Important Current Affairs 20th August 2017

- Indians top H-1B visa seekers
 - With 2.47 lakh applications, Indians continued to be largest group of H-1B visa aspirants during first nine months of the current US financial year.
 - o Indians were top H-1B visa seekers followed by Chinese and Philippines.
 - o The technology sector continues to dominate H-1B visa applications.
 - No. of Indians applying for H-1B has increased by 80.6% since 2006-07 to stand at 3 lakh in 2015-16.
- More teeth to T-90 battle tanks
 - The Indian Army is working on a project to add more teeth to its T-90 main battle tanks by arming them with a third generation missile system.
 - Currently, the T-90 tanks are equipped with a laser-guided INVAR missile system. The Army has decided to replace them with a third generation gunlaunched missile.

· World's smallest surgical robot

- British scientists have developed worlds smallest surgical robot which could transform daily operations for tens of thousands of patients.
- o The robot, called Versius, mimics human arm & can be used to carry out a wide range of laparoscopic procedures including hernia repairs, colorectal operations.
- The robot is controlled by a surgeon at a console guided by a 3D screen in the operating theatre.

· Rahul Doshi crowned 'Child Genius'

- Indian-origin boy has been crowned as the UKs Child Genius in a popular television quiz competition.
- Rahul Doshi won the show 'Child Genius' by beating his opponent 10-4 in the finale.
- He clinched the title by answering a question on 19th Century artists William Holman Hunt and John Everett Millais.
- Rahul is a member of Mensa club & is believed to have a higher IQ than Albert Einstein.

Delegation of Powers to BRO

- Defence Ministry has approved delegation of administrative & financial powers to Border Roads Organisation.
- Functioning under control of Ministry of Defence, BRO is engaged in road construction to provide connectivity to difficult & inaccessible regions in the border areas.
- This has been done to bring transformational changes in organization in order to improve the pace of execution of works

• First Shipment of American crude

- o 1st shipment of American crude oil worth \$100mn will reach India next month.
- Shipment of crude oil to India comes nearly 2 years after the then US President Barack Obama lifted the 40-year- old ban on its export.

- With this India joins Asian countries like South Korea, Japan & China to buy American crude after production cuts by OPEC.
- o IOC & BPCL have placed orders for over 4 million barrels.

First regional center of NDB

- The 1st regional centre of New Development Bank was officially opened in Johannesburg, South Africa.
- NDB formerly referred to as BRICS Development Bank, is a multilateral development bank established by BRICS states with an initial authorized capital of \$100 bn.
- It will help in promoting sustainable development through integration, industrialisation & infrastructure development on the continent.

• Orient Craft Textile inaugurated

- To celebrate 2nd phase of 'Momentum Jharkhand', Smriti Irani was made the chief guest of the event.
- Union Minister for Textile and I&B, Smriti Irani inaugurated Jharkhand's 1st textiles manufacturing & export unit 'Orient Craft Ltd' in Ranchi.
- Currently, Jharkhand produces 1,200 metric tonnes of Tasar silk alone every year & shares 62% share in the total market production of the entire country.

PPP model for handling e-waste

- o Govt is exploring the possibility of setting up an eco-park under public-private partnership mode to make R&D in e-waste recycling commercially viable.
- o It could provide a system for channelisation of e-waste for environmentally sound recycling in organized sector by bringing together formal & informal sector.
- R&D in tech pertaining to the management of e-waste falls within the domain of DeitY.

• Dick Gregory dies

- o Dick Gregory, the legendary comedian and civil rights activist passed away.
- From the 1960s Gregory mocked racism in his stand-up routines. He
 was among the first US black comedian to perform regularly in front of white
 audiences.

 Gregory was also involved in a number of civil rights activities in the 1960s. He campaigned against the Vietnam War and his protests often involved hunger strikes.

• Rajiv Gandhi's 73rd birth anniversary

- The nation is remembering former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi on his 73rd birth anniversary today.
- Rajiv Gandhi, who heralded the information and communication technology revolution in the country, was born on August 20, 1944 and served as Prime Minister from 1984 to 1989.
- He was assassinated by LTTE in a suicide bombing at Sriperumbudur in Tamil
 Nadu on May 21, 1991 during election campaign.

• Google to launch Android O

- Google will be unveiling latest Android operating system, Android O through a live streaming event from New York City.
- Google hasn't officially disclosed what the "O" in "Android O" stands for, while many believe it could be Oreo.
- Android O will be Google's Android version 8.0 after Android Nougat.
- Android O is currently on its fourth developer preview, having originally launched in March.

FICCI's Healthcare Personality award

- Dr. Nanda Kumar Jairam, CEO, Chairman & Group Medical Director, Columbia Asia Hospitals, India, has been awarded 'Healthcare Personality of the Year' award.
- He was given the award at 9th Healthcare Excellence Awards instituted by FICCI.
- The Healthcare Excellence Awards by FICCI is an attempt to recognise the contributions of those who have set benchmarks of excellence in the healthcare space.

Govt plans monthly fellowship

 Centre will provide Rs. 70,000 as monthly fellowship to those researchers doing their PhDs in Indian Institutes of Technology or Indian Institute of Science.

- Centre will provide 2,000 such monthly fellowships across IIT system & IISc Bengaluru.
- This will also enable meritorious researchers, keen to further their research but forced to opt for corporate jobs for higher pay, to pursue their goal

• Malala Yousafzai to study at Oxford

- o Nobel laureate Malala Yousafzai has gained a place in the University of Oxford.
- o She will study philosophy, politics and economics at the prestigious university.
- She is a Pakistani activist for female education & the youngest-ever Nobel Prize laureate.
- She won international renown in 2012 after she was shot by a Taliban gunman in Pakistan for speaking out for the right of girls to go to school.

• US & South Korea to begin military drill

- US & South Korea would begin a 10-day-long annual military exercise amid continued provocative behavior from North Korea
- Ulchi Freedom Guardian drill is a computer-simulated defensive exercise designed to enhance readiness, protect region & maintain stability on Korean peninsula
- In addition to South Korea & US forces, UN Command forces from 7 sending states will participate in this exercise

Japan launches satellite to improve GPS

- Japan has launched a rocket & put the 3rd of its new quasi-zenith satellites into orbit to help improve the precision of the global positioning system.
- H-2A rocket launched by JAXA carried Michibiki No 3 which is part of a 4 satellite constellation.
- New satellite system will be officially put into use next year & complement a network of US satellites that Japan previously used for its GPS needs.

• Investigation of China's IP Practices

 The US has formally launched an investigation into China's policies regarding intellectual property.

- US will investigate China's policies & practices related to technology transfer, IP
 & innovation to determine if the behavior is unreasonable or restricts
 US commerce.
- Annual cost to US economy from counterfeit goods, pirated software & theft of trade secrets has been estimated at \$600bn.

• Saudi Arabia to open border

- Saudi Arabia's King Salman has ordered reopening of border with Qatar to facilitate annual Haj pilgrimage amidst a feud that has triggered tensions b/w 2 nations since June
- Qatari pilgrims can pass through crossing without permits usually needed to be obtained in advance for haj.
- Qatar had accused Saudi of politicizing pilgrimage & complained to UN Special
 Rapporteur on freedom of religion.

BRICS think tanks to enhance exchanges

- 5 think tanks from BRICS countries has signed a memorandum to begin exchanges & conduct joint research
- Memorandum was signed on sidelines of seminar on BRICS governance in Fujian province prior to 9th BRICS Summit to be held in China
- According to the deal, the 5 will share research information, arrange exchanges
 b/w researchers & hold joint research every year on mutually-interested topics
