# 2013 Season Recap

AUBURN (12-2, 7-1 SEC)

BCS Championship Game; No. 2 in final polls 2013 SEC Champion Biggest turnaround (+8 improvement) in college football

No. 2 Auburn finished with a 12-2 record (7-1 SEC), losing 34-31 to top-ranked Florida State in the Vizio BCS National Championship January 6, 2014, at the Rose Bowl (92,542) in Pasadena, California. Auburn won the SEC championship with a 59-42 victory over No. 5 Missouri, and recorded the largest turnaround in college football, improving on a 3-9 record from 2012.

#### FIRST AND 10

- At 12-2, Auburn posted the biggest turnaround in the nation this season (last year 3-9), the biggest ever turnaround in SEC history (+7 conference wins) and fell just shy of the biggest improvement in NCAA records (8.5 games by Hawaii from 1999 to 2000).
- Auburn made its second trip to the BCS Championship game and third to a BCS bowl.
- Gus Malzahn went 12-2 in his first season as Auburn head coach, the second-best start ever
  for an Auburn coach; he served as Auburn's offensive coordinator from 2009-11. Malzahn was
  named Associated Press, Bear Bryant, Bobby Bowden, Eddie Robinson, Home Depot, Liberty
  Mutual, SB Nation and Sporting News national coach of the year.
- More fans came to see Auburn play in person during the 2013 season than any other college football team: 1,204,185 of them, according to NCAA statistics.
- Chris Davis' game-winning 100+ yard return for a touchdown of a missed Alabama field goal attempt with just one second remaining was only the fourth such play in NCAA annals.
- Wide receiver Sammie Coates finished third nationally in yards per reception (21.48); the sophomore had 42 catches for 902 yards (seventh most in Auburn history) and seven scores.
- The Tigers led the nation in rushing at 328.3 yards per game, the first SEC team ever to lead the NCAA in rushing. Auburn was one of 15 teams nationally that had four different 100-yard rushers this season and one of three teams nationally (along with Missouri and Oregon) with four 500+ yard rushers for the season.
- Auburn is just the second team in SEC history to gain more than 7,000 yards of total offense in a season, finishing the year with 7,018 total offense yards; the other was Texas A&M in 2012.
- Defensive end Dee Ford led the SEC and ranked 10th nationally in sacks per game with 0.88 sacks per contest; he finished sixth on the Auburn career sacks list (20.5).
- Auburn scored a touchdown in 47 of 56 quarters this season (.839).
- Tre Mason, a Heisman Trophy finalist, led the SEC in rushing (129.7) and scored at least one
  rushing touchdown in his last 11 games, and 13 of his last 14 contests. His 23 rushing touchdowns for the season tied Tim Tebow's SEC record set in 2007.
- In seven games versus ranked teams in 2013, Mason totaled 1,165 rushing yards and 11 rushing touchdowns (5.5 yards/attempt & 166.4 yards/game).

- The Tigers were one of only eight teams nationally to score 21 or more points in every game during 2013; the others: Florida State, Kansas State, Marshall, Missouri, Ohio State, Oklahoma State, Washington. That group compiled an 87-22 (.798) record. All eight teams played in a bowl, three in BCS bowls, and two won conference championships in 2013.
- Four players earned all-SEC honors from the league's coaches. First-team honorees were center Reese Dismukes, defensive end Dee Ford, and running back Tre Mason (the SEC offensive player of the year). Chris Davis was a second team selection at defensive back. Gus Malzahn was voted SEC coach of the year by his peers.
- Auburn scored 30+ points in the final 10 games of the season, setting a new school record for most consecutive games with at least 30 points, breaking the old mark of eight straight games set by the 1994 team. On the season, the Tigers scored 30+ points in 12 games, also a school record. Auburn scored 40 points in six games, one off the 2010 team's school record
- Sophomore linebacker Cassanova McKinzy, with 75 tackles, was the first Auburn underclassman to lead the team in tackles since sophomore Zac Etheridge in 2008.
- Auburn averaged 328.3 rushing yards per game, while its opponents allowed just 156.4 rushing yards per game to all opponents other than Auburn.
- With 553 points, Auburn had the second-highest season scoring total in school history; only the 2010 team (577 points) scored more. Third best is the 2009 team with 433 points; all three of those offenses were coached by Gus Malzahn.

Parkey was named the most outstanding specialist during the week of practice, while Ford was most outstanding defensive lineman. Punter Steve Clark participated in the East-West Shrine Game at St. Petersburg, Fla. Nosa Eguae, Jake Holland and Ryan White were invited to February's College All-Star Bowl.
- Five players -- Steven Clark, Chris Davis, Dee Ford, Tre Mason and Greg Robinson -- have been invited to participate in the NFL Combine February 19-24 in Indianapolis.

#### About Gus Malzahn

Gus Malzahn, who served as Auburn's offensive coordinator from 2009-11, just completed his first year as Auburn's head coach. He is 12-2 at Auburn and 21-5 overall. That start is the second-best ever for a new Auburn coach; Terry Bowden started his tenure 20-0.

Winner of the Associated Press, Bear Bryant, Bobby Bowden, Eddie Robinson, Home Depot, Liberty Mutual, SB Nation and Sporting News national Coach of the Year awards, Malzahn earned SEC coach of the year honors from the league's coaches and the Associated Press.

Just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, Malzahn joins Bernie Moore at LSU in 1935 and John Vaught at Ole Miss in 1947. Les Miles is the only other coach to make it to the SEC title game in his first year, but lost.

Malzahn has won or played for a conference title in six of his eight seasons as a college coach, including winning a conference crown in three of the last four seasons.

Malzahn has now produced 11 1,000-yard rushers in eight seasons as a college head coach/coordinator, at least one in each season, with Tre Mason (1,816) and Nick Marshall (1,068) being the most recent.

Overall, Malzahn has had 11 1,000-yard rushers, five 1,000-yard receivers and three 3,000-yard passers. Malzahn has had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season three times: 2006 (Arkansas), 2010 (Auburn), 2013 (Auburn). His 2007 Tulsa team had three 1,000-yard receivers.

Malzahn, who won the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach in 2010 while helping the Tigers to the BCS National Championship, returned to Auburn after serving as the head coach at Arkansas State in 2012, where he led the program to the Sun Belt Conference title. He was named Auburn's 27th head football coach on December 4, 2012, and received a six-year contract extension prior to the 2013 SEC championship game.

In 2012 at Arkansas State, Malzahn led the Red Wolves to a 9-3 record and 7-1 conference mark. While at Auburn, Malzahn made an immediate impact during his tenure, highlighted by a record-setting offense in 2010 under Heisman Trophy winner Cam Newton. The 2010 Auburn offense set nine school records, including points in a season (577), points per game (41.2), total yards (6,989), total offense (499.2), rushing yards (3,987), rushing touchdowns (41) and passing touchdowns (31), led the Southeastern Conference and finished in the national top 10 in six statistical categories.

Malzahn's arrival in 2009 and style of offense marked a drastic turnaround from the 2008 season when Auburn struggled offensively. In a two-year period, the Tigers improved from a tie for 110th to seventh in the nation in scoring offense (from 17.3 to 41.2) and from 104th to seventh in total offense.

Prior to Auburn, Malzahn was the offensive coordinator at Tulsa (2007-08) and Arkansas (2006). Two of Malzahn's first three collegiate offenses ranked in the top 10 nationally in rushing, including the 2008 Tulsa team and 2006 Arkansas squad. His offenses at Tulsa ranked first nationally in total offense in 2007 and 2008. He coached Heisman Trophy finalist Darren McFadden at Arkansas, while helping the Razorbacks finish fourth nationally in rushing at 228.5 yards per game.

Malzahn's coaching career began in his home state of Arkansas; in 14 seasons as a high school head coach there, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame.

#### In Bowl Games

Auburn now has a 22-14-2 record in bowl games. The Tigers' first bowl game was a 7-7 tie with Villanova in the Bacardi Bowl in Havana, Cuba, following the 1936 season. Auburn has played 19 times in New Year's bowls.

#### **SEC Numbers**

In SEC regular season action all-time, Auburn holds a 298-232-18 overall record since 1933.

In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 122-52-6 all-time. In all SEC games played away from Auburn, the Tigers are 176-180-12 overall.

Auburn is now 100-142-6 all-time when facing ranked opponents. Auburn is 44-36-2 at home against ranked teams, 25-60-2 on the road and 31-46-2 against ranked teams on a neutral field.

The Tigers are 79-117-5 all-time when facing SEC opponents that are ranked (35-29-2 at home, 25-54-2 away, 19-34-1 neutral field).

This was the eighth time in Auburn history that the Tigers played six ranked teams during the season. The win at No. 7 Texas A&M was Auburn's first win over a ranked opponent on the road since October 1, 2011, at No. 10 South Carolina. The Tigers also defeated No. 24 Ole Miss, No. 25 Georgia, No. 1 Alabama and No. 5 Missouri this season.

Auburn is now 4-9 all-time when facing the nation's top ranked team, with a win over Alabama and loss to Florida State. No team has ever beaten two No. 1 teams in the same season. Oklahoma tied No. 1 Texas 15-15 and later beat No. 1 Nebraska 17-7 in 1984.

This was the first season where a top fiveranked Auburn team played AP top five teams in three consecutive games. Auburn's top five matchups:

Auburn played Top Five opponents in back to back games only three seasons previously, in 1968 (vs. #5 Tennessee and #5 Georgia), in 1971 (vs. #3 Alabama and #3 Oklahoma), and in 1981 (vs. #4 Georgia and #4 Alabama).

### 30+ Points Equals Victory

Auburn had its string of 88 consecutive games won when scoring 30 or more points snapped in the BCS title game, a 34-31 loss to Florida State. The streak began after a 56-49 four-overtime loss to Georgia in 1996. In its history, Auburn is now 305-5 when scoring at least 30 points.

#### Most Improved

Improving from a record of 3-9 in 2012 to their 12-2 mark for 2013, the Tigers improved by 8.0 games for the biggest turnaround in college football this season. In fact, Auburn's achievement was just short of the NCAA improvement record of 8.5, set by Hawaii from 1999-2000 (0-12 to 9-4).

#### **SEC Improvement**

With a seven-win improvement from 0-8 in SEC play a year ago to 7-1 this season, Auburn made the biggest turnaround in SEC history. The previous top turnarounds:

Ole Miss: 1-6 (1946) to 6-1 (1947) Georgia: 2-4 (1958) to 7-0 (1959) Ole Miss: 0-6 (1974) to 5-1 (1975) LSU: 0-6 (1983) to 4-1-1 (1984)

#### Fine Line

Auburn got excellent production in 2013 from both its offensive and defensive line. The offensive line ranked third in the SEC and 22nd nationally in fewest sacks allowed (1.29/game) and sixth in the SEC and 22nd in the NCAA in fewest TFL allowed (4.64/gm).

That allowed Auburn to get 16 100-yard rushing performances from a combination of four different players, one of only seven schools to do so. Auburn averaged 328.3 rushing yards per game, first nationally.

On the defensive line, 13 players got time in the rotation; 11 of those contributed to at least one sack. Auburn was fifth in the the SEC and 41st nationally with 6.4 TFL per game.

As a group, the D-line had 61.5 TFL and 29.5 sacks; last year, the AU line accounted for 33.5 TFL and 16.0 sacks.

Senior Dee Ford, with 10.5 sacks in 12 games played, led the SEC and ranked 10th nationally in sacks per game. His 20.5 career sacks rank sixth on Auburn's career list.

#### The Ellis Effect

Including his current stint at Auburn, Ellis Johnson's last three stops as defensive coordinator have seen the veteran coach bring major improvement to his team's scoring defense in his first season.

This season with the Tigers, Johnson has guided the defense to an improvement of 18 spots in the NCAA scoring defense rankings (66th to 48th):

#### In The Red Zone/Offense

Auburn was 54-61 scoring in the red zone on the season for the second-best percentage in the SEC (.885). Auburn scored 44 touchdowns and 10 field goals on drives in the red zone.

#### In The Red Zone/Defense

Auburn was second in the SEC in red zone defense, allowing opponents to score 38 of 52 times for a 73.1 percentage. Opponents converted 26 touchdowns and 12 field goals in the red zone.

That percentage is a significant improvement from the Tigers' national ranking over the last five seasons. Auburn ranked 10th in NCAA red zone defense in 2013; the Tigers' best ranking since 2009 was 72nd in 2010 (0.84).

#### More About The Tigers ...

- Auburn set a school record for the best one-year turnaround with a nine-game swing. Previous bests were six games: 1918 (2-5) to 1919 (8-1); 1934 (2-8) to 1935 (8-2); 1992 (5-5-1) to 1993 (11-0); 2009 (8-5) to 2010 (14-0).
- Auburn ranked eighth nationally in yards per play on offense at 6.92 yards. The Tigers are second in the nation to Navy with 229 rushing first downs.
- Auburn scored 30 points in 10 consecutive games for the first time in school history. The previous best was in 1994, when the Tigers scored 30+ points in eight straight games.
- Auburn had 48 rushing touchdowns on the season, a new school record; the previous mark was 41 in 2010
- Auburn threw for 200+ yards just once in 2011 (286 yards vs. Utah State) and twice in 2012 (281 vs. Arkansas; 211 vs. Texas A&M). Auburn passed for 200+ yards in a game seven times in 2013 (339 vs. Mississippi State, 224 at LSU, 201 vs. Western Carolina, 236 at Texas A&M, 206 vs. Florida Atlantic, 243 vs. Georgia, 217 vs. Florida State). Those seven match AU's total for 200+ passing games in its last 30 games prior to 2013 (back through 2010).

- Although even in the turnover margin for the season (19 to 19), Auburn outscored its opponents 81-48 in points off turnovers (5.8 to 3.4 points per game).
- The Tigers were 5-1 in games decided by seven points or less and 6-1 in games decided by eight points or less, with seven come-frombehind wins.
- Auburn had a 100-yard rusher in 12 of 14 games this season, including at least one in 10 of the last 12 contests. The Tigers had a pair of 100-yard rushers in four games this season.
- Auburn's total offense of 628 against Florida Atlantic gave the Tigers a school record for most yards of total offense in a three-game span (1,955). Auburn had 712 vs. Western Carolina and 615 at Texas A&M. The previous record was 1,726 yards in 2010 vs. LSU (526), at Ole Miss (572) and vs. Chattanooga (628).
- Auburn's 44.57-yard average on seven kick/ punt returns vs. Tennessee set a new NCAA record; the previous NCAA record was 41.8 yds/ ret by Florida State vs. Virginia Tech in 1974.
- Auburn won SEC road games in consecutive weeks for the first time since winning at Kentucky 49-27 on November 5 and winning at Georgia 31-30 on November 12 in 2005.

#### **Drive Time**

Auburn had 33 drives of 75 yards or longer during the 2013 season, all of them accounting for touchdowns. In 2012, Auburn had only 13 drives of that length in 12 games, and only 11 such drives in 2011.

The past 18 years, the current total ranks first: 2013 (33); 2010 (29); 2004 (24); 2005 (20); 2000 (17); 1994, 2003 (14); 2012 (13); 2001, 2009, 2011 (11); 1999, 2006, 2007 (10).

Auburn had 10 scoring drives of less than a minute this season. The quickest scoring drive for the Tigers was a 10-second drive on a 43-yard run by Corey Grant against Florida Atlantic. The quickest SEC drive was 0:25 covering 29 yards on two plays at Arkansas.

#### The Field Goal Return

Chris Davis' 100-yard return of a missed Alabama field goal attempt for the gamewinning score in the final second of the Iron Bowl was the first-such touchdown in Auburn history. The return started at the back of the end zone and is recorded statistically as 100 miscellaneous yards.

According to the NCAA record book, it is just the fourth time in NCAA history that a missed field goal was returned for 100 yards for a score and the second time this year (LSU vs UAB – Odell Beckham, Jr. for LSU).

The two other times were in 1968 (Clemson vs. Georgia – Richie Luzzi for Clemson) and 1966 (California vs. Washington State – Don Guest for California).

Davis ranked third nationally in punt returns, averaging 18.7 yards per return on 17 attempts, including an 85-yard punt return for a touchdown at Tennessee.

#### More From The BCS Championship...

- Auburn added to three of its school singleseason rushing records with 729 rushing attempts, 4,596 rushing yards, and 48 rushing touchdowns.
- With 53 rushing attempts, Auburn set the all-time SEC record with 729. Auburn's 4,596 yards rushing also extends its SEC record for rushing yards in a season, (previous record: Alabama, 4,027 in 1973.) Auburn is fourth in SEC history in rushing yards per game.
- Auburn set a new SEC record with 229 rushing first downs this season, passing the old mark of 213 set by Alabama in 1979.
- Auburn set a new school record for offensive plays run in a season (1,014), passing the old mark of 948 plays in 2010.
- With 449 yards of total offense, the Tigers set a new school record for the most yards of total offense (7,018) in a season, passing the old mark of 6,989 yards in 2010.
- Auburn set a new school record for total offense per game (501.3) surpassing the 2010 season (499.2) yards per game in 2010. The 2013 Tigers finished the season with the sixth most yards total offense in SEC history.
- With 195 yards vs. Florida State, Tre Mason broke Bo Jackson's Auburn single-season rushing yards record of 1,786 yards. Mason finished the season with 1,816 yards.
- Nick Marshall finishes the season ranked third on Auburn's single-season list for total offense (3,044). He passed Pat Sullivan with 2,856 yards in 1970 and trails Cam Newton with 4,327 yards in 2010 and Dameyune Craig with 3,277 yards in 1997.

- Alex Kozan is the first freshman offensive lineman to start the BCS Championship game since Alabama's Barrett Jones in 2009.
- Sammie Coates finished the season seventh in touchdown receptions in a single-season with seven, one behind Emory Blake (2010), 2 behind Ronney Daniels (1999) and Byron Franklin (1980) and three behind Darvin Adams (2009) for third.
- Tre Mason's first-quarter touchdown reception was the first of the season for the junior and the first of his career.
- With Nosa Eguae's first-quarter sack, he has now recorded a tackle for loss in both the 2011 BCS Championship game and 2014 BCS Championship game.
- Melvin Ray's second quarter 50-yard touchdown was the first of his career and just the fifth reception of his career. Nine Tigers caught touchdown passes this season.
- Seven different receivers hauled in catches for Auburn in the first half.
- Dee Ford finished the game with 2.0 sacks to give him 10.5 for the season, fifth-best in Auburn history. The Auburn record is 11.5 sacks set by Nick Fairley in 2010.

### More From The SEC Championship...

- Auburn's 59 points scored broke an SEC Championship game record previously set by the Tigers in 2010 versus South Carolina. Those 59 points against Missouri also mark the third-most points Auburn has scored against an SEC opponent in school history.
- The 101 combined points were an SEC title game record, smashing the 73 in 2010 (Auburn 56, South Carolina 17). The 55 combined first half points was also a record, bettering the 42 done in that same game. The halftime total was more than the combined total of 15 previous championship games.
- Tre Mason, the third running back to be Championship MVP, set three individual championship game rushing marks. His 304 rushing yards bettered the 201 by LSU's Justin Vincent in 2003. Mason had 195 on 23 carries in the first half. The 304 yards is also the fifthhighest total in conference history and three shy of the Auburn school record of 307 held by Curtis Kuykendall vs. Miami in 1944.

His 46 rushing attempts bettered the 31 set by Tennessee's Jamal Lewis in 1997. That total is the second-most in SEC history trailing only 47 by Georgia's Herschel Walker against Florida in 1981.

His four rushing touchdowns broke the previous best of three by Alabama's Mark Ingram (2009), Florida's Reidel Anthony (1996) and LSU's Kenny Hilliard (2011). His 52-yard run was the sixth-longest in an SEC championship.

- Auburn set SEC championship team records for rushing first downs (26), rushing attempts (74), rushing yards (545) and rushing touchdowns (7). It broke Alabama records of 53 attempts in 2009, and 18 rushing first downs and 350 rushing yards in 2012. There were three rushing TDs done multiple times.
- The eight offensive touchdowns (7 rush, 1 pass) is a game record, eclipsing seven by Auburn in the 2010 game. Auburn also set a championship game record with 677 yards of total offense on 85 plays. It broke the mark of 589 it established in 2010 against South Carolina. The teams combined for 1,211 yards of total offense, bettering the previous mark of 938 set in the 2010 game. The 85 plays tied Georgia's 2011 and Auburn's 2004 totals.
- Cody Parkey made a championship game record 52-yard field goal in the third quarter; the old mark was 51 on three previous occasions. Parkey's first-quarter 54-yard field goal attempt was the longest in title game history (previous: 52, Todd Latourette, Arkansas, 1995).
- Auburn's 677 yards of total offense against Missouri set a school record against SEC opponents, fourth most in school history. It's the fourth time this year the Tigers have eclipsed the 600-yard mark. The season-high was 712 against Western Carolina.
- It was the second game this season that four different Auburn players scored a rushing touchdown; the other was Florida Atlantic.
- Nick Marshall's 11 pass attempts were a championship game low. The previous mark was 12 attempts by Georgia in 2005.
- The SEC championship was Auburn's eighth all-time. The win over Missouri gave Auburn its third SEC Championship since 2004, the most of any program in the league. Florida, LSU and Alabama each have two. Georgia owns one.

Auburn has won more SEC Championships this decade than any other team: 2010: Auburn 56, South Carolina 17; 2011: LSU 42, Georgia 10; 2012: Alabama 32, Georgia 28; 2013: Auburn 59, Missouri 42

- Auburn is the first SEC team to win the SEC title outright after going winless in league play the season before. In 1976, Kentucky tied Georgia with a 5-1 league record to become co-SEC champion after a forfeit was imposed on Mississippi State by the NCAA and SEC.
- Auburn is only the fourth team nationally to win its conference title outright after going winless in league play the previous season and the first to do so since 1972. Kent State won the Mid-American Conference with a 4-1 record after going 0-5 in 1971. Minnesota won the Big 10 in 1900 with a 3-0-1 record after going 0-3 in league play in 1899. Stanford won the Pac-10 Conference in 1940 with a 7-0 record after going 0-6-1 in 1939.

#### Air Marshall Well Grounded

Junior Nick Marshall excelled at the helm of the Auburn offense. He went 11-2 as a starter and engineered four comebacks in the fourth quarter, vs. Mississippi State, Texas A&M, Georgia and Alabama. During Auburn's ninegame win streak, he accounted for 19 touchdowns with only five turnovers. He had 1,068 yards rushing this season.

Marshall passed 1,000 yards rushing against Missouri, only the fourth quarterback in SEC history to reach that plateau. Three of those QBs played for AU (Cam Newton, 2010; Jimmy Sidle, 1963). The other is Texas A&M's Johnny Manziel (2012).

Named SEC player of the week, Marshall rushed for 214 yards on 14 carries at Tennessee, scoring twice, to tie the third-highest rushing total ever by an Auburn quarterback. It was the third-best rushing performance by any player in the SEC this season.

His 62-yard run in the second quarter was a career long for Marshall, the longest run by an Auburn QB since a 71-yard run by Cam Newton vs. Arkansas State (2010), and the longest run ever by an Auburn player vs. Tennessee.

Marshall was 15-26 passing for 229 yards against Georgia, with the game-winning 73-yard pass to Ricardo Louis on 4th-and-18 with 0:25 remaining. Marshall also rushed for 89 yards and two scores vs. Georgia, his fourth multiple rushing TD game.

Marshall gained 99 yards rushing with a 45-yard touchdown run, and passed for two more scores in the win over Alabama.

This season, Marshall passed for 1,976 yards and rushed for 1,068 more, averaging 234.2 yards total offense per game. Second all-time in Auburn QB season rushing, he did not play against Western Carolina and left the Florida Atlantic game early in the second quarter.

Marshall passed for 236 yards and a pair of touchdowns and rushed for 100 yards, scoring twice on runs of 16 and 13 yards in the win at Texas A&M, earning his first SEC offensive player of the week award. At Arkansas, he rushed for 59 yards and his 88-yard touchdown completion to Sammie Coates was the third longest pass play in Auburn history.

Against Ole Miss, Marshall posted his first 100-yard rushing game, with 140 yards on 14 carries, scoring twice. Only seven Auburn QBs have rushed for 100 yards in a game; AU quarterbacks have only rushed for 100 yards in a game 18 times in 121 seasons.

Only three quarterbacks nationally rushed for more yards in a game this season: Jordan Lynch (Northern Ill) 321 vs. W Mich Jordan Lynch (Northern Ill) 316 vs. C Mich Taysom Hill (BYU) 259 vs. Texas Keenan Reynolds (Navy) 240 vs. San Jose St Keenan Reynolds (Navy) 226 vs. Hawaii Nick Marshall (Auburn) 214 at Tennessee

His two touchdown runs against Ole Miss were the first pair of rushing scores by an Auburn QB since Kiehl Frazier scored two rushing TDs in the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl. The last Auburn QB to rush for 100 yards in a game was Cam Newton vs. Georgia in 2010. Marshall became the 61st player in Auburn history to have a 100-yard rushing game.

In just his third start, Marshall finished the Mississippi State game 23-34 passing for 339 yards, the first AU quarterback to pass for 300 yards since Cam Newton threw for 335 vs. South Carolina in the 2010 SEC title game.

Marshall's 339 passing yards were 16th alltime at Auburn for single-game passing yardage and the ninth-highest passing total against a conference opponent. Marshall's 339 yards passing were also the most ever by an Auburn quarterback in an SEC debut.

On the game-winning drive against Mississippi State, Marshall accounted for 84 of the 88 total yards, completing six of eight passes for 65 yards while rushing three times for 19 yards. With his 151 yards passing (9-11) in the first quarter, Marshall had already established a new season high.

Marshall was the first Auburn quarterback to pass for more than 200 yards since Barrett Trotter versus Utah State in 2011, and the first to throw for 200+ yards versus an SEC opponent since Newton did it against South Carolina in the 2010 SEC Championship game. Adding 22 yards rushing, Marshall finished with 361 yards total offense. He also had a 37-yard pass reception off a tipped ball he threw and then caught.

His 339 yards were the most passing yards by an Auburn quarterback since Brandon Cox threw for 343 versus Georgia Tech in 2005. It was just the fifth time since the start of the 2000 season that an Auburn QB has thrown for 339 or more yards:

- Ben Leard, 394 v Michigan, 2000
- Daniel Cobb, 381 v La. Tech [OT], 2001
- Jason Campbell, 374 v Tennessee, 2004 [SEC Championship Game]
- Brandon Cox, 343 v Georgia Tech, 2005
- Nick Marshall, 339 v Miss St, 2013

In the 2013 SEC Championship against Missouri, Marshall rushed for 101 yards and a 9-yard touchdown; he also threw a 38-yard touchdown pass to Sammie Coates. He passed for 217 yards and two scores in the BCS Championship vs. Florida State and rushed for 45 more, with a 4-yard touchdown run.

#### Tre Mason On The Carry

Junior Tre Mason, a Heisman Trophy finalist and the SEC offensive player of the year, had a record-setting year. Mason averaged 129.7 rushing yards per game, best in the SEC. This was the 15th time an Auburn player led the SEC in rushing, most of any school.

He rushed for touchdowns in 11 consecutive games (the second longest streak in the nation) and in 18 of the last 21 games. Eleven straight games is an Auburn record; the old mark was 10 set by Joe Cribbs in 1978-79. Mason rushed for 100+ yards in six consecutive games, the first Auburn back to do so since Kenny Irons in 2005. Mason had nine 100-yard games this season and 12 for his career.

Mason had 32 career rushing touchdowns, 35 total career touchdowns and 12 100-yard games. He had eight career games with multiple touchdowns scored, and finished his career tied for third with Joe Cribbs on Auburn's all-time TD scored list.

His 1,816 yards rushing this season set an Auburn single-season record, breaking Bo Jackson's mark of 1,786 from 1985. Mason's 23 rushing touchdowns this season rank first in Auburn single season records, ahead of Cam Newton (20 in 2010) and tied with Tim Tebow (Florida, 2007) for the most in SEC history.

Mason's 317 rushing attempts this season were the second most in Auburn history; Rudi Johnson had 324 carries in 2000.

His 195-yard performance in the BCS Championship set a title game record for a running back and was the second-highest Championship rushing total ever, behind Texas' Vince Young (200 yards vs. USC in 2006). Mason's 34 carries vs. Florida State set a title game record; the old mark was 25 by Oklahoma's Adrian Peterson vs. USC in 2005. Mason had a rushing (37 yards) and receiving (12 yards) touchdown against the Seminoles.

Mason's 304 yards vs. Missouri were a career-high in rushing yardage, and the second-best rushing game in Auburn history. His previous high was 181 vs. Alabama A&M in 2012; his previous SEC high was 178 vs. Texas A&M this season.

Mason's 195 yards rushing in the first half of the SEC title game surpassed the most rushing yards Missouri gave up to any opposing team this season (184, Texas A&M). It was the second-most yards ever by an Auburn player in the first half and the third-best rushing half ever by an AU player.

Mason's 46 carries in the game broke an Auburn record held by Carnell Williams (Georgia, 2001) and Michael Dyer (South Carolina, 2011). The previous record was 41 carries. Mason's four rushing touchdowns vs. Missouri tied a career-high earlier this season at Arkansas. Mason's attempts (46), yards (304) and touchdowns (4) set SEC Championship records.

Mason crossed the 1,000-yard rushing mark for the second consecutive season with a 10-yard carry in the third quarter of the win at Tennessee; he reached the 1,000-yard mark on his 175th carry of the season.

Mason was the first Auburn player to rush for 1,000 yards in back-to-back seasons since Michael Dyer in 2010-11; the others were Carnell Williams in 2003-04, Stephen Davis in 1994-95, James Brooks in 1979-80 and Joe Cribbs in 1978-79.

Mason had 2,979 rushing yards in his career, putting him sixth all-time at Auburn. Mason's career total is best in Auburn history by a player through the end of his junior season:

Tre Mason 2,979

Stephen Davis 2,811

Carnell Williams 2,666

Bo Jackson 2,517

Rushing for 164 yards and a TD against Alabama, which was only giving up 91.3 rushing yards per game to opponents as a team, Mason posted his fourth consecutive 100-yard game, just the fifth time since 2008 that an opponent rusher gained 100+ yards on Alabama.

Mason had 115 yards rushing and a touchdown in the win over Georgia. He rushed for 117 yards and three touchdowns at Tennessee. Mason is the first Auburn player to rush for eight touchdowns in a three-game span since Cam Newton rushed for nine in 2010.

Mason rushed for 168 yards and four touchdowns in the win at Arkansas on a then-careerhigh 32 carries, the first Auburn player to score four rushing TD in a game since Cam Newton vs. Kentucky in 2010. He earned SEC offensive player of the week honors for that effort.

In his last 21 games (back to Ole Miss in 2012), Mason rushed for 2,511 yards and 30 touchdowns on 429 carries for an average of 119.6 yards per game and 5.85 yards per carry.

In seven games against ranked teams this season (LSU, Ole Miss, Texas A&M, Georgia, Alabama, Missouri, Florida State), Mason totaled 1,165 rushing yards and 11 rushing touchdowns on 210 carries for an average of 5.5 yards per carry and 166.4 rushing yards per game on an average of 30 carries per game. He also caught eight passes for 131 yards (one TD) and returned seven kickoffs for 159 yards in those games.

Mason had seven career 100-yard rushing games against ranked opponents, six in 2013 (LSU, Texas A&M, Georgia, Alabama, Missouri, Florida State). In 18 career games against ranked opponents, Mason averaged 5.5 yards per carry. Mason stepped his game up even more in games against Top 10 competition, totaling 973 yards and nine TDs on 162 carries in five games against teams ranked inside of the Top 10, an average of 194.6 ypg and 6.0 ypc.

He had four of the top 10 rushing performances in the SEC this season:

He, Kent State's Dri Archer and New Mexico's Carlos Wiggins were the only players in the nation with a 100-yard rushing game, a rushing touchdown and 100-yard kick return TD this season.

He led the SEC in rushing touchdowns this season in road games (10); he averaged 148.8 rushing yards in those four road games.

Mason rushed for 178 yards and the gamewinning touchdown at Texas A&M; he had 108 of those in the fourth quarter. Mason had 100 rushing yards, all in the first half, against Western Carolina and 132 yards at LSU.

Mason had two rushing touchdowns of 53 and 20 yards against Western Carolina. He scored on a 1-yard run vs. Ole Miss, twice against LSU and scored an 11-yard rushing TD against Arkansas State and rushing and return scores against Washington State.

His kickoff return touchdown of 100 yards against Washington State was the second KOR score of his career; his first was a 97-yard return against Utah State in the 2011 season opener. The Tigers have returned 21 kickoffs for touchdowns in program history. Mason's three returns that day for 141 yards set an Auburn record for best kick return average (47.0).

Finishing sixth among Auburn career leaders in kickoff return yards with 1,107 total, Mason's 3,832 career all-purpose yards ranked eighth at Auburn. He holds the Auburn single-season record of 2,374 all-purpose yards, breaking the record (1,859) set by Bo Jackson in 1985.

On the final carry of 2012, Mason passed the 1,000-yard rushing mark, finishing with 1,002 yards on 171 carries (the fewest number of carries to 1,000 yards by any SEC rusher last season). He was the first non-quarterback to lead Auburn in total offense for a season since Bo Jackson in 1985.

Mason had 100-yard efforts in 2012 against Alabama A&M (181), New Mexico State (152) and Clemson (106). Mason's 86-yard first-quarter TD run against Alabama A&M was the fourth longest rushing play in AU history and the seventh longest from scrimmage ever.

Mason led Auburn in rushing for the 2012 season season with 1,002 yards on 171 carries, a 5.9-yard per-carry average. Scoring twice against AAMU, his eight touchdowns were also most on the squad; he scored seven of those in the last seven games.

# 2013 AUBURN FOOTBALL GAME NOTES



#### The Ground Game

Auburn led the nation in rushing at 328.3 yards per game due to a trio of outstanding tailbacks -- Tre Mason, Corey Grant and Cameron Artis-Payne -- and quarterback Nick Marshall.

Auburn was the first SEC team ever to lead the NCAA in rushing. Auburn has led the SEC in rushing six times since 1983, the most of any league school.

With 146 yards rushing on nine carries against Washington State, Corey Grant posted his first 100-yard game, the 59th Auburn rusher ever to do so. Grant's 75-yard second quarter TD run was his first Auburn score and the 24th-longest TD run in Auburn history.

Grant made his first career start against Arkansas State, and responded with a 17-yard first quarter touchdown. He scored on a 43-yard run against Florida Atlantic, had the opening touchdown against Georgia, a 21-yard score, and had a 2-yard touchdown run in the SEC Championship against Missouri. Grant averaged 46.2 rushing yards per game and 9.8 yards per carry in 2013.

Cameron Artis-Payne scored his first career touchdown in the fourth quarter of the win over Arkansas State, a 12-yard run that also put him beyond 100 yards on the night, the 60th player in Auburn history to record a 100-yard rushing game. He rushed for 133 yards and a touchdown against Western Carolina.

Artis-Payne scored a touchdown in the fourth quarter at Texas A&M, in the third quarter of the win over Florida Atlantic, and on a 15-yard run in the SEC Championship game against Missouri. The junior college transfer averaged 43.6 yards per game on the ground.

Auburn had 16 100-yard performances to its credit this year. This was the first time in Auburn history that Auburn had four different 100-yard rushers in the same season: Corey Grant (Washington State); Cameron Artis-Payne (Arkansas State and Western Carolina); Nick Marshall (Ole Miss, Texas A&M, Tennessee, Missouri) and Tre Mason (LSU, Western Carolina, Texas A&M, Arkansas, Tennessee, Georgia, Alabama, Missouri, Florida State).

Last season, Auburn scored only eight offensive touchdowns total in eight SEC games. This season, the Tigers scored 32 offensive touchdowns in SEC regular season games and scored eight more in the SEC title game vs. Missouri.

Auburn rushed for three touchdowns against both LSU and Ole Miss; four at Texas A&M, at Arkansas and against Florida Atlantic and Georgia; five against Western Carolina and at Tennessee; and seven vs. Missouri.

Auburn had seven 300-yard rushing games this year; the rest of the SEC had eight combined. It's the first time Auburn rushed for at least three TDs in eight consecutive games through records kept since the 1967 season, and four rushing TDs in seven straight games. It is the first time Auburn has had at least three rushing TDs in seven straight SEC games through records back through 1967.

#### 50+ Carries

Auburn averaged 52.1 rushing attempts per game in 2013. The Tigers carried the ball 50 or more times in nine contests (74 Missouri; 60 Texas A&M; 59 Florida Atlantic; 57 Georgia; 53 Florida State; 53 Tennessee; 52 LSU; 52 Alabama; 50 Arkansas State).

Since 1967, Auburn is 144-36-3 (.795) when rushing 50+ times in a game, 45-6-1 (.873) when rushing 60+ times in a game, 6-0 when rushing 70+ times in a game, and 1-0 when rushing 80+ times in a game (82 carries in a 41-0 win over Ole Miss in 1985).

# Interceptors

Auburn recorded 13 interceptions this season, after grabbing only two all last year. Seven different players accounted for those picks, led by Robenson Therezie with four and Ryan Smith with three.

Therezie and Joshua Holsey each recorded their first career interception against Washington State. It marked the first time two players recorded their first career picks in the same game since Jake Holland and Jermaine Whitehead did so vs. Florida Atlantic in 2011.

Therezie was the first Auburn player to record two interceptions in a game since Josh Bynes against Arkansas in 2010. Auburn as a team had only two interceptions in the 2012 season. Therezie was selected as SEC Defensive Player of the Week and the Jim Thorpe Award national defensive back of the week.

Therezie scored on a 78-yard interception against Ole Miss, the eighth longest such play in Auburn history. It was the longest interception return for a touchdown by an Auburn player since Walter McFadden in the 2010 Outback Bowl vs. Northwestern. Auburn's last interception for a touchdown was by Trent Fisher vs.

Alabama A&M last season, a 60-yard return. It was Therezie's third interception of the season, and the first interception thrown by Ole Miss' Bo Wallace this year.

Therezie's fourth pick of the season came at Tennessee. The last Auburn player to have four interceptions in a season was Walter McFadden with six in 2009.

Ryan Smith recorded his first career interception against Ole Miss in the fourth quarter of that win, and had a first-quarter interception at Texas A&M. He had Auburn's only interception versus Georgia, his third pick of the season.

Jermaine Whitehead recorded a thirdquarter interception at LSU, breaking Zach Mettenberger's string of 77 pass attempts without an interception. It was Auburn's first interception in an SEC game since 2011 vs. Ole Miss (T'Sharvan Bell). It was the second career pick for Whitehead; his first was versus Florida Atlantic in 2011. Whitehead added another interception in the SEC Championship against Missouri.

Jonathon Mincy recorded his first career interception, and the first by an AU corner since 2011, with a 10-yard pick against Western Carolina. Ryan White posted his first career interception versus Texas A&M and Cassanova McKinzy nabbed his first career interception at Arkansas.

#### Catching On

Sophomores Sammie Coates (42) and Ricardo Louis (28) and true freshman Marcus Davis (23) were three of Auburn's top four receivers. The young trio combined for 93 receptions for 1,444 yards and 10 touchdowns. Those totals account for 54% of Auburn's receptions and 60% of its receiving yards this year.

Junior Quan Bray, with 23 catches for 195 yards and three touchdowns, rounded out the Auburn reception leading quartet.

Coates' 902 receiving yards rank seventh on Auburn's single season list, and he is seventh in season receiving touchdowns with seven.

Coates set a career high at LSU with 139 yards receiving on four receptions, his first career 100-yard receiving game and the first for an AU receiver since Emory Blake vs. Georgia in 2012. Coates had 104 yards receiving on five catches in the win at Texas A&M, including a 43-yard TD catch. He had 113 yards receiving on just three catches against Florida Atlantic,

with touchdowns of 67 and 36 yards from Jeremy Johnson. He had 102 yards on three catches at Arkansas, including a career-long 88 yard touchdown from Nick Marshall.

The last Auburn receiver to record three straight 100-yard games was Tyrone Goodson vs. Ole Miss, LSU and UCF in 1997. The last to catch a touchdown pass in three consecutive games was Philip Lutzenkirchen in 2011.

Coates, who had a 39-yard touchdown reception in the final minute of the win over Alabama and a 38-yard TD in the SEC Championship against Missouri, finished third nationally in yards per catch (21.5). His 14 catches this year of 30+ yards were third most of any player nationally. His seven catches of 40+ yards this season were 11th nationally and he was third in the country with five catches of 50+ yards. With three catches of 60+ yards, Coates was tied for ninth nationally.

Coates had seven touchdown catches this season, and averaged 54.1 yards per TD reception; the TD distances: 88, 68, 67, 43, 39, 38, 36.

Louis caught the dramatic 73-yard tipped pass that won the Georgia game. He had 131 receiving on just four catches (his first career 100-yard game) and added another 66 yards rushing against the Bulldogs, earning him a spot on the Paul Hornung Award honor roll.

#### No Return Policy

Senior punter Steven Clark, a 2011 Ray Guy Award finalist and 2012 and 2013 semifinalist, had a season average of 42.6 with nine of 50+ yards and 26 inside the 20. Clark had only five punts returned during 2013 on 56 kicks. He did not punt against Western Carolina.

Only five of his 70 punts in 2012 were returned. Clark averaged 39.8 yards per punt in 2012, placing 15 kicks inside the 20. His season long was 54 yards against LSU; he had six punts last year of 50 yards or more.

For his career, Clark had a 40.7 average on 207 career punts, with 74 punts landing inside the 20 and 28 kicks of 50 yards or longer. Only 10.6 percent of his career punts (22-207) were returned, an average of 5.4 yards per return.

A second team Capital One Academic All-American, National Football Foundation scholarship and Senior CLASS Award nominee, Clark finished third in Auburn career punts (207) and fourth in career punting yards (8,423).

#### **Introducing Jeremy Johnson**

True freshman quarterback Jeremy Johnson saw his first collegiate action making his first start against Western Carolina. In that 62-3 Auburn victory, Johnson was 17-21 passing for 201 yards and four touchdowns against just one interception. He also rushed for 26 yards, earning SEC Freshman of the Week honors.

Johnson's four TD passes vs. WCU were the most by an Auburn quarterback since Clint Moseley threw four against Ole Miss in 2011, and tied him with Stan White (vs. Cal State Fullerton, 1990) for second-most career passes by an Auburn QB in his first career start but the most by a true freshman. Daniel Cobb threw for five touchdowns against Louisiana Tech in his debut in 2001 as a junior.

Johnson entered the action against Florida Atlantic early in the second quarter and threw a 36-yard touchdown pass to Sammie Coates on his very first play. Johnson was 10-16 passing for 192 yards and two scores (both to Coates) and also rushed for 21 yards against FAU, earning SEC Freshman of the Week honors for the second time this season.

#### Parkey For Three

Cody Parkey hit three field goals in the 24-20 Mississippi State win, including a 47-yarder that tied his then-career long, earning Lou Groza Award Star of the Week honors. Parkey also kicked a 47-yarder against Washington State, one of three FG he made in that 31-24 win. Parkey's 52-yard field goal in the SEC championship game was a career long for the senior and is 10th in Auburn records and the longest since 2008.

Parkey had his SEC-leading string of 90 consecutive PAT kicks made snapped with a blocked PAT at Tennessee. He had 136 career PAT (136-138), making him the fifth player in Auburn history to kick more than 100.

Parkey ranked fifth in Auburn career field goal percentage at .736 (39-53). His string of 19 straight field goals made from 45 yards and in, dating back through the 2011 Chick-fil-A Bowl, was broken on a 40-yarder vs. Florida Atlantic. He is 14-19 on field goals this season.

Parkey was first in the nation in touchbacks with 69 this season. During his career, 142 of Parkey's 248 kickoffs went for touchbacks (.573), including 141 of 213 since the beginning of his sophomore season (.662).

In 2012, Parkey converted on nine straight three-pointers dating back through the 2011 season, before missing on a 49-yarder vs. Arkansas. That tied the third best string of consecutive field goals at Auburn since 1981. Parkey was 11-14 on field goals in 2012 and 27-27 on PAT kicks. He made four field goals versus Clemson (37-46-27-36 yards), tying a Chick-fil-A Kickoff Classic record and earning him Lou Groza Award star of the week honors. Parkey's game-winner against ULM earned him SEC Special Teams Player of the Week honors.

#### The Return Game

Auburn was one of five teams nationally to return a kickoff and a punt for a touchdown in the same game this season:

Auburn was one of 18 teams to return both a kickoff and a punt for a TD in 2013, and one of 12 teams nationally with at least three kickoff/punt returns for touchdowns:

Auburn ranks second in the nation among teams with the longest active streak of kickoff returns for a touchdown in consecutive seasons. The Tigers have had at least one kickoff return for a score in each of the past six seasons, including Tre Mason's 100-yard return against Washington State and Corey Grant's 90-yard return at Tennessee.

Schools with the most consecutive seasons with a kickoff return for a score: 9: *Kansas State*; 6: *Auburn*; 5: *Northern Illinois*; 4: *Florida*.

Auburn's KOR touchdowns during that string were by: Corey Grant (90 vs. Tennessee, 2013); Onterio McCalebb (100 vs. Mississippi State, 2012 and 83 vs. Alabama, 2011); Tre Mason (97 vs. Utah State in 2011 and 100 vs. Washington State, 2013); Demond Washington (95 vs. Ole Miss, 2010 and 99 vs. Georgia,

2009); and Tristan Davis (97 vs. Arkansas and 95 vs. UT-Martin, 2008).

Only 12 teams returned multiple kickoffs for touchdowns this season: Auburn, Duke, Florida State, Iowa State, New Mexico, North Carolina, Purdue, Rutgers, Stanford, TCU, Texas State and UTEP.

# **First-Time Tigers**

In the season opener against Washington State, 14 Auburn players saw their first action in a Tiger uniform: Montravius Adams, Will Adams, Mackenro Alexander, Cameron Artis-Payne, Ben Bradley, Elijah Daniel, Marcus Davis, Johnathan Ford, Brandon King, Alex Kozan, Carl Lawson, Robert Leff, Nick Marshall and JaViere Mitchell.

There were eight more Tigers who saw their first Auburn action against Arkansas State: Gage Batten, Shon Coleman, T.J. Davis, Jordan Diamond, Kenny Flowers, Kamryn Melton, Gimel President and Tony Stevens. Patrick Lymon saw his first action at LSU.

Twelve players saw their first collegiate action against Western Carolina: Eric Averett, Shane Callahan, Wirth Campbell, Michael Clifton, Devonte Danzey, Adam Dyas, Khari Harding, Jeremy Johnson, Tyler Nero, Dimitri Reese, Chandler Shakespeare and Mack VanGorder.

Kyle Bolstad, Reid Brooks and Jackson Thomas were first-time players against Florida Atlantic.

Of Auburn's 38 first-time players in 2013, 10 were true freshmen, 16 were redshirt freshmen and six were junior college transfers.

#### Average Per Down

Here's a breakdown of how the 2013 Auburn offense operated on first, second, third and fourth down.

On first down, the Tigers ran a total of 460 plays, gaining 3,308 yards for an average of 7.19 yards per play. On second down, AU tried 371 plays for 2,204 yards, an average of 5.94 per play. On third down, the Tigers ran 185 plays, gaining 1,305 yards for a 7.05 average. Auburn tried 15 fourth-down attempts, gaining 98 yards (6.5-yard average).

Auburn's touchdowns came 26 times on first down (19 rush, seven pass), 24 times on second down (19 rush, five pass), 16 times on third down (nine rush, seven pass) and twice on fourth down (one run, one pass).

#### Academic All-America

Auburn punter Steven Clark was honored as a 2013 second team Capital One Academic All-American, selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America. These teams recognize the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances athletically and in the classroom. Capital One has been the entitlement rights holder to CoSIDA's Academic All-America programs since 2011.

Clark, who graduated in May with his bachelor's degree in exercise science, had a 3.70 grade-point average as an undergraduate and is enrolled in graduate studies in biomechanics.

Defensive back Trent Fisher, a junior safety from Brentwood, Tenn., was an academic all-district honoree. A nominee for the Burlsworth Trophy, he holds a 3.73 grade-point average in communication.

#### **Scoring By Quarters**

This season in the first quarter, the Tigers outscored the opposition 149-69. In the second quarter, Auburn outscored its opponents 166-120. In the third quarter, Auburn outscored its opponents 121-78, and the Tigers held a 117-79 lead in the fourth quarter.

Auburn had three streaks of scoring in at least 10 consecutive quarters this season. The Tigers started the season by scoring in all 12 quarters the first three games. After being shut out in the first half at LSU, Auburn scored in 17 quarters until the fourth quarter of the Florida Atlantic game. Auburn ended the season scoring in 22 straight quarters before being shut out in the third quarter of the BCS title game vs. Florida State.

Auburn last scored in 20 consecutive quarters in 2010 when the Tigers scored in 21 straight quarters. Auburn scored in the fourth quarter against Kentucky and all four quarters against Arkansas, LSU, Ole Miss, Chattanooga and Georgia.

For the season, Auburn scored in 52 of 56 quarters (.929). Additionally, Auburn scored a touchdown in 47 of 56 quarters (.839).

#### **Conversion Rate**

The Auburn defense ranked first in the SEC allowing opponents to convert just 25.0 percent (11-44) of third down attempts in the fourth quarter, and only 28.75 percent (23-80) in the second half, second-best in the SEC, during the regular season.

The Tiger defense kept Mississippi State from converting a third down in the second half; MSU was 0-7. The last time Auburn held an SEC opponent to zero first downs for a half was last year at Vanderbilt, where the Commodores were 0-4 on second-half third downs.

#### The Graduates

Eleven members of the 2013 Auburn squad earned bachelor's degrees. May graduates were Nosa Eguae (communication), Steven Clark (exercise science) and Chandler Shakespeare (business management).

Craig Sanders (human development and family studies) and Ryan Smith (public administration) were August graduates.

Six more Tigers graduated with bachelor's degrees December 14: Kenneth Carter (public adminstration), Chris Davis (public administration), Dee Ford (public administration), Jake Lembke (wildlife ecology and management), Jonathon Mincy (public administration) and Cody Parkey (communication).

#### Fantastic Finish I

In its 24-20 win over Mississippi State, Auburn scored the game-winning touchdown with just 10 seconds left in the game. The winning play was an 11-yard TD pass to C.J. Uzomah from Nick Marshall, capping off Auburn's 12-play, 88-yard drive that began with just 1:56 remaining. The last time Auburn scored a game-winning touchdown in the final 30 seconds of regulation in a game was against Utah State in 2011 (Michael Dyer 1-yard TD run).

Auburn's 24-20 victory over Mississippi State was the Tigers' first fourth-quarter comeback win in an SEC game since the Tigers won at No. 10 South Carolina 16-13 with 1:38 left on a Barrett Trotter 9-yard touchdown pass to Philip Lutzenkirchen in 2011.

Auburn's last victory before 2013 over an SEC opponent in the final seconds of the game was a 37-34 win at Kentucky in 2010 on a 24-yard Wes Byrum field goal as time expired. Auburn's most recent victory over any opponent in the final seconds was the 22-19 victory over Oregon in the 2010 BCS National Championship Game with Wes Byrum's 19-yard field goal as time expired.

#### Fantastic Finish II

After holding a 27-10 halftime lead over No. 25 Georgia, Auburn was down 38-37 to the Bulldogs with just 1:45 remaining in the game. Starting the drive at the AU 22, a Nick Marshall

completion to Marcus Davis and a four-yard rush by Marshall gained a first down, but two incomplete passes and a 6-yard sack left Auburn at 4th-and-18 from its own 27.

Marshall threw the ball deep and it was tipped by one of the Georgia defenders in double coverage. But Ricardo Louis stuck with the play, grabbing the tip at the 14 yard line and running to the endzone, a 73-yard touchdown play that put Auburn ahead 43-38 with just 0:25 remaining in one of the greatest finishes ever at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

#### Fantastic Finish III

With the Iron Bowl tied 21-21 after three quarters, Alabama broke the deadlock with 10:28 remaining on a 99-yard pass play from A.J. McCarron to Amari Cooper. Auburn was forced to punt on its next two drives, and Alabama attemped a 44-yard field goal with 2:32 remaining that was blocked by Auburn's Nosa Eguae, Alabama's third missed field goal of the game.

Taking over at the AU 35, Nick Marshall engineered another comeback drive culminated by a 39-yard touchdown pass to Sammie Coates with just 0:32 remaining to tie the game again 28-28. Alabama moved the ball to the AU 38 as time expired, but the officials returned one second to the clock, ruling that was the time the runner stepped out of bounds.

Alabama set up to attempt a 57-yard field goal, which fell short in the endzone into the waiting grasp of Auburn return man Chris Davis, who took the return the length of the field for a 100+ yard touchdown in one of the greatest finishing plays in college football history.

#### 100-Yard Rusher, 100-Yard Receiver

Tre Mason gained 132 yards rushing against LSU, his first 100-yard outing against an SEC opponent. Sammie Coates, with 139 yards receiving against LSU, posted his first career 100-yard game.

That's the first time an Auburn duo combined for 100 yards rushing and receiving since last year's season opener with Clemson, when Mason (106 rushing) and Emory Blake (109 receiving) posted those marks. It's the first such duo for Auburn in an SEC game since the 2011 Mississippi State game, when Blake had 108 yards receiving and Michael Dyer totalled 150 yards rushing.

Mason (178 yards rushing) and Coates (104 yards receiving) combined again to repeat the

feat at Texas A&M, and again in the win at Arkansas (Mason 168, Coates 102). Mason (115 rushing) and Ricardo Louis (131 receiving) gained the combination vs. Georgia.

This is the first time Auburn has had four such combination games in one season. The previous best was three in 1994, when Stephen Davis had 100+ yards rushing against Mississippi State, Florida and Arkansas, and Frank Sanders (twice), Andy Fuller and Thomas Bailey were the 100-yard receivers.

#### **National Numbers**

#### **For Starters**

Auburn had 45 players with at least one career start on its 2013 roster. Tops was Nosa Eguae with 43 career starts, eighth among current SEC players.

Thirteen players made their first career start for Auburn this season. Five made their first Auburn start against Washington State: QB Nick Marshall, OG Alex Kozan, DE Craig Sanders, DE LaDarius Owens and Star Robenson Therezie. Against Arkansas State, defensive tackle Ben Bradley and tailback Corey Grant were first-time starters.

Marcus Davis made his first start at WR against Ole Miss. QB Jeremy Johnson, WR Ricardo Louis and RB Cameron Artis-Payne were first-time starters against Western Carolina. LB Kris Frost and WR Melvin Ray made their first start at Texas A&M.

#### When Scoring 20+ Points

Since 2001, Auburn is 113-16 (.876) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to the start of the 1993 season, Auburn is 151-23-1 (.866) when scoring 20 or more points in a game.

#### 300-Yard SEC Half

Auburn's 333 second-half yards gained at LSU marked the first 300+ half an Auburn offense posted versus an SEC opponent since gaining 348 yards in the first half of the 2010 SEC Championship against South Carolina. The last time Auburn had a 300-yard half in the SEC regular season was a 344-yard first half against Kentucky in 2010.

Auburn also gained 333 yards in the second half of the Tigers' 45-41 win at No. 7 Texas A&M, and gained 327 yards in the first half against No. 25 Georgia.

In the SEC Championship versus Missouri, Auburn gained 376 total yards in the first half and added 301 more in the second half.

#### **Winningest Programs**

Entering the 2013 campaign, Auburn ranked among the 15 winningest BCS college football programs in all-time wins; the Tigers now have 726 total victories. Teams that have 700+ all-time wins: Michigan, Texas, Nebraska, Notre Dame, Penn State, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Alabama, Tennessee, Southern Cal, Georgia, LSU, Auburn, West Virginia, Syracuse, Virginia Tech, Texas A&M and Georgia Tech.

#### 2015 Chick-fil-A Kickoff

Auburn will meet the Louisville Cardinals in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game to open the 2015 college football season. The game is scheduled for Saturday, September 5, 2015.

#### GAME 1

Auburn opened the Gus Malzahn era with a 31-24 win over Washington State at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The two teams played a see-saw first half, which saw five lead changes and 46 total points before Auburn pulled out the victory.

Auburn rushed for 295 yards on 46 carries, led by Corey Grant's 146, which included a 75-yard touchdown run in the second quarter which helped give Auburn a lead it would hold onto for the rest of the game.

Nick Marshall finished 10-for-19 for 99 yards. Sammie Coates (44 yards) and Quan Bray (28 yards) each had three catches.

Auburn's defense collected three interceptions on the night, two by Robenson Therezie, including one in the end zone as Washington State was driving late in the fourth quarter for a tying score.

Washington State struck first, taking a 7-0 lead on a Jeremiah Laufasa 4-yard run, capping a 12-play, 75-yard drive.

Auburn took its first lead of the game when Ryan White's two-point conversion run made it 8-7 following a Tre Mason 8-yard scoring run. The touchdown the 10th of Mason's career while the successful twopoint conversion was Auburn's first since Lee Guess caught a Carl Stewart pass at Alabama in 2006.

Washington State took a 14-8 lead with 8:02 left in the first half on a Connor Halliday 7-yard touchdown pass to Bobby Ratliff, capping off a nine-play, 67-yard drive. The lead was short-lived, however, as Mason returned the ensuing kickoff 100 yards for the game-tying score. A successful Cody Parkey extra-point put Auburn ahead, 15-14.

Mason's 100-yard kick return tied for the second-longest in school history and marks the sixth consecutive season in which Auburn has returned at least one kickoff for a touchdown, tied for the third-longest active streak in the nation.

Washington State wasted little time answering Mason's return, going 75 yards in just 1:28 to reclaim the lead, 21-15, with 6:18 left in the half. Halliday hit Ratliff for a 53-yard pass down to the 1-yard line before Laufasa carried it in for his second score of the day.

Grant's 75-yard touchdown run on the first play following the WSU score tied it and a Parkey SCORING SUMMARY

extra point gave Auburn the lead for good, 22-21. A career-long 47-yard

field goal by Parkey with 1:11 left in the first half put Auburn ahead, 25-21.

The two teams traded field goals during the third quarter as Parkey's 26-yarder extended Auburn's lead to 28-21 while an Andrew Furney 43-yard kick made it 28-24 with 4:18 left in the quarter. That was the only scoring in the quarter.

Parkey's third field goal of the day, a 42-yard kick with 9:07 left in the game, extended the lead to the final seven-point margin, 31-24.

#### GAME 2

Nick Marshall threw for 147 yards and two touchdowns and tailbacks Tre Mason, Corey Grant and Cameron Artis-Payne each scored a rushing touchdown as Auburn (2-0) cruised to a 38-9 win over Arkansas State (1-1) at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Artis-Payne, finishing the night with 102 yards on 19 carries, led an Auburn rushing attack that finished with 301 yards on the ground.

Marshall finished the night 10-for-17, connecting with seven different receivers, as Auburn led from start to finish.

Mason finished the game with 99 yards on 14 carries, including an 11-yard touchdown in the third quarter that put Auburn up 28-9, while Artis-Payne's 12-yard touchdown run came in the fourth quarter and was the final score of the game.

Marshall's first career touchdown pass landed in the hands of Marcus Davis for an 18-yard score to put Auburn up a touchdown just 3:23 into the game. The catch was the first of the season for Davis.

After a Brian Davis field goal cut the lead to 7-3, Grant rushed 17 yards around right end to cap an 8-play, 85-yard drive to put Auburn ahead, 14-3. The touchdown marked the second straight week that Grant carried a touchdown in, marking the first Auburn player since Onterio McCalebb in 2009 to score in each of the first two Auburn games of a season. Mason would later join Grant in the accomplishment.

Marshall found Sammie Coates just 2:20 before halftime for a 68-yard touchdown strike that extended Auburn's lead to 21-3. The catch was the longest of Coates' career.

Davis hit a 21- and a 42-yard field goal in the third quarter for Arkansas State, cutting the margin to 12 at 21-9 before Mason's third touchdown of the season gave Auburn a 28-9 lead with just 1:14 left in the third quarter.

Cody Parkey's 35-yard field goal with 8:46 left in the game extended the lead to 31-9. It capped off an 11-play, 62-yard drive that lasted 5:12, its longest of the game by both time and number of plays.

Chris Davis finished with a career-high 10 tackles for Auburn, including seven solo, 1.5 sacks, two pass break ups and one forced fumble.

#### GAME 3

Nick Marshall hit C.J. Uzomah for a 11-yard touchdown pass with just 10 seconds left in the game as Auburn rallied to defeat Mississippi State, 24-20, at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Marshall finished the night with 339 yards passing and two touchdowns as Auburn moved to 3-0 (1-0 SEC) on the season.

Facing a 3rd-down and 10 on the Mississippi State 25-yard line, Marshall rushed over left end for 11 yards and a key first down to keep Auburn's final drive alive. Two plays later, Marshall connected with Uzomah, who finished with three catches for 48 yards, for the gamewinner. Auburn's drive had started on its own 12-yard line with just 1:56 on the clock.

Marshall, who finished 23-34 with two touchdown and two interceptions, had the first 300-yard passing game by an Auburn quarterback since Cam Newton threw for 335-yards in the 2010 SEC Championships Game against South Carolina.

Marshall connected with nine different receivers in the game, with Quan Bray leading the team in yards with 80, while Marcus Davis led the team in receptions with six, totaling 43 yards.

Mississippi State (1-2, 0-1 SEC) had taken its first lead of the game, 20-14, when Dak Prescott scored his second rushing touchdown of the game, a 2-yard scamper just 2:22 into the third quarter.

Cody Parkey's 47-yard field goal, which tied a career long, cut the lead to 20-17 with 9:53 left in the third quarter.

A Parkey 40-yard field goal and a Bray 76 yard touchdown reception helped Auburn jump out to an early 11-0 lead. Instead of kicking the extra point following Bray's catch from Marshall, Auburn successfully went for the 2-point conversion for the second time this season. Bray's reception was the first touchdown catch of his career while the 76-yard connection tied for the 19th-longest in Auburn history and was the longest since Newton hit Terrell Zachery for an 80-yard touchdown against Chattanooga in 2010.

Mississippi State cut the lead to 11-6 as Jameon Lewis rushed for

Parkey's second field goal, a 19-yarder, extended Auburn's lead to 14-6 but a 5-yard touchdown run by Dak Prescott following an 11-play, 84-yard Mississippi State drive and a successful PAT made it 14-13 going into halftime.

Prescott finished the game with 213 yards on 15-for-28 passing and added 133 yards rushing on the ground.

#### **GAME 4**

In the first loss of the Gus Malzahn era, LSU's Jeremy Hill rushed for a career-high 184 yards and three touchdowns as No. 6 LSU defeated Auburn 35-21 on a rainy Saturday night in Tiger Stadium.

Playing in inclement conditions throughout the night, both teams were forced into a ground game with Auburn (3-1, 1-1 SEC) totaling 213 rushing yards to LSU's 228. Auburn out-rushed LSU 140-74 after halftime.

Tre Mason led the way on the ground for Auburn with 132 yards on 26 carries and two touchdowns. He was the third different 100-yard rusher for Auburn in 2013 joining teammates Corey Grant and Cameron Artis-Payne.

The performance was his first 100-yard game since Alabama A&M in 2011 and the fourth of his career. It was his first 100-yard rushing game against an SEC opponent in his career.

Auburn opened the second half with an interception by safety Jermaine Whitehead of LSU quarterback Zach Mettenberger. The pick was the first of the season by Whitehead and his first since 2011.

The Tigers followed up the interception with a two-yard touchdown run by Mason. Mason later added another two-yard touchdown late in the fourth quarter to post his fourth career game with two rushing touchdowns.

The score capped a 10-play, 94-yard drive that included a 52-yard throw from Nick Marshall to Sammie Coates - the longest play surrendered by the LSU defense in 2013. Marshall completed 17-of-33 passes for 224 yards with two interceptions. He also rushed for 46 yards on 14

Artis-Payne added a 12-yard touchdown late in the fourth quarter. He finished with 41 yards on seven carries.

Coates finished with a career-best 139 yards on four receptions to become Auburn's first 100-yard receiver of the season. Ricardo Louis had a career-high five catches.

Mettenberger finished the game 14-of-22 for 229 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Jarvis Landry had seven receptions

for 118 yards to lead LSU.

Cassanova McKinzy led Auburn with eight tackles, 1.5 sacks and 2.5 tackles for loss. Robenson Therezie also totaled eight tackles.

#### GAME 5

Auburn raced out to a 17-point first half lead and then held off an Ole Miss second-half rally as Auburn defeated the No. 24 Rebels, 30-22, on Saturday night at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Quarterback Nick Marshall finished with 140 yards rushing as Auburn moved to 4-1, 2-1 SEC on the season.

Auburn's defense played a key role in the win, sacking the Ole Miss (3-2, 1-2 SEC) quarterbacks six times and also intercepting two passes. Robenson Therezie had one of the two picks for the Auburn defense, returning a Bo Wallace second-quarter pass 78 yards for a touchdown and a 13-3 Auburn lead late in the first quarter.

The six sacks by the Auburn defense were the most for an Auburn defensive unit since it registered 11 quarterback sacks against Alabama in 2005.

Auburn jumped out to a 20-3 lead on the back of touchdown runs from Tre Mason and Marshall and Therezie's pick-six. Mason's 1-yard rush capped off a six-play, 80-yard drive early on Auburn's first drive to put it up 6-0 while Marshall pushed the lead to 20-3 with a 5-yard touchdown run with 5:17 left in the first half to cap an 8-play, 80-yard drive.

Ole Miss scored on a pair of first half field goals. Andrew Ritter hit on a 42-yard field goal in the first quarter and then a 44-yarder with 41 seconds left in the half to make it 20-6 in Auburn's favor at the half.

Ritter connected on a 22-yard field goal early in the third quarter to cut it 20-9 only to have Marshall answer with his second rushing touchdown of the game, a 5-yard run as Auburn went up 27-9 with 6:35 left in the third

Ole Miss wouldn't go away quietly as Wallace hit Donte Moncrief for a 49-yard touchdown pass with 5:55 to go in the third and a 13-yard touchdown pass with 8:29 to go in the fourth to make it 27-22.

The two teams traded turnovers in the fourth quarter following the second Wallace to Moncrief connection. Auburn's Cameron Artis-Payne had the ball stripped for a fumble following an 18-yard run to give Ole Miss the ball at its own 40-yard line but Ole Miss gave it back just three plays later when Ryan Smith intercepted a Wallace pass in the flat.

After a 3-and-out by the Auburn offense, Auburn punter Steven Clark pinned Ole Miss at its own 1-yard line with a 39-

Cody Parkey would connect on a 23-yard field goal to make it an 8-point game, 30-22, and then the Auburn defense held strong, sacking Wallace on third- and fourth-down before kneeling on the ball to end the game.

Marshall's 140-yard rushing effort marked the fourth time this season Auburn has had a 100yard rusher, with Marshall being the fourth different runner to hit the century mark. Corey Grant (Washington State), Artis-Payne (Arkansas State) and Mason (LSU) have also had 100-vard rushing nights, marking the first time Auburn has had four different 100-yard single-game rushers in a season.

#### GAME 6

Jeremy Johnson threw for four touchdowns and completed 17-of-21 passes in his first career start as Auburn (5-1) cruised to a 62-3 win over Western Carolina (1-6). Auburn accounted for a school-record 712 yards of total offense on the day, which included 511 yards rushing, the third-most rushing total in school history.

Johnson and Auburn jumped out to a 42-3 halftime lead while holding the ball for 12:29, scoring on six of its seven first-half possessions. The true freshman finished with 201 yards passing, 183 of it in the first half, hitting eight different receivers while also carrying it for 26 yards on three carries.

Tre Mason finished with 100 yards rushing, his second 100-yard rushing game of the season and the fifth of his career. He scored on a 20-yard carry on Auburn's first possession of the game and later scored on a 53yard run that put Auburn up 35-3 with 7:46 left in the first half to give him seven rushing touchdowns this season.

Cameron Artis-Payne also topped 100 yards on the ground, carrying it seven times for 133 yards. His 25-yard touchdown run up the middle midway through the third quarter extended Auburn's lead to 56-3.

Corey Grant carried it five times for 83 yards, scoring on a 51-yard run that put Auburn up 28-3 with 13:54 left in the second quarter. Johnathan Ford (2 carries, 45 yards) also had a rushing touchdown, scoring on a 38-yard run up the middle just 10 seconds into the final quarter, while Chandler Shakespeare finished with 61 yards on 10 carries, all of it coming in the fourth quarter.

Auburn's rushing total was its most since it ran for 526 yards against Furman in 1946 while the school record is 565 yards rushing against Southwest Louisiana in 1985.

Johnson hit Jay Prosch for an 8-yard score on Auburn's second possession of the game, the first career passing and receiving touchdown for the duo. On Auburn's next possession Johnson hit Ricardo Louis for a 46-yard touchdown strike to extend the Auburn lead to 21-3.

Quan Bray led the Auburn receivers with four catches while Louis' 53 yards were tops on the team. Bray caught a 3-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter for his first receiving touchdown of the season while

Tony Stevens, who caught three passes for 47 yards, scored on a 22-yard pass with just 1:38 left before the half.

Auburn tallied nine touchdowns on the afternoon (five rushing, four receiving), with eight different players scoring.

Kris Frost and Anthony Swain tied for the teamhigh in tackles with three each while Dee Ford, Justin DeLaine, Jabrian Niles and Elijah Daniel each recorded a sack for Auburn's defense, which allowed just 173 yards of total offense to Western Carolina.

Jonathon Mincy had an interception for the Auburn defense, its seventh of the season and the first of his career.

#### GAME 7

Senior defensive end Dee Ford sacked Heisman Trophy winner Johnny Manziel twice in the final three plays to force seventh-ranked Texas A&M into a turnover on downs with 11 seconds remaining as No. 24 Auburn knocked off the Aggies 45-41 on Saturday at Kyle Field.

The win was the first for Auburn over a ranked opponent on the road since October 10, 2011 at No. 10 South Carolina.

Tre Mason put the Tigers (6-1, 3-1) ahead with just over a minute remaining with a five-yard touchdown run. The junior running back finished with 178 yards rushing on a career-high 28 attempts for his sixth career 100-yard rushing game and third of the season.

Auburn fell behind 34-24 in the first minute of the fourth quarter, but stormed back scoring 21 points in the final stanza on three-straight possessions.

Quarterback Nick Marshall scored his second rushing touchdown of the day from 13 yards out before Cameron Artis-Payne found pay dirt on a 2-yard run to take a 38-34 lead.

Manziel then put the Aggies on top 41-38 with five minutes remaining with his 1-yard touchdown plunge setting the stage for Auburn's final drive.

Auburn converted three third downs on the final drive included an impressive 27-yard connection from Marshall to freshman wide receiver Marcus Davis on a 3rd-and-9 down to the Texas A&M 12-yard line.

The Tigers finished the day 7-of-14 on third down. After converting its first third down attempt, Auburn held the Aggies to just one of its next five leading to a 5-of-13 afternoon.

Marshall finished the day 11-of-23 for 236 yards and two touchdowns while also rushing 20 times for 100 yards and two scores. It was his second career 100-yard rushing performance.

Sammie Coates was the leading receiver with 104 yards on five catches and a 43-yard score. Quan Bray also had a 13-yard touchdown to go

with three receptions for 28 yards. Manziel was 28-

#### **GAME 8**

Auburn kept the ball on the ground for each of its first 14 plays, gaining 165 yards and scoring three touchdowns en route to a 45-10 win over Florida Atlantic on Saturday night at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn finished the game with 422 yards rushing and 628 yards of total offense, marking the third time this season Auburn has gone over 600 yards of total offense in a game.

Tre Mason, Corey Grant and Nick Marshall all scored for Auburn (7-1) in the first quarter. Mason scored on an 8-yard run, Grant on a 43-yard run and Marshall on a 10-yard run as Auburn raced out to the 21-point lead. Auburn finished the first quarter with 186 yards rushing on 18 carries for a 10.3 yards per rush mark.

When Auburn did throw a pass, Jeremy Johnson, who had come in for an injured Nick Marshall, hit Sammie Coates for a 36 yard touchdown pass as Auburn extended its lead to 28-0 with 13:55 left in the first half. Auburn ended the first half with 440 total yards and a 38-7 lead.

Johnson finished the game 10-for-16 for 192 yards with two touchdowns and an interception. Both of his touchdown passes went to Coates, who also hauled in a 67-yard touchdown catch with 3:10 to go

Cameron Artis-Payne scored Auburn's final rushing touchdown of the game, his fifth of the season, midway through the third quarter.

Ten different players contributed to Auburn's 422 yards rushing with Artis-Payne leading the way with 93 yards, Grant with 75, Marshall with 73 and Mason with 60.

The 422 yards rushing gave Auburn 2,523 rushing yards on the season, which is the most it has gained in an entire season since it finished the 2010 season with 3,987 yards on the ground.

Florida Atlantic (2-6) was held to 247 yards of total offense, marking the second time this season Auburn has held an opponent under 250 yards of total offense in a game.

#### GAME 9

Tre Mason rushed for 168 yards and a career-best four touchdowns to lead No. 8 Auburn to a 35-17 win over Arkansas on Saturday at Reynolds Razorback Stadium.

Mason finished the night with a career-best 32 carries as the Tigers improved to 8-1 (4-1 SEC) on the year. His 168 yards rushing were the third-best performance of his career.

After Arkansas (3-6, 0-5 SEC) had scored back-to-back touchdowns to pull within 11 points in the fourth quarter, Mason led the Tigers to a response with a 12-yard touchdown run, his fourth of the night, with 10:17 left in the game.

The touchdown stretched Auburn's lead to 35-17 and marked the first time an Auburn player rushed for four or more touchdowns since Cam Newton against Kentucky in 2010.

The Tigers got on the board first with a 9-yard touchdown run by Mason with 2:35 left in the first quarter. Auburn took over with a short field after Kris Frost recovered an Arkansas fumble at the Razorbacks' 29-yard line.

Following a field goal by Arkansas, Auburn covered up an attempted onside kick and again converted the short field with six points. The drive was punctuated by a 4-yard touchdown run from Mason, who carried 13 times for 93 yards in the first half.

The Tigers came up with a huge goal line stand late in the second quarter with JaViere Mitchell making stops at the 1-yard line on third and fourth downs as Auburn forced the Hogs to turn it over on downs.

Mason kept running hard as the second half began and the junior scored his third touchdown of the day from 5 yards out to cap an 11-play, 65-yard drive. The drive included Auburn quarterbacks Nick Marshall and Jeremy Johnson completing 4-of-4 passes.

The Tigers stretched their lead to 28-3 on an 88-yard touchdown throw and catch from Marshall to Sammie Coates. The play was the longest of the season for Auburn and third-longest pass in school history.

Coates finished the day with three receptions for 102 yards and a touchdown for his fourth 100-yard receiving game of the season. In a night heavy on the run game, Marshall completed 7-of-8 passes for 118 yards and the score while also

#### GAME 10

Seventh-ranked Auburn used a pair of special teams touchdowns and a career day rushing by quarterback Nick Marshall to defeat Tennessee 55-23 on Saturday at Neyland Stadium.

Auburn's 55 points were the most scored by either team in the series, a total that ranks third all-time in program history for points on the road in

Marshall rushed for a career-best 214 yards and two touchdowns, tying Bobby Hunt (1959) for the third-best rushing performance by a quarterback in program history.

Additionally, Running back Tre Mason eclipsed 1,000 yards rushing on a 10-yard run in the third quarter for his second-straight season over the plateau. He finished with 117 yards and three touchdowns.

The Tigers rushed for 444 yards on 53 attempts as a team, the most ever by the program in an SEC game. It was Auburn's fifth game with more than 300 yards rushing this season.

Tennessee sandwiched an Auburn touchdown with a pair of field goals to tie the game at six with three minutes left in the first quarter. Marshall found C.J. Uzomah for the 25-yard Auburn score, but Cody Parkey's extra point was blocked.

The two teams combined for 42 points in the second quarter as Auburn took a 34-20 lead into the break.

Mason rumbled 13-yards for a score to knot the game at 13-all after Tennessee's Raijon Neal had given the Vols the lead in the opening seconds of the second quarter. Mason's touchdown began a streak of 21 unanswered points for the Tigers that also included an 85-yard punt return touchdown by Chris Davis and a 7-yard touchdown scamper by Marshall.

The punt return for Davis was the longest for Auburn since 1970 and the third-longest in school history. It was the first punt return for a touchdown since Robert Dunn scored against ULM in 2008.

After a pick-six for the Vols, Marshall redeemed himself with a 38-yard scoring run with 51 seconds remaining in the half to give Auburn the 34-20 lead. The junior had a career-best 164 rushing yards in the first half, the fourth most in the first half by a player in Auburn history and tied for fifth most in either half by an individual.

The Tigers opened the second half with a 90-yard kickoff return touchdown by Corey Grant, the first of his career. The score widened Auburn's advantage to 41-20 and marked the first time in program history the Tigers had returned a kickoff and punt for a touchdown in the same game.

Auburn finished with an average of 44.85 yards on seven kick and punt returns to set a new NCAA record. The Tigers' average eclipsed the mark of 41.8 yards set by Florida State against Virginia Tech in 1974.

#### GAME 11

Wide receiver Ricardo Louis hauled in a desperation touchdown throw from quarterback Nick Marshall with 25 seconds left and Auburn down by a point. The 73-yard catch, which was deflected up into the air by a Georgia defender, gave No. 7 Auburn a 43-38 win over No. 25 Georgia on Saturday afternoon at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Facing a 4th and 18 at its own 27, and potentially its second loss of the season, Marshall heaved a ball down the middle of the field that a pair of Georgia defenders converged on. Louis was past the defenders, who both tried to make a play on the underthrown ball but instead bounced it up into the air long enough for Louis to get under it and scamper into the end zone to give Auburn (10-1, 6-1 SEC) its 13th 10win season in school history and a shot at a SEC West Championship when it faces Alabama in the Iron Bowl on Nov. 30 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Georgia (6-4, 4-3 SEC) was not done after the score, however, starting at its own 25 yard line after a touchback but moving the ball all the way down to the Auburn 20 with three seconds left. Aaron Murray, who finished with 415 yards passing for Georgia, had one last chance but Auburn defensive end Dee Ford forced Murray out of the pocket and got a hand on him as he was releasing the ball, causing an incompletion and pandemonium from the 87,451 in attendance.

Auburn led 34-17 heading to the fourth quarter but saw Georgia score 21 points in the final 15 minutes, taking its first lead of the game, 38-37, on a Murray 5-yard touchdown run with 1:49 left.

Marshall finished with 229 yards passing for Auburn, connecting on 15 of 26 passes. Louis (131 yards) and Sammie Coates (39 yards) each

Chris Davis returned a missed Alabama field goal 100 yards as time expired to give No. 4 Auburn (11-1, 7-1 SEC) a 34-28 win over top-ranked Alabama (11-1, 7-1 SEC) and send it to the SEC Championship Game for the fifth time in school history.

With one second remaining, Alabama, which ended the game 0-for-4 on field goal attempts, lined up for a 57-yard field goal attempt. The final second was added after Alabama's T.J. Yeldon ran 24 yards and stepped out of bounds with the game clock originally reading 00:00.

Adam Griffith, who was attempting his first field goal of the night after Cade Foster missed two field goal attempts and had a third blocked, sent his kick to the very back of the end zone where Davis caught it. Davis followed his blockers to the Auburn sideline and raced the entire length of the field to send the sellout crowd inside Jordan-Hare Stadium into extreme pandemonium for the second straight game.

Auburn will play in the SEC Championship in Atlanta on Saturday, Dec. 7 against either Missouri or South Carolina, which would be a rematch of the 2010 SEC title game.

Auburn jumped out to a 7-0 first quarter lead when Nick Marshall rushed over left guard 45 yards for a touchdown. Marshall would finish the night with 99 yards rushing on 17 attempts and also was 11-for-16 passing for 97 yards.

Alabama would erase the deficit with a 21-point second quarter. AJ McCarron hit Jalston Fowler for a 3-yard touchdown to tie the game and then found Kevin Norwood for a 20-yard touchdown pass to put Alabama ahead 14-7. T.J. Yeldon pushed the lead to 21-7 with a 1-yard touchdown run with 3:48 left in the half.

Tre Mason, who finished with 164 yards rushing on 29 attempts, capped a 7-play, 81-yard drive with his 18th rushing touchdown of the season to make it a one-score game, 21-14, with 1:40 left in the first half. All 81 yards on the drive came on the ground, with Mason collecting all but 15 of them.

Auburn tied the game at 21-21 when C.J. Uzomah caught a 13-yard pass from Marshall just 3:04 into the second half.

Alabama found itself in scoring position twice in the fourth quarter but it failed to convert on a 4th-and-1 from the Auburn 13 when Carl Lawson stopped Yeldon and then saw Foster's third field goal attempt of the game get blocked by Nosa Eguae with 1:54 left in the game.

Auburn tied the game at 28-28 with just 32 seconds left when Marshall hit Sammie Coates for a 39-yard touchdown pass. The scoring drive covered 83 yards in 2 minutes.

Looks like the Auburn Tigers running back will get a shot at something he

Mason rushed for 304 yards and four touchdowns, leading No. 3 Auburn to a wild 59-42 victory over No. 5 Missouri in a Southeastern Conference title showdown Saturday that resembled a video game.

Auburn (12-1) took care of business, then got the help it needed to claim a spot in the BCS championship. No. 2 Ohio State lost to Michigan State 34-24 in the Big Ten title game, which likely pushes the Tigers up to face top-ranked Florida State in Pasadena. The Seminoles routed Duke 45-7 in the Atlantic Coast Conference championship.

Missouri (11-2) should be in the mix for a New Year's Day bowl, with the

Capital One, Cotton and Outback games among the possible destinations. But Auburn was the big winner on this day. The official announcement

won't come until Sunday night, but there appears to be no other outcome than Auburn-Florida State for No. 1.

Auburn is certainly playing its best offensively. The Tigers set an SEC championship record with 677 yards, including 545 on the ground.

Mason had scoring runs of 7, 3 and 1 yards before bursting up the middle

on a 13-yard TD that clinched the victory with 4:22 remaining. He carried the ball a staggering 46 times, an easy choice as the game's MVP. He celebrated by breaking out the familiar Heisman pose, his longshot candidacy getting a huge boost.

In a game where neither team played a lick of defense, Auburn finally stopped Missouri on fourth-and-1 deep in its own territory, setting up Mason's final score. Chris Davis broke up the pass, not quite as thrilling as his 109-yard return of a missed field goal to beat Alabama, but another huge play for the nation's biggest turnaround team.

Auburn, which was 3-9 a year ago and didn't win a game in the SEC, claimed the title in its first year under Malzahn. The Tigers didn't even need a dramatic finish to do it, holding Missouri scoreless in the final quarter while Mason notched two more TDs to break open a game that was close most of the way.

Missouri had its own impressive bounce-back after struggling its first year in the SEC. But coach Gary Pinkel's team was denied a quick championship in its new league after leaving the Big 12, unable to slow — must less stop -Auburn's dynamic offense.

Missouri piled up 534 yards — the teams combined for 1,211 yards in a conference supposedly known for defense - but it wasn't nearly enough against Auburn's hurry-up spread.

Quarterback Nick Marshall shook off two early fumbles, one of which Missouri returned for a touchdown. He ran for 101 yards and a touchdown and passed for 132 yards and another score.

The lead changed hands seven times. Missouri's last gasp was Franklin's 5-yard touchdown run, followed by a two-point conversion, that closed the gap to 45-42 heading to the final period. But Auburn dominated the final 15 minutes behind the play of Mason.

#### GAME 14

Auburn came with a blink of an eye of winning its second national championship in the last four years.

Florida State's Kermit Whitfield and Jameis Winston wouldn't let it happen.

They stole a page out of Auburn's playbook for the dramatic finish when Whitfield returned a kickoff 100 yards with 4:31 for a brief lead, and then Winston threw a 2-yard touchdown pass to Kelvin Benjamin with 13 seconds remaining to send Florida State to a 34-31 victory in the BCS Championship Game on Monday night in the Rose Bowl.

It prevented the biggest comeback story in college football history, though Auburn still finished with a remarkable season and a 12-2 record. The Tigers came within seconds of winning their second national title in the last four seasons.

Oh, Auburn tried to win with its usual heroics. Tre Mason broke Bo Jackson's single-season rushing record when he scored on a 37-yard run with 1:19 remaining to give Auburn a 31-27 lead. But Winston, the Heisman Trophy winner, drove the Seminoles in for the game-winner.

Auburn had beaten Georgia, Alabama, and Missouri to get this far, and won four games in the final minute, or second. But not this night. Florida State was the one with the heroics.

Auburn led 21-3, then found itself up 21-20 with 10:55 left in the game. Florida State took the lead in the fourth quarter, but Mason's TD run gave the Tigers a late lead.

Just not late enough.

Auburn found new pages in its playbook in the first half, throwing touchdown passes to Tre Mason and Melvin Ray for the first time in their careers as Marshall out-played the Heisman winner Winston in the first half.

Marshall completed passes to seven different receivers in the first half. But even with the passing, Auburn stuck with its familiar successful formula of letting Mason run. The tailback who went for 304 yards on 46 carries hit halftime Monday night with 96 yards on 18 carries.

Marshall hit the break having hit 7-of-13 passes for 113 yards and those two touchdown. Winston was only 6-of-15 passing for 62 yards and no touchdowns, though he did set up FSU's only first-half touchdown with a nice scramble to the Auburn 3.

Auburn got two early sacks against him, then forced him to fumble to set up the Tigers' third touchdown.

Auburn scored on its next possession in a most surprising way when Marshall found Ray running alone down the middle of the field for a 50-yard touchdown pass and a 14-3 lead with 13:48 left in the second quar-

Auburn kept hammering away at Winston, and, after a short run, recovered his fumble at the FSU 27. Marshall made it 21-3 when he ran around end on a 4-yard run with 5:01 left in the second quarter. Florida State got that touchdown back after successfully faking a punt, watching Winston run for 21 to the Auburn 3 and scoring on the next play on a Devonta Freeman run.

That made the halftime score 21-10.
