

## **2022 IOWA STATE FAIR CONTINUOUS ACTIVITIES AND FAIRGROUND LOCATIONS**

Most buildings are open 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.

**Administration Building:** Open year-round for assistance and houses the Iowa State Fair full-time staff and board during the Fair. The Administration Building is open 8 a.m. to 7 p.m.

**Andringa Family Foundation Little Hands on the Farm (9 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.):** Little Hands on the Farm is designed for children ages 2 to 10 to actively participate in the workings of a kid-sized farm where they plant, work and sell goods. Purchase State Fair and Little Hands on the Farm merchandise in the General Store located on-site. Sponsored by Cargill, Pioneer, Iowa Pork Producers Association, Iowa Select Farms, Fareway Meat & Grocery, Iowa Beef Industry Council, John Deere, Iowa Soybean Association, Kemps Dairy, Henning Companies, Iowa Egg Council, Wyffels Hybrids, Landus Cooperative and Renewable Energy Group.

**Alliant Energy Landing:** The picnic shelter houses various events throughout the Fair. Companies and individuals may rent this space for private events.

**Anne and Bill Riley Stage** sponsored by Pepsi with media sponsor iHeart Radio: The Anne and Bill Riley Stage is home to the Bill Riley Talent Show sponsored by Meta, Iowan of the Day award, The Way We Live Award presentations sponsored by Pioneer, WHO The Big Show, Iowa Farmer Today and Holiday Inn Downtown Mercy Campus as well as various family-friendly shows each night.

**Avenue of Breeds** presented by Iowa Bankers Association and media sponsor WHO The Big Show: The Avenue of Breeds is located west of the Bruce L. Rastetter 4-H Exhibits Building. The Avenue represents 100 breeds and approximately 100-120 animals. The Avenue is supervised and organized by current and alumni members of North Polk FFA.

**Barksdale's State Fair Chocolate Chip Cookies:** Synonymous with the Iowa State Fair, Barksdale's State Fair Cookies are a popular must-have for Fairgoers each year. Get a cup or bucket of chocolate chip cookies at the Barksdale's State Fair Cookie building, in the Varied Industries Building or one of the stands located around the Fairgrounds.

**Blue Ribbon Kids' Club:** Located on the Hy-Vee Fun Forest Stage sponsored by Community Choice Credit Union. Blue Ribbon Kids' Club has activities for Fairgoers ages 10 and under weekdays and Saturdays at 10 a.m. For a schedule of programs, visit the Daily Program Guide at [iowastatefair.org](http://iowastatefair.org) or download the Iowa State Fair App.

**Bob and Deb Pulver Outdoor Arena:** Built in 2008 east of the Swine Barn, the Outdoor Arena hosts various livestock shows, stock dog trials, llama limbo and more during the Fair.

**Bruce L. Rastetter 4-H Exhibits Building** sponsored by Touchstone Energy® Cooperatives of Iowa: Renovated in 2020, explore nearly 4,000 exhibits from some of the most talented and creative 4-H members in the state. This building offers great photography, quilts,

customized classic cars and homemade furniture. Kids can participate in daily hands-on activities and check out worthwhile programs like “Share the Fun.”

**CIRC Model Railroad:** Visit more than 3,500 square feet of display that features several miles of track and 10 to 15 1/87<sup>th</sup> scale trains. The model railroad has a layout depicting typical rural Midwest America with farms, grain elevators, small industries and communities. The building is wheelchair and stroller accessible with raised areas for children to view the display (\$2).

**Creative Arts and Crafts:** Create a variety of fun and creative crafts every day of the Fair starting at 9 a.m. Includes Henna Tattoo Art, Make and Take Candles, Airbrush Demonstrations and a Lego Display. These events are located on the second floor of the Patty and Jim Cownie Cultural Center.

**Concrete Statues:** Find concrete statues decorated by individuals, groups and organizations all over the Fairgrounds. The 2022 concrete statue is a traditional barn.

**Country School:** Get a taste of history with the activities showcased in this one-room schoolhouse. Play farms, parent-child art activities, an old-fashioned spelling bee and more are available. Outside options are also available.

**Disc-Connected K-9’s sponsored by Mountain Valley Spring Water:** Watch a Frisbee dog show act, featuring five different world champions west of the Jacobson Exhibition Center. This internationally acclaimed professional Frisbee dog touring show is family oriented, carries a message of fun, athleticism and canine bonding and promotes dog rescuing.

**Discovery Garden:** A peaceful retreat, the Discover Garden provides a place to stop and rest. Polk County Master Gardeners will be available each day of the Fair from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. to answer gardening questions. Located south of the Agriculture Building, Discovery Garden will also feature the Plant of the Day.

**Elwell Family Food Center sponsored by Urban Air Adventure Park:** Live Food Department judging, demonstrations and exhibits, boasting the largest food department of any state fair. Check out over 125 divisions and 600 classes from food exhibitors.

**Elwell Family Park:** Updated for 2022, Elwell Family Park brings back the roar of Truck and Tractor Pulls (Aug. 16-17), along with a demolition derby (Aug. 20) and ATV/UTV sports races (Aug. 13). Outlaw Truck and Tractor Pull is sponsored by Titan Tire, maker of Goodyear Farm Tires and media partners The WHO Big Show and Iowa Farmer Today. **Expo Hill:** Eco-friendly features include solar-powered pavers, lighting, seating and an entertainment venue as well as the MidAmerican Energy Wind Turbine and Wind Education Center. Expo Hill is home to The Red Trousers Show sponsored by Mattress Firm.

FFA Display Building and Headquarters: Photography and chapter exhibits, agricultural demonstrations and working displays, FFA Ag Mechanics Technology Show (inside and outside).

Fabric and Threads: Home to displays featuring counted cross stitch; counted thread techniques; crocheting; embroidery; hand and machine knitting; handspun yarn; quilting; hooked rugs; toys and dolls; needlepoint; weaving; clothing; sewing for the home; demonstrations/working exhibits; shuttle or needle tatting; sewing classes; located on the second floor of the William C. Knapp Varied Industries Building sponsored by Principal Financial Group.

Farm Bureau Park in Ruan Plaza: Meet Iowa farmers and play free games to win prizes and daily giveaways. Open 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. Located east of the Varied Industries Building.

Farm Bureau Pioneer Hall: Heritage competitive contests; working exhibits and displays; vintage vehicle display (between Fair museum and country school); country antique market; blacksmith shop, Ron Roske and Randy Mills; basket weaving and shaker boxes, Pinicon Farm Crafts, Marlys Sowers, Milo; Coon River Mercantile, manufacturers of 1860-1880 period clothing, Gerald Durbin, Des Moines; 1920s Newspaper and Printing, Friends of Pioneer Hall; 1800s Dress and Hat Enhancements Using a Treadle Machine, Jan Robinson, Ackworth; Spinning Wool on a Wheel, Janice Cook, Monroe; Tractor & Implement Restoration, Lee Sackett, Decatur City; Rigid Heddle Weaving, Kris De Wild, Pella (August 12, 13, 19 and 20); 1900s Gold Leaf and Traditional Hand Lettering Plus Glass Glue Chipping, John Parker Carlisle; Tall Corn Contests - Iowa's Tall Corn Contest and America's Tallest Corn Contest entries on display (judging held Aug 10, on display Aug 11-21).

First Church sponsored by GuideOne Insurance: Take part in old-fashioned hymn singing every day of the Fair at 11:30 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. Outdoors accommodations are also available. Children's Time takes place at 1:30 p.m. daily.

Gammon Barn Museum: Named after the Gammon Family, the barn houses the history of the Polled Hereford breed and highlights the birthplace of Polled Herefords (9 a.m. to 5 p.m.).

The Garden sponsored by Corteva Agriscience: This educational exhibit features information about fruit and vegetable growing here in Iowa along with the history of corn and agricultural crops. A not-to-be-missed Fair experience for any age; check out The Garden just east of Little Hands on the Farm. Attend the free Wine Down in The Garden August 13 and 15 at 7 p.m.

Gas Engine Display provided by Central Hawkeye Gas Engine and Tractor Association: Located west of Pioneer Hall, the display includes antique gas engines, tractors and a working grist mill. The display has continuous shelling and grinding of corn and hand-operated antique corn grinders for children to operate as well as a working aircraft engine and miniature engines.

Grand Concourse presented by Google: The main stretch of the Iowa State Fairgrounds, from Gate 11 to Pioneer Hall, visit the Grand Concourse every day of the Fair for new interactive

activities for Fairgoers of all ages. Review the Daily Program Guide at [iowastatefair.org](http://iowastatefair.org) for specific activities.

**Grandstand Concert Series** presented by Homemakers Furniture on the Kum & Go Stage: See a Grandstand show, from country to rock, Christian, pop, heavy metal or comedy. Purchase tickets at [iowastatefair.org](http://iowastatefair.org) or at the Iowa State Fair Ticket Office or [iowastatefair.org](http://iowastatefair.org). All Grandstand shows are followed by a Fireworks Spectacular sponsored by Meta.

**Halls of Flame and Law:** Visit Iowa's public safety experts where you can sit in an Iowa State Patrol squad car and take a ride on our Seat Belt Convincer. Solve a crime with our investigators, see the remnants of a house fire and learn how to make a fire escape plan, and spin the wheel to win fun law enforcement rubber duckies from our dispatcher team. Find out how you can join the Department of Public Safety's family, and see how we're protecting your community everyday with traffic safety, fire prevention and criminal investigations. Additional exhibits include the Iowa State Patrol, Division of Criminal Investigation, Division of Intelligence and Fusion Center, Division of Narcotics Enforcement, State Fire Marshal Division, Iowa Governor's Traffic Safety Bureau, Iowa State Sheriffs and Deputies Associations, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and Iowa Emergency Management, Jaslets, Gideons International, Iowa Operation Life Saver, Saylorville Lake, Iowa Byways, Iowa Special Olympics and Employee and Family Resources.

**Heritage Village:** Includes Susan Knapp Amphitheater sponsored by Prairie Meadows with media sponsor WHOTV 13; Barber Shop; Ice Cream Parlor; Country School; First Church; General Store; Harper Telephone Building; Old Depot; Farm Bureau Pioneer Hall; Richard L. Easter State Fair Museum Complex (Ralph H. Deets Historical Museum, Richard O. Jacobson Hall and Ronald and Margaret Kenyon Gallery)

**Horse Barn:** Often used in conjunction with the Jacobson Exhibition Center, the barn has 415 box stalls and 14 tack stalls. See Horse Haven, an interactive learning station located at the east end of the Horse Barn, and various horse exhibitors and competitions.

**Horseshoe Courts:** Bring your friends to the horseshoe courts for daily games of horseshoe pitching. Check the Daily Program Guide at [iowastatefair.org](http://iowastatefair.org) for specifics on open singles, open doubles, two player pro-am and more.

**Hy-Vee Health and First Aid Center:** The center is located east of the John Deere Agriculture Building, and a satellite station is located at the Robert G. Horner and Sheri Avis Horner Service Center. Locations are staffed by Des Moines Fire and Rescue. An accessible adult changing station is available in the Health and First Aid Center. The Health and First Aid Center is open 8 a.m. to Midnight.

**Hy-Vee Fun Forest and Fun Forest Stage** sponsored by Community Choice Credit Union: 1.5 acre grassy park with play equipment, a snake walk path, decorated gates, concrete lions, a chainsaw-carved eagle and a wooden train engine. A trumpeting concrete elephant stands guard as a tribute to Baby Mine, the 1929 pachyderm purchased with children's nickel and dime contributions. Find the Art Works Carnival from 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Watch live entertainment like Fantastick Patrick and the Rubber Chicken Show with Greg Frisbee on

the Fun Forest Stage. Also home of Blue Ribbon Kids' Club each weekday and Saturdays at 10 a.m.

Iowa Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Building: Natural resources exhibits and daily interactive demonstrations. The wrap-around aquarium is the focal point of the pavilion, filled with Iowa fish of all shapes, sizes and species.

Iowa Food and Family Project: Visit the Agriculture is Iowa's Masterpiece display in the south atrium of the Varied Industries Building.

Iowan of the Day Presentations: Since 1997, the Blue Ribbon Foundation and Cookies Food Products have come together to recognize people who personify greatness with a strong work ethic or loyalty to helping others and exceptional sense of Iowa Pride. The Iowan of the Day award presentations are on the Anne and Bill Riley Stage August 11-20. Stop at the booth south of Gate 11 to sample award-winning Cookies Food Products. Hotel accommodations sponsored by Des Moines Marriott Downtown.

Interpretive Trail Iowa State Fair Ground Trees: Get on the 1.2 mile long trail of learning about select trees on the Grounds of the Iowa State Fair, brought to you by the Iowa Woodlands Owners Association. Not only are the trees marked for easy identification, they also have a QR code that, when scanned, will provide more detailed information and pictures on each tree.

Jay N. Darling Fair Scavenger Hunt presented by Drake University with media partner KIX 101.1: Go on a Jay N. Darling Fair Scavenger Hunt, and learn fun facts along the way! Find the game on the Official Iowa State Fair App, and start at the KIX 101.1 media booth, located on the Triangle.

John and Emily Putney Family Cattle Barn sponsored by Vermeer: 154,000 square feet with room to hold 1,300 head of cattle. Super Bull; Hall of Champions; Cattle Corner; Boulevard of Dairy Breeds; I Milked a Cow (\$3); and Milking Parlor demonstrations by I Milked a Cow.

John Deere Agriculture Building sponsored by Alliant Energy: 4-H and FFA horticulture judging and FFA floriculture judging; floriculture and horticulture displays and crops; apiary; world famous Butter Cow; daily stage presentations; Discovery Garden; "Plant of the Day" by the Polk County Master Gardeners; FFA hands-on demonstrations; Gingerbread Sculpture by Terry Johnson, Morning Sun; indoor trees and gardens, Kirkwood Community College Horticulture Department; gardens, Christmas Tree Growers; garden design, Harvey's Greenhouse of Adel. "Duffy's Cow & Calf" is a new bronze sculpture honoring Norma "Duffy" Lyon, who created the iconic butter cow for 46 years. The bronze is a replica of Duffy's only non-butter sculpture and was made possible by a donation from BJ and Tiffany Baker, located outside of the Agriculture Building.

Kids' Zone: Find the Wheels of Agriculture and The Garden located east of Little Hands on the Farm. Pulse 101.7 is also located in Kids' Zone.

Machinery Grounds: Farm machinery, equipment showcase, merchandise vendors and food booths can be found south of the Varied Industries Building.

Maytag Family Theaters' Variety Theater is a meeting place for Narcotics Anonymous every day during the Fair. Meeting times are the following: Aug. 11 at 6 p.m.; Aug. 12 at Noon and 6 p.m.; Aug. 13-14 at 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.; Aug. 15-19 at Noon and 6 p.m.; Aug. 20 at 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.; and Aug. 21 at 10 a.m.

MidAmerican Energy Stage sponsored by Iowa Realty with media sponsor KCCI TV 8: From 80s rock to country to pop, the MidAmerican Energy Stage provides entertainment for all tastes, plus great local talent during the day and TV 8 news live at 5 on weekdays.

MidAmerican Energy Wind Turbine & Education Center: Learn something new with interactive displays throughout the Fair. Video wall, reusable bag distribution, cutout photo opportunity every day 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Mountain Man Camp: Take a walk back in time and visit the pre-1840 Mountain Man Fur Trade Camp. Seven camps demonstrate and offer for sale beadwork, leather bags, handmade courting flutes, fry bread, Scrimshaw, tomahawk throwing and more. See the Mountain Man fire starting contest around 1 p.m.; let the youngsters line up to catch candy shot out of a candy cannon. Talk to reenactors about how life might have been in a real Mountain Man camp in the late 1700s or early 1800s. You might catch someone sewing a leather bag, draw knifing a new flute, engraving a powder horn, knapping a stone arrowhead or maybe cooking up supper in a Dutch oven. Enjoy your visit to the Mountain Man Camp, located near Heritage Village and East of Susan Knapp Amphitheater.

Oman Family Youth Inn: Stop by the air-conditioned Oman Family Youth Inn on the southeast corner of the Fairgrounds throughout the Fair. Check the daily program guide for a listing of events, including 4-H clothing judging, tumbling, cribbage and backgammon tournaments.

Patty and Jim Cownie Cultural Center: Atrium sponsored by Bankers Trust: Fine Arts Juried Exhibit (including adult and youth categories): Acrylics/Tempera; Drawing; Fiber; Glass; Jewelry; Mixed Media; Oil; Pastels; Pottery; Original Hand Pulled Prints; Sculpture; and Watercolor. Paul R. Knapp Animal Learning Center sponsored by Christensen Farms: Live animal births, baby animal displays, *The Way We Live* Award display, Coloring Contest Display, and agriculturally-based educational displays. Text BABY to 844.844.8508 to receive updates when baby animals are being born.

Pioneer Livestock Pavilion: Home to many livestock shows the whole family will enjoy, including Dairy Cattle, Beef Cattle, Horse Pulling, Miniature Horse Shows, Super Bull, Governor's Charity Steer Show, various FFA and 4-H shows and more!

Poultry and Rabbit Building: Located near Gate 4 on the east end of the grounds. Stop by for various poultry and rabbit shows throughout the Fair, including the largest rabbit.

Pella Plaza: 50,000 square feet featuring benches, flowers, trees and a water fountain. In the middle of the plaza, a flag flies for each of Iowa's 99 counties.

Principal Plaza at Legacy Terrace: Enjoy water fountains, benches, shrubs and shady trees in this courtyard on the Grand Concourse adjacent to the Grandstand. Plaques and monuments commemorate contributions to the Fair. Ask how to be a part of it by stopping at the Blue Ribbon Foundation's store in the Robert G. Horner and Sheri Avis Horner Service Center.

Reichardt Family Giant Slide: A Fair institution in its 51<sup>st</sup> year, the Giant Slide is the top ride with over 100,000 riders each year. It is 45 foot-high, 150 foot-long (\$3). Located southeast of the Varied Industries building.

Richard L. Easter Museum Complex: Find interactive exhibits of Fair history in the Richard O. Jacobson Hall and Ronald and Margaret Kenyon Gallery; the Ralph H. Deets Historical Museum features an extensive collections of Fair memorabilia.

Richard O. Jacobson Exhibition Center presented by Google: Doors opened at the 2010 Iowa State Fair and it hosts various livestock shows and judging, horse shows and the Cowgirl Queen Contest. The venue has more than 3,500 seats and a VIP balcony called Jake's Club; some afternoon and evening horse shows require paid admission.

Robert G. Horner and Sheri Avis Horner Service Center sponsored by CareSource: Home of the Blue Ribbon Foundation main merchandise store during the Fair.

Rock Island: Sometimes called the Triangle, Rock Island hosts seating, vendors and some of the Fair's favorite foods. Located between the Agriculture Building and the Administration Building.

Ruan Plaza: Built in 2014, the pedestrian-friendly walkway connects the Grand Concourse with the Exhibition Center. In 2022, it includes the Straw Sculpture sponsored by Simpson College, Farm Bureau Park and various food vendors.

Sheep Barn: This historic barn includes details that can't be duplicated today. With 714 pens, it is home to the Giant Ram, Sheep Stop and various sheep shows throughout the Fair.

Shoppers' Mart: Loaded with crafts as well as demonstrations and merchants offering everything from never-before-seen products to as-seen-on-TV favorites, make sure you visit both the center and west sections of the Shoppers' Mart, located under the Grandstand.

Snakes Alive: This walk-through exhibit allows visitors to view snakes up close in glass enclosures with the chance to have a hands-on experience with live snakes (\$3 admission).

Sky Glider East and Sky Glider West sponsored by Superior Sleep: A Fair favorite, the sky gliders provide a unique view of the city and the Fairgrounds (\$5 one-way or \$8 round trip). Sky Glider East runs from Pioneer Hall to the entrance of Thrill Ville, and Sky Glider West spans from Gate 10, southeast of the Food Center, to Rock Island Ave.

Stalling Barn sponsored by Van Wall Equipment: Home of cattle and llamas. Located on the southeast corner of the Fair, next to the Outdoor Arena.

Susan Knapp Amphitheater sponsored by Prairie Meadows with media sponsor WHO13: The Susan Knapp Amphitheater is home to country, rock and pop entertainment throughout the Fair, as well as local talent throughout the day. The Susan Knapp Amphitheater is located in Heritage Village.

Swine Barn sponsored by Corteva Agriscience: An icon for more than a century, this massive 184,096 square foot building hosts numerous swine and goat shows, Pig Place and the Big Boar. It is located on the south end of the Fairgrounds, across from the Sheep Barn.



Thrill Parks: From roller coasters to bumper cars, amusement park rides have been a staple at the Iowa State Fair. Thrill Parks include Thrill Ville, Thrill Town and Thrill Zone! Fairgoers can easily access rides and games simply by purchasing a reloadable Thrill Pass. Unlimited Ride Wristbands or Thrill Passes can be ordered online for a discount before August 11 or purchased at the Fair for Thrill Town and Thrill Ville. **Thrill Ville (Opens at 10 a.m.)**

Buckle your seat belt for the newest, fastest and most thrilling amusement rides. **Thrill Town (Opens at 9 a.m.)**

Little Fairgoers and their families will find loads of fun and stroller parking with the addition of Thrill Town. Thrill Town features kid-friendly rides in a fun, clean and convenient location without having to navigate the larger Thrill Park areas. Thrill Town is located east of Gate 10 and directly north of the Richard O. Jacobson Exhibition Center Lawn.

**Thrill Zone (Opens at 10 a.m.)**

Fairgoers seeking breathtaking, heart-stopping, hair-raising adventure will find it in the Thrill Zone. These unforgettable attractions will have you talking about the Iowa State Fair for months to come. Thrill Zone is located north of Gate 11 on the west side of the Fairgrounds.

Vermeer Grandfather's Barn: Visit the Wine Experience at Grandfather's Barn for daily tastings of Iowa State Fair and Best of Show Wine sampling from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Includes featured wineries/speakers, and Grape Getaway Kids' Activities.

Walnut Center: A great showcase for nearly 20 Iowa crafters, shop for items from cross stitch to woodworking. There are also diaper-changing and nursing stations in the Walnut Center, located behind the Anne and Bill Riley Stage near the horse barn.

William C. Knapp Varied Industries Building sponsored by Principal®: Originally built in 1911, the building has been renovated and updated, and it is now one of the largest exhibition halls in the Midwest. It hosts the Fabric and Threads Department (second floor) and commercial exhibits (main floor).

The Sams Club booth will be administering flu shots and other immunizations at their booth, spaces 568-569, in the Varied Industries Building.
