

Co-head coaches Chris and Kate Malveaux, assistant coaches and select student-athletes are available for interviews by contacting Taylor Shirey in the communications office. Media availabilities will be conducted in person prior to select practices throughout the week. Details will be sent out to media at least 24 in advance. Specific interview requests should be made at least 24 hours in advance to ensure availability. Additional requests will be granted based on student-athlete availability throughout the week.

All student-athlete interview request must be submitted to Taylor Shirey of the communications office.

Postgame interviews with Chris and Kate Malveaux and requested players will be conducted in-person following a brief cool-down period. Interviews will be conducted adjacent to the Gregg E. Heim Player Development Center. A member of the communications staff will escort media members to the designated media area.

CREDENTIALS

Media members wishing to cover Auburn softball should contact Taylor Shirey at least 24 hours prior to each home contest. All credentials will be issued on a game-by-game basis. PLAYER TO WATCH: NELIA PERALTA

» Selected SEC Co-Player of the Week for the first time in her career, Nelia Peralta turned in a massive opening weekend with 11 hits, including three home runs, 10 RBI and nine runs scored. She recorded the 100th RBI of her collegiate career over opening weekend. She is looking to be the 16th Tiger in school history to record 150+ career hits and 100+ career RBI. The last Tiger to hit this milestone was Alyssa Rivera (2017-21).



NOTEBOOK

FIRST PITCH

» After a blistering hot start to the season that saw the Malveaux era begin with a undefeated record, Auburn softball faces its next big test with the Shriners Children's Clearwater Invitational Presented by EvoShield. It marks Auburn's return to the tournament for the first time since the 2022 season.

» During its 2022 appearance, Auburn posted a 4-1 record and earned an upset win over No. 11 Texas. The Tigers also picked up victories over Texas Tech, Wisconsin and USF. It's lone loss was to No. 3 UCLA.

» The 2025 edition will also feature a tough slate of opponents as Auburn is set to face (RV) Clemson, Virginia, UCF, Charlotte, No. 9 Oklahoma and (RV) Liberty over four days.

» All six contests will be available on ESPN+. Auburn's opening contest on Thursday against Clemson and Friday contest against Virginia will also be televised on ESPN2 as the network's top softball commentary teams will cover every game of the elite tournament.

» All six games of the tournament will also be available on WEGF 91.1 FM and the Auburn Sports Network with JJ Jackson covering the action live from Eddie C. Moore Complex.

INSIDE THE SERIES: SHRINERS CHILDREN'S CLEARWATER INVITATIONAL

CLEMSON

» Despite being a familiar postseason foe, Auburn is facing Clemson for the first time during the regular season. The two teams were slated to play each other at the 2024 PV College Challenge, but weather forced the game to be canceled.

» Auburn traveled to Clemson to both the 2022 and 2023 postseason with epic battles between Maddie Penta and Valerie Cagle, but the Clemson Tigers hold the advantage in the series 3-1.

VIRGINIA

» You have to go back to just the second season in the history of Auburn softball to find the last and only time Auburn and Virginia have met on the softball field.

» The two teams battled in a neutral contest in Midlothian, Virginia, on March 27, 1998. The Cavaliers edged out a 2-1 win.

UCF

» Another familiar postseason foe ... still recovering from the 2024 Tallahassee regional 2-1 Auburn victory ... 12 innings ... at 3 a.m.

» Auburn holds a slight 3-2 advantage over the Knights. This is just the third time the two teams have faced off in the regular season and the first time since 2016. Auburn is 2-0 with a pair of shutout wins in the previous regular-season meetings.

CHARLOTTE

» The Tigers are undefeated with a 3-0 record versus the 49ers. The two teams last met during the 2013 season when Charlotte trekked to the Plains. Auburn earned a 2-1 win in the contest.

OKLAHOMA STATE

» Auburn also holds the advantage in the series with the Cowgirls with a 4-1 record with Auburn earning wins in the last two meetings. The two teams are

meeting for the first time in nine seasons.

» The last showdown between the two teams also came in Clearwater back in 2016 with Auburn winning 6-1.

LIBERTY

» The Tigers boast an undefeated record versus Liberty with wins in all three previous meetings. Two of Auburn's three wins have come via the run rule.

» Once again, the two teams last met right here in Clearwater with Auburn victorious 5-3 in 2020.

MALVEAUX EFFECT

» Sure, it's early ... but the offensive genius that is Chris Malveaux has already made an impact to make the Auburn lineup something that shouldn't be ignored.

» After opening weekend, Auburn is the only school to have three student-athletes ranked in the top 10 in the SEC in slugging percentage as Nelia Peralta, Icess Tresvik and Anna Wohlers combined for 12 extra-base hits over the first week of the season.

NELIA PERALTA TABBED SEC CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK

» The first weekly honor of her career, Nelia Peralta was selected as Co-Player of the Week alongside Oklahoma's Ella Parker after Week 1 on the season.

» Holding a .611 average over the Tiger Invite, Peralta totaled 11 hits with five going for extra bases (three home runs, two doubles). She added nine runs scored and 10 RBI, including the 100th of her Auburn career. With a pair of walks, Peralta held a .667 on-base percentage coupled with a 1.222 slugging percentage over opening weekend. She did not record a single strikeout in her 18 at bats.

» Her best performance over the weekend came during Saturday's doubleheader slate. Peralta delivered the walk-off home run in the ninth, her second homer of the game, to secure a 10-9 win over App State. It was her third multi-home run game of her career and her first since the 2023 season.

» Peralta followed that up with a 4-for-4 performance versus SIU later that afternoon, setting a career high in hits. It was the first four-hit performance by a Tiger since Jessie Blaine and Aubrie Lisenby both recorded four hits versus Niagara on April 16, 2022.

ON THE CUSP: 150-100 CLUB

» Only 15 Tigers have ever recorded 150 career hits and 100 career RBI, shortstop Nelia Peralta is looking to join the elite ranks during her senior season.

» The last Tiger to join the 150-100 club was outfielder Alyssa Rivera, who played for the Tigers from 2017-

2021. Other notable names include Auburn softball legends: Kasey Cooper, Emily Carosone, Jade Rhodes, Holly Curie

» Peralta is one step closer to that elite club after recording the 100th RBI of her career at the Tiger Invitational over Opening Weekend on The Plains.

TALKING SEASON

» The buzz around Auburn softball doesn't stop around a new coaching staff. Several Tigers are making waves with preseason awards and accolades during the weeks leading into Opening Weekend on the Plains.

» Auburn's biggest addition from the transfer portal, Haley Rainey has paved the wave with accolades. The Big West Pitcher of the Year was selected by Softball America (No. 75) and D1 Softball (No. 87) in their respective preseason player rankings list. D1 Softball also tabbed Haley the No. 23 pitcher in the country heading into 2025. The acknowledgment comes after Rainey led the Bid West in ERA (1.68), batting average against (.210) and wins (19) while at Cal State Fullerton.

» The team leader in batting average and doubles a season ago, Anna Wohlers earned recognition from D1 Softball as the No. 11 third baseman in the country. Wohlers split time at both third base and behind the

dish while proving to be one of the most consistent offensive weapons during her first season on the Plains.

» She may be a freshman, by AnnaLea Adams has already generated some hype as the utility athlete was tabbed to freshman watch lists by both Softball America and D1 Softball. A top-10 recruit according to Extralnnng Softball, Adams was a four-time All-State performer at Union County High School where she holds over eight school records.

DAWN OF THE MALVEAUX ERA

» Chris and Kate Malveaux were named co-head coaches on June 5. The duo came to The Plains after serving as assistant coaches at Tennessee, where they helped the Lady Volunteers to back-to-back Southeastern Conference regular season titles in 2023 and 2024.

» The pair helped Tennessee to 136 wins over the last three seasons, which is tied for the 10th most wins nationally and second most by an SEC team.

» An offensive mastermind in Chris combined with the defensive experience of Kate is poised to make a perfect combo to help Auburn softball return to national prominence.

» With the graduation of two of the most decorated pitchers in program history in Maddie Penta and Shelby Lowe, it's up to Auburn's young pitching staff to carry the load.

» The Tigers went into the portal during the offseason, adding some depth and experience in Big West Pitcher of the Year Haley Rainey (Cal State Fullerton) and two-time national champion SJ Geruin (Oklahoma), but the Tigers hold the youngest staff in the league in terms of SEC experience, returning just 28.2 innings from the 2024 season in the form of Malayna Tamborra (19.1) and Emmah Rolfe (9.1).

» Experience wasn't the only thing the Auburn pitching staff lost, the Tigers are returning zero wins from 2024. Prior to Opening Weekend, Emmah Rolfe was the only pitcher on staff to have a collegiality win at Auburn - she had recorded one as a freshman in 2023. Auburn also lost 97% of its strikeout production from a season ago.

PACK THE PLAINS

» The Auburn Family make Jane B. Moore Field not only one of the toughest places to play in the country, but also one of the most attended. With renewed excitement for Chris & Kate Malveaux, the crowds are expected to be even bigger on the Plains in 2025.

» Since the 2020 season, Auburn is one of six teams that has over 200,000 total in accumulated attendance as the Tigers rank sixth overall amongst the group.

» After the first weekend of the regular season, Auburn ranks fourth in the country and second in the SEC behind only Texas A&M (12,743) in accumulated attendance as 9,299 fans attended Jane B. Moore Field to watch the beginning of the Malveaux era.

PORTAL PICK-UPS

» As soon as the Malveauxs arrived on the Plains, they went straight to work adding some key young players with Power 4 experience on top of adding some much needed veteran experience to the pitching circle after the decorated careers of departing Maddie Penta and Shelby Lowe.

» The Tigers needed pitching experience as Penta and Lowe left behind a very young Tiger bullpen. The Malveauxs found their answer in Cal State Fullerton transfer Haley Rainey. An NFCA All-Region performer last season dominated the Big West and was named the conference's Pitcher of the Year after leading the way in ERA (1.66), batting average against (.210) and wins (19).

» A trio of young SEC transfers are joining the Tigers this season. Sophomore Ma'Nia Womack is the most veteran of the group, appearing in 23 games at Ole Miss last season. Used primarily as a pinch runner while seeing time in the outfield, she total two hits in her eight at-bats. Catcher/infielder Kylie Brockman joins from Arkansas. She saw limited action as a freshman in Fayetteville, appearing in just nine games with two runs and a pair of walks to her credit. A two-time national champion at Oklahoma, lefty SJ Geruin is expected to play a large role on the pitching staff. Geruin redshirted as a freshman, but appeared in nine contests last season, posting a 2-0 record and a 0.70 earned run average.

» Outfielder Georgia Lessmann is the final transfer pick-up for the Tigers. The Alabama native played at Iowa last season, where she did not see any game action. Lessmann's older sister, Olivia, served as a graduate assistant for Auburn during the 2023 season.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

» Three true freshmen join Auburn for the 2025 season. The class may be small, but the Tiger trio come highly decorated and are already creating some national buzz. Utility athlete AnnaLea Adams was tabbed to freshman watch lists by both Softball America and D1 Softball during the preseason.

CO-HEAD COACH CHRIS MALVEAUX

Chris Malveaux (mal-VO) was announced as Auburn softball's co-head coach alongside his wife, Kate, on June 5, 2024.

Both came to Auburn after serving as assistant coaches at the University of Tennessee where they helped the Lady Volunteer program to back-to-back Southeastern Conference regular season titles in 2023 and 2024 and a Women's College World Series appearance in 2023.

Additionally, the two helped Tennessee to 136 wins over the last three seasons, which was tied for the 10th most wins nationally and second most by an SEC team. This past season, Tennessee not only won the SEC regular season title, but posted a 44-12 overall record and made an NCAA Super Regional appearance.

Recognized as one of the top offensive minds in collegiate softball, Chris Malveaux guided six Lady Vols to All-SEC accolades in 2024, including a third straight All-SEC First Team selection for McKenna Gibson. He helped All-American KiKi Milloy rewrite Tennessee's record book to become the program leader in home runs, runs scored and total bases. Three of Tennessee's top five single-season home run totals came under Malveaux.

Returning one of the most powerful lineups in the SEC, Tennessee led the league and ranked sixth nationally with 1.50 home runs per game average in 2024 and closed the season with 84 total, the third most in a single season on Rocky Top.

Returning for a fifth year, KiKi Milloy earned Second Team All-America honors from D1 Softball. Tennessee's all-time leader in home runs (69), runs scored (266) and total bases (534), Milloy started in 53 games in her final season at Tennessee. A mainstay at the top of the lineup, she led the Lady Vols with a .347 batting average and 64 runs scored.

Milloy tied for the team lead in hits (59) and home runs (13), while leading the squad with 12 doubles and two triples. Milloy closed out the year with 24 stolen bases as she finished with 142 for her career – the second-most in Tennessee softball history.

The Lady Vols' offense was potent in 2023 as they averaged 6.87 runs per game – ranking best in the SEC and third nationally. Tennessee pushed across 419 runs during the season – marking the first time UT broke 400 since scoring 426 in 2016. The Lady Vols scored 10+ runs 16 times in 2023 and pushed across five or more runs on 40 occasions.

Senior Milloy set a single-season school record for home runs with 25 – a mark that also led the nation. Sophomore Gibson had a breakout season as she set career bests in average (.362), OPS (1.232), runs (36), hits (59), doubles (11), home runs (15), RBIs (60), slugging (.718), walks (39) and on-base percentage (.514). She also recorded multiple RBIs in 14 games and ended the season on a 23-game reached base streak.

Under Malveaux's leadership, Milloy earned NFCA First Team All-America honors, while Gibson took home second team accolades.

In its first year under his guidance, Tennessee

boasted the SEC's third-best scoring offense with 140 runs in conference games. The Lady Vols also ranked second in the league in doubles (39), slugging percentage (.540), on-base percentage (.398), and stolen bases (22) in SEC action while finishing third in home runs (38).

The 2023 team won the SEC regular-season and tournament titles – sweeping both crowns in the same season for the first time in program history. Tennessee secured its first 50-win season and reached the national semifinals at the Women's College World Series for the first time since 2013. The trip to the WCWS was its first since 2015 and its eighth all-time.

Tennessee posted remarkable home run numbers in its first season with Malveaux on staff, totaling 91 long balls for the second-highest single-season total in program history. The Lady Vols averaged 1.54 homers per game, ranking third in the SEC and 12th in the country.

In its preseason list of top 10 assistant coaching hires during the 2021 off-season, Extra Inning Softball tabbed Malveaux's hiring as the No. 1 assistant coach addition in the country.

Malveaux, a Houston, Texas, native spent the 2019-21 seasons at Missouri with one year as an assistant coach and two years as an associate head coach. During his three seasons in Columbia, the Missouri offense improved each year – hitting .284 in 2019, .290 in the COVID shortened 2020 season and jumping up to .320 in 2021.

The Tigers' .320 batting average ranked second in the Southeastern Conference in 2021. The Mizzou squad finished the season with 91 home runs, 382 runs scored and 184 extra-base hits.

In 2019, Mizzou's Brooke Wilmes was named to the All-SEC First Team, as well as NFCA Second Team All-Southeast Region, in her first year under Malveaux. Freshman Jazmyn Rollin was a Top 25 finalist for the NFCA/Schutt Sports Freshman of the Year that same season.

Prior to joining Missouri, Malveaux was the video coordinator at Kansas in 2018 and served as the associate head coach at Louisiana from 2016-17 – it was his second stay with the Ragin' Cajuns as he was an assistant coach with ULL from 2009-11.

The 2010 Louisiana staff was selected as the NFCA South Region Coaching Staff of the Year after compiling a 45-18 record, making an NCAA Super Regional appearance and earning a No. 16 national ranking. In his five combined seasons at Louisiana, Malveaux was a member of five Sun Belt Conference and Tournament Championships, five NCAA Regionals and two NCAA Super Regional bids.

A 2001 graduate of Texas A&M, Malveaux served as an assistant coach at Bradley from 2012-15 and was the head coach at McNeese State from 2005-08 after being promoted from assistant coach, a title he held at McNeese from 2002-04.

CO-HEAD COACH KATE MALVEAUX

Kate Malveaux (mal-VO) was announced as Auburn softball's co-head coach alongside her husband, Chris, on June 5, 2024.

Both came to Auburn after serving as assistant coaches at the University of Tennessee where they helped the Lady Volunteer program to back-to-back Southeastern Conference regular season titles in 2023 and 2024 and a Women's College World Series appearance in 2023.

Additionally, the two helped Tennessee to 136 wins over the last three seasons, which was tied for the 10th most wins nationally and second most by an SEC team. This past season, Tennessee not only won the SEC regular season title, but posted a 44-12 overall record and made an NCAA Super Regional appearance.

Kate Malveaux was on staff at Tennessee for three seasons after joining the program in June of 2021. She served as a volunteer assistant during the 2022 and 2023 campaigns before being elevated to a full-time assistant coach position ahead of the 2024 season. She primarily worked with the Lady Vols' catchers and base runners.

In her first full season as an assistant coach, Malveaux continued her work with base running and the Lady Vols catchers. Tennessee's catchers committed just two errors over the course of the 2024 season and threw out five base runners.

A first-year Lady Vol, Sophia Nugent earned All-SEC honors with her efforts behind the dish and at the plate. Nugent totaled 42 hits, including eight doubles and 11 home runs with 38 RBI. Starting 52 games, Nugent held a .933 fielding percentage and threw out four base runners.

For the third straight season, Tennessee finished in the top five in the SEC in stolen bases per game, as the Lady Vols averaged 0.96 per game. Tennessee finished fifth in the league with 54 total stolen bases.

Over her two seasons as a volunteer assistant, the Lady Vols won 92 games and in 2023 won the SEC regular-season and tournament titles – sweeping both crowns in the same season for the first time in program history.

In 2023, Tennessee secured its first 50-win season and reached the national semifinals at the Women's College World Series for the first time since 2013. The trip to the WCWS was its first since 2015 and its eighth all-time. Primarily focused on Tennessee's catchers, Malveaux helped Giulia Koutsoyanopoulos transition from the outfield to playing behind the plate in 2023. Before coming to Knoxville, Koutsoyanopoulos had never been a catcher but moved into the role and started 59 games for UT.

Also working with the base runners, the Lady Vols stole 50 bases in each of the past three seasons. Since Malveaux's arrival, Tennessee has ranked among the top five in the SEC in stolen bases per game. UT was second in 2022 with an average of 1.49, fourth in 2023 at 1.43 and fifth in 2024 at 0.96.

Malveaux—formerly Kate Singler—was a member of the Missouri softball staff for the 2020 and 2021 seasons as its director of

operations.

A standout softball player at Bradley, Malveaux served as a volunteer assistant coach for the Braves in 2012. As a student-athlete, she was a Second Team All-Missouri Valley Conference selection and a First Team MVC Scholar-Athlete. She also earned First Team Capital One Academic All-District V honors as a senior.

In back-to-back years as a junior and senior, she led Bradley in RBIs, becoming just the fifth player in program history to do so.


