Charter: To oversee and monitor lake conditions and create a healthy fish habitat for recreational purposes.

Meetings: No meeting this month. Members are still being complimentary in regard to Lake appearances and fishing.

Project Updates:

Two lake treatments for Algae and Phytoplankton by Aquatics Associates in last 30 days. Lake Muck Treatment done by Paul McDaniel. Lakes are in good condition with the exception of Meadow Lake which was lowered too quickly. Doubtful there will be long term negative effects of this incident. Meadow will be lowered another foot by the end of October as per water decree. Some water was also released from Sunset. This action is deemed unnecessary but also should have no long term adverse effect if not repeated. Quick response by Paul Flannagan helped mitigate this occurrence.

Willow Well House still needs one more vent located at the aeration pump level on the north side of Willow Wellhouse soon.. We will need some trenching and drainage work done by Autumn on the west side (uphill) of the wellhouse to protect the integrity of the west wall.

- We continue efforts to work with Ops and Water Committee. We need to continue to strive for success in this effort..

All the lakes have been checked by Aquatic Assoc. Volunteers will began Muck treatments near all the weirs. Lake Clarifier treatments will continue.

We are still waiting on the Grant to be funded for the Sunset Aeration System. The sooner this happens the better and appears to be moving to fulfillment soon. It is still conceivable this aeration system could be installed before ice over.

Fathead Minnows were added to Willow and Rainbow as their population was at a lower percentage than the other lakes. This should guarantee a good food supply through the winter months.

We will probably see a little more Algae and Phytoplankton activity but cooler temperatures will keep this incheck.
