# 2015 Season Recap

#### 2015 FOOTBALL RECAP

>> Auburn finished the 2015 campaign with a 7-6 overall record, defeating Memphis 31-10 in the Birmingham Bowl at Legion Field in Birmingham.

» Auburn had 16 seniors: Blake Countess, Devonte Danzey, Kenny Flowers, Kris Frost, Justin Garrett, Keymiya Harrell, Jonathan Jones, DaVonte Lambert, Ricardo Louis, Duncan McKinney, Cassanova McKinzy, Daniel Pond, Melvin Ray, Lawyer Tillman, Tucker Tuberville, and Jonathan Wallace. Three additional players -- Peyton Barber, Shon Coleman, Avery Young -- entered their names into the NFL Draft.

#### **IN BOWL GAMES**

>> With its Birmingham Bowl win, Auburn made its 40th all-time bowl appearance and the 14th in the last 16 seasons. Auburn has a 23-15-2 record in bowl games. This was the 10th time in program history Auburn played in two bowl games in the same calendar year.

#### SEC NUMBERS

In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 304-241-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 125-56-6 all-time; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 179-185-12 overall. Auburn is 103-149-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. Auburn is 45-38-2 at home against ranked teams, 27-64-2 on the road and 31-47-2 against ranked teams on a neutral field.

#### **ON THE RUN**

>> Auburn has produced a 100-yard rusher in 29 of 40 games under head coach Gus Malzahn. Seven different Tigers have rushed for 100 yards in a game under Malzahn (36 100-yard rushing performances). Auburn's record with a 100-yard rusher during the Malzahn era is 22-7.

» Auburn is among three schools with at least one 1,000-yard rusher per season from 2009-15, along with Oregon (9), Auburn (8) and Boise State (7). The Tigers' 1,000-yard rushers during that string: Ben Tate (2009), Cam Newton (2010), Michael Dyer (2010 and 2011), Tre Mason (2012 and 2013), Nick Marshall (2013), Cameron Artis-Payne (2014) and Peyton Barber (2015).

#### **PEYTON BARBER**

>> With 1,017 yards rushing on 238 carries with 13 scores and five 100-yard games for the season, sophomore Peyton Barber posted the 26th 1,000-yard season in Auburn history. He was one of only

#### KICKOFF COVERAGE

» Kicker Daniel Carlson (first team) and offensive tackle Shon Coleman (second team) earned coaches' all-SEC recognition for 2015

» Daniel Carlson was one of three kickers nationally with four 51+-yard field goals in college football this season. His 56-yard field goal vs. Louisville was the fifth-longest in college football in 2015

» A Lou Groza Award finalist, Carlson had five 50+-yard field goals in his last 13 games, beating the total of 50-yd FG by all Auburn kickers in the previous 150 games combined, back to 2003

» Senior captain Jonathan Wallace was one of 11 FBS student-athletes named to the 2015 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team for his commitment to community service » Johnathan Ford ranked fourth in the SEC with 118 total tackles, the most by an Auburn player in a season since Dontarrious Thomas (121 tackles) in 2001

>> The Tigers were fourth nationally in kickoff returns, averaging 27.94 yards per runback

>> 17 Auburn players played in the Birmingham Bowl with a bachelor's degree, four with master's degrees

» Auburn was fourth in the nation with only 18 kickoff returns allowed and third with only seven punts returned. The Tigers' total 25 combined returns allowed tied for the lead among all FBS teams and their 473 combined return yards allowed (kickoffs and punts) ranked third nationally

» Six players on the 2015 Auburn roster received bachelor's degrees before the 2015 season:

>>> Five of those were working toward graduate degrees in adult education, while Kozan is pursuing an MBA. There were only nine non-seniors in college football who played this season with a bachelor's degree, two of them Auburn juniors Coleman and Kozan.

» Eleven received bachelor's degrees in December, 2015: Will Adams, Xavier Dampeer, T.J. Davis, Kenny Flowers, Kris Frost, Jonathan Jones, Duncan McKinney, Cassanova McKinzy, JaViere Mitchell, Daniel Pond and Jonathan Wallace.

#### SEC HONOR ROLL

» There were 31 Auburn representatives on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the 2014 season, including current team members Peyton Barber, Alec Brown, Daniel Carlson, Shon Coleman, Aaron Garrison, Gray King, Alex Kozan, Chris Laye, Damian Lewis, Duncan McKinney, Tyler Stovall, Tucker Tuberville and Jonathan Wallace. Team members had a 3.0 GPA for the previous school year or a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher.

#### ACADEMIC TOP TIGERS

>>> The Academic Top Tiger program recognizes Auburn student-athletes who post a 3.0 GPA or higher in either semester of a school year. The 2014-15 list recognized 42 members of the football team, including Tré Williams, Andrew Williams, Sean White, Jonathan Wallace, Tucker Tuberville, Keenan Sweeney, Tyler Stovall, Braden Smith, Josh Shockley, Dontavius Russell, Nick Ruffin, Ike Powell, Kamryn Pettway, Jonathan Parslow, Duncan McKinney, Tray Matthews, Damian Lewis, Chris Laye, Alex Kozan, Gray King, Raashed Kennion, Austin Golson, Aaron Garrison, Deshaun Davis, Daniel Carlson, Jack Bjork and Peyton Barber from the current squad.

#### SEC FIRST-YEAR ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL

» Auburn football had nine representatives on the 2014-15 SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included Austin Golson, Kamryn Pettway, Ike Powell, Dontavius Russell, Josh Shockley, Braden Smith, Keenan Sweeney and Tré Williams.

four FBS players to rush for at least four TDs in a game twice this season.

» Barber scored all four of Auburn's touchdowns in overtime this year. He rushed for 120 yards and four TD at Arkansas, with three TD scored in OT. He was 27th among all FBS players with 13 rushing touchdowns this season, tied for eighth all-time in a season in Auburn history.

» Barber's 11 rushing TDs vs. San José State, Kentucky and Arkansas tied Kenneth Dixon of Louisiana Tech for the most by any FBS player this season over a three-game stretch.

» Barber's five touchdown runs (three in the first half) vs. San José State were his first multiple TD game, and the most by an Auburn player in a game since Carnell Williams scored six in a 45-13 win over Mississippi State in 2003.

The last Auburn player to rush for four or more scores in a game was Tre Mason vs. Missouri in the 2013 SEC championship game. The last AU player with three rushing touchdowns in the first half was Cameron Artis-Payne vs. San José State in 2014.

» Barber was the eighth player in Auburn history (records back to 1965) to score four+ rushing TD in a single game and the fifth since 2000 (Rudi Johnson-2000; Carnell Williams-2003; Cam Newton-2010; Tre Mason-2x in 2013).

» Barber's five rushing TD vs. San José State were the second-most by an FBS player this season, tied with Keenan Reynolds of Navy (vs. East Carolina), Louisiana-Lafayette's Elijah McGuire (vs. Northwestern State), and Arkansas' Alex Collins (vs. UT Martin); and just behind Louisiana Tech's Kenneth Dixon (6 vs. North Texas). With his 115-yard rushing performance against Louisville, Barber became the 62nd player in Auburn history to rush for 100 yards in a game. Barber carried the ball 24 times versus Louisville; previously, he showed 10 carries for 54 yards in six games.

» Barber followed that up with 125 yards rushing vs. Jacksonville State, including the game-winning 4-yard TD run in overtime, making him the 22nd Auburn player who has rushed for 100 yards in at least two straight games. An Auburn player has posted consecutive 100-yard games 45 times in the program's history.

» Barber rushed for a then-career-best 137 yards on 27 carries against Mississippi State, and topped that with 147 yards on 28 carries with five TD the next week vs. San José State.

» Barber had 30 carries on third down and six or fewer yards to go, and got a first down on 22 of those carries (73.3%).

#### **JOVON ROBINSON**

>> With 159 yards rushing on 27 carries at Texas A&M, junior Jovon Robinson became the 63rd player in Auburn history to rush for 100 yards in a game, and the seventh Auburn player of the Malzahn era. That's the best performance by an Auburn rusher this season.

>> His 107 yards in the first half at Texas A&M were the most in a first half since Tre Mason had
 195 vs. Missouri in the 2010 SEC championship game.

>> Robinson's 1-yard TD run against the Aggies was the first of his career, the sixth Auburn player to rush for a TD this season.

>> His 126 yards on 27 carries with a TD against Memphis earned him Birmingham Bowl MVP

#### LARGEST VIDEO BOARD IN COLLEGE FOOTBALL

>> Jordan-Hare Stadium is now home to the nation's largest video board, which made its debut September 12 when the Tigers hosted Jacksonville State.

>> The video structure is 200 feet wide and 105 feet tall, while the board itself ranges 190x57 feet and 10.830 square feet. The cost of the project is \$13.9 million.

honors. Robinson rushed for a team-best 93 yards on 12 carries against Georgia and a teamhigh 99 yards with a 13-yard TD in the first half against Idaho.

>> For the season, Robinson gained 639 yards on 117 carries in eight games, an average of 5.5 yards per carry and 79.9 yards per game.

#### JEREMY JOHNSON

» Junior QB Jeremy Johnson, the first Auburn QB to start back-to-back season openers since Chris Todd (2008-09), has thrown at least one TD pass in eight of his nine career starts. He is 6-3 as a starter.

» His 19 career TD passes have been to 10 different receivers: Melvin Ray (3), Ricardo Louis (3), D'haquille Williams (2), Sammie Coates (2), Tony Stevens (2), Jason Smith (2), Quan Bray, Marcus Davis, Jay Prosch, Roc Thomas and C.J. Uzomah.

» Johnson topped the 1,000-yard career passing mark vs. Jacksonville State. For his career, Johnson has completed 144-235 passes for 1,911 yards with 19 TDs and 9 INTs.

#### SEAN WHITE

» Sean White was the first Auburn freshman QB to make his first start in an SEC game since Jeff Klein at Tennessee in 1999. Auburn has had six freshman QB starters since 2000.

 In his debut against Mississippi State,
 White was 20-28 passing for 188 yards with one interception. For the season, he was 83-143 (58.0) in completion percentage.

» White is the first Auburn quarterback to throw for 250 or more yards in three consecutive games since Dameyune Craig in 1997. He's the first AU freshman to ever accomplish the feat. Auburn freshmen had thrown for at least 250 yards in a game a total of five times in Auburn history prior to this season.

>> White is the second freshman signalcaller to throw for at least 250 yards in multiple games in Auburn history, joining Stan White, who topped the mark four times in 1990.

» With the win at Kentucky, White was the first Auburn freshman quarterback to win an SEC road game since Jason Campbell at Vanderbilt in 2001.

White's 255 passing yards at Kentucky (17-27) were the second-most by an AU freshman in an SEC game; Stan White threw for 338 yards against Tennessee in 1990. Those 255 passing yards were sixth-most by an AU freshman QB and most since Jeff Klein (270 vs. UCF) in 1999. White topped all those marks with 258 yards passing (12-28, 1 TD, 1 INT) vs. Ole Miss.

### NATIONAL CHAMPIONS: 1957, 2010

#### **RICARDO LOUIS**

» Senior Ricardo Louis made 98 career
 catches for 1,338 yards and eight TD catches,
 along with 535 rushing yards and two rushing
 TD. He is 11th among Auburn career leaders in
 receptions (97) and 15th in yardage (1,321).

» Louis had 114 yards receiving in the first quarter at Kentucky, the most receiving yards in a quarter by an Auburn player since Sammie Coates had 142 yards receiving in the second quarter of the 2014 Iron Bowl. Louis finished with a career-high 154 yards receiving, topping his previous high of 131 vs. Georgia (2013).

>> He totalled 137 yards against Ole Miss on four receptions, with a 47-yard TD catch, his third career 100-yard receiving game.

» Louis had a 24-game reception streak (the longest at Auburn since Rod Smith went 25 consecutive games with a catch in 2007-08) broken at Texas A&M.

» Against Louisville, Louis scored on a 33yard pass from Jeremy Johnson and also scored on an 8-yard run -- the first Auburn player to score a receiving and a rushing TD in the same game since Tre Mason against Florida State in the BCS Championship game in 2013, and the first Auburn receiver to do so since Ben Obomanu vs. Alabama in 2005.

It was Louis' first career game scoring multiple touchdowns, and the second time he caught a TD pass in consecutive games.

 Louis' career-best 10 receptions vs. Jacksonville State were the most by an AU player since Emory Blake (10) vs. Arkansas in 2012. Louis tied for the fourth-best single game in AU history, and only the eighth player at Auburn with 10 or more receptions in a game.

>> He was the first Auburn receiver in program history to rush for more than 100 yards with a 102-yard effort against South Carolina in 2014.

» Louis' most famous score was the 2013 "Prayer In Jordan-Hare," where he caught a tipped pass from Nick Marshall on 4th-and-18 for a 73-yard touchdown that won the Georgia game with 0:25 remaining in the contest.

#### **MELVIN RAY**

» Senior Melvin Ray caught 33 career passes for 568 yards and four touchdowns. In his career, 27 of his 33 catches went for either a first down or a touchdown.

» His 10-yard TD reception from Jeremy Johnson vs. Jacksonville State tied that game with just 1:22 remaining in regulation. He had a nine-yard TD catch from Johnson at LSU.

The other two career scores were a 50-yarder from Nick Marshall in the BCS Championship in 2013 and a 49-yard strike from Johnson in the 2014 season opener against Arkansas.

#### FIRST DOWNS

N Auburn has had 20 or more first downs in 28 of its last 35 games. In 40 games under Gus Malzahn as head coach, Auburn has gained 20 or more first downs in a game 31 times.

In 16 of its last 35 games, Auburn has gained at least 25 first downs. In 2015, the Tigers averaged 19.8 first downs per game; under Gus Malzahn as head coach, Auburn has averaged 22.6 first downs.

» Since 2001, Auburn is 115-21 (.846) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 171-29-1 (.853) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is now 317-9 (.972) when scoring 30 points.

#### ON DEFENSE

» Auburn held Georgia to 243 yards, the fewest yards for an Auburn opponent since the Tigers held Samford to 238 yards last season, and the fewest allowed by Auburn in an SEC game since the Tigers held Florida to 194 yards in 2011.

>> The 10 points allowed by the Auburn defense vs. Texas A&M were the fewest against a ranked SEC opponent on the road since 2004 at No. 10 Tennessee (10 points), and the fewest in a SEC road game by the Tigers since allowing just two points at Mississippi State in 2008.

#### **TOP TACKLERS**

 » Five players have more than 100 career tackles at Auburn: Cassanova McKinzy (263), Kris Frost (247), Johnathan Ford (216), Jonathan Jones (129) and Montravius Adams (107).

 » Ford had seven double-digit tackle games this season and ranked fourth in the SEC with 118 total tackles, the the most for a season at Auburn since Dontarrious Thomas (122) in 2001.

Since 2001, only three other Auburn defenders have recorded more than 100 tackles in a season: Daren Bates (104 in 2011), Josh Bynes (104 in 2009) and Neiko Thorpe (102 in 2011).

» Ford's 14 tackles vs. San José State, Kentucky and Ole Miss were a career high, the most by an Auburn player since Kris Frost tallied 14 tackles vs. South Carolina in 2014.

Ford led Auburn with 12 tackles in the win over Louisville and added 12 more stops against Jacksonville State and 10 at LSU.

The last Auburn player with 10+ tackles in three straight games was Demetruce McNeal in 2012 at Vanderbilt (12), vs. Texas A&M (10) and vs. New Mexico State (10).

» Frost had his third double digit-tackle game of the season (sixth career) at Kentucky with 11 stops. It marked the fourth time this season Auburn had multiple players record double-digit tackles.

» Three Auburn players recorded 10 tackles each in the LSU game: Frost, Ford and Tré Williams (career high). The last time three Auburn defenders had 10+ tackles in a game was against ULM in 2012: Daren Bates (14), Demetruce McNeal (11), Jake Holland (10).

» Linebacker Cassanova McKinzy led Auburn with 13 tackles against Jacksonville State, his sixth career double-figure game, and sacked JSU's QB Eli Jenkins for a 16-yard loss on 3rdand-goal in overtime.

McKinzy had a team-high 5.0 sacks (-45 yards) for Auburn this season. Montravius Adams had 2.5 sacks (-21 yards) for the season.

» True freshman Carlton Davis led all Auburn tacklers with a career-best 11 stops in the Birmingham Bowl against Memphis.

#### INTERCEPTORS

» Johnathan Ford's 48-yard interception return for a touchdown against Idaho was his second interception of the season and fifth pick of his career. It was his first interception score and second career score at Auburn. The Tigers' last interception return for a touchdown was Jermaine Whitehead vs. Arkansas in the 2014 season opener.

» Jonathan Jones' 29-yard interception against Idaho was his first of the season and the seventh of his career; he had six during his junior season.

» The Tigers intercepted at least one pass in nine of 13 games. Auburn intercepted a pass in five consecutive games prior to the Georgia contest. Seven different Auburn players had at least one interception this season.

» Auburn recorded multiple interceptions in four games this season: San José State, Ole Miss, Texas A&M, Idaho.

» Pickoffs by Blake Countess, Justin Garrett and Carlton Davis at Texas A&M marked Auburn's most interceptions in a game since last year's Outback Bowl vs. Wisconsin (3).

» Tray Matthews opened the Louisville game with a 35-yard interception return on the first play from scrimmage. It was the first INT on an opening drive by Auburn since the 2013 Arkansas game.

» Ford recorded an interception in the Jacksonville State game, the fourth pick of

his career. Kris Frost recorded his second career interception at Arkansas. Justin Garrett and Carlton Davis recorded their first career interceptions against San José State. Blake Countess and Kris Frost had picks vs. Ole Miss.

» True freshman Carlton Davis recorded the second interception of his career when he picked off Kentucky quarterback Patrick Towles in the end zone in Auburn's 30-27 win in Lexington.

Davis, the first Auburn freshman to record multiple interceptions since T'Sharvan Bell had three picks as a redshirt frosh in 2009, and the first freshman to record an INT in consecutive games since Will Herring in 2003, was one of just 12 freshmen nationally to record three or more interceptions this season, and the only SEC freshman to do so. He earned SEC all-freshman honors, the first Auburn DB to do so since Daren Bates (2009).

 The Auburn defense has 49 interceptions in 40 games (1.23/gm) since the beginning of the 2013 season.

#### LOU GROZA FINALIST DANIEL CARLSON

>> Sophomore Daniel Carlson's 56-yard field goal vs. Louisville, a Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game record, **was the fifth-longest kick in college football this season.** It was a career long; his previous was 51 yards vs. Wisconsin in 2014.

The 56-yarder was the longest by an Auburn kicker since 2003 (57 yds, Philip Yost vs. Western Kentucky) and tied John Riley (at Tennessee, 1969) for the third-longest FG in Auburn history.

» Carlson's first team all-SEC selection marked the third straight year Auburn had at least one first-teamer. Carlson is the first all-SEC Auburn kicker since Kody Bliss (2005-06).

"Legatron" was one of only three kickers nationally this season to make four field goals of 51+ yards. Carlson's four 50+ yard FG in a season break the AU single season record of three set by John Riley in 1969. He has tied the Auburn career record for 50+ yard FG with five, shared with Neil O'Donoghue (1975-76).

>> The Lou Groza Award finalist made an Auburn record 23 field goals this season:

» Auburn had 43 players in NFL preseason camps in 2015, representing 22 different NFL teams

» Auburn has had 29 players taken in the first round and four No. 1 overall draft picks: Cam Newton (Carolina, '11), Aundray Bruce (Atlanta, '88), Bo Jackson (Tampa, '86) & Tucker Frederickson (NY Giants, '65)

>> Against Texas A&M, Carlson was 4-4 on FG, the sixth time in his career he made at least three field goals in a game.

>> Carlson made 16 consecutive field goals, an Auburn record, breaking the mark set in 1997:

- 12 Jaret Holmes (1997)
- 11 **Damon Duval** (2000)
- 10 **Gardner Jett** (1970-71)

>> Carlson has scored 220 points (41-51 FG, 97-97 PAT) during his two-year career, seventh all-time among Auburn kickers. He's just the ninth Auburn player ever to score more than 100 points in a season.

>> Carlson is sixth in Auburn career field goals made (41), and is just one of four Auburn kickers all-time to make 15+ FG in multiple seasons:

Wes Byrum (2007, 2009, 2010) Daniel Carlson (2014, 2015) *Jim Von Wyl (*1990, 1991) Win Lyle (1987, 1989)

» Carlson is 5-6 on career FG of at least 50 yards, making a 51-yarder in the Outback Bowl, a 56-yarder (one yard short of the Auburn record) in the opener vs. Louisville, a 51-yarder vs. Mississippi State and a 52-yarder at Kentucky and against Ole Miss.

He's the just the third AU kicker with 50+-yd FGs in back-to-back games, along with John Riley (1969; Tennessee/56, Kentucky/54) and John Vaughn (Washington State/52, Miss State/55). In 1987, Win Lyle had FGs of 55 and 52 yards in a game vs.Tennessee.

>> Carlson has made 97 consecutive PAT kicks, the fourth longest such string in Auburn history. He is seventh in career PAT made at Auburn.

In 2014, Carlson was 57-57 on PAT attempts -- third among Auburn single-season leaders for FG made and the best 100% season in AU history. Carlson was second in Auburn single-season kick scoring with 111 points, tied with Cody Parkey (2013) and his 18 made field goals were third best in a season at Auburn.

>> This season, 49 of Carlson's 69 kickoffs were touchbacks, the fifth best percentage (71.01%) nationally. For his career, 99 of 150 kickoffs (66.0%) have been touchbacks.

#### PUNTER KEVIN PHILLIPS

>> Junior college transfer Kevin Phillips had a solid debut. Averaging 41.0 yards per kick, 17 of Phillips' 55 punts landed inside the 20 and 10 were longer than 50 yards. He had only seven punts returned.

>> Phillips' 50.0 yd/punt average at LSU (6/300) was the best for an Auburn punter since Daniel Carlson averaged 53.3 vds/punt (3/160) against Arkansas in the 2014 season opener.

>> Phillips' 56-yard punt at LSU was a career long, and the longest Auburn punt since the 2014 season opener vs. Arkansas, when Daniel Carlson had a 62-yarder.

>> With four 50+ yard punts at LSU, Phillips had the most 50-yd punts in a game for Auburn since a school record five 50+ vard punts by Skip Johnston vs. Florida (53.2 avg) in 1978.



» A three-year letterman from 1995-97, Takeo Spikes was Auburn's leader in tackles and solo stops in 1996 and 1997, earning All-America honors as a junior in 1997. As a junior he recorded 136 tackles, including nine for loss, and two interceptions while helping Auburn to its first SEC Championship game appearance and an SEC Western Division title. Spikes finished his Auburn career 10th in tackles and fourth in solo tackles.

» A two-time first-team All-SEC pick, Spikes was selected in the first round of the 1998 NFL Draft by the Cincinnati Bengals. The Sandersville, Ga., native played with five teams over his 15-year NFL career and was a Pro Bowler and All-Pro selection in 2003 and 2004.

» The 14 members of the 2015 Football Legends Class were honored at the 2015 SEC Football "Weekend of Champions" in Atlanta. » Auburn is tied for the longest string of games without having a punt blocked. The Tigers' last blocked punt attempt was vs. Mississippi State in 2009, a string of 90 games.

» Redshirt freshmen seeing their first action include Deshaun Davis, Kamryn Pettway, Dontavius Russell, Josh Shockley, Sean White, Andrew Williams and Chris Laye.

Twelve other players appeared in the Orange and Blue for the first time: Tucker Brown, Blake Countess, Austin Golson, Tray Matthews, Kevin Phillips, Daniel Pond, Logan Rice, Jovon Robinson, Jason Smith, Maurice Swain, Lawyer Tillman and Tucker Tuberville.

#### **MORE TIGER STRIPES...**

Auburn was +7 in turnovers (15/8) in its last nine games after posting a -5 turnover margin (9/4) in its first four games. Auburn scored 75 points off turnovers this season.

» The Tigers were one of seven teams with at least 20 different starters this season on both sides of the ball, along with Colorado, Nebraska, Ole Miss, Oregon State, Rice and UCF. Auburn had 22 different starters on offense and 22 on defense.

» The Tigers have a 29-game home non-conference winning streak. Auburn's last home non-conference loss was a 26-23 OT defeat to South Florida in 2007.

Auburn has won 14 consecutive regular season games against non-conference competition since a 26-19 loss to No. 14 Clemson in the 2012 season opener. Auburn's all-time regular season record in non-conference play since SEC action began in 1933 is 241-67-6.

Auburn finished 4-0 in its regular season non-conference schedule, the 28th time since joining the SEC in 1933 the Tigers did not lose a game in non-conference regular season action.

» The Tigers have 741 total victories, 13th among the all-time winningest FBS football programs. The 23 FBS teams with 700+ all-time wins: Michigan, Texas, Nebraska, Notre Dame, Penn State, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Alabama, Tennessee, Southern Cal, Georgia, LSU, Auburn, West Virginia, Syracuse, Virginia Tech, Texas A&M, Georgia Tech, Pitt, Washington, Florida, Arkansas and Clemson.

>> Auburn's 56 points scored vs. Idaho were the most by the Tigers since the 2014 San José State win (59). It was the fifth time during the Malzahn era that Auburn scored 50+ points.

Auburn has played in front of 26
 consecutive regular-season sellout crowds,
 including 16 consecutive sell-outs at Jordan Hare Stadium; the last regular season non sellout was in 2013 at Tennessee.

» Gus Malzahn has won or played for a conference title in six of his 10 seasons as a collegiate coach.

» Malzahn's teams have won their conference championships in three of the last six seasons with Auburn in 2010 and 2013 and Arkansas State in 2012

# JORDAN-HARE STADIUM >> 87,45

Jordan-Hare Stadium is Auburn's showcase football stadium, which seats 87,451, with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the east side and college football's largest videoboard - debuted in 2015 spanning the south end.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's 11th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451. It is the seventh-largest in the SEC.

The Tigers have won 79.3 percent of their games in Jordan-Hare Stadium since its 1939 dedication and hold an overall record of 305-77-7 there.

The 2014 season was the 75th anniversary of Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats. Ten years later, 14,000 more seats were added, and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium (after a member of Auburn's first football team and eventual dean of the School of Chemistry), although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span. Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980; the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season.

The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973, recognizing Hall of Fame coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan. The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl.

The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships. Auburn's home games are now played at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

On game days, Auburn's Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes the sixth-largest city in the state of Alabama as Auburn has averaged at least 80,000 fans per game for the last 21 seasons.

Since Jordan-Hare Stadium expanded to its current capacity prior to the 2004 season, the Tigers have tallied 41 sell-out games, including the last 13 consecutively.

#### ACADEMICS

>> In the 2014-15 academic year, 108 student-athletes graduated from Auburn University.

» A record 346 student-athletes received the Top Tiger Award in 2014-15 with a GPA of 3.0.

» During the 2014-2015 academic year, more than 200 Auburn University studentathletes were honored as members of the All-SEC Academic Honor Roll.

» Thirty-two current and former football student-athletes graduated during the 2014-15 academic year, including Cam Newton and Carnell Williams.

» Six current Tigers have received their degrees, including: Shon Coleman, Devonte Danzey, Justin Garrett, Keymiya Harrell, Alex Kozan and Blake Countess (Michigan).

» During Autumn of 2014, Auburn swimmer Tofey Leon was selected as a Rhodes Scholarship Finalist. Former Auburn University football player Partick Young was a nominee for the Rhodes Scholarship while former Auburn University football player Ashton Richardson was selected as one of 40 Marshall Scholarship recipients.

#### **FINANCIALS**

» In the last 23 years, the Athletics Department budget has grown from \$21 million to \$128.7 million.

In back-to-back years, the Auburn
 football program had its highest sale of season
 tickets in school history in 2014 and 2015. In
 2015, Auburn sold out of season tickets on June
 two months earlier than in 2014.

» Men's basketball season ticket sales increased 122.8% for the 2014-15, selling out premium seating for the first time in the history of Auburn Arena. TUF sales are up 75% year-to-date in 2015-16.

» Baseball season ticket sales increased 23.4% in 2015.

#### FACILITIES

» During 2014, Auburn Athletics funded more than \$7.5 million in facility improvements.

» Installed prior to the 2015 season, Jordan-Hare Stadium boasts the nation's largest video board, which is 57 feet tall by 190 feet wide.

» Opened in August 2014, the state-of-theart Auburn Wellness Kitchen provides studentathletes, students and the general population a dining facility that has six action stations and accommodates those with special dietary needs.

» The 2014-15 academic year witnessed the launch of the SEC Network which saw major infrastructure work completed necessary to support the SEC Network and War Eagle Productions.

#### **GAME DAY**

» Auburn's game day experience named by outside parties as offering the best tailgating and the best traditions.

» Per a survey done by the SEC, in which they measured 60 attributes related to the overall game day experience, Auburn scored better than the SEC average on 56 of the 60 measured attributes. Two of the below average rated attributes related to food & beverage prices, for which we in response reduced the price of water and hot dogs to very positive response from our fans.

» Over 96% of Auburn's donors and fans indicate that the frequency of communication, the transparency of communication, and the content of communication from Auburn Athletics meets or exceeds their needs.

#### WINNING

>> Auburn has finished in the top 10 percent of the NACDA Director's Cup for 10 consecutive years.

» Auburn has won 13 national titles since 2004, which is third-most in the SEC. National Champion teams include Football, Men's Swimming and Diving, Women's Swimming and Diving, Equestrian, and Women's Outdoor Track and Field.

» Auburn has won 20 SEC titles in the past 10 years, tied for fourth-most in the conference.

» Sixteen of Auburn's 21 sports participated in postseason competition in 2014-15, with four programs achieving Top 10 finishes nationally.

>> The Auburn football team has won a National Championship and two Southeastern Conference Championships in the last five years, and played for the national title for the second time in four years in 2013.

» No school has won more SEC Football Championships in the last 10 years than Auburn.

>> The Auburn softball team had its best season in school history, advancing to its' firstever Women's College World Series, where it advanced to the semifinals.

» Gymnastics advanced to the NCAA Super Six for the first time in 22 years and second time in school history in 2015, finishing sixth while breaking 52 program records.

#### GAME 1

Auburn's defense set the tone, scored some points and helped the Tigers to a cushy lead through the first half and beyond in the season-opener.

Good thing the defense played well early and Peyton Barber rushed for 115 yards, because the combo helped the Tigers to a 31-24 win Saturday in the Georgia Dome. Auburn led 24-0 in the third quarter before Louisville made it interesting, cutting

its deficit to seven with 2:18 to play. The Tigers played keep-away from there. The Tigers happily showed off their new defense early, setting up an early

touchdown following an interception, scoring again on an 82-yard fumble return by Justin Garrett and generally frustrating offensive-minded Louisville until the second half.

Will Muschamp, the former Auburn defensive coordinator who returned to his former job last December, was a complement to Gus Malzahn's offense, Barber, quarterback Jeremy Johnson and receiver Ricardo Louis' offensive exploits.

Johnson threw for a touchdown and ran for another, Louis caught a touchdown pass and ran for another and Barber came off the bench, replacing the injured Roc Thomas, to break through the 100-yard barrier, gaining 95 of those in the second half when Auburn needed him most.

Auburn led 24-0 midway through the third quarter and everything seemed to be in fine shape.

The latter half of the game was more of a challenge, and losing defensive end Carl Lawson to an injury didn't help.

Lawson wasn't the only one who missed time after being hurt.

Auburn nlaved on.

The rebuild offensive line helped Auburn to 190 rushing yards.

Johnson hit 11-of-21 passes for 137 yards and a touchdown and three interceptions.

Auburn's defense showed the way this time in the first half, setting up a Johnson 1-yard touchdown run following a Tray Matthews interception on Louisville's first play; and Garrett's 82-yard fumble return to give the Tigers a 14-0 lead with 6:54 left in the second quarter.

That was the longest fumble return since at least 1969 when Auburn began

Daniel Carlson then hit a career-best 56-yard field goal to make 17-0 with 34 seconds left in the half. That was the longest Auburn field goal since 2003 when Philip Yost hit a 57-yarder and the third longest in school history. A 33-yard Johnson-to-Ricardo Louis touchdown pass made it 24-0 with 11:21 in the third quarter. Louisville finally scored on a 33-yard John Wallace field goal with 7:07 left in the third, then made it 24-10 on a 10-yard run by Lamar Jackson.

Louis' 8-yard touchdown on an end around gave Auburn a 31-10 lead with 10:04 remaining in the game. The Cardinals scored to make it 31-17 with 6:21 remaining. Louisville cut it to 31-24, but didn't get the ball back.

Auburn went young early, starting true freshmen Chandler Cox and Tim Irvin. They were the first true freshmen to start on opening day since Reese Dismukes in 2011.

Auburn turned on college football's largest video board Saturday and showed a thriller.

Jeremy Johnson threw a 10-yard touchdown pass to Melvin Ray with 39 seconds left, and Peyton Barber scored on a 4-yard run in overtime as Auburn beat Jacksonville State 27-20 on a surprising Saturday in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn scored first in overtime and then turned away the Gamecocks. It was more than a lot of Auburn fans expected, especially when Jacksonville State's Troymaine scored on a 5-yard touchdown run with 5:38 left to give the Gamecocks a 20-13 lead.

Johnson also threw a 51-yard touchdown pass to running back Roc Thomas for a 13-10 lead in the give-and-take game.

Auburn figures to get a tougher test, still, in next Saturday's game at LSU in its SEC opener.

The Tigers improved to 2-0. Jacksonville State fell to 1-1.

Barber came through at the end. He caught a 9-yard pass from Johnson in overtime, and then scored the game-winner on the next play.

Barber followed up his 115-yard rushing game in the opener with 125 more yards against Jacksonville State.

Johnson hit 21-of-32 passes for 236 yards and two touchdowns and two interceptions.

It was a tough start. Auburn didn't score a touchdown in the first half. and, indeed, trailed 10-6 at halftime.

Auburn's first-half scoring was limited to a pair of Daniel Carlson field goals, a 27-yarder and a 49-yarder. Jacksonville State got a 32-yard field goal from Connor Rouleau, and took the lead on an 11-yard touchdown pass from Eli Jenkins to Josh Barge with 5:31 left in the first half.

#### GAME 3

Auburn didn't have an answer for LSU running back Leonard Fournette, who trumped a comeback bid that started from way back Saturday in Tiger Stadium.

The big running back rushed for 228 yards and three touchdowns, and was the engine that carried LSU over Auburn 45-21.

Auburn quarterback Jeremy Johnson ran for a touchdown and threw for two more, but it wasn't enough to overcome LSU's 24-0 halftime advantage.

Auburn came out with some life to start the second half. Johnson raced 65 yards straight up the middle for a touchdown early in the third quarter. It was the longest TD run by an Auburn quarterback since Cam Newton scored on a 71-yard run in 2010.

But Fournette was strong early, going 29 yards for a touchdown to go over 200 yards on the day for a 31-7 lead with 10:56 left in the third quarter. Later, Johnson threw a 9-yard TD pass to Melvin Ray to cut it to 38-14 and then a 10-yard touchdown pass to Duke Williams.

Auburn fell to 2-1 overall and 0-1 in the SEC heading into next Saturday's home game against Mississippi State. LSU improved to 2-0 overall and 2-0 in the league.

Fournette didn't waste time letting his intentions known. He raced 71 yards on the first offensive play of the game and had 169 rushing yards by halftime. LSU led 24-0 by then behind Fournette and quarterback Brandon Harris, who had 63 rushing yards in the first half.

#### GAME 4

Quarterback Sean White was steady in his first college game and the defense showed some moxie, but neither was enough to stop Mississippi State from beating Auburn 17-9 Saturday night in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

White, a redshirt freshman, was 20-of-28 for 188 vards passing and showed a willingness to run after being named Auburn's starting quarterback earlier in the week. The Tigers' defense kept Auburn close enough. Auburn finished with more yards and first downs than State.

Peyton Barber had more than 100 yards rushing before the third quarter was done and finished with 137, his third 100-plus rushing game this season. Auburn wasn't afraid to mix in Roc Thomas and Kerryon Johnson, either.

The Tigers fell to 2-2. State improved to 3-1. Auburn will try to rebound next Saturday's homecoming game against San Jose State in a 3 p.m. game in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Carlson's 30-yard field goal cut State's lead to 14-3 with 9:41 left in the third guarter, and his 30-varder made it 14-6 with 3:06 left in the guarter. Auburn was close to doing more. The Tigers had been inside the State 10 four times by then, but had only two field goals to show for it.

State's Westin Graves' 45-yard field goal made 17-6 with 1:11 left in the third quarter. Carlson's 51-yarder made it 17-9 with 1:07 left in the game.

Auburn's defense kept the game close in the first half in a bounce-back performance from the previous game at LSU, though State led 14-0 at the break. The Bulldogs rode the arm of Prescott to do it. He hit 16-of-20 passes for 180 yards and two touchdowns in the first half.

But White was steady in his own right in the first half, completing 9 of 10 passes for 92 yards.

Peyton Barber ran through and, when necessary, over San Jose State with a five-touchdown performance that included a throwback Bo Over the Top score and a 35-21 Auburn victory on a homecoming Saturday.

Barber scored on runs of 2, 2, 5, 1 and, just to finish it off, 36 yards on a blue-collar overcast day in Jordan-Hare Stadium. Barber was happy enough to play that brand of tough-minded football.

It was Barber's first multi-touchdown day, and he made sure he got it with two touchdown runs in the first quarter, another in the second and a 1-yard up-and-over-the-top, a la Bo Jackson, in the third quarter.

Sean White teamed up with Ricardo Louis for big plays, and Auburn rode a fast start and a good finish to beat Kentucky 30-27 Thursday night in Commonwealth Stadium.

White, confirmed as the starting quarterback only an hour before kickoff, hooked up with Louis early to help Auburn to a 23-10 halftime lead.

Louis had five catches for 114 yards in the first quarter, and seven in the game, and Daniel Carlson hit three field goals in the first half. Peyton Barber scored on two touchdown runs, including a big one on a 3-yard run with 7:56 remaining.

Auburn held Kentucky on fourth down with 25 seconds remaining. Auburn improved to 4-2 overall and 1-2 in the Southeastern Conference. Kentucky fell to 4-2 overall and 2-2 in the league.

White completed 17 of 27 passes for a career-best 255 yards in his third college game.

"We had some explosive plays, really for the first time all year. We actually got into a rhythm," said coach Gus Malzahn. "We were very good on third downs in the first half."

Auburn converted eight of 11 third-down conversions in the first half, and finished making 11 of 18.

That fast start may have been the difference. White promptly led Auburn to two quick touchdowns. Peyton Barber scored first, on a 1-yard run; and then Kerryon Johnson came in to take a direct snap, sprinted right and scored on a 6-yard run for a 30-20 lead. Kentucky cut it to three with just over four minutes remaining.

Kentucky running back Boom Williams ran for 60 yards on one play, then scored on a 1-yard run and scored again later.

Comeback Auburn came back in the closing seconds to tie things up, but it was Arkansas that scored last to beat the Tigers 54-46 in a four-overtime thriller in Razorback Stadium on Saturday.

The Tigers, down by 14 points early and trailing by a touchdown going into the fourth quarter, tied the game with four seconds left in regulation on a Daniel Carlson's 41-yard field goal. Auburn took its first lead of the game in the first overtime. The teams traded touchdowns, and in some cases, 2-point conversions from there, before Auburn's last-ditch throw to the end zone fell incomplete.

"Our kids fought, and I think everybody saw that," said coach Gus Malzahn.

Malzahn left the game saying Auburn showed plenty of resolve, that the Tigers are better than when they started, and they'd practice hard to get ready for next week's home game against Ole Miss.

Quarterback Sean White was steady, completing 19 of 32 passes for 254 yards. Peyton Barber had four rushing touchdowns.

Auburn took a 46-38 lead in the third overtime when Barber scored his fourth touchdown, and White completed a 2-point conversion pass to Melvin Ray. Arkansas answered, scoring on a fourth-and-2 play and converting on a 2-point conversion pass.

Barber rushed for 120 yards to go along with his four touchdowns. Auburn had a 96-yard drive, its longest of the season.

Jeremy Johnson, the former starter, came in to guarterback Auburn for one play, and scored on a 1-yard run to tie Arkansas in the fourth quarter. The Hogs went up by 3, then it was game on for everybody.

Jason Smith scored on a 9-yard run on his first-ever Auburn carry. Auburn finished the first half and started the second half in strong fashion after a sleepy start for the 11 a.m. game. Both teams piled on the

#### GAME 12

Jeremy Johnson threw a highlight reel touchdown pass to Jason Smith, but in a game of field goals, it wasn't enough to carry the day for Auburn at the Iron Bowl.

Alabama's Adam Griffith kicked five field goals and the Tide threw a touchdown pass of its own in the third guarter and added a touchdown late to beat Auburn 29-13 Saturday in the 80th renew of the rivalry.

The Johnson-to-Smith 77-yard touchdown pass was the stuff of the Prayer in Jordan-Hare win over Georgia, and Auburn's Kick Six win over Alabama in 2013. But while Smith made a great catch by tipping the ball to himself while running full speed, it didn't result in a win.

Auburn ended the regular season with a 6-6 record. Four of the losses were one-possession games, losing by eight or fewer points. The loss to Alabama was by double digits, thanks to a Tide touchdown with 26 seconds left.

It was a rebound for Griffith at Jordan-Hare Stadium. He missed a long field goal try on the last play of the 2013 Iron Bowl, the miss that Chris Davis turned into the Kick Six 109-yard return that beat Alabama on the final play.

This time, Griffith kicked four field goal in the first half for a 12-6 Alabama lead. He outdueled Auburn's Daniel Carlson, who hit two of his three tries.

Griffith hit field goals of 27, 40, 26 and 50 yards in the first half. Carlson ran his streak to 16 consecutive field goals when he hit field goals of 24 and 48 yards. He missed one after that.

Auburn fans cheered before the game upon seeing the return of Cam Newton, one of the stars of Auburn's 2010 Iron Bowl win. The fans cheered again when the big video board showed Davis' Kick Six return.

Neither offense did much around the end zone in the first half. Auburn finished with 146 yards with Jovon Robinson's 53 rushing yards leading the way. Johnson hit 3-of-7 passes for 56 yards in the first half and

#### GAME 13

Jeremy Johnson helped Auburn close out the season in fine fashion Wednesday when he came off the bench to lead the Tigers to a 31-10 victory over Memphis in the Birmingham Bowl.

Johnson threw the go-ahead touchdown pass in the third quarter, ran for another score early in the fourth and brought life to what had been a hard-fought game. It was 10-10 before the dramatics began in front of a Birmingham Bowl record crowd of 59,430 in Legion Field.

After the game, coach Gus Malzahn announced he hired Kevin Steele as his defensive coordinator. That's the same position he held at LSU.

Auburn running back Jovon Robinson was named the game's MVP after rushing for 126 yards. The Tigers' defense turned in an MVP performance, too, holding Memphis to 205 yards.

Johnson's play, coupled with an Auburn defense that allowed three points and Peyton Barber crossing the 1,000-yard rushing barrier for the season, allowed the Tigers to finish the season with a 7-6 record. Memphis fell to 9-4.

Johnson, subbing for starter Sean White, threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to Jason Smith for the lead with 3:12 left in the third quarter. His 5-yard touchdown run on the first play of the fourth quarter made it 24-10.

Barber's running allowed Auburn to have at least one 1,000-yard rusher in seven straight seasons.

Auburn showed a little trickery early in the game before pounding away at Memphis in the second half.

A fake punt set up a 20-yard Daniel Carlson for Auburn's first score and Kerryon Johnson scored on an 8-yard run out of the Wildcat formation for a 10-0 first quarter lead.

A Memphis field goal and a Reggis Ball 56-yard interception return tied things up in the second quarter.

Carlson's field goal was a record-setter. It gave him 23 on the season,
