Sevillanas - Concept of And. Music & Gypsy Contribution Evolution

Vergo style The Ancient Music of Andalucia was first known as Primitive cante andaluza, Primitive cante andaluza evolved to become Ancient cante andaluza - Ancient Song of Andalucia & Spanish there are 3 old & pure song forms, whose roots may be traced back to Ancient cante andaluza these found in Spain they are classified of 3 old & pure song forms, the first was the Siguiriyas.

In its original form, the siguirya was called A Song of Tears or Lament. It was sometimes referred to as the Weeping Song. It began with a high pitched scream signifying the Soul's Delance against its Fate or Destiny. Then it gradually descended into the depths of despair & deep sadness with the realization that their Destiny or Fate was unalterable. The atmosphere & emotional content of the siguirya remain unparalleled in Spanish music & have contributed to its exotic, mysterious style of music.

Turina's Gypsy Sevillana reflects a many elements of the important concept of Ancient Andalucian music. At the same time it also reflects a concept of one of the Gypsy contributions toward Ancient Andalucian music - the hope that Destiny could be altered through the acceptance of one's fate with Dignity.

For the most part Turina's Sevillana is almost as if imbued with a deep sense of sadness but it seems to be derived from the Tradition of life will not be given up. This concept was an important element in the evolution of the sevillana & came from the gypsies

Cantos Mágicos - Religious Mysticism was not only part of the religious ritualism held by the ancient Andalucians, it was also one of the characteristic of their music.

The Ancient Music of Andalucia was thought to have been linked to the primitive religious rites

The music was thought to have been linked to their religious ~~ritualism~~ through the elements of magic, dance & incantation.

In Mompou's cantos mágico #4 we hear the influences of these 3 elements. We also hear the sound of bells. Bronze bells were used as part of the religious rites practiced on the Iberian Peninsula & date back to the Neolithic Age.
