Etymology

Do you know in Old English the word 'give' was not present? They used '*giefan*' (past tense: *geaf*, past participle: *giefen*) meaning to give, bestow, entrust, deliver to another, grant, commit and devote.

In Middle English, it became '*given*' and later, '*give*'

Give In

Meaning:

1. To stop fighting, admit defeat.
2. To agree to do something that you do not want to do.



Memory tip: *Give in* means "yield"
'Yield' means *surrender and in old days, kings would send gifts to show that they do not want to fight.*

Usage: The hijackers were forced to give in.

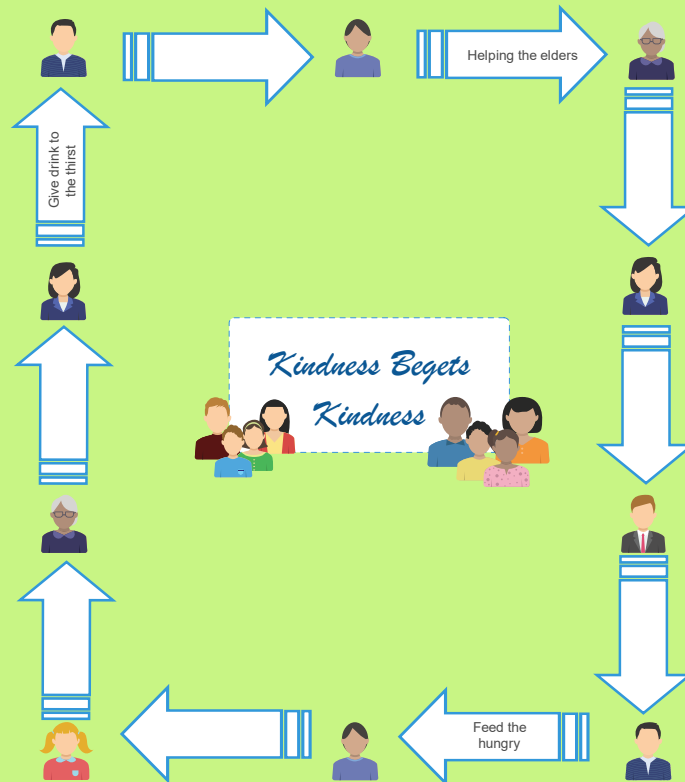




Give Out

Meaning:

1. To give something to a lot of people.
2. To come to an end.



Memory tip: *Misers think giving out will lead to 'give out'; wise men know giving out begets giving out.*

Usage: 1. The clerk gave out the identity cards.
2. Food supplies gave out in the refugee camp.
