# Pornography: Fake v Reality

## Overview

Statutory requirements for RSE education have clear guidance around educating on pornography in secondary schools and axess would like to support teachers and other professionals in delivering this element. The principle aim of teaching young people about pornography is to keep them safe from harm whilst promoting positive healthy and consenting relationships.
