Bord Iascaigh Mhara's (BIM) Aquaculture Remote Classroom (pictured below) will also be welcoming visitors on board at the event. The mobile classroom, supported by the European Maritime Fisheries and Aquaculture Fund, is designed to build awareness of aquaculture and how seafood is sustainably farmed in Ireland among younger audiences, using fun and immersive technologies including VR allowing visitors to virtually plunge underwater to explore some of Ireland's mussel, oyster and salmon farms
