RULES

1. General rules and regulations listed on the Iowa State Fair website and in the FFA section apply in this department, with special emphasis on the following sections: Member Eligibility, Supervision and Lodging and Good Conduct Policy.
2. Entries in this department must be part of the exhibitor's SAE program. Exhibits must have been propagated and grown by the FFA member. Students must have record books on all floriculture projects exhibited.
3. **Entries must be submitted online on or before July 1.** Each shall specify the number of entries they plan to exhibit. Division and class numbers do not need to be specified at the time of entry. Exhibitors are permitted up to **two entries per class.**
4. Each exhibitor in this department, as a requirement for entry, will pay an entry fee.

Entry Fees

- 1-4 entries \$5.00
- Each additional entry \$0.50

5. Entry tags for the FFA Floriculture Show will be sent from the Iowa State Fair directly to each exhibitor prior to the Fair. This will allow the FFA exhibitor to complete information on the tags before the entries are brought to the Iowa State Fair.
6. Additional entries may be made the day of the show by exhibitors who are pre-entered in FFA Floriculture for \$1 per entry.
7. Label each entry with a variety name. Entries without a variety name will be ineligible to win the class.
8. **Exhibitor must be in attendance on entry morning to prepare and show flowers. Exhibitor must check in with show personnel.**
9. Bottles will be provided to the exhibitors by the Iowa State Fair. Wedging of the stem is permitted.
10. Refrigeration will be available for arrivals on Tuesday or Wednesday.
11. **Leave foliage on where attached, but not in the water.**
12. In the case of Dahlias, they must be grown disbudded.
13. Exhibitors are encouraged to use ISU Extension 4H 464 "Preparing Cut Flowers and Houseplants for Exhibits" as a resource for exhibition.
14. Where color is mentioned, unless the exact shade is specified, all shades or varieties coming under the major color compete together in mixed colors, the one predominating shall classify.
15. The Supervisor has the right to remove any exhibit which is deemed unsightly.
16. The judge will be available at the conclusion of the show to visit with any FFA member about his/her exhibit.
17. Entries will be awarded first - eighth place with class ribbons and premiums. Only first and second place ribbon winners can be named Champion and Reserve Champion of a show/division/class.
18. When there is one exhibitor in a class, the first prize, if merited, will be awarded. When articles are not worthy of first prize, judges may, at their discretion, award a prize or prizes of such grade as the articles meet. When there is competition, all prizes may be awarded so far as there are worthy entries. If two entries are equal, both place monies are to be totaled and divided equally.
19. **Premiums and Ribbons:** Each entry will receive a ribbon (purple, blue, red or white) in each class. Monetary premiums will be paid to the top 3 entries in each class. Premiums paid will be \$6, 5, 4.
20. There will be a Champion and Reserve Champion in each division. Both will be awarded rosettes. Each Division Champion will compete for the **Award of Excellence;** a trophy and rosette will be awarded for this overall Award of Excellence.
21. **Sweepstakes Trophy:** The individual exhibitor with the highest number of points in the Floriculture division will receive a Sweepstakes Trophy. Points are awarded for Award of Excellence (10), Champion (5) and Reserve Champion (3) placings. Exhibitors receiving 2nd-8th will be announced and receive ribbons.
22. **Showmanship:** Students will be judged while preparing their exhibits for show. Included in the judging will be skills and knowledge in preparing their flowers for exhibit. They may be asked questions about their entries during the preparation time concerning plant care, selection and preparation. All exhibitors will be considered for showmanship.
23. **A representative of the FFA Chapter must attend release time to pick up ribbons, dispose of flowers and clear their displays or premiums will be withheld.**
24. A special theme rotating categories will be as follows for Class 100:
 - 2021 - Celosia
 - 2022 - Sunflower
 - 2023 - Coleus
