

# The Phrasing Relationships

## Support by Distinct Statement

**Ground:** A phrase indicating the argument or reason of the anchor phrase. (U Pr Pa C)

**Result:** A phrase indicating the consequence or outcome of the anchor phrase. (U Pa C)

**Purpose:** A phrase indicating the goal or intended result of the anchor phrase. (I Pr C)

**Advantage:** A phrase indicating that the anchor phrase is being accomplished for the benefit of someone or something. (Pr)

**Disadvantage:** A phrase indicating that the anchor phrase is being accomplished for the detriment of someone or something. (Pr)

**Condition:** A phrase indicating what must be true for the anchor phrase to be in effect. (C)

**Temporal:** A phrase indicating the time in which the anchor phrase occurs or is true. (Pr C)

**Locative:** A phrase indicating the location in which the anchor phrase occurs or is true. (Pr C)

**Source:** A phrase indicating the point of origin from which the anchor phrase derives or depends. (Pr)

**Destination:** A phrase indicating the end point to which the anchor phrase arrives. (Pr)

**Separation:** A phrase indicating that the anchor phrase is distancing itself from an object or concept. (Pr)

## Support by Contrary Statement

**Concessive:** A phrase which acknowledges a seemingly contrary point in order to support the anchor phrase. (C)

## Support by Restatement

**Manner:** A phrase indicating the way the anchor phrase is carried out. (Pa Pr)

**Means:** A phrase indicating the instrument by which the anchor phrase is accomplished. (Pa Pr)

**Agency:** A phrase indicating the personal agent by whom the anchor phrase is executed. (Pr)

**Comparison:** A phrase used to clarify the anchor phrase by showing what it is like. (Pr C)

**Standard:** A phrase indicating a point of reference to which the anchor phrase accords. (Pr)

**Negative:** A phrase that enforces the anchor phrase by contrast or by restating it in a negative way. (U C)

**Substitution:** A phrase indicating what something in the anchor phrase is given in place of or in exchange for. (Pr)

**Explanation:** A phrase that clarifies the meaning of the anchor phrase. (U Ap C)

**Content:** A phrase which acts as the subject or object of the anchor phrase. (I S C)

**Context:** A phrase indicating the sphere in which the anchor phrase is true. (Pr)

**Distinction:** A phrase that clarifies the anchor phrase by distinguishing it from something else. (Pr)

**Example:** A phrase providing a specific instance of the anchor phrase. (U)

**Accompaniment:** A phrase indicating who or what is included with those already mentioned in the anchor phrase. (Pr)

**Reference:** A phrase indicating to what the anchor phrase is in connection. (Pr)

**Answer:** A phrase indicating the reply to a question. (U)
