THE DISRUPTIVE AND EMERGING TECHNOLOGIES ALLIANCE (DETA) AIMS FOR GLOBAL COLLABORATION

- DETA is a global **Open Public Policy Lab** dedicated to forging new paths of collaboration among governments representing the **leading tech hubs worldwide**.
- This initiative focuses on anticipating the impact of disruptive technologies on our societies and adapting public policies to serve the best interests of our citizens.
- The Alliance stands as a distinctive global alliance, welcoming **democratic regional** and national governments from across the globe, committed to contributing to the discourse on technology governance.
- DETA intends to participate in the **global discussion about tech governance**.

REPRESENTATION AND STRUCTURE

- Governments in DETA are represented by their respective Ministers responsible for Technology and/or Digital Affairs, convening at the annual Ministerial Summit.
- DETA's presidency, chosen by consensus, rotates among member governments biennially. Catalonia holds the rotating presidency in 2024 & 2025.
- First Ministerial Summit to be held in Barcelona on occasion of the Smart City Expo World Congress (6-7 November 2024).

WORKING GROUPS AND POLICY PRIORITIES

- Specialized working groups will be established for each vertical. They will design and monitor DETA's projects.
- These groups, consisting of sectorial representatives (officials or experts) from participating member governments, strive to represent the **quadruple helix** model (academia, government, industry, and civil society in their respective countries).
- Working Groups members will appoint a government to lead it and will oversee its functioning.

COMMITMENTS AND MEMBERSHIP

- Governments can join DETA by completing a **simple Accession Form**, stating which working groups they want to join.
- No financial contribution is required.
- Members are expected to designate an official as the Single Contact Point for the Alliance, who will allocate part of their time to support the initiative.
