- > **Difficulty mobilizing ressources** for policy evaluation


**Objective:** To **calculate total costs** (total cost approach) VS **value creation** (global public value)

#### **Expected Outcomes:**


- Continuous policy evaluation with minimal human intervention

#### Functional specifications for automated public policy evaluation




Better control public spending (total cost approach)
