Bachelor of Science ANTHROZOOLOGY

Anthrozoology is the study of how people and animals interact. Beacon is one of only two colleges in the country to offer a BS in Anthrozoology!

As an Anthrozoology major, you will:

- · Think like a scientist.
- Use critical thinking skills to evaluate situations involving animals.
- Demonstrate knowledge and understanding of animal husbandry, animal behavior and zoonosis (diseases that can be transmitted from animals to humans).
- Create solutions leading to more positive interactions and relationships between humans and animals.

CAREER OPTIONS

Your studies provide solid preparation to work with animals at zoos, aquariums, animal shelters and nature centers. Employment opportunities include animal training, animal welfare, farming and wildlife conservation. Majors can immediately begin working in the field or pursue graduate school for advanced study in areas such as animal behavior or conservation biology. For example, a Class of 2023 Anthrozoology graduate is a biologist with the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries!

HANDS-ON LEARNING

Interacting with and caring for animals will be part of your studies as an **Anthrozoology** major. On campus, you'll work with our own domesticated animals, small mammals, birds, snakes, amphibians, fish and more.

You'll also participate in special learning opportunities through our close relationships with area employers and organizations that work with animals. These include area zoos, rescue shelters, stables, farms and other locations. You'll study zoology at ZooTampa, conservation at our nearby Weiner Estate campus and animal welfare at Lake County Animal Shelter.

All Anthrozoology majors are required to complete two internships. We work with you to identify and secure an internship in your interest area near campus during the academic year or a summer internship near your home. Recent internships include:



Psychology is the scientific study of human behaviors, activities, thoughts and feelings. At Beacon, you'll gain a deeper understanding of the many factors that influence your own behavior and the actions of others.

As a Psychology major, you will:

- Develop your research, writing and problem-solving skills.
- Hone your ability to analyze, synthesize and evaluate information.
- Gain a greater understanding of the dynamics of human behavior and develop your critical thinking skills and emotional intelligence.
- Learn to work independently or as part of a team.

- In the BA in Psychology program, students gain an understanding of human behavior in diverse populations. In addition to building your knowledge of normal and abnormal behavior and human development, the program will help strengthen your critical thinking, analytical problem-solving, research and writing skills.
- Our AA in Psychology program prepares you to enter the workforce or pursue further study or professional training by providing you with a knowledge base in theory, research and practice in the psychological sciences. In addition to learning to analyze human behavior, you'll sharpen your quantitative, communication, analytical and scientific reasoning skills.


AFFORDABLE ACCESS

The following chart illustrates the total annual cost of attendance in 2021/22, reflecting tuition, room and board, and any specialized costs for LD support programs, which are additional charges at many colleges and universities. (NOTE: Costs do not include miscellaneous fees, books, and other expenses.)

Also, because we are dedicated to exclusively serving students with diagnosed learning disabilities, the cost of attending Beacon (including tuition, books and fees) offers many families valuable medical tax deduction benefits (see IRS publications 907 and 502).
