Her professional career includes industrial biotechnology research; international cooperation and financing in research, technology and innovation, particularly with the U.S., China, Russia, the new EU Member States; Internships at the U.S. National Science Foundation (NSF), the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS) and Cooperation with the Science Advisor in the U.S. Department of State; and Fulbright Scholar at George Washington University and Johns Hopkins University/School of Advanced International Studies.

Before joining Infineon Technologies Austria, Herlitschka was Director of European and International Programmes in the Austrian Research Promotion Agency and Coordinating Austrian National Contact Point for the 7th EU Framework Programme. In this capacity she was responsible for the implementation of European & international Research and Technology Programmes, particularly the 7th EU Framework Programme in Austria.
