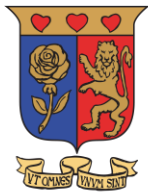

CREs will constitute research ecosystems that will strengthen research in Africa and lay down fundamental pillars for global, collaborative, impactful and sustainable research.

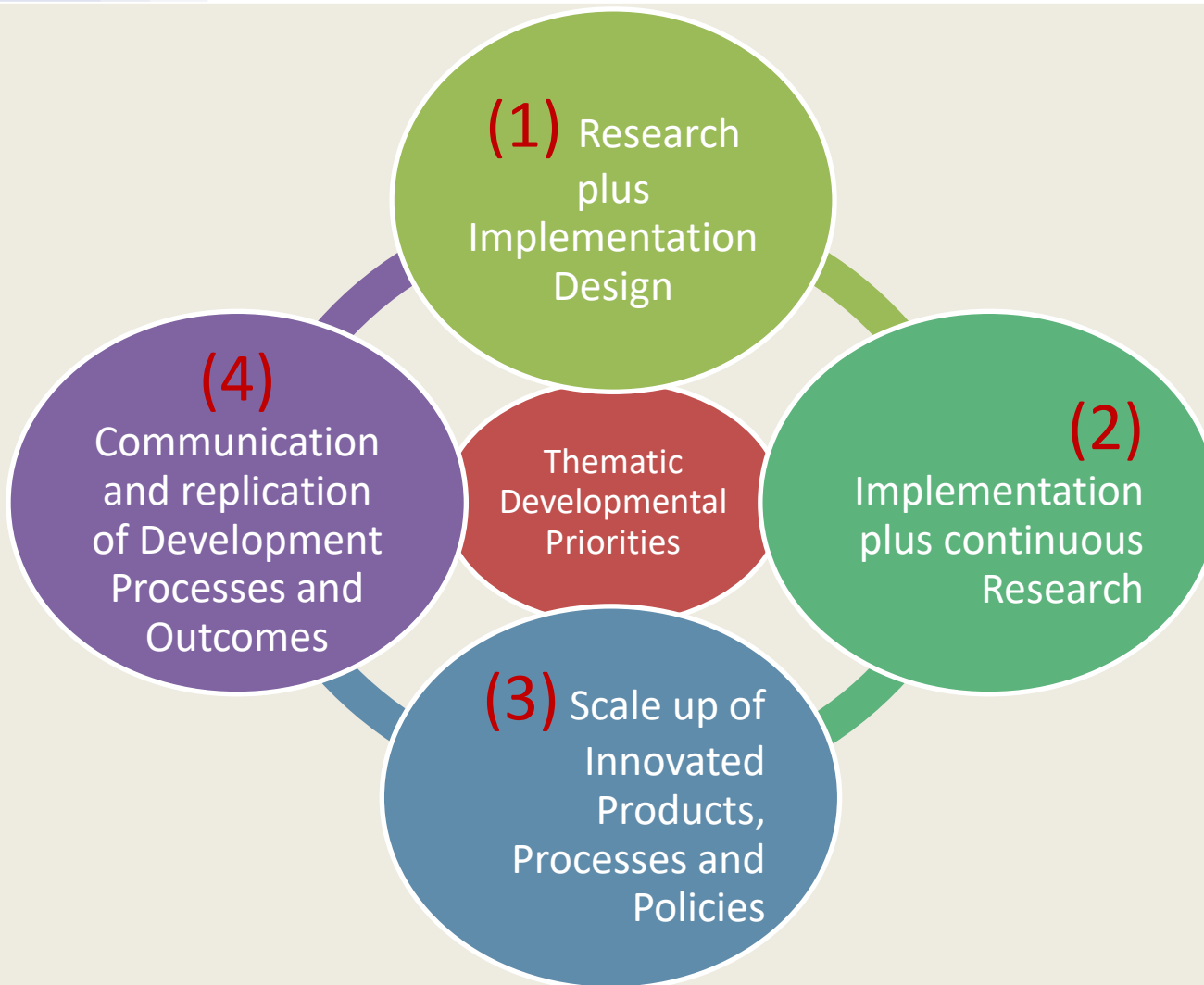
Communities of Research Excellence (CREs)

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Developmental Applied Research Approach

- I. A collaborated and multidimensional research around thematic developmental challenges, concurrent with a plan of implementation of research output.
- II. A refinement of research output implementation process through action research (research in process) involving an interplay of implementation outcomes and concurrent research.
- III. A scale up of innovated products and processes through policy enablement and profitable exploitation of viable product, proven and tested during the research process.
- IV. Communication and dissemination of research work for peer review and replication of developmental processes, products and processes.

- # A strategic, long-term and programmatic research approach.
- # CREs coordinated three-to-five-year long research programs carrying multiple research projects.
- # A programmatic research approach provides multiple opportunities for intense, exhaustive and innovative research projects, besides according research capacity development and academic attainments.
