OUR PROGRAMS

MANGROVE RESTORATION

Implementing the Adopt A Site Model involves 4 steps;

- Mapping of degraded and restoration sites
- Partnering with community
- Restoration
- Investments (Socioeconomic development)

URBAN RESILIENCE

- Focuses on curbing unemployment and overdependence on mangroves by the community.
- Promotes alternative and sustainable sources of livelihood such as beekeeping
- Offers training on entrepreneurship skills, career guidance, and mentorship programs.





WASTE MANAGEMENT

Provides best waste practices through;

- Conducting Awareness, Lobbying, and advocating for waste management governance.
- Promoting circular economy through supporting youths in waste management and Resource Collection (RECO).
- Supporting the business aspect of waste towards decent jobs creation (SDG 8).

WHAT TO EXPECT

- Learning about a variety of mangrove trees, such as red, black, and white mangroves.
- Opportunity to interact with a variety of wildlife including bird species.

OUR SUCCESS STORIES

- Restored 60.9 ha of degraded mangrove forests
- Planted 204, 766 mangroves as of 2022
- Supported 5 community self-help groups with 22 beehives
- 10 Mangrove farmers group benefited through the purchase of seedlings planted
- 28 tonnes of plastic collected and recycled
- Employment of 103 resource collectors, 82 male, and 21 female
