift 13-yard touchdown reception from Taylor at the 7:37 mark of the first quarter.

With Auburn up 14-7 after Stewart's second quarter touchdown run, Brandon Jackson scored from 20 yards out to cap a 7-play, 72-yard drive that sent the teams into halftime tied at 14.

The win improved Auburn to 18-13-2 all-time in bowl games and 4-3 under head coach Tommy Tuberville.

Kodi Burns scored on a 7-yard run in overtime to lift No. 22 Auburn to a 23-20 victory over No. 15 Clemson in the first overtime game in Auburn's bowl history.

Burns' score put the finishing touches on a performance that saw the Tigers record season highs in plays and yards with a spread offense. Auburn ran 90 plays for 423 yards, including 47 rushes and a season-high 43 passes.

Auburn scored first in a low-scoring first half, following a three-and-out by Clemson on the opening possession with an 11-play, 58-yard drive that culminated in Wes Byrum's 36-yard field goal.

After managing just 52 yards of offense in the first quarter, Clemson's C.J. Spiller raced 83 yards down the left sideline to give Clemson a 7-3 lead.

Auburn took the opening kickoff in the second half and marched 78 yards on 10 plays as Burns hit Mario Fannin with a 22-yard pass to give Auburn a 10-7 lead.

Clemson finished an 11-play drive with a 22-yard field goal on the first play of the fourth quarter, knotting the score at 10-10.

After Cox was intercepted, Clemson quickly drove 32 yards for the go-ahead score when James Davis plunged in from a yard out with 11:24 remaining.

Auburn answered right back, again mixing Cox and Burns in the backfield successfully during an 11-play, 70-yard drive. Cox's 18-yard pass to Robert Dunn and a 15-yard rush by Burns set up Ben Tate for a 1-yard run that tied the score at 17-17 with 8:27 left.

In overtime, Clemson settled for a 25-yard field goal on its first possession.

On Auburn's overtime possession, Cox found Rod Smith for 12 yards on 3rd-and-13, then snuck ahead for 2 yards and the first down. Two plays later, Burns powered in for the score, sending the Auburn sideline into a frenzy.

Cox connected on 25-of-39 passes for 211 yards in his final game for Auburn.

The Auburn defense, led by defensive MVP Pat Sims, held Clemson to just 293 yards of offense and 12 first downs.

Neiko Thorpe tackled Zeke Markshausen at the Auburn 2-yard line on a fake field goal attempt from the 5-yard line to preserve Auburn's 38-35 overtime victory over Northwestern after Wes Byrum's 21-yard field goal gave the Tigers the lead.

With the score tied 21-21, Ben Tate rushed for two touchdowns in the first eight minutes of the fourth quarter. The first came from 5 yards out with 10:10 left and the second was a 7-yard run that seemed to put the Tigers in control, 35-21 with 7:32 left.

Northwestern closed to 35-27 on a 2-yard Kafka touchdown run with 3:20 remaining but the PAT was blocked by Antonio Coleman. With Auburn trying to run out the clock, Brad Phillips forced a Tate fumble at the Northwestern 31 with 3:11 to play. The Wildcats then drove 69 yards to score on a 18-yard touchdown pass from Kafka to Sidney Stewart with 1:15 to play and a tied the game on a successful two-point conversion.

Auburn's Demond Washington returned the ensuing kickoff to midfield before he fumbled, giving the ball back to the Wildcats with 1:03 to play. Northwestern then drove to the Auburn 26 where Demos missed a potential game-winning 44-yard field goal as time expired.

Auburn's defense picked off five Northwestern passes, with Walter McFadden and T'Sharvarn Bell collecting two each and Thorpe one. McFadden's two interceptions came on Northwestern's first two drives and helped stake Auburn to an early 14-0 lead. His second interception was returned 100 yards for a touchdown.

Auburn took a 21-7 lead on a 46-yard Chris Todd pass to Quindarius Carr with 8:54 to go in the half. Northwestern drove the ball 90 yards from its own 6-yard line late in the half before Kafka threw his third interception, as Bell picked him off in the end zone with 29 seconds remaining.

Northwestern closed to within 21-14 on a 35-yard touchdown pass on another Kafka to Brewer hookup with 2:42 remaining in the third. On their next play from scrimmage, Drake Dunsmore scored on a 66-yard pass from Kafka to tie the score.

Darvin Adams was named the Outback Bowl MVP after grabbing an Outback Bowl record-tying 12 receptions for a career-high 142 yards.

Twenty-one Outback Bowl records were broken and 11 more tied during the game. The Wildcats' 115 total plays broke an NCAA record, as did the 98 plays for Kafka (78 passes, 20 rushes). The teams combined for Outback Bowl records of 73 points, 1046 yards of offense and 187 plays from scrimmage.

## 2011 BCS National Championship

Wes Byrum kicked the sixth and biggest game-winning field goal of his career on the last play of the game from 19 yards to give No. 1 Auburn a 22-19 victory over Oregon in the BCS National Championship Game. It was Auburn's second national title in history and ninth comeback win in 14 games

during the 2010 season.

After Oregon had tied the score at 19 with a touchdown and two point conversion with 2:33 to go, the biggest drive in Auburn history began at its own 25-yard line. After a 15-yard pass from Cam Newton to Emory Blake, Michael Dyer, who was named the Offensive Player of the Game after rushing for 143 yards on 22 carries, looked to be tackled after a short gain, but was never down while laying on top of an Oregon defender, and he bounced up to complete a 37-yard run to the Oregon 23.

After short gains by Dyer and Newton, Dyer followed with a 16-yard gain up the middle to the 1 with 10 seconds remaining. One play later, Byrum provided the final heroics.

Oregon scored on the second play of the second quarter on a 26-yard field goal by Rob Beard for the first points of the game. On Auburn's next possession, Newton threw a 35-yard touchdown pass to Kodi Burns for a 7-3 Auburn lead.

Oregon responded after taking over at the Duck 7 as Thomas threw an 81-yard pass on first down to Meahl, then found James on an 8-yard TD pass. A 2-point conversion run by kicker Rob Beard on a fake gave Oregon an 11-7 lead.

The Tigers then drove to the Oregon 1, but Newton's fourth-down pass to Eric Smith fell incomplete. On first down, Mike Blanc tackled James in the end zone for a safety to draw the Tigers to within 11-9 with 3:26 left in the half.

After Oregon kicked off following the safety, Auburn quickly covered 66 yards in six plays, capped by a Newton to Blake 30-yard touchdown pass to give the Tigers a 16-11 lead at the half.

On the opening drive of the second half, Wes Byrum kicked a 28-yard field goal to give Auburn a 19-11 lead.

Oregon then reached a first-and-goal on the Auburn 3, but the Tigers held the Ducks for four plays, capped by a stop on fourth and goal from the 1 as Mike McNeil and Nick Fairley hit Kenjon Barner just shy of the goal line. Fairley was named the Defensive Player of the Game after recording five tackles, including three for losses and one sack, while also forcing a fumble.

Auburn ran a season-high and BCS Championship Game record 85 plays. The Tigers outgained the Ducks 519 yards to 449 as Newton was 20-of-34 for 265 yards and two touchdowns. He also rushed for 64 yards on 22 carries.

Offensive MVP Onterio McCalebb rushed for a season-high 109 yards and had 180 all-purpose yards, Emory Blake caught six passes for a career-high tying 108 yards and Barrett Trotter came off the bench to throw for 175 yards and one touchdown to lead Auburn to a 43-24 victory over Virginia in the Chick-fil-A Bowl in the Georgia Dome

on Dec. 31.

Trotter completed 11-of-18 passes after he and Kiehl Frazier came in for injured starter Clint Moseley in the first quarter. Frazier had 16 carries for 55 yards and became the ninth Tiger to score two touchdowns in a bowl game. Tre Mason gained 64 yards on nine carries and had his first career rushing touchdown.

Auburn used a big second quarter as it scored 21 consecutive points to take control of the game, 28-14. After Virginia took a 14-7 lead, Auburn quickly answered as McCalebb ran it in from three yards out on third down to tie it 14-14 with 10:33 left in the half.

Then, Parkey successfully recovered his onside kick at the Auburn 41 as the Tigers went on to take the lead for good, 21-14, on Frazier's 1-yard third down run with 8:44 left. Trotter completed a 50-yard pass to Blake to the Virginia 5. Auburn's 14 consecutive points came on 11 plays and 144 yards in 4:08.

On the ensuing possession, Chris Davis snuffed out a Virginia fake field goal after Eltoro Freeman broke up a Cavalier pass in the end zone the play before. Auburn scored a touchdown on its third-straight possession as Trotter completed a 29-yard touchdown pass to McCalebb with 59 seconds left in the half to give Auburn a 28-14 lead.

Virginia scored first, but walk-on Garrett Harper stepped up to help the Tigers even the score on the next possession. Harper blocked the first punt of his career as Auburn took over on the Virginia 15. The Tigers tied it 7-7 as Frazier scored on a 3-yard touchdown run up the middle with 4:02 left in the opening quarter. McCalebb set it up with a 12-yard run the play before.

Mason scored his first career rushing touchdown to open the third quarter with a 22-yarder to put Auburn up 35-17 almost four minutes in.

Virginia scored with 6:20 left in the third, cutting the lead to 35-24, but the Cavaliers would come no closer.

Steven Clark pinned Virginia at its own 6-yard line and the Tigers defense held the Cavs to three and out as Gabe Wright made his first career sack at the 1-yard line. Then, Angelo Blackson blocked UVA's punt out of the end zone for a safety and a 37-24 lead with 1:57 remaining in the third. It's the first time Auburn had blocked two punts in the same game since 2003 vs. Louisiana-Monroe.

Quan Bray took the ensuing kickoff and returned it 57 yards to the Virginia 15. Parkey nailed a 45-yard field goal after a personal foul and false start penalty to make it 40-24 with 47 seconds to go in the third.

Parkey drilled his second field goal of the game, a 37-yarder, to give Auburn a 43-24 lead with 8:09 remaining.

## 2014 BCS National Championship

Auburn came with a blink of an eye of winning its second national championship in the last four years.

FSU stole a page out of Auburn's playbook for the dramatic finish when Kermi Whitfield returned a kickoff 100 yards with 4:31 for a brief lead, and then Jameis Winston threw a 2-yard touchdown pass to Kelvin Benjamin with 13 seconds remaining to send Florida State to a 34-31 victory in the BCS Championship Game on Monday night in the Rose Bowl.

It prevented the biggest comeback story in college football history, though Auburn still finished with a remarkable season and a 12-2 record. The Tigers came within seconds of winning their second national title in the last four seasons.

Oh, Auburn tried to win with its usual heroics. Tre Mason broke Bo Jackson's single-season rushing record when he scored on a 37-yard run with 1:19 remaining to give Auburn a 31-27 lead. But Winston, the Heisman Trophy winner, drove the Seminoles in for the game-winner.

Auburn had beaten Georgia, Alabama, and Missouri to get this far, and won four games in the final minute, or second. But not this night. Florida State was the one with the heroics.

Auburn led 21-3, then found itself up 21-20 with 10:55 left in the game. Florida State took the lead in the fourth quarter, but Mason's TD run gave the Tigers a late lead.

Auburn found new pages in its playbook in the first half, throwing touchdown passes to Tre Mason and Melvin Ray for the first time in their careers as Marshall out-played the Heisman winner Winston in the first half.

Marshall completed passes to seven different receivers in the first half. But even with the passing, Auburn stuck with its familiar successful formula of letting Mason run. The tailback who went for 304 yards on 46 carries hit halftime Monday night with 96 yards on 18 carries.

Marshall hit the break having hit 7-of-13 passes for 113 yards and those two touchdowns. Winston was only 6-of-15 passing for 62 yards and no touchdowns, though he did set up FSU's only first-half touchdown with a nice scramble to the Auburn 3.

Auburn got two early sacks against him, then forced him to fumble to set up the Tigers' third touchdown. Credit punter Steven Clark for setting up Auburn's first touchdown when he flipped the field when he kicked the ball dead at the Florida State 2. The Seminoles couldn't move it, and, after a Chris Davis punt return, the Tigers found themselves in great field position at the FSU 25. Six plays later, Marshall threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to Mason to make it 7-3 Auburn with 3:07 left in the first quarter.

Auburn scored on its next possession in a most surprising way when Marshall found Ray running alone down the middle of the field for a 50-yard touchdown pass and a 14-3 lead with 13:48 left in the second quarter.

Auburn kept hammering away at Winston, and, after a short run, recovered his fumble at the FSU 27. Marshall made it 21-3 when he ran around end on a 4-yard run with 5:01 left in the second quarter. Florida State got that touchdown back after successfully faking a punt, watching Winston run for 21 to the Auburn 3 and scoring on the next play on a Devonta Freeman run. That made the halftime score 21-10.

## 2015 Outback Bowl

Auburn played it to the end, and then some, but it wasn't enough to beat Wisconsin and Melvin Gordon in the Outback Bowl on Thursday.

The Badgers won 34-31 in overtime when they made a field goal on their first possession, and Auburn missed a 45-yard try when it got the ball.

Gordon rushed for 251 yards and three touchdowns, though Auburn had the lead with eight seconds left in regulation. Wisconsin tied the game a second later on a field goal, and won it in the first overtime period.

The end of the game was like the rest of the game, a see-saw affair that featured big runs and good plays.

Auburn quarterback Nick Marshall picked one good play, and then another, in two drives near the end that gave the Tigers two leads. That's when Auburn found the proper balance between the run and the pass.

The Tigers answered two Wisconsin leads with decisive drives. Cameron Artis-Payne scored on a 2-yard run with 2:55 remaining. Before that, the Tigers had taken the lead a drive that saw Artis-Payne rip off a 21-yard run, Corey Grant run for 21, too, and Marshall throw a 21-yard touchdown pass to C.J. Uzomah.

Marshall came through after that, too.

He led the Tigers to the Wisconsin 7, and, on fourth down, his pass to Sammie Coates may have been a TD had it not been for pass interference. It didn't matter. Artis-Payne scored on the next play.

Auburn finished the season with a 8-5 record. Wisconsin finished at 11-3.

The Tigers led at the half, but n Gordon carried four times for 55 yards, including the final 25, on the first series of the second half to tie Auburn at 14-all.

On fourth-and-1, Gordon broke loose for a 53-yard touchdown run to give Wisconsin a 21-17 lead with 20 seconds left in the third quarter.

But Auburn mixed it up on the Badgers from there, with Artis-Payne ripping off a 21-yard run, with Corey Grant doing the same, and with Marshall throwing a 21-yard touchdown pass to Uzomah for a 24-21 lead with 11:21 left in the fourth quarter.

Auburn regained the lead on a career-long 51-yard field goal by Daniel Carlson.

Wisconsin scored on its first series on a 7-yard pass from Joel Stave to Corey Clement, but the Tigers tied the game on a 2-yard touchdown run with 2:16 left in the first quarter, and went ahead on a Marshall 66-yard TD pass to Ricardo Louis.

Those plays, and interceptions by Trovon Reed and Jermaine Whitehead, had Auburn ahead 14-7 at the half.

The first half was more of the same for Marshall, who threw for a single-game school record of 456 yards against Alabama in the previous game, then threw for 131 more in the first half against Wisconsin.

Auburn hit halftime with those 131 yards passing and 46 yards rushing.
