The Unit was established to foster knowledge exchange between non-formal and formal knowledge actors in Europe and partner countries through the R&I, internationalisation and capacity building. The core of the unit is an interdisciplinary team of researchers and project managers, who implement sectoral and transdisciplinary actions, using applied research and formal /non-formal methods, aiming to advance knowledge society and academic practice; root co-creation of innovation in R&I; spur a sustainable development of regions and support a mission-oriented policy
