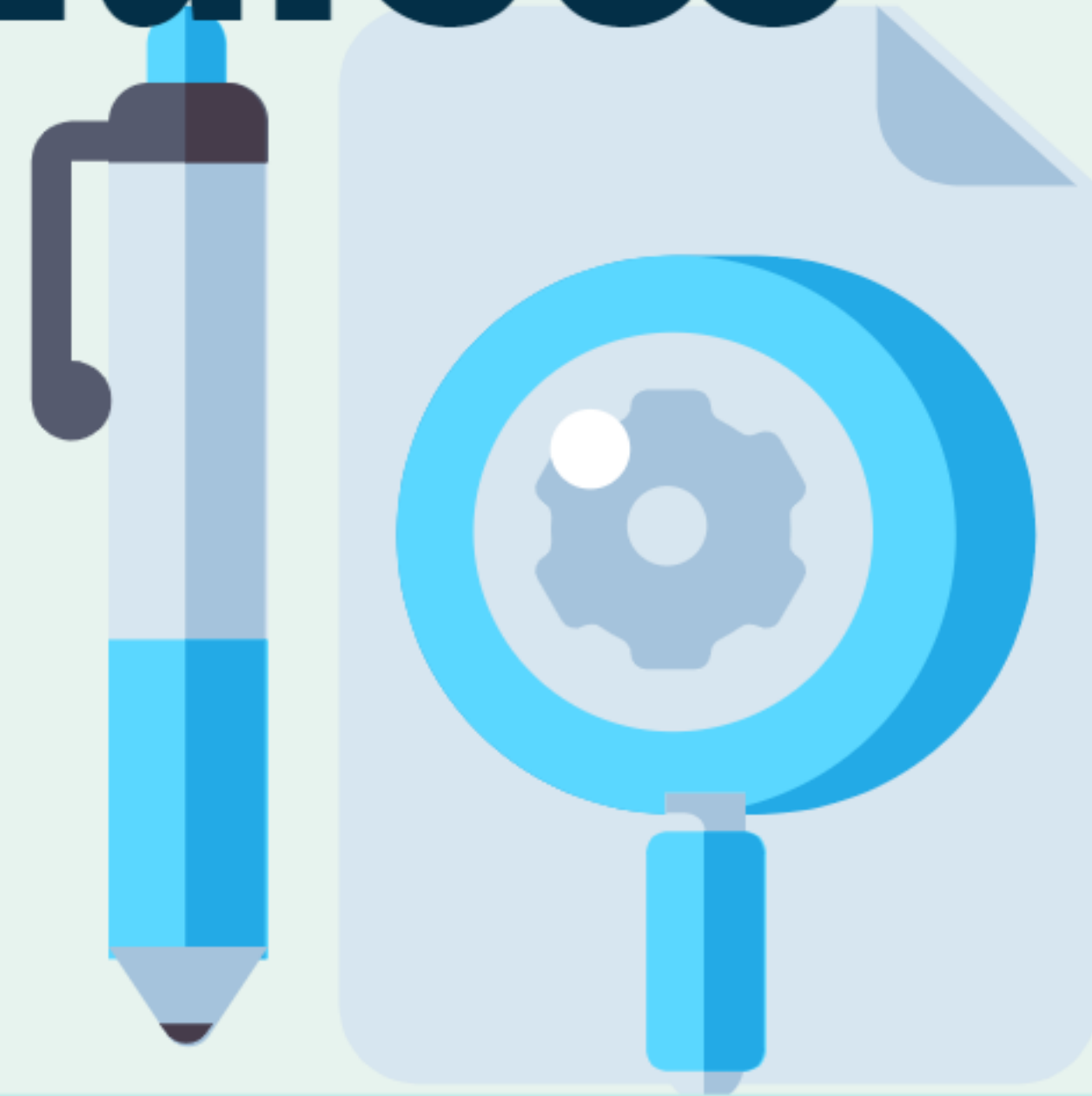


# Computerized Technology for Nurses to Maintain Sustainability in Health System

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## Introduction

- The study investigates nurses' perceptions of computerized technology and its impact on sustainability in healthcare.
- Emphasizes the critical role of nurses in adopting technological advancements to enhance care quality and community health.

## Methodology

Design: Mixed methods approach.  
Participants:  
-214 nurses via questionnaires (email)  
-10 in-depth semi-structured interviews.  
Tools Used:  
-Technology Acceptance Model Questionnaires  
-Professional Self-Identity Questionnaire (PSIQ)

## Key Findings

### Perceived Benefits of Technology:

- Years of nursing experience positively correlate with technology acceptance.
- Ease of use and job relevance enhance perceptions of technology’s benefits.
- Higher output quality linked to effective technology use.

### Professionalism and Care Quality:

- Adopting new roles and behaviors through technology fosters improved quality of care.
- Nurses’ professional identity evolves with technological integration, enhancing community health outcomes.

### Sustainability and Teamwork:

- Emphasizes the need for multi-professional collaboration to implement technology effectively.
- Global sustainability goals can be achieved through shared practices across countries.



Pearson correlations between age and seniority in nursing and the study variables (N = 213)

Positive and significant correlations between age and years of experience in nursing and the acceptance of technology.
