## 2012 Season Review

### AUBURN (3-9, 0-8 SEC)

Auburn finished the 2012 campaign with a 3-9 overall record and a 0-8 mark in SEC play. The Tigers were 3-4 at home in 2012, 0-4 in road games and 0-1 on a neutral field. Coach Gene Chizik finished his Auburn career with a 33-19 record in four seasons as head coach.

## 2012 SEASON NOTES

- Auburn's 13 seniors -- Daren Bates, T'Sharvan Bell, DeAngelo Benton, Emory Blake, Jonathan Evans, Philip Lutzenkirchen, Onterio McCalebb, Ikeem Means, Anthony Morgan, Ashton Richardson, Travante Stallworth, John Sullen, Jamar Travis -- finished with a career record of 33-19, having won the 2010 national championship, the 2010 SEC championship, and the 2009 Outback, 2010 BCS and 2011 Chick-fil-A bowls
- Auburn finished third nationally in kickoff return defense (16.64) and second in punt return defense (0.80) average among NCAA schools; AU and Northern Illinois were the only schools ranked in the Top 10 in both statistics
- True freshman signalcaller Jonathan Wallace posted the highest-rated freshman season in school history in quarterback efficiency (minimum 50 attempts): Wallace 139.6; Jason Campbell 139.41; Stan White 114.36
- Sophomore tailback Tre Mason (1,002 yards) was the first non-quarterback to lead Auburn in total offense for a season since Bo Jackson did it in 1985
- The Auburn field goal defense unit blocked three kicks this season, two of those by Angelo Blackson and one by Corey Lemonier
- Tre Mason's 86-yard touchdown run against Alabama A&M was the fourth longest rushing play and seventh longest play from scrimmage in Auburn annals
- Linebacker Daren Bates finished seventh in the SEC (7.83 tackles/game); teammates Demetruce McNeal (7.50) and Jermaine Whitehead (7.17) ranked 11th and 13th among conference tacklers
- Onterio McCalebb became just the second player in SEC history to tally more than 2,000 yards rushing (2,586), 1,000 kick return yards (1,360) and 500 receiving yards (620)
- McCalebb finished his career ranked fourth among NCAA active players in career rushing yards per carry, with a 6.37 yards-per-carry career average in 50 games
- Junior Corey Lemonier was a second team all-SEC coaches' selection at defensive end
- Senior linebacker Ashton Richardson was the 2012 national Bobby Bowden Award winner, presented by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. Richardson was also a Rhodes Scholarship finalist and a semifinalist for the National Football Foundation post-graduate scholarship; he graduated with a 3.95 average in equine studies
- Tight end Philip Lutzenkirchen was one of 11 players nationally named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team for outstanding community service
- On December 4, 2012, former Auburn offensive coordinator Gus Malzahn was introduced as Auburn's 26th head football coach, replacing Gene Chizik

### SEC Numbers

In SEC action all-time, Auburn holds a 291-230-18 overall record. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 118-52-6 all-time, and were 9-7 in SEC home contests under Gene Chizik since 2009.

In all SEC games played away from Auburn, the Tigers are 173-179-12 overall. Under Chizik, Auburn was 7-10 in SEC road play.

### For Starters

At the conclusion of the 2012 season, Auburn had a total of 47 players with at least one game of starting experience during their college careers.

Tops among those: Daren Bates (47); Nosa Eguae (31); Emory Blake (27); Corey Lemonier and John Sullen (24); Philip Lutzenkirchen and Reese Dismukes (23); and Chad Slade (22).

Making their first career starts for Auburn during the 2012 season were 17 different players: Angelo Blackson, Trent Fisher, Joshua Holsey, Jonathan Jones and Cassanova McKinzy on defense; Kiehl Frazier, Jay Prosch, Tunde Fariyike, Greg Robinson, Avery Young, Tre Mason, Patrick Miller, Jaylon Denson, C.J. Uzomah, Jonathan Wallace, Christian Westerman and Sammie Coates on offense.

### 30+ Points Equals Victory

Auburn has won 77 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points. The last time the Tigers lost when registering at least 30 points was a 56-49, four overtime loss to Georgia in 1996. In its history, Auburn is now 293-4 all-time when scoring at least 30 points.

### First College Action

A total of 25 different players saw their first career action for Auburn during the 2012 season.

The complete list of first-time Auburn participants: Mike Blakely, Sammie Coates, Kris Frost, Justin Garrett, Corey Grant, Kemiya Harrell, Forrest Hill, Joshua Holsey, Jonathan Jones, Jake Lembke, Ricardo Louis, Cassanova McKinzy, Patrick Miller, Ja'Brian Niles, Jay Prosch, Melvin Ray, Greg Robinson, Jordan Spriggs, Anthony Swain, Jonathan Wallace, Brian Walsh, Christian Westerman, Colton Wingard, Avery Young, and Patrick Young.

Seven of those were true freshmen and 10 were redshirt freshmen. Freshmen made 40 starts for Auburn during the 2012 season (27 by true freshmen and 13 by redshirt freshmen).

### Coverage Kings

Auburn finished third in the NCAA in kickoff return coverage (16.64 yards per return); only four of the nation's 120 FBS teams held opponents to 17 yards/return or less in that category.

Auburn also ranked second nationally in punt return coverage (0.80 yards per return); the Tigers and Northern Illinois were the only two schools to rank in the Top 10 in both punt and kick return coverage.

The Tigers finished sixth in the SEC in kickoff return average (22.44 yards/return), ranking 48th among NCAA leaders. The AU season record for team kick return average is 27.3, set in 2005.

Onterio McCalebb ranked sixth in the SEC in kickoff return average, gaining 22.74 yards per run on 23 returns during the 2012 season. He was 56th among NCAA leaders. The senior from Fort Meade, Fla., had seven returns of 20+ yards this year: 100 (Miss St); 45 (New Mexico State); 43 (LSU); 24 (ULM); 23 (Alabama); 22 (Texas A&M); 20 (Miss St).

McCalebb's kickoff return for a touchdown to start the second half at Mississippi State was the second of his career; he scored on an 83-yard return vs. Alabama in 2011. It was AU's first 100-yard return since Tim Carter vs. LSU (2000). The last player to return a kickoff for a touchdown versus Mississippi State was Darren McFadden (Arkansas, 2006). It was the fifth kickoff return touchdown of the Chizik era. Prior to that, Auburn had just five kickoff returns for a TD in a 298-game span from 1984-2008.

### Wallace At QB

True freshman Jonathan Wallace was Auburn's starting quarterback for the final four games of the 2012 season. He passed for 720 yards and four touchdowns (46-80) and rushed for 152 more. His quarterback efficiency rating of 139.60 was the best ever by an Auburn

freshman with more than 50 passing attempts, ahead of Jason Campbell (139.41 in 2001) and Stan White (114.36 in 1990).

Three Blocked Kicks

Auburn blocked two ULM field goal attempts and had three blocks during the 2012 season. Corey Lemonier blocked one with 3:52 left in the third quarter; Auburn was ahead 28-14 at the time. Lemonier has two career blocks, the other on an extra point against South Carolina in 2011.

Angelo Blackson had the second blocked field goal vs. ULM, tipping the Warhawks' try in overtime. With a block of a field goal attempt at Mississippi State as well, Blackson had blocks in back-to-back games. Auburn was the only SEC team to block two kicks in a game during the 2012 season. The Tigers had 12 total blocked kicks during the Chizik era.

No Return Policy

Punter Steven Clark, a 2011 Ray Guy Award finalist and 2012 semifinalist, continued to excel. Only four of his 70 punts this season were returned.

Clark averaged 39.8 yards per punt, placing 15 kicks inside the 20. His long kick of the season was 54 yards against LSU; he had six punts this year of 50 yards or more.

For his career, Clark has a 39.8 average on 148 career punts, with 50 punts landing inside the 20 and 19 kicks of 50 yards or longer.

The O-Zone

Auburn's versatile Onterio McCalebb became just the second SEC player all-time to record more than 2,000 career rushing yards, 1,000 career kick return yards, and 500 career receiving yards. The first was Kentucky's Derrick Locke (2,618 yards rushing, 1,464 yards on kick returns, and 883 receiving yards from 2007-10.)

McCalebb concluded his AU days with 2,586 yards rushing to rank ninth among Auburn's career leaders. His 6.37 yards per carry average places him third all-time at Auburn, behind Brent Fullwood (7.15) and Bo Jackson (6.62). That 6.37 average ranked McCalebb fourth among the NCAA's active players in that career statistic.

His 104 yards rushing against Alabama A&M were McCalebb's sixth career 100-yard rushing game, his third this season. His 128 yards vs. ULM were the second-highest single

game total of his career. He also had 113 yards rushing against New Mexico State.

With two TD runs of 19 and 14 yards against Alabama A&M, McCalebb now has 24 career rushing touchdowns (ninth best in AU history), and 29 touchdowns overall (eighth best at AU). McCalebb ended his career fourth among Auburn's career all-purpose yardage leaders with 4,566 yards.

He finished third on the receptions by a running back list with 63 and fourth for RB receiving yardage with 620. McCalebb had a streak of 23 straight games where he caught at least one pass stopped against Texas A&M; he had 49 receptions for 430 yards during that span.

He finished his career ranked fifth in Auburn career kick return yardage (1,360). McCalebb's kickoff return for a touchdown to start the second half at Mississippi State was the second such score of his career; the senior from Fort Meade, Fla., scored on an 83-yd return vs. Alabama in 2011. It was Auburn's first 100-yard return since Tim Carter vs. LSU in 2000.

The Line On Lutz

With Philip Lutzenkirchen sidelined by season-ending surgery, one of the most productive tight end careers in Auburn annals concluded. Lutz finishes his career third all-time in Auburn career receiving yards by a tight end, with 628, passing Fred Baxter (1991-92) who had 584 career receiving yards. Lutz is second in career catches by a tight end with 59, behind only Cooper Wallace (63 rec/2002-05). Lutzenkirchen finished with the Auburn record for career touchdowns by a tight end with 14.

The 1-2-3 Punch

The third member of Auburn's skilled senior 1-2-3 Punch was receiver Emory Blake, who also leaves his mark on the record book. Blake had 104 yards on six catches versus

Georgia, his eighth career 100-yard game (tied for third best all-time at Auburn).

Starting the season with a then career-best 109 receiving yards versus Clemson, Blake topped that total with 118 yards receiving on 10 catches against Arkansas, both career highs. That was the most catches by an Auburn receiver in a game since the 2009 season, when Darvin Adams had 10 receptions against Northwestern in the Outback Bowl. Blake had 106 yards on five receptions vs. Texas A&M.

With 128 career receptions, Blake was just the ninth receiver in Auburn history to record 100 career catches; his per-catch average of 15.79 yards was fifth among that group.

Blake finished fifth on the Auburn career touchdown receptions list with 16 scores, including a 27-yard TD against Texas A&M. Blake was also fifth on Auburn's all-time receptions list (128) and fifth in career receiving yardage (2,012).

**Tackling Daren Bates**

Senior linebacker Daren Bates, with 316 career tackles, finished 12th among Auburn's career tackle leaders. He recorded a career-best 16 tackles at Ole Miss, his fourth double-digit tackle game of the 2012 season.

Bates led Auburn with 104 tackles in 2011, and recorded 94 tackles this season, an average of 7.83 per contest. Bates ranked seventh in the SEC in tackles per game average. No AU player since the NCAA began using press box tackle totals instead of coaches' film (2004) has had back-to-back 100+ seasons; the last to do so was Takeo Spikes in 1996-97.

Bates' fumble return for a touchdown of 62 yards against New Mexico State was the longest fumble return for a score in Auburn records since 1969; the longest ever at Auburn is believed to be a 91-yard return by Gusto Yearout in 1966 vs. Florida. It was Bates' first career touchdown and the first defensive touchdown by Auburn this season. Bates also registered AU's first interception of the season, returning it 12 yards versus Clemson.

**Tre Mason On The Carry**

On the final carry of his sophomore season, Tre Mason passed the 1,000-yard rushing mark, finishing the 2012 campaign with 1,002 yards on 171 carries. He is the first non-quarterback to lead Auburn in total offense for a season since Bo Jackson in 1985.

Mason's 181-yard rushing total against Alabama A&M gave him his third 100-yard game of the season. He also had 100-yard efforts with a then-career-high 152 against New Mexico State and 106 yards against Clemson. His 22 carries versus NMSU were also a career best.

Mason's 86-yard touchdown run in the first quarter was the fourth longest rushing play in Auburn history and the seventh longest play from scrimmage ever. It was the longest Auburn run since 1986, when Brent Fullwood had an 88-yard gain against Mississippi State.

Mason led Auburn in rushing for the season season with 1,002 yards on 171 carries, for a 5.9-yard per-carry average. Scoring twice against AAMU, his eight touchdowns were also most on the squad; he scored seven of those in the last seven games.

Mason has 1,163 yards rushing for his career, just the 39th Auburn player ever to gain more than 1,000 career rushing yards. He currently ranks 34th in AU career rushing.

**Parkey For Three**

Cody Parkey, who kicked the game-winning 35-yard field goal in overtime against ULM, converted on nine straight three-pointers dating back through the 2011 season, before missing on a 49-yarder vs. Arkansas. That tied the third best string of consecutive field goals at Auburn since 1981.

With two successful field goals at both Ole Miss and Vanderbilt, Parkey was 11-14 on field goals this year, and 27-27 this season on PAT kicks. His 46-yard field goal at Ole Miss tied his career long.

He made four field goals versus Clemson (37-46-27-36 yards), tying a Chick-fil-A Kick-off Classic record. Parkey's 46-yard field goal in the third quarter vs. Clemson was a career long, earning him Lou Groza Award star of the week honors. Parkey's game-winner against ULM earned him SEC Special Teams Player of the Week honors.

Parkey ranks fourth in Auburn career field goal percentage at .750 (24-32), just behind Scott Etheridge (.791/1992-93), Matt Hawkins (.788/1994-95) and Win Lyle (.763/1987-89).

**Top Fifteen Tacklers**

Three Auburn defenders ranked among the top tacklers in the SEC this season. Linebacker Daren Bates finished seventh at 7.83 tackles

per game. Safety Demetruce McNeal, whose best effort was an 18-tackle performance at Mississippi State, ranked 11th in the SEC at 7.50 tackles per game. Safety Jermaine Whitehead, at 7.17 tackles per game, was tied for 13th among the SEC leaders.

**The D-Line**

Auburn's veteran defensive line accounted for 113 career starts among seven Tigers: Nosa Eguae, Corey Lemonier, Jeffrey Whitaker, Kenneth Carter, Gabe Wright, Dee Ford and Angelo Blackson. They averaged more than 16 tackles and four quarterback hurries per game in 2012.

That group accounted for 22 tackles in the opener with Clemson. Preseason All-American Corey Lemonier was credited with nine tackles and a pair of sacks (-7); that was the third time in eight games that Lemonier recorded a multiple-sack game. Junior Dee Ford had two sacks of Clemson's Tajh Boyd for -14 yards; those two sacks and his seven tackles overall were both career bests for Ford.

Against Mississippi State, the defensive line came up with 17 tackles, 3.5 TFL and a seven-yard sack by Lemonier. Angelo Blackson also blocked a Mississippi State field goal attempt, the first blocked field goal by Auburn since Jake Ricks had a field goal block versus Kentucky in 2009.

In the win over ULM, the defensive line accounted for 19 tackles, including an 8-yard sack by Ford, and 9 quarterback hurries; Lemonier led the group with 5 tackles and 4 hurries, and he blocked a third-quarter ULM field-goal attempt, the second blocked kick of his career (he previously blocked a South Carolina PAT attempt in 2011). And in overtime, Blackson tipped a ULM field goal attempt for his second block in as many weeks.

Lemonier had two sacks (-15) against LSU; he has 17.0 sacks for his career, placing him seventh among Auburn's career top 10. The junior has four multiple-sack games during his career, twice this season.

Against LSU, both Whitaker and Blackson forced opponent fumbles and Lemonier was credited with a fumble recovery. Blackson also forced fumbles against Arkansas and Vanderbilt. Lemonier recovered a VU fumble. Eguae recorded his first sack of the season against Texas A&M.

Auburn got sacks from Blackson, Ford and Kemiya Harrell (a career first) against New Mexico State. The defensive line accounted for 25 tackles versus Georgia, with a sack by Ford and a shared sack by Whitaker and Lemonier. Dee Ford had two sacks (-11) and forced an Alabama A&M fumble; LaDarius Owens (1.5) and Gabe Wright (1.0) also contributed sacks against AAMU.

**Average Per Down**

Here's a breakdown of how the 2012 Auburn offense operated on first, second, third and fourth down.

On first down, the Tigers ran a total of 311 plays, gaining 1,826 yards for an average of 5.9 yards per play. On second down, AU tried 223 plays for 1,333 yards, an average of 5.9 per play.

On third down, the Tigers attempted 141 plays, gaining 563 yards for a 3.9 average. Auburn tried only eight fourth-down attempts this season, gaining seven yards.

Auburn's touchdowns in 2012 came seven times on first down (4 rush, 3 pass), 12 times on second (8 rush, 4 pass), and five times on third down (4 rush, 1 pass).

**When Scoring 20+ Points**

Since 2001, Auburn is 101-14 (.878) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to the start of the 1993 season, Auburn is 144-21-1 (.870) when scoring 20 or more points in a game.

**Scoring By Quarters**

During the 2012 season in the first quarter, the Tigers were outscored by the opposition 96-42. In the second quarter, Auburn was outscored 96-78. In the third quarter, Auburn was narrowly behind its opponents 72-65. Opponents outscored Auburn 76-36 in the fourth quarter this season. Auburn held its opponents scoreless in 14 quarters this year.

**Ray Guy Semifinalist**

A 2011 finalist, Steven Clark was among the 10 semifinalists for the 2012 Ray Guy Award, announced by the Augusta Sports Council and chosen from a field of 69 candidates, recognizing the most outstanding punter in college football.

Richardson, a senior from New Orleans, La., holds a 3.95 GPA in animal sciences. He was named a finalist for a Rhodes Scholarship.

**FWAA Courage Award**

Auburn's Jay Prosch was a Discover Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award weekly honoree. Prosch, a junior fullback from Mobile, Ala., played this season after the death of his mother Sept. 3.

Prosch played two years at Illinois, but transferred to Auburn to be able to spend more time with his mother. Iris Prosch was diagnosed in 2011 with Grade 4 brain cancer. Prosch was granted a waiver by the NCAA to play immediately at Auburn. The day before the season opener, his mother slipped into a coma. He played against Clemson Sept. 1, then drove to Mobile, arriving in the early morning hours Sept. 2. He was with his mother when she died.

Prosch attended classes the next day, telling others his mother wouldn't want him missing studies or practice time. After a memorial service on Thursday, Sept. 6, he returned to Auburn in time to travel with the team to Starkville, Miss., to play Mississippi State.

The Football Writers Association of America and the Discover Orange Bowl announced a weekly nominee each Wednesday during the season. The requirements include displaying courage on or off the field, including overcoming an injury or physical handicap, preventing a disaster or living through hardship.

**Richardson Rhodes Scholarship Finalist**

Senior linebacker Ashton Richardson was a finalist for the Rhodes Scholarship, marking the fourth straight year an Auburn student-athlete has become a Rhodes finalist.

The Rhodes Scholarships, founded in 1904, are the oldest international fellowships. Winners of the scholarship have the opportunity to do graduate work at the University of Oxford in the United Kingdom.





Richardson is an Honors College student majoring in Animal Sciences (pre-veterinary medicine) in Auburn's College of Agriculture with a cumulative grade point average of 3.94. Richardson is a three-time SEC Academic Honor Roll honoree and earlier this year was a semifinalist for the National Football Foundation Campbell Trophy, presented to the top football scholar-athlete in the country. Richardson, who grew up helping his father raise quarter-horses, has aspirations to become an equine surgeon.

The four-year letterman played in 35 career games, registering 13 tackles. In 2012 Richardson has played in 11 games, making four tackles, recording one sack and recovering one fumble. Richardson walked on to the football team as a freshman and earned a scholarship prior to his junior season.

A New Orleans, La., native, Richardson is writing his Honors thesis tentatively titled "Comparison of Articular Cartilage Thickness in Cadaveric Equine Limbs" under the direction of Reid Hanson, Professor of Equine Surgery in the College of Veterinary Medicine. He is scheduled to graduate from Auburn in December. Off the field, Richardson has volunteered each week for the past four years as a mentor at the Lee County Youth Development Center.

Missing Senior Day versus Alabama A&M, Richardson appeared before the District VII Selection Committee Nov. 16-17 in Birmingham, joining 11 other finalists from the district. Two finalists from District VII were selected as 2013 Rhodes Scholars; Richardson was not successful in his bid.

### Good Works Team

Auburn senior Philip Lutzenkirchen is one of 22 members of the 2012 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®, one of college football's most prestigious off-the-field honors recognizing a select group of players committed to making a difference in their communities.

Lutzenkirchen has made supporting children with cancer his personal mission, by visiting them and bringing teammates along, corresponding with them, and offering encouragement to siblings and family. A member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll, he graduated in December with a bachelor's degree in communication.

### On Scholarship

Formerly walk-ons, junior deep snapper Jake Lembke, sophomore defensive back Trent Fisher and sophomore tailback Corey Grant were put on scholarship for the Fall Semester; classes began August 16.

### Winningest Programs

Entering the 2012 campaign, Auburn ranked among the 15 winningest BCS college football programs in all-time wins; the Tigers have 714 total victories. Teams that have 700+ all-time wins: Michigan, Texas, Nebraska, Notre Dame, Penn State, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Alabama, Tennessee, Southern Cal, Georgia, LSU, Auburn and West Virginia.

### Richardson Bobby Bowden Award Winner

Linebacker Ashton Richardson was the winner of the 2012 Bobby Bowden Award, presented by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes to the NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision player who best epitomizes a student-athlete. Southern Cal quarterback Matt Barkley, and Ohio State defensive end John Simon were the other two finalists.

The award is named for former Florida State University football coach Bobby Bowden, and conceived by former Bowden assistant coach Vince Gibson, who died in 2012 from Lou Gehrig's disease, and Vernon Brinson, who played for Coach Bowden at South Georgia College in the 1950s. The award is sponsored by Jon Khachaturian owner of Versabar, "The Power of Engineering Delivered."

In order to be nominated for the Bobby Bowden Award, a player must conduct himself as a faith role model in the classroom, on the field, on the campus and in the community. Nominees must have at least a 3.0 grade point average and have the backing of their school's athletics director and head football coach.

### James Owens Among SEC Legends

The Southeastern Conference 2012 Football Legends Class includes 14 former SEC stars who have made a name for themselves as great athletes on the playing field. Auburn's 2012 recipient is James Owens, the first African-American football player at Auburn.

A Fairfield, Ala., native, Owens lettered at Auburn as a fullback from 1969-72. During three seasons on the varsity, he helped Auburn to a 28-5 record and played a key role on the 1972 Amazin's team, which defied the odds and finished the season with a 10-1 record and a top five national finish.

Auburn has also created the James Owens Courage Award, presented annually to a current or former Auburn football player who has displayed courage in the face of adversity, distinguishing himself while contributing to the betterment of Auburn University. The current Football Legends class was honored at the 2012 SEC Football "Weekend of Champions" November 30-December 1 in Atlanta, Ga.

### Five To All-Star Games

Five Auburn seniors accepted invitations to post-season all-star games. Receiver Emory Blake is playing in the East-West Shrine Game, while tight end Philip Lutzenkirchen will attend the Senior Bowl. Running back Onterio McCalebb, linebacker Daren Bates and offensive lineman John Sullen are playing in the Raycom College Football All-Star Classic.

### Malzahn To Lead Tigers In 2013

Gus Malzahn, who served as Auburn's offensive coordinator from 2009-11, was named AU's 26th head football coach in an announcement December 4.

Malzahn, who won the 2012 Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach while helping the Tigers to the BCS National Championship, spent the past season as the head coach at Arkansas State, where he led the program to the Sun Belt Conference title.

Known for his innovative offensive style, Malzahn, a native of Fort Smith, Ark., and a Henderson State graduate, has made a profound impact at each of his collegiate coaching stops: Arkansas State, Auburn, Tulsa and Arkansas.

This past season as head coach at Arkansas State, Malzahn led the Red Wolves to a 9-3 record and 7-1 conference mark, with a current seven-game winning streak. ASU defeated Middle Tennessee by a 45-0 score on December 1 to claim the Sun Belt championship. That victory earned Arkansas State a berth in the January 6 GoDaddy.com Bowl at Ladd-Peebles Stadium in Mobile.

Malzahn's ASU offense ranked in the top 25 nationally in nearly every NCAA offensive category, ranking 17th in total offense (481.8 yards per game) and 21st in scoring offense (36.4 points per game) and rushing offense (217.4 yards per game). Led by record-setting quarterback Ryan Aplin, the Red Wolves' regular season offense was 13th nationally in passing efficiency (155.39 rating) and averaged 217.4 yards per game passing.

**GAME 1**

Cody Parkey made a career-high four field goals and Tre Mason rushed for a career-high 106 yards for Auburn but No. 14 Clemson edged past the Tigers for a hard-fought 26-19 victory in the Chick-fil-A Game in the season opener for both teams at the Georgia Dome on Saturday.

Emory Blake caught four passes for a career-high 109 yards and a touchdown while sophomore Kiehl Frazier threw for 194 yards and one touchdown on 11-of-27 passing and one interception in his first career start for Auburn. Tre Mason rushed for a career-high 106 yards while Onterio McCalebb add 82 yards.

The game was tied at 16 entering the final quarter after Parkey tied with a field goal with 55 seconds left in the third. Daren Bates intercepted Tajh Boyd and returned it 12 yards to the Clemson 35 on the first play of the fourth quarter. It set up Parkey making his career-high fourth field goal of the game, a 36-yarder to give Auburn a 19-16 lead with 12:50 remaining.

Clemson then scored the final 10 points of the game to outlast Auburn. In the back-and-forth game, Clemson came right back on a 10-play, 75-yard drive as Boyd threw a 4-yard fade route to DeAndre Hopkins, who had a Clemson single-game record 13 receptions for 119 yards, in the back right corner of the end zone as Clemson took the lead for good, 23-19, with 9:17 left.

Clemson stopped Auburn on the next possession and drove 79 yards on the strength of Andre Ellington's 45-yard run to the Auburn 8. Auburn's defense stopped Clemson at the 1-yard line for the second time to give itself another shot. Chandler Catanzaro made his fourth field goal of the game for a 26-19 Clemson lead with 1:24 left.

Ellington rushed for 231 yards on 26 carries while Boyd threw for 208 yards and a touchdown on 24-of-34 passing.

Clemson opened the game's scoring as Catanzaro made a 39-yard field goal with 5:22 left in the first quarter. Auburn's defense held after Clemson drove 83 yards down to the Auburn 1-yard line.

Auburn struck back quickly four plays later as Frazier threw a 54-yard touchdown pass to Blake to put Auburn ahead 7-3 with 3:38 remaining in the opening quarter.

Catanzaro made a 40-yard field goal to bring Clemson to within 7-6 after the Tigers recovered a Tre Mason fumble just past midfield. Auburn had driven from its own 1-yard line to the Clemson 48 before Auburn's impressive drive ended with the turnover on the first possession of the second quarter.

Ellington's 68-yard run to the Auburn 15 followed by a Ryan White personal foul penalty set up Clemson's first touchdown on a 7-yard run by Roderick McDowell for a 13-7 Clemson lead with 7:26 left in the half. Clemson's drive covered 85 yards in only three plays.

Parkey's 37-yard field goal closed Auburn to within 13-10 with 1:24 before the half. On the drive, Frazier's 38-yard completion to Philip Lutzenkirchen to the Clemson 13 was the big play.

The Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game record crowd of 75,211 saw Auburn gain 374 yards on 64 plays while Clemson had 528 yards total offense on 87 plays. Auburn rushed for 180 yards to Clemson's 320, 231 of it from Ellington.

**GAME 2**

Tyler Russell threw for three touchdowns and 222 yards to lead Mississippi State to 28-10 victory over Auburn in the SEC opener for both teams at Scott Field on Saturday. Demetrace McNeal led the Tigers with a career-high 18 tackles.

With the Auburn offense struggling in the first half, Onterio McCalebb returned the second half kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown to give the Tigers a 10-7 lead. It was the second of his career, the other an 83-yarder vs. Alabama last year, and Auburn's first 100-yarder since Tim Carter vs. LSU in 2000.

However, it was all Mississippi State after that. Mississippi State (2-0, 1-0) answered quickly as the Bulldogs drove 75 yards in eight plays to regain the lead, 14-10, on Russell's 13-yard touchdown pass to Chad Bumphis touchdown with 11:35 left in the third.

After holding Auburn (0-2, 0-1) to another three and out, State drove 58 yards and took a 21-10 lead on Russell's third touchdown pass, a 3-yard play action to a wide-open Marcus Green, who scored his second of the day, in the back corner of the end zone with 4:38 to go in the third.

The Bulldogs iced the game as LaDarius Perkins scampered 21 yards breaking four tackles to give State a 28-10 lead with 12:33 left in the game.

Mississippi State outgained Auburn 388 to 216 as the Tigers didn't score an offensive touchdown. The Tigers had 91 yards rushing, led by freshman Mike Blakely's 42 yards on 11 carries. Kiehl Frazier completed on 13-of-22 passes for 125 yards to go along with five turnovers, three interceptions and two fumbles. Quan Bray had six receptions for 50 yards while Emory Blake caught two passes for 31 yards.

Jonathon Mincy forced a State fumble on Russell's 8-yard completion to Chris Smith, and it was recovered by the Tigers' Jermaine Whitehead, a Greenville, Miss., native, at the State 39 with a minute left in the first.

## GAME 3

Cody Parkey's overtime field goal clinched Auburn's first win of the season as it defeated Louisiana-Monroe, 31-28, on Saturday afternoon at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Angelo Blackson made Parkey's game-winning kick possible as he blocked a ULM field goal attempt just minutes earlier during ULM's first overtime possession.

Auburn (1-2) saw a 14-point lead disappear late in the fourth quarter as ULM (1-1) rallied from a 28-14 deficit to tie the game with 1:18 left in regulation before the overtime heroics from Blackson and Parkey.

Auburn finished the game with a season-high 418 yards of total offense, including 255 on the ground. Oterio McCalebb finished with a 128 yards, his fourth career 100-yard rushing game, while Tre Mason had 90 yards rushing on a game-high 22 carries.

Kiehl Frazier was 10-of-18 for 130 yards with a touchdown and an interception while his counterpart from ULM, Kolton Browning, was 28-of-46 for 237 yards with three touchdowns.

ULM went 89 yards on its first drive of the game, a 12-play march, and converted on a fourth-and-goal from the one to take the early touchdown lead, 7-0. The drive was capped by a Browning to Harley Scioneaux pass into the corner of the end zone, the first of two touchdown catches for the ULM tight end.

Auburn answered with a five-play, 76-yard scoring drive of its own on its first possession. McCalebb had three carries on the drive, including the 27-yard touchdown run, while Mason had a 34-yard reception on the previous play to get Auburn into ULM territory as Auburn tied it at 7-7.

Browning put ULM back up a touchdown, 14-7, with his 39-yard touchdown run up the middle with 3:52 left in the first half. The run capped a six-play, 80-yard drive that ate up just 2:54 of clock time. Auburn immediately answered with a quick strike of its own, using a Quan Bray pass back to Frazier for the score. The pass covered 33 yards as Auburn went 75 yards in four plays to tie it at 14-14 with 2:18 left in the half.

Auburn struck one more time before the half as Frazier's 33-yard pass to Sammie Coates as time expired put Auburn ahead, 21-14. Auburn took advantage of a 33-yard punt by the

## GAME 4

Auburn's defense held LSU to a season-low 351 total yards and only three points in the final three quarters but fell to the visitors from Baton Rouge, 12-10, on Saturday night before 86,721 fans at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn (1-3, 0-2 SEC) got an outstanding performance from its defense, forcing a pair of LSU turnovers, but could not get a crucial stop late in the fourth quarter with enough time left to have a final scoring chance as LSU's final drive ate up most of the final four minutes.

LSU (4-0, 1-0 SEC) had a chance to extend its lead with less than a minute to play, but Drew Allemen's 34-yard field goal attempt sailed wide right. Auburn had one final possession with 37 seconds left, starting from their own 20, but could only manage 17 yards with no timeouts remaining, and Kiehl Frazier's final desperation heave with no time left was intercepted to end the game.

LSU appeared to be driving for the end zone on their first possession, but Mettenberger fumbled the snap at the Auburn 2-yard-line, where it was recovered by Jeffery Whitaker to end the LSU threat. It was just the second fumble lost by LSU so far this season.

But LSU would find its way onto the scoreboard on Auburn's next play from scrimmage, taking a 2-0 lead on a safety when Tre Mason was tackled in the end zone by Sam Montgomery. It was the first safety scored against Auburn since the Tigers' 3-2 victory over Mississippi State in 2008.

LSU would then take advantage of the good field position after the safety, driving 59 yards in nine plays and taking a 9-0 lead on a one-yard touchdown run by Michael Ford with 4:18 to play in the first quarter.

After taking over deep in LSU territory when Corey Lemonier sacked Mettenberger and forced a fumble that was recovered by Angelo Blackson, Tre Mason went around left end for 26 yards to the LSU 4-yard-line. On the next play, McCalebb walked into the end zone for Auburn's first touchdown of the night, cutting the deficit to 9-7 as time expired in the opening period.

**GAME 5**

The Arkansas Razorbacks forced five Auburn turnovers and sacked Tiger quarterbacks eight times in a 24-7 Razorback win Saturday afternoon before 85,819 fans at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The Razorbacks outgained the Tigers, 372-321, including a 130-40 advantage in rushing yards, yet Auburn had 22 first downs to Arkansas' 19. Auburn also matched a season-high with five turnovers and was unable to take advantage of Arkansas' two giveaways.

Emory Blake paced the Auburn offense with 10 catches for 118 yards and Auburn's only score. During the game, he hauled in his 100th career reception, becoming the eighth Auburn player to reach that mark, and now has 1,573 receiving yards for his career to move into a tie for 10th all-time at Auburn.

The Tigers used three quarterbacks for the first time this season. Kiehl Frazier earned the start and finished 9-of-14 for 118 yards and one interception, but was sacked four times in the game. Clint Moseley saw his first game action of the season, starting the second half and finishing 13-of-21 for 163 yards and a touchdown, but he also threw two picks and was sacked four times. Jonathan Wallace did not attempt a pass but rushed twice for 11 yards.

The Razorbacks struck first, taking their second possession of the game 80 yards in 10 plays, capped by a two-yard touchdown run from Dennis Johnson to take a 7-0 lead with just more than a minute left in the first quarter.

Arkansas took advantage of an Auburn turnover deep in Tiger territory midway through the second quarter and increased its lead to 10-0 on a 27-yard field goal from Zach Hocker with 6:33 to play in the half; the score would remain 10-0 at the half.

After neither team could generate much offense throughout the third quarter, Auburn mounted a 5-play, 68-yard scoring drive late in the period, cutting the deficit to 10-7 on a 21-yard touchdown pass from Moseley to Blake with 0:33 left. All five plays on the AU scoring drive went for positive yardage, including a 22-yard completion to Tre Mason and a 13-yard rush by Mike Blakely.

**GAME 6**

After Auburn scored 17 straight second quarter points, Ole Miss outscored Auburn 27-3 to run away with a 41-20 victory at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on Saturday. Tre Mason rushed for two touchdowns and 82 yards on 18 carries for the Tigers while Clint Moseley threw for 118 yards on 11-of-18 passing.

Ole Miss (4-3, 1-2) opened the game's scoring on a toss sweep to running back Randall Mackey, who threw a 25-yard touchdown pass to quarterback Bo Wallace down the left sideline with 7:14 left in the first quarter.

On Auburn's next possession from its own 28, backup center Tunde Fariyike, who was filling in for injured starter Reese Dismukes, snapped the ball over Moseley's head and C.J. Johnson recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown and a 14-0 Ole Miss lead less than two minutes later.

Auburn (1-5, 0-4) bounced right back and drove 74 yards in 13 plays and 6:43 as it cut the lead in half on a Mason 1-yard touchdown run just over a minute into the second quarter. That marked the Tigers' longest scoring drive of the season in plays and time of possession.

Auburn's defense continued to hold Ole Miss after the Rebels' opening drive as the Tigers took over on the Ole Miss 48. Two plays later, Auburn tied it 14-14. On first down, it was a Leroy High to Leroy High connection as Moseley completed a 42-yard pass to Sammie Coates to the Ole Miss 6. Mason then ran in up the middle on the next play for a touchdown with 5:56 left in the half.

Cody Parkey then recovered his own inside kick at the Auburn 47 as Auburn continued to roll. That led to a career long-tying 46-yard field goal by Parkey as the Tigers took a 17-14 lead, their first of the day, with a minute remaining in the half.

## GAME 7

Senior Zac Stacy became Vanderbilt's all-time leading rusher as he gained 169 yards and a touchdown on 27 carries to lead Vanderbilt to a 17-13 victory over Auburn in Vanderbilt Stadium.

Vanderbilt (3-4, 2-3) took the opening kickoff and drove 75 yards in 16 plays to take a 7-0 lead on a 7-yard Wesley Tate touchdown run with 6:35 left. On the drive, the Commodores had two successful fourth down conversions.

Auburn (1-6, 0-5) recovered its second of three fumbles as Vanderbilt failed on a fake punt that was recovered by Ashton Richardson at the Commodore 36 yard line. On 3rd and goal from the 10, Clint Moseley threw behind a wide open Emory Blake in the end zone. Cody Parkey brought Auburn to within 7-3 on a 27-yard field goal with 8:10 left in the half.

The Tigers stopped the Commodores again on fourth down, this time with an inch to go from the Auburn 48 as McKinzy made a huge hit and tackle with just under four minutes to go in the half. The key play of Auburn's scoring drive came as Moseley threw a 24-yard strike to Blake on play action to the Vandy 6. Onterio McCalebb rushed it to the 1, and Tre Mason punched it in despite a shaky handoff to give Auburn its first lead of the game at 10-7 with 1:21 before halftime.

Vanderbilt quickly drove 65 yards in 11 plays as Carey Spear kicked a 30-yard field goal to tie the game 10-10 on the last play of the half.

The Commodores stopped the Tigers on the opening possession of the third quarter and scored on its second consecutive drive to take a 17-10 lead on Stacy's 2-yard run with 7:34 on the clock. Vanderbilt drove 85 yards in 7 plays in only 2:56.

Auburn had the beginnings of another good drive as Mason had a career-long 34-yard rush on a nice block by Patrick Miller to the Vanderbilt 40, but a pair of false start penalties and a 10-yard third down sack pushed Auburn back to its own 40. The Tigers punted the ball to the Commodores with less than a minute to go in the third.

Auburn took over on its own 49 with 14:01 left in the game. Parkey nailed his second field goal of the day, a 39-yarder, to make it a 17-13 Vanderbilt lead with 9:55 remaining.

Vanderbilt responded as Jordan Rodgers completed a 37-yard pass to a wide open Chris Boyd to the Auburn 38. The Commodores went for it on fourth down for the fifth time, needing three yards this time from the Auburn 31, and Gabe Wright tackled Stacy for a 7-yard loss. The Tigers took over on their own 38 with seven minutes left as they stopped Vanderbilt for the third time on fourth down.

Auburn had it 2nd and 2 from its own 45, but Mason had a rush for no gain and McCalebb lost two yards.

The Commodores took over on their own 19 with 4:41 remaining. On the first play, Stacy, a native of Centreville, Ala., and Bibb County High School alum, rushed it for 27 yards from the wildcat position to the Vanderbilt 41 to become Vanderbilt's all-time leading rusher with 2,647 yards.

Stacy fumbled at the Auburn 32 with 2:24 remaining. On 3rd and 2, Moseley completed an 18-yard pass to tight end C.J. Uzomah to the Vanderbilt 41 with 1:44 to go. Moseley was sacked on second down and Auburn's comeback threat was ended.

## GAME 8

True freshman quarterback Jonathan Wallace connected on touchdown passes to C.J. Uzomah and Emory Blake and threw for 122 yards but it wasn't enough to overcome No. 21/22 Texas A&M's 672 yards of total offense as the Auburn football team fell to 1-7, 0-6 SEC with a 63-21 loss on Saturday night at Jordan-Hare Stadium in Auburn.

Both of Wallace's touchdown tosses covered 27 yards and both came in the third quarter after Auburn went down 49-7 at the half. Auburn's lone score in the first half was a Tre Mason one-yard run on Auburn's first possession of the second quarter, Mason's fifth scoring run in the last four contests.

Wallace finished the night 6-for-9 from the pocket and also ran for 71 yards on 13 attempts while Mason rushed 12 times for 80 yards and his fifth touchdown of the season.

Texas A&M (6-2, 3-2 SEC) quarterback Johnny Manziel threw for 260 yards on 16-for-23 passing with two touchdowns and also ran for 90 yards and three touchdowns on nine carries.

Emory Blake finished the night with five catches for 106 yards and moved into fifth in the Auburn record books with his 16th receiving touchdown catch. Uzomah, making his first start at tight end, had three catches for 90 yards.

Leading tacklers for Auburn were safety Demetruce McNeal (10 tackles), safety Jermaine Whitehead (8 tackles) and linebacker Jake Holland (7 tackles).

Tre Mason and Onterio McCalebb combined for 265 rushing yards and three touchdowns, and Auburn snapped a five-game losing skid with a 42-7 Homecoming victory over New Mexico State at Jordan-Hare Stadium Saturday afternoon.

Mason carried 22 times for a career-high 152 yards and a touchdown, averaging 6.9 yards per carry. Meanwhile, McCalebb made the most of his eight touches, picking up 113 yards (14.1/carry) while scoring two touchdowns.

Freshman Jonathan Wallace made his first start at quarterback, completing 9-of-16 attempts for 164 yards and a touchdown along with one interception.

Auburn outgained New Mexico State 475-305, including a 311-83 advantage on the ground. The Tigers also converted on 5-of-12 third-down opportunities and held NMSU to a 2-for-13 conversion rate. Auburn turned the ball over just once while the Aggies had two giveaways.

McCalebb got his first score when he broke loose on a 38-yard run around the right end for Auburn's fourth score of the day, its third via rushing touchdown, to make it 28-0 Tigers at the 2:58 mark of the third quarter. His run finished off a 96-yard scoring drive - Auburn's longest of the season by yardage - that lasted just seven plays and 3:26.

The Auburn senior would add his second touchdown of the day on a 7-yard run with 11:20 to play in the game, giving the Tigers a 35-7 lead. McCalebb's scoring run was set up by his own 45-yard kickoff return to near midfield, and a 40-yard run by Mason got Auburn in the red zone two plays later.

Trovon Reed capped off the scoring for Auburn with a 40-yard reception from Wallace for his first career touchdown, giving the Tigers a 42-7 lead with 7:19 to play.

After a scoreless first quarter, the Tigers struck first with a five-yard touchdown run from Mason that capped a 13-play, 89-yard drive to give Auburn a 7-0 lead with 4:56 to play in the half. It marked the longest scoring drive of the season for the Tigers. That would be the halftime score as NMSU would be unable to cross midfield.

The Tigers went to the ground game to open the third quarter, putting together a seven-play,

Emory Blake had his eighth career 100-yard receiving game, but Georgia earned a 38-0 win over Auburn on Saturday night before 86,146 fans at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The Tigers fell to 2-8 overall, 0-7 in SEC play. With the win, Georgia (9-1, 7-1 SEC) clinched the SEC Eastern Division title and a spot in next month's SEC Championship Game.

Blake had a team-best 108 receiving yards on six catches, his fourth time over 100 yards this season. Auburn quarterback Jonathan Wallace, making his second career start, finished with 15 completions on 22 attempts for 181 yards and an interception. His 15 completions were the most by an Auburn quarterback in a game this season.

The Tigers struggled in the rushing game, gaining just 57 yards on 27 attempts. Tre Mason led the way with 33 yards, and Onterio McCalebb had 16 on the ground to go along with 43 receiving yards on three catches.

Georgia's Aaron Murray completed 18-of-24 pass attempts on the night for 208 yards and three touchdowns, connecting with six different receivers as the Bulldogs employed a balanced attack throughout the game. Running backs Todd Gurley and Keith Marshall each topped the 100-yard mark with Gurley getting 11 carries for 116 yards and Marshall rushing eight times for 105. Malcolm Mitchell was Georgia's leading receiver with 47 yards on five catches.

Georgia outgained the Tigers 497-238 with 24 first downs to Auburn's 11. The Bulldogs also converted 8-of-14 third downs.

The Bulldogs marched straight down the field on their first possession, taking a 7-0 lead on a six-yard completion from Murray to Chris Conley with 10:51 to play in the first quarter. The scoring opportunity was set up by a 49-yard rush down the left sideline by Gurley on his first carry of the game.

Georgia doubled its lead to 14-0 late in the opening quarter, driving 80 yards in nine plays and scoring on Murray's second touchdown pass of the night, this time to Mitchell for five yards. It was 21-0 after the Bulldogs' first drive of the second quarter that spanned 64 yards in nine plays, capped by another Murray TD pass to Marlon Brown.

## GAME 11

Auburn's offense exploded out of the gate, scoring 21 first-quarter points on 237 total yards of offense as it cruised to a 51-7 win over Alabama A&M in the final regular season home game of the 2012 season. Running backs Tre Mason (181) and Oterio McCalebb (104) each rushed for over 100 yards, the second time in the last three games the duo has both topped the century mark.

Auburn's rushing attack gained a season-high 341 yards, marking the second time this season Auburn (3-8) has rushed for over 300 yards in a game, the other coming against New Mexico State in a 42-7 Auburn win two weeks ago. The team also finished with 512 total yards of offense, which was the most since the National Championship Game victory over Oregon (519).

Alabama A&M (7-4) was held to just 208 total yards.

Freshman quarterback Jonathan Wallace was 10-of-18 on the afternoon for 171 yards with a touchdown for Auburn. His touchdown toss was a nine-yarder to Sammie Coates with 23 seconds left in the first half that put Auburn up 35-0.

After back-to-back 19-yard touchdown runs by Mason and McCalebb put Auburn up 14-0 with 4:31 left in the first quarter, Mason went 86 yards over right guard for Auburn's longest run since Brent Fullwood rumbled 88 yards against Mississippi State back in 1986 to put Auburn up 21-0.

A Jay Prosch three-yard touchdown run made it 28-0 on Auburn's first possession of the second quarter as Auburn scored on each of its first four possessions en route to its largest margin of victory of the season. The score, his second of the season, capped a 91-yard drive, which was Auburn's second longest of the season.

After Coates' touchdown catch made it 35-0 at the half, Alabama A&M scored on its first possession of the second half to avoid the shutout as Deaunte Mason scored from a yard out to finish a 10-play, 88-yard drive.

McCalebb's second score of the day came just 50 seconds into the fourth quarter when he ran it in from 14 yards out for a 42-7 lead.

AJ McCarron threw four touchdown passes and 216 yards, Eddie Lacy rushed for two touchdowns and 131 yards and Amari Cooper had 109 yards receiving and two touchdowns to lead #2 Alabama to a 49-0 victory over Auburn in Bryant-Denny Stadium on Saturday.

On the final play of the game, sophomore Tre Mason gained 5 yards to eclipse the 1,000-yard rushing mark for the season with 1,002 yards. With his 82 yards rushing, Mason has 1,163 career rushing yards.

Alabama (11-1, 7-1) jumped out to a 42-0 lead by the half and continued to cruise the rest of the way. The Crimson Tide scored touchdowns on each of their six first half possessions and their first possession of the second half.

The Crimson Tide scored on their first possession aided by a pair of 15-yard penalties to take a 7-0 lead on an Eddie Lacy 2-yard just under four minutes into the game. T.J. Yeldon followed with Alabama's second 2-yard touchdown run to increase the lead to 14-0 with five minutes to go to close out the scoring in the first quarter.

McCarron threw a 37-yard touchdown pass to Cooper to complete a 6-play, 88-yard drive to take a 21-0 lead less than three minutes into the second quarter. Alabama's fourth score was set up by a Jonathan Wallace interception that was returned to the Auburn 29. McCarron threw his second touchdown toss of the quarter on a 7-yard pass to Kevin Norwood for a 28-0 lead at 8:39.

Lacy scored his second touchdown of the day on a 1-yard run for a 35-0 Crimson Tide lead at 4:43. Alabama forced a Mason fumble and returned it to the Auburn 35. That set up a 30-yard McCarron touchdown pass to Cooper for his second touchdown reception of the game for a 42-0 Alabama lead 31 seconds before the half.

Alabama had three touchdowns passing and three rushing as Auburn (3-9, 0-8) was held to only five first downs in the opening half.

The Crimson Tide picked up in the second half where it left off the first as McCarron threw his fourth touchdown pass of the game, this time a 38-yarder to Norwood for his second score, for a 49-0 Alabama lead six minutes after the break.

Jordan-Hare Stadium is Auburn's showcase football stadium, which seats 87,451 with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the East side.

The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats. Ten years later, 14,000 more seats were added, and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium (after a member of Auburn's first football team and eventual professor and dean of the School of Chemistry), although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span. Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980; the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season. The most recent addition to the stadium was the construction of a 30-foot by 74-foot Daktronics LED board in 2007, coming at a cost of \$2.9 million. Auburn was the first school in the SEC to install a high-definition video board display.

The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973, recognizing Hall of Fame coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan. The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame

coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships. Auburn's home games are now played at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

On game days, Auburn's Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes the sixth-largest city in the state of Alabama as Auburn has averaged at least 80,000 fans per game for the last 19 seasons. Since Jordan-Hare Stadium expanded to its current capacity prior to the 2004 season, the Tigers have tallied 28 sell-out games.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's 10th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451. It is the sixth-largest in the SEC.

The Tigers have won 77.9 percent of their games in Jordan-Hare Stadium since its inception in 1939 and hold an overall record of 288-74-7 there.
