



Bobby Reynolds

Head Coach

A veteran of competition at the highest levels of collegiate and professional tennis, Bobby Reynolds will begin his 10th season as head coach of the Auburn Tigers in 2025-26. He was named head coach at Auburn in June of 2016.

Reynolds led a young 2025 squad to a 20-11 overall record and the program's fourth straight bid to the NCAA Championship. The Tigers dominated at home, going 13-1 at the Yarbrough Tennis Center which included an upset win over No. 18 Oklahoma. After being selected to the NCAA Columbus Regional, Auburn reached the second round of the Championship for the second season in a row. The Tigers finished the season ranked inside the ITA top 30 for the fourth consecutive season and the Auburn duo of Billy Blaydes and Will Nolan were tabbed No. 18 in the final ITA national doubles rankings.

In 2024, Reynolds saw his best SEC finish since 2005 and his best since taking the job at Auburn, as the team's 7-5 conference record was tied for the fourth best mark in the league.

The Tigers finished the season with an 18-11 overall record and earned top-25 wins over No. 11 Texas A&M, No. 16 South Carolina and No. 25 Florida. Auburn also defeated Georgia for just the fifth time in program history by a 4-3 score, which marked the program's first win over the Bulldogs in Athens since 1994. Reynolds' team was also selected to participate in the NCAA Championship for the third consecutive season and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Tyler Stice and Finn Murgett earned first team All-SEC honors while Billy Blaydes picked up second team All-SEC accolades. Stice and Murgett were NCAA Singles Championship selections after the season, while Murgett and Raul Dobai were selected to participate in the NCAA Doubles Championship.

During his seventh season on the Plains in 2023, the Tigers earned back-to-back bids to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since the program did so in 2013 and 2014. Auburn finished the season ranked 26th by the ITA with a 17-12 overall record and the team claimed four victories over top-25 opponents including then-No. 4 South Carolina on the road and then-No. 13 Tennessee. Auburn also won the prestigious Blue-Gray National Tennis Classic for the first time since 1984.

In 2022, after Auburn advanced to the SEC semifinals and the second round of the NCAA tournament, he was named the ITA Southern Region coach of the year for the Tigers' continued progress in the nation's toughest

conference. The Tigers posted a 21-11 overall record, marking the program's first 20-win season since 2002.

At Auburn, Reynolds has coached two doubles All-Americans (Tad Maclean/Finn Murgett), an NCAA qualifier in singles in four seasons as well as an NCAA qualifying doubles team in every season since 2021.

Under Reynolds' leadership, Auburn has made four NCAA Tournament appearances and a SEC Championship semifinal appearance (2021).

The Acworth, Georgia, product was the 2003 SEC Player of the Year and the NCAA tournament Most Outstanding Player, leading Vanderbilt to the NCAA finals that season. The two-time ITA All-American also finished his final season ranked No. 1 in the ITA singles rankings and was inducted into the Vanderbilt Sports Hall of Fame in 2019. Reynolds holds the Vanderbilt program record for career singles wins (99), single season singles wins (46), career singles win percentage (.739) and single season singles win percentage (.868).

Reynolds played 12 seasons of professional tennis, appearing in 17 grand slam main draws for singles and 20 for doubles, and reached the third round of the Australian Open singles main draw in 2005. He claimed the doubles title at the RCA Championship in 2006 and was the 2012 MVP of World Team Tennis for the Washington Kastles.

Prior to his time on the Plains, Reynolds served as an assistant coach at Oklahoma in 2016, leading the team to an NCAA runner-up appearance.

Coach Reynolds and his wife Dr. Josie Reynolds, an All-American pentathlete and heptathlete at Vanderbilt, have three sons – Parker, Mason and Blake.

Trey Morris was named an assistant coach for the Auburn men's tennis program in July of 2024.

He also delivered a 33rd nationally ranked recruiting class according to Tennis Recruiting Network in 2023, which was the highest ranked class in program history and the highest in the state of Alabama. Morris recruited and coached Ivan Marrero Curbelo, who became the first Jacksonville State player to hold an ITA singles ranking (No. 45).

Prior to his time in Jacksonville, Morris made a coaching stop in Birmingham as the associate head men's tennis coach at UAB in the fall of 2022. The Colbert, Georgia native spent three seasons as the head coach and Director of Tennis at Montana State where he was named Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year in 2022 after leading the Bobcats to a conference championship and posting an 18-8 overall record.

In his three seasons at Montana State, he held a 27-20 record and guided Metej Panik and Jamieson Nathan to the program's first ever appearance in the NCAA Doubles Championship round of 16 in 2022. Panik and Nathan also received the highest ITA doubles ranking of any pair in program history at No. 23.

Panik and Daan Van Dijk earned Montana State's first ever appearance at ITA Fall Nationals and recorded a runner-up finish in the ITA Mountain Region doubles championship under Morris. He also enjoyed recruiting success with the Bobcats, landing the first nationally ranked recruiting class in program history according to Tennis Recruiting Network at No. 26.

Following graduation from Appalachian State with a degree in communications, Morris served as the volunteer assistant for both the men's and women's teams in the fall of 2017 where he coached Scott Webster to a program-best ITA singles ranking of No. 61. As a player with the Mountaineers, he recorded a 44-27 singles record and a 42-23 doubles record from 2015-17. Morris was also named All-Sun Belt in doubles his senior season.

Outside of collegiate tennis, Morris worked as the Tennis Director and associate owner of Baskin-McGill Tennis Academy in Marietta, Georgia, where he developed 10 Division I tennis players and saw a 100 percent college placement for his students. Morris' students landed at schools including Auburn, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Ole Miss, Texas A&M and Kansas.

Morris coaches 10 players that earned top-10 TRN recruiting rankings including Blake Croyder and Brandon McKinney. He also played professionally for one year in Germany where he reached a career high UTR rating of 13.30.

Morris is married to his wife, Katelyn, and the couple have two children, James, Mara and Sutton.



Raul Dobai ***Assistant Coach***

Auburn tennis alumnus Raul Dobai joined the men's tennis coaching staff in September 2024 and is entering his second season as assistant coach.

Dobai spent three seasons on the Plains, compiling a 35-24 singles record and a 27-24 doubles record. The Vancouver, Canada native was selected to participate in the NCAA Doubles Championship in both 2023 and 2024.

In his final season in 2023-24, Dobai and doubles partner Finn Murgett earned four ranked victories including No. 4 Angel Diaz and Johannus Monday and Tennessee as well as No. 10 Toby Samuel and Casey Hoole of South Carolina.

The year prior, the Tigers top doubles team picked up eight ranked doubles victories including over No. 4 Will Grant and Axel Nefve of Florida. The duo finished the 2024 season ranked No. 21 in doubles by the ITA and finished the 2023 season ranked No. 17.

As a senior, Dobai provided key singles wins in the Tigers' top-25 victories over No. 23 Alabama and No. 11 Texas A&M. During his sophomore season, he provided the match-clinching victory over Ole Miss in the SEC Tournament.

Dobai began his collegiate career at New Mexico, where he was named Mountain West Player of the Year and Newcomer of the Year after leading the Lobos to a conference title with a 21-17 singles record and a 20-15 doubles record before transferring to Auburn.

Prior to his time in college, Dobai played for Tennis Canada. He also won a pair of ITF G5 titles and was the British Columbia Provincial Champion.

Dobai graduated from Auburn in May 2024 with a degree in Exercise, Performance & Health from the College of Education.



Christopher B. Roberts

University President

Christopher B. Roberts began his appointment as Auburn University's 21st president in May 2022.

President Roberts leads the university's four divisions, including Auburn's main campus with its more than 31,000 students and 5,500 faculty and staff, as well as Auburn University at Montgomery, the Alabama Cooperative Extension System and the Alabama Agricultural Experiment Station, a joint enterprise with Alabama A&M University. Roberts is an accomplished scholar who understands that research and teaching excellence, together with service and public engagement, are at the very heart of the state's R1 land-, sea- and space-grant institution. The R1 designation in the Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education recognizes Auburn as a top-level research institution. As the university's CEO, Roberts marshals the institution's \$1.54 billion annual budget and vast resources, while spearheading the university's strategic vision and advancing the Auburn's ever-growing research enterprise and economic development.

Prior to his presidency, Roberts served as the dean of Auburn's Samuel Ginn College of Engineering from 2012 to 2022. The college has more than 6,000 students and about 400 faculty and staff members. Roberts was a factor in the success of the university's Because This is Auburn – A Campaign for Auburn University, which raised \$1.2 billion. Under Roberts' leadership, more than \$357 million in donations to the college were made during and since the campaign.

He earned a bachelor's degree in chemical engineering from the University of Missouri and master's and doctoral degrees in chemical engineering from the University of Notre Dame. He began his career at Auburn in 1994 as an assistant professor in the Department of Chemical Engineering and became department chair in 2003. He also served as the George E. and Dorothy Stafford Uthlaut Professor of Chemical Engineering. He has a strong record of scholarly and academic achievement in nanotechnology and synthetic fuels. Roberts has published close to 150 peer-reviewed journal articles and book chapters in leading chemical engineering, chemistry, materials and related journals and has given over 300 conference presentations, invited seminars and lectures. He has received 45 research grants and contracts from government agencies and corporations, such as the National Science Foundation, U.S. Department of Energy, U.S. Department of Defense, the US-DA-Agriculture and Food Research Initiative and Boeing.

He has been honored with numerous awards for his accomplishments and contributions to the field of engineering. Some of those recognitions include the University of Notre Dame's Graduate School Distinguished Alumnus Award in 2015; the University of Missouri's Chemical Engineering Academy of Distinguished Alumni in 2014; and the National Organization of Black Chemists and Chemical Engineers President's Award for Fostering Minority Engagement in 2012 and the SEC Academic Consortium Faculty Achievement Award in 2012.

He and his wife, Tracy, have two children and enjoy cheering on Auburn's national championship-winning Division 1 athletics programs.

In his almost 30 years on the Plains, Roberts has come to value and cherish everything that makes the Auburn experience truly remarkable and distinctive. Through the university's successes, Auburn has earned the right to dream the biggest dreams. He said the university will strive to be "nothing short of excellent in all areas of our land-grant mission."



John Cohen Athletics Director

John Cohen, who has more than two decades of experience as a head coach and administrator in the South-eastern Conference, was named the 16th athletics director at Auburn University on Oct. 31, 2022.

During Cohen's first three years on the Plains, the Tigers have achieved tremendous success, highlighted by men's golf winning the 2024 NCAA championship, the 30th national championship in the history of Auburn Athletics. Auburn has also earned a pair of national runner-up finishes from men's track & field (2024) and equestrian (2023), and a Final Four appearance by men's basketball (2025). Auburn has claimed five SEC Championships during Cohen's tenure, and all 21 programs have advanced to their respective NCAA postseason tournaments.

Individually, Auburn student-athletes have also garnered incredible honors. Ja'Kobe Tharp won NCAA titles in 2025 in 60m hurdles (indoors) and 110m hurdles (outdoors). Auburn's 4x100m relay team won consecutive NCAA outdoor titles in 2024 and 2025. Jackson Koivun, in 2023-24, became the first collegiate golfer to sweep the Fred Haskins, Ben Hogan, Jack Nicklaus and Phil Mickelson national awards in the same season. In 2025, Koivun became the SEC's first repeat champion in 49 years. Consensus All-American Johni Broome was named 2025 SEC Player of the Year and Sporting News National Player of the Year. Equestrian's Avery Glynn was the 2025 SEC and NCEA Rider of the Year in fences. Likewise, Auburn student-athletes have excelled academically, earning at least a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher each semester during Cohen's tenure.

Fundraising and ticket sales have reached new heights under Cohen's stewardship, including the largest single capital donation in Auburn Athletics history from Robin and Reid Dove supporting the future Jordan-Hare Stadium North End Zone Multi-Use Facility. From 2022-25, donations supporting Auburn athletics nearly doubled from the preceding three-year average. Season ticket sales in football and baseball have also reached all-time highs. Cohen also reimagined spaces in Jordan-Hare Stadium and Neville Arena to diversify premium options. The Locker Room Club opened prior to the 2024 football season and the Sharon and Robert Maddox Club opened prior to the 2024-25 basketball season.

Auburn has invested heavily in capital projects under Cohen's leadership. After opening the innovative Woltosz Football Performance Center shortly after taking the helm, Cohen turned his attention to the \$30 million Plainsman Park expansion and renovation, which was completed before the 2025 season. A state-of-the-art medical and athletic training facility opened prior to the Fall 2025 semester, offering on-site physician, physical therapy, sport psychology and athletic training services to all Auburn student-athletes. Other projects include a new video board in the north end zone of Jordan-Hare Stadium an expansion of team and offices spaces for men's and women's basketball, more than doubling their previous footprint; and the addition of a volleyball training facility.

Cohen has also inked strategic partnerships that fortify Auburn's position as one of the premier brands in college athletics. In April 2024, Auburn reached a 10-year agreement to switch apparel providers to Nike. The Tigers also negotiated a new 10-year extension with Playfly Sports to continue Auburn's multimedia rights partnership. The new agreement doubled the partnership's anticipated average annual value and included innovative opportunities for Auburn student-athletes to earn name, image, and likeness opportunities as the revenue sharing era of college athletics takes hold.

Cohen's career in college athletics began as a baseball player at Mississippi State before entering the coaching

ranks for 25 years. A two-time SEC Coach of the Year, he was named MSU's athletics director on November 4, 2016, and led the Bulldog program to record-breaking success athletically, academically and in capital project campaigns.



Athletically, Cohen oversaw arguably the greatest era in Bulldog history, highlighted by a 2021 College World Series Championship – the school's first team national title in any sport. A total of five Bulldog programs turned in a program-best season with Cohen at the helm of the department, including softball (2022), baseball (2021), volleyball (2021), soccer (2018) and women's basketball (2017, 2018).

After beginning his stint as the head baseball coach at MSU in July 2008, Cohen's official role in administration began in 2016 when he assumed the role of associate athletic director in addition to head baseball coach.


As the head coach at MSU, Cohen led the Bulldogs to the 2013 College World Series finals, an SEC regular season championship and an SEC Tournament title. In the classroom, 133 of his players were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll, including three straight SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year winners from 2013-15.

As a baseball player for the Bulldogs, Cohen was a key member of the 1989 SEC Champion and 1990 College World Series teams. He graduated from MSU with a degree in English and earned a master's degree in sports management from Missouri.

Prior to becoming the head coach at MSU, Cohen's coaching career included assistant coaching stops at Missouri (1992-97) and Florida (2002-03) and head coaching stops at Northwestern State (1998-2001) and Kentucky (2004-08).

Along with winning 284 games as a head coach at MSU, 138 of Cohen's players were selected in the Major League Baseball Draft, and numerous assistants, including Auburn's Butch Thompson, are now or have been SEC head coaches.

Cohen is one of just two individuals who have played, coached and later served as director of athletics for a program participating in the College World Series. He is the only coach in SEC history to win an SEC championship, SEC Tournament title, and advance to the College World Series both as a player and head coach.

Yarbrough Tennis Center



In 2005, Auburn University set out to make its men's and women's tennis teams the best programs in the country, starting with a state-of-the-art facility. In August 2006, construction began on Auburn's new facility. On Nov. 2 2007, the City of Auburn/Auburn University Yarbrough Tennis Center opened as a new phase in Auburn tennis.

The facility has 33,314-square feet of indoor space with six indoor courts, 12 outdoor courts with stadium seating and 16 clay courts. The Yarbrough Tennis Center also houses a pro shop, men's and women's locker rooms, concessions and a meeting area. All 12 courts are world-class lighted courts used for both competition and practice by the Auburn tennis teams.

As one of the best facilities in the Southeastern Conference, Auburn hosted the 2008 SEC women's tennis championships and the men's tournament in 2009. The facility was named the 2015 Public Facility of the Year by the Professional Tennis Registry.

The City of Auburn/Auburn University Tennis Center replaced the Luther Young Tennis Complex, Auburn's tennis home since 1978.





About Auburn University



Auburn University has developed into one of the largest universities in the South, remaining in the educational forefront with its traditional blend of arts and applied science, and changing with the needs of today while living with a respect for the traditions and spirit that are Auburn.

Auburn was established in 1856 as the East Alabama Male College, 20 years after the city of Auburn's founding. In 1872, under the Morrill Act, the school became the first land-grant college in the South and was renamed the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Alabama. In 1899 the name again was changed, to the Alabama Polytechnic Institute. Finally, in 1960 the name of the school was changed to Auburn University, a title more in keeping with its location, and expressing the varied academic programs and larger curriculum of a major university.

Auburn University today is a comprehensive land, sea and space grant institution -- among the few that hold that distinction -- helping fulfill the dreams of more than 25,000 students.

Auburn's beautiful main campus -- graced by greenery and open spaces and highlighted by historic Samford Park -- is made up of 90 major academic buildings spread across 1,843 acres. Buildings in the main campus area are within walking distance of each other. Residence halls are only a short walk from classrooms, dining and athletics facilities. Auburn is located in the southeastern United States in east-central Alabama about 30 miles from the Georgia border.

From 1861 to 1866 the college was closed because of the Civil War. The college had begun an affiliation with the Methodist Church before the war. Due to dire financial straits, the church transferred legal control of the institution to the state in 1872, making it the first land-grant college in the South to be established separate from the state university. It thus became the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Alabama.

Women were admitted in 1892, making Auburn the oldest four-year, coeducational school in the state and the second-oldest in the Southeast.

In 1899, the name was again changed to the Alabama Polytechnic Institute. In 1960, the school officially acquired the name it has long been called and one more in keeping with its location, size, and mission -- Auburn University. The institution has experienced its greatest growth since World War II, and now has more than 250,000 graduates.

The War Eagle Story



According to legend, football and the cry "War Eagle" came to Auburn on the same day. It was February 20, 1892, the day Auburn and Georgia met in the first game of what is now the longest continuous football rivalry in the deep South.

In 1864 at the Battle of the Wilderness in Virginia during the American Civil War, an Auburn student fighting in the battle was wounded and when the armies retreated to their respective lines, he was left on the battlefield for dead. When he regained consciousness, there were only two living things as far as he could see: himself and a baby eagle.

The soldier took the wounded bird with him and nursed it back to health. When he returned to attend school at Auburn, the eagle came with him. The student ultimately became a member of the Auburn faculty and he was there that day in Atlanta's Piedmont Park when Auburn and Georgia met in what was later referred to as "The Game of the Century". As usual, the eagle- called War Eagle because of the circumstances under which he was found- was there with him.

When Auburn scored the first touchdown, the old eagle broke free from its master and began to soar above the field. Auburn fans looked skyward, saw the familiar animal, and shouted "War Eagle". According to witnesses, Auburn then began a steady march toward the end zone.

At the end of the game that Auburn won 10-0, the old eagle collapsed and died, having given his all in pursuit of victory for Auburn. War Eagle may have passed that day, but his spirit lives forever in the hearts of Auburn men and women.

Auburn's athletic teams are known as "The Auburn Tigers", but the battle cry of the Auburn faithful is "War Eagle". The battle cry is not a mascot or a nickname of the school.

Since the first War Eagle, there have been seven others throughout Auburn's history that have served as a symbol of the Auburn spirit and kept alive the legendary battle cry. Since 2000, an eagle has flown prior to all Auburn Football home games as tradition.
